THE STORYLINE

- The Florida football team returns to The Swamp for the first time in over a month this weekend as it hosts the Vanderbilt Commodores at 12:00 p.m. on FSN/Sun Sports.
- The Gators will play three of their final four games in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium after playing four of their past five away from Gainesville.
- Florida (4-4, 3-3 SEC) is coming off tough loss against Georgia in Jacksonville. After falling behind 20-0 early in the second quarter, the Gators fought back to cut the lead to 23-20, but neither team scored in the final 14:20 in the game.
- Vanderbilt (4-4, 1-4 SEC) was off last week after suffering a 56-24 loss to Texas A&M on Oct. 26 in College Station. The Commodores' lone conference win was a 31-27 victory over Georgia on Oct. 19.
- The Gators are looking for their 23rd win in a row over the Commodores, a streak dating back to 1989. The last Vanderbilt win over UF was in 1988, when VU upset No. 20 Florida, 24-9, in Nashville.

LAST TIME OUT

- Last weekend's game between Florida and Georgia was the series' 81st meeting in Jacksonville.
- The series between Florida and Georgia dates back to 1915 and the Bulldogs hold a 49-40-2 all-time advantage. In Jacksonville, UGA holds a 43-37-1 lead in the series over the Gators. Since 1990, Florida is 18-6 against UGA, including a 7-4 mark in the last 11 meetings.
- There is a discrepancy between the two schools in the series record. Georgia claims a victory in 1904, but Florida football did not compete at the varsity level until the 1906 season.
- Georgia has won the last three meetings between the two schools.
- Head Coach Will Muschamp is now 0-3 against Georgia as a head coach.
- For just the third time since 1980, Florida and Georgia both entered the contest unranked in the polls. The last occurrence was 2010, when the Gators won 34-31 in overtime.
- Redshirt junior Quinton Dunbar's 83-yard first-quarter catch and run from Tyler Murphy was UF's longest play from scrimmage on the season and the longest reception for the Gators since Chris Rainey's 83-yard touchdown catch from John Brantley against Tennessee on Sept. 17, 2011.
- The Gator defense held Georgia to 79 yards in the second half after allowing 335 in the first half. After trailing 23-3 at halftime, the Florida defense kept the Bulldogs off of the score sheet in the second half. The Gators were the first team this year to shut out Georgia in the second half.
- Florida managed only four explosive plays against Georgia (3 runs of 10+, 1 pass of 20+). Meanwhile, the Bulldogs had nine explosive plays - 6 runs of 10+ and 3 passes of 20+.
- Florida's offense tallied 17 unanswered points in the second half.
- Florida's averaging starting field position in the second half was the Georgia 49, while the Bulldogs started at their own 17.
- The Gators converted a two-point conversion and registered a safety.
- Defensive tackle Leon Orr recovered a fumbled lateral by Georgia in the third quarter, the Gators' 19th-straight game forcing a turnover.
- Defensive back Loucheiz Purifoy sacked Aaron Murray in the endzone for a safety. The last time the Gators had registered a safety was Sept. 10, 2011 against UAB.
- The Gators' were +1 in the turnover department after Orr's fumble recovery in the third quarter. After not turning the ball over all game, the Gators are now +2 for the season.
- Florida was 3-for-4 inside of the red zone, with a pair of touchdowns, a field goal and a missed field goal. Georgia finished 3-for-4 inside of the red zone, with one touchdown and two field goals.
- The Gators were 1-for-2 on fourth down. Murphy completed an 11-yard pass from the Georgia 33 to Solomon Patton on the first drive of the third quarter. Georgia was 0-for-1 on fourth down, when Antonio Morrison and Neiron Ball stopped Todd Gurley on the 39-yard line.
- Georgia offense accounted for just 19 yards in total offense in its first four drives of second half before ending the game with a 15-play, 67-yard drive that lasted 8:17.
- UF defense allowed just one touchdown in UGA's four trips inside the red zone.
- The Gators' defense had two sacks against UGA after not recording one in each of the last two games.
- Florida had no turnovers for the third time in the last four games.

COACH MUSCHAMP INTERVIEWS

Please coordinate all requests for telephone and personal interviews with Coach Muschamp through Steve McClain in the Communications Office. Coach Muschamp is available on Monday (weekly press conference at noon) and Wednesday (SEC Teleconference at 11:20 a.m. ET). Contact the SEC Office at (205) 458-3010 for phone number and passcode). Coach Muschamp will also host the *Gator Hotline with Will Muschamp* show on 8/29, 9/5, 10/3, 10/31 and 11/14 from 7-8 p.m. ET. Additionally, *Florida Football with Will Muschamp* airs on Sundays at noon on Sun Sports throughout the regular season.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT COACH INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be coordinated with Dan Apple in the Communications Office. Players will be available on Monday (at weekly press conference), Tuesday and Wednesday (in Visiting Team Locker Room, approx. 1:15 p.m.). The starting quarterback will only be available on Mondays at the weekly press conference. Freshmen will not be available for interviews. All player interviews will conclude on Wednesdays during game weeks. Telephone interviews should be booked at least one day in advance and are normally limited to those times reserved for the general interview sessions. The Communications Office will not give out home or cell phone numbers for any players and players may not be contacted directly by phone, text, e-mail or social media. Members of the media are not permitted in team areas. Team locker room, training room and strength complex are considered private work areas. These areas, as well as players' housing (campus and off campus), are off-limits to media representatives.

Offensive Coordinator Brent Pease will be available to the media on Tuesday and Defensive Coordinator D.J. Durkin will be available on Wednesday. Interviews with Coach Pease and Coach Durkin are scheduled to take place at noon in the Gator Room to the right of Gate 1 in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. There is currently no media access for interviews with other assistant coaches.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Florida's weekly press conference will begin Monday, August 26, and will be held each Monday during the season except on the bye week (Monday, Sept. 9 and Oct. 21). Select players will address media representatives in the South End Zone Meeting Room from 11 a.m. – noon, with Coach Muschamp scheduled as early as 11:45 a.m. When entering the South End Zone Meeting Room and during the availability, members of the media are to use the entrance and exit located inside the South End Zone tunnel and are not to be in any of the team areas at any time. For those who cannot attend weekly press conferences, video of the press conference will be posted online via GatorZone.com. Quotes from Coach Muschamp will be available on the media-only website.

These video files will be posted by 3:30 p.m. ET on Mondays. In addition, utilizing station-filmed video from weekly press conferences and post-practice media opportunities is limited to three (3) minutes daily. FROM THE LAST GAME

- Tyler Murphy ran for a 14-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the second rushing touchdown of his career.
- Following Murphy's touchdown, the Gators converted a two-point conversion when Murphy completed a pass to Clay Burton. The last time the Gators had completed a two-point conversion was a Trey Burton rush against Vanderbilt on Oct. 13, 2012.
- Murphy finished 13-for-29 for 174 yards and 0 TD. He also rushed 10 times for 28 yards with a long of 25 and one touchdown.
- Mack Brown rushed for a five-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Brown has four career rushing touchdowns, all this season. Brown had 9 carries for 41 yards.
- Quinton Dunbar extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 24 games with a career-long 83 yard catch in the first quarter.
- The 83-yard completion from Murphy to Dunbar was the longest career completion for Murphy.
- Leon Orr recovered a lateral pass at the Georgia 24-yard line in the third quarter for his second fumble recovery of the season.
- Loucheiz Purifoy sacked Aaron Murray in the end zone for a safety in the third quarter. Purifoy's sack was his second of the season and of his career.
- Ronald Powell registered his third sack of the season when he forced Georgia quarterback Aaron Murray into an intentional grounding penalty with 22 seconds left

- in the second quarter. The Bulldogs lost 12 yards on the play. Powell now has 10 sacks in his career.
- Vernon Hargreaves led the Gators with a career-high nine tackles. Hargreaves' performance was the first time he has led the team in tackles.
- Antonio Morrison led the Gators with five tackles in the first quarter and finished with seven.
- Right tackle Trenton Brown and freshman running back Kelvin Taylor made their first career starts.
- Taylor became the first Gator freshman to start at running back since Matt Jones against Tennessee on Sept. 15, 2012. He finished with 20 carries for 76 yards.
- True freshman defensive tackle Joey Ivie saw his first game action in the first quarter. Ivie became the 11th Gator true freshman to see action this year.
- Johnny Townsend dropped three punts inside of the 20-yard line. His third-quarter punt was downed at the UGA 3 and led to Purifoy's safety.
- Solomon Patton returned a kickoff out of the endzone in the second quarter 41 yards, the third-longest kick return of his career.
- Frankie Velez connected on a 31-yard field goal in the second quarter and missed a 40-yard field goal in the first quarter. He is now 4-for-5 in his career.
- Austin Hardin missed a 47-yard field goal in the third quarter, and is now 4-for-9 in his career.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

2012 | No. 4 FLORIDA 31, Vanderbilt 17 (Nashville) Jeff Driskel scored three touchdowns and ran for 177 yards to lead the Gators to a 31-17 win over Vanderbilt. Driskel's third touchdown, a 70-yarder, iced the game with 2:20 remaining and came after the hosts had cut the lead to seven. The teams combined for 23 points in a wild fourth quarter. Florida did most of its damage on the night on the ground, finishing with 403 yards of offense, 326 on the ground. Florida had scored 21-straight points to grab a 21-7 lead before the Commodores became the first team to score in the fourth quarter against the Gators on the season. In the third quarter, Solomon Patton raced 54 yards on a fake punt and Driskel scored on a 13-yard run to give the Gators an 18-7 lead. The scoring drive came after UF thwarted a huge drive by the Commodores, who had a first down at the UF 6. A false-start penalty and 14-yard sack by Josh Evans forced Vandy to settle for a 44-yard field-goal attempt instead. The kick was blocked by Earl Okine and recovered by Loucheiz Purifoy at the 38.

