Georgia State will face an SEC opponent for the first time since the 2005-06 season on Tuesday, traveling to Vanderbilt in the Commodores' regular season opener. It will mark the first of six-straight road games for the Panthers.

Georgia State (1-0) opened the season on Saturday with an impressive 97-78 victory against Southern Poly. The Panthers hit 11 3-pointers and made 28-of-32 from the free throw line.

Sophomore R.J. Hunter scored 27 points on 7-of-13 field goals, while Kentucky-transfer Ryan Harrow added 20 points in his GSU debut.

Hunter, who earned Kyle Macy Freshman All-America honors last year, scored 20 or more points for the 13th time in 32 career games. He added seven rebounds and four assists in the 19-point win.

Harrow went 8-of-13 from the floor in just 24 minutes, dishing out six assists.

"I thought we did a lot of good things in the opener," head coach Ron Hunter said. "I was pleased with the way we distributed the ball, our free throw shooting and our defense in the middle. However, I was disappointed that we gave us 21 offensive rebounds, which is absolutely way too many.

"Vanderbilt offers a lot of challenges for us. They are a very good SEC team. They have solid guard play and good size in the middle. Memorial Gym is a unique place to play and I look forward to seeing how our guys respond to the challenge."

In the opener, senior Devonta White moved into 16th-place on the all-time scoring list. His 14-point performance gives him 1,014 in his career, just 502 points shy of become the school's all-time leader.

Against Southern Poly, senior Manny Atkins just missed another double-double, scoring 13 points and grabbing nine rebounds, making 3-of-6 from 3-point range. In 32 games with Georgia State, Atkins has recorded three double-doubles, missed seven more by just one rebound and another four by just two rebounds.

2013-14 QUICK GAME NOTES

- Tonight's game will mark the first game for the Panthers against an SEC opponent since the 2005-06 season. That year, Georgia State played three-straight Southeastern Conference foes: Kentucky, Georgia and Alabama. The first two games were played in Atlanta, as GSU took on the Wildcats in Philips Arena before facing Georgia at Gwinnett Arena.
- Georgia State's last win over an SEC opponent came on Dec. 22, 2003, scoring a 77-72 win at Auburn.
- One Panther, Ryan Harrow, is no stranger to SEC opposition. Harrow as the starting point guard at Kentucky last season, leading the Wildcats to a 21-win season. Kentucky went 2-1 against the Commodores.
- This will mark the Panthers first season in its return to the Sun Belt Conference. Georgia State was a founding member of the league in 1976 before leaving in 1981.
- With Georgia State's win on Saturday, head coach Ron Hunter is now 3-0 in home openers since taking the helm of the program. The wins have come against McNeese State, Monmouth and Southern Poly.
- Georgia State finished the 2012-13 season with a 15-16 record, however, head coach Ron Hunter's 37 victories in his first two seasons are the most by a Panther coach in program history. He surpassed the total of Hall of Fame coach Charles "Lefty" Driesell who won 33 games in his first two seasons. Driesell won 50 games in his first three seasons and with one win so far this season, Hunter is at 38 in his two-plus years.
- Expectations are high entering the season as ESPN, NBC Sports, USA Today and CBS Sports have all projected the Panthers to win the Sun Belt Conference this year. The Sun Belt coaches have the Panthers finishing tied for fourth.
- Georgia State returns four starters from last year, including seniors Manny Atkins, Rashaad Richardson and Devonta White, along with sophomore R.J. Hunter.
- R.J. Hunter, a Kyle Macy Freshman All-America honoree last season, opened the year with 27 points against Southern Poly. In 32 career games, Hunter has scored 20 points or more 13 times.
- Senior Devonta White scored his 1,000th career point in his last game last season and with 14 points scored this year, has 1,014 for his career. He needs 502 points during his senior season to establish a new career school record. More remarkable is the fact he missed 10 games as a freshman with an ankle injury.
- White will finish his career at Georgia State has one of the most accomplished Panthers in program history. He is currently listed or just outside the top-10 in 11 career statistically categories. For more information on the records White is chasing can be found on page five of this notes packet.
- Freshman Isaiah Dennis has already made noise this fall earning the No. 5 play on ESPN Sportscenter's Top 10 List on Oct. 19. The 5-11 guard dunked over 6-9 forward Curtis Washington during the inaugural Hoop Day Fanfest.
- Coach Hunter has made it a habit of playing in non-conference tournaments and this year will be no different. In his first year, the Panthers travelled to Seattle, Wash. to play in the World Vision Classic. Last year, the Panthers hosted Coaches vs. Cancer following an opening game at BYU. This year, Georgia State will participate in the NIT Season Tip-off. The Panthers played in the Preseason NIT in 2003, however the tournament had a different format at that time.
- Georgia State will have one of the most balanced rosters in the country this year. The squad features four seniors, four juniors, four sophomores and three freshman.
- Despite recruiting nationally, almost half of the Panthers roster comes from Georgia. To be exact, there are seven members of the team from the Peach State, with two from Kentucky. There is one player from Ohio, Indiana, Florida, Virginia and South Carolina, along with one international player, Denny Burguillos, from Venezuela.



