### HONORS FOR JORDAN MATTHEWS: SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK, BILETNIKOFF SEMIFINALIST

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) received two prestigious honors today, being named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Kentucky and selected as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award given annually to the nation's top receiver.

Matthews had a career-high 12 receptions for 141 yards in Vanderbilt's 22-6 win over the 'Cats. He is just four catches shy of becoming the league's all-time leader.

## VANDERBILT LOOKS TO EIGHTH STRAIGHT NOVEMBER WIN UNDER FRANKLIN

Vanderbilt enters the Tennessee game seeking its eighth consecutive win in the month of November.

Vanderbilt's current seven-game win streak in November is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished during the 1923-24 seasons.

The 'Dores under James Franklin are 8-2 in November games. In the decade before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

## COMMODORES ARE 13-4 IN LAST 17 GAMES

The Commodores also own a 13-4 record over their last 17 games.

The 17-game stretch includes a seven-game streak to conclude the 2012 season and a victory in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. It marks the SEC's third best record over that span.

Only two SEC teams, Alabama and Texas A&M, own better records over their last 17 games than the Commodores.

In the 13 wins, Vanderbilt's margin of victory is 20.5 points. Eleven of the victories have come against BCS teams: Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee, Georgia and Florida from the SEC and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the ACC.

All four losses have come to teams not ranked in the AP Top 25.

The 'Dores are also 15-6 dating back to early in the 2012 season.

## OFF. LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON CLOSING IN ON TEAM'S ALL-TIME STARTS RECORD

**Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OL) tied a team record last week in the Kentucky game by making his 48th career start.

Johnson's total ranks second in consecutive starts among SEC players, trailing only UGA QB **Aaron Murray** (50 starts).

Johnson has started at four different line positions: left and right tackle, left guard and center. This year, he has all 10 starts at left tackle.

Johnson shares the all-time Vanderbilt team record of 48 career starts with **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07).

## 'DORES ENJOYING IMPROVED TURNOVER MARGIN

The 'Dores have moved from midpack in the SEC to second in the league in turnover margin by forcing a rash of fumbles and interceptions in the last month.

The defense has forced 16 takeaways in the last four games – 9 picks and 7 fumble recoveries. Vanderbilt has a turnover margin of plus-9 entering the Tennessee game.

## FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

**James Franklin** is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in team history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer **Dan McGugin**, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 21-15 overall. His .583 winning percentage is the best since **Red Sanders** (1940-42, 1946-48) directed the Vanderbilt sidelines.

## SAFETY LADLER PLAYING AT ALL-SEC LEVEL; TOPS LEAGUE IN TWO DEFENSIVE CATEGORIES

Senior **Kenny Ladler** is putting together a superb final season.

Ladler, a third-year starting safety, tops the SEC in forced fumbles, shares the league lead in interceptions and ranks among the leaders in tackles.

Ladler added eight tackles and an INT in the team's 22-6 win over Kentucky last week.

The senior also is on a hot streak. In his last five games, Ladler has four forced fumbles, three interceptions and 46 total tackles.

He has 55 solo stops, five behind Georgia LB **Ramik Wilson**.

Ladler is the team's active career leader with 281 total tackles, 192 solo tackles, eight interceptions and six forced fumbles.

Since official defensive records began, only two former Commodores, LB **Jamie Duncan** in 1996 and LB **Shelton Quarles** in 1991, have registered more forced fumbles in a season than Ladler's current total.

## VANDERBILT OFFENSE HAVING RED-ZONE SUCCESS

The Commodore offense ranks among the most improved in the SEC and NCAA in its success on third downs and inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

This season, Vanderbilt leads the SEC in red-zone success. The 'Dores have scored on 39 of 44 red-zone possessions, a league-high 89% success rate. Through 10 games in 2012, the 'Dores were successful at a 74% clip (25 of 34).

More importantly, Vanderbilt is scoring TDs on red-zone drives at a much higher percentage than last year. The 'Dores have scored TDs on 31 of the 44 possessions, a 70% rate of success. Through 10 games last year, the offense was only half as successful, tallying TDs on just 15 of 34 possessions (44%).

## MORE ON THE TENNESSEE SERIES

The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other team. It is the SEC's fourth most frequently played rivalry. Vanderbilt's 41-18 victory last season ended a 14-game losing streak in games played in Nashville.

