## 'DORES 11-4 SINCE LAST GEORGIA MEETING

The Commodores own an impressive 11-4 record since their last meeting against the Bulldogs.

Vanderbilt captured eight of the final nine games in 2012 after falling to Georgia in Athens on Sept. 22.

The Commodores are also 10-3 in their last 13 games dating back to a win over Auburn nearly a year ago. In those 10 wins, Vanderbilt's margin of victory is 23.8 points. Six of the 10 victories have come against BCS teams: Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss and Tennessee from the SEC and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the ACC.

The last time Vanderbilt enjoyed a 10-3 record over a 13-game stretch came in 1955-56.

## SENIOR O-LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON RANKS AS TEAM LEADER WITH 44 CAREER STARTS

**Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OL) paces all active Commodore position players with 44 career starts.

Among SEC players, Johnson ranks second in consecutive starts, trailing only UGA QB **Aaron Murray** (46 starts).

Johnson has started at center, left and right tackle, and left guard. He has six starts at left tackle this year.

The all-time Vanderbilt team record is 48 career starts, co-shared by **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07).

## OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

Vanderbilt's offensive point production through six games ranks favorably with the highest season averages in team history.

Through six games, the 'Dores rank sixth in the SEC with a 33.7-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 3.7 points higher than in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points.

The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the highest Vanderbilt single-season total since the 1915 Commodore squad averaged 51.4 points.

The increased scoring continues a trend the 'Dores started at midseason one year ago. In its last 13 games, Vanderbilt is averaging 37.9 points and has tallied at least 24 points in each contest.

## 'DORE OFFENSE CREATING EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

The Commodores rank among the SEC leaders in creating big plays on offense.

The unit has nine plays of 40+yards, tied for third most in the league behind Missouri (12) and LSU (10). The Commodores also have 16 plays of 30+yards, tying for fifth in the SEC and 27th in the NCAA.

## FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

**James Franklin** is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer

**Dan McGugin**, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 18-14 overall. His .563 winning percentage is the best by a Vanderbilt mentor since **Steve Sloan** directed the Vanderbilt sidelines in the 1970s.

## COMMODORES TO MAKE 8TH CBS APPEARANCE

The Commodores will appear on CBS for the first time in a dozen years when they host Georgia on Oct. 19.

The game will mark CBS' first appearance on the Vanderbilt campus since 1982

when the Commodores defeated Ole Miss 19-10 on Oct. 23, 1982.

The Commodores' last appearance on the network came at Tennessee in 2001.

Vanderbilt has lost its last five games on CBS, all played on road locations. The Commodores' last four CBS encounters also have featured SEC opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top Ten.

There are historical ties between Vanderbilt football and CBS Sports. The first college football game ever aired coast-to-coast was CBS's broadcast of the 1955 Gator Bowl involving unranked Vanderbilt and No. 8 Auburn. It also marked the first bowl appearance for Vanderbilt, who upset the Tigers 25-13. The famed announcer Russ Hodges, who called Bobby Thomson's "Shot Heard 'Round the World" when the Giants defeated the Brooklyn Dodgers for the National League pennant one year earlier, had play-by-play duties at the Gator Bowl.

## MATTHEWS-KRAUSE IMPRESS AS RECEIVING DUO

Seniors **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause** rank among the SEC's second most productive receiving tandem.

Collectively, Matthews and Krause average 189.9 receiving yards each game, trailing only the LSU duo of **Odell Beckham** and **Jarvis Landry** (201.0 yards).

**MORE ON THE GEORGIA SERIES** Vanderbilt trails 18-53-2 in the series against the Bulldogs. Two of the last three games played in Nashville have been decided by five points or less, including the most recent encounter, a 33-28 Georgia win in 2011. In 2006, the 'Dores snapped a 12-game losing streak to the Bulldogs with a 24-22 victory in Athens. Vanderbilt is looking for its first home victory over the Bulldogs since 1991.

### MURRAY, POTENT GEORGIA OFFENSE LEAD HOME WIN OVER COMMODORES

**ATHENS, Ga.** — Bulldog quarterback Aaron Murray completed his first 12 passes and got plenty of help from the rest of the offense as No. 5 Georgia defeated the Commodores in Athens.

Murray hooked up with Brown and King on touchdown throws, breaking a tie with Eric Zeier for second place in school history.

