VANDERBILT LOOKS TO CONTINUE NOVEMBER SUCCESS UNDER FRANKLIN

Vanderbilt enters the Kentucky game seeking its seventh straight win in the month of November.

The 'Dores' last six wins in the month have all come vs. teams from the SEC or ACC. Five of the wins came on the road.

The 'Dores under James Franklin are 7-2 in November games. In the decade before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

COMMODORES ARE 14-6 IN LAST 20 GAMES

The Commodores also own a 14-6 record over their last 20 games.

The 20-game stretch includes a seven-game winning streak to conclude the 2012 season and a victory over N.C. State in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

In the 14 wins, Vanderbilt's margin of victory is 22.8 points. Ten of the victories have come against BCS teams: Missouri, Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee, Georgia and Florida from the SEC and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the ACC.

In five of the six losses during the 20-game stretch, Vanderbilt's opponent has been a team ranked in the Associated Press Top 25: Georgia and Florida in 2012, and Missouri, Texas A&M and South Carolina this year. The other loss came this year to Ole Miss, another squad receiving substantial votes in the AP Poll.

COMMODORES ON RECORD POINTS STREAK

The Commodores continue to build on a consecutive games stretch of scoring at least 24 points.

Vanderbilt's 34-point total at the Swamp Saturday was the 15th consecutive time the Commodore offense has reached 24 points.

The scoring streak ranks as a new standard for the Commodore program. Never in the 124-year history of Vanderbilt football, including the early 1900s when Dan McGugin's teams routinely averaged 40+ points, have the Commodores duplicated the current scoring streak.

OFF. LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON CLOSING IN ON TEAM'S ALL-TIME STARTS RECORD

Wesley Johnson (R-Sr., OL) paces all active Commodore position players with 47 career starts.

Johnson's total also ranks second in consecutive starts, trailing only UGA QB **Aaron Murray** (49 starts).

Johnson has started at four different line positions: left and right tackle, left guard and center. This year, he has nine starts at left tackle.

The all-time Vanderbilt team record is 48 career starts, co-shared by **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07).

FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer

Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 20-15 overall. His .571 winning percentage is tied with **Steve Sloan** (1973-74) as the best since the 1950s.

SAFETY LADLER PLAYING AT ALL-SEC LEVEL; TOPS LEAGUE IN TWO DEFENSIVE CATEGORIES

Senior **Kenny Ladler** is putting together a superb final season from the Commodore secondary.

Ladler, a third-year starting safety, tops the SEC in solo tackles and forced fumbles.

The senior has 50 solo stops, two more than runnerup Georgia's **Ramik Wilson**. He also has four forced fumbles, one more than Florida's **Dante Fowler**. Ladler also ranks seventh among all SEC defenders with 73 total tackles.

Ladler contributed five tackles and an INT in the 34-17 win at Florida. Ladler is the team's active career leader with 273 total tackles, 187 solo tackles, seven interceptions and six forced fumbles.

Since official defensive records began in the 1970s, only two former 'Dores, LB **Jamie Duncan** in 1996 and LB **Shelton Quarles** in 1991, have registered more forced fumbles in a season than Ladler's current total.

OFFENSE HAVING MORE RED-ZONE SUCCESS

The Vanderbilt offense ranks among the most improved in the SEC and NCAA in its success on third downs and inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

This season, the 'Dores have scored on 36 of 40 red-zone possessions, resulting in an 90% success rate. Through nine games in 2012, the 'Dores were successful at a 72% clip (23 of 32).

More importantly, Vanderbilt is scoring TDs on red-zone drives at a much higher percentage than last year. The 'Dores have scored TDs on 30 of the 40 possessions, a 75% rate of success. Through nine games last year, the offense was only half as successful, tallying TDs on just 14 of 32 possessions (44%).

MORE ON THE KENTUCKY SERIES

This is the 86th meeting between the Commodores and Wildcats in a series that dates to 1896. Vanderbilt has played only two teams more than Kentucky – Tennessee (107) and Ole Miss (87).

The Commodores' current two-game win streak is the team's first over the Wildcats since a five-game Vanderbilt streak from 1991-95.

TWO KENTUCKY RESIDENTS ON VANDERBILT ROSTER

Ryan White (Fr., DB) and **David Holtgrave** (Fr., PK) and is the only Commodore player who hails from the state of Kentucky.

White, who has not seen action during his first year on campus, is from Louisville. He was a standout at powerful Trinity H.S., helping the school to three straight Kentucky 6A state titles and a three-year varsity record of 41-2.

