THE OPENING TIP

LADY GOVS WRAP UP NOVEMBER AT VANDERBILT

Austin Peay women's basketball team concludes a three-game road trip when it meets Vanderbilt in a 7 p.m., Wednesday contest at Memorial Stadium. Both teams enter the contest amidst losing streaks, the Lady Govs lost both games at the UTSA Thanksgiving Classic, last weekend, to account for its current two-game losing streak while the Commodores lost a road outing and two games at the San Juan Shootout and bring a three-game losing streak back to Memorial Gym where they are unbeaten in two tries this season. Austin Peay and Vanderbilt do share a common opponent this season - UAB. Austin Peay suffered a 72-54 opening-day loss at UAB while Vanderbilt posted a 69-54 home victory against the Blazers six days later.

LADY GOVS SEASON TO DATE

Austin Peay's lone win this season has been sandwiched between a pair of two-game losing streaks, including its current losing stretch... the Lady Govs are shooting a respectable 39.1 percent from the field this season, but are allowing opponents to shoot a gaudy 49.5 percent... nine APSU players have played in all five contests and head coach Carrie Daniels has used the same starting lineup in each game... Austin Peay has won the turnover battle in its last three outings and now owns a plus-2.2 turnover margin... the Lady Govs have not won a rebounding battle this season and suffer a minus-12 rebounding margin through five games... seven players are averaging five points per game and the Lady Govs 64.0 points per game is only 2.6 points per game behind last season's pace.

COMMODORES COLLOQUY

Vanderbilt is amidst a three-game losing streak, but those losses have come at Dayton (6-0), and on a neutral court to both Virginia (4-1) and Florida State (5-0) - three teams receiving votes or ranked in this week's Top 25 polls... the Commodores lost SEC Sixth-Woman of the Year winner Stephanie Holzer to a knee injury suffered in their exhibition contest... Vanderbilt has been trying to recover and has not topped the 70-point mark in their last five games, posting a 2-3 mark... junior guard Christina Foggie, who scored 25 points against APSU last season, is leading Vanderbilt with 15.7 points and 3.3 assists per game this season... senior forward Tiffany Clarke, who grabbed a team-best 10 rebounds in last season's meeting, has grabbed a team-best 7.3 rebounds and is averaging 13.3 points per game.

THREE POINTS A PIECE

FAST BREAK POINTS

- ❶ **CRITICAL HANDLING:** After averaging only 16.9 turnovers per game last season (its lowest turnover rate since 2002-03), Austin Peay has opened the 2012-13 season with 95 turnovers (19.0 pg) in its first five contests. Austin Peay has done a much better job handling the ball in its last three outings, averaging 14.3 turnovers per game and winning the turnover battle each time.
- ❷ **REBOUNDING WOES:** Austin Peay enters Sunday's contest with a minus-12.0 rebounding margin average after five games. The Lady Govs have surrendered 65 offensive boards and opponents have scored 69 second-chance points. Individually, only senior Leslie Martinez is ranked among the OVC's top 20 in rebounding, her 5.6 rebounds per game ranking 17th.
- ❸ **THREE FOR THE PEAY:** The Lady Govs have been sharp from outside the arc in the season's first five games, converting on 37.2 percent of their three-point tries – a percentage that ranks 33rd nationally. Junior Nicole Olszewski has made 53.3 percent of her outside tries, ranking third in the OVC. She is joined in the league's top 15 by sophomore Kristen Stainback (11th, 42.1 percent) and senior Leslie Martinez (14th, 38.5 percent)

EARLY SEASON TRENDS

- ❶ **TURNOVERS:** Austin Peay opened the season losing the turnover battle in its first two outings. However, they have won that battle in their last three outings to the tune of a +21 total turnover margin. They enter Wednesday's contest with a +11 turnover margin (+2.2 turnovers per game).
- ❷ **STEALS:** Nearly hand-and-hand with turnovers has been Austin Peay's thievery rate. The Lady Govs have posted 10-plus steals in three of the season's first five games and are ranked second among OVC schools with 9.8 steals per game.
- ❸ **REBOUNDS:** The Lady Govs have not won the rebounding battle in any game this season. Austin Peay came closest against William & Mary, holding a narrow 17-16 rebounding edge at halftime but ultimately losing the battle by a 35-31 margin.

