## VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- The Commodores begin their 28th season, having amassed a 265-208-43 record. They finished 4-12-3 (1-9-1 SEC) in 2013.
- Coach Derek Greene enters his fourth season as head coach.
- Twenty-one lettermen return from last year, including nine starters.
- Senior Cherrelle Jarrett and juniors Erin Myers and Kelsey Tillman were the only three players to start all 19 games in 2013.
- Sophomore Simone Charley comes in as the team's top returning scorer after scoring five goals, in addition to dishing out five assists.
- Charley, whose cousin, Damien, played football for the Commodores, was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. The two-sport athlete also placed ninth in the triple jump at the NCAA Outdoor Track Championships in June, earning second-team All-American honors.
- In 2013, Vanderbilt scored 37 goals for its highest single-season scoring output since 2005. The Commodores also averaged 2.06 goals a game — their highest average in 13 years.
- Forty-three percent of that scoring returns in 2014, including four players who scored multiple goals.
- Goalkeeper Olivia Liebman returns after she made 65 saves in 15 games and 13 starts as a freshman after four-year veteran Alexa Levick tore her ACL just one game into the season.
- Vanderbilt's 30 players hail from 16 states (Alabama, California, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Maryland, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington).
- Two players were born in South America (Gena Inbusch, Brazil; Lina Granados, Colombia).

# VANDERBILT SOCCER

## COACH DEREK GREENE

A dynamic recruiter, excellent tactician and passionate leader, Derek Greene officially was named the head coach of the Vanderbilt women's soccer program after the 2011 season, which he spent as the interim head coach for five months.



A 18-year veteran of collegiate women's soccer, Greene's coaching career has been highlighted by success at a number of schools in the southeast. As an assistant and associated head coach at Ole Miss, Greene helped lead the Rebels to their first three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a second-round appearance in 2003. Greene helped guide Ole Miss to seven consecutive SEC Tournament berths — including an SEC Western Division title and second-place overall finish in 2005 — and recruited four Freshman All-America selections to Oxford.

Greene got his start in coaching nearly 20 years ago with the Knoxville Stars Soccer Club. He developed a team that went from third to second to first in the Tennessee youth soccer ranks over a period of three years, and guided that program to a Region III semifinal appearance. Five years of club experience led Greene to a position with the University of Tennessee's new varsity women's soccer program in 1996.

After serving on staff at his alma mater for a year, Greene was named the head coach at Division II Carson-Newman College. In 2000, he led the Eagles to their first South Atlantic Conference semifinal appearance with a victory over nationally ranked Wingate.

Greene made his way back to the SEC in 2002 and immediately made his mark on the recruiting trail. Among the recruits he helped bring to Ole Miss was 2005 Freshman of the Year Jennifer Hance, a four-time All-SEC honoree who went on to play professionally. Team success once again followed Greene. The Rebels would advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2003 and 2005 while posting the fourth-highest conference winning percentage from 2002 to 2008. Ole Miss also boasted a 15-game unbeaten streak in conference play spanning the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

After helping Belmont to its best finish in the A-Sun in 2009, Greene was brought to Vanderbilt as coach Ronnie Woodard's top assistant.

Just weeks before the 2011 season, Woodard retired and Greene was elevated to interim head coach. Under Greene's direction the Commodores won eight games, including victories over SEC foes LSU and Arkansas.

Shortly after the season ended, athletic director David Williams named Greene head coach — just the fifth coach in program history.

In 2013, Greene guided a Commodores bunch that scored 35 goals — the most in a season since 2005. They also averaged 2.06 goals a game for their highest average in 13 seasons.

Greene and wife Gail reside in Nashville with their two sons, Max and Miller.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Last year, Vanderbilt dominated its season opener against UAB, only to fall short. On Thursday, in an exhibition game to kick off 2014 on the first broadcast of SEC Network +, the Commodores once again outplayed the Blazers throughout this contest.

But, this time, Simone Charley made sure Vanderbilt would be on the winning end.

With 5:17 left, the sophomore drilled a shot from the top of the penalty box just inside the post to lift the Commodores to a 1-0 victory in front of a jubilant crowd at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex.

Vanderbilt, which just began preseason camp nine days ago, powered through a sluggish start to overwhelm UAB 24-3 in shots. Last year, the Commodores outshot UAB 19-6 but lost 3-1.

"We dominated that game," fourth-year coach Derek Greene said. "You outshoot somebody 24-3, you deserve to win. Last year, we didn't win a game like this. We would find a way to lose it. Our defense was rock solid - gave them nothing."

The Vanderbilt defense, anchored by back line Taylor Richardson, Cherrelle Jarrett, Claire Anderson and Kelsey Tillman and defending midfielders Erin Myers and Andie Lakin, never let the Blazer offense get off the ground.

