VANDERBILT WELCOMES SOUTH CAROLINA WEDNESDAY

Vanderbilt plays four of its final six regular season games at Memorial Gymnasium beginning Wednesday when South Carolina visits for a 7 p.m. contest. The game will not be televised.

The Commodores (16-8, 6-4 Southeastern Conference) have won 10 consecutive home games – one shy of tying the record during the eight-year tenure of head coach Kevin Stallings. A win over the Gamecocks would improve Vanderbilt to 7-4 in the SEC Eastern Division for the first time since the 1999-2000 campaign.

Vanderbilt is coming off an 84-57 loss at Tennessee on Saturday. The Commodores set season lows for points (57), made field goals (17) and field goal shooting percentage (29.8 percent) against the Volunteers. Ross Neltner and Shan Foster led the Commodores with 15 points each. Neltner's point total marked his career-high for an SEC contest. Dan Cage added seven points and tied a career-high with seven rebounds.

South Carolina (12-11, 2-8 SEC) has lost four consecutive games after suffering a 73-54 setback at home against Georgia on Saturday. Tre Kelley led all scorers with 21 points and seven assists. Kelley leads the SEC with 19.7 points per game since the start of league play. Vanderbilt's Derrick Byars is second, averaging 18.0 points.

South Carolina leads the all-time series 21-17. The series is tied 9-9 all-time in Nashville. The road team won both games a year ago with the Gamecocks claiming a 66-64 overtime win in Nashville on Jan. 18 and Vanderbilt pulling off a 57-56 victory in Columbia on Feb. 25.

Tre Kelley hit a driving lay-up with 3.6 seconds left to lift South Carolina to a 66-64 overtime victory over Vanderbilt.

Kelley hit six 3-pointers and scored a career-high 29 points as South Carolina (10-7, 1-3) rallied from a late deficit to stun Vanderbilt (11-4, 2-2) and pick up its first Southeastern Conference victory of the season.

Kelley's final basket came after Vanderbilt's Mario Moore tied the game with a 3-pointer with 16 seconds left in regulation. Moore missed a long 3-point attempt at the buzzer.

Dwayne Day scored 17 points for the Gamecocks, who won at Vanderbilt for the eighth time in their last 10 visits.

South Carolina outscored Vanderbilt 7-0 in the final three minutes of regulation to force overtime as Vanderbilt missed four free throws in the final minute.

Shan Foster made five 3-pointers and scored 17 points to lead the Commodores. Moore scored 12 points, while DeMarre Carroll and Julian Terrell scored 10 points each.

Brandon Wallace sent the game into overtime with a 3-pointer with eight seconds remaining that capped a 7-0 South Carolina run in the final three minutes of regulation.

Vanderbilt went scoreless for the final 4:21 of regulation and the first 4:28 of overtime.

Dan Cage scored 13 points and Vanderbilt rallied from a nine-point deficit to beat South Carolina 57-56.

The Gamecocks' Tarence Kinsey missed an 18-foot jumper just before the buzzer, and South Carolina (14-13, 5-9 Southeastern Conference) lost by one for the second consecutive game.

The Gamecocks were up 50-41 with 6:40 left, but Vanderbilt (14-13, 5-9) hit four 3-pointers and went on a 16-4 run. The Commodores were just 2-for-10 from beyond the arc in the first half.

Cage hit back-to-back 3-pointers in less than one minute and Derrick Byars scored on a layup to give VU a 57-54 lead with 1:36 left. Byars ended with 10 points, while Shan Foster had 11 points.

After Kinsey hit two foul shots with 1:02 left, the Commodores turned it over with 25.8 seconds remaining, setting up the Gamecocks final shot. Actually, South Carolina got two shots -- Kinsey missed a 3 with about seven seconds left then he failed to hit the rim from the corner just before the buzzer.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina (12-11, 2-8 SEC) comes to Nashville Wednesday having lost four consecutive games after a 73-54 setback at home to Georgia on Saturday. The loss was the Gamecocks' first in nearly a month decided by more than six points.

Tre' Kelley leads the league in scoring with 19.7 points since the start of SEC play. He has attempted almost twice as many shots from the field (163) as any other Gamecock during league action. Kelley's 5.14 assists per games this season lead all South Carolina players.

Brandon Wallace is close to averaging a double-double on the season. The 6-9 center is averaging 17.8 points and 9.6 rebounds. He ranks second in the SEC with 2.78 blocks per game this season and leads USC with 31 steals on the year.

