**For Openers...**

> Missouri Basketball will look to remain unbeaten at home this season as the Tigers face Vanderbilt at 4 p.m. on ESPNU ... Missouri is one of three SEC teams to remain unbeaten at home this year, joining Florida and Ole Miss.

> The Tigers will look to continue their strong play at Mizzou Arena with Haith at the helm (26-1, .963) and since the 2008-09 season the Tigers are a dominant 77-4 (.951) and have never dropped more than two home games in a single season.

> Senior forward **Alex Oriakhi** is nearing the 1,000-point mark for his career, needing just 23 points to reach that milestone ... Oriakhi played three seasons at Connecticut and scored 789 points in 109 games for the Huskies ... The Lowell, Mass., native is enjoying a career year at Missouri, averaging a career high 10.4 points per game on a career best 58 percent shooting ... He also needs just 40 points and 13 rebounds to top his entire 2011-12 output at UConn.

> Senior forward **Laurence Bowers** is questionable for Saturday's game ... Bowers is nursing a sprained MCL in his right knee, but has made significant progress since sustaining the injury on Jan. 8.

> If Bowers is out of the lineup, Mizzou has just one player, **Phil Pressey**, who has played a complete season in a Missouri uniform ... Pressey is also the lone current Tiger ever to play a complete season with Head Coach **Frank Haith** ... If you break down the numbers, Missouri is getting 84.2 percent of its scoring and 92.7 percent of its rebounding from Tigers that did not play one season ago.

> Missouri is one of college basketball's winningest teams since 2008-09 ... The Tigers have 121 wins over the last five years, which is ninth among high major programs nationally.

> Missouri has been very good in league play under Haith and has won 17-of-23 conference games under the second year head coach ... The Tigers have won 13 of their last 16 league games dating back to Jan. 28, 2012.

> Missouri has been very good in the month of January over the last five seasons ... Since the 2008-09 campaign the Tigers are 28-11 in January, including three wins over nationally-ranked foes.

> Mizzou continues to be one of the country's better rebounding clubs, ranking No. 3 nationally with 42.8 boards per game ... Missouri's rebounding rate has slowed due to injuries to forwards Bowers and **Tony Criswell** ... That tandem has missed a combined seven games this year and when both players are in the lineup, Missouri has not been outrebounded this season.

> **Jabari Brown** has emerged as Mizzou's most consistent scorer in league play and has reached double figures in 8-of-9 contests since becoming eligible ... Brown is averaging 16.6 points and 3.8 rebounds in SEC competition thanks to his 40.0 percent shooting from three-point range ... Brown has already made 16 treys through five conference games and leads the league with 3.2 makes per game.

> **Phil Pressey** is quickly approaching the career assist record at Mizzou ... Pressey is averaging 9.0 assists per game over his last eight games and needs just 28 more assists to pass **Anthony Peeler** (497 - 1988-92) for No. 1 all-time ... Pressey leads the Southeastern Conference with 7.2 dimes per game and could lead his second league in assists for the second consecutive year ... Pressey led the Big 12 in assists in 2011-12 with 6.4 dimes per game.

### Mizzou Basketball Cliff Notes...

> Missouri caps a quick two game home stand on Saturday afternoon as the Tigers face Vanderbilt at 4 p.m. on ESPNU.

> Happy Birthday to **Earnest Ross** ... Ross will celebrate his 22nd birthday on Sunday.

> Missouri's final-six home games of the season are sold out ... Mizzou is averaging 10,746 fans at Mizzou Arena this year and at this point last season the Tigers were averaging 10,156 fans per home game ... Missouri's 2011-12 home attendance average of 11,830 is the facility record.

> The Tigers and Commodores are coming off a recent home-and-home series from the 2009-10 and 2010-11 seasons, which saw a series split ... The two games were decided by a combined nine points, including an 85-82 overtime win by the Tigers at Mizzou Arena on Dec. 8, 2010.

> **Marcus Denmon** scored all-21 of his points after halftime of that win, including a go-ahead steal and three-point play with just 5.8 seconds left in OT ... Vanderbilt had the ball holding for the final shot of overtime when Denmon stepped in front of a **Brad Tinsley** to **Jeff Taylor** pass and raced the length of the court for the game-winning hoop (and harm).

> Missouri is 7-5 all-time on Jan. 26 and the most recent game on this date was a 66-62 win at Colorado during the 2007-08 season ... The Tigers are also 4-0 at home on this date.

