WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss leads the nation in scoring offense (64.0 ppg) a year after topping the NCAA in scoring defense (16.0 ppg).
- Ole Miss is 3-0 for the third straight year.
- The Rebels have not trailed in a game this season.
- Ole Miss has scored 43 or more points in three straight games for the first time in school history.
- The Rebels vaulted to No. 3 in this week's AP poll, matching their best ranking since 1964.
- This meeting is the 90th between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt dating back to 1894 ... The Rebels lead the series 49-38-2 and have won 15 of the last 22 meetings since 1992 ... Ole Miss leads 49-20-2 in SEC games versus VU ... Vanderbilt won the first 19 games in the series, with Ole Miss having won 49 of the last 70 meetings.
- Ole Miss honors Mike Slive with Saturday's Prostate Cancer Awareness Game.
- The Rebels' 43-37 win at No. 2 Alabama was their first in Tuscaloosa since 1988, and it's the first time Ole Miss has defeated the Crimson Tide in consecutive years.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC and is tied for the national lead with 10 turnovers forced and seven interceptions.
- Junior transfer QB **Chad Kelly** leads the SEC in pass efficiency (205.7), passing TDs (9), points responsible for (72), yards per pass attempt (12.3) and yards per completion (19.1).

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Hugh Freeze at approximately 11:30 a.m. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m.

PRACTICES: Viewing is permitted for approved media for select portions of practice on Tuesdays during the season. If you do not regularly attend practices, please contact Media Relations prior to your visit for exact details on times and location. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until after the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and no formations. On available days, video is permitted for individual drills only, and media will be alerted which portions of practice (including stretch) are available for video. Use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the media relations office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Periscope and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Audio/video use of content from press conferences and media opportunities is limited to five minutes per individual (coach or student-athlete) per day, and use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Athletics. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of game highlights and interviews with coaches and players for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter. Media without a parking permit may also contact Danny Blanton at dblanton@olemiss.edu prior to each visit to secure a free day pass. Day passes are also available for \$3 online to print at <http://www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html> or at a welcome booth on University Avenue in front of the Thad Cochran Research Center, which accepts cash, checks and credit cards. Please note that vendor and day passes are not applicable for gameday parking.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspapers; (2) network affiliate television stations; (3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; (4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. **PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter through Gate 6 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) new garage; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. Passes marked MEDIA are for the garage, and each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked TAD SMITH MEDIA are for a lot located west of Tad Smith Coliseum.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the 4-way stop. Those with MEDIA parking passes for the garage should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with TAD SMITH MEDIA passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST VANDERBILT

September 6, 2014 - Ole Miss 41, Vanderbilt 3 at Nashville: No. 15 Ole Miss scored early and often, while the Rebel defense gave up eight points in the fourth quarter en route to a dominating 41-3 win over Vanderbilt in both teams' SEC opener. Bo Wallace threw for 320 yards and a touchdown to lead the charge. Ole Miss scored on seven of its first eight possessions with the shortest drive covering 67 yards, and the Rebels never punted. Jaylen Walton started the scoring with a 20-yard TD, and ITavius Mathers and DeVante Kincade also ran for TDs.

August 29, 2013 - Ole Miss 39, Vanderbilt 35 at Nashville: Bo Wallace tied a career high of 31 completions of 47 attempts for 283 yards and WR Laquon Treadwell had his college debut with nine catches for 82 yards, the most catches by a Rebel since Mike Espy had nine against Auburn in 2005. The Rebels managed to snap Vanderbilt's three-game win streak in the series after scoring 29 points in the second half and securing the 39-35 victory.

November 10, 2012 - Vanderbilt 27, Ole Miss 26 at Oxford: Bo Wallace passed for a career-high 403 yards and Ja-Mes Logan had eight receptions for 160 yards - both career highs - but the Rebels couldn't hold on and fell to Vanderbilt 27-26. Vanderbilt scored 14 unanswered points in the third quarter to cut the Rebels' lead to three points. The Commodores won the game with a 26-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Rodgers to Chris Boyd with 0:52 remaining on the clock.

September 17, 2011 - Vanderbilt 30, Ole Miss 7 at Nashville: Vanderbilt scored 21 straight in the second quarter, as Ole Miss dropped its SEC opener to the Commodores 30-7. Zack Stoudt was 13-of-26 passing for 139 yards and a touchdown, but he threw five interceptions.

September 18, 2010 - Vanderbilt 28, Ole Miss 14 at Oxford: Jeremiah Masoli passed for 190 yards and rushed for 104 more, but it wasn't enough as Ole Miss dropped its SEC opener 28-14 to Vanderbilt. The Rebels lost despite outgaining the Commodores 385-300. They completed only 5 of 18 third-down opportunities.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE

Hugh Freeze (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his fourth season at the Ole Miss helm. He inherited a team that went 2-10 and winless in SEC games in 2011 and has led the Rebels to three straight bowl games, including a berth in one of the inaugural "New Year's Six" bowls last season. A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze owns a 27-15 mark in Oxford and a career record of 57-22. His .643 winning percentage at Ole Miss is the second-best of any Rebel coach in the last 100 years. He was named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011, coming to Oxford after one year as head coach at Arkansas State where he led the Red Wolves to a 10-2 season and the 2011 Sun Belt Conference title and was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in school history.

