Home Games In Bold

- Xavier, 4-0 and ranked 12th in the Nov. 21 Associated Press Poll and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, led by as many as 36 points in the second half in its 70-56 win over Georgia on Friday night at Cintas Center. XU placed four players in double figures in scoring led by senior **Kenny Frease** with 12 points and nine rebounds and senior **Tu Holloway** with 12 points and four assists. Junior **Travis Taylor** recorded the first double-double of his Xavier career with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

- Xavier is playing the first of four straight games that will be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks. The ESPN family will broadcast eight of XU's next nine games.

- Xavier, 8-4 on opponent home courts last season, is playing its first road game of the 2011-12 season.

- Xavier is playing the second of two straight games against teams from the SEC. XU beat Georgia on Nov. 25. XU has now won eight of its last nine games against SEC teams since the 2008 season.

- Xavier graduate student **Andre Walker** is a 2011 Vanderbilt graduate and played 84 games, starting 40 times, for the Commodores from 2007-08 through 2010-11.

- Xavier has four players averaging in double figures in scoring through the first four games: junior **Mark Lyons** (17.8 ppg.), senior **Tu Holloway** (15.0 ppg.), freshman **Dezmine Wells** (10.5 ppg.) and senior **Kenny Frease** (10.3 ppg.).

- Xavier junior **Mark Lyons**, a member of the 2011-12 preseason A-10 Second Team, leads Xavier in scoring at 17.8 ppg. after four games, while shooting 51.9 percent from the field, including 50.0 percent from three-point territory. He has also contributed 3.8 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game.

- Xavier senior **Tu Holloway** scored a team-high tying 12 points in the Georgia win, giving him 1,283 career points and moving him into the top 25 among all-time Xavier career scoring leaders.

- Xavier senior **Kenny Frease** has blocked 14 shots over the first four games (3.5 per game), including a career-high six blocks against IPFW on Nov. 15.

- Xavier freshman **Dezmine Wells** has been a big hit in his first four games as a Musketeer, averaging 10.5 ppg.

- Xavier is 4-0, equalling its best start so far under third-year head coach **Chris Mack** (also 4-0 in the 2010-11 season). Xavier has only had one better start over the past 14 seasons including this one. XU started the 2008-09 season at 9-0 before finishing 27-8 and reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

- Xavier made its sixth straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2011, one of only 12 schools that can say that. Xavier has made 10 of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments.

- Xavier has graduated each of the last 83 men's basketball players that have played as seniors, a streak which dates back to 1986.

The Xavier-Vanderbilt Series: Xavier leads the series 4-0, although the two teams have met only once since the 1947-48 season. No. 7 seed XU defeated No. 10 seed Vanderbilt 80-68 in the first round of the 1997 NCAA Tournament in Auburn Hills, Mich. Future NBA standout **James Posey**, currently on the Indiana Pacers roster, led the Musketeers with 22 points and eight rebounds.

Xavier vs. the SEC: Xavier is hoping to continue its recent success against the SEC when it visits Vanderbilt. XU, which defeated Georgia on Friday night, has won eight of its last nine games against the SEC since the 2008 season, including road wins at Florida, Georgia, LSU and Auburn, an NCAA Tournament win over Georgia and home wins over Georgia, LSU and Auburn. XU lost at home to Florida last season, XU's only loss in its last 43 games at Cintas Center.

For The Record (Vanderbilt): Vanderbilt, ranked 18th in the Nov. 21 Associated Press Poll and 22nd in the Nov. 21 ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, is 5-1 this season, including wins over Oregon, North Carolina State, Oregon State and Bucknell. Vandy beat Monmouth 95-73 in its game on Friday night. It's lone loss was to Cleveland State.