2011 | FLORIDA 26, Vanderbilt 21 (Gainesville) Florida ended a four-game skid with a 26-21 victory over Vanderbilt on Homecoming at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Jeff Demps ran for 158 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a 52-yarder with 2:13 remaining as Florida held off a late Vanderbilt rally. For Demps, his 158-yard day marked his third 100-yard performance of 2011, the seventh of his career. The Gators ran for 197 yards, including 100 first-half rushing yards, using seven different ball carriers. Nine different Florida receivers recorded a catch in the contest for a 213-yard output through the air. Florida finished the day with 410 yards of total offense. John Brantley completed 16-of-24 passes for 173 yards before leaving the game in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt got most of its 377 yards through the air and in the second half, as Jordan Rodgers finished 19-of-28 passing for 297 yards and two touchdowns.

2010 | FLORIDA 44, Vanderbilt 14 (Nashville) The University of Florida football team scored 41 points in the first half and never looked back, defeating Southeastern Conference Eastern Division foe Vanderbilt, 55-14, Saturday afternoon at Vanderbilt Stadium. The Gators scored in all three phases of the game, led by redshirt junior Chris Rainey, who blocked two punts on the day that each led to scores and caught four passes for a career-high 75 yards and a touchdown. Redshirt junior John Brantley led the Gators in the air, finishing the day 11-of-18 for 157 yards and two touchdowns. On the ground, sophomore Mike Gillislee ran nine times for 57 yards and had a team-high two rushing touchdowns. Redshirt freshman Jordan Reed also had two scores, finishing 11-of-19 passing for 120 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Reed also ran for a game-high 84 yards on 16 carries. Florida's defense had 13 combined tackles for loss, four sacks, two forced fumbles and one interception. Redshirt freshman Jelani Jenkins registered a team-high eight tackles, while freshman Sharrif Floyd tallied a career-high seven tackles, including three for loss. Collecting sacks for the Gators were seniors Brandon Hicks, A.J. Jones, Duke Lemmens and Justin Trattou.

2009 | No. 1 FLORIDA 27, Vanderbilt 3 (Gainesville) No. 1 Florida won its 19th consecutive game with a 27-3 victory over Vanderbilt Saturday at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Senior quarterback Tim Tebow completed 15-of-20 passes for 208 yards and one touchdown. The Gators offense racked up 227 yards through the air to accompany 148 yards on the ground against the Commodores. Junior tight end Aaron Hernandez had a career day, tallying a career-tying seven receptions for a career-high 120 yards through the air, including a career-long 64-yard haul in the fourth quarter. Jeff Demps and David Nelson also brought in scores for Florida. The Gators held the Commodores to just 99 yards rushing and 100 yards passing. Florida allowed only one field goal in the win and for the sixth time this season, the Gator defense held its opponent to under 100 rushing yards.

2008 | No. 4 FLORIDA 42, Vanderbilt 14 (Nashville) The No. 4 Florida Gators defeated the Vanderbilt Commodores, 42-14, at Memorial Stadium in Nashville, Tenn. Junior quarterback Tim Tebow finished the game 12-for-17 for 171 yards and three touchdowns. He also led the squad in rushing with 88 yards on 11 carries and two scores. Louis Murphy, Riley Cooper, David Nelson, and Percy Harvin also brought in touchdowns for Florida. The Gator offense finished the game with 422 yards of total offense, while the Gator defense held Vanderbilt to 264 yards. Carlos Dunlap blocked Vanderbilt's first punt of the game and would later block a punt in the second quarter. Nelson led the Orange and Blue in receiving with one catch for 41 yards and a score followed by Murphy, who collected 39 yards on three receptions with one touchdown.

- Vanderbilt has 14 players on its roster from the state of Florida. Freshman QB Max Staver is the Gators' only player from Tennessee.
- Florida sophomore running back Matt Jones and freshman wide receiver Alvin Bailey both went to Armwood High School in Tampa, along with the Commodore's sophomore backup quarterback Josh Grady and redshirt freshman offensive lineman Kevin McCoy.
- Vanderbilt freshman running back Ralph Webb attended Gainesville High School in Gainesville, Fla. The Gators have four players from Gainesville HS: freshman WR Case Harrison, redshirt sophomore QB Ryan McGriff, redshirt sophomore P Dallas Stubbs and freshman WR Chris Thompson.

No. 23 Florida 21, Vanderbilt 17 (Nashville, Tenn.)

Florida made a pivotal fourth down stand with a little over 90 seconds to play in the game, as the Gators ran their win streak to three straight games with a hard fought 21-17 win over Vanderbilt. The Gators' defense turned in a very solid performance, holding Vanderbilt to only 94 yards passing and sacking quarterback Jay Cutler twice. The defense got things going early on when safety Cory Bailey intercepted a pass and returned it 24 yards to the Commodores' one-yard line. Running back Earnest Graham punched it in on the next play for a 7-0 lead. Graham finished with 125 yards on 24 carries. Vanderbilt responded with a Greg Johnson 40-yard field goal to cut Florida's lead to 7-3. Florida scored again on Ran Carthon's one-yard plunge to give the Gators a 14-3 lead. Carthon was the other half of Florida's one-two rushing punch, as he totaled 83 yards on 14 carries. Vanderbilt made it 14-10 midway through the second quarter with a Matthew Tant one-yard touchdown run, but Florida responded with a Rex Grossman one-yard touchdown run of his own to make it 21-10 at the half. Vandy made it 21-17 with the only score of the second half with a third quarter, a Cutler one-yard run.

RUSHING

- Florida is averaging 159.4 rushing yards per game and has three games over 200 yards (262 yards vs Toledo, 215 vs Tennessee; 246 vs Kentucky). Last year, UF ranked third in the SEC in rushing offense, averaging 188.1 yards per game.
- Under Muschamp, UF has rushed for 200 or more yards 11 times. UF had six games in 2012 over 200 rushing yards (BGSU, Tenn, UK, Vandy, JSU, FSU).
- The Gators have had 37 runs of 10-plus yards (4.6 per game) totaling 579 yards. Last year, UF had 90 runs of 10-plus yards (6.9 per game). In 2011, Florida had 64 runs of 10-plus yards on the season (4.9 per game).
- Redshirt junior **MACK BROWN** started against Toledo and had a career day, rushing for 112 yards on 25 carries and scoring two touchdowns, all career highs.
- He was the leading rusher against LSU, totaling 56 yards on 15 carries.
- Brown leads the team with 400 yards on 108 carries (3.7 avg) and has three touchdowns. He had 25 carries for 102 yards (4.1 avg) in 2012.
- True freshman **KELVIN TAYLOR** saw his most action of the year at Missouri, leading the team with 13 carries for 74 yards (6.2 avg). He scored his first-career touchdown on a 20-yard run in the third quarter that cut the Missouri lead to 23-17.
- Taylor made his first career start against Georgia and led the Gators' rushing attack with 20 carries for 76 yards.
- In the past two games, Taylor is averaging 75 yards per game rushing (150 yards on 32 carries, 4.7 avg.).
- Taylor has 48 carries for 248 yards on the year (5.2 avg).
- Sophomore **MATT JONES** missed part of August camp while recovering from a viral infection, and then suffered a season-ending knee injury against LSU. His season ended with 339 yards on 79 carries (4.3 avg) and two touchdowns. He also had 5 catches for 25 yards.
- Jones had 176 yards rushing at Kentucky, the most by a Gator RB since Ciatrick Fason had 210 vs. Kentucky in 2004. His 176 yards rushing on the road was the most since Ciatrick Fason ran for 190 at South Carolina in 2003 and is the eighth best all-time by a Gator in a road game.
- Jones was limited against LSU, leaving the game with an injury after just 4 carries for 17 yards.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **TYLER MURPHY**, seeing the first extended action of his career, rushed for 84 yards on 10 carries against Tennessee. He had four rushes of 10-plus yards, including a long of 28 yards.
- Redshirt sophomore **VALDEZ SHOWERS**, who converted from safety during August camp, had five touches for 54 yards against Toledo in his first game on the offensive side of the ball.
- He scored his first career touchdown on a 9-yard shovel pass from Murphy to seal the game against Arkansas in the fourth quarter.
- Showers averaged 6.8 yards per carry on four rushes at Miami for 27 total yards.
- Junior **HUNTER JOYER** has 21 carries for 90 yards with two TD in his career. He has not had a rush for lost yardage in his career. Redshirt junior **GIDEON AJAGBE**, a former linebacker, converted to fullback in the spring of 2013 and made his debut on offense against Toledo, making the start and recording two catches for 16 yards and scoring his first career touchdown.

