MINUTEMEN RETURN HOME TO HOST FIRST-EVER SEC TEAM

• For the first time in program history, UMass will play host to a team from the Southeastern Conference when Vanderbilt visits Gillette Stadium on Saturday afternoon (12 PM kick-off). This will mark the second of four scheduled games with the Commodores after the Minutemen traveled to Nashville last season.

• The game will be televised live on ESPNNews and the WatchESPN app. Dave Lamont will call the action alongside color analyst Ray Bentley.

• The UMass Sports Network will once again feature Voice of the Minutemen Josh Maurer handling play-by-play duties alongside analyst Matt Goldstein, sideline reporter Cody Chrusciel and game host Adam Frenier. The game can be heard live starting at 11:40 AM (EST) on 105.5 FM WEEI (Springfield), 1440 AM WVEI (Worcester) and 95.9 FM WATD (South Shore). The broadcast is also available online through www.UMassAthletics.com and on smart phones and tablets through the Tuneln app.

• Vanderbilt and UMass first met last season in Nashville with the Commodores defeating the Minutemen 49-7. Vandy scored 14 points in the final two minutes of the first half and had a 28 point burst in the third quarter. Jordan Rogers threw for 217 yards and two touchdowns, while the Commodore run game picked up 226 yards and three touchdowns. A.J. Doyle tossed his first career touchdown going 8-for-14 for 48 yards in relief of Mike Wegzyn.

• The game will feature the return of former UMass assistants Bob Shoop and Sean Spencer. Shoop was the defensive backs coach at UMass during the 2006 NCAA National Finalist run. Spencer was a defensive line and special teams coach in 2001-03 and 2007-08.

• UMass is coming off a 37-7 loss at Kansas State last Saturday. A.J. Doyle started at quarterback for the first time this season and the second time overall in his career. Stacey Bedell ran for a career-best 81 yards, while Tajae Sharpe had a career high 98 yards receiving. Doyle finished the game going 21-of-31 with two interceptions. UMass led 7-6 after the first quarter, but a 21-point second quarter for the Wildcats broke open the game.

• The Minutemen will be off next weekend for the first of two bye weeks this season. UMass will next play on Oct. 5 at Bowling Green. The Falcons defeated UMass 24-0 last year at Gillette Stadium.

• UMass will honor its specific Colleges which make up the overall University at several home games this year. At the Vanderbilt game, UMass will honor the Isenberg School of Management which is one of the top programs in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

• The two teams met for the first time last season in Nashville with Vanderbilt winning 49-7. The teams are scheduled to play again in Nashville in 2014 and at Gillette in 2018.

QUICK SLANTS

• In the season opener at Wisconsin, UMass had 11 total freshmen (true & redshirt) play in the game. All told this season, 34 of the 51 players who have seen action are redshirt sophomores or younger. A total of 19 have started, 13 of whom were sophomores and six of whom were freshmen.

• UMass will need to limit big plays against Vanderbilt. This year, opponents have 21 plays of longer than 20 yards including eight 30-yard or longer scoring plays.

• Offensively, Tajae Sharpe has become one of UMass' favorite receivers with 20 catches for 183 yards in the last two games.

• Defensively, Ed Saint-Vil has been a tackling machine the last two outings with a total of 26 stops (14 vs. Maine, 12 at Kansas State).

• A.J. Doyle has been a model of efficiency during his career. The sophomore has a career completion rate of 58.2 with an efficiency rating of 92.5 - In 2013 he has a rating of 102.6 and a completion rate of 60.0 percent.

• Colter Johnson, the MAC's top punter in 2012, was named to the Ray Guy Watch List during the offseason.

• Anthony Dima was named to the Outland Trophy Watch List in the summer as well.

Tajae Sharpe had a career-high 11 catches for 85 yards and a touchdown, while Ed Saint-Vil posted a career-best 14 tackles.

A 21-point second quarter for Kansas State opened up a close game giving the Wildcats a 37-7 win over UMass at Bill Snyder Stadium. UMass led 7-6 after the first quarter, but could not manage to capitalize on several other scoring chances during the game. Stacey Bedell ran for a career-best 81 yards, while Tajae Sharpe had a career-high 98 yards receiving. Kansas State rushed for 329 yards picking up two touchdowns on the ground. The Wildcats also received a defensive touchdown and blocked a field goal to hold UMass at bay.

Doyle took over in the third quarter throwing his first career touchdown pass and going 8-for-14 for 48 yards.

UMass Looks To Be Much Improved For Second FBS Season

- The 2013 season for UMass will feature a still young, but more experienced football program as the Minutemen embark on their second season in the Football Bowl Subdivision. As the youngest team in college football last year, those 30 freshmen who saw game time are now a year older and more comfortable in Charley Molnar's offensive and defensive schemes.
- The 2013 season will also feature the debut of UMass' best recruiting class in program history. The freshman class is expected to see playing time throughout the season much as last year's class did. All told in 2012, 18 freshmen or redshirt freshmen started in games.
- The 2012 season represented a new era in UMass football as the Minutemen transitioned from a storied past at the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision and the Mid-American Conference.
- The 2011 season marked the final year in the FCS (formerly I-AA).
- UMass will continue to call Gillette Stadium home in 2013, but will begin to play a split venue schedule starting in 2014 as McGuirk Stadium will once again be ready to host home games. Construction is in full force currently on the new press box and the new football performance center.
- UMass will be eligible for the MAC Championship and is bowl-eligible this season.
- UMass joins UConn (Big East) and Boston College (ACC) as the only New England FBS schools.

MadeInMass

- Charley Molnar's vision for the future of UMass is the Made In Mass campaign. Within five years, Molnar wants his program to be playing for a MAC Championship with 50 percent of its starters hailing from the Commonwealth.
- Put simply, Molnar wants the Minutemen to be the state's football team and recognizes the talent available in the area.

15 PLAYERS EARN SCHOLARSHIPS UNDER MOLNAR

- In his second year at UMass, 15 returning players and walk-ons have either been put on scholarship or upgraded to full scholarship level status.
- Of those 15, 11 were walk-on players who earned a scholarship through their hard work: Vance Barton, Ryan Collins, Joey Colton, Colter Johnson, Al Leneus, Blake Lucas, Dan Maynes, Shakur Nesmith, Rob O'Conner, Greg Orekoya, and Matt Quinn.
- Joey Colton earned a scholarship after his play last season highlighted by his performance against Akron. Following that game, then senior safety Darren Thelen famously stated in the postgame interviews that he wanted Molnar to give his scholarship to Colton in 2013.
- Dan Maynes and Rob O'Connor made national headlines when a team video went viral showing Molnar surprising the two with scholarships during training camp. In that video, Molnar had two police officers come to a team meeting pretending to serve Maynes and O'Connor with arrest warrants that were really the scholarship offers. As the two were reading the papers, Molnar put up on the video board a statement saying the pair had just been given scholarships and the two were mobbed by teammates.
- To acknowledge their consistent play to the team, Molnar also upgraded Kevin Byrne, Brandon Howard, Brendan Levegood, and Jeff Strait to full scholarships.

