SIX COMMODORES EARN FIRST CAREER STARTS VS. OLE MISS

Six Commodores, including senior cornerback **Steven Clarke**, made their first career starts during the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game.

Other Commodores in addition to Clarke to make their first collegiate starts in the opener were **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT), **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) and **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL).

Clarke posted three tackles and a defended pass from the cornerback position.

Woestmann and Taylor performed well on the defensive front. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles while adding a quarterback hurry. Taylor also set a single-game career high with four total tackles.

Herring posted five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes from his linebacker position.

Butler, who moved from offensive line to defensive tackle during spring drills, contributed one tackle in his first start.

Jelks started the game lined up at tight end as a tackle eligible.

ELEVEN NEWCOMERS ENJOY FIRST ACTION IN A COMMODORE UNIFORM

Eleven underclassmen experienced their initial action in a Commodore uniform during the Ole Miss game.

First-time players on offense were **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL) and **Blake Fromang** (R-Fr., OL).

First-time defensive players included **Ja'karrri Thomas** (R-Fr., LB), **Harding Harper** (R-Fr., LB), **Torren McGaster** (R-Fr., CB), **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB), **Darius Sims** (Fr., CB) and **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., DE).

Taylor Hudson (R-So., punter) was the only specialist participating for the first time.

LOOKING FOR 5TH STRAIGHT NON-SEC WIN

Vanderbilt faces Austin Peay this Saturday looking to notch its fifth straight victory against a non-Southeastern Conference member.

Since falling at Northwestern in early September last year, the Commodores have defeated Presbyterian 58-0, UMass 49-7, Wake Forest 55-21 and N.C. State 38-14.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 7-1 in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 8-2 overall against non-league foes. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, the 'Dores are 21-14 against non-SEC teams.

FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 15-12 overall. His .565 winning percentage is the best by a Commodore mentor since Steve Sloan's 1973-74 teams went 12-9-2 (.571).

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years was Hall of Famer Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

THURSDAY NIGHT CROWD: PROGRAM'S FIRST SOLDOUT OPENER SINCE 1999

The largest crowd to attend a Vanderbilt home opener in 14 years watched the 39-35 thriller last Thursday night on the Nashville campus.

The announced audience of 40,350 also represents Vanderbilt's first season-opening sellout since the Commodores faced Alabama on Sept. 4, 1999.

It also marks Vanderbilt's largest crowd for a season opener since 1999, topping an audience of 39,885 that entered the turnstiles for the Middle Tennessee-Vanderbilt game on Aug. 30, 2001.

Like 2012 when the Commodores faced South Carolina on a Thursday night, the audience last Thursday featured

Vanderbilt's student section at full capacity.

The game marked Vanderbilt's fourth sellout during the James Franklin Era, following capacity crowds against Florida, Auburn and Tennessee in 2012. The program experienced just three sellouts in the decade before Franklin arrived on campus: Tennessee, 2006; Auburn, 2008; Florida, 2008.

FIRST FOOTBALL MEETING BETWEEN SCHOOLS

This marks the first game ever played between the Commodores and Governors, despite the universities being located less than an hour apart.

Austin Peay, located 50 miles north of Nashville in Clarksville, Tenn., and Vanderbilt compete in several other varsity sports.

The Commodores are 13-1 all-time against the Gobs in men's basketball, 12-1 in women's basketball, and 51-20-2 in baseball.





MATTHEWS OPENS SEASON WITH CAREER EFFORT VS. OLE MISS

In a career laced with remarkable performances, **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) opened the 2013 campaign against Ole Miss with what many will consider the finest game in a Vanderbilt uniform.

Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards and one touchdown on 10 catches.

The 178-yard effort was the most by a Vanderbilt receiver since **Earl Bennett** amassed 223 receiving yards against Richmond on Sept. 1, 2007. It also equalled the No. 11 effort in team history.

The SEC's active leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continued his superb play against conference foes. In his last 13 games against SEC teams, Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards on nine occasions. In those 13 games, Matthews has amassed 1,581 receiving yards – an average of 121.6 yards per outing.

Matthews' 10 receptions also matched a career best set previously against both UMass and Wake Forest during the 2012 season. He has posted at least seven catches in 10 of last 14 games.

It marked Matthews' second straight exceptional performance against Ole Miss. In 2012, he posted 153 receiving yards and a TD on nine catches in Oxford.

