### Did You Know?

Last Saturday at Tennessee, **Mark Richt** won his 100th game as head coach of the Bulldogs in his 11th season. There have only been two other UGA head coaches who have reached the century mark in victories. Wally Butts (140 wins) and Vince Dooley (201 wins) each captured their 100th win in their 14th season with the Bulldogs.

### On Deck

**Florida:** Following an open date on Oct. 22, Georgia takes on Florida. The Bulldogs own a 47-40-2 edge over the Gators in the series record. However, the Gators have won five out of the last seven matchups, including a 34-31 OT victory in 2010. Georgia last beat Florida in Jacksonville in 2007 as Knowshon Moreno exploded for a career-high 188 yards and three touchdowns to give the Bulldogs a 42-30 win. In 2010, the Gators jumped out to a 21-7 halftime lead, but the Bulldogs outscored Florida 24-10 in the final two quarters to force overtime. But after Georgia had an interception end its opening drive in OT, the Gators drilled a 37-yard field goal to clinch a 34-31 victory.

### Gilliard Leads Bulldogs In Four Straight

Junior ILB **Mike Gilliard** is quickly making a name for himself at inside linebacker. The Valdosta native recorded a career-high 12 tackles, including a sack for -14 yards and 2.5 tackles for loss, and forced a fumble during the 20-12 victory at Tennessee. For his efforts, Gilliard was named the *SEC Defensive Player of the Week* for the first time in his career. This marks the fourth consecutive game that Gilliard has led Georgia in stops. Gilliard took over the starting role after sophomore **Alec Ogletree** went down with a foot injury in the season opener versus No. 5 Boise State.

Gilliard is the Bulldogs' leading tackler with 40 and is second on the team with 5.0 tackles for loss. Georgia has held its opponents to just two touchdowns over the last four games.

### Georgia-Vanderbilt Series

Georgia and Vanderbilt resume their series this Saturday, which first began in 1893 in Nashville. Georgia leads the all-time series 51-18-2. The Bulldogs have won 15 of the last 16 meetings. Georgia blanked Vanderbilt 43-0 during Homecoming last season in Athens. **Aaron Murray** had a career-high 287 passing yards, completing 15-of-24 with two touchdowns. Backup QB **Hutson Mason** also earned some playing time that day and the Bulldog defense limited the Commodores to 140 yards on 47 plays. In Georgia's last stop in Nashville, the Bulldogs registered a 34-10 win in 2009. Georgia head coach **Mark Richt** is 9-1 against Vanderbilt.

### A Glance At The Commodores

Vanderbilt opened the season under first-year head coach James Franklin with three straight wins, including a 30-7 victory over Ole Miss. However in their last two contests, the Commodores have dropped a 21-3 decision at South Carolina and were shutout 34-0 by second-ranked Alabama in Tuscaloosa. The Vanderbilt defense ranks fifth in the SEC, allowing just 19.4 points per game. Georgia and Florida are tied for third at 19.2 points a game. Vanderbilt ranks 11th in the league in scoring with an average of 20.4 points a contest. The Commodores lead the league with 14 interceptions and have returned three for touchdowns. Senior Casey Heyward and Georgia's **Bacarri Rambo** are tied for the SEC lead with four interceptions each.

After facing the league's top-ranked third-down conversion team in Tennessee (56.3 percent), the Bulldogs will square off versus the SEC's 12th-ranked team in the category in Vanderbilt (18.5 percent). Georgia is seventh in the conference in third-down conversions at 38.6 percent.

### Four-Game Winning Streak

Georgia is now on a four-game winning streak after topping Tennessee 20-12 in Knoxville over the weekend. The Bulldogs also knocked off Mississippi State, Ole Miss and Coastal Carolina during this span. During this streak, Georgia has outscored the opposition 130-35. The Bulldogs have held their opponents to just two offensive touchdowns in the last four games.

The last four-game winning streak came to start the 2008 season. Georgia opened up with wins over Georgia Southern and Central Michigan and then registered road wins over South Carolina and Arizona State. The Bulldogs actually closed the 2007 season with seven straight wins. Georgia had won 11 in a row from that point in the 2008 season before falling to No. 8 Alabama in Athens.

