AT FIRST GLANCE

HOOVER BOUND

■ Thanks to a 7-5 victory over No. 13 Florida on the final day of the regular season, the Tennessee baseball team will make its first appearance in the postseason since 2007. The Volunteers are the 11-seed in the SEC Tournament and will face sixth-seeded Vanderbilt in the event's first game at 9:30 a.m. CT/10:30 a.m. ET.

■ Tuesday's matchup against the Commodores will be the fourth this season as the Vols won two of three games in Knoxville earlier this year. It is the 10th all-time showdown between the two squads in the SEC Tournament with UT holding a 6-3 record in the previous nine contests.

■ Tennessee's last postseason win was against Vanderbilt when the Big Orange opened the 2007 SEC Tournament with a 6-3 victory. James Adkins fired 8.1 innings of one-run ball on the mound while current Major Leaguers Yan Gomes and J.P. Arencibia each had a hit and an RBI for the Vols.

■ During Friday's quarterfinal matchups in Hoover, former Vol letterman and Tennessee Baseball Hall of Famer Phil Garner will be recognized as one of this year's SEC Baseball Legends.

VOLS LOOK FOR THIRD WIN VS. VANDY

■ Tennessee will be looking for its third win of the season against the Commodores having taken the series from them in Knoxville, April 4-6.

■ Vanderbilt ace Tyler Beede settled in after a shaky first inning in the Friday opener, allowing just five hits and four runs while striking out six over eight innings. VU closer Carson Fulmer picked up his ninth save of the season with a perfect ninth.

■ Tennessee got to Fulmer late in a marathon game Saturday. UT was down to its last strike with

the bases loaded and two outs in the ninth, when freshman Nathaniel Maggio delivered a walk-off single to left field to lift the Vols to a 10-9 win to even the series. Sophomore Derek Lance was 2-for-4 with four RBIs in the win.

■ UT carried that momentum into Sunday's rubber match, posting four runs through the first three innings en route to a 7-0 shutout. UT pitchers Kyle Serrano, Andy Cox and Andrew Lee combined for a two-hit shutout to lead the Vols to their first series win over Vandy since 2010. Christin Stewart and A.J. Simcox each had multi-hit games, with Stewart driving in three of the Vols' seven runs.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Media Credentials

Media credentials will be issued to members of the working media only. Children and other non-workers will not be allowed. Requests for credentials should be made by calling UT media relations representative Cameron Harris at least one day in advance of each home game or series. All credentials not picked up at the Media Relations Office will be left at the ticket will call window at the main entrance of the stadium.

Postgame Interviews

Tennessee head coach Dave Serrano is available to meet any working member of the media following the game in the video room at Lindsey Nelson Stadium. Media are asked to conduct player interviews in the video room, and media members are not permitted in the locker room or clubhouse area.

Interviews with visiting team members also may be done on the field, subject to the policy of the visiting team's media relations representative.

Photographers

Media credentials are required for all photographers and television media. All credentials not picked up at the Media Relations office will be left at the ticket will-call window at the main entrance of the stadium.

Photo decks are located atop the stairwells behind the first- and third-baselines. There are also field-level photo wells at the far end of each dugout. Both still and television photographers are welcome to shoot from these spots. Television crews are welcome to film from the mezzanine level underneath the press box.

Photographers *will not* be permitted in or between the dugouts.

The Press Box

The Lindsey Nelson Stadium press box is for working members of the media only. The press box is located atop the grandstand behind home plate and includes space for working members of the press, official and visiting scorers, public address announcer and scoreboard operator. Also located on the press level are two radio booths and a television/VIP booth. Admission to the press box is by credential only.

Press Box Services

Updated cumulative statistics, game notes and scorecards, along with team rosters, will be available in the press box at each home game. A final box score will be compiled and distributed at the completion of each game.

An official scorer is assigned to all home games, and Brian Bruce will keep the media informed of all scoring decisions, notable facts and records.

Internet

High-speed wireless Internet is available in the Lindsey Nelson Stadium press box, including both radio booths and the television booth. There also are a limited number of DSL connections available for use by the media in the press box (but not in the radio booths), and phone lines for dial-up access are available as well. DAVE SERRANO

HEAD COACH 12

Third Season at Tennessee
Overall Record: 366-222-1 (.623)
Cerritos College, 1985
Trinity College & University, 2003

Dave Serrano's first two seasons at Tennessee were met with a renewed sense of excitement and optimism and now, as he begins his third year as the UT head coach, the Vols look to build on the foundation that has been set and continue their trek to return to a spot among the nation's elite.

