POSTSEASON NOTES

Commodores and NCAA Regionals

Vanderbilt's appearance at the 2012 Central Regional is the Commodores' 13th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance and the fifth consecutive under current mentor Greg Allen. Vanderbilt's best finish at a regional came at the 2004 Central Regional in Normal, Ill., when the Commodores won the regional. Ironically, in 2000, the first year of Vanderbilt's run in postseason play, the Commodores competed in Columbus, Ohio, at the Scarlet Course.

Greg Allen and the Postseason

Vanderbilt head coach Greg Allen, in his fifth season, has taken the Commodores to five consecutive NCAA Regionals and two consecutive appearances in the NCAA Championship. In all, Allen, who coached at the University of Arizona before coming to Nashville in the summer of 2007, has never missed a postseason appearance in 12 years as a head coach and two years as an assistant with the men's team at the University of Texas.

Vanderbilt to host 2012 NCAA Championship

Vanderbilt and the Vanderbilt Legends Club will play host to the 2012 NCAA Championship May 22-25 in Franklin, Tenn., on the club's North Course. It is the first NCAA Championship hosted by the school, and the first NCAA Division I championship to be staged in the Middle Tennessee area. The North Course, home to the popular Mason Rudolph Women's Championship held every September, has recently been the recipient of new Bermuda greens in the last year and will have a different look for competitors when they arrive later this month.

Marina Alex claims SEC Player of the Year honors for second time

Senior Marina Alex was recently named the SEC Player of the Year for the second time of her career - Alex won the award the first time after capturing the SEC Individual Championship that season. Alex is one of only two SEC women's golfers to have won the award twice in their career - Georgia standout and LPGA veteran Vicki Goetze is the other. For the season, Alex has a 72.7 stroke average, and is on pace to depart as the Commodores' all-time leader in stroke average with a 73.1 career mark.

Lauren Stratton, Kendall Martindale named to All-SEC teams

Lauren Stratton, along with Alex, were named to the All-SEC First Team, becoming the eighth and ninth Vanderbilt players, respectively, to be named to the first team, and the first time since 2004 (May Wood, Sarah Jacobs) that the Commodores have had two players honored on the first team. Stratton, from Spring Hill, Tenn., participated in all 10 Vanderbilt events this year, posted a 73.3 stroke average, and had two top five finishes (Mason Rudolph Fall Preview, T-3rd; Mercedes Benz SEC/Pac 12 Challenge, 2nd) and three additional top 10's (Stanford Intercollegiate, t-6th; Vanderbilt/Texas Dual, t-7th; SEC Championship, t-8th).

Martindale, in her first collegiate campaign, averaged 75.1 strokes per round in eight tournaments this season in being named to the All-Freshman team. Her best finish this year was a tie for 21st at the Central District Invitational in Tampa, Fla.

Experienced Commodores

Four of the five Vanderbilt players in the lineup have played in an NCAA Regional and an NCAA Championship in their career. Alex has participated in three Regionals and three NCAA Championships (played as an individual in her freshman season), Stratton and fellow junior Anna Leigh Keith in two Regionals and two NCAA Championships, and sophomore Rene Sobolewski played in the NCAA East Regional last season in Daytona Beach and in the national championship in Bryan, Texas.

In the last two NCAA Championships, the Commodores have placed in a tie for seventh (2010, Wilmington) and in a tie for 10th (2011, Bryan, Texas), the first time in school history the team has had back-to-back top 10 finishes at the national championship.

Stratton battles through kidney stones

Stratton, who saw her national ranking rise to as high as number three in the fall season, knew something was wrong after posting an eye-popping 86 in the final round of the LSU Golf Classic on March 11. After stopping at a hospital on their way home from the tournament, it was discovered that Stratton played the final round of the tournament with kidney stones and needed surgery to remove them. The surgery was done in Nashville, and the Spring Hill, Tenn., resident was back on the course without missing any tournament time.

Greg Allen, Head Coach



Greg Allen, considered one of the outstanding collegiate golf coaches in the NCAA, is in his fifth season at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's golf program.

Allen made an impact in his first four seasons - his Commodores have been to four consecutive NCAA Regionals and broke through in 2010 to finish seventh at the NCAA National Championship in Wilmington, N.C. Also in 2010, he coached the SEC Player of the Year in Marina Alex and had two freshmen make the

All-SEC Freshmen team in the spring of 2010 in Anna Leigh Keith and Lauren Stratton.