> Missouri is one of three remaining unbeaten at home in the Southeastern Conference ... The Tigers are 11-0 at Mizzou Arena and join Ole Miss (10-0) and Florida (8-0).

> The Tigers could regain the services of senior forward **Laurence Bowers**, but he remains questionable for Saturday ... Bowers is nursing a sprained MCL in his right knee, which was injured on Jan. 8 vs. Alabama, but has made great strides and is nearing a return.

> **Keion Bell** also missed the Jan. 22 contest vs. South Carolina and is currently listed as a game-time decision vs. Vanderbilt.

> With Bowers and Bell on the mend, Mizzou has enjoyed its full complement of players for just two game this season ... The Tigers won those two games vs. South Carolina State and No. 10 Illinois before injuries to **Tony Criswell** (vs. Illinois), Bowers (vs. Alabama) and Bell (at Florida) ... Criswell missed three games overall.

> With injuries and a near complete roster turnover, Missouri has used seven different starting lineups this year ... Haith used the same starting lineup throughout the 2011-12 campaign.

> Missouri got a game-high 21 points from **Earnest Ross** off the bench to earn a 71-65 win over South Carolina ... Ross made two critical plays in the final 70 seconds of the win, hitting a trey with the game tied 63-63 with just 1:10 remaining and then finding **Jabari Brown** for the game-clinching trey with just over 10 seconds left.

> Missouri opened the game 2-of-24 (.083) from three-point range before making their final three attempts.

> Mizzou has been very good in the second half of games all season and outscored South Carolina 44-30 in the second half on Tuesday ... The Tigers are averaging 41.2 points and are shooting 49 percent from the floor, 37 percent from three-point range and 78 percent from the foul line in the second half this year.

> The club boasts a +7.6 scoring margin (41.2-to-33.6) in this second half of those games as well.

> Head Coach **Frank Haith** is a very good 7-4 vs. Top 25 opponents as the head coach of Mizzou and is 4-3 vs. the Top 10.

> The Tigers will look to continue their impressive defensive trend ... Only four teams have scored more than 70 points on Missouri this year.

> At home, no team has topped 70 points vs. Missouri and opponents are averaging just 58.7 points on 35.9 percent shooting at Mizzou Arena.

> Missouri is currently ranked No. 51 nationally in field goal percentage defense (.394).

> Defensively, Missouri has held 13-of-18 opponents (Louisville, UCLA, Alabama, Georgia and Florida) below 42 percent shooting on the year.

> Missouri has been one of the country's top rebounding teams throughout the year and has out-rebounded 14-of-18 foes in 2012-13 ... Missouri enjoyed its largest rebounding margin of the year on Dec. 8 (+25) and has recorded a double-digit rebounding advantage in nine of 18 games.

> The Tigers also average 14.8 offensive rebounds per game (No. 13 nationally) and turn that into 14.3 second-chance points per contest.

> The Tigers are currently rebounding 43 percent of their missed shot attempts this year.

> Missouri has had six different players record double-figures in rebounds in a game this season, which is the most since six Tigers accomplished the feat during the 1995-96 campaign ... The school record for the number of players recording at least 10 rebounds in one game is seven, set during the 1959-60 season.

> In addition, Missouri already has a total of 14 point-rebound double-doubles between four different players



(Bowers, Oriakhi, Ross and Bell), bettering the nine team double-doubles for Mizzou in 2011-12.

> Although the Tigers have a number of familiar faces due to transfer years with the program, just one player, **Phil Pressey**, has played for Head Coach **Frank Haith** ... Missouri is getting 84.2 percent of its scoring and 92.7 percent of its rebounding from players that did not see action at Mizzou a season ago.

> Missouri has started to build its bench over the last month thanks to the play of **Keion Bell**, **Tony Criswell**, **Earnest Ross** and the addition of **Jabari Brown** ... Missouri is averaging 20.7 points per game from its bench on the year, including 22.3 points over the last 11 games.

> On the season Missouri has 14 double-figure scoring efforts off the bench (Ross - 5, Bell - 4, Criswell - 2, Brown, Jankovic and Webster-Chan - 1).

> Despite having so many newcomers, Mizzou has been balanced through 18 games with eight players averaging at least 19.9 minutes a contest ... Nine different Tigers have also reached double figures in scoring in a game this season and seven different Tigers have recorded at least 7+ boards in a game.

> Missouri has won 73 consecutive regular-season, non-conference home games since 2005-06 and since 2006-07 (66-0) the club's average margin of victory has been 26.7 points in those non-league home tilts.

