Balanced UGA, VU squads meet

Two of the Southeastern Conference's most versatile offensive attacks square off in Nashville on Thursday evening when Vanderbilt hosts No. 17 Georgia in a CSS regionally televised contest. Tipoff at Memorial Gymnasium is set for 8 p.m. CENTRAL, with Bernie Guenther and Joe Ciampi calling the action.

Georgia and Vanderbilt are two of three SEC teams that sport four players with double-digit scoring averages...Tennessee being the other.

The Lady Bulldogs, who are coming off a 61-47 win at Ole Miss on Sunday, are currently 16-4 overall and 5-2 in SEC. Georgia raced to a 30-2 lead over the Lady Rebels and cruised thereafter.

Khaalidah Miller's 13.3 point per game average leads the Lady Bulldogs, while Jasmine Hassell (13.2 ppg), Anne Marie Armstrong (11.7) and Jasmine James (10.2) chip in double digits as well.

Vanderbilt slipped to 14-5 overall and 2-4 in the SEC with a Sunday setback to South Carolina. VU dropped a 65-60 OT decision to the Gamecocks.

Christina Foggie's 17.6 ppg average leads the Commodores and ranks second in the SEC. VU also receives double-digit contributions from Jasmine Lister (12.2 ppg), Stephanie Holzer (10.7) and Tiffany Clarke (10.6).

Series history with Vanderbilt Georgia owns a 30-24 lead in matchups with Vanderbilt; however, the Commodores possess an 11-9 edge in games at Memorial Gym.

Last season in Athens, Vanderbilt secured a 69-59 upset of No. 24 Georgia behind 24 points from Jen Lister.

The Commodores pushed a five-point halftime lead to double digits midway through the second stanza.

After trailing 58-42, a 17-2 run pulled the Lady Bulldogs within 60-59 with 2:34 remaining. Georgia failed on two chances to tie or take the lead before the Commodores scored the game's final nine points.

In the most recent contest in Nashville on Jan. 14, 2010, the Commodores' 66-44 victory over No. 6 Georgia ended the Lady Bulldogs' school-record win streak to begin the season at 16 games.

Last Time Out...

No. 15 Georgia raced to a 30-2 lead and never looked back en route to a 61-47 victory over Ole Miss on Sunday.

"It would hard to imagine us playing much better out of the gate than we did today," Andy Landers said. "They moved. They passed. They cut. They caught. They shot. They defended. They crashed the boards and rebounded. You really couldn't ask for your basketball team to play any better than we did in the first half."

Three Lady Bulldogs posted double-doubles – and career-best rebound tallies. Anne Marie Armstrong scored 15 points and grabbed 11 rebounds, Khaalidah Miller chipped in 13 points and 11 boards and Meredith Mitchell contributed 10 points and 14 rebounds.

Five different Lady Bulldogs scored on the first five possessions as Georgia opened up an 11-2 lead just 3:37 into the game.

Georgia eventually scored on its first eight trips to the offensive end and expanded the lead to 18-2 during that run.

The score bulged to 30-2 before Ole Miss finally notched its second field goal on a stickback by Nikki Byrd with 6:32 remaining.

The Lady Bulldogs again played without Jasmine James and Krista Donald, who are nursing knee injuries.

“The thing you don’t have to worry about with this team and the position we’re in with injuries and depth is that they are not going to pace themselves,” Landers said. “They’re not going to worry about how they’re going to feel late in the game. They really go out there and pour it all down the funnel from the opening tip. The result of that is that we’ve been able to jump people and get very good early leads. We may lose a little of that as the game goes on but we still play hard and we defend well.”

Winning season locked up

In the “modern era” of women’s intercollegiate basketball – since the NCAA began oversight with the 1981-82 season – only four programs have posted winning records during every campaign – Georgia, Louisiana Tech, Tennessee and Green Bay.

Georgia secured its 33rd straight winning season – a streak that coincides with Andy Landers’ arrival in Athens in 1979 – with last Sunday’s victory over Ole Miss in Oxford.

Green Bay, at 17-0, also has reached the magic “16” wins that ensure a winning campaign.

Tennessee enters tonight’s game at Alabama with 14 “Ws” on the year...two shy of guaranteeing a winning year.

The fourth member of the quartet, Louisiana Tech, has some work to do to remain among the elite ledger. The Lady Techsters are currently 9-10 on the year. La. Tech is seven victories shy of a winning record with 10 regular-season outings and the WAC Tournament remaining on their slate.

Lady Bulldogs solid on the road

Georgia hopes Thursday’s game at Vanderbilt resembles its three most recent road dates.