Derek Mason (Northern Arizona, 1993) is in his second year as Vanderbilt's head coach and has a 4-11 record with the Commodores, including a 1-2 mark so far this season. He served as associate head coach and Willie Shaw Director of Defense for the Stanford Cardinal from 2011-13 and helped Stanford win consecutive Pac-12 championships and make back-to-back Rose Bowl appearances. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award (nation's top assistant) in 2012. Before going to Palo Alto, Mason coached in the NFL with the Minnesota Vikings (2007-09). His pro career also included stops with the St. Louis Rams, New York Giants and Oakland Raiders. Other college stops include Ohio University, New Mexico State, Bucknell, Idaho State and Weber State.

VANDERBILT SCOUTING REPORT

The Vanderbilt Commodores are 1-2 overall and 0-1 in SEC play entering Saturday's contest in Oxford. Derek Mason's squad is anchored by a stingy defense that allows 17.3 points per game (5th in SEC) and 270.7 yards per outing (3rd in SEC). Opponents have converted just 23.1 percent of third-down tries against VU, the second-best mark in the conference. After struggling to score much the first two games, the 'Dores broke out with 47 points in last week's win over Austin Peay. Sophomore QB Johnny McCrary is the SEC leader in total offense (332.0 ypg) and has completed 70 of 117 passes for 880 yards, four TDs and five INTs. Sophomore WR Trent Sherfield is the league leader with 21 catches and 347 yards, while nabbing a pair of TDs. Sophomore RB Ralph Webb leads the team with 192 rushing yards and two TDs.

IN THE POLLS

- Ole Miss vaulted to No. 3 in this week’s AP poll and No. 5 in the Amway coaches poll.
- This week’s ranking matches the best since the Rebels were preseason No. 1 in 1964 ... Ole Miss was No. 3 in the polls for three weeks last season.
- Ole Miss was ranked top 25 in all 17 weeks last season ... The current streak of 21 straight weeks in the national rankings is the longest since appearing in 69 straight from 1957-62.
- The Rebels have been ranked top 25 for a total of 26 weeks during **Hugh Freeze’s** tenure as head coach.
- The Rebels’ No. 15 preseason ranking this year was the highest since they were No. 8 in the 2009 preseason polls.

FIRST 100 YEARS OF VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM

Ole Miss is celebrating the first 100 years of Vaught-Hemingway Stadium this season. The longtime home of Ole Miss Football began its life in 1915 when students helped build the first grandstands. The stadium’s permanent foundation was a three-year, federally funded project from 1939-41. Stadium capacity was originally listed at 24,000. It will top 64,000 next season after the enclosure of the north end zone. The Rebels boast an all-time record of 260-93-8 (.731 winning percentage) at Vaught-Hemingway.



RECORD SEASON TICKET SELLOUT

- Ole Miss sold out of general public season tickets in June and then all season tickets in August (including student season tickets) en route to a new record of 52,375.
- Ole Miss has now sold out of football season tickets for three straight seasons - 50,386 in 2013 and 51,316 in 2014.
- The Vaught-Hemingway season attendance record has been broken each of the last two years, with 430,829 fans watching Ole Miss play a year ago.
- Six of Ole Miss’ seven home games last year were sellouts.

OLE MISS TO HONOR FORMER SEC COMMISH MIKE SLIVE

The Southeastern Conference will help raise awareness of prostate cancer prevention and honor former commissioner Mike Slive, who battled the disease during his athletics administration career, with Prostate Cancer Awareness Games on each of the 14 league campuses during the month of September. The Prostate Cancer Awareness Game on Ole Miss’ campus will be this week against Vanderbilt.

REBELS SOAR TO OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- The Rebels have scored 43+ points in three straight games for the first time in school history.
- Ole Miss is the first team in SEC history to score 73+ points in back-to-back games and the first from any conference since Houston in 1968.
- The Rebels have set school records with 149 points in a two-game span and 192 points in a three-game span.
- Ole Miss scored 50+ points in back-to-back games for the first time in school history.
- First SEC team to score 70+ in consecutive games since Florida in 1994.
- First time in school history that Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 total yards two times in the same season.
- The 76 points vs. UT Martin were the most points and best margin of victory since a 92-0 win over West Tennessee Teachers College (now known as Memphis) on Sept. 28, 1935.
- The 28 first-quarter points vs. Fresno State and 27 vs. UT Martin are the top two marks in modern program history, dating back to 1962.
- The 43 points were the most Ole Miss has ever scored in Tuscaloosa and tied for second-most ever against Alabama.
- For perspective: In 2011 (the year before **Hugh Freeze** arrived), Ole Miss scored 193 points all year.