> Missouri is 16-0 in home non-league games under **Frank Haith** and 15 of those 16 wins have been by double figures ... In fact Mizzou is 24-2 in regular season non-league games under Haith and have won 18 of those games by 10 or more points, including wins over Villanova (10), Notre Dame (29) and California (39) on neutral courts.

> Missouri has won at historic levels over the last five seasons and continues its search for a record-setting fifth consecutive 20-win campaign ... The Tigers have won 23+ games each of the last four seasons.

> MU also won 20+ in four consecutive years from 1988-92 and 1979-83.

> Missouri was college basketball's most efficient offensive club a year ago (according to KenPom.com) ... And how about this for an exciting SEC schedule, Kentucky was

ranked No. 2 and Florida was No. 3.

> Haith was of course named the National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press, taking the Tigers to their second 30-win season in school history and fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

> Mizzou got an early start to its 2012-13 campaign, playing five games in Europe from Aug. 8-18 ... However none of Missouri's current players saw action overseas, proving to be a great opportunity for the MU newcomers to get extended playing time.

> The Tigers played games in Amsterdam, Belgium and France.

> Missouri will be seen on TV like never before thanks to the move to the SEC ... The Tigers will have a school record 18 games appearing on national TV during the regular season.

> Mizzou also had four players ranked among the top players at their position by CBS Sports ... **Phil Pressey** headlined that list at No. 2 among point guards.

> In the front court **Alex Oriakhi** was ranked No. 35 and **Laurence Bowers** checked in at No. 38.

> Newcomer **Jabari Brown** was ranked among college hoop's top wing players, checking in at No. 48.

> **Fran Fraschilla** ranked **Phil Pressey** as the country's No. 5 most-important player.

> **Luke Winn** of Sports Illustrated also listed Pressey (No. 5) on his preseason Naismith Award watch list.

> Missouri's transfer class of **Keion Bell**, **Jabari Brown**, **Alex Oriakhi** and **Earnest Ross** is being considered as one of the best in basketball history by the Sporting News.

> Finalist for the Bob Cousy Award in 2012 and now 2013.

> Has been the most exciting play-maker in college basketball this season.

> First Tiger since **Malcolm Thomas** in 1983-84 to have three consecutive 10+ rebound games to open a season and the first Tiger to accomplish the feat (in three straight games) since **Ricardo Ratliffe** in 2010-11.

> Enjoyed his sixth double-double of the year in the win against South Carolina, tying a career high with 18 points, while adding 11 rebounds.

> Was perfect from the floor vs. the Gamecocks, hitting 4-of-4 FGs and 10-of-10 FTs.

> The 14 consecutive shot makes vs. South Carolina (four field goals, 10 free throws) are the most in college basketball in a game this year.

#### Name Tags Needed at Mizzou, Kentucky...

Missouri and Kentucky were two clubs picked atop the SEC standings (along with Florida), but both programs have the least amount of returning experience in college basketball from last season.

> Kentucky has no returning players that made a start last season and Missouri has just one, **Phil Pressey**.

> Two other SEC schools have just two players that made a start last year, Mississippi State and Vanderbilt ... Utah, Nebraska and Florida State join MSU and Vandy with just two returning players with starting experience in 2011-12.

### Mizzou's Wooden Award Top 25 Duo...

Missouri joins Duke and Kansas as the lone schools with a pair of representatives on the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 list.

> **Laurence Bowers** and **Phil Pressey** were selected by the Los Angeles Athletic Club on Jan. 10 following great starts to the 2012-13 campaign.

> Bowers is averaging career highs of 16.8 points and 6.9 rebounds, while Pressey ranks No. 8 nationally with 7.2 assists per game.

### Ross Responding...

**Ernest Ross** started the season's first nine games for Missouri, but found his niche coming off the bench in eight recent outings ... Averaging 25.8 minutes a game for **Frank Haith's** squad this season, Ross is averaging 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds off the pine this season, including 21 points and 10 rebounds in the Jan. 22 win over South Carolina.

> Ross scored 19 points in the SEC opener vs. Alabama off the bench and had 16-point efforts against South Carolina State and UCLA.

> Ross has been much more efficient on the offensive end off the bench as well, shooting 44 percent from beyond the three-point line, with 14 triples during those eight games.

### Not So Friendly Confines...

Missouri Basketball is an outstanding 131-22 at home since the opening of Mizzou Arena in 2004 and its winning percentage (.856) actually trumps the win percentage of Hearn Center (.848), which was the home to Tiger Basketball from 1972-2004.

