SIDEBARS, STREAKS, & STORY LINES

- The Statesmen (0-0, 0-0 GSC) of Delta State University officially begin the *Jim Boone Era* with a pair of exhibition games versus NCAA Division I opponents this week. DSU opens up play Thursday, Nov. 1 at Mississippi Valley State University, the defending Southwestern Athletic Conference champions. Tipoff is set for 7:30 p.m. at the HPER Complex in Itta Bena. The Statesmen will conclude the two-game road swing at Vanderbilt University on Monday, Nov. 5. Game time is set for 7 p.m. at Memorial Gymnasium in Nashville, Tenn. The DSU-VU contest will be broadcast on the Statesmen Sports Network. Matt Jones and J.T. Webb have the call.
- Thursday's showdown rekindles an old Mississippi Delta tradition, as two of the state's most successful men's basketball teams reconnect in Itta Bena. The game marks the 30th meeting between the two schools with MVSU holding a 15-14 edge in the series standings. Last season, the Delta Devils escaped the HPER Complex with an 85-72 victory, but only after senior guard Terry Leake, Jr. lit up the scoreboard for had a game-high 20 points and five rebounds. Junior point guard Cornel Knight chipped in 19 points and dished out six assists.
- No strangers to Southeastern Conference competition, Monday's meeting with Vanderbilt University marks the first all-time between the Statesmen and the Commodores. DSU is 5-18 all-time against teams from the SEC, including contests versus Alabama (0-1), Ole Miss (4-2) and Mississippi State (1-15).
- Jim Boone enters his first season as head coach of the Statesmen, while bringing 27 years of collegiate experience to Walter Sillers Coliseum. The Wingfield, W.V., native is 438-328 in his career, including six conference championships, four tournament titles and seven NCAA postseason appearances. Twice Boone led California (Pa.) to the NCAA Final Four.
- Terry Leake, Jr., a 6-foot-5 shooting guard, was named to the Gulf South Conference Preseason All-GSC Team by a vote of the league's coaches in October. The Memphis, Tenn., native, who was an Second Team All-GSC pick in 2011-12, led the Statesmen in scoring (14.0) and was second in rebounding (4.4) last season.
- Junior point guard Cornel Knight is looking to build upon a solid sophomore campaign last season. The 6-foot-3 guard averaged 8.0 points and 2.7 assists per game. The Mobile, Ala., native transferred to DSU from Marion Military Institute prior to last season.
- The Statesmen return just four letterman off last season's squad, joining Leake, Jr., and Knight are Ryan Smith, a 6-foot-5 power forward, and John Hudson, a 6-foot-7 forward. Smith averaged 3.7 points per game, while Hudson delivered 1.9 points and 1.8 rebounds a game.
- Delta State will feature 10 newcomers this season, including two with international flare. Australia natives Jack Madgen, a 6-foot-3 shooting guard, and Declan Harrick, a 6-foot-9 center, will figure heavily in the plans for the Statesmen this season.
- The Statesmen were picked to finish sixth overall this season in the annual Gulf South Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. DSU received 20 poll points, while preseason favorite and defending league champion Alabama-Huntsville garnered 49.

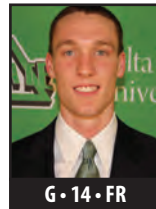

Jim Boone is in his first season as head coach of the Delta State University Statesmen Basketball program. Boone (438-328), a native of Winfield, W.V., brings 27 years of collegiate coaching experience to Delta State, including stops at the NCAA Division I and II levels. His career record speaks to his success on the hardwood, but his real niche has been at the NCAA DII level where he has posted a blistering 338-166 mark as a head coach.

Prior to taking over as head coach of the Statesmen, Boone spent the 2011-12 season as head coach at West Virginia Wesleyan College, guiding the Bobcats to a school record 22 wins at the DII level and the program's first ever NCAA Division II Regional Tournament Championship appearance.

Under Boone's leadership, the Bobcats (22-9) defeated perennial DII power Winston Salem State in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament this season before falling to West Liberty State.