FLORIDA'S OFFENSE

PASSING

- For the season, Florida has completed 62.2 percent of its passes and averaged 11.2 yards per completion. The Florida QB Rating is 127.30 (125-of-201, 1,402 yards, 7 TD, 5 INT).
- The Gators had a streak of at least one touchdown pass in seven-straight games: the first five in 2013 and the final two of 2012. During 2012, UF never had more than two-straight games with a touchdown pass.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **TYLER MURPHY**, making his first home start against Arkansas, completed 16-of-22 passes for a career-high 240 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions. Murphy's QB rating of 209.4 against Arkansas was the highest for a UF quarterback against an SEC opponent since Rex Grossman had a rating of 235.9 against LSU on Oct. 6, 2001.
- Against Georgia, his first pass completion went to Quinton Dunbar for a career-long 83 yards. The play is tied for UF's second-longest since 1996, behind an 85-yard touchdown from Danny Wuerffel to Jacquez Green against Alabama on Dec. 7, 1996. UF also had an 83-yard touchdown pass from John Brantley to Chris Rainey against Tennessee on Sept. 17, 2011. This was the longest non-scoring play by the Gators in records dating back to 1996.
- He finished with 174 yards and no touchdowns or interceptions against UGA. He also rushed for 28 yards a one score.
- On the season, he has completed 82-of-139 passes for 911 yards with five touchdowns and two interceptions. His passer rating is 123.04.
- He made his first career start at Kentucky, completing 15-of-18 passes for 156 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed for 36 yards and a score.
- Murphy completed his first 13 passes against Kentucky. The last time a Florida quarterback completed their first 12 passes in a game was Tim Tebow against Cincinnati in the 2010 Sugar Bowl.
- Murphy entered the Tennessee game with UF trailing 7-0 and led the Gators to a 31-17 victory. He had never completed a pass or carried the ball, but he completed 8-of-14 passes for 134 yards with a 52-yard score to Solomon Patton. He also rushed for 84 yards on 10 carries with a score.
- Junior **JEFF DRISKEL** suffered a fractured fibula against Tennessee and will miss the remainder of the season. His numbers for two-plus games were 42-of-61 for 477 yards, 2 touchdowns and 3 interceptions with a passer rating of 135.52.
- 13 different players have caught a pass this season. Last season, 16 different players caught a pass and six players totaled 15 or more receptions.
- Three of UF's receivers have 26-or-more receptions on the season (Burton-31, Patton-31, Dunbar-26) and all three have over 340 receiving yards.
- On the season, the wide receivers have accounted for 97 of the team's 125 receptions (78 percent). Last season, the group totaled 67 catches out of 183 total for UF (36 percent).
- Against Miami, the UF receivers totaled 19 of the team's 22 receptions.
- Quinton Dunbar and Solomon Patton are both averaging 15 yards per catch, the first time since 2008 that the Gators have had two receivers average 15 yards or more with at least 25 catches.
- Junior **QUINTON DUNBAR** set new career highs with 7 catches for 98 yards at Miami. This season he has 26 catches for 392 yards.
- Against Georgia, he had a career-long 83-yard completion from Murphy. He finished with 4 catches for 91 yards in the game.
- Dunbar has caught a pass in 24-straight games, dating back to the game against Furman in 2011. During that span, he has totaled 68 catches for 875 yards and 6 touchdowns.
- Senior **TREY BURTON** had 6 catches for 66 yards at Kentucky with a touchdown. It was his eighth career TD against Kentucky. Florida is 11-1 in games that Burton has scored a TD, with the lone loss coming in 2010 against LSU.
- This season he has 31 catches for 347 yards.
- Senior **SOLOMON PATTON** had his second 100-yard receiving game of the season against Arkansas, totaling a career-high 124 yards on six catches with touchdowns of 51 and 38 yards. He was the first UF wide receiver to have two receiving touchdowns in an SEC game since Riley Cooper had two against Georgia in 2009.
- Patton has 31 catches for a team-leading 464 yards with four touchdowns. He is averaging 15.0 yards per catch.
- Against Missouri, Patton had a career-high 221 all-purpose yards, including a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown (158 total kick return yards), 46 receiving yards and 17 rushing yards.
- Patton's 124 yards receiving were the most by a Gator since Percy Harvin had 186 vs. Ole Miss in 2008. He was the first Gator wide receiver since Harvin and Andre Caldwell in 2007 to have two games of 118 yards or more receiving in the same season.
- At Miami, Patton totaled 6 catches for 118 yards and a touchdown. He had a career-long 46-yard catch. Entering the game, he had just 9 catches and 100 yards receiving in his career.
- Patton had the first 100-yard receiving game for Florida since Andre Debose had 151 yards against Furman in 2011.
- True freshman **AHMAD FULWOOD** has come on lately with 5 of his 6 catches coming in the last three games.
- On the season, Fulwood has 6 catches for 53 yards.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- Through 8 games, the Florida defense has proven to be one of the elite units in the nation, ranking among the leaders in an assortment of major defensive categories.

- Through 8 games, the UF defense has forced 27 three-and-outs in 92 opponent drives, meaning that over 29 percent of opponent drives have not gained a first down.
- Opponents have run for 321 yards on 111 carries in the 2nd half (2.9 avg.) this season, the 4th-fewest yards in the country (Michigan State leads with 129).
- Gator foes average 5.5 yards per carry in the 1st quarter, 3.7 in the 2nd, 2.8 in the 3rd and 2.96 in the 4th.
- The Gators have held opponents to 275 yards of total offense or less in 5 of 8 games this season and 220 yards or less in 4 games.
- Georgia's offense accounted for just 19 yards in total offense in its first four drives of the second half before ending the game with a 15-play, 67-yard drive that lasted 8:17.
- The Gator defense surrendered only one TD to Georgia in four trips inside of the red zone.
- Opponents have reached the red zone 23 times in 8 games and the Gators' 10 TD allowed in the red zone is tied for the 7th-fewest nationally.
- LSU entered the game averaging 45.5 points per game and was held to a season-low 17 points.
- The Gators snapped LSU's school-record streak of scoring at least 35 points at 6 games.
- The Tigers' 327 total yards was also their lowest of the year and first time under 400 yards.
- In 2012, Florida yielded 14.5 points per game to rank 5th nationally in scoring defense and the Gators were also 5th in total defense (287.5 ypg). UF was one of four schools to rank in the top 10 nationally in total defense in 2011 & 2012 (Alabama, FSU, LSU are the others).
- Florida has allowed 14 touchdowns this year, 6th-fewest (8 rushing/5 passing/1 return).
- The Gators recovered a fumble versus Georgia, their 19th-straight game with a turnover.
- UF has at least one interception in 12 of its last 15 outings.
- Before giving up 36 points to Missouri and 23 to Georgia, Florida had held SEC opponents to 20 or fewer points in 13-consecutive games, the longest streak in the league.
- The Gators have 181 yards in tackles for loss, 7th-best in the SEC.
- Arkansas entered the game 2nd in the SEC with 237 yards on the ground per game and was held to 111 yards by the Gators. After 81 yards rushing in the first quarter, the Hogs had 20 the rest of the game and -6 yards in the fourth quarter.
- UF limited Kentucky to 47 plays, matching the fewest since LSU had 47 on Oct. 10, 2009.
- Kentucky ran 15 of its 47 plays on its final drive and turned the ball over on downs.
- The Gators forced 6 turnovers in their win over Tennessee (4 INT, 2 FR), their most under Muschamp. It was their most turnovers forced against an SEC foe since Sept. 21, 1996, at Tennessee.
- UF limited the Vols to 31 yards of offense in the first half and Tennessee's first six offensive possessions featured 2 fumbles, 2 interceptions and a pair of punts.
- Opponents ran 60 plays and totaled just 100 yards in a stretch from the second quarter of the Miami game until halftime of the Tennessee game.
- After gaining 143 yards on its first 18 offensive plays (without penalty yards included), Miami was held to just 69 yards on its final 35 snaps (1.97 yards per play).
- The Florida defense limited Miami to 5 yards or less on 10 of its 14 possessions, including six drives that resulted in 0 or negative yardage.
- Toledo's 6 points marked the sixth time in 27 games to that point under Muschamp that an opponent had scored 6 points or less.
- The Gators limited Toledo to 54 offensive snaps, its lowest total since Oct. 1, 2011 against Temple.

- No SEC defense has forced more turnovers than the Gators since the 2000 season.

RUSH DEFENSE

- Florida ranks 16th in the nation in rush defense, allowing 107.6 yards per game through the first 8 games. UF limited both Toledo and Miami to 50 yards rushing, gave up 66 yards to Tennessee, allowed 48 yards to Kentucky and 111 yards to Arkansas.
- After Georgia totaled 109 yards rushing in the first half, UF gave up 5 yards in the third quarter and 42 yards in the fourth quarter.
- Taking out the 25-yard run on a fake field goal, the Gators allowed 23 yards on 20 carries to UK.
- UF has allowed 3.8 yards per carry this season, 4th in the SEC and 36th in the nation, and 8 rushing TD (t-22nd nationally and 3rd in the SEC).
- In 215 opponent rushing plays (not including sacks) this year, the Gators have stopped them for zero or negative yardage on 55 plays (25.6 percent).
- Through 8 games, UF has totaled 41 tackles-for-loss with at least 5 TFL in 5 games. The Gators had 8 TFL at Kentucky and a season-high 9 TFL at Miami.
- The Gators allowed 94.9 rushing yards per game last year after 132.7 ypg in 2011.
- Florida held 7 teams under 100 rushing yards and 3 under 50 yards in a game last year. The Gators have kept 5 of 8 opponents under 100 yards and have given up 50 yards or less three times.
- UF's long run allowed last year was 25 yards, the shortest opponent long run in the nation.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

PASS DEFENSE

- Through 7 games, the Gators have allowed opposing quarterbacks to complete just 49.0 percent of their passes, 4th in the nation, and average only 5.98 yards per attempt, good for 12th. Opponent quarterbacks have a rating of 98.6, 4th-lowest in the nation.
- Florida has allowed 5 passing touchdowns this season, tied for the fewest total in the nation. UF has surrendered 0 or 1 passing TD in the last 6 games.
- Georgia QB Aaron Murray was 12-for-20 for 226 yards and 1 touchdown in the first half, but then 4-for-5 for 32 yards and no scores in the second half.
- At LSU, the Gators limited Zach Mettenberger to just 9-of-17 for 152 yards, with no TD, his lowest completions, attempts and yards on the season. It also ended his streak of 8 games in a row with a TD pass.
- Junior **LOUCHEIZ PURIFOY** had a 42-yard interception return for a TD versus Arkansas, his first career pick and the Gators' first non-offensive score of the season.
- Freshman **VERNON HARGREAVES III** is second in the SEC in passes defended (1.25 per game) and is 4th in the league in INT (3). He had a career-high 9 tackles against Georgia that led the team.
- Sophomore **BRIAN POOLE** had his second interception of the year and had a 30-yard return at Missouri. He had his first career pick versus Tennessee.
- The Gators had a season-high 8 pass breakups at Missouri. UF has 34 PBU on the season (5th-most in the SEC).
- UF had 7 quarterback hurries against Tennessee and 7 pass breakups.
- Creating pressure on the QB is a big emphasis for the Gators. In the first 8 games, the defense has collected 13 sacks and 27 quarterback hurries. In three seasons at Texas, Muschamp's defense averaged 3.05 sacks, 3.97 quarterback hurries and 1.33 forced fumbles in 39 games.

FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

PUNTING

- Florida did not have any punts at Kentucky, the first time since Sept. 3, 2011, against FAU. It also marked the first time that the Gators did not punt in an SEC game since Nov. 6, 2005, at Vanderbilt.
- Freshman **JOHNNY TOWNSEND** enjoyed a tremendous collegiate debut at Missouri, averaging 45.6 yards over 8 punts, with a Gator season-best boot of 61 yards and a pair of touchbacks.
- Townsend had a pair of punts over 50 yards, a 59-yarder in the first quarter and a 61-yarder in the third quarter, to match UF's output of 50+ punts in the first 6 games.
- Townsend averaged 39.5 yards per punt against Georgia, with 3 of his 4 kicks inside of the 20-yard line and a long of 43 yards that pinned the Dawgs at their 15-yard line.
- Junior **KYLE CHRISTY**, a finalist for the Ray Guy Award in 2012, has 21 punts with a 39.6 average this season, with 10 fair caught, 7 inside the 20-yard line and 2 of 50-plus yards.
- Christy ranked 5th in the country with a 45.8-yard average punting in 2012. His average surpassed the school record of 45.1 by Chas Henry in 2010 and tied for 7th in SEC history for a single season.
- Christy's career punting average of 43.4 is 2nd in school history (44.4, Ray Criswell).
- Twenty-five of his 66 punts last season were 50 yards or longer, 27 were inside of the 20-yard line, 22 were fair caught and 6 resulted in touchbacks.
- The 66 punts in 2012 by Christy tied for the 5th-most in school history and matched the most since 2003 (Eric Wilbur).
- Of his 20 punts that were 40 yards or less, 10 of them were downed inside of the 20-yard line.
- Christy had a 50-yard punt in 10 of 13 games during the 2012 season.
- Christy established a single-game school record with a 54.3 average against South Carolina in 2012, including a season-best kick of 62 yards. The previous mark of 53.0 by Fred Montsdeoca had been established in 1949 against Alabama.

KICKING

- Florida had to replace arguably its best kicker in school history, as Caleb Sturgis was selected in the fifth round by the Miami Dolphins in the 2013 NFL Draft.
- The Gators have employed three different kickers on field-goal tries and the group is 9-for-15 (.600).
- Redshirt junior **FRANKIE VELEZ**, a walk-on kicker from Ocala, made his collegiate debut at LSU and converted field-goal attempts from 44 yards and 27 yards. The 44-yarder opened the scoring and was the longest successful kick by the Gators this season.
- Velez made a 23-yarder in the first quarter at Missouri and had a pair of extra points.
- Velez was 1-for-2 versus Georgia, missing from 40 yards in the first quarter but connecting from 31 yards in the second quarter for UF's first points of the game.
- Redshirt freshman **AUSTIN HARDIN** went 1-for-2 in his collegiate debut on field goals against Toledo, connecting from 24 yards, and also added a 33-yard field goal at Miami.
- After missing from 47 yards against Georgia, he is 4-for-9 (.444) on the season on FGs, has converted all 11 extra-point attempts and has 37 kickoffs that average 61.8 yards with 13 touchbacks. Four of his five kicks at Kentucky resulted in touchbacks.
- BRAD PHILLIPS**, a senior from Gainesville, took over the kicking duties after the Gators had a 48-yard field-goal attempt blocked by Arkansas and made a 28-yarder. He was also 3-for-4 on extra points.
- He is 3-for-5 on field-goal tries in his career, with a long of 43 yards. He also has 27 career kickoffs for an average of 62.8 yards, with four touchbacks.

RETURN GAME

- Florida is one of 8 teams nationally to have multiple players with a punt return of longer than 30 yards.
- On the season, junior **MARCUS ROBERSON** has 11 punt returns for 124 yards, 2nd in the SEC with a 12.2 average. His long is 38 yards against Toledo and he had 3 returns for 36 yards and a long return of 21 returns at Missouri.
- Senior **TREY BURTON** had the first 2 punt returns of his career versus Arkansas, with a long return of 31 yards.
- SOLOMON PATTON** returned the opening kickoff of the second half at Missouri 100 yards for a touchdown – becoming the fifth Gator to have a 100-yard return (Andre Debose vs. Louisville, 2012; Bo Carroll vs. LSU, 1999; Jack Jackson vs. Mississippi State, 1993; Pat Reen vs. Miami, 1940).
- Patton has now scored a touchdown three different ways in his career: kick return,

- returning a blocked punt (42-yard TD vs. Vanderbilt on Nov. 6, 2010) and as a receiver (4 different times).
- Patton has 14 kickoff returns for 403 yards (28.8 avg), putting him 8th nationally. His season average is currently the best for a Gator in school history.
- The Gators were one of 5 schools on opening weekend to have a kickoff return and a punt return of longer than 30 yards, joining Alabama, Michigan, Middle Tennessee and Southern Miss.
- Against Toledo, Patton had a 31-yard kickoff return in the third quarter, while Roberson had a 38-yard punt return in the fourth quarter.
- Roberson had 4 punt returns for 72 yards (18.0 avg.) versus the Rockets, tied for the eighth-best average on opening weekend. Patton averaged 24.0 yards on his 2 kick returns in the season opener.
- Florida was the only team in the nation to have three players with a punt return of 30+ yards in 2012. Roberson had a 50-yard return against FSU, Jelani Jenkins had a 36-yard return on a blocked punt against Louisiana and Debose had a 32-yard return against Bowling Green.
- UF's 7 kick returns for scores since 2009 is tied for the 5th-best total in the nation and the Gators' 6 KOR in the last 4 years is tied for 4th-best.
- Florida has returned either a kickoff or punt for a touchdown for 9-straight seasons dating back to 2005, with 10 total punt return touchdowns during that span (including blocked punts). The Gators have also returned a kickoff for a touchdown for 5 seasons in a row, totaling 7 kickoff return touchdowns since 2009.

BLOCKED KICKS

- Florida has blocked 13 kicks in Will Muschamp's 34 games as a head coach, including 6 last year (4 FG, 1 extra point, 1 punt).
- At Miami, **LOUCHEIZ PURIFOY** got the first block of the 2013 season after getting a hand on a Miami punt in the first quarter. The Gators scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive.
- In the third quarter of the Sugar Bowl, **MICHAEL TAYLOR** blocked an extra point and Sharrif Floyd blocked a 41-yard field-goal attempt by Louisville for the 3rd blocked kick of his career.
- Earl Okine blocked a 44-yard field-goal attempt in the third quarter by Vanderbilt for UF's first block of the year, Floyd blocked a 45-yard field-goal attempt by South Carolina, Purifoy blocked a 25-yard attempt by Missouri and Purifoy blocked a punt by Louisiana that Jelani Jenkins returned for the game-winning touchdown.
- SOLOMON PATTON** blocked an FAU punt in the 2011 season opener that was returned 22 yards for a touchdown. It marked the second-straight contest that Patton had blocked a punt (2011 Outback Bowl vs. Penn State).

TITLE CENTRAL

Florida is one of two schools in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012) and Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997) have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.

GATORS AND THE POLLS

- After not finishing in the final poll for two seasons (2010, 11), the Gators finished 2012 ranked No. 9 in the AP poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, marking the 17th time in school history that UF has finished in the top 10. Since 1990, Florida has finished in the AP Top 25 in 21 of 23 years, including 14 times in the top 10.
- From 2006-12, the Gators finished in the top 10 of the final poll four times, tied with LSU for the second-most in the SEC behind Alabama's five top-10 finishes.
- UF has been ranked in each of the past nine AP preseason polls, dating back to 2003. That streak ranks third in the SEC behind LSU (12-straight preseason polls) and UGA (11-straight preseason polls).

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 5,892 to 2,263 at home, putting the average outcome at 39.3 to 15.1 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 24.2-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 150 home games from 1990-2013, UF has scored 31 or more points 100 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 86 times. The Gators are currently riding a 10-game home winning streak.
- With a 7-0 performance in The Swamp in 2012, the Gators matched the 2006 and 2009 squads in finishing with the most wins at home in a season.

IN THE STANDS

- The Gators sold out all season tickets for the 34th-consecutive season after averaging 87,597 fans during the 2012 season.
- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2009, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- The crowd of 90,888 for the UF-Alabama game on Oct. 1, 2011, was the second-highest single-game total in school history and the most since 90,885 watched the Orange and Blue face South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 31 years (1982-2012) and have ranked among the top nine in each of the last 22 years (1991-2012).
- In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544.
- The largest crowd for a home opener at The Swamp was 90,707 in UF's 2005 win over Wyoming in Urban Meyer's first game as head coach of the Gators. The 2009 opener (90,621) was the second-largest.

PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001. Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

Smith was a three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing TD, both of which are NFL records. He was named the honorary captain for the 2011 UF vs. Tennessee game.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the L.A. Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

NATION'S ELITE

- No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country.
- UF is one of two schools (Arkansas) to face a top-10 strength of schedule five times from 2006-12.
- Florida is one of two schools in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012) and Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997) have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.
- Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- Florida is the only school in the nation to post 100 wins during each of the last two decades. UF won 102 games in the 1990s and 100 games in the 2000s. UF is one of only three schools in NCAA history to win 100 or more games in two different decades.
- The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft for nine-consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. (Brad Culpepper, '91; Danny Wuerffel, '96; Tim Tebow, '09)
- UF is the only school in the nation to have a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy. Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

SEC ELITE

- Florida is one of two SEC schools to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- No other SEC school has won at least 10 games for a period of six-consecutive years (1993-98), something only three schools in major college history have done.
- The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12-straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96). Florida has played in 10 of the 21 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

GATORS IN THE PROS

- Since 1998, Florida has had at least 29 players on opening day NFL rosters each year.
- During the 2012 NFL season, UF had 32 players appear on active rosters, totaling 196 starts and 354 games played. In addition, former Gators accounted for the following numbers during the 2012 NFL season:
 - 39 passing yards
 - 332 rushing yards
 - 3 rushing touchdowns
 - 1,972 receiving yards
 - 536 tackles
 - 16 sacks
 - 13 interceptions
 - 2 defensive touchdowns
- Florida has seen 21 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 13 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase. Last season, Steelers center Maurkice Pouncey earned his third-straight appearance.
- A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 33 of the past 37 NFL seasons, including 13 of the past 14 and a streak of 11-consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 27 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- Thirteen former Gators have combined to win 20 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- Florida is one of two schools (Pittsburgh) that has two players, Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor, on the top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.
- Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. He then led the team in all major receiving and kickoff return categories in 2010.

SEC IN THE NFL DRAFT

- The SEC had 63 selections in the 2013 NFL Draft. The number led the nation for the seventh-straight year.
- The SEC had 12 players selected in the first round, tied for the most ever from a single conference. Since 2006, the SEC has had 67 first-round selections, an average of 8.4 per year.
- The 63 selections brought the SEC’s total to 342 during the last eight NFL Drafts, an average of 42.8 per year.
- 13 of 14 SEC teams had a player selected in the Draft. SEC by team total: Alabama 9, LSU 9, Florida 8, Georgia 8, South Carolina 7, Texas A&M 5, Arkansas 4, Tennessee 4, Mississippi State 3, Missouri 2, Vanderbilt 2, Auburn 1, Kentucky 1).
- Four of the top five colleges in the 2013 NFL Draft were from the SEC. Florida State led the nation in total draft selections with 11, but the next four teams all came from the SEC; Alabama and LSU each had nine picks while Florida and Georgia each had eight picks.

HEAD COACH WILL MUSCHAMP



Muschamp, 42, came to UF after being the coach-in-waiting and defensive coordinator at the University of Texas since November 2008. He brought 16 years of coaching experience with him, including 12 years in the SEC, eight as a coach and four as a player at the University of Georgia. Muschamp also served as defensive coordinator at Auburn Uni-

versity (2006-07) and LSU (2002-04; he was LSU's linebackers coach in 2001) and was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp also brought a wealth of big-game experience. Prior to arriving at Florida, he coached in two national championship games, winning the ultimate prize in 2003 as the defensive coordinator at LSU, and coached in a third BCS bowl game following the 2008 season, when Texas won the Fiesta Bowl. In addition to his national championship past, Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and in the Big 12 Championship Game once, coming out on the winning side in each of those three contests.

After a 7-6 record in his first season at Florida, Muschamp led the Gators to one of the nation's top turnaround in year two, finishing 11-2 and playing in a BCS bowl game. Florida improved from a 6-6 regular season in 2011 to an 11-1 regular season in 2012, which marked the biggest one-year leap for the program in 32 years (0-10-1 in 1979, 7-4 regular season in 1980). In addition, the Gators finished 7-1 in the SEC East, tying for the division crown, a year after posting a 3-5 record in the conference. Florida defeated three top-10 opponents for just the second time in school history. Muschamp was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches as well as CBSsports.com.

The Gators finished No. 3 in the final regular-season BCS standings in 2012, the third-highest finish in school history, and ranked in the top 10 in both the final Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' Poll. UF won 11 games for just the sixth time in school history, won four of five games against the final BCS top-12 teams and defeated seven bowl-eligible teams in what ranked as the toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA.

The formula for the Gators success was to take care of the football, control both lines of scrimmage, finish games, have outstanding special teams and a physical defense. The Florida defense continued to be one of the nation's best in 2012, ranking fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.5 points per game) and total defense (287.5 yards per game). UF's rush defense improved dramatically from year one under Muschamp, limiting opponents to just 94.9 rushing yards per game after allowing 132.7 yards per game in 2011. The secondary also shut down the opposition, ranking as the nation's No. 2 pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.

A year after being outscored 86-59 in the fourth quarter, UF posted a 128-32 edge in the final quarter in 2012. That led to a 5-1 record in games decided by one score or less and matched a school-record eight come-from-behind wins. UF improved from -12 in turnover margin to +15 and ranked seventh nationally. Punter Kyle Christy set a school record for average yards per punt, placekicker Caleb Sturgis finished his career as Florida's leader in career field goals made and the special teams unit blocked six kicks in the last eight games.

Muschamp's first season in Gainesville produced the school's 24th-consecutive winning season and its 32nd-consecutive season of .500 football or better, the longest streaks in the nation. With the victory over Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl, UF established a school record with its fourth-straight bowl win. Muschamp's first squad will go down as one of the youngest in school history: 15 true freshmen and 52 underclassmen saw action — the second most in school history.

Despite returning 37 combined starts on the defensive side of the ball, the fewest in the SEC, Muschamp's defense ranked second in the nation in third down conversion defense (.273) — the best national ranking

in school history. Florida allowed just 166.8 yards per game passing to rank seventh nationally and permitted just 299.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally.

In his five seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defenses ranked among the nation's top 10 in total defense every single year, while always maintaining a top-15 rating in scoring defense, including three times inside the top 10.

In four of his eight seasons overall as a Division I defensive coordinator, his teams allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense while yielding less than 75 rushing yards per game. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to lead the nation.

From 2008-10 under Muschamp's guidance, the Texas defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks for 949 yards lost. His unit also ranked in the top-10 nationally during the same time frame in several other major categories, allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all of which are Big 12 bests during that span.

In 2009, the Texas Longhorns advanced to the BCS National Championship Game as Muschamp's defense gave up just 73.1 rushing yards per game, the best figure by any BCS school from 2008-10. The Longhorns also led the nation in 2009 in third-down defense (26.5 percent), turnovers created (37, tied with Ohio University) and interceptions (25) as Texas claimed the Big 12 championship in 2009.

Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo claimed the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award (lineman of the year), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (most outstanding defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end), while the Longhorns' defense saw Sergio Kindle become the first player in college football history to be named a finalist for both the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) and the Hendricks Award (nation's top defensive end). Earl Thomas also earned finalist honors for the Jim Thorpe Award in 2009.

In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined 10 players drafted, including nine in the first four rounds and two first-rounders in Orakpo and Thomas.

As the defensive coordinator at Auburn from 2006-07, Muschamp's defense ranked third in the nation in scoring defense (15.4 points per game) and fourth in the nation in pass defense (170.7 pass yards per game). During the same time frame, Auburn ranked third in the SEC in total defense by holding opponents to 295.1 yards per game.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU as the linebackers coach for the 2001 season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game). The Tigers allowed just 19 touchdowns all season in 2003, three less than the next closest competitor nationally.

Between his positions at LSU and Auburn, Muschamp spent a season with the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2005 as Assistant Head Coach for Defense. He helped the Dolphins finish second in the league with 49 sacks, while leading Miami to top-10 rankings in yards per play (4.7, seventh), yards per rush (3.7, seventh) and yards per pass (6.0, ninth).

The 1994 graduate of Georgia moved immediately into coaching following his collegiate playing career, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He became a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season.

In his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain for his senior season. He also earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

ASSISTANT COACHES

JEFF CHOATE

*Special Teams Coordinator/
Outside Linebackers*

- Joined the Florida staff prior to the 2013 season after serving as linebackers coach under Mike Leach at Washington State in 2012. The Cougars ranked eighth in the nation in tackles for losses (7.7 avg.) and 11th in sacks (2.9 avg.) last year.
- Spent the spring of 2013 as the defensive coordinator at UTEP before joining the Gators in mid-April.
- While at Boise State during the 2006-11 seasons, among Choate's special teams' protégés was Kyle Brotzman, the highest-scoring kicker in school and conference history (439 points) and the school's career leader in punting average (44.6).
- The Broncos' 2009 special teams unit was rated No. 1 in the nation by Phil Steele, led by Titus Young, who returned two kickoff returns for touchdowns to garner first-team All-WAC honors.
- Boise State ranked in the top-25 nationally in kickoff returns three times under Choate, and in the top-25 in punt returns four times.
- Choate had previous collegiate coaching stops at Utah State (2003-04) and Eastern Illinois (2005), serving as the special teams coach at both institutions.



