FLORIDA RETURNS TO "THE SWAMP" FOR HOMECOMING AGAINST VANDY

■The Florida-Vanderbilt game will mark the 41st meeting between the Gators and Commodores. UF has won each of the last 16 meetings and owns a 25-3-1 edge in the last 29 games between the schools and a 29-9-2 series advantage overall. The Gators enter the game with a 5-3 overall record and are 3-3 in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt is 5-3 overall and 2-3 in the league after facing Miami (Ohio) last Saturday.

GATORS AT HOME UNDER COACH MEYER

■Since Urban Meyer's first season at the University of Florida in 2005, the Gators have posted a 16-1 (.941) record at home. The chart below shows where the Gators rank nationally in several statistics in home games since the 2005 season:

■The Vanderbilt game serves as the Captain's Legacy Weekend, which is an initiative by Coach Meyer to invite UF's former captains to take part in several activities surrounding the game, including attending the team dinner Friday night.

GATORS YOUNG IN 2007

■Overall, 49 players who have seen action in a game this year are either freshmen or sophomores. Eighteen of the 49 are true freshmen this season and 33 are either true or redshirt freshmen.

■UF returned 10 scholarship seniors and 11 scholarship juniors in 2007. Other than Florida's 21 combined upperclassmen, there is not a school in the Southeastern Conference and only one in the state of Florida (FIU) that has fewer than 28 combined juniors and seniors returning and the average in the SEC is 34.

■A total of 19 Gators have made their first career start this season (Tebow, Ma. Pouncey, Pupello, Hernandez, Henry, Cooper, Cunningham, A.J. Jones, Pierre-Louis, Haden, Munroe, Antwine, Nelson, Hurt, James, Wright, Fayson, Rickerson, Stamper).

■Entering the Ole Miss game (UF's first road game of the year), 35 members of the Florida travel roster had not played in a road game. Among the total were 18 true freshmen who were making the first road trip of their careers.

■There are 57 players on the Florida scholarship roster that are either a freshman or sophomore (73 percent).

GATOR STORYLINES

■This year's game will be UF's 83rd annual Homecoming contest. Florida has an all-time record of 60-20-2 in Homecoming games. The Gators have won 17 straight Homecoming contests, marking the longest Homecoming winning streak in school history.

■Coach Meyer is 17-5 all-time and 6-1 at UF in the month of November and has won 12 of the last 13 outings in the month. Over the past four years, Urban Meyer-led teams have gone 12-1 in the month with the one loss coming on Nov. 12, 2005 at South Carolina (30-22).

Sun Sports, with David Steele (play-by-play), Larry Vettel (color) and Steve Babik (sideline) will air the game at 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 4, on Sun Sports "Breakfast with the Gators" and again Tuesday, Nov. 6, at 11 p.m. (replays available in SEC territory).

THE GATOR RADIO NETWORK

The Gator Radio Network team of Mick Hubert (play-by-play), Lee McGriff (color) and Steve Babik (sideline) will broadcast the contest. Scot Brantley joins Babik as co-host of pregame. WFXJ radio (930-AM in Jacksonville) serves as UF's flagship station. The pre-game show begins two hours before kickoff. There is also a 90-minute show following the conclusion of the game.

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

■Of the 25 true freshmen on the Florida squad, 14 spent last season on a team that played for a state championship during their senior season.

■Florida returned 38 letterwinners to the 2007 team. The total is the lowest in the SEC and tied with six others for the 99th-lowest total in the nation.

■Florida lost 25 letterwinners from the 2006 national championship team. The total is tied with Tennessee for the most lost in the SEC and it is tied for the 13th-highest amount lost in the nation.

■Going into 2006, the Gators brought back 10 players who began playing for UF in the fall semester of 2002. In 2007, Florida returned three that started in the fall of 2003 (Andre Caldwell, Clint McMillan and Carlton Medder).

Florida Freshmen Notes From 2007 Season

■UF started a true freshman on opening day for the third-straight year under head coach Urban Meyer.

■UF started three true freshmen on opening day for the first time in school history (Maurkice Pouncey, Joe Haden and Chas Henry). Haden and Pouncey became the first true freshmen to start on opening day in UF history at cornerback and offensive guard, respectively. Chas Henry was the eighth true freshman punter to start on opening day.

■Tight end Aaron Hernandez started the Troy game and became the first true freshman to start at the position since Tate Casey did so against Middle Tennessee State in 2004. Also, free safety Major Wright started the Auburn game. The last true freshman to start at free safety for Florida was Lester Norwood against The Citadel in 1998.

■Overall, 42 players who saw action in the 2007 season opener were either freshmen or sophomores. Fourteen true freshmen played, as did 10 redshirt freshmen. UF played 64 players total, 21 of those were making their first-ever appearance in "The Swamp."

■Florida's 14 true freshmen and 24 overall freshmen that played in the season opener were the most by any team in the Southeastern Conference.

