NOTABLES

• RIDLEY ON A ROLL

Sophomore center Cameron Ridley recorded his second double-double in the last three games with 10 points, 11 rebounds and six blocks (tied his career high) in a career-high 37 minutes during Friday's win against UT Arlington. During the last three contests, Ridley has averaged 13.7 points, 10.0 rebounds and 4.3 blocks in 32.3 minutes per game while converting 12-of-19 (.632) field goals and 17-of-27 (.630) free throws. On the year, he leads the team in rebounding (7.7 rpg) and blocks (23) while averaging 9.1 ppg in 25.3 minutes per contest.

• COMEBACK HORNS

The Horns rallied for their fourth second-half comeback victory of the season (in seven games) during Friday's win against UTA. Texas, which trailed by as many as 12 points in the first half (35-23), faced a 60-51 deficit at the 8:43 mark of the second half. The Longhorns closed the game on a 21-9 run. UT also posted second-half comebacks against Mercer, South Alabama and Stephen F. Austin earlier in the year.

• HOLLAND SEES DOUBLE

Sophomore guard Demarcus Holland posted his first collegiate double-double on Friday with career highs in points (23) and rebounds (11) against UT Arlington. Holland tied his career high in both field goals made (9-of-13) and three-point field goals made (2-of-4) while hitting 3-of-4 free throws in 35 minutes. On the year, he leads the team in minutes (33.1 mppg), ranks second in scoring (12.0 ppg) and steals (9), third in assists (18) and fourth in rebounding (6.1 rpg) while hitting 35-of-64 (.547) field goals.

TEXAS VS. VANDERBILT

- Texas and Vanderbilt are meeting for the seventh time. The Commodores own a 4-2 lead in the all-time series that dates back to a 55-49 UT win on Dec. 27, 1950 in Oklahoma City. Vanderbilt has won the last four meetings.
- This will be the first meeting between the teams in Austin.
- Both UT wins came on a neutral floor (1950 in Oklahoma City; 1951 in Dallas).

WHAT'S IN A WIN

- A win would mark the **1,681st** victory in program history.
- A win would mark head coach Rick Barnes' **365th** victory at Texas and his **567th** victory all-time as a head coach.
- A win would improve the Longhorns' overall record to **7-1** this season, which would be their best start to a campaign since the 2009-10 season (started 17-0).

BIG 12-SEC CHALLENGE



Monday's Texas-Vanderbilt contest is part of the first men's basketball challenge between the Big 12 and Southeastern Conferences. The majority of the games are scheduled for Dec. 2-6, with three contests taking place outside the four-day series window due to scheduling issues. In future years, the two leagues will work with ESPN to schedule all games across consecutive days.

- This will be the first challenge for Big 12 men's basketball since a four-year series between the Big 12 and Pac-10 from 2007-10. The Big 12 held a 28-20 advantage in games played in that event. The Horns posted a 3-1 mark in the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series with a pair of meetings against both UCLA (2-0) and USC (1-1).
- ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU will combine to televise all 10 games, starting with the first game of the Challenge on Thursday, Nov. 14. All telecasts will be available through WatchESPN, accessible online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app, through ESPN on Xbox LIVE to Gold members and on Apple TV to fans who receive their video subscription from an affiliated provider.

UT ARLINGTON POSTGAME NOTES

- The Longhorns improved to 9-0 all-time against UT Arlington.
- UT rejected 12 shots (one shy of tying the team record). It marked the second time this year the Longhorns have blocked at least 11 in a game (vs. Houston Baptist). Texas has had at least 6 blocked shots in six of the first seven games.
- Texas trailed by nine points (60-51) with 8:43 remaining in the game. The Horns closed the contest on a 21-9 run.
- Texas held UTA to a 38.3 FG percentage. The Longhorns improved to 223-26 when holding opponents to under 40 percent shooting during the Rick Barnes era.
- The Longhorns were outrebounded for the first time this season (39-38).
- **Demarcus Holland** set new career highs in points (23) and rebounds with (11) to register his first career double-double. He reached double figures in scoring for the second straight game, third time this season and sixth time in his career (41 games). Holland also tied his career high in field goals made (9-of-13) and three-pointers made (2-of-4).
- **Jonathan Holmes** missed Friday's game due to his grandmother's passing last week.
- **Prince Ibeh** played a career-high 25 minutes and tied his season high with 11 points. It marked the second time this season and third time in his career (41 games) he reached double figures in scoring. Ibeh also tied his career high in blocks with five.
- **Cameron Ridley** played a career-high 37 minutes and tied his career high in blocks with 6 (last vs. BYU; 11/25/13). He finished with his second double-double in the last three games (10 points and 11 rebounds) and reached double figures in scoring for the third time this year (third straight game) and fourth time in his career (39 games).