Matthews' also tied a team record with his 11th game of at least 100 receiving yards. He holds the mark with **Dan Stricker** (1999-2002). Matthews remains well short of the team's career marks of 236 catches (**Earl Bennett**, 2005-07) and 2,964 receiving yards (**Boo Mitchell**, 1985-88).

PREP TEAMMATES FACING OFF SATURDAY

Three Vanderbilt players will face teammates on the opposing sideline when the Commodores and Governors play this Saturday.

- Vanderbilt's **Wesley Tate** (R-Sr., RB) and Austin Peay's **Julian Virgo** (R-So., OL) were teammates at Hendersonville's Pope John Paul II H.S.

- Vanderbilt's **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) and Austin Peay's **Evan Toby** (R-Fr., PK) were classmates at powerful Maryville (Tenn.) H.S.

- Vanderbilt's **Gerald Perry** (Fr., WR) and **Darrius Sims** (Fr., CB) were teammates of Austin Peay's **Timarious Mitchell** (R-Fr., QB) at Whitehaven H.S. in Memphis.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM OLE MISS GAME

★ The loss ended Vanderbilt's seven-game win streak that started with a 17-13 victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012. The streak was the team's longest since the 1948 season.

The defeat also ended Vanderbilt's four-game win streak in SEC play. The Commodores entered the opener off consecutive wins last year over Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss and Tennessee.

★ After redshirting last year, **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) returned to action in impressive fashion, rushing for 43 yards on just five carries (8.6-yard avg). Seymour's effort also included a 3-yard scoring rush.

Seymour also provided the Commodores' longest rush – a 32-yard carry to highlight Vanderbilt's first touchdown drive of the second half.

★ Vanderbilt has now scored at least 35 points in its last four games, dating back to a 41-18 victory over Tennessee on Nov. 17, 2012.

The Commodores have averaged 40.7 points against its last seven opponents, including four SEC teams and two ACC foes.

★ **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) watched his excellent form carry over from the 2012 season.

Making his first career start at defensive end, Woestmann produced a career game, notching two quarterback sacks among seven total tackles. His performance also included a quarterback hurry.

One of Vanderbilt's most productive defensive linemen during the closing stretches of the 2012 season, Woestmann now has seven quarterback sacks in his last six appearances. It also produced a pair of sacks in his last outing – Vanderbilt's 38-24 victory in the Music City Bowl.

The sack allowed Woestmann to pass **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) into second place on the team with eight career sacks, four behind active leader **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB).

★ Ole Miss' 39-point total was the second most points scored against a James Franklin-guided Vanderbilt squad.

★ **Taylor Hudson** (Jr., punter) averaged 46.0 yards on his final four punts in his first collegiate action.

The former prep quarterback who hopes to become a neurosurgeon averaged 40.0 yards on the game. After watching his first punt go just 16 yards, the walk-on settled down to net 43.3 yards on his last final efforts.

★ The 35-points of offense was the most by the Commodores in an eventual Southeastern Conference loss since Vanderbilt fell to Kentucky 48-43 on Nov. 12, 2012.

★ The Commodores production inside the Ole Miss 20-yard line was impressive. Vanderbilt tallied touchdowns on all three possessions inside the Rebel 20, scoring on a pair of rushes by **Wesley Tate** and a carry by **Jerron Seymour**.

On defense, the Commodores didn't experience the same success, allowing Ole Miss to score on all five red-zone possessions.

★ As expected, the Commodores filled the absence of two-time All-SEC running back Zac Stacy with a trio of prospects.

Wesley Tate (R-Sr.) started at running back, finishing with 39 yards and two TD rushes on 17 carries. **Jerron Seymour** (R-So.) and **Brian Kimbrow** (So.) also rotated in at running back, finishing with 39 and 37 yards, respectively.

★ The winning 75-yard rush by Ole Miss' RB Jeff Scott was the longest rush against Vanderbilt since Kentucky's Derrick Lock went 83 yards on Nov. 13, 2010.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) enjoyed one of his finest receiving performances as a Commodore, catching six passes for 66 yards.

★ **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) set a single-game high with nine total tackles and matched highs in solo tackles (7) and passes defended (3).

★ **Javon Marshall** (Sr., safety) paced the Commodores with nine solo tackles, one more than his previous game high set in 2012 against Ole Miss.