Boone began his career as a standout player at West Virginia State College where he was a four-year letterman. He earned his bachelor's degree in Accounting (1981) and followed that with a master's in Business Administration from the University of Kentucky (1982) with a concentration in Marketing.

His coaching career brought him back to his alma mater, spending three seasons as the head assistant coach from 1982-85. Boone made the jump to NCAA DI basketball in 1986, as an assistant at Charleston Southern University, where the Buccaneers won the Big South Conference Championship.

The championship experience led Boone to California University of Pennsylvania as head coach. Over the next 10 years, Boone led California (Pa.) to unprecedented success, including a 228-71 record. During his time with the Vulcans, Boone's squads claimed 31 wins and being the number one team in the country in 1992, two NCAA DII Final Four appearances, six regular season conference titles, and nine

trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Boone (228-71) finished his time with a school-record 228 wins and a .763 win percentage. Boone was inducted into the California (Pa.) Hall of Fame in 2005.

From California (Pa.), Boone on the challenge of rebuilding NCAA Division I Robert Morris University, eventually leading the Colonials to the NEC Championship game in 2000. In 1999 and 2000, he led RMU to a record of 25-13 in the NEC and produced two of the best seasons in Colonials history.

Boone left RMU after 2000 to take on the task of turning Eastern Michigan University into a competitive DI program. In five seasons at EMU, Boone quadrupled the program's wins total and set several EMU attendance records.

Boone left EMU after the 2005 season to take his talents to Tusculum College, a member of NCAA DII and the South Atlantic Conference. In 2009, the Pioneers won a school-record 20 games and the made its second-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament. He still holds the school record for conference wins over a four-year period. Boone recruited and coached two-time SAC Player of the Year and All-American Kyle Moore.

During his career, his teams have recorded 17 or more wins on 16 occasions, including six conference championships, four tournament titles and seven postseason appearances. From 1990-96, his California teams recorded over 20 victories for six consecutive years tallying an impressive 150-33 mark during that span. His 94-24 league record in the PSAC is still the best of any coach in that conference's history. He was named PSAC Coach of the Year on three occasions (1988, 1992, 1996) and NCAA Region Coach Year twice (1992, 1996).

He is married to the former Stephanie VanVranken and they are the parents of two sons, Jimmy and Joey.

STATESMEN PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH IN GSC; LEAKE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC

For the third consecutive year, Alabama-Huntsville was selected as a GSC Men's Basketball Pre-Season Coaches' Poll Favorite. Delta State was picked sixth.

UAH was also a unanimous selection by the league's head coaches for the second year in a row, securing seven first-place votes en route to 49 points. The Chargers proved the prognosticators correct a year ago, capturing their first-ever GSC Tournament Title and also claiming their second straight NCAA South Regional Championship.

Christian Brothers came in second (36) after posting runner-up efforts in last year's GSC and Regional Finals. Third-place West Georgia (30) was the only other team to hit the 30-point total, while fourth-place West Alabama earned the lone remaining first-place vote to rack up 29 points. North Alabama (26) finished in the No. 5 spot, while Delta State and Valdosta State finished in a tie for sixth-place (20). West Florida rounded out the Pre-Season list by garnering 14 points.

Alabama-Huntsville was the lone school to place multiple players by posting at least two members for the third year in a row. Senior guard Jaime Smith and senior forward Zane Campbell return to the Pre-Season squad for the third consecutive season. Smith collected All-GSC First Team laurels a year ago, while Campbell is a 2011 First Team winner. Both players helped lead the Chargers to their first-ever GSC Title and second straight NCAA Regional Crown. Smith led the GSC a year ago in three-point field goal percentage (.486—107-220) and was second in free throw percentage (.849—146-172) and third in scoring (18.0). Campbell, a former GSC Player of the Year in 2010-11, placed third in field goal percentage (.607—193-318) and blocked shots (1.3) and ninth in scoring (14.7).