For The Record (Xavier): Xavier, 4-0, had a 10-0 lead to start the game and led by as many as 36 points in the second half in its 70-56 win over Georgia on Friday night at Cintas Center. XU placed four players in double figures in scoring led by senior **Kenny Frease** with 12 points and nine rebounds and senior **Tu Holloway** with 12 points and four assists. Junior **Travis Taylor** recorded the first double-double of his Xavier career with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. All 14 players on the XU roster played on Friday. XU's defense held Georgia to 32.1 percent shooting, including 21.4 percent in the first half.

Nice Start: Xavier is 4-0, equalling its best start so far under third-year head coach **Chris Mack** (4-0 in the 2010-11 season). Xavier has only had one better start over the past 14 seasons including this one. XU started the 2008-09 season at 9-0 before finishing 27-8 and reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

ESPN Is Watching: Xavier is playing the first of four straight games that will be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks: at Vanderbilt on Nov. 28 (ESPN2), Purdue on Dec. 3 (ESPN2), at Butler on Dec. 7 (ESPN2) and Cincinnati on Dec. 10 (ESPN2). The ESPN family will broadcast eight of XU's next nine games to close out the calendar year of 2011.

National Rankings: Xavier, 4-0, was ranked 12th in the Associated Press Poll and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll that were released on Monday, Nov. 21. Xavier's preseason rankings in both polls marked Xavier's first preseason national ranking in the two major polls since **David West's** senior year of 2002-03, a remarkable fact considering Xavier has been a regular in

the polls for many years, especially in the second half of the season.

Nationally Ranked In Final 2011 Poll: Xavier was ranked 20th in the final Associated Press Poll. This was XU's fourth straight year in the AP Final Poll. Only Xavier, Duke, Kansas, Purdue and Pittsburgh have been in at least each of the last four final AP Polls.

Xavier Forward Is A Familiar Face In Nashville: Xavier graduate student **Andre Walker** is a 2011 Vanderbilt graduate and played 84 games, starting 40 times, for the Commodores from 2007-08 through 2010-11. Walker played in 32 games, starting 31 times, as a redshirt sophomore in the 2009-10 season, averaging 6.1 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. Injuries limited his time last season as a redshirt junior, although he played in 15 games and started eight times. Both of those seasons Vanderbilt made the NCAA Tournament.

Xavier Will Return To Tennessee In February: Xavier plays at Memphis (No. 8 in both Nov. 21 major polls) on February 4.

Lyons Has Been A Leader: Junior **Mark Lyons**, a preseason Second Team All-Atlantic 10 Conference selection, is averaging 17.8 ppg. (first on the team) through four games, while shooting 51.9 percent from the field, including 50.0 percent from three-point range. He has also contributed 3.8 assists (second on the team), 4.3 rebounds (fourth on the team) and 1.3 steals (tied for second on the team) per game.

Get Tu The Point: Holloway Is Among The Best Players In The Nation: Xavier senior point guard **Tu Holloway**, who made his 2011-12 season debut with 24 points and six assists against IPFW on Nov. 15, is listed as the fourth-best player in the nation in the list of top 100 players in the nation in the preseason (CBSSports.com) and a 2011-12 preseason All-American, including ESPN.com and *Athlon Sports* First Team and CBSSports.com Second Team. He is listed on the 2011-12 Naismith Preseason Watch List and the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list. Holloway was a consensus 2010-11 All-American, including Associated Press Third Team, and the 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Conference Player of the Year. Jay Williams, former National Player of the Year at Duke, called Tu "the most exciting guard to watch in college basketball."

Tu Is One Of Only Three Returning AP All-Americans: Senior **Tu Holloway** is one of only three players named to the 2010-11 AP first, second or third All-America team lists who is back this season, joining Ohio State's Jared Sullinger and

Wisconsin's Jordan Taylor. ESPN.com's Dana O'Neil listed Holloway as her preseason pick for National Player of the Year.