UMass History Thumbnail

- This is the 131st season of UMass football. UMass has an all-time record of 557-540-51 (.513) in 1,148 all-time games. The Minutemen won two of the their last six conference championships (2006 and 2007) as members of the Colonial Athletic Association and the Atlantic 10. In 2008, UMass posted its seventh winning season in a row with a 7-5 record. Over its last nine years at the FCS level, UMass made three NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007, UMass went 10-3, going 7-1 in the inaugural season of the CAA.
- UMass was the winningest program in the CAA over a 10-year span from 1998-2008 with an 83-44 record with a 65.7 win percentage.
- The Minutemen have won 22 conference championships - the last two coming in 2007 and 2008. All-time UMass had eight NCAA Tournament appearances at the FCS level winning the 1998 national title and also playing in the championship game in 2006 and 1978.

FORMER MINUTEMEN IN THE NFL

- Entering the 2013 NFL Season, UMass is well represented on Sunday afternoons. The most prominent UMass alum is none other than Victor Cruz whose improbable story and highlight reel season in 2011 captured America's attention. Cruz helped the New York Giants to a Super Bowl win while setting a franchise record for receiving yardage in a single-season. Along with the publicity he garnered for his signature 'Salsa Dance' as a touchdown celebration, Cruz also wrote a book during the off-season which became a best-seller.
- Lining up opposite from Cruz in the 2012 Super Bowl was James Ihedigbo with the New England Patriots. Ihedigbo previously played three years with the New York Jets alongside Vladimir Ducasse and is now with the Baltimore Ravens. Ihedigbo helped the Ravens to the 2013 Super Bowl marking the second consecutive year that UMass had an alum hoist the Lombardi Trophy.
- Ducasse was drafted in the second round of the 2010 NFL Draft and is entering his fourth season with the Jets.
- Also currently on NFL rosters are Michael Cox (New York Giants) and Emil Igwenagu (Philadelphia Eagles). Cox was drafted in the 7th round of the 2013 NFL Draft by the Giants.
- The previous high mark for UMass products in the pro came in 1968, when UMass had five players combined between the NFL and AFL, prior to the leagues' merger in 1970. That year, tight end Milt Morin played for the Cleveland Browns, quarterback Greg Landry was a first-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions, quarterback John McCormick played for the Denver Broncos and halfback Terry Swanson and lineman Ed Toner suited up for the then-Boston Patriots.

DOYLE EARNS START AT K-STATE

• A.J. Doyle earned the start at Kansas State marking the second career start for Bay State native. Doyle was 21-of-31 for 186 yards and two interceptions and also generated 37 yards on the ground.

• That marked his first start since last year's season finale against Central Michigan where he was 30-of-45 for 253 yards, 2 touchdowns and 3 interceptions. His 30 completions are the 5th most for a single game in school history.

SHARPE CATCHING ON IN 2013

• In the course of the last two games, Tajae Sharpe has 20 receptions for 183 yards and one touchdown. That alone equals his total output from last season in terms of catches. For 2013, he has 21 catches for 196 yards - just five shy of his total 2012 yardage.

• At Kansas State, he had a career-best 98 yards on nine catches including a long of 27 yards.

• He had a career outing versus Maine with 11 catches for 85 yards and one touchdown. His previous career high for catches was three which he last had at Akron in 2012 where he also posted a then-high 50 yards. The touchdown against the Black Bears marked the first of his career.

BEDELL CARRYING THE LOAD

• Stacey Bedell had a career game at Kansas State with 81 yards rushing and his first career touchdown. Bedell had a pair of 14 yard runs and a team season-long 18 yard run in the game as well.

• Of UMass' 89 rushing attempts this season, Bedell has 58 of the carries. He also has 209 of UMass' 287 rushing yards.

• Bedell also has 11 first down carries this year, five runs of 10 yards or more, and has been thrown for a loss just four times this year.

• In his second game as a starter against Maine, Bedell showed he can be equally adept at receiving out of the back field as he is running the ball. Bedell posted 110 all-purpose yards with 58 yards on the ground and 52 through the air.

• After missing 10 games last year due to an injury, Bedell showed he can carry the load at running back against Wisconsin. He posted 19 carries for 70 yards (3.7 per carry).

• His 19 carries and 70 yards were both career highs at the time.

FOUR WIDEOUTS POST CATCHES AGAINST BLACK BEARS

• While the tight ends had 10 of 14 catches against Wisconsin, it was the wide receivers who were featured against Maine. Four different wideouts had catches highlighted by Tajae Sharpe's 11 catches. All told, 18 of 20 receptions were by wide receivers with the other two by running back Stacey Bedell.

AFTER THREE GAMES, LINE PLAYING WELL

• In its first three games of the year, the offensive line has allowed just two sacks which came against Maine and at Kansas State. In the season-opener at Wisconsin, UMass did not allow a sack at all. In 2012, UMass allowed 32 sacks on the year.

• UMass had no negative yardage run plays through the first two games and had just one negative yardage pass play which also came during the Maine game. Kansas State managed to drop UMass behind its own line of scrimmage seven times.

UMASS CUTTING DOWN ON PENALTIES

• UMass had seven penalties against Wisconsin and saw that drop down to just three against Maine. The total picked back up to six in the loss at Kansas State.

• In 2012, UMass averaged 6.75 penalties per game. In 2013, that average is down to 5.33 per game.

BECK MAKES SOME NICE GRABS

• In his third career start, Derek Beck had a team-best six catches for 37 yards at Wisconsin.

• In 2012, Beck had 3 catches for 20 yards in five games.

• Two of his six catches resulted in first downs against Wisconsin and another set-up a short-distance third down conversion.

• Beck has started all three games this season with 11 catches for 72 yards - both second best on the team.

TIGHT ENDS FIGURE PROMINENTLY INTO OFFENSIVE SCHEME

• Of the 14 receptions against Wisconsin, 10 were by tight ends. Derek Beck had six catches, while Ricardo Miller and Brandon Howard each had two. Miller had a long catch of 16 yards, while Howard had a 19-yard grab - both marked career-longs for each.