South Carolina leads the SEC, averaging the fewest turnovers per game (11.7) for the year. Since the start of SEC action, South Carolina ranks third in 3-pointers per game (8.40), fourth in turnover margin (+0.60) and fifth in 3-point shooting (35.7 percent) and blocks (4.30 per game).

SERIES HISTORY

- South Carolina leads the all-time series 21-17, including a 10-7 advantage in Columbia. USC also leads 2-1 at neutral sites. The series is tied 9-9 in Nashville.
- The Gamecocks have won six of the last eight meetings in the series.
- South Carolina is 9-6 at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gymnasium since joining the SEC prior to the start of the 1992 campaign. In fact, the Gamecocks have won eight of the last 10 games at Vanderbilt since a 66-65 win over the Commodores during the 1997 season.
- Vanderbilt's 76-65 win over South Carolina during the 2005 season snapped a five-game home losing streak to the Gamecocks.
- Vanderbilt's 57-56 win last year over South Carolina snapped a three-game road losing streak for the Commodores in Columbia.
- The Gamecocks hold a 19-12 lead in the series since joining the SEC in 1992.
- Stallings is 4-10 all-time vs. South Carolina.
- Odom is 9-5 all-time vs. Vanderbilt.
- The series dates back to a 31-25 Vanderbilt win in 1927.

COMMODORES AMONG NATION'S BEST VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Vanderbilt's five wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation heading into play on Monday. The Commodores won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams earlier this season -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before dropping a 10-point decision at top-ranked Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000 campaign.

Vanderbilt recorded back-to-back road wins over Top 25 opponents for the first time in school history when it defeated No. 21 LSU, 64-53, on Jan. 24 after claiming a 72-67 victory at then-No. 25 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

Vanderbilt's 72-67 win at Kentucky on Jan. 20 marked the Commodores first road win against a ranked foe since a 63-61 win at then-No. 7 Florida on Jan. 20, 2001.

The Commodores' 94-73 win over then-No. 10 Alabama was its first victory over a top 10 foe since Vanderbilt edged then-No. 4 Mississippi State 74-70 in overtime in the quarterfinal round of the 2004 SEC Tournament.

Entering play on Monday, Vanderbilt led the SEC and was tied for second in the nation (with Southern Cal and North Carolina) for the second most wins against Top 25 competition. Following is a look at how Vanderbilt's five wins over AP Top 25 teams ranks in the nation.

The Commodores are one victory shy of tying the school record for consecutive home wins against ranked opponents set during the end of the 1999 season and the start of the 2000 campaign. Vanderbilt topped No. 22 Arkansas (73-69) and No. 19 Florida (71-70 in overtime) at Memorial Gymnasium during the 1999 season before defeating No. 6 Florida (87-77) and No. 24 LSU (65-62) in its first two home contests against ranked opponents during the 2000 season.

WHAT A TURNAROUND

After starting the season at 1-3, Vanderbilt has won 15 of its last 20 games and enters Wednesday's contest at Tennessee with a 16-8 overall mark and 6-4 league record. Top-ranked Florida is the only other conference member to have won more games than Vanderbilt (15) since the start of December.

Vanderbilt's record during the months of December (8-1) and January (6-3) were the Commodores best since Vanderbilt's 1993 SEC championship season. That year, the Commodores were 8-0 in December and 6-2 in January en route to a 28-6 overall mark, an SEC crown, and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament's West regional semifinals.

COLLEGE BASKETBALL EXPERTS TAB BYARS AS CANDIDATE FOR SEC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A pair of college basketball experts has placed Vanderbilt's Derrick Byars on the radar for consideration for the SEC's Player of the Year award. CBS Sports broadcaster Clark Kellogg and ESPN.com senior college basketball writer Andy Katz both have said recently that Byars' strong play warrants his inclusion among the league's most elite players.

• Second in Scoring Since the Start of League Play

Byars enters play Wednesday second in the SEC in scoring since the start of league action with 18.0 points per contest. He is second only to South Carolina's Tre Kelley's 19.7 average.

Byars has played a vital role in Vanderbilt's recent success against ranked opponents, leading the Commodores in scoring in seven of its last nine games -- scoring 20 or more points five times. He tallied his career-high for an SEC game with 25 points against then-No. 16 Tennessee on Jan. 10.

