VANDERBILT OPENS SEASON HOSTING NO. 8 GEORGETOWN

The Vanderbilt Commodores open their 2006-07 season playing host to eighth-ranked Georgetown, Wednesday, Nov. 15 at 8 p.m. CT. The game will be televised by Fox Sports Net.

The Commodores are coming off a 98-94 exhibition victory over visiting Northern State (S.D.) on Nov. 1. Five Commodores scored in double figures led by redshirt freshman George Drake's 17 points.

The Hoyas played the first game of their new campaign on Saturday, topping Hartford 69-59. Jeff Green led Georgetown with 17 points to go along with seven rebounds.

Wednesday's match-up marks Vanderbilt's first home game against a non-conference opponent ranked in the Associated Press Top 10 since 1992. That year, the Commodores played host to ninth-ranked Louisville, beating the Cardinals, 90-88, on Dec. 9.

The contest also should display a contrast of strengths as Vanderbilt features one of the top wing duos in the Southeastern Conference in Shan Foster and Derrick Byars while Georgetown boasts one of the nation's best frontcourts led by Jeff Green and Roy Hibbert.

The all-time series between the two schools is even at 1-1 following Vanderbilt's 68-61 win at Georgetown last season (Nov. 26). The Hoyas won the first meeting in the series, 70-60, in the first round of the 1991 NCAA Tournament.

SCOUTING GEORGETOWN

Georgetown returned to the Top 25 last season, posting a 23-10 overall mark and advancing to the Sweet 16 before losing to eventual national champion Florida, 57-53.

The Hoyas' strength this season lies in the frontcourt where Second Team All-BIG EAST honorees forward Jeff Green and center Roy Hibbert return for their junior seasons. Green led Georgetown in scoring (11.9 ppg) and assists (3.27 apg) and was second in rebounding (6.5 rpg). Hibbert led the squad in rebounding (6.9 rpg) and was second in scoring (11.6 ppg).

Junior Jonathan Wallace returns in the backcourt for Georgetown. Wallace handed out 106 assists last season with only 47 turnovers.

Vanderbilt overcame a 13-point first half deficit to earn a 68-61 road win at Georgetown. The Commodores (4-0) connected on nearly 60 percent of its field goals in the second half while holding the Hoyas to 34.6 percent shooting.

Shan Foster led the Commodore attack with a game-high 20 points. He made 6-of-11 field goals, including five 3-pointers. Mario Moore chipped in 12 points while Julian Terrell added eight points and a team-high nine rebounds.

The Commodores trailed 33-20 with 4:42 left in the first half and 36-29 at intermission. Foster's dunk at 15:30 in the second stanza gave Vanderbilt its first lead of the game at the beginning stages of a 23-12 Commodores run.

A layup from center Ted Skuchas with 3:42 increased the Commodores' lead to 64-54.

Georgetown suffered its first loss of the season. Four Hoyas reached double figures led by Jeff Green's 14 points and nine rebounds.

Vanderbilt is 21-34 (.382) all-time against current teams of the BIG EAST Conference... The Commodores have lost six of their last seven games to BIG EAST teams with the lone victory coming against Georgetown last season. (Connecticut [0-3], Cincinnati [0-2], Notre Dame [0-1])... Prior to last season, Vanderbilt's last win over the BIG EAST came in the 1999 season opener at home against Providence (72-66) on Nov. 9, 1998... Commodore Head Coach Kevin Stallings is 4-9 against current members of the BIG EAST, including an 0-4 mark while at Vanderbilt. Stallings is 1-0 against Georgetown.

THE 1991 GEORGETOWN MEETING

Georgetown took advantage inside as Alonzo Mourning scored a game-high 23 points and Dikembe Mutombo posted 14 points and 12 rebounds as the Hoyas defeated Vanderbilt 70-60 in a first round West Regional match-up in the 1991 NCAA Tournament... The meeting took place at the McKale Center in Tucson, Ariz., on March 15, 1991... Scott Draud kept the Commodores close hitting 5-of-12 3-point tries and netting a team-high 22 points in a losing effort... Georgetown outrebounding Vanderbilt 39-22... The Hoyas lost to UNLV in the second round of the 1991 NCAA Tournament.

VANDERBILT VS. TOP 25 & TOP 10

- Vanderbilt has lost its last eight games against nationally ranked opponents (0-6 last season), including five contests against teams ranked in the AP Top 10.
- VU's last win against a Top-25 foe came at home against then-No. 19 Alabama, 70-56, on Jan. 5, 2005.
- Vanderbilt's last win over a Top 10 opponent was a 74-70 overtime victory against then-No. 4 Mississippi State in the second round of the 2004 SEC Tournament.
- The Commodores won their last home game against a non-SEC opponent ranked in the AP Top 10, edging then-No. 9 Louisville, 90-88, on Dec. 9, 1992.