• 17 of UMass' 55 receptions this year have been by tight ends.

BIG PLAY PRODUCTION CRITICAL

• UMass was unable to pick up any offensive plays over 20 yards against Wisconsin. UMass had just two drives of 10-or-more plays, but were unable to convert them into points.

• In the loss to Maine, UMass had two plays over 20 yards and six other plays between 10-20 yards.

• UMass had two plays over 20 yards at Kansas State. Both were by Tajae Sharpe who had a 27 yard reception and a 20 yard reception against the Wildcats.

• Part of UMass' ability to extend drives last season and pick up third down conversions was an uptick in big plays throughout the season. UMass had 30 offensive plays over 20 yards for the year in 2012 with 9 of them coming against Ohio.

ROUGH START TO SEASON IN LOSS AT No. 23 WISCONSIN

• Wisconsin ran for nearly 400 yards and popped four scoring plays over 50 yards in a season-opening defeat for UMass, 45-0 at Camp Randall Stadium. The Minutemen trailed just 17-0 at halftime, but the Badgers scored 21 points in the third quarter to fully break open the game.

• Of Wisconsin's 598 yards of total offense, 243 yards came on the four scoring plays.

• 13 Minutemen made their collegiate debut including five first-time starters on offense and two on defense. Wide receiver Shakur Nesmith was the only true freshman to start the game.

WEGZYN STARTS SEASON AT QB

• After starting 11-of-12 games last season, Mike Wegzyn used a strong offseason and spring camp to take hold of the starting quarterback spot heading into the season. Wegzyn was 182-of-346 through the air last year with six touchdowns and 10 interceptions in his first season under center.

OFFENSE LOOKING TO IMPROVE IN 2013

- After a year under head coach Charley Molnar and his spread offense scheme, the Minutemen have looked more comfortable through spring and summer camps.
- UMass averaged 12.7 points last year picking up 89.6 yards rushing and 187 yards through the air - numbers which are expected to improve in 2013.
- The Minutemen return four true starters from last year, but have an infusion of talent in tight end Ricardo Miller, offensive lineman David Osei, and the return of running back Stacey Bedell and offensive lineman Tyrell Smith who were both injured last season.
- John Bond takes the reigns as offensive coordinator this year after spending time at Georgia State.

DEPTH AT TIGHT END A MAJOR PLUS

- Rob Blanchflower enters the year as one of the top tight ends in the Mid-American Conference and leads what will be a talented offensive group for UMass this season. The addition of Ricardo Miller from Michigan, the return of Brandon Howard, and the emergence of Derek Beck during the off-season gives the Minutemen several strong options.
- Blanchflower will miss the Wisconsin game giving Miller his first career start. A strong return against Maine should put the 6-4, 260 pound native of Leominster, Mass., in the hunt to be added to the Mackey Award Watch List when it is updated during the season.

FRESHMAN LOOKING TO CONTRIBUTE RIGHT AWAY

- Overall last year, UMass played 30 true or redshirt freshmen with 18 starting games. That trend will continue in 2013, however, not to that degree. Currently, only five freshmen have started on offense and only one starter on defense has been a rookie this year.
- Stacey Bedell and Tyrell Smith are two of the freshmen who have started this season, but both have a year in Coach Molnar's offensive system under their belt. Wide receiver Shakur Nesmith, E.J. Burstn and Fabian Hoeller are the only true freshmen to start this season. The lone freshman to start on defense has been Shane Huber.

NEW FACES AT WIDEOUT

- Sophomore Tajae Sharpe returns as UMass' only true starter at wide receiver following 2012. Sharpe had 20 receptions for 206 yards as a freshman in 11 games.
- Bernard Davis and Elgin Long will prominently figure in the offense after seeing limited time last season.
- Iric Harris is a converted defensive back, but has progressed nicely as the slot receiver behind Long.

BLANCHFLOWER NAMED CAPTAIN

- Charley Molnar named Rob Blanchflower team captain at the end of 2012 and has said on numerous occasions that he is the unequivocal voice of the team. Molnar also did something new by putting a 'C' on Blanchflower's uniform to denote his status as captain.

DIMA ANCHORS REVAMPED O-LINE

- One of the tough breaks for UMass last season was inconsistency among the offensive line due to a rash of injuries. That forced a different line-up in nearly every game for the Minutemen and that inconsistency affected the offense at times.
- Redshirt senior Anthony Dima is the top returning lineman in 2013 and the lone true starter. Matt Sparks will shift from guard to center, while Vincent Westcarr returns to the team playing guard after missing spring camp. The addition of David Osei from Rutgers and the return of Tyrell Smith from injury gives the Minutemen a strong starting five.
- Several newcomers including Tyshon Henderson and Fabian Hoeller figure to see early playing time. The overall depth of offensive lineman is better this year with 15 on the roster.
- *This is a bigger group as well as the entire offensive line averages 6-foot-5, 300 pounds.*

DIMA NAMED TO OUTLAND TROPHY LIST

- Dima's playing ability in 2012 caught the eye of many and his offseason workout has him moving and playing better. He was named to the Outland Trophy Watch List during the summer becoming the first UMass offensive lineman to do so. The Outland Trophy goes to the best interior offensive or defensive lineman in the country.

OSEI, MILLER EXPECTED TO HAVE AN IMPACT

- As the Minutemen did last year, UMass is hoping that another pair of fifth-year transfers are able to make a significant impact on the offense similar to Deion Walker and Michael Cox. Cox benefited the most as his play gained him the exposure to be drafted by the New York Giants this past April.
- David Osei will certainly add leadership and talent to the offensive line, but his ability to play all five positions will be beneficial over the course of the season. Osei started five games during his career at Rutgers and certainly solidifies the offensive line which lost four starters from last season.
- Not only does Miller add depth and athleticism at tight end, but he is also versatile enough to play at wide receiver.

BIG PLAYS HURTING AFTER THREE GAMES

- In three games, UMass has allowed a total of 21 plays to go for 20-or-more yards. Eight of those 21 plays have resulted in touchdowns of greater than 30 yards.
- After allowing eight in both the Wisconsin and Maine games, UMass gave up just five plays over 20 yards at Kansas State although two were scoring plays of 43 and 50 yards.
- Against Maine, UMass allowed 8 plays over 20 yards including runs of 35 yards and 39 yards for touchdowns.
- On paper UMass gave up nearly 600 yards of offense including 398 on the ground at No. 23 Wisconsin. However, 360 of those yards came on eight plays of 20-or-more yards. Four of those were 50+ touchdown plays that changed the complexion of the game.