NON-CONFERENCE HOME SUCCESS AGAINST UN-RANKED OPPONENTS

During the Rick Barnes era, the Longhorns have posted a **107-5 (.955)** record in non-conference home games against unranked (AP) teams. Texas has won **45** consecutive home games against unranked non-conference opponents entering Monday's game against Vanderbilt. The last time UT lost to an unranked (AP) team at the Erwin Center came in a 67-66 defeat to Wisconsin on Dec. 29, 2007.

THE LONGHORNS AT HOME

- Texas is in its **37th** year of play in the Frank Erwin Center.
- The Longhorns have registered an all-time record of **439-102 (.811)** in the building.
- Since Rick Barnes arrived in Austin, UT has recorded a **214-30 (.877)** mark at the Erwin Center including a **99-23 (.811)** record in Big 12 Conference home games.
- Texas is **108-14 (.885)** at the Erwin Center in the last eight seasons (dating to the start of the 2006-07 season).

CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas has outrebounded six of its first seven opponents this season while posting double-digit rebound advantages in four of the six games in which it has outrebounded the opponent. The Horns have registered a +10.4 rebound margin (42.4-32.0) through their first seven contests this year.

- Texas posted its largest rebound margin of the year (+20) against DePaul (11/26). The Horns posted a 40-20 advantage, including an 18-10 edge on the offensive glass.
- UT also posted double-digit rebound margins against South Alabama (40-30), Stephen F. Austin (41-26) and Houston Baptist (52-33).
- The Horns recorded a season high in offensive rebounds (21) against Houston Baptist (11/18).
- Texas has only been outrebounded once this season (vs. UTA; 39-38). Jonathan Holmes, who was ranked second on the team in rebounding (6.7 rpg) going into the game was absent for that contest.

DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 249 of their 520 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. Texas sports a 223-26 (.896) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat. UT has held its first seven opponents to an average of 69.6 ppg on 40.4 percent FG shooting.

- UT has held five of its first seven opponents this year to under 40% FG shooting. The Horns held Mercer to 39.7 percent, SFA to 38.6, Houston Baptist to 39.2, DePaul to 38.3 and UT Arlington to 38.3.
- Texas made a season-high 12 steals in its loss to BYU (11/25)
- Against UTA, the Horns rejected a season-high 12 shots (one shy of the team's single-game record).

BLOCK PARTY

Texas is averaging 7.9 blocked shots per game through its first seven contests. The Horns have recorded at least six blocks in six of their first seven games. UT registered a season-high 12 blocks in the win against UT Arlington, just one shy of the single-game team record.

- Three Longhorns have already reached double figures in blocks this year, including Cameron Ridley (23), Prince Ibeh (15) and Jonathan Holmes (10).
- On the season, UT has posted a 55-21 advantage in blocked shots against its first six opponents.
- Texas has had at least 11 blocks in a game twice this season (11 vs. Houston Baptist and 12 vs. UT Arlington)

BALANCING THE ATTACK

- Through seven games this season, all 10 of Texas' scholarship players have reached double-digit scoring totals in at least one game.
- In each of the last five games, UT has had at least four players score in double figures.
- Texas has had five players record double-figure scoring efforts in three games this year (vs. SFA, vs. BYU, vs. DePaul).

COMEBACK HORNS

The Longhorns rallied for second-half comeback wins in four of their first six wins.

- UT overcame a nine-point deficit (62-53) with 9:44 left against Mercer (Nov. 8), going on a 23-11 run to close the game.
- The Horns also trailed South Alabama (Nov. 12) by 10 points (64-54) at the 11:51 mark, before closing the contest on a 30-13 run.
- In the win against SFA (Nov. 15), UT faced a five-point deficit (40-35) with 16:31 left. Tied at 60-60 at the 3:10 mark, the Horns closed the game with a 12-2 spurt.
- Texas trailed by nine points (60-51) with 8:43 left against UT Arlington before rallying for a 21-9 run to close out the contest.

LOOKING TO GET BACK TO THE BIG DANCE

Last year, Texas had its streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped at 14. Prior to that, UT had advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of Rick Barnes' first 14 seasons in Austin (1999-2012). Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances was four (set twice).

AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA "Sweet 16" a total of five times in the last 12 years (2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008). The Longhorns are one of just 13 schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).

CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the first 15 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

SUCCESS AGAINST ELITE PROGRAMS UNDER BARNES

Texas has been successful against several elite programs during the Rick Barnes era. UT is 3-1 under Barnes against UCLA, 4-4 vs. Michigan State and 4-1 vs. North Carolina. In addition, UT has posted a 4-4 mark in home games against Kansas under Barnes.