ROSTER FULL OF FACTS

- ❶ **YOUTH RULES?:** Austin Peay's roster will lean towards the young side in 2011-12 with seven freshman dominating the 15-woman roster. Add in three sophomores and a senior who transferred to the team last season and that equals more than half the roster with one year or less of Division I collegiate experience.
- ❷ **CAGEY VETERANS:** At the top of the roster food chain are the Lady Govs three seniors. Forward Meghan Bussabarger and center Kaitlyn Hill have been with the program their entire collegiate careers while forward Leslie Martinez joined the team last season. Bussabarger has battled injuries throughout her career but when healthy has provided key minutes. Hill put together an impressive nine-game stretch at last season's end and will be asked to step up in that role again this season. Martinez proved a capable No. 2 scorer last season and has an indefatigable rebounding prowess.
- ❸ **SMALL GROUP OF JUNIORS:** The Lady Govs junior class is the smallest of the four with only guards Nicole Olszewski and Lauren Yarbrough to its count. Nicole Olszewski has been a regular starter each of the past two seasons, playing most of the time at point guard.

SEASONALLY

- ❶ **42 SEASONS:** Austin Peay is in its 42nd consecutive season of women's basketball and has compiled a 426-593 overall record since 1976-77.
- ❷ **STREAK SPEAK:** The Lady Govs bring a two-game losing streak into Wednesday's contest at Vanderbilt. Austin Peay also has lost its last four road contests dating back to last season.
- ❸ **DANIELS SEVENTH SEASON:** Now in her seventh season at her alma mater, head coach Carrie Daniels brings a career 73-120 record into this contest, including a 50-60 record in OVC play. Her 73 wins ranks second all-time among Lady Govs coaches, behind only APSU Hall of Fame head coach Susie Gardner who compiled a 112-93 record from 1996-03. Daniels will coach her 200th career game Dec. 29 at Alabama A&M.



NOTES & NOTABLES FROM LAST OUTING

LADY GOVS AT UTSA THANKSGIVING CLASSIC

Austin Peay trailed by double digits in both contests, nearly completing a come-from-behind effort in a two-point loss (69-67) at UTSA before failing to overcome a hot-shooting William & Mary squad and dropping a 12-point decision (88-76)... Austin Peay won the turnover battle in both contests, including an impressive 27-16 margin against UTSA, but could not make either advantage pay off... the Lady Govs suffered rebounding losses in both outings, including a 46-27 margin against UTSA... Austin Peay nabbed a season-best 14 steals against UTSA... the Lady Govs scored a season-best 76 points in the loss to William & Mary... the Lady Govs bench was responsible for 33 points against William & Mary and played 96 of the possible 200 minutes... junior guard Nicole Olszewski was named to the all-tournament squad after averaging 14 points per game, including 9.5 points per game over the final five minutes... senior forward Meghan Bussabarger averaged 14 points per game as well, scoring 20 in the loss to UTSA... freshman Tiasha Gray handed out nine assists against William & Mary, leading APSU to a season-best 16-assist night.

TIMEOUT TOPICS

AN AUSTIN PEAY WIN WOULD...

Be its first road win this season, ending a four-game road losing streak that dates back to last season... snap a 13-game losing streak against Vanderbilt... be its first win against the Commodores since Dec. 10, 1977... end a six-game losing streak at Memorial Gymnasium, dating back to Dec. 3, 1976... improve Daniels' record to 74-120 overall... make the Lady Govs 427-593 overall since 1976-77.

AN AUSTIN PEAY LOSS WOULD...

Be its fifth consecutive road loss dating back to last season... be its 14th consecutive loss to Vanderbilt, dropping it to 2-15 all-time against the Commodores... be its seventh consecutive loss at Memorial Gymnasium... drop Daniels' record to 73-121 overall... make the Lady Govs 426-594 overall since 1976-77.

LADY GOVS ADD ST. CATHARINE TO SCHEDULE

Austin Peay women's basketball team has added St. Catharine College to its 2012-13 schedule in a game to be played at 4 p.m., Sunday, Dec. 9 at the Dunn Center. The game replaces the Dec. 15 contest against Christian Brothers which was cancelled due to a scheduling conflict. Austin Peay season ticket holders who have a ticket for the Dec. 15 contest may use that ticket for the Dec. 9 game.