NEED FOR 3RD & LONGS

- UMass has allowed opponents to convert 22-of-37 third downs in three games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

- A bright spot for the Minutemen this year has been the ability to force turnovers. UMass has three interceptions and three fumble recoveries in the first three games of the year.

SAINT-VIL A TACKLING MACHINE

- Over the last two games, Ed Saint-Vil has racked up an impressive tackle total of 26 stops.
- He had a career day in the game vs. Maine with 14 total tackles (9 assisted) and one pass break-up. His previous career-best total was 11 against Buffalo last season.
- He followed that with 12 tackles (8 solo) and a forced fumble at Kansas State.
- The two game stretch marks his highest tackle total for back-to-back games in his career.
- He currently leads the team with 31 tackles and has 92 for his career.

COLTON COMING ON STRONG

- Just behind Ed Saint-Vil and Devin Brown is Joe Colton who posted nine tackles, one sack and a pass break-up at Kansas State. That was coming off an 11 tackle performance against Maine.
- For the year, Colton ranks 3rd on the team in total tackles with 24 including a team-high 16 solo stops.

ANDRE STRONG IN MOVE TO LB

- After playing defensive end last year, Stanley Andre moved back to his natural position at inside linebacker. In the season-opener at Wisconsin, he posted a career-high seven tackles including one tackle-for-loss.
- Andre currently ranks 4th on the team with 20 tackles but leads UMass with three tackles for loss.

BROWN HAS CAREER DAY AGAINST BADGERS

- In his first career start at safety, Devin Brown made nine tackles and had an interception at Wisconsin. The tackle total was a career-high, while the interception marked his first career pick at UMass.
- He added nine more against Maine and seven in the loss at Kansas State.
- In 2012, his first year with the Minutemen, Brown played mostly special teams and at corner back. He saw action in seven games with two tackles.

SANTOS-KNOX POSTS FIRST CAREER INT

- Second-year linebacker Jovan Santos-Knox posted his first career interception in the Maine game. His first-quarter interception in the game ended a Maine drive which had a first-and-goal at the UMass five-yard line.

NEW FACES MAKE DEBUTS ON DEFENSE

- Along with Devin Brown at safety, Trey Seals made his first career start at outside linebacker in the season opener at Wisconsin. All told three other players made their defensive debut as Peter Angeh, Steve Casali and Shane Huber all played.
- Casali made three tackles in his collegiate debut, while Huber made two.
- Huber made his first collegiate start at Kansas State, while Enock Asante and Elijah Wilkinson also made their collegiate debuts against the Wildcats.

YOUNG, BUT VETERAN DEFENSE

- Despite their relative youth, the defensive unit has the most returning starters (7) and has the most game experience of any group for the Minutemen entering 2013. Anchored by a veteran line up front, the back seven is a talented group of youngsters who all started at times during the 2012 season.
- Kevin Byrne, Galen Clemons, Dan Maynes and Brandon Potvin are the most experienced and oldest members of the defense and form what should be a strong defensive line.
- Stanley Andre, the captain of the defense, moves to middle linebacker this season which is a more natural position for him after playing defensive end a year ago. His leadership will be vital for a group of young linebackers which showed great promise last year.
- The secondary is by and large made up of underclassmen with Devin Brown being the lone senior in the line-up - although he is only in his second year with UMass after transferring in from Contra Costa Community College prior to 2012.

DEFENSIVE LINE STOUT UP FRONT

- The interior of the line features Maynes and Clemons, while Robert Kitching and freshman Elijah Wilkinson will also see plenty of action. Byrne and fifth-year transfer Justin Anderson man the edges with Brandon Potvin and Peter Angeh adding depth.
- The average height of the defensive line is 6-foot-3, while the group weighs in at 280 pounds which should allow the group to hold the point of attack better this season.

LINEBACKERS A TALENTED GROUP

- Along with Andre, Trey Seals and Jovan Santos-Knox look to be the starting linebackers. Santos-Knox had an outstanding freshman seasons last year and looks to have improved during the off season. Seals made his first career start at Wisconsin at outside linebacker.
- Backing up Seals is Kassin Messiah who had a terrific start to his career in 2012. Messiah ranked 3rd on the team in total tackles (65) despite missing three games.
- Ed Saint-Vil moves down from safety/nickel back to linebacker and will be joined in the rotation by Shane Huber, John Robinson-Woodgett and Steve Casali.
- The group will miss the leadership and production of Perry McIntyre who ended his career last season as one of the top linebackers in program history.

SECONDARY SHOWS GROWTH IN OFFSEASON

- The youngest overall position group on defense is the secondary, however, each position returns its starter from last year with the exception of safety Darren Thellen. Devin Brown steps into that role after earning the position throughout spring and summer camp.
- Randall Jette and Trey Dudley-Giles man the corners, while D'Metrius Williams will also see time. Freshman Jackson Porter is expected to see action as well at corner.
- Joe Colton mans the other safety beside Brown, with Khary Bailey-Smith and freshman Arthur Williams expected to see time.
- Jette was the fourth leading tackler on the team (53), while Colton (49), Bailey-Smith (45) and Dudley-Giles (43) were just behind.

ANDERSON ADDS STRENGTH TO D-LINE

- Justin Anderson joined the Minutemen during the summer as a graduate student after earning his degree at Maryland. Anderson started 13 games in 2010 before being sidelined in 2011 and playing in six games in 2012. Anderson was originally recruited to Maryland by UMass defensive line coach Dave Sollazzo who was his position coach in 2009 and 2010 with the Terps. For his career in College Park, Anderson played in 25 games with 31 tackles including seven for loss and two sacks.
- In his UMass debut, Anderson tied his career-high (set twice previously at Maryland) with five tackles at Wisconsin.

ANDRE ANCHORS LINEBACKERS

- Originally brought in as a linebacker, Stanley Andre moves back to the position after playing defensive end in 2012. The transition allows Andre to have better command of the defense and is a good fit for the run-stopper. Andre had 41 total tackles last year including four TFLs. After being hurt at Boston College in 2011, Stanley earned a redshirt meaning he will have another season in 2014.

BROWN GROWS INTO SAFETY SPOT

- A relative unknown player in 2012, Devin Brown made huge strides in the 2013 offseason to take the role of starting safety. Brown played mostly special teams last year and was used as a cornerback in defensive schemes.
- Brown is also a member of the Commonwealth Honors College at UMass.

