COMMODORE NOTES

'DORES LOOKING TO END THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK IN SEASON OPENERS

Vanderbilt is looking to open its season with a victory for the first time in four seasons.

In 2014, the Commodores lost to Temple in the opener, dropping the Commodores' all-time record in season openers to 78-44-4.

It was also the team's first loss to a non-conference opponent since 2010 when the 'Dores dropped a 23-21 decision to Northwestern. In the last 25 years, Vanderbilt is 8-9 record against non-SEC teams in openers.

Some other notes on Vanderbilt in season-openers:

- ★ Vanderbilt opens at home this year for the seventh straight season.
- ★ Vanderbilt has dropped its last three openers.

VANDERBILT VS. CONFERENCE USA TEAMS

The Commodores will be seeking to improve on a 25-4 overall record against current Conference USA members when they face the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers.

In 2014, Vanderbilt defeated new C-USA member Old Dominion 42-28 on Nov. 1.

Western Kentucky is a relatively new member of Conference USA, joining the league prior to the 2014 football season.

The Commodores face another member of the conference, Middle Tennessee, on Oct. 3.

Though just 66 miles separates the two campuses, Vanderbilt and Western Kentucky last met when Franklin D. Roosevelt was President of the United States and World War II would come to Europe in a matter of months.

COMMODORES ARE 3-6 ALL-TIME PLAYING ON THURSDAY NIGHT

Vanderbilt opens its fourth straight season with a Thursday night home game on national television when Western Kentucky visits Nashville Sept. 3.

The Commodores have struggled in recent Thursday games, having lost its last three appearances: Temple in 2014, Ole Miss in 2013, and South Carolina in 2012.

It also marks the fifth time since 2008 that Vanderbilt has opened the season on a Thursday night. That year, the Commodores opened with a win at Miami (Ohio).

The WKU game was Vanderbilt's 10th all-time Thursday night appearance, dating back to a 1996 home stint against highly ranked Notre Dame.

VANDERBILT IN NON-SEC PLAY

Vanderbilt has won 12 of its last 13 games against non-SEC teams.

Since the 2011 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-2 against non-SEC teams in regular season action – and 16-3 overall against non-SEC foes including bowl appearances. In the last decade, the Commodores are 29-13 against all non-SEC teams.

In 2014, Vanderbilt went 3-1 in non-league play, defeating Old Dominion, Charleston Southern and UMass, and losing to Temple.

Since an early-season loss at Northwestern in 2012, the Commodores have defeated UMass, Charleston Southern and Old Dominion in 2014, Austin Peay, UMass, UAB and Wake Forest in 2013, and Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest in 2012.

MASON ENTERS SECOND SEASON AS VANDERBILT HEAD COACH

Vanderbilt Head Coach Derek Mason greets a more experienced team in 2015 than his initial unit, and one seeking more success than a year ago.

The Commodore roster features 52 letterwinners, 10 more than the squad Mason greeted last August. It also features seven offensive starters, 11 defensive starters and both starting specialists. The improved depth is exhibited from Vanderbilt's 2014 regular season finale vs. Tennessee: 34 of the 44 players on Vanderbilt's two-deep are expected in uniform when the Commodores face Western Kentucky on Sept. 3.

Immediately after the 2014 season, Mason made three key staff decisions that could pay huge dividends

this season and years to come. Mason's first priority – to attract one of the nation's top conditioning coaches to work with Commodore student-athletes – was closed in late December when University of Nebraska coordinator James Dobson accepted an offer. Needing to improve the Commodore offense, Mason next attracted highly regarded Andy Ludwig as the team's offensive coordinator. Finally, after weeks of deliberation, Mason decided to add defensive coordinator responsibilities to his Vanderbilt duties, joining San Diego State's Rocky Long as the only head coach-defensive coordinator pairing in the nation.

LUDWIG BRINGS HISTORY OF SUCCESS TO VANDERBILT OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR ROLE

Andy Ludwig joins Vanderbilt as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach with a proven history of creating productive offensive attacks and winning football games.

Ludwig has worked more than two decades as an offensive coordinator at the collegiate level, including at the FCS level every year since 2001. In that 14-year span, Ludwig has been involved with 10 teams that have won 8+ games, six teams that have won 9+ games and three teams with 10+ win seasons. His offenses have averaged 31 points since 2001.

Most recently, Ludwig directed the Wisconsin Badgers' 2013-14 offenses to record-book production in Madison.

While helping the Badgers to the program's fifth 11-win season in 2014 and a 20-7 overall record, Ludwig's offense was regarded among the most powerful in Big Ten and team history. In 2014, Wisconsin's 4,482 rushing yards established a new Big Ten record and the unit's 320.1 rushing yards per game as the conference's highest average since 1976.