SUCCESS AGAINST THE AP TOP 25

During his first 15 seasons in Austin, Rick Barnes has registered a school-record 58 career victories against AP Top 25 opponents (previous mark: 10-44 by Tom Penders, 1989-98). Barnes has guided the Horns to a 58-82 (.414) record against ranked teams. Barnes has posted 88 career victories against AP Top 25 foes.

DID YOU KNOW?

Facts on the Texas Basketball program

- Texas is one of just 13 schools to have advanced to at least the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament in five of the last 12 years, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).
- Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Rick Barnes era, the Longhorns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

UT owns a **30-17** (.638) mark against AP Top 25 opponents under Rick Barnes at the Erwin Center entering the 2013-14 season.

BEATING THE BEST

UT's win at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, 2011 equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. Six of Texas' nine all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come during the Rick Barnes era.

HOLMES RETURNS AS LONE SCHOLARSHIP JUNIOR

The most experienced player on this year's roster, junior forward **Jonathan Holmes** leads the team in scoring (13.3 ppg) and ranks third on the team in blocks (10) and second on the team in rebounding (6.7 rpg) while averaging 22.5 minutes per game through six contests. Holmes missed Friday's game against UTA (Nov. 29) due to the death of his grandmother, but he is expected to be back in the starting lineup for Monday's game against Vanderbilt. He has played in 69 career games (52 starts) and has reached double figures in scoring 24 times and in rebounds four times. Last year as a sophomore, he led the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg) despite averaging just 20.5 minutes per game.

- Holmes reached double figures in scoring in each of the first six games. For the season, he has converted 29-of-57 (.509) field goals, including 10-of-21 (.476) from three-point range, and 12-of-14 (.857) free throws.
- Against BYU (11/25), Holmes recorded his second career double-double and first of the year with 10 points and 10 rebounds.
- He averaged 10.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game in the two games at the CBE Hall of Fame Championship Round (Kansas City, Mo.)

A HELPING HOLLAND

Through the first seven games, sophomore guard **Demarcus Holland** ranks second on the team in scoring (12.0 ppg) and leads the squad in minutes (33.1 mpg.), which is more than twice the action he saw as a freshman. The second-year guard has appeared in 41 games (19 starts) during his career. Last year as a rookie, he ranked fourth on the team in steals (23) while averaging just 16.5 minutes per game. He earned the team's Outstanding Defensive Player honor following last season. Holland averaged 19.6 minutes per contest during the last 19 games of last season, compared to 12.7 minutes per game in the first 15 contests.

- In Friday's win against UT Arlington (Nov. 29), Holland registered his first career double-double. He set career highs in points (23) and rebounds (11) and tied his career high in field goals made (9-of-13) and three-pointers made (2-of-4) in 35 minutes.
- He has reached double figures in scoring three times this season and six times in his career.
- Earlier this season, he helped bail UT out of a second half deficit against Stephen F. Austin (Nov. 15) by dropping 21 points on 9-of-13 shooting.
- Holland played a season-high 36 minutes against DePaul (11/26) and scored 10 points.

LAMMERT PLAYING A LARGER ROLE

Sophomore forward **Connor Lammert** ranks third on the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg) and sixth in scoring (7.6 ppg) in 21.1 minutes per game while hitting 20-of-32 (.625) field goals, including 4-of-9 threes, and 9-of-10 (.900) free throws through the first seven contests. He also ranks fourth on the team in blocked shots (5). By comparison, Lammert averaged 4.5 points and 4.2 rebounds in 21.0 minutes per game while hitting 48.1 percent (64-of-133) from the floor last year.

- Against Houston Baptist (11/18), he scored a season-high 13 points, added a game-high nine rebounds and tied his career high in 3-pointers made (2-of-2).

MAKING AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

UT's quartet of freshmen guards (Damarcus Croaker, Isaiah Taylor, Martez Walker and Kendal Yancy) have combined to produce 28 percent of UT's team scoring, 18 percent of the team's rebounds and 30 percent of the team's minutes.

- Three of the four freshmen have earned starting nods through the first seven games. Taylor has started all six games at point guard. Croaker (BYU and DePaul) and Yancy (Houston Baptist and UTA) have both started two games.
- The four frosh made an impact during the team's season-opening victory against Mercer. All four freshmen scored and combined to post 28 points (8-of-15 FG, 3-of-4 threes, 9-of-15 FT), eight rebounds and two assists in 58 minutes.
- All four frosh have scored in double figures in at least one time this season.
- Three of the four are averaging double figures in minutes played.

TAYLOR TIDBITS

Freshman **Isaiah Taylor** has earned the starting nod at point guard in each of the first seven games to start his collegiate career. He ranks second on the team in assists (2.9 apg) and fourth in scoring (10.4 ppg) while averaging 27.4 minutes per contest. Taylor sports a 20-to-15 (1.3-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and also averages 3.1 rebounds per game. He has reached double figures in scoring in five of the first seven contests. Taylor was rated as the No. 13 prospect in the state of Texas by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 17.6 points, 10.8 assists and 6.0 steals per game while leading his team to a 23-5 mark as a senior.