Murray also scored on a 1-yard sneak as the Bulldogs raced to a 27-0 lead in the first half. He finished 18 of 24 for 250 yards.

## MORE NOTES AND STATS FROM MISSOURI ENCOUNTER

★ The Commodores have tallied at least 28 points in each of their last 12 games dating back to midseason one year ago.

It marks a modern day team record for the longest stretch of games with at least 24 points scored.

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) tied a career high with 14 total tackles against the Tigers. Ladler matched his previous best from earlier this season (at South Carolina, 9/14).

The senior leads the team in solo stops (30) and total tackles (49). He also ranks as the Commodores' active career leader with 168 solo tackles, 249 total tackles and five interceptions.

★ The Commodores' 468 yards of offense against Missouri – 338 passing and 130 rushing – was the highest total against a SEC opponent since James Franklin became head coach.

It ranks as the team's highest offensive production in league play since a 621-yard total at Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.

★ The Commodores struggled with field position throughout the Missouri game. Vanderbilt averaged starting drives on their own 20-yard line. The Tigers' average possession started at the Missouri 40-yard line.

All four of Vanderbilt's four scoring drives were at least 75 yards. The team's first TD came after a season-high 15-play possession.

★ **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) set a single-game career high in passing yards for the second consecutive week when he threw for 338 yards against the Tigers.

Carta-Samuels also established a game high with 29 completions against Missouri. Two of the completions went for TDs.

Coming after a 334-yard effort vs. UAB, Carta-Samuels became the first Commodore signal caller since **Jay Cutler** to produce back-to-back 300-yard passing performances. Cutler accomplished the passing feat in his final two appearances as a Commodore in 2005.

It was Carta-Samuels' third 300-yard passing effort this year. Only two other Vanderbilt QBs have more in a season: **Kurt Page** (6, 1983) and Cutler (5, 2005).

★ **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) tied a season high in receptions. He had five catches for 81 yards, including a 35-yard TD reception.

In his last three games, Krause is averaging five catches and 98 receiving yards.

The senior has 24 catches this year, tying his previous high from the 2010 season. His receiving yardage total this year (430) is nearly 190 yards more than his previous season high.

★ The Vanderbilt defensive starters versus Missouri mirrored the same unit that started in previous wins over UMass and UAB.

Eight Vanderbilt defenders have started all six games this year: DE **Kyle Woestmann**, DE **Walker May**, DT **Vince Taylor**, LB **Darreon Herring**, CB **Andre Hal**, CB **Steven Clarke**, FS **Kenny Ladler** and SS **Javon Marshall**.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) topped the Commodores with 65 rushing yards and added five catches for 31 yards.

After missing the 2012 season, Seymour is averaging 6.0 yards per carry this year, and has set a new season high with 353 rushing yards.

★ Only five offensive players have started every game for the Commodores: QB **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, WR **Jordan Matthews**, OT **Wesley Johnson**, center **Joe Townsend** and OG **Spencer Pulley**.

★ The Vanderbilt defense posted 11 tackles for loss against the Tigers. **Caleb Azubike** (DE, So.) paced the unit with 2.5 stops for loss among seven total tackles.

★ The Commodores committed just one turnover, but were unable to force any Missouri miscues.

## MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) continued his assault on Vanderbilt and Southeastern Conference career receiving records with another game of more than 100 receiving yards against Missouri Oct. 5.

Matthews set two new school records in the seven-reception, 123-yard effort vs. Missouri. His 26-yard TD catch in the third quarter was the 22nd of his career, breaking a tie with **Dan Stricker** (1999-2002) for the school record.

Matthews also broke the Vanderbilt career record for receiving yards in the game. He has 2,991 career receiving yards, breaking the former record of 2,964 yards set by **Boo Mitchell** (1985-88).

Matthews ranks No. 4 all-time on the SEC receiving yardage charts, trailing only LSU's **Josh Reed** (3,001 yards, 1999-2001), South Carolina's **Alshon Jeffrey** (3,042 yards, 2009-11) and record holder **Terrence Edwards** of Georgia (3,093 yards, 1999-2002).

Matthews is tied for No. 7 all-time in the SEC with 197 receptions. He needs four catches to pass **Keith Edwards** (1980-83) as No. 2 all-time in Vanderbilt history. Matthews is 39 catches short of matching the team and SEC mark of 236 receptions held by **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

This year, Matthews ranks first in the SEC with 47 catches. He ranks second in the SEC with a 118.2-receiving yard average. His five TD receptions is tied for fourth in the SEC.