Holtgrave graduated from Kentucky Country Day in Louisville where former Vanderbilt letterwinner **Dr. Tim Green** serves as athletic director.

SPEAR FIRST COMMODORE NAMED TO ALLSTATE-AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Carey Spear (Sr., PK) became the first Vanderbilt player ever named to the Allstate/American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team when he was named to the 2013 national squad.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, was recognized by Allstate officials during a ceremony Oct. 23 at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital on the Vanderbilt campus. Spear and several teammates were visiting young patients at the hospital when he was surprised with a Good Works Team trophy from the sponsors.

Spear also is considered among the nation's leading placekickers. An All-SEC recipient in 2012, Spear is 8-of-10 on field goals this year. Earlier this year, he was a candidate for the Lou Groza Award.

Spear also has been named for two other prestigious postseason awards, the Senior CLASS Award and Wuerffel Trophy. Both awards recognize football, academic success in the classroom, and community service.

Spear, is expected to graduate this May with a degree in Human & Organizational Development.

Last month, Spear was a finalist for the Vanderbilt Outstanding Senior Award, recognized as the top honor bestowed on a Vanderbilt undergraduate.

COACHES WORKED ON SAME STAFF

A decade ago, Vanderbilt defensive line coach **Sean Spencer** and Kentucky offensive coordinator **Neal Brown** worked together on the 2003 coaching staff at Massachusetts.

LAST TIME VS. KENTUCKY

COMMODORES EARN FIFTH VICTORY WITH IMPRESSIVE ROAD WIN AT KENTUCKY

LEXINGTON, Ky. – Before this game on the Kentucky campus, Vanderbilt hadn't shut out by a SEC opponent since 1968.

That streak was broken in a 40-0 road win against Kentucky in which the Commodores dominated on offense, defense and special teams.

Quarterback Jordan Rodgers completed 18 of 29 passes for 220 yards, two touchdowns and one interception, and three different

Commodores running backs rushed for scores against the overmatched Kentucky defense.

Vanderbilt's 40-point victory margin was its largest over the Wildcats in 96 years. In the teams' 85 meetings, only two of Vanderbilt's wins have been more lopsided: 45-0 in 1916, and

50-0 in 1897.

Vanderbilt (5-4, 3-3) scored touchdowns on four of their five first-half drives, and none of the scoring drives took more than four minutes.

Rodgers led his team 71 yards on 11 plays begin the game, ending the drive with a 34-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Matthews. It was the fourth time this season has scored on its first drive of the game.

SIGNIFICANT VANDERBILT WIN IN THE SWAMP

The 34-17 victory over Florida Saturday ended decades of Vanderbilt struggles facing the Gators in the Swamp.

★ It marked Vanderbilt's first victory on the Florida campus since a 7-0 shutout in 1945. That game, held just months after World War II ended, was Vanderbilt's trip visit to Gainesville. Until Saturday, the Commodores were 0-19-1 in the Swamp since the 1945 win.

★ The victory also ended 22 years of Commodore frustration in the series. The win was Vanderbilt's first over the Gators since 1988,

★ The 17-point winning margin was the Commodores widest margin of victory in the series since a 20-0 shutout in 1946.

ADDITIONAL NOTES AND STATS FROM ROAD VICTORY OVER FLORIDA

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) was superb against the Gators. Though totalling only 62 yards on a career-high 24 rushes, Seymour played excellent in the red zone, scoring from bursts of 10, 2 and 1 yards. He became the first Commodore back to rush for three touchdowns since **Zac Stacy** accomplished the feat at Wake Forest on Nov. 26, 2011.

Seymour also has 12 rushing TDs on the season, the third highest total in the SEC this year and just two shy of matching Stacy's team record. Seymour has notched a rushing TD in eight of nine games this year.

★ The Commodores were 6-of-6 on possessions inside the Gator 20-yard line. Four of the six drives resulted in Vanderbilt TDs.

★ The defense limited Florida to just 39 rushing yards on 34 carries. It marked the fewest rushing yards by a SEC opponent since Kentucky was held to 32 yards on Nov. 1, 2011.

★ **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) has played serious minutes against two ranked opponents (Georgia and Texas A&M) and Florida. He owns a 2-1 record in those games. He was efficient against the Gators. In just his second career start, Robinette completed 6-of-12 for 57 yards and ran for 26 yards and a TD on nine carries.