HEAD COACH URBAN MEYER

■Coach Meyer has started his Florida career with a 16-1 (.941) record in "The Swamp" and is 38-3 (.927) at home as a head coach. In addition, Coach Meyer has opened his career at UF with a 20-2 record in games played in the state of Florida.

■With the win over Kentucky following Florida's bye week this year, Urban Meyer moved to 23-2 (.920) all-time when having more than one week to prepare for a game.

■With the win over Tennessee, Urban Meyer became the only head coach in Florida history to open his career with three-straight wins over the Vols.

■Florida has been ranked in the AP, Coaches' and BCS polls each week since Urban Meyer's arrival in Gainesville, which is a streak of 40-straight AP and Coaches' polls (based on polls as of Oct. 21).

SERIES NOTES

■ Florida and Vanderbilt were both charter members of the SEC when it began play in 1933. However, the two schools never met until 1945, with Vanderbilt posting a 7-0 win in the initial contest, which was played in Gainesville.

■ Florida's 38-7 victory in 1995 was its 12th consecutive SEC win, which set a school record for consecutive league wins, breaking the previous mark of 11 set by the 1990-92 UF teams.

THE TEAM

■Starting with the Kentucky game, the Gators are wearing a sticker on their helmets that reads "Sunshine" in honor of Michael Guilford, who passed on Oct. 12, 2007.

■Florida returns to Gainesville this week after completing a stretch of three-straight games against ranked opponents away from home for only the third time in school history. The 1997 and 2003 teams also played three consecutive games against ranked opponents away from home.

■Last week (Oct. 21 rankings), the SEC Eastern Division featured four ranked teams, which is as

2006 UF 25 VU 19
 (Nashville) Quarterback Chris Leak ran for two touchdowns and Florida's special teams blocked two punts as Gators claimed the road victory. UF's win, coupled with Tennessee's loss to LSU, clinched the Eastern Division crown.

2005 UF 49 VU 42 (2OT)
 (Gainesville) An interception by Reggie Lewis on a pass by Commodore quarterback Jay Cutler ended the game. On the previous possession, wide receiver Jemalle Cornelius hauled in a 16-yard reception from Chris Leak with a dramatic catch in the back of the end zone. Leak finished with a career-high 32 completions in 41 attempts for 257 yards and passed for three TDs.

2004 UF 34 VU 17
 (Nashville) Quarterback Chris Leak was 22-of-29 for 307 yards with two touchdowns passing and another one rushing, while Ciatrick Fason gained 170 yards on 26 carries and a touchdown to become the fourth-fastest Gator to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark in a season.

2003 UF 35 VU 17
 (Gainesville) Keiwan Ratliff broke the single-season interception record by nabbing his eighth interception with 56 seconds remaining in the game and returned the ball 52 yards into the end zone to put the game away. The running back trio of Ran Carthon, DeShawn Wynn and Ciatrick Fason rushed for 181 yards. Chris Leak went 15-for-25 with 179 yards passing and one touchdown.

2002 UF 21 VU 17
 (Nashville) Earnest Graham topped the 100-yard mark for the third time on the season and the Florida defense made a pivotal fourth-down stand with just over 90 seconds remaining to give UF a hard-fought win.

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

POSTSEASON HONORS

WR PERCY HARVIN - Biletnikoff Award Semi-finalist - presented to the nation's top wide receiver. The field will be narrowed to three finalists in Nov. and the winner will be announced Dec. 6 in Orlando.

DE DERRICK HARVEY - Lott Trophy - presented to the player who exhibits the same characteristics Ronnie Lott embodied during his career: Integrity, Maturity, Performance Academics, Community and Tenacity.

Winner announced at The Pacific Club on Dec. 9.

DE DERRICK HARVEY - Hendricks Award - presented to the Defensive End of the Year. Six finalists are announced in November and the winner will be announced Dec. 5.

DE DERRICK HARVEY - Bednarik Award Watch List - presented to the nation's outstanding defensive player.

Twelve semifinalists will be announced in October and the field will be trimmed to three finalists in November 19. The winner will be announced on the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show December 6.

QB TIM TEBOW; WR PERCY HARVIN; WR ANDRE CALDWELL - Maxwell Award Watch List - presented to the collegiate player of the year.

Twelve semifinalists will be announced in October and the field will be trimmed to three finalists in November 19.

QB TIM TEBOW - Manning Award Watch List - presented to the nation's top quarterback.

The Manning Award was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton, and Eli Manning, and will be presented to the recipient following the holiday bowl season. It is the only quarterback award that takes into consideration the candidates' bowl performances. Finalists for the award will be announced prior to the beginning of the bowl season.

■ This season, Florida has scored consecutive points against its opponents in impressive stretches:

■ In Florida's SEC opener, the Gators defeated Tennessee, 59-20. The loss was the worst for the Volunteers since a 44-0 loss to Georgia in 1981 and the 39-point margin was the highest in the Tennessee series ever for a Gator win.