MESSIAH MAKES BIG ROOKIE IMPRESSION

- As a true freshman last year Kassan Messiah made a big splash with his collegiate debut at Miami (Ohio) posting 10 tackles including a nine-yard sack in the second play of the game for his first collegiate tackle.
- Messiah followed up that performance with a 12 tackle effort the following week against Ohio.
- In nine games, Messiah ranked 3rd on the team in total tackles with 65 - the most among all freshmen on the team.
- With a 7.5 tackle per game average, Messiah was the 25th overall defensive player in the MAC in 2012. He was the only freshmen listed in the league's top 50 defensive players.

FRESHMEN MADE AN IMPACT IN 2012

- No where did freshmen make a bigger impact last year than on defense where five of the back seven were true or redshirt freshmen for most of the season. Kassan Messiah and Jovan Santos-Knox were among UMass' top linebackers, while Joe Colton, Khary Bailey-Smith, Trey Dudley-Giles, D'Metrius Williams, and Randall Jette all significant minutes in the secondary.
- All told 6 of UMass' top 13 tacklers last season were made up of freshmen with 9 of the Minutemen's 18 forced turnovers coming from the group as well.

COLTON PLAYS BIG VS. OHIO & AKRON

- Playing just 10 minutes away from his hometown of Norwood, Joe Colton had a career game against Ohio in Gillette Stadium. The freshman safety recorded 12 tackles including a team-high 7 solo stops in his second start of the season.
- The former walk-on came up big again in UMass' first-ever win as an FBS program with five tackles, an interception and a blocked punt which he returned 27 yards at Akron. Following the game, that prompted starting safety Darren Thellen to declare that he wanted his scholarship to go to Colton when he graduated.

4TH MOST INT'S IN THE MAC

- With 13 interceptions last season, the UMass defense had the fourth-most picks in the league. Kent State led the league with 23, while Toledo had 17 and Northern Illinois had 15. Despite having fewer than those teams, UMass' 223 interception return yards ranked 2nd among all teams. Only Toledo had more return yardage with 394 yards.

MOLNAR QUOTES FROM WEEKLY MAC MEDIA TELECONFERENCE

Recapping the Kansas State game:

I thought our team played hard. We didn't always play smart. We're getting closer on both sides of the ball and in our kicking game. We're still making some errors; some of it is due to youth and some of it is due to the environment, the pressure, the intensity, or whatever the cause may be. I feel good about our team coming off the field; about as good as you could after a loss that looks like it was by a wide margin. We had played the team in certain areas closer than we have played some of the top teams that we've played in the past. All in all, I think we have a sense of accountability with our players that maybe didn't exist before. They realize that their particular performance has a direct bearing on any given play and if they had done their job better, perhaps the outcome of the play would have been better and made for a better night for the Minutemen.

On positives taken away from the Kansas State game and performance of A.J. Doyle:

First, I will start with the positives. Number one, defensively in the first quarter, the only points that Kansas State scored were on a pick-six. Defensively, we shut them out in the first quarter. The second quarter, we had a bad turn there and let up 21 points. When we played the third quarter, the defense let up seven points and in the fourth quarter, let up three points. One bad quarter of football defensively and three pretty darn good ones against a very potent offensive attack. Offensively, we had more first downs than we have had in the past. We had 17 first downs with pretty good balance with seven rushing (first downs) and ten by passing. We threw the ball better from an efficiency standpoint. I believe A.J. was 21-for-31, but still had two interceptions. Not both of those were on A.J. though. Things happen on the field that were beyond his control. Obviously at the end of the day, the interceptions go against him, but there were other people involved in those. I feel like we took a step forward at the quarterback position and, all in all, our team is going to be in a good place going forward.

On keeping up the morale of the team with inconsistent results and the status of tight end Rob Blanchflower:

As far as keeping up the morale, that has not been an issue. Our guys know where they are at and our guys want to win each and every time they step out there on the field. The team is hungry for a win and they aren't just playing out the string. They are going out there to win. They were really disappointed getting on that plane Saturday night and I'm convinced they are going to come out again and do everything they can to win against Vanderbilt. As far as Rob Blanchflower, we'll have more information as the week goes on. Each and every week, we go in with the idea that "Blanch" is going to play, until proven otherwise.

On the challenges that Vanderbilt presents:

Number one, they have a wide receiver that at this point is the best we have seen in Jordan Matthews. He is a very polished route runner with great speed. They move him all over the place and he is the guy they try to throw the ball to on big downs. Their quarterback (Austyn Carta-Samuels) is competitive. He can make plays with his feet as well as with his arm. He is a pretty polished passer and an all-around good quarterback. They play a bunch of running backs and they are all good and very capable. Defensively, they have a corner that looks like a high draft pick, so we will certainly have our hands full with him. They have an excellent safety and a big, strong defensive line. It's just what you expect playing a very good BCS team; we have our work cut out for us.

On how A.J. Doyle and Stacey Bedell came to UMass:

Quickly with A.J., he was a guy who came to camp when I was at Notre Dame. I looked at him and watched him work and I thought he was a 1-A quarterback. He just wasn't the guy we were looking for at the time where I was. Certainly, it was a name that resonated with me. When I got to UMass, he was the first recruit that I called. He was committed to another school in the ACC as a defensive player. We were able to get A.J. to stay at home in Massachusetts and play quarterback. He played about 25% of our snaps last year and as a true freshman and started the last game. He made progress through the year, but had an injury that hampered him through spring ball and the summer. Only over the last several weeks has he been able to hit his stride. He was able to get in shape and throw the football better. The best football for A.J. is in his future. As far as Stacey, he was a guy that was on our radar as he was Long Island Player of the Year. We were recruiting him and he had a wide mix of schools that were after him. He had an offer from an ACC school and they wanted him to play defense also. We wanted him to play running back and at the end of the day, he decided to come to UMass. I don't think he has ever regretted it and he seems to love it here. We have always liked Stacey. He is very quick, has above average speed, and has developed a nice set of hands on him. Both of these guys are great kids off the field, good students, and all around very good teammates.

EXPERIENCE IN THE KICKING GAME

- The most experienced group returning in 2013 is the specialists which returns all 6 key starters. Once again Brendon Levensgood will handle kick-off duties, while Blake Lucas handles field goals and extra points.
- Levensgood will handle the kick-off duties for the third straight season.
- Lucas was 7-of-8 last year in field goal attempts and 8-of-9 in extra points. Although he didn't try any attempts outside of 40+ yards last year, Lucas can consistently hit from that distance. During preseason camp, he showed off his leg several times hitting 50+ yard field goals - the school record in a game is 52 yards.