Holloway Bidding To Be A Tu-Time All-American And National Player of the Year Candidate: Senior **Tu Holloway** is looking to be Xavier's first two-time (or Tu-Time if you prefer) All-American since 2003 National Player of the Year David West. Holloway was named as 2010-11 Third Team Associated Press All-American, just the third Xavier player to earn AP first, second or third team honors and only the second to do it as an underclassman. Holloway's Third Team All-American honors also included being named 2010-11 Third Team All-American by *Sporting News*, *Basketball Times*, *SI.com*, *CBSsports.com* and *FOXSports.com*.

All-American Tu Holloway Was Named 2011 Atlantic 10 Conference Player Of The Year: **Tu Holloway** was named 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Conference Player of the Year and a member of the A-10 All-Defensive Team by the A-10 coaches. Holloway is the second Xavier player to earn the A-10 Player of the Year honor since XU joined the Atlantic 10 Conference for the 1995-96 season. 2003 National Player of the Year and two-time NBA All-Star **David West** won the award an A-10 record three straight years (2001, 2002 and 2003).

Holloway Now In The Top 25 On XU's All-Time Scoring List...Three Others Could Be 1,000 Point Scorers This Season: Xavier senior **Tu Holloway** scored 12 points in the win over Georgia on Nov. 25, giving him 1,283 career points and moving him into the 25th spot on XU's all-time scoring list. Junior **Travis Taylor** (835 points), senior **Kenny Frease** (778) and junior **Mark Lyons** (753) all have a good shot at joining the 1,000 Point Club this season.

Frease Enjoying A Block Party: Senior **Kenny Frease** has blocked 14 shots over the first four games (3.5 per game), including a career high six blocked shots against IPFW on Nov. 15.

Fresh Start: Freshman **Dezmine Wells** has started his first four games as a collegian and has made a definite impact. Wells, a preseason A-10 All-Rookie Team selection, is third on the team in scoring at 10.5 ppg. He is bidding to become the first XU freshman to score in double figures for a season since **Stanley Burrell** scored a team-high 12.7 ppg. in the 2004-05 season. The last Xavier freshman to start his first collegiate game was **Romain Sato** in a win over Miami (Ohio) on Nov. 18, 2000 at Cintas Center.

Wells Made ESPN's Top Plays List In His Debut Game: Freshman **Dezmine Wells** started his first game as a collegian and caught the eye of ESPN. His one-handed alley-oop dunk with his left hand (he's right-handed) in the first half was selected as the No. 2 Play of the Day on ESPN's SportsCenter.

Redford Returns To Action: Junior **Brad Redford** played 11 minutes and hit two three-pointers in the season opener against Morgan State on Nov. 11, Redford's first official game action since the 2010 NCAA Tournament Regional Semifinal against Kansas State (3-25-10). Redford hit two deep three-pointers in the win over Georgia on Nov. 25. Redford, named as the second-best shooter in college basketball by CBSsports.com, suffered a season-ending knee injury prior to the start of the 2010-11 season. He has 105 three-pointers among his 112 career field goals. Last season Redford worked as a roving reporter for GoXavier.com and RedfordsRundown.com. He even did a sideline spot for a CBS College Sports game.

Mack Has More Options This Season: Head coach **Chris Mack** has 10 players averaging at least 7.0 minutes per game and nine of them have averaged over 11 mpg. Three freshmen have been a big part of the early-season lineups: **Dezmine Wells** (22.0 minutes per game), **Dee Davis** (14.3 mpg.) and **Justin Martin** (12.5 mpg.). By comparison, last season Xavier only had seven players who even averaged 7.5 minutes or more per game (none of them freshmen) and there were only nine active scholarship players on the roster.

Impressive Record Under Mack: Xavier third-year head coach **Chris Mack**, the 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year, is 54-17 (.761) overall and 29-3 (.906) in Atlantic 10 regular season play in his career so far.