THE OFFENSE

■ Florida's scoring offense is ranked 10th nationally and second in the Southeastern Conference (39.1). The last time Florida ended a season ranked first in scoring offense was in 2001 (43.8). The Florida offense has scored on 47 of its 89 drives this year for a league-best 52.8 percent.

■ Florida's offense is averaging 39.5 points per game against ranked opponents this season. The total is the third-highest nationally and best among teams that have played more than one ranked opponent this year.

■ This season, Florida is averaging 5.0 yards per rush, which is tied for the fifth-best total in school history (record is 5.9 in 1976) and the Gators are completing 66.0 percent of their passes, also second-best in UF history (68.8 in 1982).

■ UF started the year with four-consecutive games with 500-plus yards in total offense. The streak of four was the longest since UF started the 2001 season with five games of 500-plus yards of total offense.

■ Florida's 21 rushing touchdowns are tied for tied for 14th nationally and are the third-highest total by an SEC team.

■ On the season, the Gators are 46-of-89 on third-down conversions (52.0 pct.). UF ranks first in the SEC and third nationally on third-down conversions. In record dating back to 1979, the best mark in a single-season by the Gators on third downs was 51.9 in 1994 (82 of 158).

■ The Florida offense is 37-of-42 in the red zone this season, with 31 touchdowns and six field goals. This season, UF has been perfect in the red zone in four games (including two of the last three games). UF was perfect in the red zone in three games during 2006.

■ Under head coach Urban Meyer, the Gators have out-rushed 28 of 33 opponents (10-of-12 in 2005, 12-of-13 in 2006, 6-of-8 in 2007).

QUARTERBACKS

■ Tim Tebow's passer rating of 176.5 is the highest in the nation. He has completed 65.8 percent of his passes, which is the 16th-highest mark in the country and is the best in the Southeastern Conference. Tebow has thrown 11 passes for 40-or-more yards this season, which is already six higher than UF did all of last season.

■ Tim Tebow has rushed for 12 touchdowns in 2007, which are tied for the fifth-highest single-season total in school history with Tommy Durrance who had 12 in 1969 (Emmitt Smith, 14, 1989; Buford Long, 14, 1952). Tebow's 20 career rushing touchdowns are the ninth-highest total in school history (36, Emmitt Smith, 1987-89).

■ Tim Tebow's 12 rushing touchdowns this season are just one shy of the SEC record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.:

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

■ Tim Tebow has accounted for 30 touchdowns this season, which is tied with Shane Matthews (1991) for the fifth-highest single season total in UF history.

■ During the Georgia game, Tim Tebow scored his 12th rushing touchdown of the year to build on the single-season record for rushing TDs by a quarterback. As a freshman, Tebow had eight, which equaled Jimmy Fisher's mark set in 1976.

■ In Florida's game against Georgia, Tim Tebow rushed for two touchdowns to bring his career total to 20 and his season total to 12. Tebow's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2007 rank as the top total in the nation by a quarterback and are tied for ninth nationally among all players:

■ Tim Tebow's 12 rushing touchdowns this season are as many or more than 52 teams currently have combined in Division I-A. Tebow is averaging 313.8 yards of total offense a game, which is higher than the total of 12 teams in Division I-A.

■ Against Georgia, Tim Tebow rushed for a touchdown for the ninth-straight game, which built upon his own school record (Errict Rhett, seven-straight, 1991-92 seasons). The current streak is longer than that of any other player in the nation:

■ Tim Tebow is Florida's active career leader in rushing yards with 1,032, which is a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback. The previous career record for rushing yards by a quarterback at UF was 786 by Larry Libetore (1960-62).

■ In his career, Tim Tebow has run the ball 227 times for 1,032 yards a UF record for quarterbacks.

■ Over the past three seasons, Tim Tebow has been a part of teams that have gone 31-6 overall. As the starting quarterback at Nease High School as a senior in 2005, he helped lead the school to its first-ever Class 4A state championship. As a freshman at UF in 2006, he played in all 14 games in his role as the backup quarterback on the national championship squad. He is 5-3 as Florida's starting quarterback in 2007.

■ Against Ole Miss, Tim Tebow finished the game with 427 yards of total offense which is the top performance in the SEC this year and the sixth-highest in school history. Tebow rushed for 166 yards on 27 carries. His rushing total was the second-highest by any quarterback in the nation this season, while his carries were the most.

■ Tim Tebow's 166 rushing yards against Ole Miss set a single-game record for a UF quarterback and were the most by any UF player since Ciatrick Fason rushed for 170 on 26 carries vs. Vanderbilt in 2004. The previous single-game rushing high by a quarterback was 109 by Larry Rentz (vs. Tulane, 10/14/67). Tebow's 27 carries were the most by a UF player since Fason rushed 31 times against Kentucky in 2004. The total was also one short of the single game record by a UF sophomore held by Emmitt Smith (vs. Kentucky, 1988).