Matthews had 123 yards and a TD on seven receptions in Vanderbilt's loss to the Tigers. He opened the year with a 10-catch, 178-yard, 1-TD performance against Ole Miss, then produced back-to-back 100-yard receiving efforts against Austin Peay and South Carolina. He also had a 115-yard receiving effort in team's win over UAB Sept. 28.

Matthews also holds the team career mark of 15 games of 100+ receiving yards.

Matthews' performance in the opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his collegiate career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels.

The SEC's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb results versus SEC foes. He has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 11 of his last 15 games against SEC teams, averaging 120.7 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 14 of his last 18 games.

## VANDERBILT SPECIAL TEAMS IMPRESSIVE MIDWAY THROUGH SEASON

Vanderbilt special teams have performed extremely well through the team's six games.

- **PLACEKICKING** **Carey Spear** (Sr.) has performed at an All-SEC level despite limited kicking opportunities. Spear has converted on 80 percent of his FG attempts (4-of-5), including kicks of 54 and 50 yards. He also is perfect (26-of-26) on PATs.

- **PUNTING** **Taylor Hudson** ranks among the nation's leaders in both punting average and net punting. The first-year starter ranks fifth in the SEC – and 15th in the NCAA – with a 44.7-yard average.

Hudson's net punting average of 41.7 yards also tops the SEC and ranks eighth nationally.

Hudson is ranked as one of two punters in the SEC yet to register a touchback.

- **KICKOFF COVERAGE** Aided by Spear's accuracy, the 'Dores are among the NCAA's best units at covering kickoffs.

Opposing teams are averaging just 14.8 yards per return. The average leads the SEC and trails only La.-Monroe (12.0-yard avg.) in the NCAA.

Spear's ability to kick deep also has been a weapon. Opponents have returned just 11 of Spear's 35 kickoffs.

- **PUNT COVERAGE** Vanderbilt has limited opposing punt returners to a 6.9-yard average.

- **KICKOFF RETURNS** **Darrius Sims** is quickly becoming one of the team's most exciting returners. He ranks eighth in the SEC with a 22.9-yard average, with a season long of 42 yards.

- **PUNT RETURNS** **Jonathan Krause** doesn't own a lofty average (3.8 yards), but he has greatly contributed to Commodore field possession by catching virtually every opponent punt.

## SENIOR SAFETIES 'DORE LEADING TACKLERS

Senior safeties **Kenny Ladler** and **Javon Marshall** are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 30 solo tackles and 49 total stops. He had a career high 14 tackles vs. Missouri.

Marshall is second in both categories.

DE **Caleb Azubike** has the most tackles for loss (6.5) while DE **Kyle Woestmann** has the team lead in QB sacks (2.5).

**Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with eight passes defended.

## NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

## SUMMARY OF THE COMMODORE CAPTAINS

### AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer QB is averaging 260.2 passing yards and 274.5 yards of total offense in six starts. He also has accounted for 15 TDs.

### ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He serves as the team's primary snapper in all roles.

### CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. He has been out of the lineup since the opener.

### ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender has 25 total tackles, including 3.5 for losses, and a team-high eight passes defended at midseason.

### WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 44th consecutive career start at UMass.

### JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 40 total tackles.

### JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Trophy candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in five of six games this year, leads the SEC with 47 receptions and ranks second with 709 receiving yards.

### WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

Part of a five-player rotation, May has 1.5 QB sacks to go with 16 total tackles.

### CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior, coming off the best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, is 4-of-5 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more.

## OFFENSIVE LINEMAN GOUGER LATEST 'DORE TO EARN FIRST STARTING ASSIGNMENT

**Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL) became the latest Commodore to earn his first career collegiate start this season in the Missouri game Oct. 5.

Gouger started against the Tigers at a tackle eligible position in a seven-linemen set.

Gouger joins 10 other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts in the first six games of the season.

Making their first collegiate starts in the opener against Ole Miss were **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT), **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Taylor Hudson Jr.**, punter), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE). **Jake Sealand** (So., LB) and **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) also enjoyed their first career starts against Austin Peay and South Carolina, respectively. **Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) earned his first start against UMass.

