### Georgia Looks To Snap Streak

Georgia (21-19-1 overall, 7-10-1 SEC) aims to snap a season-high five-game losing streak when it faces 25th-ranked Vanderbilt starting Friday in Nashville. The series concludes an eight-game road trip. Game one is at 7:30 p.m. ET, Saturday will be at 4:05 p.m.ET (CSS-TV), and Sunday at 2 p.m. ET.

Georgia, under the direction of coach **Scott Stricklin**, is in 5th place in the SEC Eastern Division and 11th overall. The Bulldogs had won three straight SEC series before being swept at #9 Florida this past weekend. On Tuesday, Georgia was edged 3-1 by Kennesaw State at Coolray Field in Lawrenceville, home of the Triple-A Gwinnett Braves.

The Commodores are 30-12 overall, 8-10 in the SEC. This past Tuesday, they beat Memphis 2-1. Last year, the Commodores posted a 2-1 series win over the Bulldogs at Foley Field. Vanderbilt lost a series at Arkansas this past weekend. Georgia leads the all-time series with VU 97-82. The last time the Bulldogs won a series over VU came in 2008 in Nashville when it clinched an SEC title. Coach Stricklin was an assistant at Vanderbilt from 2000-01.

### Did You Know?

Georgia is in a stretch where it closes the regular season playing 20 of its final 23 games against ranked opponents. Georgia is 6-13-1 against top 25 teams this year.

### Inside The Numbers

The Bulldogs are Batting .260 overall with a 4.11 ERA and Fielding .972.

Georgia has turned 40 DPs and that's among the best in the SEC. The pitching staff has 11 pickoffs.

Georgia ranks 2nd in the SEC with 184 walks and leads the league with 306 strikeouts.

In SEC games, the Bulldogs strike 12th in Batting (.233), 5th in Pitching (3.29) and 1st in Fielding at .978. Georgia made just one error in the UF series, and it was by a pitcher in the final game.

### Bulldogs To Watch

Junior 3B **Hunter Cole** (.327-2-24) leads the team with a .333 average and ranks among the SEC leaders with 14 doubles. In the UF series last weekend in Gainesville, Cole batted a team-best .462 (6-for-

13). Sophomore 1B **Daniel Nichols** (.294-1-12) leads the team in SEC action with a .333 average. He has a 6-game hitting streak

Freshman CF **Stephen Wrenn** (.269-0-18) ranks among the SEC leaders with a team-best 15 SB. For the year, he is 15-for-19. His speed has been asset on defense, registering a perfect fielding percentage in 123 total chances including five assists. Wrenn and freshman OF/C **Skyler Weber** (.250-0-11) each had three-hit games this past Tuesday versus KSU.

Junior SS **Nelson Ward** (.299-2-27) ranks second in the SEC in walks with 26. He leads the team with 27 RBI and has a seven-game hitting streak. He is one of three Bulldogs along with **Cole** (3B) and outfielder **Conor Welton** (.299-1-15) to have started all 41 games this year. Ward hit .417 (5-for-12) in the UF series.

Sophomore LHP **Ryan Lawlor** (3-3, 3.43 ERA) pitched his second consecutive complete game of the season last Saturday at ninth-ranked Florida. However, this time the Bulldogs lost 3-2. The difference proved to be a solo home run in the fifth inning, the first he had allowed in 56.1 innings this year. In his previous start, Lawlor went the distance in a 4-1 victory over #23 Tennessee. In SEC action, Lawlor is 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA. He will start Friday.

Freshman RHP **Robert Tyler** (4-3, 2.45 ERA) looks to bounce back after a rough outing at #9 Florida. He was lifted after three innings as he allowed a career-high six runs on seven hits. In league action, Tyler is 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA including 32 strikeouts in 35.2 IP. Tyler will start Saturday.

### Georgia Lineup Missing Key Duo

Sophomore RHP/OF **Sean McLaughlin**, the team's No. 1 starter, has been limited to just 9.2 IP this season due to a sore arm. It is unlikely he will pitch again this year. However, he has seen action as a DH/RF in 19 games this year with seven starts. He is batting .226-0-2. He was an All-Freshmen SEC selection in 2013 after going 5-6 with a 3.28 ERA.

Junior 1B/LHP **Jared Walsh**, the team's No. 3 starter and starting first baseman, has appeared in just 19 games this season including 9 IP. He will be out for the Vanderbilt series due to a sore back.