■ Tim Tebow was the ninth consecutive season-opening quarterback to take over as a starter as a freshman or sophomore following Wayne Peace, Kerwin Bell, Kyle Morris, Shane Matthews, Danny Wuerffel, Doug Johnson, Rex Grossman and Chris Leak. Bell, Matthews, Wuerffel and Grossman led UF to either the best record in the SEC or a league title in their first year as a starter.

■ In his first career start, Tim Tebow finished 13-of-17 for 300 yards and three touchdowns against Western Kentucky to become the first UF quarterback to throw for 300-or-more yards in his first career start since Shane Matthews (1990, 332).

RUNNING BACKS

■ Kestahn Moore is second on the team with four rushing touchdowns this season. He had only three rushing touchdowns in his career prior to the 2007 season.

■ In the LSU game, UF averaged 4.9 yards per rush against a Tiger squad that was ranked No. 1 in the nation allowing just 1.3 yards per rush entering the game. Kestahn Moore averaged 6.6 yards per

■ Florida makes its last road trip of the season as the Gators travel to Columbia, S.C., for a meeting with South Carolina on Saturday, Nov. 10. Florida and South Carolina will play for the 28th time, including the 16th time in South-eastern Conference play since USC joined the league in 1992. Florida leads the series, 20-4-3, and has claimed 14 of the last 15 meetings with both schools members of the SEC. Each of Florida's four losses in the overall series have come in Columbia, however, the Gators own the lead in games played at South Carolina (8-4-1).

The largest crowd in Florida Field history (75,459) and a national television audience on ESPN looked on as the Florida Gators dominated in every phase of the game on the way to a shocking 48-7 upset of the fourth-ranked and previously unbeaten Auburn Tigers. The victory was the largest ever for UF against Auburn and marked the worst loss of Pat Dye's Tiger coaching career.

The 7-1 start marked only the sixth time in UF history that a Gator team has posted at least a 7-1 record after the first eight games of the season.

The Gators' dominance was evident in virtually every statistical category, as the Tigers were held to an all-time low of -14 yards rushing and could muster only 172 yards of total offense.

Nov. 3, 2001- Florida vs. Vanderbilt
UF 71, Vanderbilt 13 – Gainesville, Fla.

Florida put on an impressive offensive, defensive, and special teams' display on Homecoming as it defeated Vanderbilt, 71-13. The 58-point margin of victory was UF's third largest-ever vs. a SEC opponent.

The Gators scored 10 touchdowns, totaled 28 first downs and were never forced to punt in the game. UF's defense forced five turnovers (two interceptions/three fumble recoveries) and limited Vanderbilt to 63 yards rushing and 272 total offensive yards.

INSTANT REPLAY

For the 2007 season, the rules committee is allowing several varying systems to implement video replay, as determined by each conference or institution. Each head coach is allowed one Instant Replay challenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a team timeout. A head coach may issue a challenge only if his team has one or more timeouts remaining in the half. If the challenged ruling is overturned, the timeout is not charged, but the coach has no more challenges during that game.

Plays that **MAY** be reviewed:

1. Governed by sideline, goal line and end line:

- Scoring plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line.
- Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line.
- Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
- Recovery of loose ball in bounds.

2. Passing Plays:

- Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
- Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
- Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
- Quarterback (passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
- Illegal forward pass or illegal handing beyond the line of scrimmage.
- Illegal forward pass or illegal handing after change of possession.
- Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage.

3. Other detectable infractions:

- Runner ruled not down.
- Forward progress errors with respect to first down.
- Touching of a kick.
- Number of players on field.
- Clock adjustments.
- Fourth-down/try fumble plays.
- Fumble recovery on fourth down or try
- Muffed or fumbled kick
- Incorrect down number
- Bench interference

Plays that **MAY NOT** be reviewed:

- Holding
- Offside/encroachment
- Pass interference
- Personal fouls (e.g., late hits)

carry. Florida finished with 156 yards on the game after the Tigers surrendered just 195 rushing yards in its five previous games (nation's best 39.0 yards per game).

■This season, the Florida running backs have carried the ball 92 times for 495 yards and four rushing touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 5.4 yards per carry.

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

■This season, Percy Harvin is first on the team with 933 all-purpose yards and is averaging 116.6 yards per game. He has rushed for 329 yards on 43 carries and has a team-leading 36 catches for 604 yards. Harvin's 329 rushing yards are the second-highest total in the nation for any receiver. Harvin's 7.7 yards per carry is the highest among all receivers in the country.

■Percy Harvin has 701 rushing yards in his career, which are the most by a Florida wide receiver in school history. The second-highest total is Wes Chandler's 356 (1976-77). Harvin's 428 rushing yards in 2006 are the top single-season total by a UF receiver. His 272 yards this year are already the third-highest, as Wes Chandler had 353 in 1977.

■Over the last six games, Percy Harvin has had 38 catches for 565 yards (14.8 yards per catch and 94.1 yards per game). Over the last two games, Harvin has carried the ball 16 times for 144 yards (averaging 9.0 yards per rush)

■This season, Harvin has seen the ball 79 times (36 receptions and 43 carries) and is averaging 11.8 yards per touch.