Several of the other first-time starters posted superb stats in their first start. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles, and a quarterback hurry against Ole Miss. Taylor, Clarke and Herring also played well against the Rebels: Taylor setting a single-game career high with four total tackles, Clarke notching three tackles and Herring posting five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes. Butler, who moved from offensive line to defensive tackle during spring drills, contributed one tackle against Ole Miss.

Hudson averaged 40.0 yards on five punts against the Rebels in his first appearance as a Commodore.

Sealand had two tackles against Austin Peay. Seymour had 39 rushing yards, including a 1-yard TD rush, vs. the Govs.

Jelks started against Ole Miss lined up at tackle eligible.

Franklin contributed two tackles in the win over Massachusetts.

Sims has impressed as a big-play kick returner and continues to get action in the Commodore secondary. Cunningham had a team-high seven passes for 67 yards in the win over Austin Peay.

Rayford also posted one catch for 24 yards against the Govs.

No new true freshmen has played in the team's last four games.

## QUARTERBACK CARTA-SAMUELS OFF TO SOLID START; THROWN FOR 300+YARDS IN CONSECUTIVE OUTINGS

**Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense through six early-season games.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB during the 2009-10 seasons for the University of Wyoming, is averaging 260.2 passing yards and 274.5 yards of total offense in six starts. He has also completed 10 TD passes and ran for five more scores.

Carta-Samuels threw for 338 yards and two TDs against Missouri, one week after throwing for 334 yards and two TDs in a victory over UAB.

Carta-Samuels has been extremely accurate, hitting on 66.1% of his passes. In his last two games, his completion percentage is 74.3% (52-of-70). Carta-Samuels' current completion percentage would rank as the best by a Vanderbilt QB in 60 years.

Carta-Samuels opened the season by becoming just the second Commodore QB ever to reach 300 passing yards in the season opener vs. Ole Miss. That performance ranked among the best ever by a Vanderbilt QB.

Carta-Samuels ranks fourth in the SEC in total offense and fifth in passing yards. He has passed for 10 TDs, including five to Jordan Matthews (Sr., WR) and two to **Jonathan Krause**.

## FACTS ON COMMODORE OL WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate Wesley Johnson has started 44 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

★ Johnson has been flagged for just three holding penalties during his 44-game career.

★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 7.5 sacks on 1,169 career pass attempts, or one sack every 156 pass plays.

★ Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012. He has allowed one sack this year.

★ Johnson has produced 186 knockdown blocks, 59 intimidation blocks and 118 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.

★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two Vanderbilt offensive touchdowns for the last 3+ seasons.

★ Johnson has played 2,757 career snaps: 1,849 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 72 at tight end. He has played 98.5 percent of the team's snaps over the last 3+ years.

## HUDSON SUPERB AS 1ST-YEAR STARTING PUNTER

In six weeks, **Taylor Hudson** (So., punter) has earned the respect of teammates and SEC observers. Hudson has been superb as the replacement of 2012 All-SEC recipient **Richard Kent**.

The former prep quarterback is averaging 44.7 yards, 7th best in the SEC. His net average of 41.7 tops the conference and ranks 9th in the NCAA.

Hudson averaged 43.0 yards on four punts against Missouri. Earlier in the year, he earned the team's Specialist of the Week against Austin Peay after averaging 48.2 yards.

Hudson has punts of 50 yards or more in four of six games. His 75-yarder vs. South Carolina equals the eighth longest punt in team history.

for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, given annually to the nation's leading receiver.

Through six games, Matthews is on pace to improve on his 2012 totals of 94 catches and a team-record 1,323 receiving yards. Matthews leads the SEC with 47 catches and ranks No. 2 with 709 receiving yards. He also has five TD catches.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in five games this year, extending his school career record to 15 100+ receiving games. He opened the year with a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole Miss, and added 106 yards at South Carolina. Besides Missouri, he also has at least 100 receiving yards against Austin Peay and UAB.

Entering the Georgia game, Matthews ranks seventh on SEC career

Matthews continued his assault on record books Oct. 5 vs. Missouri, hauling in seven passes for 123 yards and a TD. Matthews' 26-yard scoring catch early in the third quarter was the 22nd of his career, enabled Matthews sole ownership of the team's career TD reception record.

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., is a leading contender

charts with 197 catches. He needs 40 catches to surpass the SEC and team career mark of 236 receptions established by **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews is three receptions shy of fifth place on the SEC all-time list.