In 2011, his Commodore team qualified for the NCAA Championship after winning a one-hole playoff against Florida State in the NCAA East Regional. It was Allen's second consecutive trip to the national championship as Vanderbilt's coach and eighth overall. He also guided Vanderbilt to their first back-to-back top 10 finishes at the NCAA Championship after his 2011 squad ended the event in a tie for 10th place. Two of his players, Alex and senior Megan Grehan, were named to the All-SEC Second team at the end of the regular season.

Allen came to Vanderbilt after a seven-year tenure as the head coach at the University of Arizona, where he twice won the Pac-10 Conference, finished as NCAA runner-up in 2002 and coached Lorena Ochoa - the number one ranked player on the LPGA Tour before her retirement in 2010 - among nine other All-Americans.

Allen had a lengthy record of achievement at Arizona during his seven years there. In addition to his Pac-10 titles and 10 All-Americans, he coached eight NCAA All-Scholars, 13 Academic All-Pac-10 student-athletes, three NCAA Players of the Year, two National Freshmen of the Year, three Pac-10 Players of the Year, two Curtis Cup selections and 21 All-Pac-10 performers. Two of his players won three Golfstat Cup Award for the nation's lowest stroke average. His Wildcat teams also won nine tournament championships and registered 28 individual victories. Allen has also coached LPGA and PGA stars Natalie Gulbis, Erica Blasberg, Laura Myerscough, and David Gossett during his coaching career.

Allen arrived at Arizona after serving as assistant men's golf coach at Texas from 1998-2000. He helped lead the 1999-2000 Longhorns to a banner year that included the NCAA Central Region championship and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championship, its highest finish in five years. The squad ended the season ranked No. 8 in the final MasterCard Collegiate Rankings. The 1998-99 team had its best showing in six years, as it earned three tournament victories and finished in the top three in seven of its 13 competitions. Well known for his rapport with collegiate players, Allen handled many of the day-to-day operations for the Longhorns and assisted head coach John Fields with scheduling, recruiting and coaching at practices and tournaments.

Prior to that he was Director of Tournament Operations for the American Junior Golf Association in Roswell, Ga., where he spent five years as both director of tournament operations and tournament director. While in Roswell, Allen was responsible for planning and executing 47 national junior golf tournaments and other AJGA events. He oversaw all AJGA tournaments and was responsible for the supervision of eight tournament directors, as well as the hiring of 24 summer interns.

He is a native of Beechmont, Kentucky and graduated from Murray State in 1993 with a degree in journalism. As a student, he worked in the sports information office, where he was a liaison for numerous sports, including golf. Prior to graduation, Allen worked two summers as a communications intern for the AJGA, where he was responsible for all on-site media relations at 10 national junior golf tournaments.

He and his wife Julie, a swim coach who competed in the 1988 Olympic trials, have four children, Maggie (16), Mollie (12), Mason (10) and Mabry Jane (3).

Holly Clark is in her second season as an assistant coach with the Vanderbilt women's golf team after spending two seasons as the head coach at Carson Newman College. Clark replaces Nicki Cutler, who was named as the head coach at Princeton University in the summer of 2010.

Prior to her arrival at Vanderbilt, Clark began the Carson Newman golf program in January of 2008 as the team's first head coach, and helped lead the Lady Eagles to their first NCAA Regional appearance in 2010 and the South Atlantic Conference Championship in their first year of existence in 2009. Clark had an individual compete in the NCAA Regional in the program's first year in 2009, and coached a NGCA All-American and an Academic All-American in 2009-10.



"I'm really excited to have Holly join our program and become part of the family," said Vanderbilt head coach Greg Allen. "She has an impressive background in a very short time as a coach. Starting a college golf program shows me that she knows what it takes to work hard and get things done. She has a wonderful personality filled with southern charm that the Vanderbilt community will fall in love with."

Before her arrival at Carson Newman, Clark was a four-year standout player at the University of Tennessee, where she helped lead the Volunteers to the 2006 NCAA East Regional title. The Morristown, Tenn., native turned in one of her top individual finishes at the Southeastern Conference Championships that same year, when she placed 12th. Clark also finished eighth at the Mercedes-Benz Women's Collegiate Championships in 2004.

Golfer gets past pain of 'crazy semester,' leads Vanderbilt into SEC championship

The number puzzled Vanderbilt women's golf coach Greg Allen.

Eighty-six?

Allen did not see that coming. Not from All-American hopeful Lauren Stratton. Especially after she shot even par over the first two rounds, which put her in third place, two strokes behind the leader, with one round to go in the LSU Golf Classic last month. In contention to win her first collegiate golf tournament, the junior recorded four double-bogeys, six bogeys and no birdies to finish with a career-worst 86 and fall into a tie for 27th.