Home Sweet Home: Xavier is in its 12th season at Cintas Center. Xavier, 4-0 this season and winners of 12 straight games at Cintas Center, is now 153-18 (.895) all-time at Cintas Center. XU is 78-10 (.886) against Atlantic 10 teams and 75-8 (.904) against non-conference teams since Cintas Center opened. Xavier currently has a 40-game home court winning streak in Atlantic 10 play, which stands alone for the longest in league history. XU was 8-0 at home in A-10 play in the 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.

Home Cooking: Xavier completed the season-opening four-game homestand with a 4-0 record. This is the longest homestand of the season. XU has home games in seven of its first nine games.

102 Sell-Outs: Xavier has now sold out 102 games at the 10,250-seat Cintas Center since the building opened for the 2000-01 season, including three this season. XU has averaged 10,038 fans per game for 171 men's games at its on-campus home.

Quite A Five-Year Run: Entering this season, Xavier had won 132 games over the last five years combined, which is an average of 26.4 wins per season. Last season Xavier secured its sixth straight 20-win season and its 14th 20-win season in 15 years.

Six Straight NCAA Tournaments Puts Xavier Among A Select Dozen: Xavier is one of only 12 schools that have made six straight NCAA Tournament appearance, including 2011: Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Marquette, Michigan State, Pittsburgh, Tennessee, Texas, Texas A&M, Villanova, Wisconsin and Xavier.

NBA Success Stories: Xavier has four players currently on NBA rosters, including **Jordan Crawford** (Washington Wizards), **Derrick Brown** (N.Y. Knicks), 2003 National Player of the Year and two-time NBA All-Star **David West** (N.O. Hornets) and two-time NBA Champion **James Posey** (Indiana Pacers).

Impressive Graduation Streak Continues: Xavier has graduated each of the last 83 men's basketball players that have played as seniors, including the six seniors from the 2010-11 season: **Jamel McLean, Andrew Taylor, Danté Jackson, Kevin Feeney, Joe Hughes** and **Johnny Mazza**.

Streaking: Xavier's graduation streak is impressive but it's not the only streak still alive at Xavier. Xavier has won at least a share of five straight Atlantic 10 Conference Regular Season Championships. While Xavier's school-record streak of 30 straight home wins came to an end against Florida on Dec. 31, 2010, Xavier still has an active streak of 40 straight Atlantic 10 home wins in addition to the win streaks in season openers (22) and Cintas Center season openers (12). XU has an active overall home winning streak at Cintas Center of 12 games. XU has now recorded six straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

Five Straight Atlantic 10 Regular Season Championships: Xavier, 15-1 in the Atlantic 10 Conference, won sole possession of the 2011 Atlantic 10 Regular Season Championship. Xavier has won at least a share of five straight A-10 Regular Season Championships. It's a feat that only UMass and Saint Joseph's had previously accomplished in A-10 history. UMass won five straight regular season titles from 1992-96. Saint Joseph's did win five straight regular season titles from 2001-05, including three East Division titles, but finished second to West Division Champion Xavier in A-10 overall record to a 14-2 XU squad in 2002 and a 15-1 XU squad in 2003. SJU

shared the A-10 East title at 12-4 in 2002 and won the East at 12-4 in 2003. *XU and UMass are the only teams that have shared or recorded the best A-10 overall record for five years in a row.*

Atlantic 10 Success Story: Xavier has won outright or shared nine Atlantic 10 Conference Regular Season Championships since joining the league for the 1995-96 season, including each of the last five seasons. Xavier's impressive Atlantic 10 history includes five straight A-10 Regular Season Championships (2011, Co-Champs in 2010, 2009, 2008 and Co-Champs in 2007), sole possession of three A-10 West Division Championships (1997 and back-to-back in 2002 and 2003), one A-10 West Co-Championship (1998) and four A-10 Tourney Championships (2006, 2004, 2002 and 1998). Xavier began competition in the A-10 in the 1995-96 season after 16 years as a member of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference (now Horizon League).