★ The defense also forced four Florida turnovers, including a season-high three interceptions. The offense turned the picks by **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB), **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) and **Andrew Williamson** (R-So., safety) into 21 points.

★ **Caleb Azubike** (So., DE) seemed to constantly be in the Gator backfield. He ended with two QB sacks and a pair of QB hurries.

★ **Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) enjoyed a superb performance, averaging 49.8 yards on four punts.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) had five of Vanderbilt's six receptions. The sixth came on a first-down catch by **Trent Pruitt** (R-Jr., WR).

★ The defense posted five sacks resulting in minus-59 yards for the Gators and nine tackles for loss. In addition to Azubike, others registering sacks were **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE), **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) and **Javon Marshall** (Sr., safety).

★ **Javon Marshall** (Sr., safety) and **Darreon Herring** (So., LB) paced the defense with eight and seven total tackles, respectively. Herring also contributed a pair of pass breakups.

★ **Joe Townsend** (Jr., center) was solid throughout the game from the middle of the offensive interior line. Townsend contributed a dozen knock-down blocks, including six that directly led to Vanderbilt first downs or TDs.

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) continued his outstanding recent play, registering five solo tackles and a team-high third interception. In the last two games, he has 13 solo tackles, two forced fumbles and a pair of INTs.

★ **Brian Kimbrow** (So., RB) had his best performance in weeks, running hard inside-the-tackles for 38 yards on 11 rushes.

MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

After setting a new SEC standard for career receiving yardage two weeks ago, **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) is on pace to establish another important league record for career receptions.

Matthews needs just 16 catches to eclipse the SEC mark of 236 career receptions set by former Commodore **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews ranks among the leading candidates for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top receiver.

The senior posted five catches for 45 yards in Vanderbilt's 34-17 win at Florida.

In a Oct. 26 game at Texas A&M, Matthews broke the SEC all-time receiving yardage record previously held by former UGA standout WR **Terrence Edwards** (3,093 yards, 1999-2002). Matthews has 3,217 receiving yards for his career entering the Kentucky game.

Matthews holds four team receiving marks for the Commodores. In addition to the career receiving yardage record, he is the team leader with 22 all-time touchdown catches, 1,323 receiving yards in a season, and 15 games of 100+ receiving yards.

This year, Matthews ranks as the conference leader with 66 receptions. His 103.9-yard receiving average is third best in the league behind only Texas A&M's **Mike Evans** and LSU's **Odell Beckham**.

Matthews also surpassed 100 receiving yards in five games this year. He has amassed at least five catches in every game as a senior.

Matthews' performance in the season opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his Vanderbilt career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels.

The conference's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb stats against SEC opponents. He has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 11 of his last 17 games against SEC teams, averaging 117.2 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 16 of his last 21 games.

2013 OFFENSE ON PACE TO REGISTER ONE OF TOP SEASONS IN MODERN TEAM HISTORY

The Vanderbilt offense is on pace to produce one of the finest campaigns in modern team history.

Through nine games, the unit is averaging 32.3 points, which would rank as the team's highest single-season average since Dan McGugin's potent Commodore teams in the World War I era. The offense established a modern day scoring standard in 2012 with a 30.0-point average.

The Commodores also are averaging 377.7 total yards – 237.9 passing and 139.8 rushing.

The comparative chart shows an improved Commodore unit over each of the first two Franklin seasons – and one vastly improved over the previous offense before Franklin took over as head coach.

Through nine games, the current offense is averaging 6.9 points more than the 2012 unit that eventually featured a 2,500-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver.

SUPERB KICKOFF COVERAGE TOPS VALUABLE SPECIAL TEAMS CONTRIBUTION

Vanderbilt's frequent advantage in field possession through nine games partially can be tracked to the NCAA's best kickoff coverage unit.

The 'Dores continued to rank No. 1 in the NCAA in the stat, holding opponents to a measly 15.3-yard average on 16 returns. Last Saturday, the unit held explosive Florida returner Solomon Patton to a 21-yard average.

Plenty of credit goes to **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK), a 2012 All-SEC recipient who has enjoyed improved leg strength during his final campaign. This year, 35 of Spear's 51 kickoffs have resulted in touchbacks. In 2011-12, only 33 of 134 kicks were downed in the end zone.

Spear also has been accurate as a placekicker. He was 2-for-2 against the Gators, and is now 8-for-10 on the season. Two of Spears' field goals have come from at least 50 yards.