## CAREY SPEAR: WUERFFEL AWARD FINALIST AND ALLSTATE-AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM RECIPIENT

In recent weeks, **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) has received two impressive recognitions, earning inclusion as a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and a member of the Allstate/American Football Coaches Association national Good Works Team.

Spear, a native of Mayfield Village, Ohio near Cleveland, becomes the first Commodore student-athlete ever to receive either recognition.

Spear was named among 12 finalists for the Wuerffel Trophy on Nov. 12. The Wuerffel recognition honors the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with outstanding academic and athletic achievement.

Spear was recognized by Allstate officials during a special ceremony Oct. 23 at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital on the Vanderbilt campus. Spear and several teammates were visiting young patients at the hospital when he was surprised with a Good Works Team trophy from the sponsors.

Spear will graduate this May with a degree in Human & Organizational Development.

He is considered among the nation's leading placekickers. An All-SEC recipient in 2012, Spear is 10-of-13 on field goals this year. Earlier this year, he was an early candidate for the Lou Groza Award.

Spear was nominated for the Senior CLASS Award, and was a finalist for the Vanderbilt Outstanding Senior Award in mid-October.

## LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE

### COMMODORES CLAIM FIFTH VICTORY WITH IMPRESSIVE HOME WIN OVER VOLUNTEERS

**NASHVILLE** – The Vanderbilt Commodores ended years of frustration at the hands of their in-state rival Tennessee with one of their best victories in decades.

Making their celebration even sweeter?

The Commodores also ensured Tennessee's third straight losing season, putting Derek Dooley's job status in further jeopardy.

Andre Hal intercepted two passes and Jordan Rodgers threw for two TD as Vanderbilt routed Tennessee 41-18 for the Commodores' fifth straight victory, clinching their first winning record in the regular season since 1982.

The Commodores (7-4, 5-3 SEC) also snapped a 14-game skid against Tennessee at home with their first win in Nashville since 1982 and the most points they've scored against the Vols since a 51-7 win in 1923.

"This is what we all envisioned when we came here, that we could build something special here at Vanderbilt right here in Nashville. We are Nashville's team," Franklin said.

## SIGNIFICANT VANDERBILT WIN VS. KENTUCKY

The 22-6 victory over Kentucky allowed Vanderbilt to even the all-time series with the Wildcats at 41-41-4. The win also marked the Commodores' third straight over Kentucky during James Franklin's tenure at Vanderbilt. Prior to Franklin's arrival, the 'Dores were 2-8 vs. Kentucky in the last decade.

The 'Dores have dominated in the last three games, owning a 100-14 advantage in the total score.

## ADDITIONAL NOTES AND STATS FROM HOME VICTORY OVER KENTUCKY

★ The win was Vanderbilt's sixth of the season, making the Commodores bowl eligible in three straight seasons for the first time in team history.

★ The defense forced five UK turnovers, including four interceptions. It was the most picks in a game this season, and the highest total since Vanderbilt registered five picks in a 30-7 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2011.

★ **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB), **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB), **Andrew Williamson** (R-So., safety) and **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) had the interceptions.

★ **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) made one of the game's biggest plays. After Kentucky went 75 yards for a touchdown on its opening drive, Butler broke through the 'Cats line and blocked the extra point attempt. **Steven Clarke** (R-Sr., CB) ran the ball into the Vanderbilt end zone resulting in a 2-point play.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) topped the rushing attack with 77 yards on 21 attempts. In his last six games, Seymour is averaging 73.5 rushing yards on 17.3 carries.

★ Vanderbilt produced seven defended passes, the most this season.

★ The 12 receptions by **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) was the most by a Vanderbilt receiver since Earl Bennett had 13 catches for 223 yards against Richmond on Sept. 1, 2007.

★ Three different defenders – **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) – contributed two tackles for loss each. As a unit, the Commodore defense registered 10 tackles for loss.

★ Returning to the starting lineup after missing two games, **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) was 19-of-24 for 184 yards. Carta-Samuel connected with **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) with 12 passes.

Carta-Samuels is on pace to achieve the highest passing percentage in modern Vanderbilt history. He is connecting on 67 percent of his throws.

★ **Karl Butler** (R-Sr., LB) topped the defense with six solo tackles, including an impressive tackle for loss early in the game.

★ After allowing an opening 75-yard touchdown drive, the defense held Kentucky to just 187 total yards. After intermission, the Cats produced just five first downs and 93 yards of total offense.