Redshirt-junior Curtis Washington who transferred to Georgia State from Southern Cal, tied a school-record with nine blocked shots, scoring six points and adding seven rebounds.

Tuesday night's game will mark just the second meeting between Georgia State and Vanderbilt with the coming in 1979. Vanderbilt (0-0) went 16-17 last year, finishing sixth in the SEC.

Head coach Kevin Stallings' squad is led by Rod Odom who averaged 10.4 points and 4.5 rebounds last season.

In the Commodores exhibition opener, Eric McClellan scored 20 points in his debut as one of three Vanderbilt players in double figures. McClellan transferred to Vanderbilt from Tulsa.

Following Tuesday's game, Georgia State will take have nearly a week off before facing McNeese State in the opening game of the 16-team NIT Season Tip-off on Nov. 18. The Panthers will meet the Cowboys in Tuscaloosa, Ala. as a part of a four-team regional including Alabama and Stillman College.

PERFECT...KIND OF

In Georgia State's regular season opening win against Southern Poly, the Panthers made 28-of-32 free throws, an 87.5 percent clip. However, the starting five went a perfect 22-of-22, with sophomore R.J. Hunter going a perfect 8-of-8. The 87.5 team mark was the 21st-best mark in school history.

ON THE MOVE

This will mark Georgia State's first season as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Panthers became official members on July 1, joining the highly-competitive league, led by Commissioner Karl Benson.

The Sun Belt was formed in 1976 with six members, including Georgia State, competing in four men's sports, and today comprised of 10 institutions of higher learning sponsoring 19 championship sports for men and women.

Georgia State was a founding member of the Sun Belt Conference in 1976 but left the conference in 1981. In 1984, the school joined the Trans America Athletic Conference, which was renamed the Atlantic Sun Conference in 2001, and then moved to the Colonial Athletic Association in 2005.

THE SENSATIONAL SOPHOMORE

Following a season in which R.J. Hunter won nearly every award possible, he is back for his sophomore campaign. He opened the season with a 27-point performance against Southern Poly, going 7-of-13 from the floor, 5-of-11 from 3-point range and a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line.

In his first year, Hunter earned Kyle Macy Freshman All-America honors, along with All-CAA First Team, CAA All-Rookie and CAA Rookie-of-the-Year recognition.

He was named CAA Rookie-of-the-Week six times and scored his first CAA Player of the Week honor on Feb. 2, while also being named the Lou Henson National Player of the Week.

He earned national player of the week honros after pouring in a career-high 38-points on a school-record 10 3-pointers. He finished the game 12-of-18 from the floor and 10-of-15 from 3-point range.

He was one of just three freshman in the country to average at least 17.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. The other two (UNLV's Anthony Bennett and UCLA's Shabazz Muhammad) were both selected in the NBA Draft with Bennett going No. 1 overall.

TOUGHER COMPETITION

Building his second schedule for Georgia State, head coach Ron Hunter wanted to test his team early, knowing a difficult Sun Belt Conference schedule awaits.

In the Panthers second game of the season, GSU will travel to Vanderbilt of the SEC. It will immediately be followed with a trip to Alabama for the NIT Season Tip-off. If the Panthers win two games in Tusculoosa, it would be on to Madison Square Garden in New York to possibly play the likes of Duke and Arizona, both ranked in the top-10 in most preseason polls.

