TV: Friday and Saturday evening's games will be televised live on the NBC Sports Network, with Terry Gannon calling the action and Ben Howland and Dalen Cuff providing the analysis.
Radio: The contests will be broadcast live on the Rutgers IMG Sports Network, WOR 710 AM in New York & WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Danny Breslauer will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU (88.7 FM) will also broadcast the games.

After a pair of preliminary round games at the RAC, Rutgers travels to Brooklyn to meet Vanderbilt on Friday evening in a 7 p.m. tip-off in the Barclays Center Classic. Depending on the outcome versus the Commodores, Rutgers will meet either Virginia or La Salle on Saturday at 7 or 9:30. The contests in Brooklyn will mark RU's first games away from the RAC this season and the program's first contests on the Barclays Center hardwood. The Scarlet Knights, in the midst of playing five games in nine days, play seven contests over a span of 15 days to begin their inaugural campaign in the Big Ten Conference.

Friday's evening's game will mark the first meeting between Rutgers and Vanderbilt on the collegiate hardwood. The Scarlet Knights and Cavaliers have met three times dating back to 1986, with Virginia holding a 3-0 advantage, including 1-0 on a neutral court. Rutgers and La Salle have played five times dating back to 1960, with the Explorers holding a 3-2 edge and the series tied 1-1 on a neutral court. Both of the neutral court games were contested with Eddie Jordan running the point for RU. He scored 13 points as four Scarlet Knights scored in double figures in a 96-84 win over the No. 17-ranked Explorers at the Palestra on Feb. 22, 1975. Jordan posted six points as a freshman, as RU dropped a 76-82 decision to La Salle at Madison Square Garden on Feb. 23, 1974.

Rutgers suffered a 68-50 loss to Saint Peter's on Tuesday night. Sophomore forward Junior Etou shot 6-of-10 to score a career-high 16 points, while senior guard Myles Mack made 5-of-10 field goal attempts to register 13 points with seven assists and four steals. Senior forward Kadeem Jack chipped in 10 points. The Peacocks shot 12-of-23 from behind the arc to earn the victory and out-rebounded RU by a 36-26 margin.

Mack leads the Big Ten and ranks 11th nationally steals (3.5), while Etou is third in the Conference in rebounding (9.3).

Vanderbilt, under the direction of 15th-year head coach Kevin Stallings, defeated Norfolk State 63-53 at home on Tuesday night. The Commodores made nine three-pointers and had four players register double figures. Sophomore center Damian Jones leads the team in both scoring (16.0) and rebounding (8.3).

RUTGERS MEN'S BASKETBALL ANNOUNCES RECRUITING CLASS

Head coach Eddie Jordan announced that point guard Corey Sanders, forward Kejuan Johnson and shooting guard Justin Goode have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Rutgers University and compete in men's basketball.

"We are very excited to welcome these three young men into our basketball family," said Jordan. "They each possess a special skill set that will help us build a winning program. Competing in the Big Ten is very challenging. It's essential to have players that not only have the ability to compete at a high level, but the drive and enthusiasm to attack the process. We believe Corey, Kejuan and Justin have these important qualities."

Sanders (6-1, 170), is a four-star recruit and the 74th-rated overall player in the class of 2015, according to Rivals.com. ESPN.com also has him slated as a four-star recruit (86th overall) and the seventh-best point guard in the country, while 247Sports has him as the 67th best player in the nation. Sanders is considered an electric point guard possessing elite speed and handle on the court. Also ranked as the 15th point guard and 91st overall player in the country according to Scout.com, Sanders averaged 16.8 points, four assists and four steals per game during his junior season at Kathleen High School in Bradenton, Fla.

ing ability. During his senior campaign at Lord Botetourt High School in Virginia, Goode averaged 19.9 points-per-game and was named VHSCA Group 3A Player of the Year. Goode shot 91.6 percent from the charity stripe and dished out 4.2 assists-per-contest to help Botetourt to a semifinal appearance in the 3A Virginia playoffs.

RUTGERS SEASON NOTABLES

- Senior guard Myles Mack's eight steals versus St. Francis-Brooklyn were a career high and were the second highest single-game total in school history. It was the most since Mike Dabney had nine steals on Feb. 7, 1976 vs. Navy. Dabney had nine steals twice that season, while current Rutgers head coach Eddie Jordan also had nine versus Penn State on March 2, 1974.
- The 44 points scored by Fairleigh Dickinson were the lowest scoring output allowed by Rutgers since holding Pittsburgh to 39 points in a 62-39 win on Jan. 11, 2012.

Johnson (6-6, 215), is currently a senior at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. The 50th overall forward in the class of 2015 according to ESPN.com, Johnson is slated as a three-star recruit by ESPN, Rivals.com and 247Sports.com. Johnson, who can play both guard and small forward, can attack the basket effectively and is a dangerous coast-to-coast player, according to ESPN's analysis. Johnson averaged 18.1 points and 6.5 rebounds-per-game during his junior season at Hapeville Charter in Atlanta, Ga.