QUOTING COACH LANDERS...

On his team’s solid play of late while shorthanded due to injuries...

“It’s a mature basketball team. They understand the challenge. They understand the margin of error that’s involved, the importance of preparation and then coming out and playing hard. They’re really done an outstanding job on staying focused on the things that we can control and not really worrying about the things that we can’t control.”

On the game with Vanderbilt...

“You go to Nashville and you’re going to play a very good offensive basketball team... you’re going to play a very good defensive basketball team. This is a team that shoots the three-ball extremely well and has an excellent presence inside and an excellent ability to deliver the ball inside at the right time at the right place. Defensively, we’re in for a big, big challenge.”

Over the past three Sundays, the Lady Bulldogs have secured double-digit wins at Auburn, Mississippi State and Ole Miss by an average of 18.7 points per game.

On Jan. 8 at Auburn, the Lady Bulldogs secured a decisive 70-45 victory over the Tigers.

On Jan. 15, Georgia topped Mississippi State, 68-51 – UGA’s largest margin of victory in Starkville since 1991.

Last Sunday, the Lady Bulldogs exploded to a 30-2 lead and were never challenged thereafter while topping Ole Miss 61-47 in Oxford.

A homecoming for Hassell
Lady Bulldog junior Jasmine Hassell is from Lebanon, Tenn., – about 30 minutes from Nashville – where she starred at Wilson Central High.

Hassell was a McDonald’s and WBCA All-American and tabbed Miss Basketball for Tennessee’s Class AAA as both a junior and a senior. She also was named the Tennessean’s Player of the Year both seasons.

Hassell helped Wilson Central’s Wildcats to Tennessee AAA state titles as a freshman in 2006 and again as a junior in 2008.

MITCHELL GRADUATES

Meredith Mitchell's roster status could have changed from "Sr." to "Gr." on Dec. 16 when she became the 59th – of 59 – four-year letterwinners to earn their degree from UGA during Andy Landers' 33 seasons in Athens.

Mitchell secured her bachelor's in Management from the prestigious Terry College of Business.

"It's a relief to be done," Mitchell said. "It's hard to believe that my undergraduate career is over. It was a little stressful this week with practice and finals but it's really just time management."

Not only have all 59 four-year letterwinners graduated, two (Tina Taylor and Jaleesa Rhoden) earned three additional degrees combined during extra years of eligibility due to injuries. **Awarding "extra credit" for those extra diplomas earned while eligible bumps the graduation rate of Landers' four-year letterwinners to 105 percent.**

The Lady Bulldogs came within a single digit – Erika Ford finished with nine points – of repeating that feat in their next outing at Ole Miss.

Georgia has produced three or more double-figure individual tallies in 16 of 20 games to date in 2011-12. On six occasions, four players popped for 10 or more.

Playing 5 on 9

Five Lady Bulldogs played 35 minutes or more against Kentucky on Jan. 19. Only one Wildcat, A'dia Mathies, logged 35 MP, while eight other UK players saw double-digit minutes.

For Georgia, **Anne Marie Armstrong, Erika Ford, Jasmine Hassell and Khaalidah Miller all met or bettered their career-high tallies for minutes.**

Meredith Mitchell, the lone starter who did not do so, played all 40 minutes against the Wildcats...*her career-most MP is 44 established against Oklahoma State in the 2010 NCAA Tourney and equaled last year against Arkansas.*

Armstrong played 39 minutes, one more than she did against Florida.

Hassell logged 35 minutes, one more than she saw at Mississippi State.

Ford totaled 37 MP, the same she played against Appalachian State.

Miller played all 40 minutes for the fifth time this season and eighth time in two seasons at UGA.

Mitchell played every second for the fourth time this year and the 10th time during her collegiate career with the Lady Bulldogs.

Landers' comments prophetic?

Andy Landers said he believed playing two non-conference contests without Jasmine James would ultimately benefit the Lady Bulldogs.

James missed Georgia's contests against Appalachian State and Furman after spraining her right knee during the Montana State game at the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic. *She played through the injury and finished the game versus the Bobcats.*

"I think it's going to be invaluable," Landers said. "Having to play without Jasmine James has changed the way some other people play. I think the willingness to handle the basketball and do certain things against pressure has made them and made us better."

Landers' comments rang true when James "tweaked" the same injury with 6:02 remaining in the first half at Mississippi State on Jan. 15. The Lady Bulldogs led by seven when James left the contest but eventually secured a 17-point decision.

Since then, Georgia put up a solid effort against No. 6 Kentucky and topped Ole Miss in Oxford by 14 points..