Matthews jumped from No. 11 to No. 4 in the league's all-time receiving yardage charts during the Missouri performance. He is 103 receiving yards from breaking the league's all-time receiving yardage record held by former Georgia standout WR **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002).

Matthews posted staggering numbers during a sensational junior campaign when he earned First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America recognition. Matthews' 94-reception total in 2012 is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks sixth on the SEC single-season charts.

## RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

## SPEAR SETS 3RD TEAM FIELD GOAL RECORD; UP FOR SEVERAL INDIVIDUAL HONORS

Coming off the best season ever by a Vandy placekicker, senior **Carey Spear** has continued his excellent form in 2013.

The Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yard during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

Spear, an Associated Press All-SEC recipient in 2012 after setting team records with 20 field goals and 87 points scored by a kicker, is 4-of-5 on FG this year.

Spear also is a stellar all-around student-athlete. He was recently named to the 2013 Allstate/American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team and has been nominated for two other prestigious postseason awards, the Senior CLASS Award and Wuerffel Trophy. Both postseason awards recognize football, academic success in the classroom, and community service.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, is expected to graduate this May with a degree in Human & Organizational Development.

Earlier in October, he was a finalist for the Vanderbilt Outstanding Senior Award, recognized as the most prestigious honor bestowed on a Commodore undergraduate student.

Spear is a two-year starter as the team's placekicker and four-year starter as its kickoff specialist. He is also the first Commodore player to be voted captain for three consecutive seasons since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected in 2003-05.

## 2014 SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED; EIGHT HOME GAMES SLATED

Home games with Ole Miss, South Carolina, Florida and Tennessee will highlight Vanderbilt's 2014 football schedule.

The 2014 Vanderbilt schedule features eight home games, including the first four contests of the season. The 'Dores will conclude the regular season against Tennessee, reviving season-ending rivalry that existed for 67 years until being interrupted in 2007.

The 2014 season opens against Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28 and is followed by Ole Miss, which will be visiting for the second straight year, on Sept. 6. UMass and South Carolina follow to cap the month-long home stand.

The Commodores then hit the road for back-to-back games against Kentucky and Georgia before returning Oct. 11 to host Charleston Southern.

## FOUR COMMODORES EARN COACHES' RECOGNITION

For the first time in recent years, three Commodore standouts have earned preseason First-Team All-SEC recognition from the league's 14 head coaches. A fourth Vanderbilt player received second team honors.

The coaches' ballot, the last preseason unit named prior to the season opener, includes **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) as first team recipients. A fourth Commodore, **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) also was named as a Second-Team All-SEC member by the coaches.

It marks the most Commodores to be recognized in the coaches' preseason ballot since 2009 when five Vanderbilt players were named.

## 'DORES FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC GRIDIRON ACHIEVEMENT

### TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

### MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

### SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

### UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

### WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

### FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

### FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

### DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

## MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

## VANDERBILT ANNOUNCES FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

**BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL** When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

**JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL** Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

**JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING** Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

**DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE** Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

**JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE** A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

**CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL** Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

**JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL** Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Lincecum Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.

On Feb. 1, Head Coach **James Franklin** and his coaching staff delivered on a promise to Vanderbilt fans by signing what recruiting experts regard as the best class of national prospects in team history.

Franklin praised the 24-player class that ranks among the finest recruiting achievements of any coaching staff in the nation. According to Rivals.com, the class ranks 19th nationally, making it the highest ranked collection of signees in Commodore history.

The 2013 class includes 11 players on offense, 12 on defense and one kicker. It features three prep All-Americans and 12 players that earned rare four-star evaluations from national recruiting services. Fifteen members of the class made appearances in prestigious postseason all-star games.

Three members of the class – **Jordan Cunningham** (WR), **Latevius Rayford** (WR) and **Darius Sims** (CB) – have played in Vanderbilt's first two games.



## INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY EXPECTED TO OPEN ON CAMPUS IN LATE OCTOBER

The Commodores expect to have access to one of the nation's finest indoor practice facilities in the next two weeks.

The new on-campus venue, which features a 300-meter synthetic track surrounding a 120-yard football field, is scheduled to open Oct. 31, just yards from the team's John Rich Practice Facility. The spacious project adjoins the Vanderbilt Recreation Center.

Ground was officially broken during the 2012 football season on the multipurpose



facility. The entire \$30 million construction, which includes numerous enhancements to the recreation center, is expected to be completed by January, 2014.