Walsh has missed the last 11 games. In his Bulldog career, Walsh is 3-5, 3.86 ERA, 3 SV in 62.1 IP and batting .251-4-36.

# GEORGIA HEAD COACH SCOTT STRICKLIN

## #10 SCOTT STRICKLIN, HEAD COACH 1ST YEAR AT UGA

Scott Stricklin, who led his alma mater Kent State to five NCAA Regionals and the 2012 College World Series, was named head baseball coach at the University of Georgia on June 3, 2013.

Since arriving in Athens, Stricklin has created an atmosphere of excitement around the program, starting with the current student-athletes, extending to former lettermen and to Georgia baseball fans around the state. He has organized numerous lettermen functions to help reunite the Bulldogs and steered the Foley Field Revival project that will be ready for 2015.

Stricklin, 42, posted a 350-188 record during a nine-year stint with the Golden Flashes, winning five Mid-American Conference regular season crowns and five MAC Tournament titles. Known for developing student-athletes on and off the field, 30 KSU players were selected in the Major League Baseball draft during his tenure, and from 2010-12, the team registered a perfect 1,000 score in the NCAA's Academic Performance Rate (APR) report. KSU was one of only 16 schools in the country to reach this academic accomplishment and the only public institution on the list. Also, the Golden Flashes were honored in Omaha in 2012 for having the highest team Grade Point Average (GPA) of all the eight participants at the College World Series (CWS), owning a 3.09 GPA. For the spring semester of 2013, the KSU baseball team registered a 3.06 GPA.

Stricklin earned his first head coaching job in July of 2004 when he returned to Kent State following three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Georgia Tech under former KSU head coach Danny Hall. Stricklin began his coaching career in 1998 as a volunteer coach for the Yellow Jackets and then spent two years as the pitching coach at Vanderbilt from 2000-01.

Stricklin directed Kent State to its finest season in school history in 2012 as the Golden Flashes posted a record 47 victories including a 21-game winning streak and their first trip to the CWS. KSU's post season run featured its fourth consecutive MAC Tournament title to go with its first NCAA Regional and Super Regional championships.

The Golden Flashes went on the road and won the NCAA Gary (Ind.) Regional and then upset No. 5 national seed Oregon in a Super Regional in Eugene. At the CWS, they eliminated top-ranked Florida and finished tied for fifth. KSU wound up with a final national ranking of No. 5, the highest ranking in team history.

Stricklin, a two-time All-Mid-American Conference catcher, handled pitching staffs that were ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the nation in earned run average during his final two playing seasons at KSU. A 23rd round draft pick of the Minnesota Twins in 1993, he played five seasons of professional baseball and reached the Triple-A level with the Twins.

Stricklin graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor's degree in marketing from Kent State in 1995. He and his wife Cheri have three children: daughters Sydney (11) and Keaton (6), and a son, Cale (9).

### INTERESTING FACTS FROM 2014

\*Georgia's season opener was delayed a day to snow. It split a doubleheader with Ga. Southern on Feb. 15 in front of a crowd of 3,494, which was the largest for a season opener at Foley Field since it was renovated in 1990.

\*The Bulldogs dropped the rubber game of the opening series with Ga. Southern as the Eagles scored 11 runs on 10 hits in the 3rd frame en route to an 18-4 decision.

\*Georgia's played a game in 2:06 (1-0 Win over Ga. Tech) and one that lasted 3:50 (10-4 loss @ #4 FSU).

\*Georgia and #4 FSU were tied 4-4 going to the 7th before the Seminoles scored six runs over the final two frames to delight a crowd of 6,568 in Tallahassee.

\*Bulldog pitchers have 9 pickoffs, starting with *Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston (FSU)*.

\*On Feb. 26, Georgia tossed six scoreless and no-hit innings against Ga. State before allowing 3Rs in the 7th and lost 3-2. After that, Georgia won 11 in a row.

\*On Feb. 28 trailing 3-1 in the bottom of the 9th, Georgia rallied to tie Binghamton and eventually won 4-3 in 11 innings with a Walk-Off 2B by **Nelson Ward**.

\*On March 4, **Brandon Stephens** delivered an RBI-1B for a 1-0 Walk-Off win over rival Tech. Freshman **Robert Tyler** tossed 8 scoreless IP but got a no decision.