"[Assistant coach] Holly [Clark] and I were seeing shots that we've never seen Stratty hit before," Allen said. "An 86. We're thinking, 'What in the world?'"

Barely 15 minutes out of Baton Rouge, the culprit revealed itself.

Driving back to Nashville on a sleeper bus, "excruciating pain" moved from Stomach's stomach to her back, forcing the bus driver to stop at a local hospital in Mississippi.

It turned out Stratton had played with a kidney stone.

After having the "best semester of my college career" in the fall, the Spring Hill native said she hasn't clicked this spring. Still, heading into this weekend's SEC Championship in Fayetteville, Ark., Stratton ranked second on the team behind senior Marina Alex in stroke average (72.7). She has six top 20 finishes and twice finished in the top five.

The final stretch begins Friday with the SEC tournament and continues on May 10 at an NCAA Regional. The Commodores hope to qualify for the NCAA Championship, which is May 22-25 on their home course – Vanderbilt Legends Club in Franklin.

By then, Stratton wants to be peaking — and pain free.

"I was in the hunt to win a golf tournament and then that decides to pop up on the final day," she said. "It gets me back out there to try to get back in the hunt again. It's coming. Golf is a cycle. I feel close. I feel really comfortable. I just need to make a couple more putts every round and,

hey, I'll be right where I was.”

Before that forgettable final round, Stratton had complained of a horrible stomachache.

“I just didn't feel like myself on the golf course and it just ate me alive,” Stratton said.

Local physicians initially believed the it had passed but when she saw a specialist in Nashville that turned out not to be the case. A day later, she underwent surgery to have it removed.

“That is just like Stratty — a tough competitor,” Allen said. “We were at Stanford her freshman year and she had a fever. In fact, she had such a fever that she didn't know what she shot. She ended up shooting 67 that day. So we know fever for her she plays great. Kidney stone, no so great.”

Stratton also has battled arthritis in her hip and a stress fracture in her back but “it is nothing compared to that.” She awaits more test results to disclose the cause of the kidney stone but she was told it most likely is hereditary. Her father also had one.

A week after the surgery she returned to practice and got in a couple hours of work just one day before the team left to compete in a golf tournament in Arizona. She finished a team-best tied for 32nd.

“I was just happy to be playing again,” Stratton said. “It has been a crazy semester.”

• **SEC tennis:** Vanderbilt, ranked 43rd in the nation, avenged an early-season loss and scored a stunning 4-3 upset over No. 19 LSU in the opening round of the SEC tennis tournament Thursday at Starkville, Miss.

The Commodores' Austin Gonzales won a three-set match at 7-6 in the third set at No. 4 singles to finally end the four-hour marathon.

Vanderbilt plays top seed Kentucky in the quarterfinals Friday.

The 23rd-ranked Vanderbilt women blanked Mississippi State 4-0 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the SEC women's tournament at Oxford, Miss.

The Commodores meet host Ole Miss Friday in the quarterfinals.

Roots: Greg Allen

Roots is a series that profiles Vanderbilt student-athletes and coaches, and reflects back on their lives, forming a roadmap that guides readers through the early years of their lives to where they are today.

Roots: Jeremy Organ

If you were to layout a prototypical career path that would eventually lead you to becoming a head coach in a given sport, the road map would not resemble anything like the route Vanderbilt Head Women's Golf Coach Greg Allen took. In fact, Allen's route to where he is today is so far off the beaten trail not even the use of a compass, an atlas or a GPS could guide him down the path from where he started to where he is today.

Look at a U.S. map and you will see dots of varying sizes. The biggest dots represent cities such as New York or Chicago and the dots so small you may mistake them for a speck of dust represent towns such as Beechmont, Ky. (pop. 793), where traffic lights cease to exist. It is here, 47 miles northwest of Bowling Green, where Allen was raised. "It makes Mayberry look like New York City," said Allen. But it is not his humble, small town beginnings that tell all to his story.

Unlike coaches who cut their teeth playing their sport for most of their lives, Allen did not. Golf was not offered at Hughes-Kirk School, a K-12 school everyone in the town attends. Instead the only two options were baseball and basketball, which was just fine with Allen.

"My dream was to someday play basketball for the University of Kentucky," said Allen, who also played baseball growing up.

His introduction to the sport of golf came when he was 15 and he and his older friends would drive to a nine-hole course that looked more like an open pasture with flags sticking out of the ground every few hundred yards. "You hear people describe golf courses as a goat ranch and that truly was what this was," Allen said. "It was somebody's farm that they turned into a golf course."