> Missouri has enjoyed an 88-4 mark at home since 2008-09 (.956) and is a perfect 11-0 at home this year.

### New League Debuts...

Missouri is one of college basketball's winningest programs, but oddly enough the first year in a new league has not been kind to the Tigers ... Missouri is playing in its sixth conference and has enjoyed just one winning season in that first year in a new league, recording an 11-7 overall mark in 1928-29 as a member of the Big Six.

### Pressey Breaks School Record...

**Phil Pressey** broke the Missouri school record with 19 assists in a Dec. 28 contest at UCLA, blowing past the previous record of 13 dimes shared by **Melvin Booker** (1993 vs. Illinois) and **Steffhon Hannah** (2006 vs. Coppin State).

> In addition, the 19 assists tied the SEC record shared by LSU's **Kenny Higgs** (1976-77) and Tennessee's **Bill Hann** (1967-68).

> It was also the most assists by a Power 6 Conference player since **Mateen Cleaves** (Michigan State) went for 20 in 2000 and was the most in a Division I game since 2008.

> Pressey broke the Pauley Pavilion assist record, eclipsing the 15 dimes recorded by the Bruin's **Darrick Martin** in 1991 vs. Pitt.

> The last player in basketball (college or NBA) to have exactly 19 points and 19 assists in a game was **John Stockton** (Utah Jazz) in the 1990-91 season ... Other NBA players to go for 19-19 were **Tim Hardaway** (1989-90), **Sleepy Floyd** (1989-90) and **Magic Johnson** (1986-87).

### Missouri Balance Under Haith

**Frank Haith** knows how to get contributions from a number of players and for the second consecutive year the head coach has great balance in the scoring column with five players averaging double figures.

> And to add to it, four players are averaging career highs this season, as **Laurence Bowers** (16.8), **Jabari Brown** (14.4), **Phil Pressey** (11.9) and **Alex Oriakhi** (10.4) are scoring at a career rate ... A fifth Tiger averaging double figures is **Ernest Ross** (10.3), who is making his return to SEC play after starting his career at Auburn ... Ross is coming off a 21-point, 10-rebound effort in the win against South Carolina, his top scoring night as a Missouri Tiger.

### The Dish On Flip's Record Assist Pace

**Phil Pressey** has three point-assist double-doubles in his last eight games and tied the Mizzou Arena record with 13 assists and 11 points in the SEC opener against Alabama.

> Pressey already owns the school record with five career points-assist double-doubles and his three games with 10+ assists in one season follows his seven games with 10+ dimes a year ago ... The junior now has 11 career games with double-figures in assists.

> The Dallas native is also on pace to break his own single-season assist mark (223) ... He has 130 assists through 18 games compared to the 107 he had through 18 games last season.

***What Can Brown Do For Mizzou...***

That's a question many fans and national pundits have asked as sophomore **Jabari Brown** continues his debut season for Missouri.

> Brown has been a strong addition through nine games, reaching double figures eight times, including a career high 22 points on 5-of-7 three-point shooting in the SEC opener against Alabama.

> Earlier Brown scored 18 points against Illinois, 16 at Florida, 15 against Georgia and 14 points in his California homecoming at UCLA.

> Brown is currently second on the team in scoring at 14.4 points a game and is already tied for the team lead with 25 three-point makes, including five straight games with multiple three-point makes.

> He has also been strong on the glass grabbing 4.3 rebounds per contest.

***Mizzou Mashers In The Middle...***

Missouri is averaging 42.8 rebounds per game this season, the highest total at the school since the 1975-76 campaign (46.9) ... That's 37 years since Mizzou has been this solid on the boards and the club has enjoyed a 40.0+ rebounds per game average just seven times since the 1975-76 season.

> That strength is a stark contrast for Mizzou over the last few years as the club boasted a positive rebounding margin just once (2011-12) since 2005-06.

> In addition, Missouri's rebounding margin of 8.7 is No. 9 nationally and the Tigers rank among nationally leaders (No. 13) with 14.8 offensive rebounds per night.

***Winter To Remember For Bowers...***

**Laurence Bowers** has missed a few games with a sprained MCL in his right knee, but that doesn't stop the fact he is having a terrific senior season and, in particular, terrific months of December and January ... The Memphis native had led the Tigers to a 7-1 mark when in the lineup over the last two months, averaging 18.8 points and 7.3 rebounds.

> Bowers topped double figures in scoring in all-eight games, including three 20-point efforts and two double-doubles.

> Bowers scored a career high 26 points in a win over Southeast Missouri State on Dec. 4 and enjoyed a 23-point, 10-rebound double-double in the Bud Light Braggin' Rights win over Illinois.

