### OPENING KICK

★ Vanderbilt travels to Bowling Green, Ky. for the first time in school history for just the fifth meeting all time against the Hilltoppers. VU is 3-1 all-time against Western Kentucky.

★SEC rushing leader RB Ralph Webb moved into fourth all-time in career rushing at Vanderbilt and needs 708 yards to break Zac Stacy's school record.

★ The Commodores square off against their second Conference USA team this season after beating Middle Tennessee earlier this year. The Dores played WKU and Middle Tennessee last year and will play both again next season.

★ QB Kyle Shurmur completed a career-best 17 passes at Georgia Tech while passing for a season-high 149 yards. Shurmur's TD pass to WR Kalija Lipscomb gave him TD passes in consecutive games for the first time in his career.

**Last time vs. Western Kentucky**

**NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP)** -- Perhaps it's only fitting that Vanderbilt's comeback hopes Thursday died with a failed two-point conversion attempt.

All night long, the Commodores stumbled whenever they got near the end zone. Joe Brown stopped Nathan Marcus a yard shy of the goal line on a two-point conversion attempt with 33 seconds left to preserve Western Kentucky's 14-12 victory over Vanderbilt on Thursday night. Earlier in the game, Vanderbilt had failed to score on three separate trips inside Western Kentucky's 10-yard line.

"I thought all the way to the end we were going to win this game," Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason said. "I came into this game that way, and I felt that way all the way through. I'm confident about what this football team can accomplish."

Vanderbilt's comeback hopes instead fell a yard short.

**WEBB CHASING STACY, VANDY RUSHING RECORD**

Ralph Webb entered his junior season chasing history and former Commodore Zac Stacy.

Webb started the season eighth all-time in rushing at Vanderbilt but has moved up to fourth on the list with his 377 yards rushing in the first three games of the season - including a career-high 211 yards against Middle Tennessee - passing Lonnie Sadler, Jared McGrath, Jermaine Johnson and Jamie O'Rourke.

Webb rushed for 1,152 yards last season - the most ever by a Vanderbilt sophomore - to run his career total to 2,059 yards in just two seasons on the gridiron for VU. Webb's 1,152 yards came up just 41 yards short of Stacy's single-season Vanderbilt record of 1,193 yards set in 2011.

In his two years carrying the ball for the Commodores, Webb already owns the second-most yards in a single-season at Vanderbilt and the eighth-most yards in a single season, set in 2014 with 907 yards a VU freshman record. Webb owns rushing records for sophomores and freshman at VU already. Stacy set the school record as a junior and followed it up with 1,141 yards as a senior in 2012.

Webb became the first Vandy rusher to top the 1,000-yard mark since that 2012 season by Stacy and just the fifth VU running back to ever cross the milestone. Stacy is the only Commodore in history to post two 1,000-yard seasons.

**SIMS CLOSING IN ON KICK RETURN RECORD**

Darrius Sims is running up the record book at Vanderbilt in kickoff return yards.

The senior from Memphis, Tenn. began the season third all-time at VU in kick return yards trailing only Tony Jackson (1989-93) and record holder Mark Johnson (1986-90).

Sims has returned six kicks for 152 yards this season, including three for 57 yards last week at Georgia Tech.

Last year, the Commodores split games between those same two teams – dropping a narrow 14-12 decision to WKU in the opener and defeating Middle Tennessee 17-13 on the road to snap a three-game slide against the Blue Raiders.

Vanderbilt is set to play the same two Conference USA teams next season with a season-opening trip to Middle Tennessee before hosting Western Kentucky later in the 2017 season.

**COMMODORES IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY**

Vanderbilt enters the second game of a three-game, non-conference stretch having won 14 of its last 20 encounters against non-SEC opponents, including the win over Middle Tennessee two weeks ago.

Since the 2011 opener, Vanderbilt is 16-6 against non-SEC teams in regular season action – and 18-6 overall against non-SEC foes including bowl appearances.

In 2015, the Commodores were 2-2 in non-SEC play, defeating Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee, and losing to Western Kentucky and Houston.