CARTA-SAMUELS OPENS SEASON

WITH 300-YARD PASSING PERFORMANCE

Austyn Carta-Samuels (R-Sr., QB) opened the 2013 campaign with one of the most productive outings ever by a Vanderbilt quarterback in the season opener.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at the University of Wyoming in 2009-10, became just the second Vanderbilt QB to pass for 300 yards in an opener. It was last achieved when

Greg Zolman threw for 300 yards the 2001 opener vs. Middle Tennessee as a senior. Zolman also holds the team record – a 307-yard effort against Miami (Ohio) in 2000.

Making just his second start as a Commodore, Carta-Samuels was 21-of-36, throwing for a pair of touchdowns and two interceptions. The completions total ties the most by a Vanderbilt QB since **Jared Funk** completed 27 passes in the 2010 regular season finale.

It appeared that Carta-Samuels' last touchdown pass – a 34-yard toss to **Steven Scheu** (R-So., TE) with 1:30 left – would give the Commodores a come-from-behind victory in front of 40,350 fans.

Carta-Samuels' effort included five completions of at least 28 yards: the 34-yarder with Scheu, a 33-yarder to **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) and tosses to **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) of 28, 55 and 42 yards.

The 2009 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year narrowly missed his single-game high for passing yards. He threw for 319 yards in Wyoming's 2010 season opener.

SPEAR COMING OFF ALL-SEC YEAR

Carey Spear (Sr., PK) enters 2013 off arguably the best season ever produced by a Vanderbilt kicker.

Spear was voted All-SEC by the Associated Press in 2012 after establishing a new Vanderbilt single-season record with 20 field goals.

Spear, a preseason candidate for the Lou Groza Award, and a First Team preseason All-SEC honoree from coaches and writers, did not attempt a field goal in the opener. He was 5-of-5 on extra point conversions.

Spear ranks among the SEC's most accurate kickers. Spear finished last year making 83.3 percent of his field goals, including all 15 attempts inside 43 yards.

Just before the 2013 opener, Spear was selected team captain for the third straight season. The only other recent Commodore to serve three years as a captain was quarterback **Jay Cutler** (2003-05).

TWO TRUE FRESHMEN PLAY IN OPENER

Two Vanderbilt true freshmen participated in the Commodores' season opener vs. Ole Miss.

Jordan Cunningham (WR) and **Darrius Sims** (CB) were the only true freshmen to play. Cunningham played numerous snaps at a wideout but did not register a catch. Sims did not have a tackle on defense, but posted an impressive 34-yard kickoff return late in the game.

NINE 'DORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores will feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer earned the team's starting QB role, then threw for 300 yards and two touchdowns in the opener against Ole Miss.

ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He was the team's primary snapper in all roles against Ole Miss.

CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. Garnham contributed a pair of tackles vs. Ole Miss.

ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender had nine tackles (seven solo stops) and three passes defended in narrow loss to Ole Miss.

WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 39th consecutive career start against Ole Miss.

JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall added nine solo tackles in the season opener vs. Ole Miss.

JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Trophy and Maxwell Award candidate might have played his finest game vs. Ole Miss – 10 receptions, 178 receiving yards, 1 TD.

WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

Part of a five-player rotation, May contributed one tackle and a QB hurry against Ole Miss.

CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior, coming off the best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, did not attempt a field goal, but was 5-of-5 on extra point tries against Ole Miss.

'DORES FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC GRIDIRON ACHIEVEMENT

TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

VANDY STAFF: FULLY INTACT FROM 2012

Vanderbilt is the only SEC team that will have its entire coaching staff intact from last year.

It also marks the first time since 2009 that the Commodore staff remained intact.

Vanderbilt is one of nine schools from the NCAA's FBS subdivision that will return intact staffs. The others are Baylor, Louisville, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Notre Dame and Ohio State.

FACTS ON COMMODORE OL WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate Wesley Johnson has started 38 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

- ★ Johnson has never been called for a single holding penalty.
- ★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 6.5 sacks on 1,021 career pass attempts, or one sack every 157 pass plays.
- ★ Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012.
- ★ Johnson has produced 152 knockdown blocks, 37 intimidation blocks and 106 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.
- ★ Johnson has been on the field for every Vanderbilt touchdown and PAT for the last 3+ seasons.
- ★ Johnson has played 2,433 career snaps: 1,647 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 67 at tight end. He has played 98.4 percent of the team's snaps over the last three years.