ROUGH OUTING AT WISCONSIN

- The kicking game had a tough day in the season-opener at Wisconsin. Blake Lucas missed a 47-yard field goal, while Colter Johnson averaged just 31.3 yards per punt.
- Lucas initially made the 47-yard field goal which would have capped UMass best offensive drive of the first half. With time on the play clock winding down, UMass called a timeout just as the ball was snapped. On the ensuing kick, Lucas' kick was just wide of the post.
- Johnson had six punts against the Badgers with his final two boots going 41 and 42 yards, respectively, which were his best of the day.

COLTER BOUNCES BACK AGAINST MAINE

- After the tough opener at Wisconsin, Colter Johnson bounced back against Maine with nine punts for a 39.7 yard average. Included in that was a season-long 57 yard boot and three that he dropped inside the Maine 20 yard line.

DUDLEY-GILES AN EXPLOSIVE RETURNER

- In addition to his starting role on defense, Trey Dudley-Giles handled kick-off return and punt return duties at Wisconsin. Although he did not log punt return yardage, he did have four kick returns for 104 yards (28 yard average).
- Against Maine, he averaged 34 yards on kick returns including a career-long 41 yarder to open the game. On his three kick-off returns, UMass' average starting field position was its own 39 yard line. On the two other kickoffs which he did not return, UMass' average starting field position was its own 20 yardline.

KICK COVERAGE BEST UNIT IN MAC

- For the second straight year, UMass leads the MAC in kickoff coverage. Opponents are averaging just 14 yards per kick return which is nearly 7 yards better than second ranked Kent State (20.9 yards/return).
- UMass led the MAC last year with a 42.4 yard net kickoff average against its opponents. The Minutemen averaged 60.7 yards per kick-off allowing its opponents to return the ball just 18.3 yards.

JETTE'S BLOCKED PAT FIRST SINCE 2009

- Randall Jette's blocked extra point in the first quarter at Kansas State was the first time a UMass player had done so since Anthony Monette at Delaware on Oct. 10, 2009.

LAST TWO BLOCKED FG'S AGAINST KSU

- It was a bit of deja vu at Kansas State as the Wildcats managed to block a UMass field goal. The last time that happened was also at Kansas State on Sept. 5, 2009 when Emmanuel Lamur did so on a Caleb Violette kick.

JOHNSON ONE OF MAC'S BEST

- Last season, Colter Johnson proved he was one of the top punters in the MAC as a junior. That performance put him on the Ray Guy Watch List this offseason making him the first Minuteman in program history to be named to a major FBS award watch list.
- Johnson led the MAC last year in punting average at 43.6 yards per boot. He had a long of 66 yards and 19 kicks of 50+ yards. For the year, he downed 16 kicks inside the 20 yard line.
- Johnson took over the punting duties against Indiana last year turning in a 44.1 yard average including 3 over 50 yards and was UMass' starting punter since.
- The Bowling Green game saw Johnson's best performance of the year with 10 kicks for 478 yards (47.8 yard avg) highlighted by a season-long 66 yard drive.
- At Akron, Johnson had the best game of his career. He had a 44.8 yard per kick average including a long of 53 yards. Four of his six punts were downed inside the 10 yard line back-to-back punts in the third and fourth quarters that were downed on the Akron 1-yard line.

NO WORRIES ON THE SNAP & HOLD

- UMass also returns veteran holder Jeff Strait who is also the back-up punter. Strait will be the holder for the last three years.
- In keeping what seems to be a new tradition of NFL potential long-snappers, Vance Barton is perhaps one of the finest in the league. Barton played in every game but one last year and has been heavily praised by head coach Charley Molnar. If Barton were to impress the NFL scouts, he would follow in the footsteps of Jeremy Cain (Jacksonville Jaguars) and Travis Tripucka (St. Louis Rams/New York Jets) as former Minutemen to make the league.

STADIUM UPGRADES AT MCGUIRK

• As part of the transition plan to the FBS, McGuirk Stadium in Amherst is in the midst of much construction. With groundbreaking during April 2013, the two main projects include the new UMass Football Performance Center which will house offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, a theatre, athletic training facilities, video facilities and strength & conditioning facilities. This will mark the first time in the modern era that all support services for the program will be housed in one complex. Additionally, the new Martin And Richard Jacobson Press & Skybox Complex will be built. McGuirk Stadium was opened in 1965 and seats 17,000 fans. The previous renovations to the stadium include a FieldTurf surface which was installed in 2006 and permanent lighting in 2008.

SPLIT SCHEDULE FOR 2014

• With the construction projects set to be completed in time for the 2014 season, UMass will host a split schedule between McGuirk and Gillette Stadiums. The Minutemen will play three games at McGuirk and three games at Gillette although which teams play at which stadium has not been determined.

• Going forward, the program will continue to play games at both venues.

COMMUNITY SERVICE A PROGRAM STANDARD FOR MOLNAR

• One of Charley Molnar's core tenants as a football coach is to engage his players with the community through service projects. In his time at UMass, Molnar, his staff and members of the team have volunteered and helped at events throughout Western Mass.

• Over the summer, members of the football team volunteered at the Boys & Girls Club each week in Holyoke, Mass. The players served as mentors at the Club and engaged the children in activities.

• Players also helped with Habitat For Humanity, were representatives at the Special Olympics torch lighting ceremony, visited local schools and helped work the Relay For Life.

VETERAN COACHING STAFF

• Charley Molnar has assembled a veteran coaching staff with experience at the highest levels of football. The staff is comprised of coaches who have spent years at Bowl Championship Series (BCS) schools as well as time in the National Football League and the United Football League. The experienced staff has found success at every level of the college game and in the professional ranks as the Minutemen begin a new era of football in Amherst.

• "I think the staff we have assembled has the knowledge, experience, and teaching tools to make us a successful program in all phases of the game," said Molnar. "This is a highly motivated group of professionals who know how to gain success not just in football, but in daily life. Their experiences as coaches and players will serve as the foundation for what we want to build here - championship caliber football played by championship caliber young men."

#MADEINMASS

• Charley Molnar's vision for the future of UMass is the Made In Mass campaign. Within five years, Molnar wants his program to be playing for a MAC Championship with 50 percent of its starters hailing from the Commonwealth.

CHARLEY MOLNAR RADIO SHOW

• The Bud Light UMass Football Coach's Show With Charley Molnar airs live on Thursday night's from the Hangar Pub & Grill on University Drive in Amherst. Each Thursday night, Coach Molnar joins Voice of the Minutemen Josh Maurer along with player guests to give insight into the program and take a look at the week's upcoming opponent. The show airs on 105.5 FM WVEI in Springfield and 1440 AM WVEI in Worcester from 7-8 PM.