The Orange and White's first campaign under Serrano saw it record wins over half of the 2011 College World Series field, downing No. 16 Texas, No. 10 South Carolina, No. 4 Florida and Vanderbilt. The Vols also defeated No. 2 Kentucky, handing the Wildcats their first loss of the season, and No. 19 Georgia to give them victories over five different ranked teams in 2012.

Serrano's second season at Rocky Top featured one of the youngest teams in the nation with a NCAA-leading 18 true freshmen on the roster. The Vols posted a series victory over No. 13 Kentucky and wins over No. 14 Arkansas and perennial power No. 20 Arizona State.

Fans in Knoxville made Serrano's first two seasons an immediate success in the stands as the Big Orange fan base came out in droves to Lindsey Nelson Stadium. Over the course of the team's 33-game home schedule in 2012, 63,084 Volunteer faithful clicked the turnstiles, the second-highest total in school history. Right out of the gate in 2013 Tennessee set a school record for a home-opening weekend, as 5,508 fans were on hand for the three games against Arizona State. The Vols averaged 1,881 fans per home contest last season, marking the fourth-highest total in school history.

On the field under Serrano, Tennessee found quick success as well, needing just 30 games to reach 20 wins in 2012, its fastest path to that mark since going 20-8 to open the 2005 campaign which resulted in a trip to the College World Series.

The Vols roared out of the gates in their first season under Serrano, winning their first seven games to get off to the second-best start in school history. That 7-0 record also marked the best by any UT skipper to start his Tennessee managerial career, topping the previous record of 4-0 last attained over 100 years prior in 1911.

Serrano's energy and passion for the University of Tennessee, combined with his impeccable track record of success made him the choice to become the 24th head coach of the Volunteer baseball program following a nationwide search after the 2010 campaign. A former UT assistant, he was welcomed back to the Big Orange family on June 15, 2011.

A veteran of seven College World Series and one of just 11 coaches to lead two different programs to Omaha, Serrano is in his third season at Rocky Top and has a career record of 366-222-1 (.623) in 10 seasons as a Division I head coach. After leading UC Irvine to the 2007 CWS in his third year at the helm of the Anteaters, he moved on to Cal State Fullerton where he averaged 43.75 wins per season in his four campaigns with the Titans, including an appearance in Omaha in 2009.

Serrano, 49, has returned to the site of his first Division I job, as he served two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee from 1995-96, following seven years at Cerritos Junior College. His first taste of Omaha came as a Volunteer as he helped lead a Big Orange squad featuring all-time UT greats Todd Helton and R.A. Dickey to the College World Series for the first time in over four decades in 1995. During Serrano's first stint in Knoxville, Tennessee posted an impressive 97-36 (.729) record, including a school-record 54 wins in 1995.

Serrano holds a bachelor's degree from Trinity College and University (2003) and was born on June 28, 1964, in Torrance, Calif. He and his wife, Tracy, have three sons, Kyle, Zachary and Parker.

SERRANO LEADS TEAM USA IN 2012

Following his first season at Tennessee, Serrano was awarded the honor of serving as the head coach of the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team which he led to a 12-5 record and a bronze medal at Honkbal Week in the Netherlands.



After opening its training with 10 days in North Carolina where it played a selection of collegiate summer teams and participated in the second annual Prospect Classic with the USA Baseball 18U squad, Serrano then led the Collegiate National Team into uncharted territory as it became the first U.S. squad to travel to Cuba to take on its national team in 16 years.

Despite playing a veteran Cuban squad which featured 12 players who have competed in the World Baseball Classic and four who have done so twice, the Collegiate National Team proved its mettle by bookending the five-game series at Latin American Stadium in Havana with victories. That series would continue in the Netherlands where they split two more decisions as the U.S. went 5-2 during Honkbal Week to claim the bronze.

Notes on the Vols...

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME...

■ It hasn't taken long for fans in Knoxville to buy into Coach **Dave Serrano** and the Vols. In his first three seasons at Tennessee, the Vols have already set two of the top three single-season total attendance marks in school history.

■ This year, Tennessee averaged 1,985 fans through 31 home games (61,550), which ranks as the second-highest average - behind only the 1997 campaign - and third-highest total in school history.

■ UT's 2012 average attendance of 1,911 ranks third all-time and the team's total attendance of 63,084 marked just the third time it passed the 60,000 mark, joining the 1997 and 2007 campaigns.