### Keep An Eye On Boykin

Senior **Brandon Boykin** reminds the Bulldog nation of former Bulldog All-American Champ Bailey (UGA 1996-98) with his versatility. While junior cornerback **Branden Smith** has seen action on offense, defense and special teams in his career, Boykin is now doing the same with even more flair. He has four career kickoff returns for a touchdown, and against No. 5 Boise State, he had an 80-yard rushing touchdown on his first career carry. He had a school record seven kickoff returns and tallied 198 all-purpose yards against No. 12 South Carolina.

### SEC Record Book - Career Kickoff Return Yardage

Boykin has a school record 2,247 yards on 90 returns, including four touchdowns (three 100 yarders). He is the active SEC career leader in the kickoff return yardage category and sixth all-time with the best average return.

## OFFENSE

### Murray Showing Flashes During Sophomore Season



Sophomore QB **Aaron Murray** is beginning to build on a spectacular start to his career in his second season. Under Murray's direction this season, the Bulldogs are third in the SEC in passing offense, averaging 235.8 yards per game. Murray recorded a career-high four touchdown passes against #12 South Carolina as he was able to complete 19-of-29 attempts to eight different receivers. He finished with 248 yards passing to go along with 32 yards rushing in the losing effort. In his 10 wins as a starter over the last

two seasons, Murray has 20 TDs to five INTs. The Bulldogs join Florida as the only two teams in the league to score first in all of their games this season.

Two of his best games as a freshman in 2010 came against eventual national champion Auburn on The Plains and versus arch-rival Georgia Tech between the hedges. He completed 15-of-28 passes for 273 yards and three touchdowns for the Tigers. Versus the Yellow Jackets, Murray went 15-for-19 with 271 yards and three touchdowns, which tied his career high for the sixth time. He tied the school record for touchdown responsibility by a quarterback in a season with 28 (24 passing, 4 rushing). D.J. Shockley also had 28 in 2005. Murray's backup is sophomore **Hutson Mason** (9-of-17, 102 yds., 1 TD in four games in 2010). Mason played most of the second half in the win over Coastal Carolina this season and finished 6-for-9 for 68 yards, including a 33-yard touchdown strike to TE **Orson Charles**.

Murray had the highest passing efficiency rating for a freshman in the nation and finished 14th overall at 154.48, which is second in school history only to Bulldog offensive coordinator **Mike Bobo** in 1997. That marks the second-highest rating in Georgia history. The Tampa, Fla. native is currently No. 4 in the league in the category with a 150.2 mark. Murray ranked fourth all-time in total offense after piling up 3,216 yards in 2010 during his first year.

Murray, a 2010 Freshman All-SEC selection, ranked among the best freshman quarterbacks in SEC history and posted one of the more impressive seasons in UGA history. Now, he ranks in the top five in school history in career touchdown passes:

## Quick Start

The Bulldogs have benefitted from a quick start this season, outscoring their opponents 61-10 in the first quarter. In fact, the Bulldogs have held their four SEC opponents to just three points in the first quarter this year.

After scoring a combined six points in the second half against Ole Miss and Mississippi State, the Bulldogs tallied 14 points in the third quarter on their first two possessions at Tennessee. One of the Bulldogs' drives was a three-play, 93-yard drive to put UGA ahead 20-6 in Knoxville.

## Senior Trio & Versatile Guards Hold Line Together

Georgia has a senior-laden offensive line featuring C **Ben Jones**, LT **Cordy Glenn** and RT **Justin Anderson**. A trio of sophomores in **Kenarius Gates**, **Chris Burnette** and **Dallas Lee** have split time at the guards this year. Lee has been the healthiest of the three, playing in all six games.

The five starters average a height of 6-4 and a weight of 329. Glenn leads the trio with 41 career starts, including the last 38 games. He started all 13 games in 2010 at guard. Jones has appeared in 41 games, starting 14 games in 2010.