BRODEUR NAMED ASSISTANT ATHLETIC TRAINER OF THE YEAR

UMass athletic trainer Jenn Brodeur was named the National Athletic Trainers Association Assistant Athletic Trainer of the Year this past summer at the group's annual convention in Las Vegas. Brodeur is in her eighth year at UMass including her seventh working with football. The graduate of Ohio University is one of just four females in the country to be the head athletic trainer for a Football Bowl Subdivision college football program.

GOLDEN NAMED MASTER STRENGTH COACH

One of the newest members of the football staff is strength and conditioning coach Mike Golden who was named a Master Strength & Conditioning Coach by the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association (CSCCA) last Spring. Golden was presented with the coveted blue MSCC Jacket - the highest honor in the profession - at the group's annual convention in Kansas City.

Second Year at UMass

Second Year as Head Coach

Lock Haven '84

A new era in UMass football began with the naming of Charley Molnar as head coach on December 8, 2011. The long-time collegiate coaching veteran was tapped as the new leader of the program as it made its transition into the Football Bowl Subdivision and member of the Mid-American Conference in 2012. The 29th head coach in program history, Molnar came to Amherst with 28 years of experience and an exciting plan to build the Minutemen into not just the team for Massachusetts, but for the entire Northeast.

A veteran coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Molnar developed prolific offensive attacks at Notre Dame, Cincinnati and Central Michigan. In his time at those schools, the Morristown, N.J., native helped them to a 59-20 record and seven straight bowl games including Cincinnati's historic 2009 season where the Bearcats won the Big East Conference Championship, played Florida in the Sugar Bowl and finished third in the BCS rankings.

"I am extremely pleased that Charley is leading the University of Massachusetts into this new era as our head football coach," said Director of Athletics John McCutcheon. "His background, energy, commitment to student-athletes and desire to be part of a growing program clearly makes him the right man for this endeavor."

While Molnar's inaugural year at UMass was a tough one in the record book, the program does have a bright future. Nearly all of the 2012 freshman class saw significant playing time as either starters or key reserves. The 2013 class is the most talented ever to join the University and was ranked among the top-5 in the MAC. UMass earned its first FBS win on Nov. 10, 2012 with a 22-14 victory at Akron. Three Minutemen earned All-MAC honors and following the season, running back Michael Cox was drafted by the New York Giants while three others signed NFL undrafted free agent contracts.

Molnar joined the Minutemen after two seasons with Notre Dame as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. In his time with the Fighting Irish, the Morristown, N.J., native helped the program to an 8-4 record in 2011 and an appearance in the Champs Sports Bowl along with an 8-5 record in 2010 and a trip to the Sun Bowl.

"This is an opportunity I worked for my whole career and there is no limit to my excitement that guiding the UMass football program brings me," said Molnar. "I have a vision for this program into the future and we are going to do nothing but great things at the University of Massachusetts."

"Coach Molnar has a track record of winning and has the history of being associated with programs that have won, that have shaped the lives of student-athletes, and that were first-class making their universities, their students, faculty, friends and alumni proud," said

University President Robert L. Caret.

The 2013 season will be Molnar's 30th overall including 11 as an offensive coordinator and 17 coaching quarterbacks.

Prior to his time at Notre Dame, Molnar was an integral piece of Cincinnati's rise capped by a Big East Championship, Sugar Bowl appearance and top-five final ranking in the BCS standings in 2009.

Molnar also has extensive experience with the Mid-American Conference after working at Central Michigan, Western Michigan, Kent State and Eastern Michigan.

For the six seasons prior to joining UMass, Molnar worked alongside current Notre Dame head coach Brian Kelly.

"Charley was a part of my offensive staff the last six years and a key figure in the success we had at Central Michigan, Cincinnati and Notre Dame. Charley's familiarity with the Mid-American Conference and strong recruiting connections on the East Coast will truly benefit him at UMass," said Kelly.

For the second straight year, Molnar helped the Irish earn a bowl game bid in 2011 thanks in part to the play of quarterback Tommy Rees. Rees threw for over 2,700 yards that season with 19 touchdowns averaging 225.7 yards per game. As a unit, the Irish averaged 424.1 yards per game on offense behind Rees and 1,000-yard rusher Cierre Wood. Alongside Wood, Jonas Gray netted nearly 800 yards rushing and 12 touchdowns on the ground.

Highlighting the 2011 season for the Irish were wins over Michigan State, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Air Force.

In 2010, his first year with the Irish, Molnar helped install a new offensive system and developed both Dayne Crist and Rees as first-time starting quarterbacks. Crist started the first nine games and passed for 2,033 yards with 15 touchdowns before injuring a knee in the first quarter of the ninth game. Rees played the rest of the ninth game after Crist was injured and completed 33 of 54 passes for 334 yards with four touchdowns. He started the final four games and led the Irish to wins over No. 15 Utah, Army, USC and Miami (Fla.) in the Hyundai Sun Bowl.

Under Molnar's tutelage, Rees set Notre Dame freshman records in touchdown passes (12) and completion percentage (61.0). He also ranked in the top five among freshman Irish quarterbacks in completions (third, 100), yards (second, 1,106) and passing efficiency (second, 132.70).

From 2006-09, Molnar coached alongside Kelly at Cincinnati and Central Michigan and helped develop record-breaking quarterbacks and wide receivers. With the Bearcats, Molnar was the passing game coordinator and coached the wide receivers from 2007-09. He oversaw the two most prolific passing seasons in Cincinnati history and mentored a pair of record-setting receivers.

Wide receivers Mardy Gilyard and Dominick Goodman flourished with Molnar as their coach. Goodman played for Molnar from 2007-08 and initially set Cincinnati career records with 2,512 receiving yards and 22 receiving touchdowns. Goodman also tied the previous school record with 204 career catches. Gilyard received Molnar's

tutelage from 2007-09 and broke Goodman's career records by recording 3,053 receiving yards and 25 TD catches. Fittingly, Gilyard also finished his Bearcat career with 204 receptions, tying the school record.

In 2009, Molnar's passing attack averaged 308.77 yards per game to rank eighth in the nation and the 4,014 passing yards set the Cincinnati single-season record. The Bearcats ranked fourth in the country in passing efficiency (161.21), thanks to a school record 39 TD passes. Cincinnati's high-octane offense averaged 447.5 total yards per game (11th in the nation) and tallied the fifth-most points in the Football Bowl Subdivision at 38.6 per game.

With Molnar's guidance, Gilyard became just the second Cincinnati player ever to be named an All-American by the American Football Coaches Association. He caught a school-record 87 passes for 1,191 yards with 11 TDs and ranked in the top 20 nationally in receptions and receiving yards per game. Gilyard was named first-team all-BIG EAST for the second year in a row and became the Bearcats' first player with multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons.