Georgia State will also face five teams from Conference USA, including rematches with Southern Miss and East Carolina.

GEORGIA STATE VS. THE SEC

Two of Georgia State's first four games could come against Southeastern Conference opponents. The Panthers will travel to face Vanderbilt on Tuesday and then could play Alabama on Nov. 19 with a trip to New York on the line as a part of the NIT Season Tip-off.

The Panthers have four wins over SEC opponents, the most recent coming against Auburn during the 2003-04 season. Head coach Ron Hunter is 0-5 all-time against the SEC, having faced Vanderbilt twice and Auburn, Kentucky and Ole Miss once each.

THE SERIES WITH VANDERBILT

Despite only a four-hour difference between the two schools, this will mark just the second time Georgia State and Vanderbilt meet on the court and the first time in 34 years.

Vanderbilt earned a 65-53 win in Nashville the last time the two schools met.

OPENING ACTS

Head coach Ron Hunter is 1-2 in season openers and 3-0 in home openers in his first three years at the helm of the program.

His last two season openers have been no easy task. His first game as GSU's head coach came at Washington, a 91-74 loss. Last season, the Panthers opened the season at No. 8 Duke, falling to the Blue Devils 74-55 live on ESPNU. This year, the season opener came at home, a 97-78 victory over Southern Poly.

Before this season in home openers, Hunter led the Panthers to a 69-50 win over McNeese State during the 2011-12 season. That will propelled the Panthers to a school-record 11-game win streak. Last season, Georgia State earned a 62-49 win over Monmouth in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in the Sports Arena.



AWARD WINNING

The season is just underway, but the accolades have already started to come in for some Panthers. Sophomore R.J. Hunter was named to the Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team, while junior-transfer Ryan Harrow earned second team honors by the coaches.

CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

Redshirt-senior Manny Atkins put together a very special season last year, but a rebound here or there could had made it even more special.

Atkins recorded three double-doubles during the season, however, he also missed a double-double six times by just one rebound and another four by two rebounds.

IF he had secured all of those double-doubles, he would have ranked in the top-25 in the final NCAA rankings.

He opened the 2013-14 season with 13 points and nine rebounds against Southern Poly, once again, falling just short of that elusive double-double.

GOING BAREFOOT

Coach Ron Hunter will once again go barefoot for one game this season in support of Samaritan's Feet. It is expected that game will be Jan. 16 against Arkansas State, however, final preparations are still being made.

In his first two seasons at GSU, the Panthers are 2-0 when Hunter has gone without socks and shoes to raise awareness for the 300 million children around the world without shoes.

FATHER & SON

Ron and R.J. Hunter are actually the second father-son combo to grace the GSU Sports Arena. Bob Reinhart coached his son Bobby Reinhart from 1987-1989. Bobby led the team in assists during his senior season.

HOME SWEET HOME

When coach Ron Hunter took over the Panthers, one of the first things he proclaimed was that the GSU Sports Arena would become one of the toughest places in the country. So far, he has been correct. The Panthers are 23-10 in the comfy confines in his two-plus seasons.

In his first season, Hunter's Panthers won 10-straight home games and finished the 2011-12 season 13-3 in the GSU Sports Arena. After a 9-7 mark last year, Georgia State is 1-0 at home this year.

547 AND COUNTING

Georgia State has made at least one three-point field goal in 547 straight games, dating back to the 1994-95 season. The last team to hold the Panthers without a trey was Stetson on Feb. 18, 1995.

NEXT UP

Georgia State will open the NIT Season Tip-off facing McNeese State in Tuscaloosa, Ala. on Nov. 18. It will be the first of two games on the campus of Alabama. The Panthers will face either Alabama or Stillman College on Nov. 19. With two wins, Georgia State would advance to New York the week of Thanksgiving. The Panthers will not have another home game until Dec. 4 against Young Harris.

HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

Ron Hunter restored the Georgia State program to national prominence in his first year and has won 37 games in two seasons after taking over as head coach of the Panthers before the 2011-12 season. In that first campaign, Georgia State won 22 games, the second most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, the Panthers' fourth postseason appearance.