The Memphis native, who transferred from the University of Virginia after two seasons, enters Wednesday's game ranked among the SEC leaders in four other categories since the start of conference play: tied for sixth in 3-pointers per game (2.50), seventh in 3-point shooting (40.3 percent), eighth in field goal shooting (48.5 percent) and tied for 20th in rebounding (5.4).

Outstanding Performances vs. Ranked Foes

Byars has performed well against nationally ranked opponents, averaging team highs for points (19.1), rebounds (5.4), 3-pointers made (2.29) and steals (1.3). He is shooting 52.7 percent from the field (49-of-93) and 38.1 percent from 3-point range (16-of-42) in Vanderbilt's seven games against ranked teams this season.

• Byars has led the Commodores in scoring in four of their last five games against ranked teams. He made 10-of-16 field goals in tallying 25 points against then-No. 16 Tennessee. He posted game highs for points (23) and rebounds (eight) at then-No. 25 Kentucky. He registered a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds at then-No. 21 LSU. He scored a game-high 21 points at No. 1 Florida on Jan. 31.

Accolades for Byars

• Byars was tabbed the midseason SEC Player of the Year by Athlon Sports. Senior Editor Mitch Light said earlier this week: "[Prior to last Wednesday] Byars is leading the SEC in scoring (19.1) and has posted 18 or more points in six of nine leagues while shooting 51.2 percent from the field and 41.8 percent from 3-point range."

• Byars was named the SEC Player of the Week (Week 11) after he averaged 19.0 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from the field and 53.8 percent (7-of-13) from 3-point range while

helping lead Vanderbilt to a pair of wins over nationally ranked opponents. He posted a game-high 23 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the field with four 3-pointers and a game-high eight rebounds in the Commodores' 72-67 win at then-No. 25 Kentucky on Jan. 20. He also registered 15 points and a trio of 3-pointers in Vanderbilt's 94-73 home victory over then-No. 10 Alabama on Jan. 17.

THREE-POINT WEAPON

Vanderbilt features one of the most talented and deep collection of 3-point shooters in the nation. Nine different Commodores have made a 3-pointer this season while four have made 30 or more triples on the year.

- Vanderbilt enters the week as the only squad in the SEC and with four players who have made 30 or more 3-pointers this season: Dan Cage (57), Derrick Byars (51), Shan Foster (46), and Alex Gordon (35). Ole Miss, Mississippi State and South Carolina have three players with 30 or more 3-pointers on the season.
- The Commodores rank second in the SEC, averaging 8.83 3-pointers made on the season. Since the start of league play Vanderbilt is averaging an SEC-best 9.10 3-pointers made.
- Vanderbilt ranks third in 3-point shooting percentage for the season (.371) and since the start of SEC play (.381).
- Dan Cage and Derrick Byars rank among the SEC's leaders in 3-point shooting percentage and 3-pointers per game (for all games).
- Dan Cage is second in the SEC in 3-point shooting (50.0 percent) and fourth in 3-pointers per game (3.00) since the start of league play.
- Vanderbilt set season-highs for 3-pointers made (15) and 3-point shooting percentage (.536) against Alabama on Jan. 17. The then-10th ranked Crimson Tide entered the contest ranked second in the SEC in 3-point shooting defense (.275). The 15 made 3-pointers against Alabama are tied for the most by an SEC team this season.
- Three days later, the Commodores made 11-of-23 attempts (47.8 percent) from beyond the arc against then-No. 25 Kentucky on Jan. 20. The Wildcats entered the contest ranked third in the SEC in 3-point shooting defense (.295) and surrendered season highs in 3-pointers (11) and 3-point shooting percentage (.478) by a Kentucky opponent.
- Of Vanderbilt's 10 scholarship players on its roster, eight have made at least one 3-pointer this season.

BYARS & FOSTER MAKE UP TALENTED WING TANDEM

Vanderbilt features one of the SEC's top wing tandems in senior Derrick Byars and junior Shan Foster. Byars, a recent SEC Player of the Week, ranks seventh in the SEC averaging 15.8 points. Foster, named First Team All-SEC by the league's coaches in the preseason, is 12th in the SEC with 14.7 points per game.