Ludwig's Wisconsin offense also featured Melvin Gordon, who ended his career as one of the most productive runners in NCAA history. As a senior in 2014, Gordon finished second in the Heisman Trophy voting, won the Doak Walker Award and consensus All-America recognition, and was a finalist for the Maxwell and Walter Camp Player of the Year awards after rushing for 2,587 yards, the second highest single season total in FBS history, and 29 touchdowns. Gordon briefly held the FBS record for single-game rushing yards after amassing 408 yards in three quarters of action vs. Nebraska. Gordon also posted a remarkable average of 206.0 rushing yards in Big Ten Conference action, and ended his career with an amazing 251-yard performance against Auburn in the Outback Bowl.

Ludwig's production at Wisconsin came after a run of similar successes in coordinating roles at San Diego State (2011-12), California (2009-10), Utah (2005-08), Oregon (2002-04) and Fresno State (1998-2001).

FORMER NEBRASKA STRENGTH COORDINATOR LEADING 'DORES CONDITIONING EFFORT

James Dobson, long-time conditioning coordinator at the University of Nebraska, has been guiding the Commodores' strength program since January.

Dobson spent the last seven years guiding Nebraska's conditioning programs under former Cornhusker football head coach Bo Pelini. In Dobson's tenure, Nebraska joined Alabama and Oregon as the only three teams nationally to post at least nine wins every year.

In Dobson's last game with Nebraska, the Cornhuskers faced Southern California in the Holiday Bowl – the Huskers seventh straight postseason appearance.

Under Dobson, the Huskers were regarded among the nation's most outstanding fourth quarter teams. In 2014, the Huskers outscored opponents by a remarkable 119-62 margin. Nebraska also scored more fourth-quarter points by its foes in 2008 (155-52), 2009 (96-32), 2010 (64-53) and 2012 (101-82).

Dobson's conditioning program helped the 2014 Nebraska offense average 37.4 points, 248.2 rushing yards and 446.2 total yards. Dobson's efforts also produced a tenacious Nebraska squad. The Huskers were known for producing remarkable comeback victories in recent years, including four such wins during the 2012 season and a thrilling 37-34 overtime victory over Iowa in the 2014 regular season finale.

Prior to Nebraska, Dobson spent nine years with the University of Iowa program, helping the Hawkeyes to one of the most successful periods in school history.

Dobson also brought his top two Nebraska assistants – Tyler Clarke and Ben Schumacher – to Vanderbilt.

Vanderbilt joins SEC in effort to raise prostate cancer prevention awareness

The Vanderbilt football program, in conjunction with the Southeastern Conference, is kicking off a campaign to highlight prostate cancer prevention and awareness during the opening week of the season.

Helmets worn by all student-athletes on the Commodore squad will feature a commemorative sticker when Vanderbilt faces Western Kentucky this Thursday in the season opener.

Shirts worn by the entire Vanderbilt coaching staff will have feature a similar prostate cancer awareness patch.

Other special awareness activities will take place during the game which kicks off at 7 p.m. in Vanderbilt Stadium.

The Southeastern Conference launched the campaign to honor former commissioner Mike Slive, who coped with the disease during his administrative career. The league's 14 athletics directors voted unanimously in May to recognize Slive by dedicating games in his honor. The Prostate Cancer Awareness Games are scheduled on each of the 14 league campuses during the month of September.

Slive is excited to be in attendance at the Vanderbilt-Western Kentucky game.

Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among American men. Although the disease is serious, most men diagnosed with prostate cancer can successfully fight the disease with early detection. Men over the age of 50 are encouraged to talk with their physicians about their risk for the disease and their options for screening.

Slive was originally diagnosed with prostate cancer in the late 1990s. In October 2014, he announced he was dealing with a recurrence of his prostate cancer and stepped down at the end of the year after serving as commissioner for 13 years. He has been undergoing treatment periodically and plans to attend several of the games during the month of September.

Vanderbilt-Ingram Cancer Center experts are also onboard for this important awareness and prevention campaign. VICC provides multi-disciplinary care for men seeking information, screening options and leading-edge treatment for prostate cancer.

VICC's prostate cancer experts include imaging specialists, urologic surgeons, pathologists, radiation oncologists, medical oncologists and hematologist/oncologists who work together as a comprehensive team to provide high-quality evidence-based care for patients. Members of this team are renowned for their research studies which are routinely published in many of the leading academic medical journals.