> In the Dec. 17 win over South Carolina State, Bowers scored 11 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau for his career and he now needs just 10 more blocked shots to become the second player in program history with 1,000 points and 150 career blocked shots, joining only **Arthur Johnson** (1,759 points, 245 blocks).

***Early Rebounding Returns...***

Missouri's new-look Tigers have been outstanding on the glass this year, winning the rebounding advantage in 14-of-18 games.

> Missouri owned the rebounding advantage just 17 times all of last season, including just once vs. high major opposition (Notre Dame) in non-conference play ... Below is a look at the Mizzou rebounding break down through 18 games over the last five seasons.

> In addition, Missouri ranks No. 3 nationally with 42.8 rebounds per contest and the team boasts a +8.7 rebounding margin per game.

> The Tigers also rank No. 13 nationally with 14.8 offensive rebounds per game.

> The junior scored the game's final five points in the three-point win over VCU and scored 18 points, while dishing eight assists in the win against Stanford.

***Oriakhi Flourishing At Mizzou***

**Alex Oriakhi** won a national championship during his time at Connecticut, but the senior is playing some of the best basketball of his career at Missouri, averaging a career high 10.4 points to go with 8.4 rebounds through 18 games this season.

> Oriakhi's best year at UConn came as a sophomore when he averaged 9.6 points and 8.7 rebounds, but saw those numbers dip to 6.7 points and 4.8 boards last season prior to his transfer.

> The senior leads the team with six double-doubles, including a career high-tying 18 points and 11 rebounds in a win against South Carolina on Jan. 22.

***Mizzou Arena - Home Sweet Home...***

Mizzou is a perfect 73-0 in non-conference home games at Mizzou Arena since the end of the 2005-06 campaign ... > **Laurence Bowers** played three seasons at Mizzou before sitting out last year and the only other Tiger ever to suit up for Mizzou is **Phil Pressey**, who enters his junior season ... Overall Missouri's five seasons of play (at Mizzou) is the fewest in the conference.

The tandem of **Keion Bell** and **Earnest Ross** saw their first action in well over a year on Nov. 10 when they earned starts in the opener against SIUE on ... Both players sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules and halted streaks of 600+ days since their last regular-season game action.

### Taller Tigers Battle New Challenge...

Missouri fans will immediately notice the improved height and depth on this year's roster, but did you know the 2012-13 Tigers are the tallest at the school since 1995-96? ... That's right, not since the days of **Slim and Slam** (Simeon and Sammie Haley) have the Tigers had this many players standing at least 6-foot-9 ... Overall Missouri has five players standing 6-foot-9 *plus* this season, the most at the school since the Tigers had six 17 seasons ago.

> Here is a quick rundown of the tallest teams at Mizzou since the 1995-96 campaign:

In addition, Missouri has two players taller than 6-foot-10 on the roster... The last time that occurred was 1998-99 with 6-foot-11 post players **Monte Hardge** and **Pat Schumacher**.

### Pressey Named First Team All-American...

CBS Sports named Missouri Basketball junior **Phil Pressey** a Preseason First Team All-American ... A finalist for the 2012 **Bob Cousy** Award, Pressey helped lead Mizzou to a 30-5 record last season and shattered the school mark with 223 assists over 35 games.

> Pressey was one of college basketball's busiest players over the summer participating in the **LeBron James**, **Chris Paul** and **Deron Williams** elite camps.

> As a sophomore he was a First Team All-Big 12 pick by CBS Sports and averaged career highs in scoring (10.3), rebounding (3.3), assists (6.4) and steals (2.1).

### Pressey Nearing School Record Totals...

Few players in Missouri history have made a bigger impact at the point guard position than **Anthony Peeler**, but two of Peeler's all-time records are within the sights of junior point guard **Phil Pressey** ... Peeler, who played from 1988-92, holds the school record for both assists (497) and steals (196) ... Pressey could break both of those records in just his third season, needing 158 dimes and 62 thefts in 2012-13.

> So far this season Pressey has recorded 130 assists and 32 steals and needs just 28 more dimes and 30 thefts the rest of the way to break those records.

> Included in his strong junior season was a school and SEC record 19 assists at UCLA on Dec. 28.

> He also tied the Mizzou Arena record with 13 assists in a win over Alabama in the SEC opener.