Allen enjoyed the sport, but did not play it at a serious level. Basketball was still his passion, but as he grew older, he began to realize that his dream of one day playing basketball at Kentucky was just that, a dream.

Although he was not talented enough to play Division I basketball, he wanted to stay around the game, and hoped to do so at Murray State, where he enrolled in their communications program.

"I went to Murray State University because they had a really good communications department so then my dream went from playing for Kentucky to writing for *Sports Illustrated*," Allen said.

He wrote for the student newspaper and covered the Racers' men's basketball team, which was led by future NBA forward Popeye Jones. It was through his work with the student newspaper that led him to discover the sports information department at Murray State. He eventually moved from the student paper to the SID department as a student assistant. As a student SID, Allen covered a number of teams, writing recaps and feature stories, creating media guides, managing statistics and coordinating publicity efforts.

It was as a student SID that that Allen was first introduced to a communications internship with the American Junior Golf Association - the AJGA. In the summer of 1992, he interned with the AJGA and traveled throughout the Southeast from town to town putting on golf tournaments. He enjoyed the internship so much that he returned to the AJGA the next summer, but this time as an operations intern, working the western states in the U.S.

They were only internships at the time, but Allen's work with the AJGA would open doors for him into the golf world that he could not imagine at the time.

Soon after Allen graduated from Murray State in December of 1993, he was working full-time with the AJGA as a tournament director. At the time, coaching didn't seem all that realistic to him. However, his outlook on coaching began to change by 1996 when Chris Haack, who helped begin the AJGA and was the assistant executive director, received the men's golf head coaching job at Georgia. Haack has since won two national titles.

"The thing that I learned real early is that the AJGA is the place where all the college coaches go to recruit," Allen said. "It is kind of like the junior PGA or LPGA Tour. Coaches were at these tournaments all the time and I got to know them."

By being in contact with coaches, Allen became connected in the industry and it was only a matter of time before he started to receive overtures from head coaches looking for an assistant coach.

"I began to think that maybe I should look into coaching," Allen said. "I had a couple of opportunities in 1997 to go to Arizona as the men's assistant, to go to UNLV as the men's assistant, but it just didn't feel right."

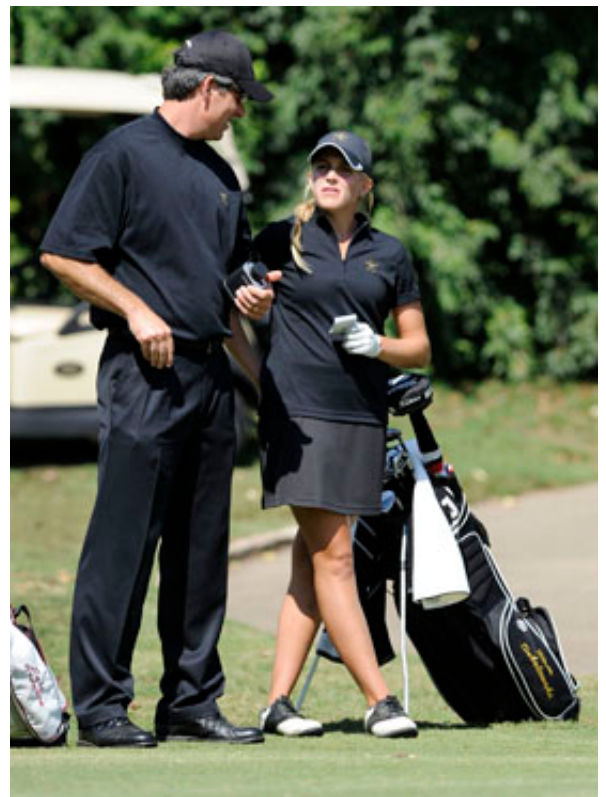
Finally, the right opportunity came along in the summer of 1998 when John Fields became the Head Men's Golf Coach at Texas and needed an assistant. The two had met through AJGA tournaments and struck up a friendship.

"I really felt like I would be with him for 3-5 years, felt like that was the time frame of an assistant in college golf," Allen said. "My dream was to get back to the University of Kentucky and be their golf coach. After one year, they hired a really good coach and he got their program up and going in the right direction, so there went that dream of being at Kentucky."

After two years as an assistant at Texas, Allen was approached to be the head women's golf coach at Arizona by former Athletic Director Jim Livengood. Allen was still very inexperienced in the coaching profession, but he took a chance on the opportunity.