Armon Binns developed into a solid complementary receiver opposite Gilyard in 2009. Entering the season, Binns had registered two career receptions for 19 yards and zero TDs, but Binns became a second-team all-BIG EAST performer under Molnar after totaling 61 receptions for 888 yards and 11 TDs.

Gilyard and Goodman both experienced career seasons in 2008 as Gilyard set the Cincinnati record with 1,276 receiving yards and Goodman totaled 1,028 yards receiving. The duo became the first Bearcats players to eclipse 1,000 receiving yards together in the same season since 1968 when Jim O'Brien and Tom Rossley accomplished the feat.

Gilyard caught 81 passes and 11 TDs in his breakthrough season and ranked eighth in the nation in total receiving yards, en route to being named first-team all-BIG EAST. Goodman recorded 84 receptions (a school record, at the time) and seven TDs.

In 2007, Molnar's aerial attack proved a harbinger of things to come for Bearcats fans as Cincinnati passed for 3,720 yards and 36 TDs - both school records, at the time. The Bearcats ranked eighth in the country in passing efficiency (149.38) and averaged 286.2 passing yards per game to rank 20th nationally. Marcus Bennett was selected second-team all-BIG EAST after tallying a school-record 13 TD receptions.

Prior to Cincinnati, Molnar joined Kelly's Central Michigan staff in 2006 when he helped the Chippewas win 10 games for the first time since 1979. Central Michigan won its Mid-American Conference division, the MAC championship and was victorious in the Motor City Bowl. The Chippewas' offense ranked first in the MAC in scoring and second in passing.

Molnar coached the quarterbacks and wide receivers at Central Michigan and developed the most prolific freshman quarterback and wide receiver duo in the nation in 2006. Dan LeFevour was named MAC Freshman of the Year and was selected first-team all-MAC

after he led the conference in passing TDs, passing yards, passing efficiency, completion percentage, total completions and total yards. Under Molnar's tutelage, LeFevour completed 247 of 388 pass attempts for 3,031 yards with 26 TDs. He also rushed 132 times for 521 yards and seven TDs and ranked 13th nationally in total offense (253.7 yards per game). LeFevour set school records for passing yards and TD passes, and his 3,552 total yards also were a Central Michigan record. He finished his rookie campaign ranked 19th nationally in passing efficiency.

On the receiving end of many LeFevour passes was freshman wide receiver Bryan Anderson who snagged a school-record 73 passes for 877 yards and five TDs. Anderson also was named first-team all-MAC and was selected a first-team freshman All-American.

Molnar completed a rare coaching feat at the conclusion of the 2006 season. Not only was he on the sidelines for 15 contests, including the 2006 MAC Championship Game, 2006 Motor City Bowl and 2007 International Bowl, but he coached the MVP in all three postseason games.

Molnar directed another record-setting quarterback during his only season at Indiana State in 2005. As the associate head coach and offensive coordinator of the Sycamores, Molnar's offense broke six school passing records (including passing yards, completion percentage and TD passes) and two of his players combined to break 11 single-season or single-game school marks. Quarterback Blayne Baggett completed 284 of 473 passes for 2,741 yards, all school records. Baggett's 284 completions also were a Gateway Conference single-season record. Wide receiver Sam Logan was the primary beneficiary, as his 77 receptions were a Sycamore record and his 849 receiving yards ranked second in school history. Logan was honored after the season as a first-team all-Gateway Conference performer.

Molnar coached quarterbacks from 2003-04 at Western Michigan and was forced to develop multiple signal-callers each season. In 2004, Molnar helped three quarterbacks combine to pass for 2,913 yards (264.8 yards per game) with 23 passing TDs. He also had to prepare three Bronco quarterbacks in 2003 as he guided them to the eighth-ranked passing attack in the nation with 3,701 passing yards (308.4 yards per game) and 31 TDs. Chad Munson passed for 2,123 yards with 18 TD passes in 2003, while Jon Drach completed 67.0 percent of his passes for 1,499 yards and 13 TDs.

A one-year stop at Eastern Michigan in 2002 as quarterbacks coach followed a one-year stint as wide receivers coach at Eastern Illinois in 2001.

From 1990-2000, Molnar spent time as an offensive coordinator as well as working with quarterbacks and wide receivers at two universities. He spent seven seasons at Kent State (1994-2000) after he worked in the same position at Illinois State from 1990-93.

Prior to Illinois State, Molnar called the offensive plays and coached quarterbacks at Western Carolina in 1989. He made his first foray into major college football as a graduate assistant in 1987-88 at Virginia. With the Cavaliers, he assisted the quarterbacks coach.

Molnar's first coaching job came at his alma mater, Lock Haven University. From 1984-86 he worked with the wide receivers, tight ends, running backs and kickers.

A 1984 graduate of Lock Haven, Molnar earned his bachelor's degree in political science. He was born July 23, 1961, and he and his wife, Meg, have eight children: Charley III, Gillian, Tate, Bryce, Mitch, Gemma, Gianna and Dominic.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Kansas State used a 21-point second quarter to break-open a close game giving the Wildcats a 37-7 win over UMass football on Saturday night at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. Wide receiver Tajae Sharpe had 98 yards receiving, while running back Stacey Bedell had 81 yards rushing to go with a touchdown.

Quarterback A.J. Doyle was 21-of-31 for 186 yards and two interceptions in his first start of the year. Defensively, UMass was led by Ed Saint-Vil who had 12 tackles and Joe Colton who had nine, including a sack.

Kansas State earned 329 yards on the ground, including John Hubert's 118. Daniel Sams had 77 yards, while Jake Waters had 74 yards rushing. Waters was 5-for-10 for 115 yards with two touchdowns and an interception.

The Wildcats took a 6-0 lead on a 38-yard interception return for a touchdown by Kip Daily with the Jack Cantele extra point being blocked.

Doyle and Bedell went to work to quickly drive the Minutemen down the field for a five-play touchdown drive. Doyle hit Sharpe for a 27-yard pick-up and Bedell punched it in for his first career touchdown two plays later closing out the first quarter giving UMass a 7-6 lead.

Kansas State scored three times in the second quarter including a 26-yard run by Robert Rose and a 43 yard reception by John Hubert in the final four minutes of play to take a 27-7 lead at halftime.

The Minutemen failed to make any headway on their opening possession of the second half. After a quick three-and-out gave the ball back to KSU, a 50-yard pass play from Waters to Glenn Gronkowski, the brother of New England Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski, put the Wildcats up 34-7. The Wildcats added a 42-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter.