**IRON WEBB**

Junior Ralph Webb has been a workhorse for the Commodores in his two-plus years of action on West End. The Gainesville, Fla. native has started all 27 games of his career and enters the season with the most career starts on the VU roster.

Webb has also carried the rock for the Doers, racking up 556 carries in his three seasons, including a school-record 277 last year.

On the other side of the ball, seniors Adam Butler and Torren McGaster have the most career starts with 26 each. Will Holden holds the second-most career starts behind Webb on offense with 25.

### SHURMUR TO LIPSCOMB

The connection between sophomore QB Kyle Shurmur and true freshman WR Kalija Lipscomb is beginning to blossom for Vanderbilt.

Shurmur found Lipscomb six times for 59 yards and a touchdown last week at Georgia Tech. The six completions to Lipscomb helped Shurmur complete a career-best 17 passes. Shurmur has thrown touchdown passes in two straight games for the first time in his career with TD tosses against Middle Tennessee and Georgia Tech.

The six receptions and 59 yards established new career marks for Lipscomb in just his third collegiate game. He is the only true freshman on the Vandy roster to start all three games this season. The New Orleans native leads the Commodores with eight receptions for 90 yards and has both of Vanderbilt's receiving scores this season.

### ZACH THE TACKLER

Zach Cunningham has picked up where he left off the 2015 season, as a tackling machine.

The junior led the Commodores with 12 tackles in the season opener to register his fifth straight game with at least 10 tackles dating back to last season when he made a team-best 103 stops.

He followed up with 10 more tackles against Middle Tennessee to extend the streak to six games and push his total to 80 tackles over his last nine games.

He finally saw his streak of double digit tackle games come to an end with seven solo stops at Georgia Tech.

Through three games he ranks second in the league in tackles with 29 and tackles for loss with 5.5.

The Pinson, Ala. native finished 2015 in a flurry, racking up 10 tackles against Florida and Kentucky, 14 against Texas A&M and

10 solo tackles against Tennessee.

He has also been in opponents backfields, making 16.0 tackles for loss over his last nine games, including a game-high three against the Gamecocks.

### BLACK & GOLD ZONE

Vanderbilt's offense has began the season a remarkable 10-for-10 in the red zone, scoring points in all 10 trips inside the 20-yard line.

The Commodores' offense scored points in both trips inside the red zone against South Carolina in the season opener and kept the trend going with seven scores in seven attempts in the red zone against Middle Tennessee. Last week, VU's lone trip into the red zone produced the Commodores' only touchdown of the game.

VU is one of 23 teams in the nation to be perfect in the red zone through the first three weeks, including fellow SEC teams Alabama (9/9) and Tennessee (7/7).

The Commodores struggled in the red zone a year ago, converting just 21-of-33 trips into points. Vanderbilt did not have a game last year in which they scored points in every trip into the red zone.

Vanderbilt took it's opening possession 75 yards down the field on 11 plays last week at Georgia Tech for seven points, marking the first time this season the Commodores scored a touchdown on the team's opening drive.

The TD pass from Kyle Shurmur to Kalija Lipscomb gave the Dores the score. Vandy has scored on each of its first drives in the last two games. A 32-yard Tommy Openshaw field goal put points on the board on Vandy's initial drive against Middle Tennessee two weeks ago.

The 75-yard scoring drive matched the Commodores' longest scoring drive of the season, matching Vanderbilt's touchdown drive against Middle Tennessee from two weeks ago.

- Kalija Lipscomb set new career-bests with six catches for 59 yards.
- Taurean Ferguson picked off his first pass of the year with an interception in the end zone in the second half.
- Caleb Scott caught a season-high three passes for 31 yards.
- Zach Cunningham's streak of six straight games with at least 10 tackles ended with him making seven stops in the loss.
- LaDarius Wiley led Vanderbilt with a career-best eight tackles.
- Dare Odeyingbo made his first career sack in the second half.
- Vanderbilt scored on its first possession of the game, marching 75 yards in 11 plays for the team's first opening possession TD of the year.
- The Commodores passed for 71 yards and rushed for 68 yards in the first half.
- Vanderbilt completed passes to nine different receivers led by Lipscomb's six receptions.
- The Commodores passed for a season-high 190 yards.
- VU allowed 165 yards and two TDs on the first two drives of the game but recovered to allow 125 yards and a field goal over Georgia Tech's next four drives of the first half.
- Vanderbilt has forced at least one turnover in every game this season and has a turnover margin of +3.
- Ryley Guay saw his first action as a Commodore, handling the kickoff duties.
- Sam Loy averaged 40.1 yards on eight punts in the game.