■Percy Harvin finished the Georgia game with 97 yards on a career-high 10 rushing attempts, his most in a game this season. Harvin's previous season-high was 75 rushing yards against Tennessee. His career-high is 105 vs. Arkansas in the 2006 SEC Championship Game.

■Against Georgia, Jarred Fayson caught a career-high three passes for 62 yards, including a career-long 30-yard reception.

■With his 119-yard receiving performance against Auburn, Percy Harvin became the first Gator to have three-straight 100-yard receiving games since Reche Caldwell put together a four-game stretch during the 2001 season (vs. Kentucky, Mississippi State, LSU and Auburn).

■Against Tennessee, Percy Harvin became the fourth Gator to have a 100-yard receiving game. Last season, only two Florida receivers went over 100 yards and they did so only four times.

■Against Tennessee, Riley Cooper caught his third touchdown of the season, which is tied with Percy Harvin and Louis Murphy for the second-highest total on the squad. Cooper has caught six passes this season total (50 percent of his receptions are for touchdowns). He has caught 10 passes on his career and six have been for touchdowns (60 percent).

■As a group, the Florida wide receivers have carried the ball 63 times for 452 yards and three touchdowns (avg. 7.2 yards per carry).

■This season is the third time in school history that UF has had four different players with 100-yard receiving games (1985, 1993). UF has never had five different players with 100-yard games in a single season.

■This season, three Florida wide receivers have taken direct snaps, as Andre Caldwell, Percy Harvin and Jarred Fayson have done so. Running back Kestahn Moore has also taken a direct snap.

■Andre Caldwell needs 29 catches to establish a new school record for career receptions (172, Carlos Alvarez, 1969-71). With four catches against Georgia, Caldwell increased his total to 144 which is the sixth-highest career total at UF. Caldwell's brother (Reche) stands at eighth on the career list with 141. Caldwell's 10 receptions over the last two games combined have led all Gators.

■Riley Cooper led the Gator receivers in the season opener against Western Kentucky with four receptions for 122 yards and two touchdowns, while Andre Caldwell finished the day with three catches for 103 yards. The two were the first Gator duo to have over 100 yards receiving in the same game since Jemalle Cornelius and Chad Jackson did so against Kentucky in 2005.

■In 2006, Percy Harvin became the first freshman since 2003 (LSU's Justin Vincent) to be chosen as the Most Valuable Player of the SEC Championship Game. Harvin became the fifth player in school history to earn the distinction and the fourth to return the following year. The chart below shows how

■ Under the guidance of position coach Billy Gonzales, the leading receiver on the team over the last six years has averaged 76.5 receptions a season. Also, UF's Chad Jackson tied the school record with 88 receptions in 2005 and Utah's Paris Warren had a school-record 80 receptions in 2004.

OFFENSIVE LINE

■ Florida opened the Georgia game with the following lineup on the offensive line: Jason Watkins (LT), Jim Tartt (LG), Drew Miller (C), Maurkice Pouncey (RG), Carlton Medder (RT). Pouncey, who had missed starting the Ole Miss game, returned to the lineup against the Auburn. Pouncey has started seven out of eight games at the right guard position this season.

■ In the LSU game, Drew Miller graded out at 88 percent. The grade was the highest Miller has received in his UF career. Carlton Medder graded out a career-high 94 percent against Troy, which is the best mark by any Gator this season.

■ Drew Miller and Carlton Medder started every game in the 2006 season and Jim Tartt started all but one (Vanderbilt due to an ankle injury). The three have combined for 72 starts on the offensive line in their careers. Miller and Medder have started 22 consecutive games, which are the longest active streaks on the Florida squad.

■ The offensive line has not allowed a sack in four out of eight games this season (WKU, UT, Ole Miss and Auburn) and has allowed five all season. In 2006, the unit allowed only 23 sacks after giving up 35 in 2005. Last year, UF gave up only one or less sacks seven times and in 2005 they did so on only three occasions.

■ Against Western Kentucky, Drew Miller was the third different senior in three years at starting center under head coach Urban Meyer at Florida (2005, Mike Degory; 2006, Steve Rissler).

■ Phil Trautwein, who started every game last season, suffered a stress fracture in his right foot during August practices and has not played this season.

■ Michael and Maurkice Pouncey are the fifth and sixth freshmen offensive linemen in school history to enroll early and participate in spring drills. All six have done it under head coach Urban Meyer.

THE DEFENSE

■ UF opponents have gained 1,103 yards rushing for an average of 3.1 per carry (20th nationally).

■ This season, the Gators have scored two defensive touchdowns. The first came when Dustin Doe returned a fumble 18 yards against Tennessee. Wondy Pierre-Louis had the second when he intercepted a pass and ran it back 25 yards against Georgia.

■ Against Kentucky, the Florida defense recorded a season-high six sacks, the most by a Gator team since six against the Wildcats last season. Florida's six are tied for the second-best single-game effort in the SEC this season.