- Byars or Foster have led Vanderbilt in scoring in 16 of 24 games this season, including 11 of the last 12.
- The duo also has posted similar numbers in field goal shooting (Byars - 46.6 percent; Foster - 44.1 percent); 3-point shooting (Byars - 37.8 percent; Foster 33.3 percent) and rebounds (Byars - 5.0; Foster - 4.9).
- Both have raised their game to another level recently. Byars has led Vanderbilt in scoring in seven of its last nine games, averaging 19.1 points while shooting 49.6 percent from the field and 41.1 percent from 3-point range. Foster has come through in the clutch with several key baskets, rebounds or defensive plays in wins at then-No. 25 Kentucky and No. 21 LSU.
- Foster is averaging a career-high 4.9 rebounds this season. He grabbed seven rebounds and handed out a career-high seven assists in Vanderbilt's win at then-No. 25 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

CAGE A KEY COMPONENT OF VANDERBILT'S ATTACK

Dan Cage has proven himself as a key asset to the Vanderbilt cause this season. The 6-5, 214-pound guard was inserted into the Commodore starting lineup three games into the season when starting center Alan Metcalfe went down with a fractured bone in his left foot at Wake Forest (Nov. 21).

Since Start of SEC Play

Cage ranks second in the SEC in 3-point shooting percentage (.500) heading into play on Tuesday and is tied for fourth in 3-pointers made per game (3.00) since the start of conference play. He also is fourth in the league in free throw shooting at 84.4 percent and is 20th in scoring (13.5 ppg).

He matched his career high with 19 points -- all in the second half -- against Georgia on Feb. 3, thanks in part to four 3-pointers. Earlier this season at Auburn, Cage tallied 19 points with five triples.

Other top performances by Cage included: 15 points and seven rebounds in Vanderbilt's win over then-No. 16 Tennessee on Jan. 10; 17 points thanks in part to five 3-pointers at Georgia on Jan. 13.

Cage helped Vanderbilt to a 72-67 at Kentucky on Jan. 20, scoring all of his 10 points in the second half. In fact, he netted seven points in the final 1:54 of the game. He nailed a clutch 3-pointer to give the Commodores a 65-59 lead with 1:54. He then closed out the game with 4-of-4 shooting from the foul line.

Cage's Double-Figures Scoring Streak

Since Metcalfe's injury Cage has helped Vanderbilt to 16 wins in its last 22 games as a starter, scoring in double figures for 12 consecutive games from Dec. 19 through Jan. 27. During his double-figures scoring streak, Vanderbilt lost only three games while Cage led the Commodores in 3-point shooting at 51.4 percent (38-of-74), free throw shooting at 90.9 percent (30-of-33), and ranked third on the squad in scoring with 14.3 points per game.

Outstanding Free Throw Shooter

• Since the start of league play Cage (27-of-32) is fourth in the SEC in free throw shooting percentage (.844). For the season, Cage has made 84.7 percent of his charity tosses (50-of-57). In fact, Cage has made 91-of-102 attempts (89.2 percent) since Dec. 1, 2004.

Accolades for Cage

• Cage joined teammate Derrick Byars on the San Juan Shootout All-Tournament team. Cage scored 10 or more points in all three games in San Juan, averaging 15.0 points and shooting a team-best 47.6 percent (10-of-21) from 3-point range. He hit four 3-pointers and tallied 18 points against UPR-Mayaguez in the tournament's first round match-up.

- The Commodores have won 10 consecutive home games entering Wednesday's home contest with South Carolina. It's tied for the second-longest streak in the eight-year tenure of Kevin Stallings (Nov. 23, 1999 through Jan. 15, 2000 and March 3, 2004 through Jan. 5, 2005). Vanderbilt won 11 consecutive home games during the 2004 campaign (Nov. 24, 2003 through Jan. 17, 2004).
- Vanderbilt leads the SEC for the best assist-to-turnover ratio for both SEC games (1.28-to-1) and for all games (1.33-to-1).
- Alex Gordon has committed the fewest turnovers (36) by an SEC starting point guard this season. He ranks third in the league with a 2.42-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio on the year.
- Ross Neltner has led Vanderbilt in rebounding all season long. His 6.4 rebounds per game average during SEC play ranks 11th in the conference.
- Ted Skuchas has 22 blocks on the season -- three shy of a new single-season high for the fifth-year senior. His blocks per game average (1.20) during SEC play is tied for 11th in the league. He rejected four shots each against then-No. 10 Alabama and at then-No. 21 LSU earlier this season.
- Shan Foster (1,142) needs three points to pass former Commodore Babe Taylor (1953-56) and his 1,144 career points for 28th place on Vanderbilt's career scoring list. He's also only eight points from moving ahead of Brett Burrow's (1983-1986) 1,149 career point total for 27th place.