VANDERBILT IN SEASON OPENERS

Vanderbilt is now 78-42-4 all-time in season openers after the 39-35 loss to Ole Miss on August 29 against Ole Miss. It marked the second straight year that Vanderbilt opened with a narrow loss to a SEC team.

Some other notes on Vanderbilt in season openers:

- ★ Vanderbilt has won four of its last seven season openers.
- ★ The 'Dores are now 3-15 when facing an SEC team in the first game of the season. The last win in a season opener versus an SEC team came in 1988 (24-20 over Mississippi State in Nashville).

VANDERBILT WIN STREAK ENDS AT SEVEN

Vanderbilt' seven-game winning streak, one of the nation's longest entering the season, ended Aug. 29 when Ole Miss rallied for a victory.

The Commodores' streak, which started Oct. 20 with a win over Auburn, ranked among the Top Ten in program history. It was T-10th along with similar streaks in 1920-21, 1915 and 1896-97.

The longest win streak in Vanderbilt history came before World War I. From late in the 1903 campaign to early in the 1905 season, the Commodores captured 13 straight games.

The green dot is the symbol and name of a national program designed to provide a comprehensive approach to violence prevention that capitalizes on the power of peer and cultural influence.

During the 2013-2014 academic year, all Vanderbilt Athletics teams will wear a green dot on their uniforms during their seasons.

MATTHEWS HOLDS RECEIVING MARKS; CHASING SEVERAL TEAM, RECORDS

Jordan Matthews (Sr., WR) has established himself as one of the finest receivers to ever wear the Black & Gold. In 2013, he'll begin making his case for inclusion alongside legendary receivers in the Southeastern Conference.

After producing one of the finest seasons ever by a Vanderbilt receiver in 2012, Matthews started 2013 with arguably his greatest performance, catching 10 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown against Ole Miss despite suffering muscle cramps in the game.

Matthews now needs 626 receiving yards to break the all-time receiving yards record held by former Georgia standout Terrence Edwards. He also needs 77 catches to surpass the SEC and Vanderbilt career record of 236 set by Earl Bennett from 2005-07.

A 2013 Biletnikoff Award candidate, Matthews posted staggering numbers last year en route to becoming a First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America selection. Matthews' 94-reception total is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks fifth on the SEC all-time charts.

The Ole Miss game marked Vanderbilt's eighth Thursday night appearance, dating back to a 1996 home stint against nationally ranked Notre Dame.

Vanderbilt is now 3-5 in Thursday night games.

The Commodores have opened with SEC opponents on Thursday night the last two years. Both games resulted in narrow losses: 39-25 to Ole Miss this year and 17-13 to South Carolina in 2012.

FOUR 'DORES EARN COACHES RECOGNITION

For the first time in recent years, three Commodore standouts have earned preseason First-Team All-SEC recognition from the league's 14 head coaches. A fourth Vanderbilt player received second team honors.

The coaches' ballot, the last preseason unit named prior to the season opener, includes **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) as first team recipients. A fourth Commodore, **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) also was named as a Second-Team All-SEC member by the coaches.

It marks the most Commodores to be recognized in the coaches' preseason ballot since 2009 when five Vanderbilt players – **Patrick Benoist** (LB), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Myron Lewis** (CB), **Brett Upson** (punter) and **Ryan Hamilton** (safety) – were named. None of the 2009 performers were first team recipients.

2014 SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED; EIGHT HOME GAMES SLATED

Home games with Ole Miss, South Carolina, Florida and Tennessee will highlight Vanderbilt's 2014 football schedule, SEC officials announced Aug. 21.

The 2014 Vanderbilt schedule features eight home games, including the first four contests of the season. The 'Dores will conclude the regular season against Tennessee, reviving season-ending rivalry that existed for 67 years until being interrupted in 2007.

The 2014 season opens against Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28 and is followed by Ole Miss, which will be visiting for the second straight year, on Sept. 6. UMass and South Carolina follow to cap the month-long home stand.

The Commodores then hit the road for back-to-back games against Kentucky and Georgia before returning Oct. 11 to host Charleston Southern.

The opening seven weeks of action is broken Oct. 18 with an open date before traveling to Missouri on Oct. 25. Vanderbilt returns to Nashville Nov. 1 against Old Dominion and Nov. 8 with Florida.