■ In Serrano's first three years at Rocky Top, the Vols have already hosted 35 crowds of over 2,000 fans and four over 3,000. In the three years prior to his arrival, UT had just 18 crowds of 2,000+ at Lindsey Nelson Stadium and half as many that crossed the 3,000 threshold.

■ A season-high 3,306 witnessed the Vols' series-clinching win over in-state rival Vanderbilt on April 6, marking the largest crowd at Lindsey Nelson Stadium since 3,322 clicked the turnstiles against Florida on April 15, 2012.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR COX

■ Sophomore lefty **Andy Cox** has been dominant for the Vols this season, leading the team with 27 appearances, including 21 in relief. He is second in the SEC with just 47 hits allowed, of which just 11 (8 2B, 3 HR) have gone for extra bases.

■ The Arlington, Tenn. native is one of 50 players to be named to the mid-season watch list for the 10th annual NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, given to the nation's top relief pitcher.

■ He has also been named to the watch list for the 2014 Gregg Olson Award, presented by Toolshed Sports to college baseball's "Breakout Player of the Year." He is one of six SEC players on the list.

■ Cox's 2.44 ERA leads the team (min. 10 IP) and stands 14th in the conference.

■ The lefty is currently holding opposing hitters to a miniscule .178 batting average - good for second in the SEC behind LSU's Aaron Nola (.172) - and is allowing just 5.47 hits per nine innings, which stands seventh in the country and second in the SEC ranks behind Nola as well.

■ Cox has surrendered just 22 runs all season, which is tied for fifth in the SEC.

■ The sophomore made his first weekend start of the season at LSU on Saturday (April 26). Against Kentucky on May 3, Cox carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning, giving up just two singles and one run while striking out seven over 7 2/3 innings.

COMING OUT SWINGING

■ Tennessee has done the most damage early in games, outscoring its opponents 113-63 over the first three innings.

■ The Vols have scored over 37.2 percent (113-of-304) of their runs in the first three frames.

■ Tennessee has plated an impressive 82 combined runs in the second and third innings in 2014. The Vols are hitting .320 and .293 in the second and third frames, respectively in 2014.

■ Tennessee is 21-10 this season when scoring first and 12-7 when scoring in the first inning.

■ The Vols struck first in all three games in its series at LSU, as well as all three games against Kentucky and two of three at Mississippi State.

■ When scoring three runs or more, the Orange and White is an impressive 30-11 this season. UT is also 22-6 when out-hitting the opposition in 2014.

■ In total, Tennessee has outscored its opponents 304-237 this season. The Vols enter the series averaging 5.7 runs per game, which ranks 70th in the country and fourth in the SEC.

LAYING ONE DOWN

■ A staple of the UT approach, the Vols have dropped down 53 sacrifice bunts this season, which ranks third in the SEC and 46th in the nation.

■ **A.J. Simcox** leads the team and the conference with 15 sac bunts in 2014. That mark currently stands 10th in the nation.

■ Tennessee's single-season record for sac bunts is 16, set by Bryce Christensen during the Vols' 1995 College World Series run.

■ Just a sophomore, Simcox is also approaching the Vols' career sac bunts record. With 12 as a freshman and 15 this season with seven regular-season games to go, the Knoxville native's 27 sac bunts rank second all-time behind Zach Osborne's 28, set from 2009-12.

■ In addition, the Diamond Vols have executed 31 bunt singles and are hitting .525 (31-for-59) when squaring to bunt for a hit in 2014.

■ **Will Maddox** leads the team with 12 bunt singles on the season.

■ Speedster **Johnny Youngblood** is 6-for-11 on bunt-single attempts in his first season as a Vol. Youngblood successfully executed three bunt singles in game two against South Carolina (March 29).

■ **Scott Price** is also 4-for-5 with two sac bunts.

SWIPING BAGS

■ The Vols' 92 stolen bases this season lead the SEC and rank ninth in the nation. Tennessee has been thrown out just 28 times for a success rate of 76.7 percent.

■ 12 Vols have stolen at least one base in 2014.

■ Junior **Will Maddox** leads the team with 24 stolen bases. **Nick Senzel** follows with 13 and has been thrown out just three times. Maddox, who has been thrown out six times, led the Vols in stolen bases the past two seasons (22 in 2013, 14 in 2012).