### Transfers Have Been Good To Mizzou...

Missouri fans know the value of quality four-year transfers and have enjoyed a number of great memories courtesy of some key "short-timers" over the last 15 years ... Below is a quick list of players that have finished their careers at Missouri over recent years and made big impacts in Black & Gold:

#### Zaire Taylor, 2008-10 (Delaware)

"Mr. Big Shot" hit game winners vs. Kansas, at Texas, Kansas State and at Iowa State over his two seasons at Mizzou.

#### DeMarre Carroll, 2007-09 (Vanderbilt)

Mizzou's Junkyard Dog ... First Team All-Big 12, First Round NBA Draft Pick.

#### Jason Conley, 2003-05 (VMI)

Helped the Tigers to back-to-back postseason appearances.

#### Albert White, 1997-99 (Michigan)

Led Mizzou in scoring (16.3) and helped the club to the 1999 NCAA tournament.

### Bowers Back...

Senior forward **Laurence Bowers** made a spectacular return on Nov. 10, scoring 20 points on 9-of-14 shooting to lead Missouri to an 83-69 win over SIUE in the 2012-13 season-opener.

> Bowers has been strong throughout the 2012-13 campaign, leading the club in scoring (16.8) and ranking second in rebounding (6.9), both career highs.

> Bowers is second on the team with four double-doubles (vs. Stanford, VCU, Tennessee State and Illinois) and is working his way back after suffering a sprained MCL in his right knee during a win against Alabama.

> Over his last nine games played (missed Ole Miss, Georgia and Florida games) Bowers averaged 18.2 points while shooting 58 percent from the floor and 53 percent from three-point range.

> Bowers missed the entire 2011-12 season with a knee injury, but traveled with the club during his redshirt year due to his leadership on the bench.

> For his career, Bowers has 140 career blocked shots and needs just 10 more to move into second in school history ... **Arthur Johnson** owns the school mark with 245 career swats.

> Bowers also has 1,073 career points, topping the 1,000-point plateau in the Dec. 17 win against South Carolina State.

### Missouri Among Rare Company For Wins...

Missouri Basketball is one of just 12 teams in college hoops with multiple 30-win seasons over the last four years ... The Tigers of course won 30 games a year ago en route to a Big 12 title, but also won a school record

31 games in 2008-09 ... That feat puts the Tigers in rare company along with: BYU, Connecticut, Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisville, Murray State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Syracuse and Utah State as the only schools to enjoy multiple 30-win seasons since 2008-09.

### Transfer Of Opportunity...

Missouri has just two players on its 2012-13 roster with a season of experience in a Mizzou uniform ... Coming into the year only **Laurence Bowers** and **Phil Pressey** had ever donned the Black & Gold and will be relied upon to assist a number of new faces for their first campaign as Tigers ... Of Missouri's 14 players, 11 will be eligible for their first season of play at Mizzou and a 12th, **Jordan Clarkson**, will sit out the year after transferring from Tulsa.

> However it's not like that group of newcomers is inexperienced ... Five of those 11 have played at the Division I level ... **Keion Bell** is a 1,400-point scorer from his days at Pepperdine and now at Mizzou, **Tony Criswell** played at UAB, **Alex Oriakhi** won a NCAA crown at Connecticut (2011) and **Earnest Ross** was Auburn's leading scorer in 2011.

### The Replacements...

No team has more transfer firepower entering its program this season than Missouri ... And that's great, because it's not likely another team lost more critical players off its club from last season than the Tigers ... Missouri welcomes four highly thought of four-year transfer players into the fold this year as **Keion Bell**, **Jabari Brown**, **Alex Oriakhi** and **Earnest Ross** become eligible after the departure of senior standouts **Marcus Denmon**, **Kim English**, **Steve Moore**, **Matt Pressey** and **Ricardo Ratliffe**.

> Overall that group of seniors accounted for 1,979 points (70 percent), 942 rebounds (84 percent) and 4,967 minutes of play (71 percent) and Denmon, English, Pressey and Ratliffe started all 35 games.

> However Missouri was strategic of its recruitment of transfers and welcomes in Bell who scored 1,365 points in three seasons of Pepperdine, Oriakhi who helped lead UConn to a national title in 2011, Ross who was Auburn's leading scorer and rebounder in 2011 and former Jordan Brand All-American Brown ... Combined (Brown has only played two career games) that group averaged 44.8 points and 17.6 rebounds per game during their most recent season of college basketball, so the Tigers have some important pieces entering in 2012-13.