FRESHMAN TRIO EATING UP MINUTES EARLY

The freshman trio of Tiasha Gray (19.2 mpg), Jennifer Nwokocha (15.0 mpg) and Alexis Hardaway (22.2 mpg) have found themselves heavily involved in the Lady Govs first five contests, combining for 282 of the team's 1000 minutes (28.2 percent). Their inexperience has shown in the early going, as they have combined to score 78 points (5.2 ppg) and grab 39 rebounds (2.6 rpg).

CHARITY STRIPE

After opening the season making just 16 of its first 30 free throws (53.3 percent), Austin Peay has made a bee-line to the stripe in its last three outings and has made its opponents pay. The Lady Govs have attempted at least 20 free throws in each of those three games and is 55-of-80 (68.8 percent) during that span. The burst has helped the Lady Govs push their season free-throw percentage to 64.5 percent, but still ranks 10th among OVC teams.

WHAT RETURNS FOR APSU

Austin Peay lost a large portion of its scoring punch in the transition from the 2011-12 season to the current 2012-13 campaign, largely due to the departure of Whitney Hanley. However, as the chart below demonstrates, the Lady Govs should be able to compensate in other key statistical categories. Still its the score that matters and the question remains: Who will step up and score for Austin Peay?

LADY GOVS PICKED FIFTH IN OVC PRESEASON POLL

Austin Peay women's basketball team was picked to finish fifth in the West Division of the preseason Ohio Valley Conference women's basketball poll, as selected by the league's head basketball coaches and sports information directors. The Lady Govs, who returns four starters and eight letterwinners, received 47 points. Austin Peay finished behind reigning OVC champion UT Martin, which received 129 points and 19 first-place votes to earn the top pick in the division. The Skyhawks were followed by Eastern Illinois (113 points), SIU Edwardsville (86), Murray State (77), Austin Peay and Southeast Missouri (39).

AND ON THE OTHER SIDE

Tennessee Tech was picked to win the OVC's East Division, receiving 15 first-place votes and 121 points. They were followed by Eastern Kentucky (108 points), new league member Belmont (86), Morehead State (69), Tennessee State (68) and Jacksonville State (40).

LADY GOVS ABSENT FROM OVC PRESEASON SQUAD

For the first time since 2008-09, Austin Peay women's basketball team did not have a player named to the OVC's 10-member preseason squad. Eastern Illinois had three players selected to the team while UT Martin had two players picked. Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, SIU Edwardsville, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had one player on the list.

NEW DIVISIONS...

With the addition of Belmont for the 2012-13 season, the Ohio Valley Conference will move to divisional play for both the men and women's basketball regular-season schedules. Austin Peay was placed in the West Division along with Murray State, which will be its travel partner. Rounding out the division are UT Martin, Southeast Missouri, SIU Edwardsville and Eastern Illinois. The East Division will be comprised of Belmont, Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky, Morehead State, Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville State.

...BIG CHALLENGE

The race for the OVC West Division crown promises to be an all-out battle. Four teams that qualified for the 2012 OVC Tournament came from the division and a fifth, SIU Edwardsville, would have qualified if it was eligible. In addition, seven of the league's 10 Preseason All-OVC selections will play in the West Division during the 2012-13 season. In recent history, the league's regular-season champion in five of the last six seasons has been a team now located in the West Division.

DUNN CENTER RECEIVES NEW PLAYING SURFACE

During the summer, Austin Peay replaced the entire playing surface at the Dunn Center. The project, which cost less than \$300,000, is the first complete floor replacement in the history of the 37-year old arena and was necessary due to damage to the original floor. The Govs and Lady Govs now play on a state-of-the-art PermaFlex flooring system supplied by Connor Sports Floor and installed by Sport Floors, Inc. of Memphis. The floating floor system features a rubber shock absorber that reduces the impact for athletes. The project began shortly after Austin Peay's May graduation and was completed in time for the Lady Govs volleyball team to take the court for its first home match in September.