LANDSHARKS LOVE TURNOVERS

- Last year, the Rebels' Landshark defense led the SEC and ranked eighth nationally with 34 turnovers forced.
- So far this season, Ole Miss tops the SEC and is tied for the national lead with 10 turnovers forced.
- The Rebels also lead the SEC and are tied for third in the nation with a +6 turnover margin.
- The Rebels' three defensive touchdowns are tied for most in the nation ... Their seven defensive TDs over the last two years are second-most in the nation behind Ohio State's eight.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC and is tied for the national lead with seven interceptions.

TOP-RATED REBELS

After leading the NCAA in scoring defense last year (16.0 ppg), Ole Miss currently tops the nation in scoring offense (64.0 ppg). The defense isn't too shabby so far this year, ranking top half of the SEC and top 50 nationally (20.3 ppg).

KELLY SHINES BEHIND CENTER

- Junior QB **Chad Kelly**, a transfer from East Mississippi Community College after starting his career at Clemson, has helped Ole Miss to a 3-0 start and gaudy offensive numbers by completing 47 of 73 passes for 898 yards with nine TDs and only one interception (that slipped through his receivers hands).
- Kelly leads the NCAA in yards per pass attempt (12.3) and yards per completion (19.1)
- He ranks 2nd in the nation in pass efficiency (205.7), 4th in points responsible for (72), 6th in passing TDs (9), 19th in total offense yards per game (321.7) and 20th in passing yards per game (299.3).
- He leads the SEC in pass efficiency, passing TDs and points responsible for, while he ranks 2nd in passing yards per game and total offense.
- First SEC QB since Johnny Manziel in 2012 to account for five touchdowns in a half (4 pass, 1 rush vs. Fresno State).
- First QB to lead his team to victory in Tuscaloosa since Texas A&M's Manziel in 2012.

ROBERT NKEMDICHE: A BEAST IN ALL THREE PHASES

- Junior DT **Robert Nkemdiche** has shown his athleticism and prowess on defense, special teams AND offense this year.
- Nkemdiche, the SEC Defensive Player of the Week after the Alabama road win, has tallied 11 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 0.5 sack and a QB hurry on defense.
- He mauled a couple of would-be blockers on his way to block a 23-yard field goal attempt vs. UT Martin ... It was the Rebels' first blocked field goal since 2010 (Allen Walker vs. Fresno State).
- He has lined up three times in the offensive backfield and scored two touchdowns - a 31-yard catch and run vs. UT Martin and a 1-yard goal line carry vs. Fresno State.

SPREADING THE BALL

- Through three games, 14 different Rebels have scored touchdowns (12 on offense, two on defense).
- Seven different Rebels have rushed for at least one touchdown: **Chad Kelly** (3), **Jaylen Walton** (2), **Eugene Brazley** (2), **Jordan Wilkins** (1), **Akeem Judd** (1), **D.K. Buford** (1) and **Robert Nkemdiche** (1).
- Six different Rebels have caught a touchdown pass: **Quincy Adebeyejo** (5), **Cody Core** (3), **Laquon Treadwell** (1), **Markell Pack** (1), **Robert Nkemdiche** (1) and **DaMarkus Lodge** (1).
- Notably, preseason All-America TE **Evan Engram** has yet to score this season.
- Sixteen different Rebels have caught a pass, while 12 different Rebels have logged a rushing attempt.

STATEMENT FROM HUGH FREEZE AND ROSS BJORK: "We have been preparing as if **Laremy Tunsil** will not play and that status will continue until the matter is resolved. The team of our university administration, athletics compliance and outside counsel are working daily on this sensitive matter. Although the process is ongoing, the decision to withhold Laremy is not related to any current items involving our football staff, and we have been assured that everyone is aggressively seeking a resolution. We continue to support Laremy in every way. In early July, the University offered (Laremy accepted) separate legal counsel with experience in similar matters, and the University continues to pay for Laremy's counsel, as permitted by NCAA rules."

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM EXPANSION AND RENOVATIONS

A number of renovations, expansions and improvements are underway for Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field as part of the Forward Together capital campaign (that has also helped create the new Pavilion at Ole Miss for basketball).

PHASE 1: Completed for this season are renovations to the south end zone that have added 770 club seats, 30 new luxury suites and a new ribbon board. The west suites and press box also received a fresh refinishing.

PHASE 2: When the 2016 season begins, the north end zone will be enclosed, bringing stadium capacity to 64,038. New video boards and sound system will be installed. A new plaza and bell tower on the north side of the stadium will give Ole Miss Football an exciting new "front door." A green space will extend the Walk of Champions from The Grove to the new plaza. The south end zone will have a new field-level club area.