■ Against Auburn, UF had 12 tackles behind the line of scrimmage as a team, which is the highest team total since 13 against The Citadel in 1998.

■ Dating back to last season, the Gator defense has held six of its last 11 opponents to under 60 yards rushing. In 16 of the last 22 games, the Gators have held their opponents to 100 yards rushing or less.

■ In the last 58 games, the Gators have scored points off turnovers in 39 games. 223 of UF's points under head coach Urban Meyer have come off turnovers.

■ The Florida defensive staff finished the 2006 season with 115 years of combined collegiate coaching experience: Chuck Heater (31), Doc Holliday (29), Greg Mattison (31), Charlie Strong (24).

■ This season, Brandon Spikes and Dustin Doe rank as Florida's leading tacklers with 74 and 59, respectively.

■ The SEC is the only conference in the nation with four teams ranked inside the AP preseason top 15 (No. 2 LSU, No. 6 Florida, No. 13 Georgia, No. 15 Tennessee). The SEC is one of four conferences in the nation to have two teams ranked inside the AP preseason top 10 (Big East, Big 10, Big 12).

■ In 11 of the past 12 seasons, the SEC has had five-or-more teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25. In 2003, the SEC had four and in 2001 and this season, the SEC had six (including preseason No. 1 Florida). Every other season, the year started off with five league teams ranked in the AP top 25 to begin with.

■ Redshirt sophomore Ryan Stamper made the first start of his career against Georgia. Stamper became the 19th different Gator to make his first career start this season.

DEFENSIVE LINE

■ Florida's starting defensive line against Georgia was the following: Derrick Harvey (DE), Javier Estopinan (NT), Clint McMillan (DT) and Jermaine Cunningham (DT). UF has opened with this lineup in seven out of eight games this season.

■ Defensive end Derrick Harvey recorded one and a half sacks at Kentucky to bring his career total to 18.5. With the effort, Harvey improved to ninth on Florida's all-time career list. Harvey has had a tackle for a loss in seven of the last eight games and a sack in three of the last five outings.

■ Over the last nine games, Derrick Harvey has totaled nine and a half sacks. Harvey did not get his first sack of the 2006 season until the fourth game. He ended last year with a team-leading 11. The sack output tied for the fifth-highest single-season total in school history, as well as the third-highest by a defensive lineman in the UF record books.

■ Against LSU, Jermaine Cunningham had a career-high 17 tackles. The total was the second-best effort in the SEC this season and the most by a Florida player since Channing Crowder had 18 against Miss. State on Oct. 23, 2004.

■ Justin Trattou made the first interception of his college career against Troy. Trattou became the second UF defensive lineman to intercept a pass under Coach Meyer (Joe Cohen, 2005).

SECONDARY

■ Kyle Jackson was UF's starting strong safety in the Georgia game. Jackson made his first start since the Ole Miss game.

■ Against Georgia, Wondy-Pierre Louis made the first interception of his career. He was the sixth different Gator to have an interception this season. Pierre-Louis returned the interception for his second career touchdown. He also scored a touchdown on a fumble recovery in the 2006 SEC Championship Game against Arkansas. In 2006, the Gators had five players make interceptions.

■ Against Kentucky, Jacques Rickerson made the first start of his Gator career. In addition, Markihe Anderson returned to action for the first time since the Tennessee game.

■ Florida has had an interception in 31 of the past 46 games. In 2006, Florida led the SEC with 21 interceptions. UF's 16 in 2005 tied with Georgia for the highest amount by any team in the league.

■ Florida's defense has intercepted 80 passes since 2003, when Charlie Strong took over as defensive coordinator. The four-year total is tied for the sixth-highest in the nation over the time period and is the best among SEC teams:

■ Until Florida's season opener against Western Kentucky, no cornerback on the Gator roster had started a collegiate game. UF opened the game with Wondy Pierre-Louis and Joe Haden at corner, which marked the second-straight season and the third time in the last six years that UF had two new starters at corner.

SPECIAL TEAMS

■ Florida and Navy are the only schools in the nation to allow only three punt returns this season. The Gators have given up only 22 yards on the three returns, which is also the lowest total in the country. The UF school record for fewest punt return yards allowed in a season was 47 yards on 11 punt

returns in 1990.

■ Brandon James had his fifth return of 50-plus yards on the year with a 52-yard kick return against Georgia. Last season, James had just one kick return over 50 yards (77-yard punt return for a touchdown against Western Carolina).

■ Brandon James is averaging 29.3 yards per kickoff return. The single-season school record is 28.2 by Jack Jackson in 1993. James is also averaging 17.1 yards per punt return, the top mark by a Gator player since Allen Trammell averaged 17.1 during the 1964 season.

■ Against Georgia, Joey Ijjas connected on a career-long 43-yard field goal midway through the second quarter.