BELMONT JOINS OVC FOR 2012-13 SEASON

The Ohio Valley Conference announced in May that Belmont has been admitted to the Conference and will become the league's 12th member. The move was approved by the OVC Board of Presidents. Belmont officially became a member of the OVC on July 1, 2012 and its athletic teams began competing in the conference this season.

OVC, NASHVILLE TO HOST 2014 WOMEN'S FINAL FOUR

The NCAA Women's Final Four will visit Nashville in 2014 the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Committee announced, Nov. 14, 2008. The Ohio Valley Conference will host the biggest event in collegiate women's basketball at Bridgestone Arena. The committee selected Final Four hosts for the period from 2012 through 2016. Joining Nashville on the list are Denver (2012), New Orleans (2013), Tampa Bay (2015) and Indianapolis (2016).

AFTER THE FINAL HORN

LADY GOVS BEGIN DECEMBER AT HOME

Austin Peay begins December with a 5:15 p.m., Saturday contest against Ball State. It is the return trip of the home-and-home series that began with Ball State eking out a 59-55 victory in Muncie last season. The game also is the first of six December outings for the Lady Govs as they will alternate home and away contests throughout the month.



AUSTIN PEAY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

PREVIOUS MEETING AGAINST VANDERBILT • NOV. 30, 2011

CLARKSVILLE - Austin Peay women's basketball team could not slow nationally-ranked Vanderbilt, dropping an 83-51 non-conference tilt, at the Dunn Center.

Austin Peay (2-4) kept the game close in the opening seven minutes and trailed by only three points, 10-7, after sophomore Meghan Bussabarger made a pair of free throws. However, the Lady Gobs could not maintain their early momentum and made only two of their next 13 shots.

No. 25/22 Vanderbilt (7-0), which entered the game shooting nearly 50 percent from the field, found its shooting stroke while Austin Peay struggled. The Commodores made 8-of-12 attempts from the field over the next eight minutes as part of a 21-4 run that broke the game open with VU leading 31-11 with 5:40 left. Vanderbilt made 50 percent (15-of-30) of its first half shots and took a 22-point, 43-21 lead into halftime.

The Lady Gobs shooting warmed only marginally in the second half, converting 37 percent of their shots (10-of-37). Vanderbilt kept the pressure on, making 45.2 percent (14-of-31) as its lead reached 30 points seven minutes into the second half.

Junior Leslie Martinez led the Lady Gobs with her season's first double-double, scoring 10 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. Sophomore Shyra Brown added a career-high 13 points. Both Martinez and Brown led a bench effort that scored 30 of the Lady Gobs 51 points. Austin Peay's starting five - led by senior Whitney Hanley's eight points - was held to 21 points and made only 19.3 percent (6-of-31) of its field goals.

Vanderbilt's Christina Foggie led all scorers with a career-high 25-point effort. Stephanie Holzer added 15 points and eight rebounds.

LAST TIME OUT: WILLIAM & MARY DOWNS LADY GOVS • NOV. 24, 2012

SAN ANTONIO - Austin Peay women's basketball team ran into a hot-shooting William & Mary squad and dropped an 88-76 decision, Saturday, in the UTSA Thanksgiving Classic at the Convocation Center.

William & Mary (2-3) seemingly couldn't miss a shot to start the game; making 11 of its first 13 shots to build a 22-8 lead in a little over five minutes. A lackadaisical defensive effort forced Lady Gobs head coach Carrie Daniels to bench four of her starters by the six-minute mark. Austin Peay played the majority of half with three freshmen and two sophomores on the court.

Austin Peay (1-5) didn't suffer its customary shooting drought in the first half. Rather, the Lady Gobs couldn't keep pace with the Tribe. Austin Peay ultimately would close within six points as sophomore Shelby Olszewski made three-pointers on consecutive trips with less than a minute to play. Yet William & Mary responded with Kaitlyn Mathieu's three-pointer to take a 43-34 halftime lead.

After shooting nearly 55 percent in the opening half, William & Mary was primed cool off in the second half. However, they defied that expectation by shooting an even-better 58 percent in the second half. The Tribe pushed their lead to 20 points, 64-44, at the 13:15 mark, courtesy a 14-4 run.