TIM DAVIS

Offensive Line

- Owns 30 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL levels. Davis has coached in 16 FBS bowl games, including three Rose Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl.
- In his first year coaching the offensive line at Florida, Davis guided a unit that finished third in the SEC in rushing offense, averaging 188.1 yards per game, an improvement of 45 yards from the previous season.
- While serving as the Director of Player Personnel, Davis played a key role as Alabama signed the nation's No. 1 recruiting class in back-to-back years (2008 and 2009).
- While he was at USC from 2002-04, the Trojans won a pair of national championships and three BCS bowl games. His offensive lines protected two Heisman Trophy winners in Carson Palmer (2002) and Matt Leinart (2004).
- During his second stint at Wisconsin, the Badgers made five bowl appearances in five years, including two Rose Bowls.
- The UW offensive line paved the way for running back Ron Dayne, who rushed for an NCAA career record 6,397 yards with 63 touchdowns and won the 1999 Heisman Trophy.



D.J. DURKIN

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

- As a veteran linebacker group in 2012, the Gators' defense finished ranked fifth in the country in total defense, allowing 287.5 yards per game, and fourth nationally in rush defense (94.9 yards per game).
- UF blocked six kicks last season, ranking fifth nationally and tied for first in the SEC, marking the sixth time in seven seasons and all three of Durkin's seasons that the Gators led the SEC in blocks.
- Florida scored a touchdown on a punt return for the eighth-straight year and also had a kickoff return touchdown for the fourth-straight season. Andre Debose set the career record with his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown.
- Guided placekicker Caleb Sturgis, who was a two-time finalist for the Lou Groza Award (2011, '12) and set numerous school records, including career field goals made (70) and attempted (88). Sturgis was named a first-team All-American as a senior in 2012.
- Helped punter Chas Henry win the 2010 Ray Guy Award, as Henry became the first Gator to bring home that honor, and earn consensus All-American recognition. Florida finished the season second in net punting (40.9) and tied for 14th in punt average (44.2) nationally.



BRAD LAWING

Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line

- Lawing is in his first season at Florida after being at South Carolina for the previous seven campaigns.
- His 2012 Gamecock team set a school record with 43 sacks on the season, the sixth-most in the nation. Sophomore Jadeveon Clowney was a unanimous first-team All-American after recording a school-record 23.5 tackles for loss and a school-record 13.0 sacks.
- In 2011, the Gamecocks finished the year with the nation's third-best defense, a unit that surrendered just 268 yards per contest. Aided by a ferocious pass rush, Carolina boasted the nation's second-best pass defense and ranked 11th in the country, allowing just 18.4 points per game.
- Lawing spent three seasons as North Carolina's defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator from 2003-05. Each of his three recruiting classes was ranked among the nation's top-25.
- Between his stops at Carolina, Lawing spent four seasons at Michigan State, where he served as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator. During his tenure, the Spartans led the Big Ten in total defense during the 1999 and 2000 regular seasons.
- Lawing began his college coaching career at Appalachian State, where he mentored the defensive line for five years and the tight ends and offensive tackles for one season.



DEREK LEWIS

Tight Ends

- Tutored first-team All-SEC selection Jordan Reed, who led the team with 45 catches for 559 yards and scored three touchdowns last season. Reed ranked ninth nationally in catches by a tight end and 13th in receiving yards by a tight end.
- In 2011, led a tight end group that totaled 47 catches for 584 yards (12.4 ypc) and three touchdowns. Reed finished second on the team with 28 catches and third on the team with 307 receiving yards.
- Tutored Minnesota's Nick Tow-Arnett to an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention selection following the 2009 season after Tow-Arnett finished second on the team with 37 receptions for 505 yards and three touchdowns. As a group, Gopher tight ends in 2009 averaged over 13 yards per reception.
- Tight ends were also a prominent part of the Gopher offense in 2008, as the group hauled in 46 receptions for 542 yards and three TDs, averaging 11.8 yards per reception. Minnesota's tight ends accounted for 30 receptions and 351 yards in 2007, part of the second-best single-season passing mark (2,949 yards) in school history.
- From 2005-06, Lewis worked at Texas as a graduate assistant, where he was part of the staff that captured the 2005 BCS National Title.



BRENT PEASE

Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

- Has served 12 seasons as an offensive coordinator and has coached at his alma mater, Montana (1991-98), as well as Northern Arizona (1999-2000), Kentucky (2001-02) and Baylor (2003-05).
- In his first season at Florida, guided an offense that produced the school's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2004 and just the eighth player in school history. Running back Mike Gillislee finished with 1,152 yards, the seventh-most in a single season in UF history.
- Tutored first-year starting quarterback Jeff Driskel, who led the team to an 11-2 record last year and a berth in the Allstate Sugar Bowl. Driskel set a school-record with 177 rushing yards at Vanderbilt, the most in a single game by a UF quarterback.
- Florida only turned the ball over 15 times all season, 13th-fewest in the nation, and had six games without a turnover in 2012. It was the third-fewest turnovers by a UF team in school history.
- Pease coached in a bowl game in each of his six seasons at Boise State, including two Fiesta Bowl victories.
- Has reached the postseason 14 times in his career, highlighted by a national championship in 1995 at Montana.
- Montana quarterbacks won the Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year Award in five of his eight seasons at the school. Pease also coached two All-America wide receivers.



JOKER PHILLIPS

Wide Receivers/Recruiting Coordinator

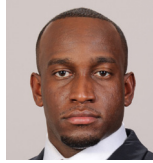
- Phillips came to UF after being the head coach at the University of Kentucky for three seasons (2010-12).
- A native Kentuckian and former Wildcat player, Phillips was only the fifth Kentucky alumnus to become head coach of the Wildcats. Phillips was UK's first African-American head football coach and only the second in the history of the Southeastern Conference.
- Became the first coach in Kentucky history to take a team to a bowl game in his first season. In addition, Phillips won more games than any first-year UK coach since Blanton Collier in 1954.
- Prior to being elevated to head coach, Phillips was on the staff of head coach Rich Brooks from 2003-09, including the last five seasons as offensive coordinator. Named offensive coordinator before the 2005 season, he made an immediate impact as Kentucky improved its scoring average and total offense in each of the first three years under his direction.
- Phillips' offensive style has shown flexibility and balance between the run and the pass. During his time as offensive coordinator, UK had a 3,000-yard passer (André Woodson, who accomplished the feat twice), two 1,000-yard receivers (Keenan Burton and Steve Johnson) and a 1,000-yard rusher (Rafael Little, who reached the mark twice).
- In addition to his coaching, Phillips also is a highly effective recruiter, as his straightforward, likeable personality earns the trust of young players and their families. His abilities in that area have become known across the country, as he has been identified as one of the nation's top recruiters by SportsIllustrated.com and Rivals.com.



TRAVARIS ROBINSON

Defensive Backs

- Oversaw a Gator secondary that was one of the best in the nation in 2012, ranking No. 2 in pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.
- Florida had 20 interceptions last season, tied for the 10th-most in school history and seventh nationally.
- Tutored first-team All-America safety Matt Elam, who totaled 76 tackles, 11.0 tackles-for-loss and four interceptions before becoming a first-round selection in the NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens.
- Coached cornerback Marcus Roberson, who earned second team All-SEC honors and totaled 12 pass breakups in 2012, tied for the sixth-most in a single season in UF history and the most since Joe Haden had 12 in 2008.
- In 2011, guided a UF secondary that ranked seventh in the nation in pass defense (166.8 yds/game). Overall, the Gator defense ranked eighth nationally in total defense (299.5 yds/game) and second in third-down defense (27.12 percent).
- Worked under Will Muschamp in his two seasons with the Auburn program.



BRIAN WHITE

Running Backs

- A 27-year coaching veteran and the 2004 winner of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division I Assistant Coach of the Year Award. Has coached in 16 bowl games and served on coaching staffs that have won a national title and two league championships.
- In 2012, led a Gator rushing attack that ranked third in the SEC, averaging 188 yards per game. Coached senior Mike Gillislee to the first 1,000-yard season at Florida since 2004 and just the 10th all-time. He also earned first team All-SEC honors in his only year as starting tailback.
- Served as UF's Interim Offensive Coordinator during the victory over Ohio State in the 2012 Gator Bowl.
- Worked with running backs Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey, who each ranks among the top 10 in rushing yardage at Florida.
- During his 11-year tenure at Wisconsin from 1995-2006, he mentored 1999 Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne, 2001 NFL first-round draft choice Michael Bennett, 2001 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Anthony Davis and 2006 Capital One Bowl Most Valuable Player Brian Calhoun.
- Was a graduate assistant for the 1988 Notre Dame team that won the National Championship.

Tailback Mack Brown rushed for 112 yards and Jeff Driskel threw a second-half touchdown pass to fullback Gideon Ajagbe as the 10th-ranked Florida Gators extended their run of consecutive victories in season openers Saturday with a 24-6 victory over Toledo at The Swamp. Make that 24 straight opening-day wins for the Gators (1-0), a string that dates to the 1990 season and ranks second in the nation to Nebraska's 28. Brown, the 5-foot-11, 215-pounder from Lithonia, Ga., made his starting debut due to the viral infection that has sidelined sophomore Matt Jones since the start of the preseason. Behind Brown, UF out-rushed UT, 262-50, for the game, including 141-33 in the first half. Driskel finished 17-of-22 for 153 yards, including the 4-yard toss to Ajagbe that pushed the Gators to an 18-point edge early in the final period. It was the combination of Driskel and Brown who got things started for UF after defensive end Ronald Powell, seeing his first action since suffering a serious knee injury in the 2012 Orange & Blue Game, sacked Toledo quarterback Terrance Owens to thwart the Rockets' opening possession. Florida took its first possession of the game at the 16-yard line and drove 84 yards in 17 plays to score on a 1-yard blast by Brown. Along the way, Brown carried five times for 38 yards, including a 23-yard run. The touchdown marked the first time UF had found the end zone on a season-opening drive since 2009. The two teams traded field goals -- with Florida redshirt freshman Austin Hardin kicking a 24-yarder and Toledo's Jeremiah Detmer good from 44 yards -- to make the score 10-3 in the second quarter, until the Gators put together another scoring drive. A 29-yard run from backup tailback Valdez Showers, who was switched from safety during the preseason, was the big hitter on a 10-play, 83-yard drive that Brown capped by dragging a handful of Rockets into the end zone on a 14-yard that had the Gators up 17-3 at halftime. Detmer's 23-yard field goal at 10:03 of the third period drew UT within 17-6, but an interception and 15-yard return by freshman cornerback Vernon Hargreaves III gave the Gators a first down at the Rockets' 23. Five plays later, Driskel hit a wide-open Ajagbe off play-action on third-and-goal for the final score of the game.