★ Vanderbilt outgained Kentucky 141-16 yards in the fourth quarter, and held possession for 10:51 of the final stanza.

★ **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) tossed his second career TD pass late in the fourth quarter, connecting with **Kris Kentera** (R-So., TE). It was Kentera's second career TD catch.

★ The Commodore offense was 2-of-3 on fourth down attempts, including one conversion that came early in the first quarter deep in Vanderbilt stadium.

Conversely, the defense denied a pair of fourth-down tries by Kentucky.

★ The Commodores outscored Kentucky 13-0 in the fourth quarter. This season, Vanderbilt owns a 111-50 scoring advantage over its opponents in the final quarter.

★ **Brian Kimbrow** (So., RB) gave the Commodores their winning margin with a shifty 21-yard scoring scamper.

★ **Jared Morse** (Sr., DT) produced four solo tackles, the team's only QB sack and knocked down two Wildcat passes.

## MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

### MORE ON MATTHEWS CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS, PAGE 10

After setting a new SEC standard for career receiving yardage two weeks ago, **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) is closing in on another important league record for career receptions.

Matthews needs just four catches to eclipse the SEC mark of 236 career receptions set by former Commodore **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews was named as a semifinalist Nov. 18 for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top receiver.

The senior posted a career-high 12 catches for 141 yards in Vanderbilt's 22-6 win over Kentucky.

In a Oct. 26 game at Texas A&M, Matthews broke the SEC all-time receiving yardage record previously held by former UGA standout WR **Terrence Edwards** (3,093 yards, 1999-2002). Matthews

has 3,358 receiving yards for his career entering the Tennessee game.

Matthews holds four team receiving marks for the Commodores. In addition to the career receiving yardage record, he is the team leader with 22 all-time touchdown catches, 1,323 receiving yards in a season, and 16 games of 100+ receiving yards.

This year, Matthews ranks as the conference leader with 66 receptions. His 107.6-yard receiving average is third best in the league behind only Texas A&M's **Mike Evans** and LSU's **Odell Beckham**.

Matthews also surpassed 100 receiving yards in six games this year. He has amassed at least five catches in every game as a senior.

Matthews' performance in the season opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his Vanderbilt career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels.

The conference's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb stats against SEC opponents. He has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 12 of his last 18 games against SEC teams, averaging 118.4 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 17 of his last 22 games.

## 2013 OFFENSE ON PACE TO REGISTER ONE OF TOP SEASONS IN MODERN TEAM HISTORY

The Vanderbilt offense is on pace to produce one of the finest campaigns in modern team history.

Through 10 games, the unit is averaging 31.3 points, which would rank as the team's highest single-season average since Dan McGugin's potent Commodore teams in the World War I era. The offense established a modern day scoring standard in 2012 with a 30.0-point average.

The unit also are averaging 371.2 total yards – 233.8 passing and 137.4 rushing.

The attached chart shows a Commodore unit that compares with the 2012 offense that ranked among the team's best ever, and is improved from James Franklin's initial offense in 2011. The current offense is vastly improved over the 2010 unit, the last prior to Franklin's arrival.

Through 10 games, the current offense is averaging 5.7 points more than the 2012 unit that featured a 2,500-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver.

## SUPERB SPECIAL TEAMS CONTRIBUTIONS CONTINUES TO PAY DIVIDENDS FOR 'DORES

Vanderbilt special teams again paved the way for a Commodore win last week. Impressive performances from various special team units was on display throughout the 22-6 victory over Kentucky.

First-year starter **Taylor Hudson** (R-So.) helped the Commodores to gains in valuable field possession by averaging 46.4 yards on five punts. One of Hudson's efforts went for 69 yards and was downed inside the UK 10-yard line.

**Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) was 2-of-3 on field goals, converting from 26 and 38 yards after misfiring from 34 yards.

Spear also was invaluable as a kickoff specialist. The 'Cats returned just one of Spear's five kickoffs, with the lone UK effort totalling 13 yards.

The 'Dores rank No. 2 in the NCAA in kickoff coverage, holding opponents to a measly 15.1-yard average on 17 returns. This year, 39 of Spear's 56 kickoffs have resulted in touchbacks.

Another special teams' unit that contributed a huge play against Kentucky was the PAT block squad. After **Adam Butler** (R-Fr.) broke through the UK formation to block the 'Cats only extra point try, **Steven Clarke** (Sr.) ran the ball 75 yards for a Commodore safety.