VANDERBILT IN SEASON OPENERS

The Commodores own an 88-31 all-time record in season openers having won 10 consecutive and 14 of their past 15. The last time VU dropped a season opener was to start the 1995-96 campaign. Vanderbilt fell short in a 71-63 decision against North Carolina in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.

Vanderbilt is 28-2 all-time in season openers at Memorial Gymnasium, having won the last 11 in a row. The only setbacks came to Louisville (82-74) on Dec. 1, 1970 and Arkansas (107-70) in preseason NIT action on Nov. 14, 1990.

The Commodores are 7-0 when opening the season at home under head coach Kevin Stallings.

NWANKWO REMAINS A VALUED COMMODORE

College Park, Md., native Davis Nwankwo will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice last March — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, who played along side Georgetown's Roy Hibbert at Georgetown Prep, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbed 30 rebounds last season as a red-shirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and attends Commodore practices. He will be present at all home and road contests.

NWANKWO AND HIBBERT WERE PREP TEAMMATES

Vanderbilt's Davis Nwankwo and Georgetown's Roy Hibbert were high school teammates at Georgetown Preparatory School in College Park, Md. Nwankwo and Hibbert posted a four-year record of 76-25, including a 20-6 mark during their senior campaign. Nwankwo was named All-IAC three times and all-county twice, averaging 13 points and 11 rebounds as a senior.

Nwankwo is familiar with several Georgetown players. Before his arrival at Vanderbilt, Nwankwo played along side Tyler Crawford at a Nike All-America camp in Indianapolis, Ind., and was a teammate of Jeff Green at a Capital Classic All-Star game.

NEXT GAME: AT WAKE FOREST

Vanderbilt travels to Winston-Salem, N.C. to battle Wake Forest on Nov. 21. The Commodores' first road game of the season starts at 8 p.m. CT and will be televised by Fox Sports Net.

The two teams last played during the 1999-2000 campaign, with the Demon Deacons claiming an 83-68 victory in the first round of the postseason NIT. Vanderbilt leads the overall series 4-3.

MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE FOES

- Vanderbilt has won 82 of its last 86 home games against non-conference opponents.
- The Commodores are 62-4 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era (losses against Cincinnati [92-83] on Dec. 10, 2005; Connecticut [76-70] on Dec. 1, 2002; Notre Dame [77-74] on Dec. 2, 2001; Wake Forest [83-68] on March 14, 2000 in the NIT).
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 132-11 non-conference record at home (.923 win percentage).
- Last season's 92-83 setback to Cincinnati on Dec. 10 snapped a 28-game home winning streak against non-SEC foes.
- VU won 40 consecutive non-conference home games from the 1996 season to the 2001 campaign.
- The Commodores own an all-time record of 636-181 (.778 win percentage) in Memorial Gymnasium since the building opened for the 1952-53 campaign.
- Vanderbilt won a school record 17 home games during the 2004-05 season.
- Vanderbilt has never finished a season with a losing home record.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home and won 10 or more games at the site in 19 of the past 20 seasons.

RECAPPING THE EXHIBITION WIN

Five Commodores scored in double figures led by a 17-point effort from red-shirt freshman George Drake, but Vanderbilt had to withstand a late rally from visiting Northern State (S.D.) to claim a 98-94 exhibition win on Nov. 1.

The Commodores built an 86-61 advantage with seven minutes remaining in the game against the Division II school, before the Wolves mounted 30-6 run to pull within a point at 92-91 with 29 seconds left. Vanderbilt's Dan Cage, Shan Foster and Alex Gordon sank two free throws each to give the Commodores the cushion needed to close out the contest.

Drake had a strong showing, making 7-of-8 attempts from the field to go along with five rebounds. Preseason First Team All-Southeastern Conference honoree Shan Foster posted 15 points in 19 minutes. Derrick Byars added a 13-point effort from the wing on 5-of-9 shooting. Alex Gordon (11 points) and Alan Metcalfe (10 points) also reached double-digits in scoring. Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt in assists (five) and steals (two).

Levi Hamilton was perfect from the field on eight attempts to lead Northern State with 19 points. Kevin Ratzsch posted a double-double for the Wolves with 17 points and 10 rebounds. Northern State outrebounded Vanderbilt 44-30.

Vanderbilt shot 61.3 percent from the field in the first half and took a 51-42 advantage to the locker room at halftime. Byars started strong, scoring 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting in the first stanza. Metcalfe contributed all of his scoring in the first half, as well as five of his six rebounds.

Three-pointers from Cage and Foster and consecutive baskets from Drake and JeJuan Brown helped the Commodores vault to a 21-point lead with 9:36 remaining. Vanderbilt increased its lead to 25-points two minutes later after a jumper from Ross Neltner, a 3-pointer from Byars and a basket and two free throws from Gordon.