One hundred years ago, 1915 squad coached by **Dan McGugin** was a dominant power in the South, becoming just the second of four Commodore units to reach nine wins. The World War I era team went 9-1 overall, winning its first seven games by a combined 459-0 margin. The Commodores' only loss in 1915 came at Virginia. Known as the "Point-A-Minute" Commodores, the 1915 unit was anchored by tackle **Josh Cody**, the only three-time All-America in team history, and a small back named **Irby "Rabbit" Curry**, who would die three years later when his plane was shot down over France.

The 1955 team, celebrating a 60th anniversary this year, will always be remembered by fans as the first Commodore squad to make a postseason appearance. The unit, led by running back **Charley Horton**, receiver **Joe Stephenson** and quarterback **Don Orr** among others, started the season 1-2 before going on a six-game win streak. Finishing the regular season at 7-3, Commodores under **Art Guepe** accepted an invitation to play No. 8 Auburn in the Gator Bowl. Vanderbilt forced five fumbles and scored 12 unanswered points in the second half to claim a 25-13 victory.

MASON'S CAREER AT A GLANCE

COMMODORE DEFENSE RETURNS LEADING TACKLERS FROM A YEAR AGO

Vanderbilt's youth movement on defense in 2014 has resulted in 13 of the team's top 14 tacklers returning this season.

Leading the list of returnees is a pair of inside linebackers, **Nigel Bowden** (R-So.) and **Zach Cunningham** (R-So.). Bowden was the Commodores' leading tackler in 2014, posting 78 tackles as a first-year player. Bowden also ranked first among all Southeastern Conference freshmen in total tackles. Cunningham became a productive contributor after taking over a starting role next to Bowden at midseason. Cunningham finished the year with 67 total tackles, and averaged 8.3 stops during his five starting assignments.

Torren McGaster (R-Jr., CB) paced the Commodore defense with 46 solo tackles, and ranked just behind Bowden and Cunningham with 66 total tackles.

Four other returnees contributed 40 or more tackles during the 2014 campaign: OLB **Stephen Weatherly**, 55; safety **Andrew Williamson**, 54; ILB **Darreon Herring**, 45; and safety **Jahmel McIntosh**, 40.

The only player among Vanderbilt's top 14 tacklers not in uniform is DT **Vince Taylor**.

TOP TWO RECEIVERS RETURNING FOR COMMODORE AERIAL ATTACK

Four of the Commodores' six leading receivers from a year ago, including the top two targets, are back for the 2015 season.

The group is headed by **Steven Scheu** (R-Sr., TE). Scheu earned second team All-SEC honors from coaches after leading the 'Dores with 39 catches and 525 receiving yards. Scheu's totals were the most by a Commodore in more than 30 years.

Latevius Rayford (Jr., WR) returns after posting a solid season in 2014. Rayford finished his sophomore season strongly, posting 20 of his 36 receptions in the final four games. Commodores coaches expect greater production this season from several receiving targets, including **Kris Kentera** (Sr., WR) **Chandler Dorrell** (R-So., WR), **Caleb Scott** (So., WR) and **Nathan Marcus** (R-So., TE).

First-year wide receivers coach **Cortez Hankton** also will watch the development of several talented underclass prospects, including **Trent Sheffield** (So.), **Ronald Monroe** (R-Fr.) and **Rashad Canty** (R-Fr.).

DeAndre Woods (R-Jr.) and **Sean Dowling** (R-So.) are expected to see action after switching to tight end during spring drills.

COMMODORE NOTES

WEBB HOPING TO IMPROVE OFF FRESHMAN YEAR

Ralph Webb returns for his redshirt sophomore campaign after putting together the finest rushing season ever by a Vanderbilt freshman running back.

Webb, a product of Gainesville (Fla.) H.S., produced 907 rushing yards, surpassing the former 'Dore freshman record of 798 yards set by **Kwane Doster** in 2002.

Webb established four freshman rushing marks for the Commodores: single-season rushing yards (907), single-season rush attempts (212), rushing yards in a game (166, vs. Old Dominion), and carries in a game (31, vs. Old Dominion).

Webb's rushing total ranks seventh on Vanderbilt's all-time Top Ten single-season charts.

Webb's 76.0-yard rush average ranked eighth in the SEC last year, trailing only **Cameron Artis-Payne** (Auburn), **Nick Chubb** (Georgia), **Josh Robinson** (Mississippi State), **Jonathan Williams** (Arkansas), **Alex Collins** (Arkansas), **Leonard Fournette** (LSU) and **Russell Hansbrough** (Missouri).

Webb's 907 rushing yards was the 13th highest total among league backs last year _ and ranks sixth among SEC returning rushers.

Webb has also been a workhorse in the Commodore backfield. His 212 rush attempts ranks as the third most in the SEC last year. Webb's total attempts ranks as the third highest single-season total by a Commodore, topped only by **Jermaine Johnson** (267, 1995) and **Corey Harris** (229, 1991).