Turning "D" into "O"

Entering their Jan. 19 matchup, No. 6 Kentucky and No. 15 Georgia ranked first and fourth, respectively, in the SEC in scoring offense; however, closer examination showed the "other end" of the floor played a large part in that.

The Wildcats and Lady Bulldogs ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the league in both steals and turnover margin.

UK was averaging 14.2 steals per game, while UGA was collecting 11.2. Kentucky was a whopping +12.3 in TO margin and Georgia is +5.9.

In the Dogs vs. Cats matchup, Georgia won the TO margin battle by two, giving the ball away 14 times to UK's 16. However, Kentucky scored 13 points off of those gifts...vs. eight by Georgia. Ironically, the Wildcats won by that exact margin, five points.

"2" and "4" scoring more

Khaalidah Miller and Anne Marie Armstrong provided Georgia with stellar offensive outputs against Florida and Mississippi State.

They shared game-high scoring honors with 19 points apiece against the Gators. Armstrong poured in 22 points and Miller added 17 in Starkville.

All told, Miller and Armstrong scored 77 of Georgia's 129 points (59.7 percent) versus UF and MSU. They did so efficiently by shooting percentages of 53.7 from the floor, 42.1 from three-point range and 91.7 percent from the line.

Big numbers on the sidelines

The Mississippi State contest represented Andy Landers' 1050th game as UGA's first – and still only – full-time women's basketball head coach.

It also served as Sharon Fanning-Otis' 500th outing at MSU.

Landers was a 26-year-old with four seasons of junior college experience when he was hired in April 1979. Interestingly, Landers was the first head coach hired by football coach Vince Dooley after he added the role of Director of Athletics to his title.

Former teammates face off

The Mississippi State game was the fourth time a Lady Bulldog faced a former high school teammate during the 2011-12 season.

Georgia's Meredith Mitchell and Mississippi State's Brittany Young played together for two seasons at Midfield (Ala.) High School near Birmingham.

The other reunions occurred when the Lady Bulldogs played at Georgia Southern, at Mercer and at Auburn.

A half-dozen former teammates played against each other in Statesboro. Tamika Willis and Danielle Spencer played together at Westlake High. Erika Ford and Kayla Upchurch were classmates at Chattahoochee High. Brittney Crews and Southern's MiMi DuBose played together at Jefferson High.

Willis also faced Westlake alum Sharnea Boykin in Macon.

Sophomore Khaalidah Miller and Auburn senior Morgan Jennings played together for two seasons at Frederick Douglass High in Atlanta.

Georgia hitting its "magic number"

The Lady Bulldogs have furthered one of the greatest statistical indicators in any sport six times this season.

The Lady Bulldogs have scored 80 or more points on six occasions and in the process improved to 431-



UPDATING A CLASSIC VENUE

Georgia's historic Stegeman Coliseum, which underwent a \$13 million, 21st century facelift prior to the 2010-11 season, received more than \$700,000 in additional upgrades before the 2011-12 campaign.

The initial renovations focused on the arena's concourses. Those were highlighted by the installation of glass facades from the facility's distinctive overhang roof on the Smith and Carlton Street sides of the venue, creating an additional 10,000 square feet of concourse space. The alterations to the venue won the 2011 American Institute for Architects Georgia Honor Design Award.

This fall, the changes addressed the competition arena bowl itself. A new floor utilized during the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship was purchased and installed, as was a state of the art sound system.

All of the aforementioned, coupled with the \$30-million, 120,000-square foot practice facility adjacent to the Coliseum that was christened in 2007, have transformed the 48-year-old Coliseum facility into a modern classic.

7 when scoring 80 or more during Andy Landers' 33 seasons at the University of Georgia.

That converts to an almost unfathomable 98.401826484018 winning percentage. The six 80-plus outings in the first 13 games represented one more than the Lady Bulldogs produced in the past two seasons combined.

Fond memories of Auburn Arena

Though the Jan. 8 game was UGA's first versus Auburn in its new arena, the Lady Bulldogs are now 3-0 in the venue.

Last March, Georgia won NCAA Tournament first- and second-round games at Auburn Arena.

The Lady Bulldogs topped Middle Tennessee, 56-41, behind 18 points from Jasmine James and a double-double of 10 points and 14 rebounds by Porsha Phillips.

Sixth-seeded Georgia upset third-seeded and No. 15-ranked Florida State, 61-59, in dramatic fashion. The Lady Bulldogs secured the victory on James' stickback of a Phillips miss with 2.9 seconds remaining.

The Lady Bulldogs advanced to their 19th "Sweet 16" – the third-most of any program in the nation.

