What's On Tap

No. 1 Vanderbilt hits the road this weekend for a key Southeastern Conference match up against No. 9 Arkansas. The series starts Friday night at 6:35 p.m. and will continue on Saturday at 2:05 p.m. and Sunday at 1:05 p.m.

Scouting Arkansas

Arkansas is 17-6 on the year and 2-1 in SEC play after taking two of three from Kentucky in Lexington over the weekend. The Razorbacks rallied from a late eight run deficit to top Centenary, 16-13, Wednesday afternoon in Shreveport, La.

Third baseman Logan Forsythe leads the team with a .358 batting average with three homers and 16 RBI. Outfielder Casey Coon is the top power source with five homers, nine doubles and 36 RBI through 23 games. The Razorbacks are hitting .296 as a team with 29 homers and 210 runs scored (9.1 runs per game).

Junior southpaw Nick Schmidt (5-0, 1.47 ERA) will get the start on Friday night for Arkansas. Junior right-hander Duke Welker (4-0, 3.77 ERA) will take the hill on Saturday, while Sunday's starter is yet to be determined. Jess Todd (1-2, 4.95 ERA) has served as the team closer and could possibly start on Sunday. He has two saves with 33 strikeouts and six walks in 20.0 innings. As a team, Arkansas sports a 3.85 ERA with 191 strikeouts and 92 walks in 194.0 innings. **Of Note:** Staff ace Nick Schmidt was a member of the US National Team over the summer coached by Tim Corbin ... The Commodores last win in Fayetteville was a 6-4 win on April 11, 2003.

Commodores Remain No. 1 For Fourth Straight Week, Off To Best Start Ever

Vanderbilt picked up two No. 1 rankings this week and is ranked in the top spot in four of the five polls. *Baseball America* and *Rivals.com* ranked the Commodores No. 1 for the first time ever this week, while the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and the *USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll* continued to rank them first. *Collegiate Baseball* dropped the Commodores out of the top spot for the first time in four weeks behind undefeated Florida State.

The Commodores at 22-1 are off to the best start of any sport in school history, besting the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team.

The baseball ranking joins women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to postseason play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Shea Robin Named To Johnny Bench Watch List

Junior catcher Shea Robin was named to the initial Johnny Bench Award List by The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.

Twenty-seven catchers from seventeen conferences were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 7, 2007.

Robin is one of four catchers from the Southeastern Conference to be on the list, joining Tennessee's J.P. Arencibia, Mississippi State's Edward Easley and LSU's Robert Lara. The Woodlands, Texas, native is hitting .311 on the season with a homer and 11 RBI. He has made only one error on the season in 188 chances and has thrown out eight base runners in 18 chances. He had a stellar week at the plate last week, going 7-for-16 (.438) with six runs scored in helping lead the Commodores to a series win over Ole Miss.

The watch list will be narrowed down to ten semi-finalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2007.

Commodores Blast Western Kentucky 15-2

Vanderbilt scored 12 runs in the first three innings, capped off by a six run third en route to a 15-2 win over Western Kentucky Tuesday night at Hawkins Field.

Six Commodores had two or more hits led by Dominic de la Osa's three hits and two RBIs and Ryan Davis' three hits and four RBIs. Alex Feinberg, Pedro Alvarez, Ryan Flaherty and Andrew Giobbi each had two hits in the winning effort.

Mike Minor pitched 3.1 innings of two-hit scoreless relief with six strikeouts and no walks in the winning effort to move to 3-0 on the year.

Western Kentucky jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first on a RBI single by Scotty Colt and a sacrifice fly by Jake Wells.

The Commodores plated four runs in the bottom half and never looked back. They scored two more in the second, courtesy of a two-run homer by Pedro Alvarez and then took advantage of three Hilltopper errors in the third to score six unearned runs.

VU scored another run in the fourth and de la Osa added a solo homer in the sixth, his sixth of the year to make it 14-2. Brian Harris' added a RBI double in the seventh to close out the scoring.

Tyler Rhoden, Cameron Betourne, Josh Zeid, Caleb Cotham and Jason Cunningham combined to pitch four innings of two hit relief. Betourne made his first appearance of the season, while Cunningham recorded an out in his first career outing.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt (22-1, 2-1 SEC) lost for the first time this season against No. 14 Ole Miss last Saturday, but captured the three-game series against the Rebels in dramatic fashion, using ninth inning rallies in one-run wins on Friday and Sunday... The Commodores won the regular season series over the Rebels for the third straight year ... VU is 8-0 in one run games this year and have come from behind in 12 of its 21 wins on the year ... David Price produced his third straight complete game (in six starts on the year), this one a yeoman 10 inning performance in the 3-2 win over Ole Miss in 10 innings Friday night. He held the Rebels to just four hits and two runs while striking out 14 with just two walks. On the season he is 5-0 with 71 strikeouts in 45.2 innings. It was his fifth straight game with double digit strikeouts ... Offensively, Matt Meingasner seems to have claimed the full-time starter's role in leftfield with four starts on the week, he was 7-for-16 (.438) with two homers, nine RBI and five runs scored. He had a .813 slugging percentage with a .500 on base percentage. He was 4-for-5 with a homer and six RBI against Belmont and also came up huge with game-tying hits in the bottom of the ninth in the two wins over Ole Miss ... The Commodores won the regular season series over the Rebels for the third straight year ... Shea Robin also had a solid week at the plate going 7-for-16 as well with three RBI and six runs scored. He raised his batting average from .276 at the start of the week to .311 after Sunday's win ... Alex Feinberg went 6-for-14 (.429) in four games, with three of the hits coming in Sunday's win from the leadoff spot in the order. It was his first game this season hitting in that spot after mostly hitting eighth or second ... Mike Minor made his SEC debut with 1.1 innings of two-hit scoreless relief against Ole Miss on Sunday ... Cody Crowell returned to form in two relief appearances on the week, giving up one run on four hits in 7.1 innings with three strikeouts and a walk. He picked up his first win of the year against Belmont last Wednesday ... Freshman Caleb Cotham pitched an inning of scoreless relief against the Bruins last week ... Dominic de la Osa hit two homers on the week and now has six on the year, two behind Pedro Alvarez for the team lead.

Record Watch

Two Vanderbilt records worth watching this season are the school's career strikeout mark and the career homer mark. With 14 strikeouts against Illinois-Chicago last Friday, David Price vaulted into third place on the career list with 318. He trails record holder Mike Willis by 32 strikeouts and second place Jeremy Sowers by 9. With eight homers this year, Pedro Alvarez is now 10th by himself on the career list.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In addition, the 10 previous finalists for the Clemens Award are also issued ballots. The 2007 award will be presented at a gala dinner next July. The event is administered by the Greater Houston Baseball Association, which has donated more than \$300,000 to the charities from the net proceeds from the first three dinners.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up preseason plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by Baseball America and Rivals.com this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. Baseball America listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

Price is expected to be one of the top picks in this June's amateur draft.

In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