Charley fired a game-high 10 shots, including five that were on goal. Lydia Simmons, a redshirt freshman, showed off her impressive footwork and dropped in five shots.

With the clock running out in regulation, the SEC All-Freshman selection dribbled through several defenders and worked her way into the penalty box. As she crossed inside the 18-foot yard mark she fired a shot with her left foot.

"It went by really fast," said Charley, who is the team's top returning scorer. "I got a really good ball from one of my teammates, dribbled a little bit, got my head up and tried to finish like we worked on all this preseason."

## EXPERIENCED GROUP

The Commodores bring a wealth of experience for a team full of freshmen and sophomores, which count for 16 of the squad's 30 players.

Twenty-one letterwinners return from 2013, including nine starters. The trio of forward/defender Kelsey Tillman, defender Cherrelle Jarrett and midfielder Erin Myers (a team captain) started all 19 games.

SEC All-Freshman forward Simone Charley started 16 of 17 games before suffering a MCL sprain. Forward/midfielder Sasha Gray started 18 of 19 games. Midfielders Jamie Kator and Andie Lakin each made 16 starts. Defender Taylor Richardson made 14 starts. As a freshman, Olivia Liebman started 13 games in goal after Alexa Levick suffered an ACL injury.

## SEC PLAYERS TO WATCH

Three Commodores were tabbed as SEC preseason players to watch — sophomores Simone Charley and Sasha Gray and redshirt freshman Lydia Simmons.

Charley, from Hoover, Ala., was an All-SEC Freshman selection in 2013 and returns as the team's top scorer after recording five goals along with dishing out five assists. Gray, a native of Nesconset, N.Y., had three goals and two assists. Simmons, a Londonderry, N.H., native, sat out 2013 as she recovered from a high school injury.

As a team, the Commodores were picked to finish 13th in the league by the SEC coaches. They finished ahead of Mississippi State, which VU defeated for its lone conference win of 2013.

## SIMONE SAYS

After a stellar first year in which she earned SEC All-Freshman honors, forward Simone Charley picked up where she left off in an exhibition victory over UAB.

Charley, a two-sport athlete and All-American in the triple jump, accounted for nearly half of the team's 24 shots. The Hoover, Ala., native fired off 10 shots, five on goal, and scored the game-winner with 5:17 left to unknit a scoreless tie.

Charley returns as the team's top scorer and points leader after scoring five goals, dishing out five assists and notching 15 points. She kept busy in the spring, too, by breaking the school record five times in the triple jump. She finished ninth at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships to earn second team All-American honors. At the USATF Junior Championship in June, she broke the school record again with a leap of 43-2.5 to finish third.

## FRESHMAN TRIO JUMPS INTO EXHIBITION

Freshman Christiana Ogunsami started in goal for the Commodores in a 1-0 victory in an exhibition game over UAB on Aug. 14. Ogunsami, an all-conference and all-regional goalkeeper at Cherry Hill West High School in New Jersey, had just three shots fired her way. The 5-foot-10 Ogunsami made one save in the shutout.

Along with Ogunsami, freshmen Colby Ciarrocca and Cristina De Zeeuw logged 50 and 58 minutes, respectively, against UAB. Both players came off the bench and impressed coach Derek Greene in their debuts. De Zeeuw, a three-time all-state midfielder from Overland Park, Kan., was ranked as 32nd among high school recruits in the IMG Academy 150. Ciarrocca, a high school All-American forward from Montgomery, N.J., was tabbed as the 82nd best player in the country.

## SEC NETWORK SPOTLIGHT

All nine of Vanderbilt's home games will be aired on either the new SEC Network or SEC Network +, the digital platform that broadcasts games online.

Friday's season opener against Mercer will be aired on SEC Network +. All season long, local radio personality Kevin Ingram will provide the call. Vanderbilt alum and former soccer standout Megan Forester will serve as the color analyst. The Hendersonville native played for the Commodores from 2006-09.

In addition, three regular-season games will be broadcast on the SEC Network, which is based out of Charlotte, N.C. Vanderbilt's SEC opener at Georgia on Sept. 21, home game against Texas A&M on Oct. 10 and regular-season finale at Florida on Oct. 30 will be aired on the SEC Network.

The Commodores were a part of the SEC Network's first day on Aug. 14. The network offered live look-ins of the exhibition game against UAB (which was broadcast in its entirety on SEC Network +). A festive crowd, which included the pep band, spirit squad and football team, added to the atmosphere as SEC Network reporter Jessica Mendoza dropped in to interview football coach Derek Mason, men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings and baseball coach Tim Corbin, who led the Commodores to a national championship in June.