## A New Look Backfield

Freshman **Isaiah Crowell**, junior **Richard Samuel IV** and junior **Carlton Thomas** are splitting time in the backfield for the Bulldogs. During his second career start in a win at Ole Miss, Crowell carried the ball 30 times for 147 yards, both career highs. He had another 100-yard game versus Miss State (22 carries, 104 yds.), giving him three in his career as he was named the **SEC Freshman of the Week** for the third time this year. Crowell is fourth in the league averaging 95.5 yards/game after scoring twice against UT. Samuel was sidelined with a heel injury vs. Coastal Carolina so Crowell got his first career start and responded with 86 yards rushing and a score on 16 carries. Crowell exploded for a then career-high 118 rushing yards and 40 receiving yards against #12 South Carolina and was named one of the **SEC Co-Freshmen of the Week**. He scored two touchdowns (1 rush., 1 rec.) versus the Gamecocks after carrying the ball 16 times.

## Top Targets

This season, **Aaron Murray** has thrown touchdowns to seven different Bulldogs. Statistically, the top target has been freshman WR **Malcolm Mitchell**, who has 25 catches for 438 yards and three touchdowns. His first score came on a 51-yard reception versus #5 Boise State. Mitchell has the two longest receptions by a Bulldogs this year (a 69 yarder at Ole Miss and a 71 yarder at Tennessee). Mitchell is out this week after suffering a hamstring injury versus UT.

Georgia's tight ends have also been called upon to play a bigger role in 2011. **Orson Charles** led all Bulldogs against the #5 Broncos with six catches for a career-high 109 yards and a touchdown. He added his team-leading third touchdown catch in a five-catch, 59-yard performance at Ole Miss. Charles is second on the team with 17 catches for 266 yards. Also at TE, senior **Aron White** recorded his first touchdown catch in two seasons versus the Rebels and finished with three receptions for 52 yards. Junior FLK **Tavarres King** is third on the Bulldogs with 17 catches for 189 yards and three scores.

## DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

### Stifling Opponents

Georgia won its fourth straight game during its matchup at Tennessee. During this streak, Georgia has outscored the opposition 130-35. Overall, Georgia's defense limited UT to a pair of field goals in the first half and then one touchdown with 2:51 left in the contest. In the past 16 quarters, Georgia's defense has allowed just two touchdowns. The Volunteers were held to minus 20 rushing yards on 23 attempts. The previous low in the **Mark Richt** era in an SEC game was 1 yard by Tennessee in 2008 on 15 attempts, and UGA's performance against the Vols is an all-time low under Richt. The minus 20 yards matches the third fewest in school history (matching The Citadel in 1958). It was the fewest since a record minus 50 by Kentucky in 1999.

The Bulldog defense has allowed 11 touchdowns, including one 5-yard drive and one 28-yard drive (special teams has surrendered two and the offense has allowed two). UGA's opponents have reached the Red Zone only three times in the last four games and that resulted in 12 points.

### Linebackers Lead The Defense As Gilliard Steps Up

Junior ILB **Mike Gilliard** has been the leading tackler for the Bulldogs the past four games. He had a career-high nine against Mississippi State last week and followed that up with a new career high against the Volunteers, getting 12 stops along with one forced fumble, a sack, a pass breakup and one tackle for a loss. Junior ILB **Christian Robinson** returned to action against Miss State after missing two games with a foot injury. He played primarily on third downs as the Bulldogs limited MSU to 27 percent conversion rate (4-of-15). Gilliard leads the team with 40 tackles while sophomore OLB **Jarvis Jones** is second on the team with 33.

### Sack Totals On The Rise

After having just one sack through the first three games, the Bulldog defense has tallied 11 sacks following the last three wins over SEC opponents. Georgia had four in the road win over Ole Miss and then exploded for five against Mississippi State. Junior OLB **Cornelius Washington** has 3.5 sacks (-35 yds.) and sophomore OLB **Jarvis Jones** has three (-27 yds.) to lead the Dog defense. However, Washington will be unavailable against the Commodores while completing a two-game suspension.

### Plugging The Middle

During Georgia's four-game winning streak, the Bulldog defensive front has held its opponents to a combined 133 yards rushing. For the year, the Bulldog defense ranks third in the SEC in rushing defense (85.8/g) and third in total defense (260.5/g, *which is sixth in the nation*). The Bulldogs are getting solid production from its two nose tackles in redshirt sophomore **Kwame Geathers** and junior **John Jenkins**, along with ends junior **Abry Jones** and senior **DeAngelo Tyson**. Jenkins made his first start at Tennessee after tallying three tackles and a sack during the win over Miss State.