- Ole Miss is 3-0 for the third straight year.
- Ole Miss has not trailed in a game this season.
- The Rebels have defeated Alabama in consecutive years for the first time in history and are the first team to take down the Tide in back-to-back years since LSU in 2010 and 2011.
- A win Saturday against Vanderbilt would even **Hugh Freeze's** SEC record to 13-13.
- Ole Miss tops the SEC and is tied for third nationally with a +6 turnover margin.
- Ole Miss ranks fourth in the SEC in 4th down conversion (80%), while the Rebel defense is second in the league in opponents' 4th down conversion (25%).
- Ole Miss is 21-4 under Freeze when leading at the half, including a 3-0 mark this year.
- Ole Miss is 22-2 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards, 5-13 when it rushes for less than 150 yards.
- Ole Miss has increased its win total by one game each year under **Hugh Freeze** - 7 in 2012, 8 in 2013, 9 in 2014.
- Ole Miss is one of 14 schools that will play at least nine teams this year that made bowl games in 2014.
- The Rebels face UT Martin and New Mexico State for the first time in program history this year.
- The Rebels travel to Florida for the first time since 2008 and to Memphis for the first time since 2009.
- Denzel** and **Robert Nkemdiche's** 240 combined career tackles are the most among active brothers in the NCAA.
- Ole Miss has three sets of brothers on the squad this year: **A.J.** and **C.J. Moore** (twins); **Denzel** and **Robert Nkemdiche**; and **Laremy Tunsil** and **Alex Weber**.
- The Rebels' Oct. 4, 2014 win over Alabama won them the ESPY for Best Upset at this year's ESPY Awards.
- Hugh Freeze** was the honorary pace car driver for the GEICO 500 at Talladega Superspeedway on May 3, 2015.
- Ole Miss Sports Productions won two Emmy awards for "The Season: Ole Miss Football" this year.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss ranks No. 1 in the nation in scoring (64.0 ppg), just ahead of Baylor (61.0 ppg).
- The Rebels have converted all 15 of their red zone trips this season (12 TDs, 3 FGs) and are tied for the national lead with a 100 percent conversion rate.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC in scoring, red zone offense, total offense (567.3 ypg) and passing offense (352.3 ypg).
- Senior WR **Cody Core** ranks 2nd in the SEC in receiving ypg (99.7), followed by junior WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** (4th, 74.7 ypg) and junior WR **Laquon Treadwell** (6th, 65.7 ypg).
- Adebeyejo tops the SEC and is tied for the national lead with five receiving touchdowns (on 10 catches).
- Core tops all SEC players and ranks eighth nationally with 24.9 yards per reception.
- Against Fresno State, junior WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** became the first Rebel to catch three TDs in a game since Donte Moncrief in 2012 vs. Mississippi State.
- Left guard **Javon Patterson** is the first true freshman starter on the Ole Miss OL since John Jerry in 2006.
- Preseason All-American junior TE **Evan Engram** ranks top four in Ole Miss history in career receptions (61), yards (957) and touchdowns (5) by a tight end.
- Preseason All-American junior WR **Laquon Treadwell** has caught a pass in 25 straight games in which he's played, which ranks top 20 in the nation.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss ranks seventh in the SEC and 43rd nationally in scoring defense (20.3 ppg).
- The Rebels' red zone defense allows 75% scoring opportunities to score, which is fifth-best in the SEC.
- Senior FS **Trae Elston** is one of three players in the nation with a pair of interception returns for TD this year (along with Marshall's Tiquan Lang and San Diego State's Calvin Munson) ... Elston's 93-yard return against UT Martin was the Rebels' longest since Charles Sawyer's 96-yarder vs. BYU in 2011.
- Elston is tied for the SEC and national lead with three interceptions, having picked off a pass in each game.
- Senior DB **Chief Brown** returned an INT 22 yards for his first career touchdown vs. Fresno State.
- Sophomore DB **A.J. Moore** tops the SEC with two fumble recoveries and is tied for the league lead with two forced fumbles.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Senior RB **Jaylen Walton** ranks fifth in school history with 3,613 career all-purpose yards and holds the school record for career kick return yards with 1,635 ... He needs 69 all-purpose yards to overtake Jeff Scott and Brandon Bolden and move into third place.
- Sophomore K **Gary Wunderlich** is a perfect 4-for-4 on field goals and 21-for-21 on PATs this season ... He ranks fourth in the SEC in scoring at 11.0 points per game.
- Against UT Martin, junior DT **Robert Nkemdiche** recorded the Rebels' first blocked field goal since 2010 (Allen Walker vs. Fresno State).