## LADLER, HAL, AZUBIKE, WOESTMANN TOP DEFENSE

**Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) and **Darreon Herring** (So., LB) are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 57 solo tackles and 81 total stops. He had eight tackles and an INT in the win vs. Kentucky. Herring is second with 70 total stops and third behind **Jovan Marshall** (Sr., safety) in solo stops.

DE **Caleb Azubike** has the most tackles for loss (9.5) while DE **Kyle Woestmann** has the team lead in QB sacks (5.5).

**Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with 14 passes defended.

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since QB **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned a team record-tying 48th consecutive career start in the win vs. Kentucky.

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 40 solo stops and 66 total tackles.

### JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Award candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in six of 10 games, leads the SEC with 83 catches and ranks 2nd with 1,076 receiving yards.

### WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

May has 29 total tackles, 2.5 QB sacks & 7 tackles for loss in nine starts,

### CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior is 10-of-13 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more. He also scored on a TD on a fake FG attempt vs. Georgia. Spear has also been one of the SEC's top kickoff specialists as a senior.

## TE DILLON VAN DER WAL NEWEST COMMODORE TO EARN FIRST START

**Dillon van der Wal** (R-So., TE) became the latest player to earn his initial start as a Commodore when Vanderbilt defeated Florida Nov. 9.

The Commodores also had three first-time starters, **Patton Robinette** (QB), **Paris Head** (CB) and **Torren McGaster** (CB), in their previous game at Texas A&M. Robinette was 15-of-28 for 216 yards and a TD vs. the Aggies. Head and McGaster contributed three and two tackles, respectively.

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps Wildcats to 7-6 record in 2006, topped by a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. K-State plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason game in three years... Under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense in 2007 becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 1st-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets many school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-American by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... Nelson is a starting receiver for Green Bay.

**Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) contributed four blocks that led directly to Commodore touchdowns in Vanderbilt's 31-27 victory vs. nationally ranked Georgia on Oct. 19.

Johnson has been recognized by the SEC more than any Vanderbilt player. The honor vs. UGA marked the fourth time the conference has recognized Johnson.

## SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: CALEB AZUBIKE, DE • VS. FLORIDA

**Caleb Azubike** (So., DE) contributed two quarterback sacks, four total tackles and a pair of hurries in Vanderbilt's 34-17 victory at Florida.

It marked the first SEC weekly honor for Azubike. It also was the first recognition this season for any Commodore defensive player.

## MORE ON 'DORE OFFENSIVE LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) has played four offensive line positions along with tight end while tying a school record with 48 consecutive starts.

But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

★ Johnson has been flagged for just two holding penalties during his 48-game career.

★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 7.5 sacks on 1,213 career pass attempts, or one sack every 165 pass plays.

★ Johnson did not allow a single QB sack in 2012. He has allowed two sacks this year.

★ Johnson has produced 212 knockdown blocks, 70 intimidation blocks and 131 blocks that led to a Commodore TD or first down.

★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two offensive TDs for the last 3+ seasons.

★ Johnson has played 3,026 career snaps: 2,133 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 76 at tight end. He has played 98.5 percent of the team's snaps over the last 3+ years.

## COMMODORE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

Vanderbilt's offensive point production through 10 games ranks favorably with the highest season averages in team history.

The Commodores rank eighth in the SEC with a 31.3-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 1.3 points higher than in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points. The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the program's highest single-season total since the 1915 Commodore squad averaged 51.4 points.

The increased scoring continues a trend the Commodores started at midseason one year ago. In its last 16 games, the Vanderbilt offense is averaging 35.6 points.

(202.3 yards) and **Mike Evans** and **Malcome Kennedy** of Texas A&M (186.9 yards).

While Matthews ranks No. 1 in the SEC with 83 receptions and second with 1,076 receiving yards, Krause also is enjoying a break-through season. The three-year starter has established new season highs with 32 catches, 608 receiving yards and three TD catches.

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) has established himself as one of the finest receivers to ever wear the Black & Gold. As he pushes beyond midseason of his final year, Matthews is starting to make a strong case for inclusion among the greatest receivers in SEC history.

with a 107.6-yard average. He trails only **Mike Evans** of Texas A&M (126.3 yards).

Last Saturday, he also totalled 141 receiving yards in the 'Dore victory.