### Bulldog Secondary Vs. Commodore Secondary

Georgia's secondary faced one of the league's top passing offenses last week in Tennessee. The Volunteers led the SEC in passing offense and were second in total offense. Georgia's secondary limited Tennessee to 290 yards passing, completing 22-of-40 in the 20-12 road win. This week, Georgia's secondary will see how they match up with Vanderbilt, who leads the league with 14 picks, including three for touchdowns. The Commodores rank second in the league in turnover margin at +5. The Bulldogs rank fourth in the SEC with eight INTs in 2011, including four from FS **Bacarri Rambo** *which is tied for second in the nation*.

Senior CB **Brandon Boykin** has started 30 games in his career and has 22 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, and an INT this year. Rambo is the team's active leader with nine interceptions. Like Boykin, junior CB **Branden Smith** is a versatile threat who has seen time on offense and special teams as well.

Junior CB **Sanders Commings** and junior SS **Shawn Williams** round out the starters in the backfield. Commings ranks fourth on the team with 24 stops. Williams and Commings have shown their own versatility by starting at two positions in 2011. Commings has started at CB/SS while Williams has lined up at SS/ILB this season.

### The Butler Keeps Doing It

Georgia senior Academic All-American and All-SEC punter **Drew Butler** returns as one of the nation's top punters. He has been a two-time Ray Guy Award finalist and took home the hardware in 2009. In the road win over Ole Miss, Butler averaged 55.2 yards (*tied for third-best game in school history*) a punt on four attempts, including a season-long 59 yarder.

In 2010, Butler averaged 44.5 yards on 50 punts, 15 that went for 50+. The Bulldogs finished second in the SEC and fourth in the nation in net punting with an average of 40.6.

Butler is the son of former NFL standout and Bulldog All-American Kevin Butler. He is also the holder for **Blair Walsh**.

### Boca Bulldog Booter Back

Senior PK **Blair Walsh** has been one of the nation's top place-kickers since 2009. He was a semifinalist in 2010 and a finalist in 2009 for the Lou Groza Award. Walsh is eighth in the SEC record books for points scored in a career (350--63 FGs, 161 PATs). He has hit at least one FG in 25 of the past 27 games (no attempts vs. GT in 2010, 0-1 vs. #5 Boise State in 2011--54-yard att.) and 39 games in his career. His career-long 56 yarder versus Coastal Carolina is the longest in the nation this year. Walsh was named *SEC Special Teams Player of the Week* after scoring eight of 20 points versus the Vols.

Currently, he is 63-for-82 (76.8%) overall. He has the most field goals of any active SEC kicker with 63, which is eighth most in league history. Walsh owns the school record for PATs with 161, highlighted by hitting eight versus Coastal Carolina.

### Boykin Sets School Career Return Yardage

Senior CB **Brandon Boykin** took over UGA's No. 1 mark in career return yardage during the 2011 season. Boykin had five returns for 110 yards against #5 Boise State and followed that up with a school record seven returns (184 yards, third best in school history) against #12 South Carolina. He passed Scott Woerner's 1,916, who tallied his on punt and kickoff returns from 1977-80. In 2010, Boykin set the career kickoff return yardage with 1,813 yards on 72 returns. Boykin is now seeing some action on offense for the Bulldogs as well. His top performance on the other side of the ball is an 80-yard touchdown run versus #5 Boise State. *Boykin has now been named to the Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll four times in six weeks this season for being one of the nation's most versatile players.*

Currently, he has 2,247 yards on 90 returns and four touchdowns. In 2010, Boykin had 34 returns for 825 yards, for an average of 25.3. Boykin sped to his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown (*third 100-yd. return*) in his career to tie an SEC record against Kentucky in 2010. Tennessee's Willie Gault and Arkansas' Felix Jones also had four KOR TDs in their career. Boykin's first career kickoff return for a touchdown came against South Carolina in 2009 on a 100-yard return.

**Did You Know?** Boykin is the only player in SEC history to record three plays of 100 yards of any kind in his collegiate career.