Goode (6-3, 185) is a post-graduate student at Hargrave Military Academy. He is considered a skilled three-point shooter who can stretch defenses with his shoot-

passion that exists, not only from the schools, but from the region as well. This is a game that everyone looks forward to. To shine a brighter light on it with additional branding and an annual trophy is very exciting.”

The trophy will be unveiled prior to this season’s game, which will tip-off at 12 noon on Saturday, Dec. 6 at the Prudential Center in Newark. The trophy is constructed primarily from recycled Asbury Park boardwalk planks, which were retrieved during a re-decking after Superstorm Sandy. New Jersey resident Colin Pezzano, a 2014 graduate of the University of the Arts, created the one-of-a-kind trophy. It is “definitively Jersey” in its presentation.

RU HALL OF FAMER GEORGE MACKARONIS PASSES AWAY

Rutgers Athletics Hall of Famer George Mackaronis passed away on Monday, Nov. 3, 2014 at the Roosevelt Care Center in Edison at age 90. A WWII Army veteran, restaurateur and founder of the Rutgers Court Club, Mackaronis was a fixture on the Rutgers men’s basketball scene for more than 50 years. An All-State player at New Brunswick High School, Mackaronis became one of the best college players in the East, competing well against All-Americans the likes of NYU’s Dolph Schayes, Seton Hall’s Bobby Wanzer and Princeton’s Butch Van Breda Kolf. In 1942, due to World War II, he became the first Rutgers freshman to ever play on the varsity. From 1943-45, he served in World War II, was involved in the D-Day invasion and earned five battle stars. He returned to Rutgers and started every game over the next three seasons, leading the 1945-46 team in scoring with a 15.0 average. The team captain in 1947-48, Mackaronis was the winner of the Loyal Son Award and was considered to have one of the best set shots in Rutgers history. A leader on various committees, Mackaronis founded the Court Club in 1956 and served as president for 30 years. He was the first president of the Rutgers Basketball Players Association and sponsored the Rutgers Basketball Scholar-Athlete Award, which is named in his honor. Mackaronis was inducted into the Athletics Hall of Fame in 1996.

DIALLO AND JOHNSON TO SIT OUT 2014-15 SEASON

Rutgers head men’s basketball coach Eddie Jordan announced Oct. 3 that freshmen Ibrahima Diallo and Ryan Johnson will sit out the 2014-15 season. Diallo and Johnson will be able to practice and participate in team activities, but will not be permitted to compete in games after being ruled as partial qualifiers by the NCAA. Diallo and Johnson will retain four years of eligibility, beginning with the 2015-16 season.

“Ibrahima and Ryan have both worked very hard since arriving on campus and have done everything we have asked of them,” said Jordan. “We will utilize this redshirt season as an opportunity for Ibrahima and Ryan to continually develop, both on and off the floor. RUTGERS MEN'S BASKETBALL SHINES IN APR

Rutgers men's basketball earned a multi-year academic progress rate (APR) score of 978 for data concluding with the 2012-13 academic year. The multi-year score marked the highest for Rutgers men's hoops since the data began being tabulated in 2004-05 and was in the top 30 percent of all men's basketball programs Rutgers earned a perfect APR score of 1000 for the 2012-13 academic year. It marked the third consecutive year that RU received a perfect single year score.

RUTGERS "DRAFTS" SEAN MOFFITT

Rutgers men's basketball, via the Boston-based nonprofit organization Team IMPACT, "draft" Sean Moffitt, an 11-year boy from North Brunswick, onto the team on Sept. 4. Moffitt's "Draft Day" press conference took place in the media room at the RAC. Sean signed his "Scarlet Knight Intent Letter" and was presented with his team jersey by head coach Eddie Jordan. He was joined by his parents, Mitch and Beth. Born with hemiplegic cerebral palsy, Sean has limited use of his right side after suffering a stroke at birth. He is able to walk with the help of a brace and has had multiple surgeries to try to gain movement and use of his right arm. Team IMPACT is a 501(c)3 nonprofit whose mission is to improve the quality of life for children facing life-threatening and chronic illnesses through the power of team.

HEAD COACH EDDIE JORDAN

29 seasons of coaching experience
14 career post-season appearances as a coach, including two NBA Finals appearances and three NCAA bids
17 NBA All-Stars coached during his career

Eddie Jordan, who helped the Scarlet Knights to the 1976 Final Four, was named the 18th head coach in the history of the Rutgers men's basketball program on April 23, 2013. He returned to "The Banks" with an NBA Championship ring and now leads RU into the Big Ten Conference with 29 seasons of coaching experience, including nine at the collegiate level and 19 in the NBA.