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DB **Mike Hilton** became the 25th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Hilton wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

BIG FUTURE PLANS FOR OLE MISS ATHLETICS

- On Aug. 31, Athletics Director **Ross Bjork** announced several big items for the future of the Ole Miss program:
- Ole Miss' Nike contract has been improved and extended through 2027.
 - Natural grass will return to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium for the 2016 season.
 - In 2015-16, Ole Miss has 378 student-athletes and will spend roughly \$78,000 per student-athlete.
 - The Rebels' athletics budget has increased from \$57 million in 2011-12 to \$96 million in 2015-16.
 - The new Pavilion at Ole Miss will feature the largest center-hung video board in college basketball.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, "Landshark" is a term adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players will celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "fins up" also contributes to the players' persona.

With the popularity of both the players and the "Landshark" celebration, Ole Miss student-athletes from other sports have even performed the hand gesture as a tribute to their fellow Rebels on the football team.

Roots of the "Landshark" at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-Americans Peria Jerry and Greg Hardy and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term "Landshark" originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the "Landshark."

UT MARTIN NOTES

GENERAL: This was the first meeting all-time between Ole Miss and UT Martin ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 60,186 ... Ole Miss improved to 90-26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of the last 20 ... The Rebels' 76 points are their most since scoring 92 against West Tennessee Teachers College (now known as University of Memphis) in 1935 ... The Rebels' 27 first-quarter points were their most in the opening frame in modern history (since at least 1962) ... It was the most points in any quarter since scoring 28 in the fourth against Boise State in last season's opener ... Ole Miss had its highest first-half scoring output (41) since scoring 42 against Arkansas State in 1990 ... Ole Miss scored 11 touchdowns by 10 different players.

OFFENSE: Senior RB **Jaylen Walton** only rushed three times, but he piled up 65 yards and a pair of scores, taking rushes from 60 yards and 4 yards to the house ... It was his first multi-score game since Idaho in 2013 ... The three Ole Miss quarterbacks combined to complete 19 of 28 passes for 324 yards, five touchdowns and an interception ... Junior QB **Chad Kelly** started in his Rebel debut and went 9 of 15 for 211 yards with two touchdowns and an interception, while adding a 20-yard rushing TD ... Sophomore QB **Ryan Buchanan** went 4 of 6 for 58 yards and two TDs ... Sophomore QB **DeVante Kincaide** went 6 of 7 for 55 yards and a TD ... He also rushed twice for 15 yards ... Touchdown runs were 60 yards by Walton, 4 yards by Walton, 20 yards by Kelly (first career), 70 yards by **Eugene Brazley** (first career) and 20 by **D.K. Buford** (first career) ... Touchdown catches were 56 yards by **Markell Pack** (first career), 15 yards by **Quincy Adebeyejo**, 31 yards by **Robert Nkemdiche** (first career - lined up as an H-back), 57 yards by **Cody Core** and 12 yards by **DaMarkus Lodge** (first career).

DEFENSE: Senior DB **Trae Elston** returned an interception 93 yards for his first career TD ... It was the longest return since Charles Sawyer's 96-yarder vs. BYU in 2011

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior DB/PR **Carlos Davis** made his debut as the punt returner and had six returns for 80 yards (13.0 average) ... Junior **Robert Nkemdiche** blocked a field goal for the first time in his career and the Rebels' first since Allen Walker did so against Fresno State in 2010.

FRESNO STATE NOTES

GENERAL: This was the third all-time between Ole Miss and Fresno State ... Ole Miss now leads the series 3-0 ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 60,302 ... The Rebels' 149 points over the last two games are the most in a two-game span in school history ... The previous record was 131 from Oct. 22-29, 1904 ... Ole Miss is the first SEC team ever to score 73+ points in back-to-back games and the first SEC team to score 70+ points in back-to-back games since Florida in 1994 ... Ole Miss has scored 49 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time ever in the same season ... The Rebels' 28 first-quarter points were their most in the opening frame in modern history (since at least 1962), surpassing last week's total of 27 vs. UT Martin.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss gained 607 yards of total offense, the second straight game with more than 600 and the seventh-most in a game in program history ... It's the first time in school history to have two games of 600+ total yards in the same season ... Junior QB **Chad Kelly** was 20 of 25 for 346 yards with four touchdowns, the most passing TDs since Bo Wallace threw for four against Louisiana-Lafayette last year ... Kelly also punched in a 4-yard rushing score, his second rushing score of the season ... Junior WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** caught five passes for a career-high 120 yards and a career-high three touchdowns ... He's the first Rebel with three TD catches since Donte Moncrief vs. Mississippi State in 2012 ... Senior WR **Cody Core** led the team with six catches for 96 yards and a touchdown ... Junior DT **Robert Nkemdiche** scored an offensive touchdown in his second straight game, this time with a 1-yard rush in the third quarter.