The Georgia Bulldogs suffered a 35-21 loss to the fifth-ranked Boise State Broncos in the 2011 season opener on Sept. 3 in the Chick-fil-A Kick-Off Game in front of a crowd of 73,614 at the Georgia Dome and a ESPN national television audience. The loss moves them to 89-26-3 in season openers, including 9-2 under Mark Richt. This game marked the first time since 1965 that Georgia opened a season against a team ranked among the top-five nationally. The win evens Boise State's record against Georgia at 1-1.

Georgia senior cornerback Brandon Boykin made his first career play on offense with an 80-yard touchdown run to give UGA a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter. Boise State answered quickly as senior quarterback Kellen Moore found redshirt freshman Matt Miller for a 17-yard touchdown pass to tie the score. Junior cornerback Branden Smith recorded Georgia's first interception of the season with 5:32 left in the second quarter, which was soon followed by a Boise State pick by Jerrell Gavins.

Boise State would continue its offensive run with a seven-yard rushing touchdown by running back Doug Martin followed by a three-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Shoemaker to give BSU a 28-7 lead over the Dogs. With a nearly a minute left in the third quarter, Georgia sophomore quarterback Aaron Murray hit junior tight end Orson Charles in a hole for a 36-yard touchdown to make it a 28-14 game. Boise State added to its lead with a one-yard rushing touchdown from D.J. Harper at the beginning of the fourth quarter. The 35-14 tally would stand until Murray would find true freshman Malcom Mitchell for a 51-yard pass for his first career touchdown with 10:15 remaining in the fourth quarter to bring the score to 35-21 in favor of the Broncos.

Junior linebacker Christian Robinson led the Bulldogs with a career-high 13 tackles followed by sophomore linebacker Jarvis Jones making his Bulldog debut with 11 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for a loss.

Despite four touchdown passes by Georgia quarterback Aaron Murray, the Bulldogs dropped a 45-42 decision to No. 12 South Carolina on Sept. 10, 2011 at Sanford Stadium in front of a boisterous sellout crowd of 92,746 and an ESPN nationally televised audience.

With the loss, the Bulldogs slipped to 0-2 overall and 0-1 in the Southeastern Conference. The Gamecocks improved to 2-0 and 1-0.

Murray hit on 19-of-29 passes for 248 yards and the career-best four touchdowns, the last covering 33 yards to receiver Tavarres King with 2:33 remaining. But after the Bulldogs were unable to recover an onside kick, South Carolina ran out the clock.

Freshman tailback Isaiah Crowell gained 118 yards on 16 carries to establish his career high for the Bulldogs. He scored two touchdowns, one on a 17-yard reception and the other on a 16-yard rush.

South Carolina was led by sophomore tailback Marcus Lattimore, who had 176 yards and a touchdown. The Gamecocks also scored touchdowns on a fake punt, an interception return and a fumble return, and they had another touchdown set up by a fumble return.

Murray's touchdown passes covered 27 yards to receiver Rantavious Wooten, 17 yards to Crowell, 19 yards to receiver Michael Bennett and 33 yards to Crowell.

Kicker Blair Walsh was 2-for-3 on field goals, hitting from 37 and 39 yards.

Linebacker Christian Robinson recorded eight tackles for the Bulldogs, while cornerback Sanders Commings added six stops.

The Georgia Bulldogs recorded their first win of the 2011 season with a 59-0 victory over the Coastal Carolina Chanticleers on Saturday afternoon in front of 91,946 fans at Sanford Stadium.

The Georgia quarterbacks combined for 276 yards through the air, including an 18-for-26, three-touchdown performance by starter Aaron Murray. Freshman tailback Isaiah Crowell finished with 86 yards rushing and one touchdown to lead the Bulldogs on the ground.

Coastal Carolina quarterback Aramis Hillary led the Chanticleers with a 10-for-15 performance. Jeremy Height finished with five rushes for 19 yards.

The Bulldogs scored early and often in the first half, putting up 305 yards of total yards on their way to a 35-0 halftime lead, including three trips to the end zone on the opening three possessions.

On the first possession of the game, Crowell broke off a 27-yard run that was followed by a Blair Walsh extra point that put the Bulldogs on top 7-0 early in the first quarter.

On the next possession, Murray found Michael Bennett over the middle for an 18-yard pickup that set up Georgia's second touchdown of the day.

With 1:42 remaining in the first quarter, Murray hit Tavares King for a 32-yard reception that gave the Bulldogs a 21-0 lead.