During the Oct. 26 effort at A&M, Matthews broke the SEC career receiving yardage record previously held by former Georgia WR **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002). He has 3,358 receiving yards.

Matthews also set the Vanderbilt team record Oct. 5 against Missouri with his 22nd career touchdown catch.

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., has been voted one of 10 semifinalists for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, which is given to the nation's leading receiver.

Through 10 games, Matthews also is on target to become the first receiver in SEC history to catch 100 passes in a season.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in six games this year, extending his school and SEC career record to 16 games of at least 100 receiving yards.

He also opened the year with a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole Miss, and added 106 yards at South Carolina.

Later, he produced 123 receiving yards against Missouri and 111 yards vs. Austin Peay.

Matthews has been sensational against SEC competition this year. He has 61 catches for 774 receiving yards in seven conference games.

Matthews posted staggering numbers during a superb junior campaign when he earned First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America recognition. Matthews' 94-reception total in 2012 is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks fifth on the SEC single-season charts.

## RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

## SPEAR SETS THIRD TEAM FIELD GOAL RECORD; HAS CONVERTED 80% OF FIELD GOALS THIS YEAR

Coming off the best season ever by a Vandy placekicker, senior **Carey Spear** has continued his excellent form in 2013.

The early-season Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yards during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

Spear was 2-of-3 on field goals vs. Kentucky, and has converted four field goals in the last two games. He also scored a TD on a fake FG vs. Georgia.

A second-team AP All-SEC recipient in 2012 after setting a team records with 20 field goals and 87 points, Spear is 8-of-10 on FGs this year.

Spear's career total of 168 points ranks fourth all-time among Vanderbilt kickers. He passed Johnny Clark (1966-69) during the Kentucky performance.

Spear is a two-year starting placekicker and four-year starter at kickoff specialist. He is also the first Commodore player to be voted captain for three consecutive seasons since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected in 2003-05.

## HUDSON SOLID AS COMMODORE PUNTER

**Taylor Hudson** (R-So.) has earned the respect of teammates and SEC observers as a first-year starting punter. Hudson has been superb as the replacement of 2012 All-SEC recipient **Richard Kent**.

The former prep quarterback is averaging 43.7 yards. He also has a solid net punt average of 38.7 yards. Hudson averaged 46.4 yards on five punts in the win vs. Kentucky.

Hudson has punts of 50 yards or more in seven of 10 games.

## LASSING, HUDSON NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE DISTRICT III ALL-ACADEMIC SQUAD

Two of Vanderbilt top scholar athletes, **Fitz Lassing** (Sr., FB) and **Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) have been named to the Capital One/CoSIDA Academic District III football team.

Lassing, a senior from Montgomery Bell Academy in Nashville, and Hudson, a redshirt sophomore from Olentangy Liberty H.S. in Powell, Ohio, are under consideration for the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team.

Lassing and Hudson are the first Commodore football players to earn Academic All-District recognition since linebacker John Stokes and receiver John Cole were recognized in 2010.

The last Vanderbilt scholar athlete to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team honors was linebacker Hunter Hillenmeyer in 2002. That year, Hillenmeyer also earned National Scholar Athlete status.

Lassing returned to the Commodore starting lineup at Florida, providing several key lead blocks from his fullback position in the Vanderbilt victory. On the season, he has three pass receptions for 18 yards and one touchdown.

Lassing is expected to earn an undergraduate degree in Economics in May. He holds a 3.9 GPA and is a multiple SEC Academic Honor Roll and Dean's List recipient.

Hudson has been superb as a first-year starting punter. He ranks among the nation's top 25 punters with a 43.3-yard average, and owns one of the top net averages in the SEC. He also is a candidate for the Ray Guy Award.

Hudson holds a 3.78 GPA as he works toward a Bachelor's degree in Neuroscience from the College of Arts and Science.

## FRANKLIN'S COMMODORES ARE 10-1 IN NON-SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE PLAY

Vanderbilt captured its sixth straight regular season win against a non-SEC member when it defeated UAB 52-24 on Sept. 28.

Besides UAB, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay and UMass, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 10-1 (.909) in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 11-2 overall (.846) against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt is 22-14 (.611) against regular season non-SEC teams.

## SIGNIFICANT VANDERBILT WIN IN THE SWAMP

The 34-17 victory over Florida Nov. 9 ended decades of Vanderbilt struggles facing the Gators in the Swamp.