"When he called to ask if I'd be interested in being his women's golf coach, I went out there and looked at it," Allen said, "and it was just too good of an opportunity to pass up, even though in the back of my mind maybe I didn't feel like I was quite ready to be a head coach. It was too good of an opportunity so my wife and I jumped at it."

Allen spent seven years at Arizona, and did not think he would ever leave. His teams won two Pac-10 titles and finished runner-up at



the 2002 NCAA Championships.

"We went out there and spent seven years and never dreamed of leaving," Allen said. "That was one of those jobs, you never see yourself leaving. It is a great place to raise a family, it is a great environment, it is a university that has a lot of good things going for it."

But in 2007, Vanderbilt called with an offer to be the Commodores' next head coach after Martha Richards had departed for Texas.

Richards and Allen served as assistant coaches together at Texas and she confirmed to Allen that Vanderbilt would be an excellent choice. "She told me how committed Vanderbilt was to athletics," Allen said. At the time, there was still trepidation surrounding Vanderbilt athletics, from a national level, following the restructuring in 2003.

Allen's fears were put to rest with Richards' assurance in addition to his interviews with then-Chancellor Gordon Gee, Vice Chancellor David Williams and Nick Zeppos, who was the provost at the time.

Beyond the positive vibes he received from his interviews and from what he saw in person, coming to Vanderbilt offered Allen and his family with a chance to come home so to speak.

"It was an opportunity to get close to family," Allen said. "At the time we had just found out that my wife was pregnant with our fourth child and all of our family is on this side of the Mississippi. We are two hours from where I grew up and four hours from where my wife grew up (Atlanta). So we jumped on it."

The rest as they say is history. Now in his fifth season, Allen has guided Vanderbilt to top 10 finishes in the NCAA Championships each of the last two seasons. The 2012 NCAA Championships will take place May 22-25 in Franklin, Tenn.

He and his wife have four children, each of which have been born in a different city. Finally, Allen feels like he and his family are settled. When he took the job at Vanderbilt in July 2007, his wife, Julie, was pregnant with their youngest child, Mabry Jane. For six months, she stayed back in Tucson, Ariz., to sell the home and watch the other three children.

"It was an extremely busy time for us," Allen said. "You talk about a wife who is a champion. She is a saint to do all that."

They finally sold their house on Dec. 3, and Allen returned to Tucson to help his family move to Nashville on Dec. 11. On Dec. 28, Mabry Jane was born. "I'm a huge believer that things happen for a reason," said Allen of the timing of events.

Allen has no idea where he would have ended up had he not started an internship with the AJGA or taken a chance on coaching. He now knows he made the right decision and that coaching is for him.

"The relationships are what I enjoy the most," Allen said. "I think the chance I have to develop the relationships with the players and to some extent with their families. I love to get to know them through the recruiting process."

"We now have a chance to build on the success that we have had the last couple of years and the foundation that Martha Richards built and the success she had."

For Allen, he believes the possibilities at Vanderbilt are endless.

"Phil Mickelson used to get a lot of grief for not being able to win a major. He would say, 'I'm not trying to win a major, I'm trying to win a lot of majors.'"

"That's what we are trying to do here. We aren't just trying to win a SEC Championship or a NCAA Title, we are trying to win a lot. We've got great players on our team this year. I feel like we have a lot of good things going and really have some momentum behind us."

The 4 Final

Who were your favorite athletes growing up?

When I was younger it was Kyle Macy and when I was older, it was Rex Chapman. He was from Owensboro and I never got a chance to play against him, but I watched him play in high school. I also loved Michael Jordan and Larry Bird so I will say they were my favorite athletes.

One golf tournament every golf fan should attend?

No doubt, it is the Masters. TV doesn't do that place justice for how beautiful it is and how severe the slope is on those greens. You really feel guilty walking on the grass because you are afraid you are going to mess it up. When I was with the AJGA, I went every

year because we received passes.

If someone were to visit Beechmont, Ky., where would you tell them to eat?

There is really only one restaurant in Beechmont. It has changed names so many times that I don't even know what it is called today. It used to be called, The Tigers' Den because we were the Hughes-Kirk Tigers and it was right across the street from our high school. In Beechmont that is the only option.

If you could pick three all-time golf greats to play in a foursome with you, who would they be?

Byron Nelson, Freddie Couples and Bobby Jones. I've had the privilege of meeting Byron Nelson and I'd love to play with him because I have heard he is just the true gentleman of the game. I've always been a big Freddie fan and still am. Bobby Jones is a golfing legend.