The Bulldogs tacked on 14 more points at the close of the half after Murray found Malcolm Mitchell and King in the back of the end zone, putting Georgia up 35-0.

Following a career-best 56-yard field goal by Walsh, backup quarterback Hutson Mason walked scored with a quarterback sneak to put Georgia up 45-0.

The Georgia special teams helped the Bulldogs to a pair touchdowns and a 59-0 lead late in the third quarter after Walsh and Ty Frix each recovered fumbles on kickoff returns.

The Georgia Bulldogs picked up its first Southeastern Conference win of the season as it knocked off the Ole Miss Rebels 27-13 on Saturday afternoon in front of 58,042 fans at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Miss. Georgia improved to 2-2 overall and 1-1 in conference play, while the Rebels dropped to 1-3 and 0-2 in the SEC. It was also Georgia's ninth-straight victory over the Rebels.

The Bulldogs put up 475 yards of total offense, led by sophomore quarterback Aaron Murray who finished 17-of-26 for 268 yards and two touchdowns. Isaiah Crowell finished with 147 yards on 30 carries. It was the freshman's second 100-yard rushing performance against an SEC foe. Malcolm Mitchell led the Bulldogs in receiving with three catches for 93 yards, including a 69-yard strike that set up a Georgia touchdown in the second quarter. Orson Charles and Aron White each had a receiving touchdown for the Bulldogs.

Georgia eased out to an early 10-0 lead after scoring on its first two possessions of the game. Blair Walsh connected on a 36-yard field goal that put Georgia on top 3-0. Georgia went 53 yards on seven plays on its next possession, which was capped off by a one-yard touchdown run by Murray.

The Bulldogs went up 17-0 when Murray found Charles in the back of the endzone with just over six minutes to play in first half.

Ole Miss answered on the ensuing drive, going 80 yards on three plays. The Rebels got on the board as Mackey completed a 38-yard touchdown pass to Moncrief that cut Georgia's lead to 17-7.

A Bacarri Rambo interception set up a three-play, 53-yard scoring drive for the Bulldogs that put Georgia back up by 17 at 24-7. Murray found White twice on the drive, including a 35-yard touchdown grab that was followed by a Walsh extra point.

Ole Miss made it a two-possession game late in the first half when Nick Brassell returned a punt 68 yards to the end zone. A missed extra point made it a 24-13 game. The offenses remained quiet throughout much of the second half until Walsh booted a 43-yard field goal that put Georgia up 27-13 with 4:16 left in the game.

The Georgia Bulldogs improved to 3-2 on the year and 2-1 in Southeastern Conference play after defeating Mississippi State 24-10 in front of a boisterous crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium and a Fox Sports South regionally televised audience. Mississippi State drops to 2-3 overall and 0-3 in the SEC.

The Georgia offense put up 315 total yards, with quarterback Aaron Murray leading the way with 160 yards on 13-of-25 passing. Orson Charles and Malcolm Mitchell each recorded a receiving touchdown, while Blair Walsh added a field goal late in the third quarter. Tailback Isaiah Crowell led the rushing attack with 104 yards on 22 carries, with Carlton Thomas earning 35 yards on the ground and rushing for one touchdown.

Mississippi State was held to 213 yards of offense. Quarterback Chris Relf was 19-of-31 for 157 yards. Relf also led the team with 31 yards on the ground. He was sacked four times and intercepted twice.

Georgia took a 14-3 first-quarter lead as the Bulldogs held Mississippi State to just three rushing yards. Georgia jumped out to a 7-0 lead on its first possession of the game as Murray completed a 21-yard touchdown pass to Charles. The scoring drive was set up by a 30-yard punt return by Brandon Boykin. Mississippi State answered on the following drive, driving 56 yards on 11 plays. The drive culminated in a 42-yard Derek DePasquale field goal that made it 7-3.

With 3:44 left in the first quarter, the Bulldogs extended their lead to 14-3 as Murray found Mitchell over the middle for a six yard touchdown pass on third-and-four. Thomas walked into the end zone with just over a minute left in the first half that extended Georgia's lead to 21-3. The drive started with an interception by Sanders Commings at the Georgia three yard line. During the drive, Crowell ran 36 yards on three carries, including a 16-yard rush that put the Bulldogs in Mississippi State territory.