Covering kicks is just one area of special teams where Vanderbilt has witnessed superb results. The 'Dores have received solid punting from first-year starter **Taylor Hudson** (R-So.), excellent coverage of opposing punt returners, and exciting kickoff returns by **Darrius Sims** (Fr.).

The combined play from Commodore special teams proved a key factor in the team's victory over Georgia Oct. 19. During the game, Vanderbilt special teams registered a touchdown resulting from a fake field goal, recovered a fumbled Bulldog punt return and yielded zero yards on five UGA kickoff returns. In the closing minutes, the team's punt return unit provided a final big play by tackling the Georgia punter deep in Bulldog territory following a bobbled snap.

LADLER, HAL, AZUBIKE, WOESTMANN TOP DEFENSE

Kenny Ladler (Sr., LB) and **Darreon Herring** (So., LB) are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 50 solo tackles and 73 total stops. He had five tackles and an INT in the win at Florida. Herring is second with 64 total stops and third behind **Jovan Marshall** (Sr., safety) in solo stops.

DE **Caleb Azubike** has the most tackles for loss (10.0) while DE **Kyle Woestmann** has the team lead in QB sacks (5.5).

Andre Hal (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with 11 passes defended.

The Commodores are one of nine schools from the BCS-affiliated conference that return intact staffs. It also marks the first time since 2009 that the Vandy staff remained intact.

TURNOVER MARGIN IMPROVES WITH BALL SECURITY

The Vanderbilt running back corps is doing a superb job protecting the football. The unit tops the SEC – and shares the NCAA lead – with just two fumbles lost through nine games.

On defense, the 'Dores have recovered nine opponent fumbles.

The lack of fumbles has pushed Vanderbilt to No. 3 in the SEC and 34th in the NCAA with a turnover margin of +5.

NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since QB **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

SUMMARY OF THE COMMODORE CAPTAINS

AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer QB is averaging 238.9 passing yards and 252.9 yards of total offense in seven starts. He did not play against Texas A&M or Florida.

ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He serves as the team's primary snapper in all roles.

CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. He returned to the lineup at Florida, contributing two stops.

ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender has 34 total tackles, including 3.5 for losses, an INT and SEC-high 12 passes defended.

WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 47th consecutive career start in the win at Florida.

JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 33 solo stops and 60 total tackles.

JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Award candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in five of nine games, leads the SEC with 71 catches and ranks 3rd with 935 receiving yards.

WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

May has 25 total tackles and 2.5 QB sacks in nine starting assignments.

CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior is 8-of-10 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more. He also scored on a TD on a fake FG attempt vs. Georgia. Spear has also been one of the SEC's top kickoff specialists as a senior.

TE DILLON VAN DER WAL NEWEST COMMODORE TO EARN FIRST START

Dillon van der Wal (R-So., TE) became the latest player to earn his initial start as a Commodore when Vanderbilt defeated Florida Nov. 9.

The Commodores also had three first-time starters, **Patton Robinette** (QB), **Paris Head** (CB) and **Torren McGaster** (CB), in their previous game at Texas A&M. Robinette was 15-of-28 for 216 yards and a TD vs. the Aggies. Head and McGaster contributed three and two tackles, respectively.

Van der Wal, Robinette, Head and McGaster joins 12 other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts this year.

Adam Butler (R-Fr., DT), **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Taylor Hudson Jr.**, punter), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) made their first collegiate starts in the opener against Ole Miss.

Jake Sealand (So., LB) earned his first start against Austin Peay, with **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) and **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR) enjoying their first start at South Carolina. **Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) also received his first start at UMass, and **Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL) started vs. Georgia.

Several of the other first-time starters posted superb stats in their first start. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles, and a QB hurry against Ole Miss. Taylor, Clarke, Herring and Hudson also played well against the Rebels: Taylor setting a single-game career high with four total tackles, Clarke notching three tackles and Herring posting five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes. Hudson averaged 40.0 yards on five punts against the Rebels.

Sealand had two tackles against Austin Peay. Seymour had 39 rushing yards, including a 1-yard TD rush, vs. South Carolina.

Jelks and Gouger lined up at tackle eligible in their initial starts.

EIGHTEEN COMMODORES HAVE EARNED INITIAL COLLEGIATE ACTION THIS YEAR

Eighteen underclassmen have experienced their initial action in a Commodore uniform this season.

First-time defensive players included **Torey Agee** (R-Fr., DT), **Ladarius Banks** (R-Fr., DT), **Harding Harper** (R-Fr., LB), **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB), **Torren McGaster** (R-Fr., CB), **Darrius Sims** (Fr., CB), **Ja'kari Thomas** (R-Fr., LB) and **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., DE).