Austin Peay would cut the lead to 12 points several times during the final 10 minutes as junior Nicole Olszewski found her range. She made five points as part of a 7-0 run that ended with 8:11 remaining then hit back-to-back threes later in the half to get the deficit to 12 points again, 80-68, with 3:09 left. A pair of Nwokocha free-throws got APSU to its closest margin, 86-76, with 34 seconds left.

Sophomore Kristen Stainback and Nicole Olszewski each scored 13 points as Austin Peay's season-best 76 points went for naught. Nwokocha added 12 points and six rebounds while Martinez grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds. The Lady Gobs were held to 42.9 percent (27-of-63) shooting.

Taylor Hilton led William & Mary, which scored a season-best 88 points, with 23 points and Janine Aldridge added 22 points. The Tribe made 12 three-pointers as part of a 56 percent (32-of-57) shooting performance.

Carrie Daniels, a member of Austin Peay's first Ohio Valley Conference Championship basketball team and NCAA participant in 1996, enters her seventh season as head coach at her alma mater. She already has taken the Lady Govs to two NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament appearances in her brief career and is intent on building a program that will compete annually for the OVC's regular-season and tournament titles.

When she led the Lady Govs to the 2009 NCAA Tournament, Daniels became the first former Austin Peay student-athlete to take an Austin Peay team to a NCAA Championship. One year later, she led the Lady Govs to the NCAA Tournament again, becoming the second head coach in program history to lead a team to multiple tournament appearances.

In addition, Daniels is one of 26 coaches in NCAA Division I history to have played and coached in the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. All told, she has made five appearances in the NCAA tournament – twice as a head coach at Austin Peay, twice while an assistant at Western Kentucky and once as a player at Austin Peay.

Daniels' led the Lady Govs to three consecutive 10-win OVC campaigns before suffering a setback in 2011-12. Austin Peay opened the campaign with back-to-back wins and even showed promise in a close loss at nationally-ranked Louisville. Yet, the Lady Govs saw their season slowly slip away as they strung consecutive victories together only three times after the opening back-to-back wins. The Lady Govs were competitive all season, with 20 of their 31 games decided by less than 10 points but they were only 8-12 in those outings. Austin Peay was again a tough out in the conference tournament, winning a double-overtime decision against Morehead State – thanks largely to a 38-point outing by guard Whitney Hanley – before falling to Murray State in the second round.

The Lady Govs 2010-11 effort was a battle to find scoring after the loss of two of the team's top three scorers from the previous season. Those losses forced Daniels to turn to two juniors – Hanley and forward Jasmine Rayner – to make up over 26 points in lost scoring. The team struggled again in the non-conference portion of its schedule and even early in the OVC slate. However, Hanley and Rayner settled into their roles in time for a February surge where the team posted a 6-1 record and secured fifth place in a close conference race. The Lady Govs carried that momentum into the OVC Tournament, winning its first two games with dominant first-half performances. However, the Lady Govs could not overcome the fatigue of playing its third game in as many days and fell to Tennessee Tech in the tournament's semifinals.

Daniels, now in her 16th season as a coach at the Division I level, entered the coaching ranks after a brilliant collegiate career at Austin Peay, where she was a four-year starter (1991-96) while playing under her maiden name, Carrie Thompson. At the time of her graduation, she was only the second player in school history to compile 1,000 points, 400 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals during her career. Daniels is one of the first 10 APSU women's basketball players to score 1,000 points, finishing with 1,118 points. Ten years after her career ended, she remains ranked among the career top 25 in 15 statistical categories.

She earned the 1996 Joy Award given to the top senior athlete at Austin Peay, after helping lead the Lady Govs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance as a senior in 1996. Daniels averaged 10.3 points and 3.6 rebounds per game during the 1995-96 campaign. She scored a team-best 14 points

in the Lady Govs NCAA Tournament first-round game at Clemson.

In 1995, she received the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics Wilma Rudolph Award, a national award presented to honor student athletes who have overcome great personal, academic, and/or emotional odds to achieve academic success while participating in intercollegiate athletics. She missed most of the 1994-95 season after receiving a medical redshirt for a heart ailment.

A stellar prep player at Scottsburg (Ind.) High School, Daniels earned All-America recognition from Women's Basketball News Service after averaging 17 points, 6.3 assists and 3.8 rebounds per game as a senior.