DEFENSE: Senior FS **Trae Elston** returned an interception 38 yards for a touchdown, his second straight game with a pick-six ... Senior DB **Chief Brown** returned an interception 22 yards for a touchdown, his third career INT and first career score ... This was the first time Ole Miss returned two interceptions for touchdowns in a game since 1993 vs. Northern Illinois ... It was the Rebels' first game with multiple defensive touchdowns since Texas A&M last year ... Senior LB **C.J. Johnson** picked off a pass for the second time in his career and returned it 70 yards to set up a Rebel score ... The Ole Miss defense racked up three interceptions, two forced fumbles, 10 tackles for loss and a sack.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K **Gary Wunderlich** converted all nine PATs and connected on his first FG attempt of the year, a 37-yarder in the fourth quarter.

ALABAMA NOTES

GENERAL: This was the 63rd meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Alabama ... The Crimson Tide now hold a 47-11-2 series lead ... Ole Miss has defeated Alabama in back-to-back years for the first time in history and won in Tuscaloosa for the first time since 1988 ... Attendance at Bryant-Denny Stadium was a capacity crowd of 101,821 ... Ole Miss now has an all-time record of 33-46-3 (.421) in SEC openers ... Ole Miss starts the season 3-0 for the third straight year ... The Rebels' 43 points were their most ever scored in a game in Tuscaloosa and tied for the second-most points ever against Alabama ... This is the first time in school history Ole Miss has scored 43 or more points in three straight games ... Ole Miss handed Alabama its first loss in Tuscaloosa since Texas A&M in 2012 ... The Rebels forced five Alabama turnovers (scoring 24 points off of them) and did not commit a single turnover ... Ole Miss improved to 6-10 against ranked teams under Freeze ... The Rebels are now 4-8 against top-10 teams and 3-3 against top-five foes in the Freeze era.

OFFENSE: Ole Miss was a perfect 4-for-4 in red zone tries (2 TD, 2 FG) and is a perfect 15-for-15 this season (12 TD, 3 FG) ... Junior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 18 of 33 passes for 341 yards, three TDs and no INTs, while rushing eight times for 21 yards and another score ... Sophomore RB **Jordan Wilkins** punched in a 1-yard touchdown in the second quarter for his second career TD (first of the season) ... He's the seventh different Rebel to rush for a TD this season ... Junior WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** caught his fifth touchdown of the season with a crazy 66-yard reception on a desperation heave by Kelly that was tipped up ... Senior WR **Cody Core** caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 73-yard TD in the fourth quarter that put the Rebels up by two scores ... It was Core's second career 100-yard receiving game ... With five catches, **Laquon Treadwell** passed Rebel great Dexter McCluster and moved into 10th place in school history with 134 career receptions ... Treadwell also moved into a tie for ninth in school history with 11 career TD catches ... He finished the game with five catches for 80 yards and his first TD of the season.

DEFENSE: Ole Miss forced five Alabama turnovers and has forced 10 turnovers on the season ... The Rebels led the SEC and ranked eighth nationally with 32 turnovers last year ... The Ole Miss defense held Alabama scoreless in the first quarter at Bryant-Denny Stadium for the first time since 2012 ... Senior FS **Trae Elston** had an interception for the third straight game, but it was the first time he didn't return it to the house this season ... Senior LB **C.J. Johnson** picked off a pass for the second straight game and third time in his career ... Junior CB **Tony Bridges** snagged his first interception as a Rebel late in the fourth quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore K **Gary Wunderlich** made a career-high three field goals on three attempts, converting from 32, 34 and 45 yards ... Sophomore DB **A.J. Moore** recovered an Alabama fumble (his first career recovery) on the opening kickoff that set up a Rebel field goal for the game's first score ... He then forced a fumble on a second-quarter Alabama kick return (recovered by **Carlos Davis**) that set up a Chad Kelly touchdown run.

@COACHHUGHFREEZE

Hugh Freeze refers to his tenure at Ole Miss as a “journey.” Suffice it to say the journey has moved at a quicker pace than even Freeze could have imagined.

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation’s top rising coaches, Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels’ 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

In the time since Freeze inherited a team coming off a two-win season and 14 straight Southeastern Conference losses, the Rebels have made three straight bowl appearances and won more games in each season.

He is the first coach in school history to guide the Rebels to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons.

Among the accomplishments in Freeze’s first three years: 24-15 record; two bowl wins; 22 weeks ranked in the nation’s top 25; at least one win over every other SEC West team; three straight top-15 ranked recruiting classes; three straight Vaught-Hemingway Stadium season ticket sellouts and season attendance records; 77 graduated players.

The foundation that was laid in 2012 and 2013 led the way for a memorable campaign last year. Ole Miss played in the very first of the inaugural New Year’s Six bowl games - the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl vs. TCU. The Rebels got there on the strength of the nation’s No. 1 scoring defense (16.0 ppg allowed) and wins over four 10-win teams (Alabama, Boise State, Memphis, Mississippi State) and three conference champions (Alabama, Boise State, Memphis). Freeze led Ole Miss to its most regular-season wins over ranked teams since 1969 and its highest national ranking (No. 3) since 1964.