Taylor Hudson (R-So., punter) and **Colby Cooke** (R-Fr., PK) is the only specialists participating for the first time.

Rayford also posted one catch for 24 yards against the Gobs.

No new true freshmen has played in the team's last four games.

MORE ON 'DORE OFFENSIVE LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) has started 47 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

Here's a few facts about Johnson's impressive Commodore career.

★ Johnson has been flagged for just two holding penalties during his 47-game career.

★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 7.5 sacks on 1,213 career pass attempts, or one sack every 162 pass plays.

★ Johnson did not allow a single QB sack in 2012. He has allowed two sacks this year.

★ Johnson has produced 208 knockdown blocks, 67 intimidation blocks and 128 blocks that led to a Commodore TD or first down.

★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two offensive TDs for the last 3+ seasons.

★ Johnson has played 2,964 career snaps: 2,075 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 72 at tight end. He has played 98.5 percent of the team's snaps over the last 3+ years.

JOHNSON: TEAM'S FIRST SEC PLAYER OF WEEK RECIPIENT THIS YEAR

Wesley Johnson (R-Sr., OT) earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his blocking efforts in Vanderbilt's 31-27 victory vs. nationally ranked Georgia on Oct. 19.

Johnson, who contributed four blocks that led directly to Commodore touchdowns in the performances, is the first Vanderbilt player this year to earn the SEC weekly recognition.

Johnson has been recognized by the SEC more than any Vanderbilt player. The honor vs. UGA marked the fourth time the conference has recognized Johnson.

COMMODORE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

Vanderbilt's offensive point production through nine games ranks favorably with the highest season averages in team history.

The Commodores rank eighth in the SEC with a 32.3-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 2.1 points higher than 297 in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points.

The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the program's highest single-season total since the 1915 Commodore squad averaged 51.4 points.

The increased scoring continues a trend the Commodores started at midseason one year ago. In its last 15 games, the Vanderbilt offense is averaging 36.5 points.

Vanderbilt seniors **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause** rank as the SEC's third most productive receiving tandem.

Collectively, Matthews and Krause are averaging 179.9 receiving yards each game.

The Matthews-Krause duo trails only two receiving tandem in the conference:

Odell Beckham and **Jarvis Landry** of LSU (202.3 yards) and **Mike Evans** and **Malcome Kennedy** of Texas A&M (186.9 yards).

While Matthews ranks No. 1 in the SEC with 71 receptions and third with 935 receiving yards, Krause also is enjoying a break-through season. The three-year starter has established new season highs with 32 catches, 608 receiving yards and three TD catches.

Florida. Both totals were team highs for the Commodores.

During the Oct. 26 effort at A&M, Matthews broke the SEC career receiving yardage record previously held by former Georgia WR **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002). He has 3,217 receiving yards.

Matthews is quickly approaching another important SEC career mark. He is 16 catches from tying the existing record of 236 receptions held by former Vanderbilt WR **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews also set the Vanderbilt team record Oct. 5 against Missouri with his 22nd career touchdown catch.

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., is among the leading contenders for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, which is given to the nation's leading receiver.

Through nine games, Matthews is on pace to challenge his 2012 totals of 94 catches and a team-record 1,323 receiving yards.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in five games this year, extending his school career record to 15 games of at least 100 receiving yards.

He also opened the year with a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole Miss, and added 106 yards at South Carolina. Later, he produced 123 receiving yards against Missouri and 111 yards vs. Austin Peay.

Matthews has been sensational against SEC competition this year. He has 49 catches for 633 receiving yards in six conference games.

Matthews posted staggering numbers during a superb junior campaign when he earned First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America recognition. Matthews' 94-reception total in 2012 is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks sixth on the SEC single-season charts.

RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

LASSING, HUDSON NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE DISTRICT III ALL-ACADEMIC SQUAD

Two of Vanderbilt top scholar athletes, **Fitz Lassing** (Sr., FB) and **Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) have been named to the Capital One/CoSIDA Academic District III football team.

Lassing, a senior from Montgomery Bell Academy in Nashville, and Hudson, a redshirt sophomore from Olentangy Liberty H.S. in Powell, Ohio, are now under consideration for the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team.

Lassing and Hudson are the first Commodore football players to earn Academic All-District recognition since linebacker John Stokes and receiver John Cole were recognized in 2010.

