VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- For the second straight week, the Commodores will play a top 10 opponent. After falling just short to No. 5 Texas A&M last week, Vanderbilt hosts No. 9 Florida. VU last defeated a ranked opponent on Sept. 6, 2013 when it knocked off No. 23 Wisconsin 4-3.
- The Commodores are 4-1-1 in their last six games, with their lone loss to No. 5 Texas A&M on the road on Sept. 18.
- Coach Darren Ambrose enters his first season as head coach after spending the previous 15 at Penn, where he won 148 games and was the program's all-time winningest coach. Ambrose picked up his 150th career victory with a 1-0 win over familiar Ivy League foe Dartmouth on Sept. 4.
- Junior All-SEC forward Simone Charley enters as the team's top returning scorer. The three-time All-American in the triple jump is the team's active leader in career goals with 17, including a team-high three this season.
- SEC All-Freshman Lydia Simmons returns after dishing out three assists. The redshirt sophomore already has three goals (the first three of her career) and an assist for a team-high seven points.
- In June, redshirt junior Lina Granados represented Colombia in the Women's World Cup in Canada, making the 23-player roster.

VANDERBILT SOCCER

COACH DARREN AMBROSE

Darren Ambrose enters his first season at Vanderbilt after a successful run at the University of Pennsylvania.

Ambrose spent the last 15 years as the head coach at Penn, and was the program's all-time winningest coach. He is the sixth head coach in the history of the program.



In 15 years at Penn, Ambrose compiled an impressive record of 148-71-35, including a 54-34-17 mark in the Ivy League. His teams reached the NCAA Tournament three times and won three Ivy League championships. His teams finished in the top three of the Ivy League in 10 of his 15 seasons, including seven of the past eight years.

Ambrose never had a losing season at Penn as the Quakers averaged nearly 10 wins a year under his watch. He coached the team's first two All-Americans as well as its first NSCAA Scholar All-America, CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year, Ivy League Player of the Year, Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year and Ivy League Rookies of the Year. In addition, Ambrose was at the helm for all of Penn's Ivy League championships (2001, 2007, 2010), three of its four NCAA Championship berths (2001, 2007, 2010), and an ECAC title in 2000.

Under Ambrose, more than 80 percent of the Penn women's soccer players have graduated with GPAs above 3.0, and Penn is the only Ivy League program to have earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award each of the last 14 years.

Prior to Penn, Ambrose served as an assistant coach at Florida State, Rhodes College (in Memphis) and Connecticut. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in management accounting from USC-Spartanburg, where he played goalie and was the Division II National Player of the Year in 1992-93. He received his master's degree in sports administration from Memphis in 1995.

Ambrose, who was born in Sheffield, England, lives with his wife, Sherry, and their two daughters, Madison and Ainsley.

GLIMPSE OF THE 'DORES

Vanderbilt, in its 29th women's soccer season, returns 15 letterwinners and eight starters from a team that went 7-10-2 overall and 2-7-2 in SEC play. Among those returning are All-SEC junior forward Simone Charley, who led the team with nine goals last year, and midfielder Lydia Simmons, who was named SEC All-Freshman. Goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami also returns after starting all 19 games as a freshman and leading the SEC with 113 saves.

In addition to Ogunsami, senior captain Erin Myers, senior Kelsey Tillman and junior Claire Anderson started all 19 games in 2014. Myers, a midfielder/defender, has started all 58 games of her career.

The Commodores return 56 percent of last year's goal scorers. Both goalkeepers are back, as Ogunsami and senior Shannon Morrish combined for six shutouts.

The squad welcomes eight newcomers. Six freshmen arrive, plus a pair of transfers from the ACC — defender Danae O'Halloran from North Carolina and midfielder Kacy Scarpa, who played for national champ Florida State.

WEEKLY REPORT

Vanderbilt split a split weekend, falling on the road to No. 5 Texas A&M with a 1-0 loss on Friday before coming home for a Sunday tilt against Evansville and picking up a 2-1 win.

Against Texas A&M, the Commodores out-shot the Aggies 12-9 and won the corner kick battle 8-2 in addition to controlling possession for most of the first half. But A&M scored in the 70th minute as VU narrowly missed pulling off the upset.

On Sunday against Evansville, Vanderbilt rallied from a one-goal deficit to win its final non-conference game. The Commodores surrendered a goal in the seventh minute, but responded with two goals. Redshirt senior Taylor Elliott scored her first goal of the season and tied the game in the 38th minute off an assist from Simone Charley.

In the 70th minute, fellow senior Jamie Kator scored her first goal of the season. She knocked in a deflection off a shot by Lina Granados to push the d'Dores in front. Senior Shannon Morrish made her first start in goal since 2013. Christiana Ogunsami took over after halftime and made five saves.

After starting 1-3, Vanderbilt is 4-1-1 in its last six games. The only loss in that stretch was to the fifth-ranked Aggies.