Georgia added a field goal with 2:29 to play in the third quarter to make it 24-3. Walsh booted the 28-yarder after Commings recovered a fumble that was forced by Boykin. With less than nine minutes to play, Mississippi State's Darius Slay returned an interception for a touchdown. DePasquale added the extra point that cut Georgia's lead to 24-10.

## Tennessee

Oct. 8, 2011 • Neyland Stadium - Knoxville, Tenn.

Mark Richt won his 100th game at the helm of the Georgia football program with a 20-12 win over the Tennessee Volunteers on Saturday evening in front of a capacity crowd of 102,455 at Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tenn. Richt became the third coach in Georgia history to reach the century mark.

The Bulldogs, currently riding a four-game win streak, are now 4-2 on the season and 3-1 in the Southeastern Conference. Tennessee drops to 3-2 on the year and 0-2 in SEC play.

The offense put up 366 total yards behind sophomore quarterback Aaron Murray, who finished with 227 yards on 15-for-25 passing. Isaiah Crowell led the Bulldogs on the ground with 58 yards and two touchdowns. Freshman wide receiver Malcolm Mitchell finished with 126 yards through the air, including a career-best 71-yard grab. Mike Gilliard led the Bulldogs defensively with 12 tackles and a sack.

Tennessee quarterback Tyler Bray was 18-of-33 for 251 yards. Backup quarterback Matt Simms saw action late in the game, scoring the Vols lone touchdown. Mychal Rivera led the Vols with five catches for 85 yards.

Georgia struck first, taking a 3-0 lead on its opening possession. During the drive, the Bulldogs converted twice on fourth down, helping set up a 35-yard field goal by Blair Walsh.

The Volunteers added a field goal of their own to tie the game at three with just under seven minutes to play in the first half. Using a fourth-and-eight conversion, the Vols knocked a 28-yarder through the uprights.

The Bulldogs responded on their next possession after Murray connected with Mitchell for a 43-yard reception. Three plays later, Walsh booted his second field goal of the night, this one from 23 yards out, that gave Georgia a 6-3 lead. As time expired in the first half, Tennessee kicked a 43-yard field goal that tied the game at six.

A bad snap forced Tennessee to punt from its own seven-yard line on the opening drive of the third quarter, giving the Bulldogs a short field. Murray found Orson Charles on the drive for a 10-yard gain that gave Georgia a first-and-10 at the Tennessee 13-yard line. Crowell capped off the eight-play, 4:32 drive with a one-yard touchdown run that put the Bulldogs on top 13-6.

Crowell rushed for his second touchdown of the game, scoring from 17 yards out, putting the Bulldogs up 20-6 with 4:51 remaining in the third quarter. Mitchell set up the touchdown run with a 71-reception from Murray that made it first-and-10 at the Tennessee 22-yard line.

Tennessee made it a 20-12 game with 2:45 left in the fourth quarter. The Vols converted on fourth down for the third time in the game, setting up a one-yard touchdown run by Simms.

"This is a tough place to play and an even tougher place to win at. Our defense came out in the second half and did what they could to give us great field position and then the offense came out and did what they had to do. Tennessee came to play and this was a great, tough football game."

### Worth Noting...

- Georgia's captains against Tennessee were senior P Drew Butler, senior OT Cordy Glenn, senior DE DeAngelo Tyson and senior CB Brandon Boykin.

- With the win over Tennessee, Bulldog head coach Mark Richt improved to 100-36 in this his 11th season (58-29 in the SEC). He becomes just the third coach in UGA history to reach 100 wins.

- Georgia won its fourth straight to improve to 4-2 overall and 3-1 in the SEC. During this streak, Georgia has outscored the opposition 130-35.

- Going into the game against Tennessee, Georgia was 3-for-9 on fourth down conversions. The Bulldogs were 3-for-3 on fourth downs against the Vols.

- Mike Gilliard has been the leading tackler for the Bulldogs the past four games. He recorded a career-best 12 tackles against Tennessee and had one forced fumble, one sack, a pass breakup and one tackle for a loss.

- Blair Walsh recorded his 63rd field goal against the Vols, the most of any active kicker in the SEC and ranks eighth overall in league history.