Ford earns SEC Freshman honor

Erika Ford was named Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week on Jan. 2 after averaging 9.5 points and 6.0 rebounds in wins over Furman and Arkansas.

Ford, a 5-9, guard from Chattahoochee High School in Alpharetta, scored 14 points and grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds against the Paladins to post the first double-double of her career. Ford scored 12 first-half points to lead Georgia to a season-best 49 points prior to intermission.

In the SEC opener against Arkansas, Ford came off the bench to make an immediate impact against the Razorbacks. She scored five of the first eight points in a 21-4 run that turned a 16-7 deficit into a 28-20 lead.

All told, eight different Georgia freshmen – including current Lady Bulldogs Jasmine Hassell, Jasmine James and Khaalidah Miller – have combined to earn Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week honors 19 times since the award's inception in 2006.

Rare league opener versus Hogs

This season marked just the second time – and the first in two decades – the Lady Bulldogs opened SEC play against Arkansas since the Razorbacks joined the league in 1991.

Unranked Georgia upset No. 20 Arkansas, 79-62, in Fayetteville on Dec. 19, 1991 in the then-Lady Razorbacks' first-ever SEC contest.

The most coaching wins...ever!

The combined victories on the sidelines for the Jan. 5 game between Georgia and Tennessee equaled the most in the history of college basketball.

Entering that contest, Andy Landers and Pat Summitt had recorded 867 and 1,081 wins, respectively. That added up to a staggering 1,948 "Ws" – the same tally accumulated when Tennessee faced off against Rutgers on Dec. 13, 2011, when Summitt (1,076) coached against C. Vivian Stringer (872).

The third-most combined wins (1,919) came when the Lady Bulldogs and Lady Volunteers met in last season's SEC Tournament semifinals.

Fourth was Tennessee at Stanford on Dec. 20, 2011, when Summitt (1,078) and Tara VanDerveer (833) had 1,911 combined victories.

Hassell earns all-tourney honor

Jasmine Hassell was named to the all-tournament team at the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic.

The junior from Lebanon, Tenn., led Georgia offensively in both games, averaging 17.0 points.

Those outings were just a fraction of a very impressive stretch for Hassell.

She was a double-digit scorer in 10 consecutive games from Nov. 26-Jan. 1, averaging 16.1 points while shooting a spectacular 63.6 percent from the field and a sterling 74.0 percent from the line.

The book on boarding: Chapter 1

Freshmen Krista Donald and Erika Ford were active on the glass in Georgia's final two non-conference games.

Donald grabbed 13 rebounds against Appalachian State.

Ford secured a career-best and game-high 10 rebounds versus Furman en route to a double-double.

Ford offered a simple description when asked about her rebounding prowess against the Paladins.

"I just try to go to where there isn't anyone else and hope that the ball comes to me," Ford quipped.

Andy Landers confirmed Ford's assessment of effective rebounding...but gave her a little more credit.

"I call it 'going where they ain't,'" Landers said. "It sounds simple but it's easier to rebound if you're not behind someone. Erika should give herself a little bit more credit, though. She tracks the ball pretty well. She and Donald both have a pretty good GPS when it comes to rebounding."

Jones plays, gets hurt again

Ebony Jones saw her first – and only – action of the season at Mercer.

Jones missed Georgia's first eight games while recovering from a posterior cruciate ligament (PCL) injury in her left knee. She scored on a nifty catch and layup in transition that supplied the Lady Bulldogs' final points of the night.

Jones then sprained her right ankle in practice Dec. 16 before departing for the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic and did not dress there.

She was in uniform for the Appalachian State and Furman games but did not play. Jones' ankle improved but swelling to her knee returned since the holiday break and she has not dressed out for an SEC game.

Stifling "D" versus App State

The Lady Bulldogs raced to a 32-10 halftime lead over Appalachian State on Dec. 22. That represented the fewest points Georgia surrendered in a first half since holding N.C. Central to six on Nov. 26, 2008.

Perhaps more impressive is that Appalachian State entered the game averaging 72.7 ppg.

Wrapping up a busy stretch

Georgia hosted Appalachian State on Dec. 22 – the Lady Bulldogs' third contest in just four days...with a red-eye flight home from Las Vegas sandwiched in between.

Georgia's loss to Gonzaga has to be a record for shortest time leading by a winning team. The Zags took their one and only advantage of the contest with two-tenths of the second on the clock.

Georgia scored the game's first six points and led by double-digits most of the contest. The Lady Bulldogs' enjoyed their largest lead of 15 points on four occasions, lastly at 62-49 with 7:12 left.