- Ross Neltner scored his career-high in an SEC game with 15 points against the Volunteers. Neltner was 5-of-8 from the field and 5-of-6 from the foul line to go along with six rebounds.
- Dan Cage hit two 3-pointers at Tennessee. The senior has made at least one 3-pointer in 21 of Vanderbilt's 24 games this season.
- Shan Foster tallied 15 points against the Vols -- his most since posting 16 points in Vanderbilt's 72-67 win at Kentucky on Jan. 20. Foster has scored in double figures in 14 of Vanderbilt's last 17 contests.
- Vanderbilt's 27-point loss at Tennessee (84-57) marked the Commodores largest margin of defeat since dropping a 106-44 decision at Kentucky on March 5, 2003. Prior to Saturday, Vanderbilt had dropped only three games by 20 or more points since the beginning of the 2004 campaign when the Commodores advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.
- The Commodores set season lows for points (57), made field goals (17) and field goal shooting percentage (29.8 percent) at Tennessee.

NEXT GAME: VS. FLORIDA

Vanderbilt plays host to top-ranked Florida Saturday at 12 p.m. The contest will be televised nationally by CBS Sports.

Florida won the first meeting this season between the schools, 74-64 in Gainesville on Jan. 31. Florida's second-half effort overshadowed Vanderbilt's first-half showing as the Gators rallied from an 11-point halftime deficit to hold off the visiting Commodores.

Vanderbilt took it to the top-ranked Gators in the first half, grabbing an 11-point advantage (41-30) at intermission while holding the nation's best shooting team to 29 percent from the field (9-of-31).

However, Florida outscored Vanderbilt 44-23 after halftime thanks in part to a 13-0 run to start the second half. The Gators hardly missed, shooting 72.7 percent after halftime.

Joakim Noah led four Florida players in double figures with 19 points and nine rebounds. Lee Humphrey made four of his five 3-pointers in the second stanza and finished with 15 points. Taurean Green posted 13 points. Al Horford finished with 12 points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt saw its five-game win streak against ranked opponents end. Derrick Byars scored a game-high 21 points on 9-of-18 shooting. Shan Foster and Ross Neltner contributed nine points each.

STALLINGS TABBED NATIONAL COACH OF THE WEEK

CollegelInsider.com named Kevin Stallings as its national coach of the week (Jan. 14-21) following Vanderbilt's pair of victories over nationally ranked teams.

Vanderbilt made a season-high 15 3-pointers in handing then-No. 10 Alabama a 94-73 defeat on Jan. 17.

Three days later Vanderbilt claimed its third consecutive win over then-No. 25 Kentucky and its second in a row at storied Rupp Arena with a 72-67 victory on Jan. 20. The Commodores made 11 3-pointers and shot 47.7 percent from beyond the arc -- both season highs by a Kentucky opponent.

STALLINGS MILESTONES

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has achieved some milestones during the 2006-07 season.

- Stallings earned his 250th career coaching victory when Vanderbilt defeated No. 25 Georgia Tech, 73-64 on Dec. 9. In doing so, Stallings became the sixth active coach in the SEC to achieve 250 or more career coaching wins.
- Stallings moved into third place on Vanderbilt's all-time coaching wins list following the Commodores' 75-62 victory over Tennessee Tech in the second round of the San Juan Shootout. His career wins mark at Vanderbilt ranks behind only Roy Skinner (278) and Bob Polk (197).
- The Alabama win marked the 100th home victory for head coach Kevin Stallings during his eight-year stay in Nashville. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) — Vanderbilt's all-time winningest coach — compiled more wins (181 in 16 seasons) at Memorial Gymnasium now in its 55th season.

For his career, Stallings owns a 261-167 overall mark in his 14th year. Stallings is 138-104 in his eighth season at Vanderbilt.

Stallings coached six seasons at Illinois State (1994-1999) where he amassed a 123-63 (.661) record before coming to Vanderbilt.

He played three seasons (1980-1982) at Purdue under Gene Keady before serving as an assistant in West Lafayette for six campaigns (1983-1988). He then worked as an assistant under Roy Williams at Kansas from 1989 to 1993. Stallings reached the NCAA Final Four as a player at Purdue in 1980 and twice as assistant at Kansas in 1990 and 1993.