Delta State senior forward Terry Leake, West Alabama senior guard Steven Samuels and Christian Brothers junior guard Harry Green round out the GSC Pre-Season Team. Leake finished ninth in the Conference in steals a year ago (0.7) and 10th in scoring (14.0). Samuels is UWA's first Pre-Season player since 2010 after he led the Tigers in scoring (14.1) and rebounding (6.4) in just 17 games. Green started in all but one of CBU's 32 contests a year ago, placing eighth in the GSC in assists (3.3) and ninth in assists/turnover ratio (1.4).

STATESMEN-DELTA DEVILS REKINDLE RIVALRY

Thursday's showdown rekindles an old Mississippi Delta tradition, as two of the state's most successful men's basketball teams reconnect in Itta Bena. The game marks the 30th meeting between the two schools with MVSU holding a 15-14 edge in the series standings.

Last season, the Delta Devils escaped the HPER Complex with an 85-72 victory, but only after senior guard Terry Leake, Jr. lit up the scoreboard for had a game-high 20 points and five rebounds. Junior point guard Cornel Knight chipped in 19 points and dished out six assists.

DELTA STATE-VANDY A FIRST

No strangers to Southeastern Conference competition, Monday's meeting with Vanderbilt University marks the first all-time between the Statesmen and the Commodores. DSU is 5-18 all-time against teams from the SEC, including contests versus Alabama (0-1), Ole Miss (4-2) and Mississippi State (1-15).

KNIGHT READY TO LEAD FROM PG SPOT

Junior point guard Cornel Knight is looking to build upon a solid sophomore campaign last season. The 6-foot-3 guard averaged 8.0 points and 2.7 assists per game. The Mobile, Ala., native transferred to DSU from Marion Military Institute prior to last season.

In 2011-12 the Statesmen won six games, oddly each DSU victory came in contests where Knight scored in double figures.

SMITH & HUDSON READY FOR SENIOR CHALLENGE

The Statesmen return just four lettermen off last season's squad, joining Leake, Jr., and Knight are Ryan Smith, a 6-foot-5 power forward, and John Hudson, a 6-foot-7 forward. Smith averaged 3.7 points per game, while Hudson delivered 1.9 points and 1.8 rebounds a game.

DOWN UNDER STATESMEN

Delta State will feature 10 newcomers this season, including two with international flare. Australia natives Jack Madgen, a 6-foot-3 shooting guard, and Declan Harrick, a 6-foot-9 center, will figure heavily in the plans for the Statesmen this season.

The duo are the first Australians to play for DSU since former power forward Oliver Mansour, a 6-foot-8 Melbourne native, finished his career in 2009-2010.

HOME SWEET SILLERS

The Statesmen will feel right at home this season, as DSU opens the 2012-13 campaign with five consecutive home games at Sillers Coliseum. Traditionally one of Division II's most difficult venues, the Green-and-White will play a total of 15 home games this year.

LOOKING FOR 16

Should the Statesmen collect 16 victories this year, two major milestones will fall for the program - 1,200 all-time victories and 700 Gulf South Conference wins.

The Statesmen boast the second most wins all-time amongst GSC institutions with a career record of 1,184-788-1. DSU is also a blistering 684-444 in league games.

SIX AND COUNTING

Delta State enters the 2012-13 season with six Gulf South Conference championships, the most by any member institution. The Statesmen also own GSC records for postseason tournament appearances (24), wins (26), semifinal berths (17) and finals appearances (12).

WE WANT TO BE LIKE MIKE

The Statesmen will be wearing Nike head-to-toe this season after DSU Athletics finalized a deal with the athletic apparel giant last summer.

STATESMEN, NOT FIGHTING OKRA

Despite some rowdy student objections, athletic programs at Delta State University do not use the student-chosen sub-mascot, Fighting Okra. The Fighting Okra, the most vicious of all vegetables, was created by a band of students at DSU in the late 1980's and early 1990's. While some on campus embrace the scary veggie, DSU Athletics does not. Our programs have always been, and will continue to be the Statesmen and Lady Statesmen. If you have a problem with that, take it up with the vegetable in the corner with boxing gloves.