★ It marked Vanderbilt's first victory on the Florida campus since a 7-0 shutout in 1945. That game, held just months after World War II ended, was Vanderbilt's trip visit to Gainesville. Until Saturday, the Commodores were 0-19-1 in the Swamp since the 1945 win.

★ The victory also ended 22 years of Commodore frustration in the series. The win was Vanderbilt's first over the Gators since 1988,

★ The 17-point winning margin was the Commodores widest margin of victory in the series since a 20-0 shutout in 1946.

## COMMODORES ON RECORD POINTS STREAK

The Commodores continue to build on a consecutive games stretch of scoring at least 21 points.

Vanderbilt's 22-point total in the win over Kentucky was the 15th consecutive time the Commodore offense has reached 21 points.

The scoring streak ranks as a new standard for the Commodore program. Never in the 124-year history of Vanderbilt football, including the early 1900s when Dan McGugin's teams routinely averaged 40+ points, have the Commodores duplicated the current scoring streak.

## FORMER STANDOUT JIMMY WILLIAMS RECOGNIZED AS PROGRAM'S 2013 SEC LEGEND

**Jimmy Williams**, a standout RB/DB from 1997-2000, will be saluted as Vanderbilt's Legend as part of SEC Championship activities this December in Atlanta. Williams was an All-SEC performer who started for the Commodores as a running back, cornerback and return specialist.

## DEFENSE IMPRESSES IN WINS OVER GEORGIA, FLORIDA & KENTUCKY

The Vanderbilt defense has registered three of its best efforts in recent wins over Georgia, Florida and Kentucky. The unit held Kentucky scoreless after allowing a touch-down on the opening Wildcat possession. After that drive, Kentucky managed just 187 total yards on 56 plays.

The defense also produced a season-high by picking off four Kentucky passes.

On Nov. 9, the unit helped Vanderbilt to its first win in Gainesville since 1945 by limiting Florida to 39 rushing yards and forcing four critical turnovers in a 34-17 victory.

Three weeks earlier, face facing one of the SEC's most potent attacks, the unit held Georgia to season lows in every virtual offensive category, including rushing yards (107), first downs (16), total yards (221) and points scored (27). UGA QB **Aaron Murray**, the league's all-time leader in passing yardage, threw for only 114 yards, his third lowest total in a 49-game career, and failed to complete a TD pass for just the third time in his last 31 appearances.

Trailing by 10 points at intermission, the 'Dore defense frustrated Murray and the Bulldog offense in the second half. Georgia managed just five first downs and 80 total yards after halftime. The Bulldogs' only second-half points came on a 23-yard field goal.

The 221 yards of total offense by Georgia was the fewest Vanderbilt has allowed to an SEC opponent since Auburn managed just 212 yards in a 17-13 'Dore victory on Oct. 20, 2012.

## QB CARTA-SAMUELS IMPRESSIVE; POSTED CONSECUTIVE 300+YARDS

**Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB in 2009-10 at the University of Wyoming, is averaging 238.9 passing yards and 252.9 yards of total offense in seven starts. He has also completed 10 TD passes and ran for five more scores. He has been extremely accurate, hitting on 65.5% of his passes.

Carta-Samuels started last week in Vanderbilt's 22-6 win over Kentucky, completing 19-of-24 passes for 184 yards.

He threw for 338 yards and two TDs against Missouri on Oct. 5, one week after throwing for 334 yards and two TDs in a win over UAB on Sept. 28.

### TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

### MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

### SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

### UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

### WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

### FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

### FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

### DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

## MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

## VANDERBILT ANNOUNCES FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

**BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL** When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

**JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL** Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

**JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING** Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

**DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE** Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

**JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE** A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

**CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL** Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

**JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL** Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Corbin Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.

Franklin praised the 24-player class that ranks among the finest recruiting achievements of any coaching staff in the nation. According to Rivals.com, the class ranks 19th nationally, making it the highest ranked collection of signees in Commodore history.

The 2013 class includes 11 players on offense, 12 on defense and one kicker. It features three prep All-Americans and 12 players that earned rare four-star evaluations from national recruiting services. Fifteen members of the class made appearances in prestigious postseason all-star games.

Just three members of the class – **Jordan Cunningham** (WR), **Latevius Rayford** (WR) and **Darrius Sims** (CB) – have played for the Commodores this year.

## COMMODORE NOTCH FIRST VICTORY IN THE SWAMP SINCE WORLD WAR II