**DEREK MASON:  
HEAD COACH & DEFENSIVE  
COORDINATOR**

Head coach Derek Mason is on a very short list of head coaches that also serve as their own offensive or defensive coordinators in college football.

Mason and San Diego State head coach Rocky Long are the only two head coaches in the country that run both the team and the defense. Mason and Long are two of eight college head coaches to serve as both head coach and coordinator joining head coaches that run the other side of the ball with Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson, Massachusetts' Mark Whipple, New Mexico State's Doug Martin, Washington State's Mike Leach, Kansas' David Beaty and Tulsa's Philip Montgomery running their respective teams' offenses.

Mason, Beaty, Johnson and Leach are the only ones to pull double duty at the Power 5 level. Mason and Johnson will put their teams on the field against each other on September 17 in Atlanta when the Commodores travel to Atlanta to take on Johnson's Yellow Jackets.

**VANDERBILT COACHES  
YOUNGEST IN SEC**

Vanderbilt's coaching staff has skewed much younger this year under Derek Mason in his third season. During the offseason, Mason hired former Vanderbilt All-SEC LB and 27-year-old Chris Marve to coach the team's linebackers and former Oklahoma DL and 34-year-old C.J. Ah You to coach the Commodores' defensive line. Adding Marve and Ah You to the coaching staff dropped the Dores' average age on the coaching staff to 41.6. Mason's staff is the youngest staff in the Southeastern Conference, narrowly in front of South Carolina's new coaching staff. Marve and Ah You join Marc Mattioli (29), Cortez Hankton (35) and new offensive line coach Cameron Norcross (39) as VU coaches to begin the season under 40-years-old.

The SEC by average age (44.5) is the second-youngest league among the Power 5 conferences led by the Atlantic Coast Conference with an average coach age of 43.9. The SEC is in front of the Pac-12 (44.7), Big 12 (44.7) and the Big 10 (45.1).

**LOADS OF EXPERIENCE  
BACK FOR VU IN '16**

The Vanderbilt roster is loaded with experience coming into the 2016 season with eight returning starters on offense, seven on defense and kicker Tommy Openshaw back. The Commodores' skill positions return virtually everyone from a year ago led by QB Kyle Shurmur. The now sophomore quarterback led Vandy to Southeastern Conference wins over Missouri and Kentucky as part of his five-game starting stretch as a true freshman. Ralph Webb is back after a record-setting sophomore campaign that saw him rush for more yards than any Vanderbilt sophomore in history with 1152 yards. The receiving corps welcomes back Trent Sherfield, Darrius Sims and Caleb Scott while the line has Barrett Gouger, Bailey Granier and Will Holden back up front.

Defensively, Vanderbilt is happy to have first team All-SEC LB Zach Cunningham back in the middle of the defense. The now junior led VU with 103 tackles last year as a sophomore and will get more help this year with the return of Nigel Bowden to the defense. Bowden missed the majority of last year

after suffering a concussion. Nehemiah Mitchell started seven games last year as a linebacker but has made the move to the defensive line and joins Adam Butler and Nifae Lealao up front for the Dores' D. The Vandy secondary returns nearly intact with the return of three starters. Torren McGaster, Tre Herndon and Oren Burks are all back with Burks transitioning into the created Star position in Mason's defense. Burks will now serve as a hybrid safety-linebacker.

**JELKS, STANKAVAGE  
SIDELINED FOR SEASON**

OL Andrew Jelks and QB Shawn Stankavage will be sidelined for the 2016 season with injuries. It's the second straight season missed for Jelks due to injury and second in the last three years for Stankavage.

Jelks has started 22 games in his career but has not played since 2014.

**VU 2017 SCHEDULE HAS  
SEVEN HOME GAMES**

Vanderbilt is set to host seven home games in 2017.