■ Sophomore **A.J. Simcox** also has 13. **Taylor Smart** has eight, **Vincent Jackson** and **Christin Stewart** have seven each and junior college transfer **Johnny Youngblood** is 6-for-7.

■ Youngblood, a native of Lexington, Ky., is a two-time MLB Draftee (2011 & 2012) and one of the Vols' top pinch runners.

■ Opponents have only stolen 29 bases against the Volunteers in 2014, a mark that leads the SEC and is four fewer than any other league team. Sophomore catcher **David Houser** has caught 12-of-25 attempted base stealers, while junior **Tyler Schultz** has gunned out 8-of-24.

LEGGING IT OUT

■ Led by sophomore **Christin Stewart**, Tennessee leads the conference and ranks 44th in the nation with 16 triples through 53 games.

■ The Vols hit just 12 triples all of last season.

■ There must be something in the water in the Smoky Mountains because ETSU ranks second in the nation with 25 triples.

■ Seven Vols have hit at least one three-bagger in the 2014 campaign.

■ Stewart leads the Vols and the conference with six triples. He ranks 16th in the nation in the category. Stewart finished second on the team in triples as a freshman last season (2).

■ Stewart is the only Vol to start all 53 games this season. He's started all 53 in left field.

ON THE HILL

■ Tennessee, which finished the 2013 season with a team ERA of 5.37, currently sports a much improved mark of 3.43 on the mound this season.

■ The Vols' ERA ranks 72nd in the nation entering the week. The 3.43 mark is only good enough for 10th-best in the SEC.

■ The Vols stand 39th in the nation and sixth in the SEC with 7.99 hits allowed per nine innings.

■ Tennessee has 10 pitchers currently under a 4.00 ERA, with **Andy Cox** leading the way (2.44).

TENACIOUS D

■ The Vols currently sport a team fielding percentage of .971, which would rank as the fifth-best fielding mark in school history if it remains at that mark at the end of the year. The school record of .977 was set in 1994.

18 PLAYS MADE AT THE PLATE

■ Entering the weekend, the Vols have cut down 18 potential runs at the plate in 2014.

■ Behind great blocks by catchers **David Houser** and **Tyler Schultz**, the Vols stuffed two at the dish in the Purdue series, one vs. UNLV, two at Arizona State, two at Mizzou, one vs. Austin Peay, two against Auburn, one at Georgia, three vs. Auburn and one more against Kentucky, Mississippi State, Morehead State and Florida.

■ The Vols' two outs at the plate against Auburn both came in the seventh inning off perfectly-executed relays from the outfield.

HITTING THE CUTOFF MAN

■ The Volunteers currently rank tied for 15th in the nation and second in the SEC with 15 outfield assists this season. Only Alabama has more in the league with 17.

■ Senior right fielder **Scott Price** is tied for 17th in the country and third in the SEC with seven outfield assists, the third-highest amount by an outfielder in the nation.

MORE CLOSE GAMES

■ After going 6-11 in one-run games last season (the most one-run losses in school history), UT currently stands at 8-8 in one-run contests in 2014.

■ Tennessee has had 38 games decided by three runs or less this season. The Vols are 19-19 in those games. UT was 11-13 in games decided by three-runs or less in 2013.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

■ Two Tennessee pitchers are working their way up the program's all-time record lists this season.

■ Senior right-hander **Nick Williams** made his 78th career appearance against Florida last Saturday, moving him further past former Vols Sean Watston and R.A. Dickey (74) for sole possession of second in the all-time record books. The record for career appearances is 85, held by Craig Cobb (2004-07).

■ Sophomore southpaw **Drake Owenby's** five saves this season moved him onto Tennessee's top 10 all-time saves list with seven career saves.

■ The Powell, Tenn., native has not recorded a save since recording the game's final two outs in the Vols' 8-6 win over Auburn (March 23).

■ Owenby's five saves are good for eighth in the conference and 120th in the nation. He's finished 10 games for UT this season - tied for 12th-most in the SEC.

■ Tennessee great Todd Helton holds the program's save record with 23 from 1993-95.

NEARLY 70 PERCENT WINS AT HOME

■ Tennessee finished the 2014 regular season with a 22-10 (.688) record at home.

■ With an all-time record of 498-229 (.685), the Vols have won nearly 70 percent of their games at Lindsey Nelson Stadium. The ballpark opened in 1993 and has hosted five NCAA Regionals.

■ The Orange and White outscored its opponents 219-147 and hit .289 at home this season.