THE STALLINGS FILE

COACHES TAB FOSTER FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt junior swingman Shan Foster was named Preseason First Team All-Southeastern Conference by the league's coaches.

Foster, who earned a similar postseason award from the coaches last year, ranks as the league's third-leading returning scorer, averaging 15.9 points a year ago. Foster finished his sophomore campaign ranked among the SEC's leaders in 3-pointers per game (second with 3.00), 3-point shooting percentage (fourth at .415), and field goal percentage (ninth at .451).

"Shan is very deserving of the award," head coach Kevin Stallings said. "For the better part of two years he has been very consistent and has proven to be one of the league's best players."

"Preseason awards are nice but postseason honors have more meaning. I wouldn't be surprised if both Shan and Derrick (Byars) were on the list at the end of the season."

Foster is shooting 42.7 percent from 3-point range for his career - fourth best in school history. The Kenner, La. native ranks ninth at Vanderbilt with 159 career 3-pointers. His 90 3-pointers made a year ago tied for third place all-time.

The coaches' preseason All-SEC first and second teams consist of a minimum eight players on each squad. No ties were broken and no predicted order of finish was made.

SEC MEDIA PICKS COMMODORES FOURTH IN EAST

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by media attending the league's annual media days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

The Commodores received 138 points to finish behind defending national champion Florida (30), Kentucky (62) and Tennessee (84). South Carolina (146) was chosen fifth while Georgia (149) ended up sixth. Florida earned 28 of 29 first-place votes to win the division and 21 votes to be crowned the overall champion.

Alabama edged LSU in voting to win the Western Division title. The Crimson Tide received 16 votes to LSU's 13 votes.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 55TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium enters its 55th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

COMMODORES INK THREE SIGNEES

The Vanderbilt men's basketball program has received written commitments from three prospects during the fall signing period.

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced Nov. 10 that center A.J. Ogilvy, guard Keegan Bell and forward Andre Walker have signed national letters of intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2007.

"This is the start of a class that would be comparable to or even better than our current junior class," Stallings said. "We're off to a good start and look forward to signing one or maybe two more prospects."

Ogilvy, a 6-10, 250-pound big man from Canberra, Australia, is in his third season attending the Australian Institute of Sports where he has developed into one of the nation's premier post players. He averaged 16.5 points, 9.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks in the 2006 Under-20 Nationals.

Ogilvy was named to the Oceania Under 19 Championship All-Star team after averaging 15 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks while competing in the 2006 qualifying series against New Zealand.

Other accolades for the Australian include representing the country at the Youth Olympics and being named the 2005 New South Wales Junior Basketball Player of the Year.

Ogilvy picked Vanderbilt over New Mexico, UNLV and St. Mary's.

from Australia since Andrew Bogut," Stallings said. "He's a very exciting signee for us. He's almost seven-foot tall, moves very well and has a strong physical presence inside.

"He will come to us as one of the most complete post talents we've recruited at Vanderbilt."

Bell, a 6-1, 180-pound floor leader from Hazel Green, Ala. is listed among the nation's top 25 point guards by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. Bob Gibbons All-Star Report lists Bell as the 60th-best overall prospect.

Bell averaged 25 points and 11 assists as a junior at Bob Jones High School where he earned First Team All-State, All-Metro and All-Area accolades last season. He will play his senior campaign at Hazel Green High School.

Bell selected Vanderbilt over LSU and Ole Miss.

"Keegan has all the instincts you'd expect from someone who grew up in a basketball family," Stallings said of Bell whose father, Dan, has been a successful high school coach Alabama and Division I coach in Louisiana. "Keegan is an excellent ball handler and passer who possesses exceptional shooting skills and good quickness."

Walker is a 6-7, 210-pound forward from Flossmoor, Ill. The versatile Walker averaged 15 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists at Homewood-Flossmoor High School as a senior last season. He is currently playing a post-graduate year at Brewster Academy, a prep school in Wolfeboro, N.H.

Named one of the most complete players in Chicago by the Chicago Tribune, Walker helped lead the Vikings to the Illinois Class 2A sectionals in both his junior and senior seasons. In summer 2005, Walker was a member of a Chicago Ferrari squad that won the 17-and-under AAU National Championship.

Walker chose Vanderbilt over Arizona State, Colorado and Seton Hall.

"What sets Andre apart is his ability to shoot the basketball," Stallings said. "He has great range and an easy release. He's got a body similar to Derrick Byars and is a great ball handler and passer for someone his size. He had foot surgery in the summer that limited some of his recruiting, but we feel fortunate to get him. He should be a good addition to our program."