Despite opening on the road at Middle Tennessee, the Commodores will play their most home games at Vanderbilt Stadium since 2014.

The Dores welcome Alabama to West End for the first time since 2007 and match up with the Tide for the first time since 2011.

Vandy continues its series with local teams Middle Tennessee and Western Kentucky and begin a series with Kansas State. The Commodores and Wildcats last played in 1984, when VU opened the season with a 26-14 win over KSU.

Torey Agee is the son of Tommy Agee, who played at Auburn as Bo Jackson's lead blocker before leading Emmitt Smith for the Cowboys.

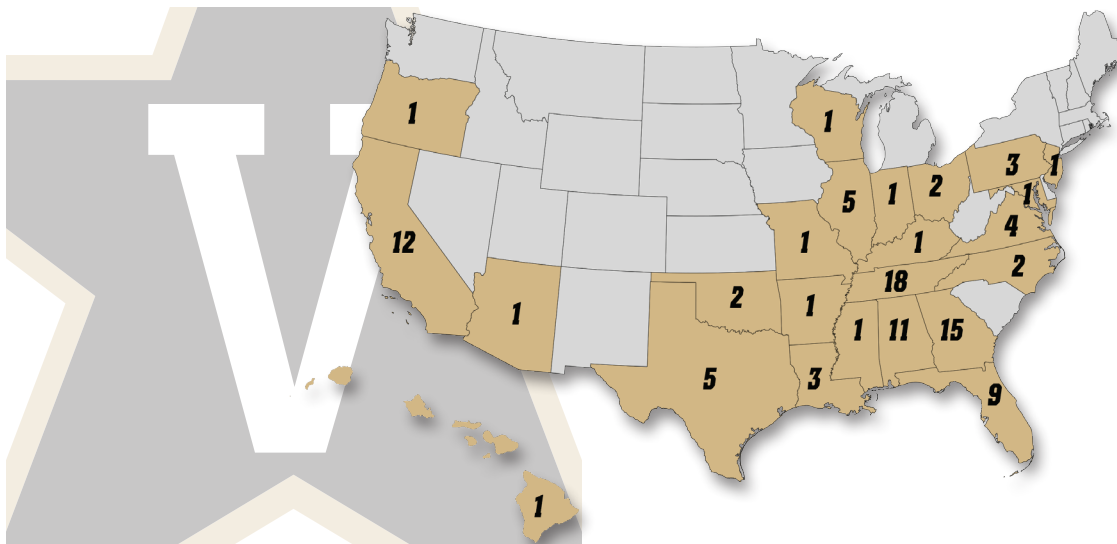
Jaire George is the son of former Titans legend and Heisman Trophy winner Eddie George.

### FOUR NEW COACHES ON STAFF FOR 2016

Heading into his third season at Vanderbilt head coach Derek Mason has just one original member of his coaching staff in Gerry Gdowski remaining on the staff. But Gdowski has a new role for the 2016 campaign as the former Nebraska QB now coaches the Commodores' QBs. Former QBs coach and offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig traded spots with Gdowski and now coaches the Dores' tight ends.

Four new coaches have joined the staff in veteran coaches Jeff Genyk and Cameron Norcross along with young coaches C.J. Ah You and Chris Marve rounding out Mason's staff.

Genyk brings head coaching experience to the table, having served as the head coach at Eastern Michigan 2004-08. He also has stops as an assistant at Northwestern, California, Nevada and Wisconsin. He joins VU from Northwestern, where he served as a quality control for the Wildcats. For the Dores, Genyk serves as the teams special teams coordinator and running backs coach.

Norcross coached in the Mountain West Conference for 15 years prior to his move to West End, coaching for 11 years at his alma mater, Nevada, and four years at Fresno State most recently. He helped the Bulldogs to an 11-2 season in 2013 and helped Nevada head coach Chris Ault develop an innovative offense for the Wolfpack.

Ah You joins the Commodores from Oklahoma, where he played for Bob Stoops prior to an NFL career. Back with the Sooners, Ah You served as a defensive quality control assistant working with the team's defensive line. He was a seventh round pick of the Buffalo Bills in 2007 but played six seasons with St. Louis, ending his career after the 2012 season.