The last Vanderbilt scholar athlete to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team honors was linebacker Hunter Hillenmeyer in 2002. That year, Hillenmeyer also was a National Scholar Athlete recipient.

Lassing returned to the Commodore starting lineup at Florida, providing several key lead blocks from his fullback position in the Vanderbilt victory. On the season, he has three pass receptions for 18 yards and one touchdown.

Lassing is expected to earn an undergraduate degree in Economics in May. He holds a 3.9 GPA and is a multiple SEC Academic Honor Roll and Dean's List recipient.

Hudson has been superb as a first-year starting punter. He ranks among the nation's top 25 punters with a 43.3-yard average, and owns one of the top net averages in the SEC. He also is a candidate for the Ray Guy Award.

Hudson holds a 3.78 GPA as he works toward a Bachelor's degree in Neuroscience from the College of Arts and Science.

SPEAR SETS THIRD TEAM FIELD GOAL RECORD; HAS CONVERTED 80% OF FIELD GOALS THIS YEAR

Coming off the best season ever by a Vandy placekicker, senior **Carey Spear** has continued his excellent form in 2013.

The Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yards during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

Spear was 2-of-2 on field goals at Florida, converting a pair of 31-yarders. He also scored a TD on a fake FG vs. Georgia.

A second-team AP All-SEC recipient in 2012 after setting a team records with 20 field goals and 87 points, Spear is 8-of-10 on FGs this year.

He ranks fourth all-time among Vanderbilt kickers with 172 points scored.

Spear is a two-year starting placekicker and four-year starter at kickoff specialist. He is also the first Commodore player to be voted captain for three consecutive seasons since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected in 2003-05.

Vanderbilt captured its sixth straight regular season win against a non-SEC member when it defeated UAB 52-24 on Sept. 28.

Besides UAB, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay and UMass, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 10-1 (.909) in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 11-2 overall (.846) against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt is 22-14 (.611) against regular season non-SEC teams.

VANDERBILT DEFENSE IMPRESSES IN WINS OVER GEORGIA, FLORIDA

The Vanderbilt defense registered two of its best efforts of the year in recent wins over Georgia and Florida.

The unit hit Florida to 39 rushing yards and forced four critical turnovers during a 34-17 victory in the Swamp on Nov. 9. It was the first 'Dore win in Gainesville since 1945.

Three weeks earlier, face facing one of the SEC's most potent attacks, the unit held Georgia to season lows in every virtual offensive category, including rushing yards (107), first downs (16), total yards (221) and points scored (27). UGA QB **Aaron Murray**, the league's all-time leader in passing yardage, threw for only 114 yards, his third lowest total in a 49-game career, and failed to complete a TD pass for just the third time in his last 31 appearances.

Trailing by 10 points at intermission, the 'Dore defense frustrated Murray and the Bulldog offense in the second half. Georgia managed just five first downs and 80 total yards after halftime. The Bulldogs' only second-half points came on a 23-yard field goal.

The 221 yards of total offense by Georgia was the fewest Vanderbilt has allowed to an SEC opponent since Auburn managed just 212 yards in a 17-13 'Dore victory on Oct. 20, 2012.

QB CARTA-SAMUELS IMPRESSIVE; POSTED CONSECUTIVE 300+YARDS

Austyn Carta-Samuels (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB in 2009-10 at the University of Wyoming, is averaging 238.9 passing yards and 252.9 yards of total offense in seven starts. He has also completed 10 TD passes and ran for five more scores. He has been extremely accurate, hitting on 65.5% of his passes.

Carta-Samuels did not play at Texas A&M or Florida.

He threw for 338 yards and two TDs against Missouri on Oct. 5, one week after throwing for 334 yards and two TDs in a win over UAB on Sept. 28.

Carta-Samuels opened the season by becoming just the second Commodore QB ever to reach 300 passing yards in the opener vs. Ole Miss. That performance ranked among the best ever by a Vanderbilt QB.

TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

VANDERBILT ANNOUNCES FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Corbin Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.

Seymour started the game's scoring with a 7-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter. With just over nine minutes remaining in the second Seymour took a direct snap and ran for a 58-yard score on the only play of that drive.

It was the first career two-touchdown game for the sophomore, who set a career high with 107 yards rushing.

Vanderbilt quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, completing 23-29 passes for a career high 334 yards.

Carta-Samuels' second touchdown pass went to Jordan Matthews, who tied a Vanderbilt record with his 21st career touchdown reception.