- In his first collegiate game, Taylor posted a team-high 17 points (4-of-10 FG, 9-of-14 FT) to go along with three rebounds and two assists in 29 minutes.
- The 17 points marked the sixth-highest scoring output by a UT player in his freshman debut and just three shy of the record held by Kevin Durant (20 vs. Alcorn State on Nov. 9, 2006).
- Taylor also scored in double figures against South Alabama (13), Stephen F. Austin (10), DePaul (14) and UT Arlington (10).
- Against South Alabama (11/12), he made a season-most five field goals while dishing out five assists and grabbing four rebounds in a season-high 32 minutes.
- Dished out a season-high six assists in UT's win over Houston Baptist (11/28).
- Against UT Arlington, Taylor made a season-high five steals and had zero turnovers for the first time this season.

WALKER'S WAY

For the year, freshman **Martez Walker** is averaging 2.4 points, 1.4 rebounds and 7.6 minutes per game, while shooting 6-of-15 from three-point range. Walker was ranked as the No. 8 player in the state of Michigan by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 20.4 points and seven rebounds per game while leading his team to a 25-1 mark and the Michigan Class A state quarterfinals as a senior.

- Against Houston Baptist (11/18), Walker played a season-high 18 minutes and set season highs in points (10) and rebounds (4).

CROAKER'S CREDENTIALS

Freshman **Damarcus Croaker** has played in all seven games, including starts against BYU and DePaul. For the season, he is averaging 5.1 points per game and is shooting 33.3 percent (8-of-24) from three-point range. Croaker was ranked as the No. 105 prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and tabbed the No. 6 prospect in the state of Florida following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 23.9 ppg and paced his team to the 2013 Florida High School Athletic Association regional quarterfinals.

- In his first career start (vs. BYU, 11/25), he finished with a season-high 14 points. He also knocked down a season-high 3 three-pointers.

YANCY'S YOUTH

Freshman **Kendal Yancy** has made two starts this season (vs. Houston Baptist and UT Arlington). Through seven contests, Yancy is averaging 4.1 points and shooting 52.4 percent (11-of-21) in 12.4 minutes per game. Yancy was ranked as the No. 85 prospect nationally in the ESPN100 following his senior year. He averaged 12.2 points, 6.6 rebounds and 7.8 assists per game while leading his team to a 33-6 record and a trip to the Texas 5A state semifinals as a senior.

- Against DePaul (11/26), Yancy set season highs in points (10), field goals made (4-of-7) and minutes played (23). Yancy reached double figures in scoring for the first time in his collegiate career.

DUO COMMITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

A pair of high school basketball standouts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. **Jordan Barnett** (St. Louis, Mo.) and **Obie Oleka** (Washington, D.C.) will join the Longhorns for the 2014-15 season.

- **Barnett** (6-7, 190), a forward from Christian Brothers College High School who played under coach Bob McCormack, is ranked as the No. 83 prospect in the nation by ESPN and No. 101 by Rivals.com. As a junior last season, Barnett led CBC with 17.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game while hitting 37.6 percent of his three-point attempts. In his sophomore year, he helped the Cadets to the Class 5 quarterfinals by leading the team with 14.2 points, 6.8 boards and 1.7 blocked shots per game. Barnett also knocked down a team-high 48 three-pointers and led the team with a 48.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc.
- **Oleka** (6-7, 225), a power forward from State College of Florida (Bradenton, Fla.) who plays under head coach Elliot Washington, will enroll at UT this summer as a junior. In his freshman season at State College of Florida, he averaged 10.9 points and 6.2 rebounds per game while converting 55 percent from the floor. In his senior year at Florida Christian Institute (Cape Coral, Fla.), Oleka averaged 24.0 points and 11.0 rebounds per game.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last four years (2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013). The awards are given each year to teams scoring in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1.000 score in each of the last four multi-year APR reports. In seven of the last eight years, two or more student-athletes have represented Texas on the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Five schools on Texas' schedule are ranked in the AP Top 25. During its non-conference schedule, UT will face opponents from the Atlantic Sun (Mercer), Sun Belt (South Alabama), Southland (Stephen F. THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. The Longhorns enter Monday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 763 consecutive games. In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 892 of 898 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

OFF THE COURT WITH THE HORNS

- **Brandon Allums** served as a practice player for the Texas women's basketball team last season.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a sophomore on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets. Harris is currently playing for the Erie BayHawks of the NBA Developmental League.

Year 16 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 16th season at Texas. He has compiled over 500 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 20 NCAA and three NIT trips.

- UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the 15 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 14 of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin.

- UT owns a 30-17 (.638) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

- Barnes carried a streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances into the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