Sun Life Stadium | Miami Gardens, FL (Attendance: 76,968)

A bunch of trips into the red zone, a bunch of blown opportunities. That was the story for 12th-ranked Florida, which fell to Miami, 21-16, in their much-anticipated showdown at Sun Life Stadium. UF quarterback Jeff Driskel's second interception of the game, to Hurricanes' cornerback Tracy Howard, came on a third-and-2 from the UM 18-yard line with 6:42 to play. The possession marked the sixth for the Gators that reached inside of the Miami 20 -- and the fourth time coming away with nothing. Duke Johnson's 2-yard touchdown run following a fumble by Driskel at the Gators' 5-yard line -- the Gators' fifth turnover of the game, gave Miami a cushion. Florida responded with a quick drive, capped by a 21-yard touchdown pass from Driskel to Solomon Patton with 2:08 left in regulation, but an onside kick came up short. Florida got the ball back with :28 left at its own 20 but was unable to move the ball. Austin's Hardin's 33-yard field goal at 8:40 of the third quarter capped a 9-play, 44-yard drive and had been UF's lone score of the second half. A 52-yard touchdown from Stephen Morris to Phillip Dorsett had staked the Hurricanes to their eight-point lead at 14-6. After that, Florida mounted a series of drives -- UF out-gained UM by 100 yards on offense and held the ball for more than 13 more minutes -- but each ended in self-destruction. The Gators had a chance to close the margin after a 43-yard pass from Driskel to Patton helped move UF inside the UM 10. But, one play after overthrowing a wide-open Quinton Dunbar in the end zone for what would have been an easy touchdown, Driskel was under pressure and tired to force a throw that was intercepted by UM defensive back Rayshawn Jenkins at the goal line. Miami had taken a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter when Morris threw a 7-yarder to Herb Waters. UM capitalized on a series of early mistakes by UF, including a fumble by Matt Jones that Miami converted into the score on its opening drive. Down 7-0, Florida got some instant life when cornerback Loucheiz Purifoy, suspended from the season opener for violating team rules, blocked Pat O'Donnell's punt, with the Gators recovering at the 10. Two plays later, Driskel sprinted untouched into the end zone off a zone-read option play, picking up a nice downfield block from fullback Hunter Joyer. Florida did not tie the game, though. The Gators went for a trick-play attempt at a 2-point conversion, spreading the field and having Tyler Murphy throw a pass to Trey Burton, but the Hurricanes tackled Burton short of the goal line. On Miami's next possession, the Hurricanes went 84 yards in just six plays, with the big-hitter the over-the-top bomb to Dorsett. From there, the UF defense stepped it up and kept the UM offense on the sidelines with three straight three-and-outs. The Hurricanes ran six plays for four yards in the second quarter, but the Gators did not do their part when they had the ball.

Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Florida Field | Gainesville, FL (Attendance: 90,074)

Backup quarterback Tyler Murphy accounted for a pair of touchdowns and the Florida defense forced six turnovers as the No. 19 Gators defeated Tennessee, 31-17, in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday at The Swamp. The win was the Gators' ninth straight in the series. Murphy, summoned after starter Jeff Driskel was forced from the game in the first period, entered the game having never thrown a pass as a collegian. He finished 8-of-14 for 134 yards, and added another 84 yards rushing on 10 carries, including a fourth-quarter touchdown of seven yards to push UF ahead, 31-10. The Gators (2-1, 1-0) finished with 382 yards of total offense, but it was their defense that set the tone behind four interceptions and two fumbles. The Volunteers (2-2, 0-1) finished with 220 yards of total offense, but at halftime had just 31 yards on 25 plays. The Gators led 17-7 at the half, thanks to a 2-yard touchdown run from Mack Brown with 37 seconds to go in the second quarter. The Vols got a field goal on their first drive of third period from Michael Palardy. The points came after UT coach Butch Jones opted for a quarterback switch, benching ineffective redshirt freshman Nathan Peterman (4-of-11, 5 yards, 2 interceptions) in favor of Worley, the junior backup. UF was buoyed by a spectacular two quarters from a defense that forced four turnovers and held the Volunteers 31 total yards on 25 plays. Tennessee's only points in the first half came when cornerback Devaun Swafford returned a Driskel interception 62 yards for the first score of the game. Driskel injured his ankle on the play and was replaced by Murphy. Brown's touchdown was set up by a tipped-ball interception by junior defensive tackle Darious Cummings, whose 30-yard return set the Gators up on the UT 40. Seven plays later, one a crucial third-down run by Murphy to move the chains, Brown took an inside handoff and broke it outside for the score and 10-point lead. Earlier in the half, Solomon Patton took the pass from Murphy and weaved around two UT defensive players and raced 52 yards for the touchdown and 10-7 lead. That play came after UF defensive back Brian Poole came down with a batted ball to set the UF offense up at its own 44. UF's Austin Hardin had kicked a 23-yard field goal late in the first quarter after the Gators' defense forced a turnover deep in UT territory. Swafford's touchdown return came when Driskel, with a UT defender wrapped around his ankles, tried to force a throw to wide receiver Trey Burton, who was blanketed in coverage on the Tennessee sideline. The ball hit Swafford in the numbers and he raced untouched for the score at the 9:23 mark of the period.

NO. 20/19 FLORIDA 24, KENTUCKY 7

September 28, 2013

Commonwealth Stadium | Lexington, KY (Attendance: 62,076)

Tyler Murphy passed for a touchdown and ran for another Saturday night and tailback Matt Jones rushed for a career-high 176 yards and a score as the 20th-ranked Florida Gators defeated Kentucky, 24-7, and captured their SEC road opener at Commonwealth Stadium. Make that 27 straight wins for the Gators (3-1, 2-0) in the series, dating to 1987. That's the longest current winning streak for one team over another in the nation and now the longest by any program in SEC history. Making his first career start, Murphy completed 15 of 18 passes, including his first 13 attempts, for 156 yards, including a 9-yard scoring strike to Trey Burton in the second quarter and later in the period added a 5-yard TD run on an option keeper. He was intercepted once. Murphy made one big mistake in the third period when he stared down his receiver and was intercepted by linebacker Josh Forrest, who returned the ball 39 yards to the UF 38. Five plays later, though, UK quarterback Maxwell Smith's heave into the end zone was intercepted by leaping true freshman cornerback Vernon Hargreaves, his third pick of the season. The Hargreaves' play was the signature moment on a night when UF's defense put together another overwhelming display. UK's lone points of the night came in the first quarter, when the Wildcats executed a picture-perfect fake field goal and placekicker Joe Mansour ran 25 yards for a touchdown that tied the game at 7-all. The Gators scored the game's next 17 points, finishing with 402 yards of total offense. Their defensive counterparts held the Wildcats (1-3, 0-1) to 173 yards, sacked UK quarterbacks five times and limited the 'Cats to 1-for-8 on third down. Murphy's touchdown run late in the second quarter capped a nine-play, 62-yard drive, highlighted by a 19-yard completion to Burton. His touchdown pass came two plays after Jones had a 67-yard run. After a holding penalty on the opening kickoff stuck the Gators in a hole at their own 7, Murphy took his team 93 yards in 13 plays to give the Gators a 7-0 lead. The drive was the longest TD march -- in yards, plays and time consumed (7:47) -- for UF this season and was capped when Jones went around left end for his 2-yard scoring run on third-and-goal. Jones went on to carry 28 times on the night. On Kentucky's first possession, the Wildcats drove to the UF 42-yard line, but a sack and penalty forced the UK into a third-and-long that came up short. Enter Mansour for a 42-yard field goal attempt on fourth-and-9. Instead of kicking the ball, Mansour took a pitchout from his holder, sprinted around the right side and raced untouched into the end zone to tie the game. Kentucky reached UF territory twice in the second half, but was turned away by Hargreaves the first time (third quarter) and on downs the second time (fourth quarter), with the Gators taking control and behind Jones basically ran out the clock.

Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Florida Field | Gainesville, FL (Attendance: 90,043)

As if the first night game at Florida Field in two years wasn't electric enough, Solomon Patton and Loucheiz Purifoy provided an extra power surge for the home team Saturday night. Patton turned a pair of nice gains into long touchdown catches and Purifoy returned an interception 42 yards for a score to lead the 18th-ranked Gators to a 30-10 defeat of Southeastern Conference foe Arkansas at The Swamp. The win was Florida's 10th straight at home and kept the Gators (4-1, 3-0) tied with Georgia atop the SEC Eastern Division standings. Junior quarterback Tyler Murphy, making his first start before the home crowd since replacing Jeff Driskel (season-ending broken leg), completed 16 of 22 passes for a career-high 240 yards and scores of 51 and 38 to Patton, plus a late shovel-pass toss to tailback Valdez Showers. The UF defense got off to a slow start, but stiffened for the final three quarters and put the clamps on the Razorbacks' high-powered rushing attack. The Hogs (3-3, 0-2) came into the game averaging 237 yards per game on the ground, second-best in the league. Against the Gators, armed with the nation's second-best run defense, UA gained 111 yards rushing on 29 attempts. The Razorbacks led 7-3 and faced a third-and-6 late in the first quarter when they sent tailback Keon Hatcher out on a flair route into the right flat. From his left cornerback spot, Purifoy read quarterback Brandon Allen all the way, stepped in front of the pass -- for the first interception of his career -- and followed a calvary of UF defenders to the end zone at the 8:33 mark of the second period to put the Gators up 10-7. That's where the score stood late in the half, when Murphy was flushed from the pocket, found an open passing lane and roped a ball toward Patton about 20 yards downfield. Patton came back for the ball, wheeled around and sped off down the sideline into a spectacular touchdown. And, then he did it again in the second half. Patton's second touchdown came at the 11:23 mark of the third period and capped a seven-play, 75-yard drive to give the Gators a three-score advantage. Like before, he came back to the ball to help Murphy find a target and outraced Razorbacks to the end zone. The Gators also got a 28-yard field goal from senior placekicker Brad Phillips in the second quarter and a 7-yard shovel-pass touchdown from Showers. Arkansas had taken a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter when freshman tailback Jonathan Williams had a 4-yard touchdown run. In the first quarter, the Hogs cranked out 81 rushing yards against the nation's No. 2 rush defense, which came in allowing just 53.5 yards per game and 2.4 yards per carry. From the second quarter on, however, Arkansas managed just 155 yards of total offense, only 30 on the ground.

Tiger Stadium | Baton Rouge, LA (Attendance: 92,980)

Quarterback Zach Mettenberger engineered a pair of long touchdown drives, tailback Jeremy Hill rushed for 121 yards and the LSU defense overwhelmed quarterback Tyler Murphy and the Florida offense. That combination was more than enough for the 10th-ranked Tigers beat up and beat down the Gators, 17-6, in their Southeastern Conference showdown at "Death Valley." Fullback J.C. Copeland scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter and wildcat quarterback Anthony Jennings added another 1-yarder in the second period. The Tigers (6-1, 3-1) also got a 31-yard field goal from Colby Delahoussaye in the fourth quarter, forcing the Gators (4-2, 3-1) to play for two scores. They couldn't get one. In fact, the only scores Florida managed on the day were two field goals from Frankie Velez, a walk-on from Ocala, Fla., who got the weekend nod over incumbent kickers Austin Hardin and Brad Phillips. Velez was good on both his attempts, from 44 and 27 yards, but the Gators needed much more. For the game, Florida managed just 240 yards of total offense; 94 in the first half. In his third start since taking over for injured Jeff Driskel, Murphy went 15 of 27 for just 115 yards in facing his best opponent yet and was sacked four times by an LSU defense that came in allowing nearly 25 points per game but teed off on Murphy all day. One of UF's lone bright spots on the day came courtesy of freshman tailback Kelvin Taylor, who replaced injured Matt Jones (knee) and carried 10 times for 52 yards. The loss came three hours after SEC East Division rival Georgia lost at Missouri, which assumed first place in the division by remaining undefeated at 6-0 overall and 2-0 in league play. The Gators play at Missouri next week, meaning a win there would put them right back in the thick of the East race and unbeaten against division foes. LSU's two scoring drives went for 60 yards on 14 plays and 62 yards in eight. Both were marched into the teeth of a UF defense that came in ranked No. 1 in the SEC in yards allowed (217 per game). Mettenberger hit some big third-down passes against the UF secondary and also benefitted from key third-down pass interference penalties on both TD drives; the first against nickelback Cody Riggs on a third-and-6 from the UF seven; the second against cornerback Marcus Roberson on a long sideline throw. For the game, the Tigers totaled 327 yards -- far below their season average of 488.8 -- with well over half (200) coming in the first half when the Tigers went up 14-3. The score could have been worse, but another LSU drive was stopped when Mettenberger fumbled a pass attempt -- without being hit -- and defensive tackle Leon Orr recovered at the the Florida 28. The Tigers finished with a season-low 17 points after coming in averaging 45.5 a game. LSU took its 7-3 lead after the Gators jumped on the scoreboard first. Murphy marched the UF offense 60 yards on 14 plays, converting a pair of third downs along the way, before the drive stalled at the Tigers' 27. From there, Florida coach Will Muschamp bypassed a fourth-and-1 for a field-goal attempt. Instead of going with ardin, Muschamp tabbed Velez for the boot and early 3-0 lead.

Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium | Columbia, MO (Attendance: 67,124)

Redshirt freshman Maty Mauk passed for 295 yards against the SEC's top-rated defense, placekicker Andrew Baggett tied a school record with five field goals and UF quarterback Tyler Murphy was punished and panicked all day as the 14th-ranked Tigers dominated the No. 22 Gators at Faurot Field. In losing for the second-straight week on the road, the Gators (4-3, 3-2) gained just 151 yards of total offense. Murphy was under siege the entire game, with the Gators mostly helpless in the running game (31 carries, 59 yards) and the offense providing no time in pass protection. Murphy finished 15 of 29 for 92 yards and an interception against a Missouri (7-0, 3-0) defense that was in perpetual attack mode during the entire sun-splashed afternoon. Murphy was sacked six times and hit a bunch more. Florida's best offensive output of the game came on a six-play, 70-yard drive that true freshman tailback Kelvin Taylor capped with an all-out effort 20-yard touchdown run, the first score of his career. Taylor finished with 74 yards on 12 carries. The rest of UF's rushing attack totaled 15 yards on 19 carries. Mauk, meanwhile, completed 18 of his 36 throws, including a 20-yard touchdown on the game's second play from scrimmage and also had a 17-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter. The Gators answered Mizzou's first touchdown with a 23-yard field goal from Frankie Velez, thanks to a muffed punt by MU return man Marcus Murphy. Baggett canceled out Velez's field goal with a 43-yard of his own. That score was set up after UF true freshman wideout Demarcus Robinson let a wide-open pass from Murphy skip through his arms and into the hands of MU cornerback Aaron Penton, who returned it seven yards to the UF 46. The score was 13-3 at halftime, but UF's Solomon Patton started the second half with a 100-yard kickoff return that quickly made it a 13-10 game. Undeterred, Mauk hit wideout Jimmie Hunt for a 52-yard completion on Mizzou's second offensive play of the half, and three plays later Josey scored on a 6-yard on third-and-5 to stake the lead back to 10. Baggett's third field goal, a 39-yarder, pushed the margin to 23-10, but the Gators put together their best drive in two weeks: six plays, 70 yards, with Taylor dashing in from 20 yards out to make the score 23-17. But, Josey took off on a 50-yard run to set up field goal No. 4 from Baggett. His fifth came early in the fourth quarter. If the game wasn't out of reach there, Murphy's fumble deep in his own territory did, with Mauk scoring his 17-yard run for a 36-17 lead with 6:30 to go.

GEORGIA 23, FLORIDA 20

November 2, 2013

EverBank Field | Jacksonville, FL (Attendance: 84,693)

Georgia started fast, really fast, and ultimately had enough to finish off a Florida rally for a 23-20 win in their annual SEC series at EverBank Field. Quarterback Aaron Murray passed for 258 yards and a score, while tailback Todd Gurley rushed for 100 yards and scored twice as the Bulldogs defeated the Gators a third-straight time for the first time in 24 years. The Murray-Gurley combo helped the Bulldogs build a 23-3 halftime lead after cranking out 355 yards in the first two quarters. UF managed to battle back into the game by scoring 17-straight points to open the second half. The game took a huge momentum swing early in the third period when Florida defensive tackle Leon Orr picked up a Murray pass, dropped by tight end Arthur Lynch in the back and ruled a lateral. Orr returned the ball to the UGA 16 and, three plays later, UF tailback Mack Brown scored around left end on a 5-yard touchdown run. That made the score 23-10. On Georgia's next offensive possession, UF cornerback Loucheiz Purifoy sacked Murray in the end zone for a safety. It was 23-12. After the Bulldogs' free kick, Gators quarterback Tyler Murphy moved his unit 50 yards in five plays, first racing 25 yards to the UGA 14, then going 14 yards for a touchdown. His two-point conversion pass to tight end Clay Burton drew UF to 23-20 with 14:20 to go. Four minutes later, the Gators were back in Georgia territory with a first down, but went three-and-out, with the third-down play a 14-yard sack. Florida punted the ball away at the 8:17 mark and never got it back, as Georgia ran the clock out with the game's final 18 plays. The Bulldogs needed less than three minutes to score their first touchdown, a 5-yard run by Gurley, then needed just three plays to score the second, a 73-yard Murray-to-Gurley touchdown pass. Those drives, along with three field goals from Marshall Morgan, had the Bulldogs out to a 20-point lead. The Gators had a chance to bounce back on their first possession after quarterback Murphy hit Quinton Dunbar for an 83-yard bomb to the Georgia 9. But, after freshman tailback Kelvin Taylor gained just two yards on third and goal, senior wide receiver Solomon Patton was flagged for a dead-ball unnecessary roughness penalty and walk-on kicker Frankie Velez pushed a 40-yard field-goal attempt wide to the right. The Bulldogs faced a third-and-6 at their 27 when the Gators emptied their defense with an all-out blitz and left Gurley completely open for a touchdown. The Gators' second offensive possession lasted six plays, went 18 yards and ended with a punt. The Bulldogs then drove 53 yards in 10 plays, with Marshall Morgan kicking a 49-yard field goal for a 17-0 lead. Morgan added a second field on Georgia's fourth possession, a 27-yarder early in the second quarter. After UF had a 31-yarder by Velez to put the Gators on the board, Morgan hit a 32-yarder, his third of the game, as time expired in the first half.