In Jordan's first season at the helm, the Scarlet Knights were picked 10th in the American Athletic Conference preseason coaches poll and finished seventh in the league standings. The three position differential between projected and actual finish tied for the best in the league with Cincinnati (4th/t-1st) and SMU (6th/t-3rd). Fifteen of Rutgers' games were played against opponents that earned post-season invites as the team compiled a 12-21 (5-13) record. RU defeated USF in the opening round of the AAC Championship, its third win over the Bulls during the season. It marked the first time the Scarlet Knights had defeated a foe three times in a season since 1988-89, when it completed the trifecta versus St. Bonaventure when Jordan was an assistant under Bob Wenzel.

Kadeem Jack and Myles Mack earned All-MET honors in 2013-14 under Jordan's tutelage. Rutgers players also earned seven conference honors during the course of the season. In conference games, RU led the league in defensive rebounding percentage (.681) and ranked third in the AAC in free throw percentage, shooting .707 percent. It marked RU's best team mark at the charity stripe since shooting .719 percent in 2008-09.

RU's all-time leader in both assists (585) and steals (220), "Fast Eddie" scored 1,632 career points and earned honorable mention All-American honors as a senior in 1977. He later returned as an assistant under coaches Tom Young (1984-85) and Bob Wenzel (1988-92). In his nine seasons with the Scarlet Knights before returning as head coach, RU earned eight postseason berths, including four NCAA Championship bids.

Jordan served as an assistant with the Los Angeles Lakers in 2012-13 under head coach Mike D'Antoni, returning to the club for which he earned a championship as a player in 1982. He helped the Lakers to its eighth-straight playoff appearance, working with notable players such as Kobe Bryant, Dwight Howard, Paul Gasol and Steve Nash. Jordan transitioned back to the NBA after serving as a freshman coach at his alma mater, Archbishop Carroll High School in Washington, D.C., while also working as head coach of the D.C. Assault 17U AAU team.

Jordan has served as an NBA head coach for three different teams over nine seasons. He compiled a career regular season mark of 257-343 (.428) and a playoff record of 8-18 (.308) over nine seasons with Sacramento (1996-98), Washington (2003-09) and Philadelphia (2009-10). Among the players to earn All-Star recognition under his head coaching leadership are Mitch Richmond, Caron Butler, Gilbert Arenas, Antawn Jamison and Allen Iverson.

Born (Jan. 29, 1955) and raised in Washington, D.C., Jordan served as head coach of his hometown Wizards from the 2003-04 season through the first 11 games of 2008-09. After inheriting a Wizards team that posted a losing record in five-straight seasons, Jordan was able to guide the 2004-05 Wizards to their highest win total in 25 years in just his second season, while giving Washington its first playoff berth since 1997 and advancing past the first round for the first time since 1982. Jordan's Wizards made four-straight playoff appearances from 2004-05 through 2007-08. Prior to his arrival, Washington made the playoffs just once over a 16-year span. The Wizards ranked sixth in the league in scoring in 2004-05, third in 2005-06 and fourth in 2006-07.

Before his time with the Wizards, Jordan served as the lead assistant coach on Byron Scott's staff in New Jersey from 2000-03, helping the Nets to the NBA Finals in back-to-back years in 2002 and 2003. Among the players Jordan worked with in the Garden State were Jason Kidd, Richard Jefferson, Stephon Marbury, Kenyon Martin and Dikembe Mutombo. Prior to his work with the Nets, Jordan was an assistant coach with Sacramento for five seasons beginning in 1992, before being named head coach of the Kings for the final 15 games of the 1996-97 campaign. He would spend his first full season as an NBA head coach with the Kings for the 1997-98 season, his last year with the club.

After retiring from the NBA in 1984, Jordan began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Rutgers. He followed Young to Old Dominion before landing an assistant coaching position under Jim O'Brien at Boston College, where he served from 1986-88. He later returned to Rutgers as an assistant coach under Wenzel. The Scarlet Knights made NCAA appearances in 1989 and 1991 and earned NIT berths in 1990 and 1992.

Originally selected by Cleveland in the second round of the 1977 NBA Draft (33rd overall), Jordan averaged 8.1 points, 3.8 assists, 1.9 rebounds and 1.82 steals in seven seasons with the Cavaliers, Nets, Lakers and Portland Trail Blazers. While with the Nets, Jordan led the league in total steals in 1978-79 and was second in 1979-80. He played in 420 NBA games and scored 3,414 career points.

Inducted into Rutgers Athletics Hall of Fame in 1980 and the Hall of Distinguished Alumni in 2004, Jordan was the point guard and catalyst of the great Rutgers teams of the mid-1970's. He was the on-court general for the 1975-76 Scarlet Knights, who fashioned a perfect 26-0 regular season mark and wound up with a 31-2 record. He was named the 1976 NCAA Tournament East Regional MVP.

Jordan and his wife Charrisse have two children, son Jackson and daughter Skylar. Jordan also has three sons: Justin, Eddie II and Paul. Eddie II was a three-year (2000-01, 2003) varsity football letterwinner at Rutgers under head coach Greg Schiano, playing tight end and linebacker. Charrisse Jordan was appointed President of "Behind the Bench," a non-profit organization developed by the National Basketball Wives Association, which raises funds and awareness for charities that benefit women and children.