After another open date Nov. 15, the Commodores conclude by going to Mississippi State on Nov. 22 and hosting Tennessee Nov. 29.

OL WESLEY JOHNSON RANKS AS TEAM LEADER WITH 39 CAREER STARTS

Veteran offensive lineman **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr.) paces all active Commodore position players with 39 career starts.

Johnson has started every game of his Commodore career, seeing assignments at four line positions: center, right and left tackle, and left guard. The majority of his starts have come at left tackle, which he started last Thursday in the opener vs. Ole Miss.

If Johnson starts every game of his final season, he could become the all-time team leader in career starts.

Chris Marve, a linebacker from 2007-11, and **Brian Stamper**, an offensive lineman from 2003-07, share the team mark with 48 starts.

Kenny Ladler, a senior safety, and two senior receivers, **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**, are the closest to Johnson's starts total. Ladler has 28 starts, Matthews with 26 and Krause with 24.

'DORES EARN PRESEASON TOP 25 VOTES; FINISH 2012 RANKED IN BOTH POLLS

Ranked among the Top 25 at the conclusion of the 2012 season, Vanderbilt did not enough votes to get in the *USA Today*/Coaches or Associated Press 2013 preseason polls.

Vanderbilt was No. 34 in the coaches' preseason ballot after receiving 29 votes, and No. 33 in the Associated Press poll after earning 19 voters in the writers prior to the opener vs. Ole Miss.

The first regular season poll this year has not been released.

In 2012, Vanderbilt's 9-4 record and seven-game winning streak to conclude the season pushed the Commodores to No. 20 and No. 23 in the final coaches and AP polls, respectively. It marked the first year since 1948 that Vanderbilt completed its season ranked in the AP Top 25.

Sports Illustrated listed the Commodores No. 23 in its 2013 College Football preview edition.

KRAUSE AMONG SEC'S BEST RETURNERS

Jonathan Krause (Sr., WR/PR) ranks among the SEC's top punt returners. His 2012 average of 11.2 yards ranks second behind Missouri's Marcus Murphy (13.9 ypr) among active SEC return specialists.

Krause's punt return average is the third highest by a Commodore in the last three decades, trailing only D.J. Moore (14.4 yd. avg., 2008) and Jeff Brothers (12.3 yd. avg., 1992).

In 2012, Krause also became the first Commodore to return two punts for touchdowns since 1968.

Hall of Fame Weekend is scheduled to be held Sept. 6-7. The fifth annual Hall of Fame Dinner will take place at the Vanderbilt Student Life Center this Friday. The class will also be recognized at Vanderbilt's football game against Austin Peay on Sept. 7. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:30 p.m.

The inaugural Hall of Fame class was enshrined in 2008. There was not a 2012 Hall of Fame class.

BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL

When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to West End High School star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level and Vanderbilt's program became one of the best in the SEC.

JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL

Jamie Duncan was a high school football star in Wilmington, Del., recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. Since his NFL days, Jamie has been involved with a variety of businesses, and currently partners with former Commodore Ronnie Gordon in an enterprise that brings quality dental care to low income populations in the U.S.

Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her decision to attend a young Vanderbilt bowling program surprised some but it has paid dividends ever since. Her mere presence was a catalyst for other bowling stars to also choose Vanderbilt and she went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year.

DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

- Phi Beta Kappa Vanderbilt student and recipient of university's "Bachelor of Ugliness" (highest undergraduate honor awarded)
- Member of ODK and four years on student council
- Captain of Vanderbilt basketball team, 1941; All-SEC first baseman
- Became team's chief medical consultant upon returning to Nashville, serving in role from 1948-1990
- One of first surgeons in USA to reconstruct ACL knee injuries
- He was also a Clinical Professor of Orthopedics, training and mentoring dozens of Vanderbilt residents in Orthopedics and Sports Medicine

JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE

A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite.

- Vanderbilt's SEC Great representative in 2011.
- Won NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue, becoming the only African-American coach to win an Division I women's basketball title.
- Served three seasons as head coach/GM of the WNBA's Orlando Miracle.
- Head coach at University of Florida for five years.

JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL

Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom recruited by Roy Mewbourne who became the first ace of the Tim Corbin Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth.

- Was named to 2002 Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team
- Two-time all-SEC as a sophomore and junior
- Ranks in Top 10 of numerous Vanderbilt single-season and career pitching records, including wins, strikeouts and innings pitched