Marve is no stranger to Vanderbilt having earned All-SEC honors with the Commodores as a LB in 2010 and 2011. Marve led the Dores in tackles in 2009 and 2011, including a remarkable 121 total tackles in 2009 which made him the last Dore to surpass 100 tackles in a season until Zach Cunningham did it last year with 103 tackles. The Memphis, Tenn. native owns three degrees from Vanderbilt.

### CUNNINGHAM, WEBB ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Zach Cunningham and Ralph Webb enter their junior seasons with numerous accolades, including being named to a pair of awards watch lists.



Cunningham is on the Bednarik Award watch list after a stellar 2015 that saw him earn first team All-SEC honors. The Bednarik Award is given annually to the nation's best defensive player.

Webb finds himself on the Doak Walker Award watch list. The Gainesville, Fla. native became just the fifth Commodore to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark last season, rushing for 1,152 yards. The Doak Walker is awarded annually to college football's top running back.



### BURKS NAMED TO GOOD WORKS TEAM

Oren Burks has been named to the Allstate/AFCA Good Works Team for his accomplishments on and off the field.

As a student, Burks has become a key leader on the Vanderbilt campus. He has been elected president of Vanderbilt's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2016-17 calendar year after serving as a Commodore football representative in last year.

He is a co-founder of the Revitalizing & Empowering Vanderbilt's African-American Male Population (REVAMP) student organization in 2015, and helped coordinate a series of on-campus lectures and activities during the school year. REVAMP was recognized as the university's top new student organization last spring.





**THREE COMMODORES EARN PRESEASON ALL-SEC NOD**

A trio of Commodores earned preseason recognition from the league’s coaches last week when LB Zach Cunningham and RB Ralph Webb were tabbed second team All-SEC and LB/S Oren Burks was tabbed as a third team member.

Cunningham is coming off a first team All-SEC season as a sophomore last year when he led the Commodores in tackles (103), tackles for loss (16.5) and sacks (4.5).

Webb enters his junior season needing 1,085 yards to break

Zac Stacy’s all-time rushing record. Webb rushed for 1,152 yards as a sophomore last season - the most ever by a sophomore at Vanderbilt - on a school record 277 carries. Webb holds the record for rushing yards for sophomores and freshmen (907). Stacy holds the record for rushing yards for a junior with 1,193, which is also the school single-season record.

Burks moves into the Vanderbilt defense’s new star position this year after posting a solid sophomore season in 2015. He made a career-high 58 tackles and led the Commodores with three interceptions.

The nod from the league’s coaches adds to the media voting Cunningham and Webb to their All-SEC second team at SEC Media Days in July.

**WELCOME TO POLY-VILLE**

The Vandy roster features an island-like feel to it in 2016 with three players coming from Polynesian descent.

Junior Nifae Lealao is the elder statesman of the trio and has been joined by freshmen Josiah Sa’o and Sean Auwae-McMoore. Sa’o plays alongside Lealao on the defensive line with Auwae-McMoore on the offensive line. Auwae-McMoore calls Hawaii home while Lealao and Sa’o both call California home.

Vanderbilt’s soccer team joined the Polynesian party, adding freshman Taiana Tolleson to the growing ‘ohana’ (family) at Vanderbilt.

Even with four Polynesians in athletics on West End, the most famous Polynesian in Nashville remains Heisman Trophy winner and Tennessee Titans QB Marcus Mariota.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON**

WR Caleb Scott and DB Donovan Sheffield are second-generation Commodores. Both following their dad’s collegiate path through Vanderbilt

Scott is the son of former Commodore TE Chuck Scott (1981-84). Scott’s dad was a 1983 All-America and two-time All-SEC pick who still ranks T-3rd all-time among Commodores with 20 TD catches, sixth in receiving yards (2,219), and seventh in receptions (145).

Caleb Scott produced his best season at VU last year, catching 24 passes for 339 yards and two TDs.

Sheffield is the son of DB Robert Sheffield (1993-95). Sheffield’s dad was a three-year letterwinner at cornerback from 1993-95.