After that, Gonzaga outscored Georgia 22-4, including Haiden Palmer's game-winner with 0.2 left on the clock.

Lady Bulldogs hold bike build

Wrenches and ratchets were put to good use in the Stegeman Coliseum concourse on Dec. 10 as the Georgia Lady Bulldogs conducted their fifth annual Holiday Bicycle Build.

The Lady Bulldogs raised more than \$2,000 to purchase bikes and helmets for worthy children. Academy Sports + Outdoors donated additional bicycles and helmets, bringing the total to approximately 60. The bikes were distributed through schools in Athens/Clarke and Jackson County that participated in the "Reading with the Dogs" program, as well as Athens' Boys & Girls Club.

Lady Bulldog players originated the program five years ago during an early-December break from competition.

All told, the Lady Bulldogs have raised funds for, built and given away approximately 275 bikes.

"One of the things that makes this effort special is that it was and is the players' idea and the players' execution," Andy Landers said. "From the raising of the money to the actual putting together of the bikes, this is their deal. They take great pride in that fact as do I."

Solid within the borders

The Lady Bulldogs are 3-0 this season in games against other schools from within Georgia.

Those victories improved UGA's all-time record versus in-state competition to 126-84 (.600).

The Lady Bulldogs' record versus Peach State competition took a dramatic turn after Andy Landers was named UGA's first – and still only – full-time head coach in 1979. In the six seasons prior to Landers' arrival, Georgia was just 26-67 (.280) against home state opponents. In his 33 campaigns, Georgia has compiled a 100-17 (.855) mark.

Freshman starters sorority grows

Krista Donald and Erika Ford added their names to a lengthy and impressive list of first-year Lady Bulldogs to start for Andy Landers against Northeastern on Nov. 27.

Donald and Ford became the 68th and 69th freshmen to get the nod in Landers' 33 seasons on the sidelines in Athens.

Current senior Meredith Mitchell, juniors Anne Marie Armstrong, Jasmine Hassell and Jasmine James and sophomore Khaalidah Miller also started in their initial campaigns.

Mitchell stellar against USC

Meredith Mitchell exploded for a career-high 21 points against No. 23 Southern Cal on Nov. 20.

Mitchell keyed an early run that put Georgia in control. She scored 10 in a first-half span of 6:23 as the Lady Bulldogs pushed a four-point edge to 14.

"The great thing about Meredith's performance was that it was all within reason," Andy Landers said. "I didn't think one of her shots was ill-conceived. They were the shots I want her to take. It was good day, about as good as it gets."

James earns SEC honor

Jasmine James was named SEC Player of the Week Nov. 21 after averaging 13.3 points, 7.0 boards, 5.3 assists and 2.7 steals during a trio wins.

James scored 16 points on 6-of-9 FG shooting in Georgia's 68-49 win at Georgia Southern. Two days later, she posted game-high tallies of 17 points, seven assists and six steals – and grabbed eight rebounds – in a 73-48 victory over College of Charleston. James led UGA with nine boards and six assists and played all 40 minutes in a 67-60 win over No. 23 Southern Cal.

James has earned six weekly honors from the SEC. In 2009-10, she was tabbed SEC Freshman of the Week a league-record five times.

UGA signs five standouts

The Lady Bulldogs' next generation was secured when a quintet of standouts inked letters of intent during the NCAA early signing period on Nov. 9-16.

On Nov. 9, UGA signed Shacobia Barbee, a 5-11, guard/forward from Riverdale High in Murfreesboro, Tenn., and Marjorie Butler, a 5-7, guard from the Webb School in Knoxville, Tenn. Barbee and Butler were the 2011 Miss Tennessee Basketball winners for Classes AAA and Division II-A, respectively.

On Nov. 11, Georgia inked Kaelyn Causwell, a 6-4, forward from the Wesleyan School in Norcross, Ga., who helped the Lady Wolves secure a third straight Class A state title in 2011.

On Nov. 14, UGA received scholarship papers from Merritt Hempe, a 6-2, forward from Stafford High in Fredericksburg, Va., who averaged a double-double of 20.1 points and 10.8 rebounds per game last season.

On Nov. 16, Tiaria Griffin, a 5-9 guard from Hattiesburg (Miss.) High, committed. Griffin averaged 30.1 ppg as a junior while leading Lawrence County High to a runner-up finish in the Mississippi AAAA State Tourney as a junior.

Barbee, Butler, Griffin and Hempe all are ranked as four-star prospects by ESPN's HoopGurlz, while Causwell is listed as a three-star recruit.