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

The Commodores host No. 9 Florida on Friday and in-state rival Tennessee on Sunday in a game that will be aired nationally on SEC Network.

Florida is 23-2-1 all-time against the Com-

modores, having won the last nine games in the series. The Gators (7-2, 1-1 SEC) finished second in the SEC last year and were picked to win the league this year. They defeated then-No. 1 and defending national champ Florida State in non-conference play. Since losing to No. 4 Texas A&M two weeks ago, Florida has won three straight by outscoring its opponents 14-2.

The Gators are led by junior Savannah Jordan, who is tied for second in the country with 10 goals. Florida averages three goals a game for eighth most in the nation.

Tennessee enters with a 5-1-3 mark and 1-1 record in league play after suffering its first loss of the season on Sunday to No. 14 Auburn. The Vols had won five in a row before the loss and hadn't allowed a goal before the Tigers scored three.

UT ranks ninth in the country with a .414 goals against average as Julie Eckel has posted six shutouts and made 35 saves. Offensively, Anna McClung leads the Vols with nine goals. Vanderbilt won last year's meeting 2-0 in Knoxville and leads the series 10-9-3.

SIM CITY

Simone Charley enters the second half of what has so far been a superb two-sport college career. The 5-foot-8 junior forward from Hoover, Ala., leads active VU players with 16 career goals, including a team-high nine last year.



She accounted for seven of the team's nine goals in league play and scored six goals in her last six games. She was named First Team All-SEC and All-South Region Second Team last year. She has scored a team-high three goals this season, including game-winners against Gonzaga and Mississippi State.

Charley also is a standout on the track as a three-time All-American. She placed fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and then reached the podium at the NCAA Outdoor Championships with a third-place finish in June. In the process, she leapt 44-3.25, breaking her own school record.

SIMMONS EMERGES AS SCORING THREAT

Midfielder Lydia Simmons earned SEC All-Freshman honors last year for her work as a field general and as the team's top distributor with three assists. But this year she has also emerged as a scoring threat.

Simmons has scored the first three goals of her career in the last four games and is tied with Simone Charley with a team-high seven points. All three have come from at least 18 yards out.

The redshirt sophomore from Londonderry, N.H., booted her first career goal in a 1-0

victory against Dartmouth on Sept. 4. She followed up the next weekend with another goal from just outside the box in a 2-1 victory over Mississippi State. On Sunday, she tied Simone Charley for the team lead with her third goal of the season as she hooked in a corner kick in a 1-1 tie against High Point.

TASTING THE WORLD CUP

Redshirt junior Lina Granados made the 23-player roster for Colombia at the Women's World Cup in June in Canada and traveled with the team during its four games. Colombia advanced out of pool play for the first time and fell to the United States, the eventual champ.



Granados hails from Ashburn, Va., but has dual citizenship as she was born in Bogota, Colombia. She has played for the Colombia Football Federation since she was 15, and has played in international tournaments three times. She has made her first five career starts in the last five games.

MORRISH BEGINS NURSING SCHOOL

Senior goalkeeper Shannon Morrish will be juggling not only soccer and her final year of undergraduate studies this fall but also nursing school. Morrish, a native of Bradenton, Fla., entered Vanderbilt University's School of Nursing on Aug. 17. She is pursuing a master's degree in adult/gerontology acute care. She'll be a registered nurse after the first year and complete the requirements to be certified as a nurse practitioner by May 2017.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Vanderbilt Soccer/Lacrosse Complex has been a welcome sight for the Commodores so far this year.

VU is 4-1-1 at home this season. After dropping the season opener to Miami-Ohio, the 'Dores have won four of their last five and notched a tie. With five home games left, Vanderbilt already has as many home wins as it did all of last year.

DEUCES WILD

Two has been the magic number for the Commodores this season.

VU is 4-0 when it scores two or more goals this year. On the flip side, the Commodores are 1-4-1 when they score less than two goals.

NEW FACES MAKE DEBUTS

Transfers Danae O'Halloran (North Carolina) and Kacy Scarpa (Florida State) have started all eight games. In addition, transfer Carley Bogan (William & Mary) and freshmen Kelsey Carrier, Maggie Clemmons, Megan Henry and Hannah Menard have made their VU debuts.

Miami-Ohio scored in the 80th minute to hand Vanderbilt a 1-0 loss on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. The Commodores outshot the Redhawks 22-8, with 13 shots on goal, but none found the back of the net.

Haley Walter scored the lone goal in with 10 minutes left in the game on an assist from Courtney Evans. Walter nudged a shot off the feet of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, who tried to cut down Walter's angle, and the ball bounced up into the goal.

It was a tough loss for Vanderbilt (0-1) and Ambrose, who was coaching his first game as Commodores head coach after spending the previous 15 years at Penn. VU outshot Miami 16-4 in the first half and a couple of solid looks that were snuffed out.

Simone Charley, who led the team with 12 shots and seven on goal, nearly put the Commodores in front in the 19th minute. On a breakaway, Charley aimed a shot toward the right corner. But Miami goalkeeper Vic Maniaci got enough of her mitt on the ball that it deflected off the near post. It was one of Maniaci's 11 saves.