### Thank You Seniors...

Missouri graduated the winningest senior class in school history last year as the collection of **Marcus Denmon**, **Kim English**, **Steve Moore** and **Jarrett Sutton**, not to mention **Laurence Bowers**, who returns in 2012-13, and junior college transfers **Matt Pressey** and **Ricardo Ratliffe** combined to help the school win 107 games since 2008-09 ... The Tigers twice won 30 games in that four year stretch and helped the program to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, tying a school record.

> Another fact that shouldn't be lost is that six of those seven seniors have already graduated and a seventh is just a handful of hours away and is competing professionally.

### Masters Of Mizzou...

Missouri is no stranger to having graduates finish up their final season of eligibility on the basketball court ... Last season **Jarrett Sutton** worked towards his graduate degree while playing his final season on the hardwood and in 2010 **Zaire Taylor** walked across the stage in December only to have a final semester

of eligibility remaining ... In 2009 **DeMarre Carroll** worked towards his graduate degree while helping the Tigers to a school record 31 wins ... This season **Laurence Bowers** will work towards his Masters while also finishing up on the hardwood ... Bowers missed last season due to a knee injury, but that didn't stop the now fifth-year senior from taking care of business in the classroom ... Bowers finished with a grade-point average above a 3.0 and is working towards his Masters in Public Administration.

### Five In A Row?...

Missouri is looking for a school record-tying fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament this season ... The Tigers have qualified for every Big Dance since 2009, a streak that began when **Laurence Bowers** entered as a freshman.

> Mizzou last made five consecutive NCAA Tournaments in 1990 and made its fourth consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament in 1993, 1995 and 2003, before accomplishing the feat of four consecutive once again in 2012.

### Hoops In August...

"Look Kids... there's Big Ben, there's Parliament" ... No, Holiday Road was not the soundtrack of Missouri's European trip this summer, but the Tigers did get some valuable experience playing with 10 new performers during the five games overseas ... Despite having so many new faces Mizzou once again showed great balance during its tour of The Netherlands, Belgium and France, having five players in double figures and eight players average 10.5 minutes or more of playing time.

> Departed senior Mike Dixon led the Tigers in scoring at 16.5 points per game, but newcomers **Keion Bell** (12.0), **Earnest Ross** (11.8), **Alex Oriakhi** (11.3) and **Jabari Brown** (10.0) were just behind the senior all-league candidate.

> Mizzou also dominated the glass vs. their European counterparts, owning a 46.2-to-30.0 rebounding advantage ... Ross (9.3) and Oriakhi (8.3) lead the way and freshman **Ryan Rosburg** added 11 points and 10 boards vs. The Netherlands National B Team.

### That's A Winner...

Missouri Basketball is one of college basketball's winningest programs over the last five seasons with its 121 wins since the 2008-09 campaign ranking ninth amongst high major programs ... Missouri has twice won 30 games over the last four years, including 30 wins and a Big 12 title in 2011-12, its final year in the Big 12 Conference.

> Overall Missouri's 121 wins ranks 17th in college hoops and is second amongst current members of the Southeastern Conference (Kentucky with 136 wins).

# NOTING MIZZOU HEAD COACH FRANK HAITH

In his inaugural season with the University of Missouri basketball program, Frank Haith led his program to new heights. Not only did the 26-year coaching veteran bring in regional ties, a family atmosphere and impeccable academic success, he helped the Tiger program step back into the national spotlight.

Despite having a roster which featured just seven scholarship players, Haith and his staff guided the Tigers to a 30-5 overall record in 2011-12, marking just the second 30-win season in MU history. Mizzou, picked fourth in the Big 12 Conference pre-season coaches' poll, won a school-record 14 league games, and finished second in the conference standings with a 14-4 mark. The Tigers won the school's second Big 12 Tournament Championship with a 3-0 run in Kansas City, before advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

With his record-setting first season in the books, Haith received recognition in the form of numerous coaching accolades. After earning the Big 12 Coach of the Year title, Haith was named U.S. Basketball Writers Association District VI Coach of the Year. As a first-year coach, Haith guided his team to more regular season wins than any other Mizzou coach before him and became the first Tiger head coach since 1920-21 to win his first 14 games.

The honors continued to roll in for Haith as he was given the prestigious Henry Iba Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the National Coach of the Year by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association. He was also named the Associated Press College Basketball Coach of the Year, becoming just the third head coach at Missouri to win national Coach of the Year honors. Haith was officially welcomed to the Missouri family on April 5, 2011, and immediately appreciated the Tiger's passionate fan base. The Burlington, N.C., native came from the University of Miami where he was not only forced to instill a winning mentality to his players and supporters, but do it at a university void of any lengthy basketball tradition.