Donavan Sheffield played in six games as a freshman in 2015, making five tackles, including two for loss.

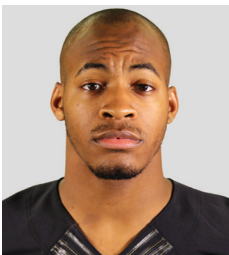

**NASHVILLE** – Will Muschamp had no worries about sending Elliott Fry out for the longest field goal of his career. Even though this was the coach's first game with South Carolina, he had seen the kicker connect repeatedly in clutch situations.

Fry kicked a career-long 55-yard field goal with 35 seconds left, and the South Carolina Gamecocks rallied from a 10-point halftime deficit to beat Vanderbilt 13-10 Thursday night in Muschamp's debut as head coach.

Muschamp started Orth at quarterback and also played freshman Brandon McIlwain. But it was Orth who went back into the game in the third quarter and threw for 152 yards rallying the Gamecocks to their eighth straight victory over Vanderbilt in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

Vanderbilt now is 0-3 in season openers under coach Derek Mason, though his Commodores did manage to score an offensive touchdown in the first half. But Tommy Openshaw missed a 45-yard field goal wide left with 3:44 left, and Vandy turned it over on downs with 14 seconds left.

"Every decision we made will be questioned," Mason said. "The bottom line is we didn't win this game. Now we have to get back to next week and play MTSU."

Fry also kicked a 48-yard field goal in the third quarter, and Deebo Samuel atoned for a fumbled punt in the first quarter by scoring an 8-yard TD on an end-around with 7:30 left. Fry had total confidence he could connect from 55 after barely coming up short from 62 in warmups.

**NASHVILLE** – Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason turned the lights out in the locker room for 10 minutes during a weather delay that lasted for an hour, 44 minutes. He wanted his Commodores to picture themselves playing good football.

Aside from a blocked punt on the first play once the game resumed, Ralph Webb and the Commodores did just that.

Webb ran for a career-high 211 yards and two touchdowns as Vanderbilt easily handled the weather delay and beat Middle Tennessee 47-24 Saturday. "We did what this team hasn't done since I've been here," Mason said. "I mean just responded all the way around."

Vanderbilt (1-1) took control with a 28-point second quarter after trailing 10-5 at the end of the first, the final two TDs coming after the storm. Middle Tennessee blocked a field goal on the first play after resuming the game, setting up Brent Stockstill's 5-yard TD pass to Ty Lee to pull within 19-17.

The Commodores answered by scoring two TDs in a span of 87 seconds, the last a 3-yard TD by Webb giving him 102 yards before halftime. Vanderbilt also forced two turnovers to win its second straight in this series against an in-state rival.

Stockstill finished with 399 yards passing and three TDs for Middle Tennessee (1-1), which was trying to start 2-0 for the first time since 2001.

Georgia Tech

ATLANTA – Justin Thomas threw an 81-yard touchdown pass to Marcus Marshall on the first play of the game, Dedrick Mills ran for three touchdowns and Georgia Tech beat Vanderbilt 38-7 on Saturday, holding the Commodores scoreless in the final three quarters.

Mills ran for 58 yards with touchdown runs of 15, 4 and 5 yards. His last two scoring runs came in the third quarter, when Georgia Tech extended a 17-7 halftime lead.

Thomas threw for 136 yards and ran for 84 yards before sitting out the final quarter as Georgia Tech (3-0) remained undefeated against Vanderbilt (1-2) since World War II.

“Today was our day,” Thomas said.

The Yellow Jackets gained momentum for Thursday night’s visit from No. 5 Clemson as they won their sixth straight game in the series and improved to 12-0-1 against the Commodores since 1941.

Vanderbilt was held to 275 total yards, including 69 yards rushing on 18 carries by Ralph Webb, who led the Southeastern Conference in rushing through two games.

Georgia Tech produced a surprising 222 yards passing, including a late 77-yarder from backup Matthew Jordan to Clinton Lynch.

The Commodores were held to 85 yards rushing while averaging only 2.8 yards per carry.

Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason gave credit to Georgia Tech defenders for looking “sort of like popcorn” as they shed blockers.