A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze seems to get the most out of his players every game by emphasizing the importance of playing for the love of teammates instead of self. His leadership has also seen a rise in the team’s grade point average and involvement in service opportunities both locally and abroad, such as spring break mission trips to Panama and Haiti.

The Rebels’ 8-5 record after defeating Georgia Tech 25-17 in the 2013 Music City Bowl gave Ole Miss consecutive winning campaigns for the first time since the 2008-09 seasons. For his efforts, Freeze was named the 2013 FCA Grant Teaff Coach of the Year.

A month after the Rebels capped off a 7-6 season in 2012 with a 38-17 win over Pittsburgh in the BBVA Compass Bowl, Ole Miss was the talk of National Signing Day when Freeze and Co. landed a consensus top-10 class that was ranked as high as No. 2 by 247Sports and No. 5 by ESPN - the highest recorded signing class rankings in school history.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 20 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. Before returning to Oxford, the former Ole Miss assistant experienced a record-setting run at Arkansas State.

With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with a perfect 8-0 mark. In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. The Sun Belt Coach of the Year also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005. Prior to his arrival at Arkansas State, Freeze compiled a 20-5 record over the 2008 and 2009 seasons at the helm of the Lambuth University football program.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - No. 15 Ole Miss scored early and often, while the Rebel defense gave up only a field goal in the fourth quarter en route to a dominating 41-3 win over Vanderbilt in both teams' SEC opener Saturday.

With the exception of that first half against Boise State, Ole Miss coach Hugh Freeze is very happy with how his Rebels have started this season.

Bo Wallace threw for 320 yards and a touchdown to lead the charge. He is now one passing touchdown shy of Jevan Snead (46) for second place on the Rebels' all-time list.

The Rebels (2-0) have beaten Vanderbilt in Nashville in consecutive seasons after the Commodores had won five of the previous six. The Rebels won in dominating fashion with their largest margin of victory against an SEC opponent since beating Mississippi State 45-0 in 2008.

Ole Miss scored on seven of its first eight possessions with the shortest drive covering 67 yards, and the Rebels never punted. Jaylen Walton started the scoring with a 20-yard TD, and I'Tavius Mathers and DeVante Kincade also ran for TDs.

Wallace put the Rebels up 20-0 with a 20-yard TD pass to Cody Core, and he was sacked as the first half ended with Ole Miss threatening to score again. Playing an hour north of his hometown in Pulaski, Tennessee, Wallace had 249 yards by halftime, and his day was done after Mathers' TD with 9:29 left in the third quarter.

Ole Miss outgained Vandy 331-76 in total offense at halftime and finished 547-167. The Rebels also piled up 34 first downs -- the most in a game under Freeze.

Cliff Coleman returned an interception 39 yards less than a minute into the second half, and Mathers, from Murfreesboro, Tennessee, padded the lead to 34-0 with a 2-yard TD run.

Vanderbilt didn't get past midfield against the Rebels until the final couple minutes of the third quarter, and the Commodores had to settle for a field goal after recovering Kincade's fumble at the Ole Miss 5 in the fourth quarter.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — For the second straight year, Ole Miss and Alabama delivered an instant classic on the gridiron. For the second straight year, Ole Miss took down Alabama. Behind five turnovers forced by the Landshark defense, the No. 11 Rebels won 43-37, defeating the No. 2 Crimson Tide in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history.

Playing a night game on the road in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium, Ole Miss led the entire game and left Tuscaloosa victorious for the first time since 1988.

Ole Miss scored at least 43 points for the third consecutive game, marking the first time that feat has ever been accomplished in program history. The 43 points was also the most the Rebels have ever scored in a game played in Tuscaloosa.

Junior quarterback Chad Kelly was calm, cool and collected as he played away from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium for the first time in his Rebel career. He finished the evening completing 18-of-33 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing for a score. Kelly and the Ole Miss offense did not turn the ball over once and recorded 24 points off of the five Alabama turnovers.

A.J. Moore was in on two of the turnovers, recovering the fumble on the opening kick and forcing a fumble on another kick return later in the first half. Trae Elston picked off a pass for the third straight game, while teammate C.J. Johnson has made an interception in back-to-back games. Tony Bridges' interception with 2:36 left in the game was the fifth and final turnover forced by the Landshark defense.

Cody Core caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 73-yard TD. Laquon Treadwell hauled in a team-high five passes for 80 yards, his last catch a 24-yarder in the end zone that ended up being the game-winning score.

Alabama recorded 503 yards of total offense led by running back Derrick Henry and quarterback Jake Coker. Henry rushed 23 times for 127 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss scored early and often Saturday against UT Martin.