"Being the head coach at the University of Missouri is such an honor and it's something that has become more and more meaningful during our time here," Haith said. "Obviously the passionate fanbase is what grabbed my attention first, but the support of the administration, the support of our community and the support of our students is second to none.

"We have the complete package here and that's what sets us apart in college basketball. We have incredible facilities, we have a national brand when we go out on the road and Missouri has shown, time and time again, it supports its teams with vigor, but also in a first-class manner."

Haith's task in South Beach was monumental. In addition to resurrecting a hoops program that was restarted just two decades prior, he ushered the Hurricanes into the tradition-rich Atlantic Coast Conference where many didn't expect his program to win a single league game. Those critics were wrong.

In his first of seven seasons as the head coach, Haith guided the 'Canes to seven ACC victories (despite being picked last) and qualified for postseason play. He was recognized by being named a Naismith National Coach of the Year finalist and NABC District 6 Coach of the Year.

Miami returned to postseason play the following year. The Hurricanes won 18 more games and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT, recording the program's first postseason wins since 2000. Postseason success was a theme under Haith. His teams won six total games in the NCAA and National Invitation tournaments, including a memorable run to the second round of the Big Dance in 2008. The 'Canes went 23-11 in Haith's fourth season, just one win shy of the school record and he was named a finalist for

ACC Coach of the Year and the Skip Prosser Man of the Year honors.

And it's not just on the hardwood where Haith has fueled incredible growth amongst his players. During his time at both Missouri and Miami his players were visible in the community and Haith has seen an incredible 28-of-30 seniors to play for him walked across the stage to receive a diploma.

"That's my proudest moment," Haith said. "To know we churn out young men, ready to make positive contributions in the community, ready to be great fathers and husbands. That's what coaching at the college level is all about."

It's not an accident Frank Haith was hired as the 17th basketball coach at Mizzou. The grind from student-assistant at Elon College to being named the National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com doesn't just happen without a dedication to family, career and your student-athletes.

Haith paid his own way through Elon and graduated in 1988. He helped the Fighting Christians twice win 20 games and earned the opportunity to cut his teeth at perennial power Wake Forest the following year as a graduate assistant. His first full-time coaching position at Division I came at UNC-Wilmington from 1990-92 and he laid the foundation for his job at Missouri with a three-year stop at Texas A&M from 1992-95, which included helping the Aggies reach postseason play in 1994.

A remarkable 21-win campaign during his one season at Penn State (1995-96) allowed the Nittany Lions to reach the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 31 years, and he returned to Texas A&M and the Big 12 Conference for one season as the Aggies' Associate Head Coach in 1996-97 before returning to Wake Forest from 1997-98. The Demon Deacons reached postseason play each of his four years in Winston-Salem, including winning the NIT Championship in 2000 and reaching NCAA Tournament play in 2001.

Haith parlayed that success at Wake Forest into an opportunity at the University of Texas. Coaching alongside friend and mentor Rick Barnes, Haith was a part of (at the time) the winningest three-year stretch in Texas Basketball history. The Longhorns averaged better than 24 wins per season and never failed to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns advanced to the Final Four in 2003 and Haith worked magic on the recruiting trail, ushering four McDonald's All-Americans to Austin, including Brad Buckman (2002), LaMarcus Aldridge (2004), Daniel Gibson (2004) and Michael Williams (2004). Aldridge and Gibson are now mainstays in the NBA, with Aldridge being drafted No. 2 overall to the Chicago Bulls. The Class was rated No. 2 nationally by Rivals.com and Haith was the nation's hottest young coach. So began the daunting reclamation project at Miami, which concluded with an average of 21 wins over his last three years, national rankings in three of his final four campaigns and three of the school's six (all-time) 20-win ledgers.

One of 10 siblings, family will always be first for Frank Haith, and his student-athletes are part of that family. A proud father and husband, Frank and his wife Pam are the parents of two children, Corey and Brianna and his son is walking onto the Mizzou program this year.

Frank and Pam met in high school, began dating a short time after and have been together for 28 years. The Haith family is an active participant in its home communities and spearheaded fundraising and renovation efforts for Morningside Park in Elon, N.C., in the neighborhood in which Haith grew up. In Columbia, the family is actively involved with the Boys & Girls Club of the Columbia Area.

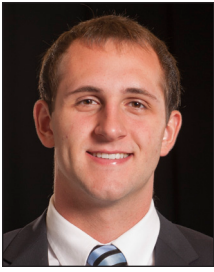