3-POINT STREAK NOW IN 20TH SEASON; VU ONE OF THREE TEAMS TO HIT A TREY IN EVERY GAME SINCE 1986-87 SEASON

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 654 consecutive games entering today's contest. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (657#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (568#) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

FOSTER JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Shan Foster joined the 1,000-point club with a bang, tying a season high with 29 points in Vanderbilt's 74-69 win at Rice on Jan. 2.

Foster netted 26 of his 29 points in the first half, an output that nearly surpassed Rice's point total for the half of 27. For the game, Foster shot 11-of-17 from the field,

including 5-of-8 from 3-point range.

The junior from Kenner, La. joined the 1,000-point club in his 78th game as Commodore, tying Perry Wallace for 17th among the fastest players to join the elite club.

Among Commodores who played during or since the adoption of the 3-point line (1986-87), Foster is the second fastest Commodore to reach 1,000 points, behind only Billy McCaffrey. The Duke transfer joined the club after only 50 games as a Commodore.

METCALFE RETURNS TO THE COURT

Vanderbilt junior forward Alan Metcalfe made his first appearance on the court in over a month when he played eight minutes against Alabama A&M on Dec. 29.

Metcalfe missed 10 games and 37 days after breaking the second metatarsal in his left foot midway through the second half of Vanderbilt's 88-78 setback at Wake Forest on Nov. 21.

Metcalfe was averaging 5.5 points and 3.5 rebounds before the injury.

RODRIGUEZ JOINS COMMODORES AS A WALK-ON

David Rodriguez joined the Vanderbilt basketball squad as a walk-on Commodore head coach Kevin Stallings announced prior to Alabama A&M game on Dec. 29.

The 6-2, 180-pound sophomore guard from Sarasota, Fla. averaged 15 points, six rebounds and three assists as a senior at Out-of-Door Academy, a class 1-A school in Sarasota. He helped lead the Thunder to the District championship as a junior and was named the team's most valuable player as a sophomore and junior. He served as co-captain of two Thunder squads as a junior and senior.

Rodriguez, who wears No. 2 for the Commodores, played the final two minutes of Vanderbilt's 86-47 win against Alabama A&M.

Rodriguez joins junior Aubrey Hammond as one of two walk-ons on the Vanderbilt roster.

Junior swingman Shan Foster (205) has moved past former Commodores Matt Freije and Mario Moore into sixth place on Vanderbilt's career list for made 3-pointers. Foster ranks eight in career 3-pointers attempted with 510.

NWANKWO REMAINS A VALUED COMMODORE

College Park, Md., native Davis Nwankwo will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice last March — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbed 30 rebounds last season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and attends Commodore practices. He will be present at all home and road contests.

METCALFE SHARES GRIEF IN TOLEDO'S LOSS

Vanderbilt junior forward Alan Metcalfe shares in the grief felt by the Toledo basketball program following the tragic loss of center Haris Charalambous earlier this fall.

The 21-year old reserve center for Toledo passed away on October 9 after collapsing near the start of a morning conditioning session.

Metcalfe and Charalambous were teammates in England as members of both the "Manchester Magic" Senior League Team and the England Junior National Team from 2000-2003.

Charalambous played in 23 games and averaged 0.8 points and 0.8 rebounds in 5.4 minutes for Toledo last season. Metcalfe is from St. Helens, England while Charalambous was a native of Manchester.

COACHES TAB FOSTER FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt junior swingman Shan Foster was named Preseason First Team All-Southeastern Conference by the league's coaches.

Foster, who earned a similar postseason award from the coaches last year, ranks as the league's third-leading returning scorer, averaging 15.9 points a year ago. Foster finished his sophomore campaign ranked among the SEC's leaders in 3-pointers per game (second with 3.00), 3-point shooting percentage (fourth at .415), and field goal percentage (ninth at .451).

"Shan is very deserving of the award," head coach Kevin Stallings said. "For the better part of two years he has been very consistent and has proven to be one of the league's best players. Preseason awards are nice but postseason honors have more meaning. I wouldn't be surprised if both Shan and Derrick (Byars) were on the list at the end of the season."

SEC MEDIA PICKS COMMODORES FOURTH IN EAST

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by media attending the league's annual media days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

The Commodores received 138 points to finish behind defending national champion Florida (30), Kentucky (62) and Tennessee (84). South Carolina (146) was chosen fifth while Georgia (149) ended up sixth. Florida earned 28 of 29 first-place votes to win the division and 21 votes to be crowned the overall champion.