Twice Vanderbilt had empty nets in the first half, but Miami defenders knocked the ball away. Off a corner kick, Charley headed the ball toward the goal. Vanderbilt defender got a foot on it and steered it toward the net but Redhawks defender was right there on the goal line to keep the shot from going in. Lina Granados also had a chance as she beat Maniaci to her left just inside the five yard-mark, but the ball was cleared by a defender at the goal line.

Later in the half, redshirt sophomore Lydia Simmons fired in a free kick from 25 yards out that Pavlika had to jump and swat away. Vanderbilt's lone shot attempt in the second half by Simone Charley's was immediately blocked.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Fittingly, Vanderbilt head coach Darren Ambrose's 150th career victory came against a foe from the league where he accumulated a huge chunk of those wins.

Sophomore midfielder Lydia Simmons scored her first career goal in the 41st minute to lift Vanderbilt to a 1-0 victory over Dartmouth on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. It was win No. 150 for Ambrose, who compiled 148 wins when he was at Penn the last 15 years and competing against Dartmouth and the rest of the Ivy League. More than a third of his victories (55) have come against Ivy League foes.

Though he was the all-time winningest coach at Penn, Ambrose picked up just his second win as Vanderbilt's head coach and first at home with Friday night's win over Dartmouth (1-1). On Thursday night after practice, Ambrose told his team it would mean a lot to beat Dartmouth because of his time in the Ivy League. The Commodores (2-3) responded with arguably their most complete effort of the season to boost their coach to the milestone victory.

It was enough for the Commodores, who outshot Dartmouth 17-8. Only three of the Big Green's shots were on goal, though. Led by strong defensive performances from Cristina De Zeeuw and Danae O'Halloran, Dartmouth never mounted a serious threat.

Sasha Gray and Claire Anderson each scored their first goals of the season to lift the Commodores to a 2-0 victory over the Bisons on a balmy Sunday afternoon at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. NASHVILLE, Tenn. — A slight delay couldn't slow down the Vanderbilt soccer team's winning streak.

Thanks to an early second-half goal by Simone Charley the Commodores picked up a 2-1 victory over Mississippi State on Friday night for their third straight win and fourth in five games. Vanderbilt also won its SEC opener for the first time since 2005.

The start of the game was delayed by 20 minutes due to a bank of lights at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex that malfunctioned after heavy storms swept through the area earlier in the afternoon. But Vanderbilt (4-3, 1-0 SEC) shook off the delay to match its longest winning streak in four years.

Sophomore midfielder Lydia Simmons scored her second goal of the season just four minutes in. Simmons smashed a shot from the top right wing just outside of the box over goalkeeper Tanya de Souza and into the top center of the net. Mississippi State (1-5-1, 0-1) responded just four minutes later when Kiley Martens followed up on shot that Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami initially saved. Martens knocked the ball away from Ogunsami and tapped in the rebound to tie the game 1-1 in the eighth minute.

The Commodores had chances to pull ahead with 12 shots in the first half, including nine on goal. But de Souza was spectacular in goal for the Bulldogs, posting eight of her 10 saves before halftime.

In the 47th minute, though, shortly after halftime, Charley scored her team-leading third goal of the season that would stand up as the game-winner. Jamie Kator, who just a minute before had two cracks at the goal on a penalty kick, sent in a cross to Charley just inside the box. Charley then scored her 17th career goal.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – Against one of the best teams in the country, in a hostile environment and on a nationally televised stage, the Vanderbilt soccer team sent a warning to the rest of the Southeastern Conference.

The Commodores put together arguably one of their best performances of the season, falling just short in a 1-0 loss to No. 5 Texas A&M on Friday night in front of 2,851 fans at Ellis Field and many more watching around the nation on the SEC Network.

The Aggies, a Final Four team a year ago, scored in the 70th minute to hold off the upset-minded Commodores and snap their four-game unbeaten streak.

Vanderbilt outshot the Aggies 12-9 (with seven shots on goal) and won the corner kick battle 8-2. The Commodores created seven corner kick opportunities before A&M registered its first. Redshirt sophomore Lydia Simmons led the way with four shots, while Lina Granados, Jamie Kator and Kacy Scarpa each had two shots.

From the start, Vanderbilt (4-4-1, 1-1 SEC) controlled possession and snuffed out opportunities by the Aggies, who made the Final Four a year ago and swept the SEC regular-season and tournament titles. The league's second highest scoring offense had just four shots at halftime.

Texas A&M (8-1, 2-0 SEC) scored with 20 minutes left. Haley Pounds sent in a cross from the right side, 25 yards out and into the box. The ball bounced into the box and past Texas A&M's Ally Watt, who tried to deflect the shot. The run by Watt threw off the Commodores as the ball slipped into the bottom left corner. It was the team's first loss since falling to Seattle University on Aug. 30.