The Rebel offense amassed 662 yards and scored 10 touchdowns, while the defense limited the Skyhawks to just 290 yards and scored a TD of its own, as Ole Miss rolled to a 76-3 season-opening win in front of 60,186 fans at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

It marked the most points in a game for Ole Miss and the largest margin of victory since a 92-0 win against West Tennessee Teachers College, now known as Union University, in 1935.

On the first play of the Rebels' second series of the day, senior Jaylen Walton broke free on a draw play up the middle for a 60-yard touchdown run to get Ole Miss on the scoreboard. After the Rebel defense forced a Skyhawk punt, junior Carlos Davis returned it 58 yards to the UT Martin 26, and five plays later Walton danced into the end zone from four yards out for his second TD of the day to put Ole Miss up 13-0.

Walton finished the game with just three carries but gained 65 yards and tied a career-high two TDs.

Following another UT Martin punt, junior quarterback Chad Kelly — making his Ole Miss debut — connected with sophomore Markell Pack for a 56-yard TD pass on the Rebels' first play of the drive. Sophomore Ryan Buchanan entered the game on Ole Miss' next offensive series and capped a 38-yard drive with a 15-yard TD strike to junior wideout Quincy Adebeyejo that put the Rebels up 27-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Ole Miss continued to add to its lead in the second quarter after Buchanan found junior Robert Nkemdiche, who was lined up at tight end, in the flat and Nkemdiche rumbled 31 yards to the end zone to put the Rebels up 34-0. It was Nkemdiche's first career reception and touchdown, and the 6-4, 296-pounder added a blocked field goal later in the quarter. Buchanan finished the game with a pair of TDs and 58 yards on 4-of-6 passing.

The Rebels would score six more touchdowns for a total of 11 on the day.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss scored 76 points last week against UT Martin and quarterback Chad Kelly set out to prove that wasn't a fluke.

The junior signal caller directed the Rebels on seven-straight touchdown drives to start the game, as Ole Miss cruised to a 73-21 victory over Fresno State.

Kelly completed 20-of-25 attempts for 346 yards and four touchdowns of 14, 16, 44 and 50 yards, and added 26 yards and a rushing score on the ground.

Through the first two games of the year the Rebels have scored 149 points - the most in a two-game stretch in school history - and have averaged 634.5 yards of offense.

Ole Miss took the opening kickoff and went 85 yards in 10 plays capped by a 14-yard touchdown pass from Kelly to senior wide out Cody Core. Following a Fresno State three-and-out, the Rebels took over on their own 41 and took just five plays to go 59 yards for another score - a four-yard scoring rush up the middle by Kelly - that put Ole Miss up 14-0 with 8:26 left in the opening quarter.

The Rebels tacked on two more scores in the quarter on a pair of passing TDs from Kelly to Quincy Adebeyejo from 16 and 50 yards to go up 28-0. The 28 points were the most in an opening quarter in Ole Miss modern history (since 1962) surpassing last week's mark of 27 points.

After Fresno State picked off sophomore Ryan Buchanan and returned it 56 yards for a score, Kelly re-entered the game and found Adebeyejo for the third time in the first half on a 44-yard TD strike. Adebeyejo finished the game with five catches for a career-high 120 yards and three scores.

The Ole Miss defense limited Fresno State to just 316 yards and forced four Bulldog turnovers, including a pair of interception returns for TDs.

Junior defensive star Robert Nkemdiche scored a TD in his second-straight game, this time a one-yard plunge up the middle on the Rebels' opening drive of the second half.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — For the second straight year, Ole Miss and Alabama delivered an instant classic on the gridiron. For the second straight year, Ole Miss took down Alabama. Behind five turnovers forced by the Landshark defense, the No. 11 Rebels won 43-37, defeating the No. 2 Crimson Tide in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history.

Playing a night game on the road in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium, Ole Miss led the entire game and left Tuscaloosa victorious for the first time since 1988.

Ole Miss scored at least 43 points for the third consecutive game, marking the first time that feat has ever been accomplished in program history. The 43 points was also the most the Rebels have ever scored in a game played in Tuscaloosa.

Junior quarterback Chad Kelly was calm, cool and collected as he played away from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium for the first time in his Rebel career. He finished the evening completing 18-of-33 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing for a score. Kelly and the Ole Miss offense did not turn the ball over once and recorded 24 points off of the five Alabama turnovers.

A.J. Moore was in on two of the turnovers, recovering the fumble on the opening kick and forcing a fumble on another kick return later in the first half. Trae Elston picked off a pass for the third straight game, while teammate C.J. Johnson has made an interception in back-to-back games. Tony Bridges' interception with 2:36 left in the game was the fifth and final turnover forced by the Landshark defense.

Cody Core caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 73-yard TD. Laquon Treadwell hauled in a team-high five passes for 80 yards, his last catch a 24-yarder in the end zone that ended up being the game-winning score.

Alabama recorded 503 yards of total offense led by running back Derrick Henry and quarterback Jake Coker. Henry rushed 23 times for 127 yards.