■ Against Tennessee, Brandon James returned the first punt of the game for an 83-yard touchdown. It was the longest punt return of his career and tied for the fifth-longest in school history (George Gandy, vs. Tulane, 1966). James finished the day with three punt returns for 91 yards and four kick-off returns for 102 yards (193 total on the day).

■ Brandon James' 83-yard punt return for a touchdown against Tennessee was the second of his career. The Florida record punt returns for a touchdown in a career belongs to Jacquez Green (4, 1995-97).

■ Florida has a new punter (Chas Henry) and placekicker (Joey Ijjas) this season. Throughout the first eight games, Henry has punted 25 times for an average of 38.8 yards. Henry's season-long (53 yards) came in UF's last outing against Georgia. He has placed eight inside the 20-yard line this season. Ijjas is 40-of-40 on extra points through the first seven outings and is seven-of-nine on field goals.

■ Over the last six games, Chas Henry is averaging 44.6 yards per punt (six punts for 268 yards) and he has had two 50-plus yard punts.

■ In the Troy game, UF blocked two punts for the first time since the 2006 Vanderbilt game. Carlos Dunlap and Roderick Blackett each blocked the first punt of their Florida careers.

ATTENDANCE NOTES

■ In 2006, Florida ranked ninth nationally in average attendance with a total of 90,409.

■ The attendance of 90,716 for the Tennessee game on Sept. 17, 2005 established a school record. The previous school record of 90,707 was set against Wyoming in the 2005 season opener on Sept. 3. The school-record-setting crowd was the largest ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 13 Super Bowls, two BCS national title games and has featured a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title in a bowl game 18 times.

■ The attendance for the '05 season opener (90,707) was the largest opening-day crowd in Florida history. The previous record was 90,011 against San Jose State in the 2003 opener. The Gators opened the 2004 season against Eastern Michigan in front of a crowd of 90,009.

■ The attendance of Florida's game at Tennessee (109,061) on Sept. 18, 2004, was the largest ever to see a Gator team play.

■ The attendance for the 2004 Florida-Georgia game was an Alltel Stadium record (84,753). The previous record of 84,433 was set at the Florida-Georgia game in 2002.

■ The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 25 years (1982-2006) and have ranked among the nation's top-nine schools in each of the last 16 years (1991-2006).

■ UF's average of 90,409 fans per home game in 2006 ranked as the best single-season mark in school history. The mark bettered that of the 2005 season, in which the Gators averaged 90,406.

■ Florida maintains a current streak of 114-consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. Here is where UF ranks nationally for current consecutive sellouts:

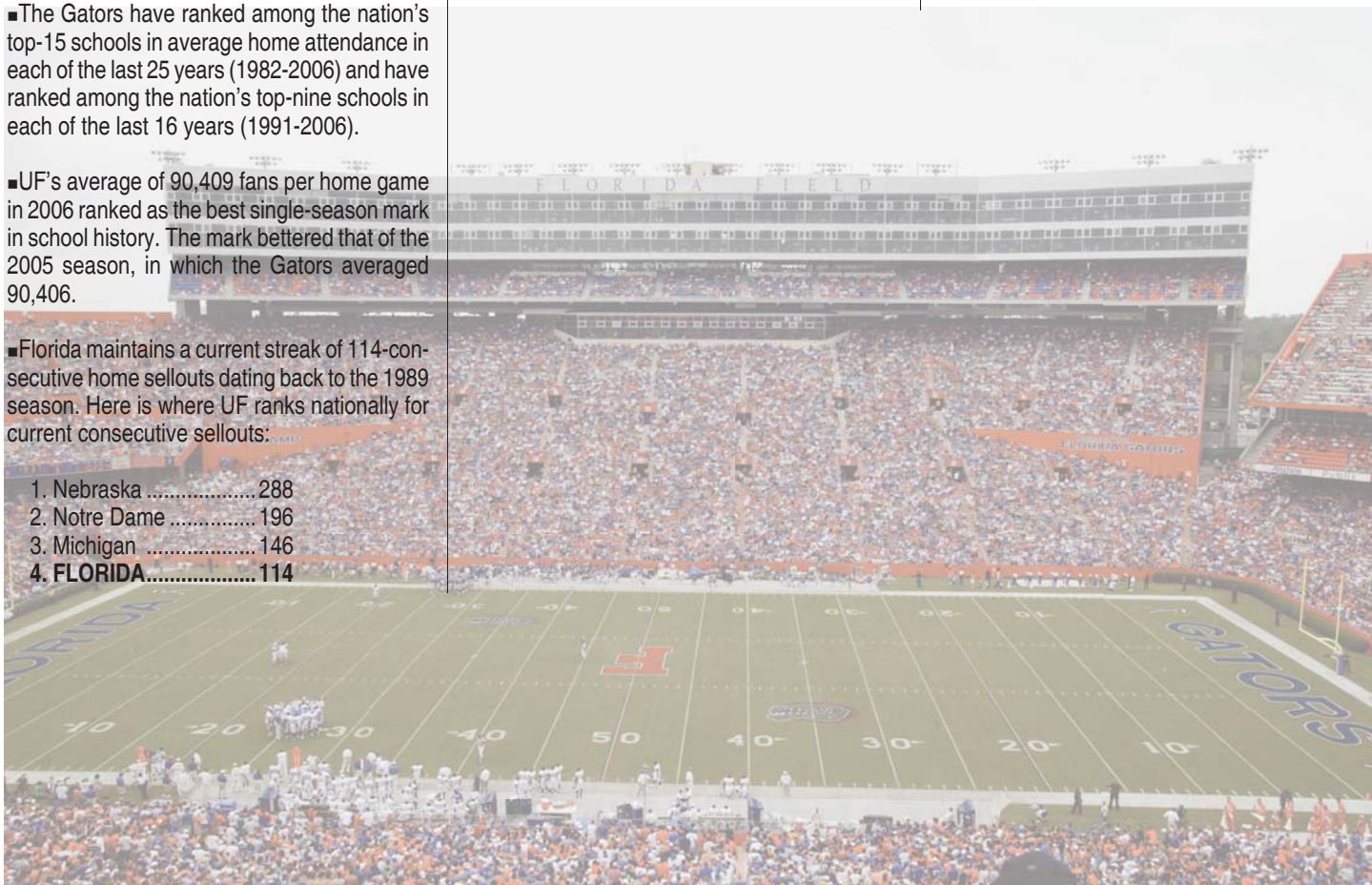

LEGENDARY STATUS...

THE ONLY SCHOOL IN THE NATION TO:

- One of three schools in major college history, and the only one in the SEC, to win at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001).

- One of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade (102 wins in the 1990s).

- The only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).

- The only school in SEC history, and one of only three in major college history, to win at least 10 games for a period of six-straight years (1993-98).

- Post a perfect 8-0 conference record in back-to-back seasons (1995-96).

- The only school in SEC history, and one of only four schools in major college history, to rank in the top 15 of the final polls in 12-consecutive seasons (1990-2001).

- Its 87-13 SEC record from 1990 to the seventh conference game of 2001 is the best league record over a 100 SEC game-time period in conference history.

- It holds the SEC record for most consecutive seasons (12) with at least six league wins, a streak that doubled the previous record of six set by Alabama from 1961-66.

- With Jarvis Moss (Denver) and Reggie Nelson (Jacksonville) selected in the first round, Florida had two first-round draft picks for the ninth time in school history. UF had two defensive players taken in the first round for the fourth time in school history.

- Florida led the nation in 2007 with nine former players selected in the NFL Draft and there were 18 members of last year's team either drafted or signed as a free agent. The Gators have led the SEC in total draft selections twice in the last five years. In 2003, eight UF players were chosen.

- Since the inaugural NFL Draft in 1936, a Florida player has been selected in the first-round 37 times, covering 27 separate seasons. It marks the seventh-most number of years for a top pick by any school in the nation.

- One of only two schools to have had at least one first-round draft selection in 18 of the last 25 drafts.

- UF had at least 40 players chosen in the NFL Draft for the decades of 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980 and 1990. UF already has 44 selections from the years 2000-07. The total is one shy of the school record for choices in a decade (45, 1990s).

- The Gators had at least one NFL first-round draft choice for nine-straight seasons (1983-91). This marked the second-longest streak by any college in the history of the draft.

FLORIDA NFL NOTES

- Florida had 31 players on 2007 NFL opening-day rosters, which was the ninth-highest total in the nation. In 2005, UF's 37 players were tied for the second-highest total of any school in the country. Overall, the Gators had 44 players on NFL rosters during the 2006 regular season.

- The Gators had at least one player (including practice squads) on 17 of the 32 NFL teams. Here is the breakdown of former Gators on active NFL rosters: 7 DE, 7 WR, 5 DT, 4 LB, 3 CB, 3 RB, 3 S, 2 TE, 1 FB, 1 G, 1 QB, 1 T.

- Florida's three quarterbacks on 2006 NFL rosters ranked as the second-highest total from any college in the country behind Michigan's four.

- Florida's six wide receivers on 2006 NFL rosters were the second-highest total from any school in the nation. UF's six wide receivers on 2005 NFL rosters tied for the highest total nationally and in 2004 Florida's seven wide receivers on NFL rosters were the most in the country.

Former Gator Emmitt Smith became the NFL's all-time leading rusher on Sunday, Oct. 27, 2002, with an 11-yard run against the Seattle Seahawks in Dallas. Smith surpassed the long-time record held by Walter Payton, who rushed for 16,726 yards.



On April 12, 2003, Florida fans got the opportunity to recognize one of their own as Emmitt Smith was honored at halftime of the 2003 Orange and Blue Spring game.

Smith was a three-time All-American at the University of Florida from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928 yards. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. On Friday, Feb. 4, 2005, Smith retired from the NFL. Smith starred for 13 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and spent his final two seasons with the Arizona Cardinals. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing touchdowns, both of which are the highest totals ever posted in NFL history.