Alabama edged LSU in voting to win the Western Division title. The Crimson Tide received 16 votes to LSU's 13 votes.

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

COMMODORES INK THREE SIGNEES

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced Nov. 10 that center A.J. Ogilvy, guard Keegan Bell and forward Andre Walker have signed national letters of intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2007.

"This is the start of a class that would be comparable to or even better than our current junior class," Stallings said. "We're off to a good start and look forward to signing one or maybe two more prospects."

Ogilvy, a 6-10, 250-pound big man from Canberra, Australia, is in his third season attending the Australian Institute of Sports where he has developed into one of the

nation's premier post players. He averaged 16.5 points, 9.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks in the 2006 Under-20 Nationals.

Ogilvy was named to the Oceania Under 19 Championship All-Star team after averaging 15 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks while competing in the 2006 qualifying series against New Zealand.

Other accolades for the Australian include representing the country at the Youth Olympics and being named the 2005 New South Wales Junior Basketball Player of the Year.

Ogilvy picked Vanderbilt over New Mexico, UNLV and St. Mary's.

"Some people have considered A.J. the best big man from Australia since Andrew Bogut," Stallings said. "He's a very exciting signee for us. He's almost seven-foot tall, moves very well and has a strong physical presence inside."

"He will come to us as one of the most complete post talents we've recruited at Vanderbilt."

Bell, a 6-1, 180-pound floor leader from Hazel Green, Ala. is listed among the nation's top 25 point guards by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. Bob Gibbons All-Star Report lists Bell as the 60th-best overall prospect.

Bell averaged 25 points and 11 assists as a junior at Bob Jones High School where he earned First Team All-State, All-Metro and All-Area accolades last season. He will play his senior campaign at Hazel Green High School.

Bell selected Vanderbilt over LSU and Ole Miss.

"Keegan has all the instincts you'd expect from someone who grew up in a basketball family," Stallings said of Bell whose father, Dan, has been a successful high school coach Alabama and Division I coach in Louisiana. "Keegan is an excellent ball handler and passer who possesses exceptional shooting skills and good quickness."

Walker is a 6-7, 210-pound forward from Flossmoor, Ill. The versatile Walker averaged 15 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists at Homewood-Flossmoor High School as a senior last season. He is currently playing a post-graduate year at Brewster Academy, a prep school in Wolfeboro, N.H.

Named one of the most complete players in Chicago by the Chicago Tribune, Walker helped lead the Vikings to the Illinois Class 2A sectionals in both his junior and senior seasons. In summer 2005, Walker was a member of a Chicago Ferrari squad that won the 17-and-under AAU National Championship.

Walker chose Vanderbilt over Arizona State, Colorado and Seton Hall.

"What sets Andre apart is his ability to shoot the basketball," Stallings said. "He has great range and an easy release. He's got a body similar to Derrick Byars and is a great ball handler and passer for someone his size. He had foot surgery in the summer that limited some of his recruiting, but we feel fortunate to get him. He should be a good addition to our program."

The victory was a nice bit of revenge for the Hoyas (2-0) who lost at home last season to Vanderbilt after blowing a 13-point lead in that game.

Not this time as Georgetown used its size with the 7-foot-2 Hibbert and speed to drive to the basket repeatedly for easy layups. The Hoyas outshot (52.5 percent to 41.5 percent) and out-rebounded Vandy 38-33 in putting the game away.

Jonathan Wallace had 16 points, and Jessie Sapp had 11 for the Hoyas.

Alex Gordon had 15 points off the bench, and Derrick Byars added 14 for Vanderbilt, which lost its season opener on its home court for the first time since 1990. Dan Cage had 10 points.

But Shan Foster, the Southeastern Conference's third-leading returning scorer, went 0-of-5 from the floor and had a pair of free throws for his only points. That was well below his 15.9-point average last season.

Georgetown led 39-35 at halftime, and Byars had a steal and a layup to start the second half and pull the Commodores within 39-37. They didn't come closer than five the rest of the way.

Fellow rookie Jamie Skeen added 16 points and 10 rebounds for the Demon Deacons (4-0), who took a double-digit lead late in the first half and stayed in control the rest of the way.