Xavier Named Atlantic 10 Favorite And Five Musketeers Earned Preseason

Atlantic 10 Conference Honors: Xavier, which has won at least a share of the last five Atlantic 10 Conference Regular Season Championships, was picked by the coaches and media as the preseason favorite. Senior **Tu Holloway** (2010-11 A-10 Player of the Year and A-10 All-Defensive Team member) was named to the A-10 preseason First Team and All-Defensive Team. Junior **Mark Lyons** and senior **Kenny Frease** were named to the preseason Atlantic 10 Conference Second Team and freshmen **Justin Martin** and **Dezmine Wells** were named to the preseason A-10 All-Rookie Team.

Xavier Will Be In Hawaii This Christmas: Xavier is among the teams in the 2011 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic, which will be held in late Dec. in Honolulu, Hawaii. Tournament host Hawai'i will again be part of the field along with Auburn, Clemson, Kansas State, Long Beach State, Southern Illinois and UTEP.

Popular Weekly Coaches Show Takes A Week Off: Xavier head coach **Chris Mack** has a new home for his weekly radio show. The weekly Chris Mack Show presented by Toyota continues on Mondays from 7-8 p.m., live on 55KRC from T.G.I. Friday's in Kenwood. The popular radio play-by-play tandem of **Byron Larkin** and **Joe Sunderman** join Coach Mack each week, although there will be no show on Nov. 28 since XU will be playing at Vanderbilt. The radio show and game broadcasts are productions of Xavier Sports Properties, a property of Learfield Sports.

Impressive Recruiting Class: Head coach **Chris Mack** announced on the first day of the early signing period (Nov. 9) that he had received four signed National Letters of Intent: **Semaj Christon** (Sem-ah-jeh Kristen), a 6-3 and 182-pound point guard from Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, N.H.; **Myles Davis**, a 6-2 and 200-pound guard who is playing at Notre Dame Preparatory School in Fitchburg, Mass.; **James Farr**, a 6-9 and 222-pound forward from Maine Central Institute in Pittsfield, Maine; **Jalen Reynolds**, a 6-9 and 220-pound forward who is now playing with Christon at Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, N.H.

Two More Musketeers Sitting Out Due To Transfer Rules: Xavier has two transfers that are currently practicing with the team and will be eligible next season: **Isaiah Philmore**, a 6-8 junior forward, played his first two seasons at Towson University and **Erik Stenger**, a 6-8 junior forward, played two seasons at Northern Kentucky University.

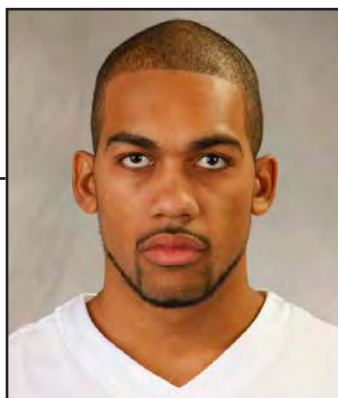

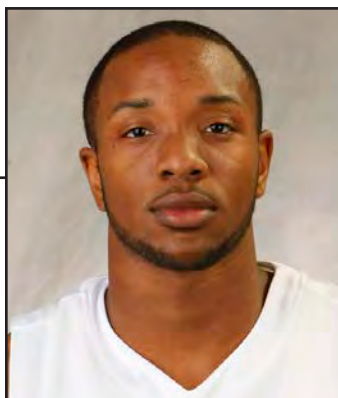

MACK WON 2010-11 ATLANTIC 10 COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD AND SKIP PROSSER AWARD

Xavier third-year head coach **Chris Mack**, 41, was named 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year by his fellow A-10 coaches. In addition, Mack was the recipient of the 2011 Skip Prosser Man of the Year award, which is sponsored by CollegeInsider.com. The Skip Prosser Award was established in 2008 to honor those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off of it as well.