Hunter has won 311 games in 19 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team might be the most special. After being named head coach on March 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record-number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

He continued that work in Atlanta, coaching the Panthers while barefoot to victory over UNCW in front of the largest crowd in the Sports Arena since 2007.

While leading IUPUI to 25 or more wins in two of his final four seasons, Hunter began to partner with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world. On Jan. 24, 2008, he coached IUPUI against Oakland in his bare feet to help raise awareness for the cause. By tipoff, Hunter's efforts had raised more than 100,000 pairs of shoes, and to date, that number has climbed well above 250,000.

During his first season at Georgia State, Hunter led the Panthers to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, just the fourth time GSU earned a postseason bid. The Panthers opened the tournament at home, another first, hosting a postseason contest and earning an impressive 74-43 victory against Tennessee Tech.

Earlier in the year, Hunter's squad won 11 straight games, a school-record, earning impressive victories over CAA preseason favorite Drexel and at VCU. The streak included wins of 32, 32 and 31 points.

The Panthers winning ways continued in the CAA Tournament with a record-setting 35-point victory against Hofstra in the first round, the largest margin of victory in CAA Championship history.

Hunter's resume includes numerous national honors including an NABC Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Service, the 2009 Giant Steps Award from the National Consortium for Academics and Sport (NCAS), and a Minority Achievement Award from the Center for Leadership Development (CLD).

He was one of seven head coaches who served on the Division I Basketball Academic Enhancement Group, as appointed by late NCAA President Myles Brand, and he is a member of the National Basketball Coaches Association (NABC) Board of Directors.

Hunter, 48, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. He was a standout player on strong Miami teams of the mid-1980s, along with high school and college teammate Ron Harper, who went on to a long NBA career. The Redhawks were 81-30 during Hunter's four-year career and earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berths while winning two MAC championships.

Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (24) and R.J. (20), a sophomore on this year's team.

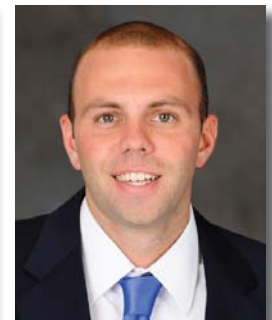

R.J. Hunter scored 27 points and Curtis Washington tied the Georgia State record with nine blocked shots as the Panthers opened the regular season with a 97-78 victory over Southern Poly Saturday at the GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (1-0) achieved its highest scoring output under head coach Ron Hunter and its highest since a 97-92 victory over Troy on Nov. 24, 2007.

Hunter went 7-for-13 from the field, including five 3-pointers, and was a perfect 8-for-8 at the free throw line as he equaled the second-highest scoring game of his career, bettered only by his 38 points last season against Old Dominion. The 6-5 sophomore also contributed seven rebounds and four assists.

Washington, the 6-9 transfer from Southern California playing his first regular-season game for the Panthers, tied the GSU record originally set by Sylvester Morgan against Mercer in 2005 and then equaled by James Vincent last season against Monmouth. Washington also had six points and seven rebounds in his Panther debut.

Also playing his first game in a GSU uniform, Kentucky transfer Ryan Harrow had 20 points and six assists. Devonta White added 14 points and five assists, and Manny Atkins contributed to 13 points and nine rebounds to give the Panthers four players in double figures.

White moved into 16th-place on GSU's all-time scoring list with 1,014 points. The senior moved ahead of Chris Collier and is now just three points shy of Travis Williams for 15th on the all-time list.

Georgia State shot 44 percent from the field with half of its 66 field goal attempts coming from beyond the 3-point arc, where the Panthers made 11. GSU went 28-of-32 at the free throw line.

Marcus Dortch led Southern Poly (2-1) with 20 points and seven rebounds.

After trailing 10-9 early, the Panthers used a 30-6 run to take a 39-16 lead with seven minutes left in the half. Southern Poly answered by scoring 16 straight points, pulling within 39-33 with two minutes to go before GSU closed the half with 10 straight points. Hunter's deep three from the top of the key with two seconds left sent the Panthers into the locker room with a 49-33 advantage.

Georgia State then scored the first 13 points of the second half for a 23-0 run, pushing their lead to 62-33.