\*On March 5 versus Charleston Southern, Bulldog junior **Hunter Cole** was called out for interference for standing on first base after he popped up to first, and the first baseman ran in to him trying to catch the ball. It cost him an RBI-single. It's not the first time Cole has been on the short end of an umpire's call. As a freshman against Winthrop in the fifth game of the 2012 season, his first career HR banged off the camera platform in CF, but the men in blue ruled it a double thinking it went off the wall. Two days later, he would hit his 2nd 1st Career HR, this one into the parking lot.

\*On March 7, Georgia erased a pair of four-deficits to defeat Buffalo 11-10.

\*On March 8, Georgia recorded its 3rd Walk-Off of the year and second by junior **Nelson Ward** to defeat North Florida 4-3 and extend the winning streak to seven.

\*On March 9, junior **Conor Welton's** first career HR netted one lucky fan \$700 as it

came during the Foley Field HR Jackpot Inning. It sparked a five-run outburst and the team's 8th straight win.

\*On March 10, RHP **Robert Tyler** was named SEC Freshman of the Week.

\*On March 11, Georgia beat Western Kentucky 26-7, the largest output since 1988 when it beat Jacksonville 27-8. **Zack Bowers** had 7 RBI on 2 HRs in the latest rout. Also, **Conor Welton**, **Hunter Cole** and **Skylar Weber** each had 4-hit games.

\*On March 11, junior utility Bulldog **Heath Holder** made a relief appearance with one scoreless inning. Up to that point, he had made 6 starts at 1B and 2 in RF this year.

\*On March 12, junior **Pete Nagel** registered the 1st Save of the year for the Bulldogs in an 8-6 win over Western Kentucky to extend the team's winning streak to 10.

\*On March 14, Georgia ran its win streak to 11 with a 7-1 win over #24 Miss. State to open SEC play. **Ryan Lawlor** tossed a career-high 7.2 IP with just 1 UE run.

\***From Feb. 28-March 14, Georgia put together an 11-game winning streak**, which was the longest since the 2009 club opened the year 14-0.

\*On March 18, seven pitchers combined on a five-hit shutout of Presbyterian 11-0 to help the Bulldogs close out a 16-game homestand by going 13-3 in that stretch.

\*On March 23, Georgia and #6 LSU played four hours and one minute in Baton Rouge before having to settle for a **2-2 tie in 13 innings** due to SEC Travel Curfew. LSU did not strike out once, drew 8 BB (4 intentional) and went 2-17 with RISP.

\*On March 28, Georgia posted its fourth walk-off victory over the season as **Jared Walsh** delivered a bases-loaded FC in the ninth to beat #22 Texas A&M 3-2.

\*On March 29, **Robert Tyler** pitched 8 scoreless innings for his first SEC win to clinch the series over #22 Texas A&M. Two days later, he was named SEC Freshman of the Week for the second time this season.

\*Georgia will play just three home games at Foley Field during the month of April. It will serve as the home team on April 22nd versus Kennesaw State at Coolray Field in Lawrenceville, home of the Gwinnett Braves, the Triple-A affiliate of Atlanta.

\*After trailing 1-0 after the first at Missouri on April 4, Georgia tossed 12 scoreless innings (**Ryan Lawlor/Jared Cheek**) and beat the Tigers 2-1 in 13 innings. Pinch-hitter **Jess Posey** tied the game with a one-out RBI-single in the 8th. The Tigers loaded the bases with one out in the 12th, and Georgia went to a five-infielder defense and Cheek got a strikeout of their #2 hitter and then got a groundout to send it to the 13th. **Daniel Nichols** got a one-out hustle 2B and scored on an E3 in the 13th.

\*On April 8, **Hunter Cole** tied a career high with 4 RBI and **Patrick Boling** pitched a career-long 7.2 IP to lead Georgia to a 6-2 win at #14 Clemson.

\*Junior 1B/LHP **Jared Walsh** has been out with a sore back since April 6. Walsh has made 19 starts as a 1B/DH/OF along with three starts on the mound.

\*On April 11, sophomore LHP **Ryan Lawlor** pitched his first CG of his career and first for the team this season when he beat #23 UT 4-1 with a career-high 10K. He followed it up with another CG on April 19 but lost 3-2 to #9 UF in Gainesville.