IMPRESSIVE RECORD UNDER MACK

Xavier head coach **Chris Mack** is 54-17 (.761) overall and 29-3 (.906) in Atlantic 10 regular season play in two years plus at the helm. Mack's two-year A-10 record of 29-3 (15-1 last season and 14-2 in the 2009-10 season) equals the best two-year A-10 run in Xavier history. XU

was a combined 29-3 in **David West's** junior and senior years (15-1 in 2003 and 14-2 in 2002). Mack has already led Xavier to the 2011 A-10 Regular Season Championship, the 2011 NCAA Tournament Second Round, the 2010 A-10 Co-Regular Season Championship and the 2010 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

XAVIER EVEN MORE IMPRESSIVE IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH UNDER MACK

Xavier's numbers back up the theory that the team seems to get better as the season progresses and peaks at the right time under head coach Chris Mack and his staff. In the two years under Mack, Xavier is a combined 20-6 (.769) for the months of February and March, including 9-3 last season (7-1 in February and 2-2 in March) and 11-3 in the 2009-10 season (6-1 in February and 5-2 in March, including an NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance).

MACK MADE XAVIER HISTORY IN THE 2009-10 SEASON AS A ROOKIE HEAD COACH

Mack, the 2009-10 *Basketball Times* Rookie Coach of the Year, was 26-9 in his first season as Xavier's head coach. He was the winningest first-year head coach in Division I for the 2009-10 season. He was the only rookie head coach to lead his team into the 2010 NCAA Tournament. Mack became the first Xavier head coach to guide XU to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 in either his first or second season as head coach. Mack led Xavier to a 20-win season, the first time in school history that a coach has led a team to 20 wins without at least two seniors on the roster. He also accomplished that feat with no returning double-figure scorers from the 2008-09 season. In fact, Mack won 26 games, tying him for the best total ever for a Xavier rookie head coach.

XAVIER COACHING SUCCESS STORY

Mack, 41, is the 17th head coach in program history. Prior to being named Xavier's head coach on April 15, 2009, Mack spent five seasons as an assistant on **Sean Miller's** Xavier staff. Prior to that he was on the staff of the late **Skip Prosser** both at Xavier and at Wake Forest.

XAVIER PLAYER AND GRADUATE

Mack is a 1992 Xavier University graduate with a degree in communication arts. Mack is the fifth Xavier alumnus out of 17 all-time head coaches to take over the Xavier men's basketball program. Mack was a two-time team captain as a player at Xavier under then-head coach **Pete Gillen**. He won an MCC Regular Season Championship at 12-2 and reached the second round of the 1993 NCAA Tournament. Mack was the 1987-88 *Cincinnati Post* Metro Player of the Year at St. Xavier High School in Cincinnati before going on to start for two seasons at Evansville, winning an MCC Regular Season Championship and a trip to the second round of the 1989 NCAA Tournament as a UE freshman. He transferred to Xavier after his sophomore season.

LEARNED UNDER PROSSER AND MILLER

Mack was XU's Director of Basketball Operations from 1999-2001 under Prosser. Mack spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Wake Forest under Prosser from 2001-04. He returned to Xavier from 2004-09 as an assistant coach under Miller. During those 10 years on the Prosser and Miller staffs at Xavier and Wake, Mack coached on nine teams that made postseason play, including eight teams that made the NCAA Tournament field. Those eight NCAA teams made the NCAA Second Round three times (2002, 2003 and 2007), the NCAA Sweet 16 twice (2004 and 2009) and the NCAA Elite Eight once (2008).

BASKETBALL FAMILY MAN

Mack and wife, Christi, have two daughters, Hailee (5) and Lainee (6). Christi has a basketball background as a collegiate standout at the University of Dayton, the Director of Basketball Operations for XU's women's basketball team (2001-03) and more recently as the former head girls basketball coach at Cincinnati's Colerain High School.

Prior to this game, the last Xavier freshman to start his first collegiate game was **Romain Sato** in a win over Miami (Ohio) on Nov. 18, 2000 in the first game ever played at Cintas Center. Xavier played its opener without senior All-American **Tu Holloway**.