Shan Foster scored 23 points for the Commodores (0-2), who hung around but struggled to get the defensive stops they needed to get back in the game. Fellow wingman Derrick Byars added 18 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

Most of that difficulty started with Smith, a 5-foot-11 freshman from Concord with impressive baseline-to-baseline speed. He provided the perfect floor leadership for coach Skip Prosser's up-tempo attack, repeatedly attacking the rim for easy baskets or to create opportunities for teammates. Behind Smith, the Demon Deacons shot 48 percent and finished with 17 fast-break points.

The Demon Deacons led by as many as 14 points in the game, with the Commodores getting no closer than seven points after the break and getting in foul trouble early.

Vanderbilt jumped to an early six-point lead before Wake Forest charged ahead, getting seven straight points from Williams to take a 36-27 lead with 3:55 left in the half.

Elon's LeVonn Jordan scored 26 points, which included 22 in the second half. But the Phoenix had no answer for Vanderbilt's three-point shooters, as the Commodores hit 10-of-24 from behind the arc, including a five-of-seven performance by Cage.

Vanderbilt jumped out to a 6-0 lead behind two quick three-pointers from Cage, and cruised to a 41-21 halftime lead.

The Commodores stretched the lead to 24 early in the second half after Shan Foster was intentionally fouled on a dunk, then hit two free throws.

The Phoenix kept the lead in the teens throughout most of the rest of the evening, but got no closer than the 11-point final margin.

Derrick Byars led Vandy with eight rebounds and seven assists, and Shan Foster also added 17 points for the Commodores.

Robby Bostain and Stanley Jones added 11 points apiece for the Paladins (4-2), who held Vanderbilt (1-3) to just 2-of-17 3-point shooting.

It was Vanderbilt's first loss to a Southern Conference opponent since 1968, and its first ever in six meetings against Furman.

The Paladins blew an 11-point first half lead to trail 32-28 at the half, and trailed by as many as six in the second half. But Furman battled back midway through the second half, tying the game at 52 when Webb hit a long 3-pointer with 8:03 left.

The Paladins never trailed again. Jones followed with a layup, and then an easy dunk off a feed in the lane.

Vandy's Dan Cage hit a layup with 2:41 left to cut the lead to 63-61. Bostain added a free throw with 2:23 left, then added a layup at 1:26. Jadee Jones and Punch each hit a pair of free throws in the last 32 seconds to close out the game.

Vandy starters Derrick Byars and Shan Foster combined to go just 5-of-25 from the field. Ross Neltner led Vandy with 12 points, while Cage had 11 and JeJuan Brown 10.

The Rockets (2-4) led 92-87 with 2:27 remaining in overtime, but the Commodores (2-3) grabbed the lead at 93-92 with 48.5 seconds left on back-to-back 3-pointers by Derrick Byars and Ross Neltner.

Toledo's attempt to send the game into a second overtime failed when an intentionally missed free throw by Justin Ingram was grabbed by Neltner with 3.6 seconds left.

Forward Derrick Byars led Vanderbilt with a career-high 28 points. Guard Shan Foster added 21 and Neltner scored a career-high 20. Keonta Howell led Toledo with 32 points.

 Vanderbilt (5-3) hadn't beaten a Top 25 team since downing then-No. 19 Alabama on Jan. 5, 2005.
 Thaddeus Young had 19 points for the Yellow Jackets (6-3), who hadn't played since losing to Miami a week ago in their Atlantic Coast Conference opener. This was their third loss in four games.
 The Commodores were playing their third game in five days.
 They opened the game hitting seven of their first nine shots and led by as many as 13 points in the first half. They lost the lead by going cold, hitting only two of their final 14 shots, as Georgia Tech used a 14-0 run to take a 34-33 lead at halftime.
 Vanderbilt took the lead for good with a 14-4 run started by three straight baskets by Foster. Byars added a 3-pointer with 12:06 to go, giving the Commodores a 51-50 lead they wouldn't lose again.

Vandy (12-6, 2-2 Southeastern Conference) never let Alabama (14-3, 1-2) get close after the opening minutes in handing the Tide a ninth straight loss in Nashville. Alabama hasn't won in Memorial Gym since 1990 under coach Wimp Sanderson.

Vanderbilt took it to the top-ranked Gators in the first half, grabbing an 11-point advantage (41-30) at intermission while holding the nation's best shooting team to 29 percent from the field (9-of-31).
