VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- The Commodores are in their 29th season, having amassed a 272-220-45 record.
- Coach Darren Ambrose enters his first season as head coach after spending the previous 15 at Penn, where he won 148 games and was the program's all-time winningest coach.
- Fifteen lettermen from last year return, including eight starters.
- Seniors Erin Myers and Kelsey Tillman, along with junior Claire Anderson and sophomore goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami return as the only four to start all 19 games in 2014.
- Junior All-SEC forward Simone Charley comes in as the team's top returning scorer after scoring nine goals, with three assists. The three-time All-American in the triple jump is the team's active leader in career goals with 14 in two years.
- SEC All-Freshman Lydia Simmons returns after dishing out three assists, tied for a team-high, and being a steady force in the mid-field as she started 18 games.
- In June, redshirt junior Lina Granados represented Colombia in the Women's World Cup in Canada, making the 23-player roster.
- Vanderbilt adds two ACC transfers: Kacy Scarpa, from national champ Florida State and Danae O'Halloran from North Carolina.

VANDERBILT SOCCER

COACH DARREN AMBROSE

Darren Ambrose enters his first season at Vanderbilt after a successful run at the University of Pennsylvania.

Ambrose spent the last 15 years as the head coach at Penn, and was the program's all-time winningest coach. He is the sixth head coach in the history of the program.



In 15 years at Penn, Ambrose compiled an impressive record of 148-71-35, including a 54-34-17 mark in the Ivy League. His teams reached the NCAA Tournament three times and won three Ivy League championships. His teams finished in the top three of the Ivy League in 10 of his 15 seasons, including seven of the past eight years.

Ambrose never had a losing season at Penn as the Quakers averaged nearly 10 wins a year under his watch. He coached the team's first two All-Americans as well as its first NSCAA Scholar All-America, CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year, Ivy League Player of the Year, Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year and Ivy League Rookies of the Year. In addition, Ambrose was at the helm for all of Penn's Ivy League championships (2001, 2007, 2010), three of its four NCAA Championship berths (2001, 2007, 2010), and an ECAC title in 2000.

Under Ambrose, more than 80 percent of the Penn women's soccer players have graduated with GPAs above 3.0, and Penn is the only Ivy League program to have earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award each of the last 14 years.

Prior to Penn, Ambrose served as an assistant coach at Florida State, Rhodes College (in Memphis) and Connecticut. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in management accounting from USC-Spartanburg, where he played goalie and was the Division II National Player of the Year in 1992-93. He received his master's degree in sports administration from Memphis in 1995.

Ambrose, who was born in Sheffield, England, lives with his wife, Sherry, and their two daughters, Madison and Ainsley.

GLIMPSE OF THE 'DORES

Vanderbilt begins its 29th women's soccer season this Friday against Miami-Ohio at the VU Soccer Complex.

The Commodores return 15 letterwinners and eight starters from a team that went 7-10-2 overall and 2-7-2 in SEC play. Among those returning are All-SEC junior forward Simone Charley, who led the team with nine goals last year, and midfielder Lydia Simmons, who was named SEC All-Freshman. Goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami also returns after starting all 19 games as a freshman and leading the SEC with 113 saves.

In addition to Ogunsami, senior captain Erin Myers, senior Kelsey Tillman and junior Claire Anderson started all 19 games in 2014. Myers, a midfielder/defender, has started all 58 games of her career.

The Commodores return 56 percent of last year's goal scorers. Both goalkeepers are back, as Ogunsami and senior Shannon Morrish combined for six shutouts.

The squad welcomes eight newcomers. Six freshmen arrive, plus a pair of transfers from the ACC — defender Danae O'Halloran from North Carolina and midfielder Kacy Scarpa, who played for national champ Florida State.

WEEKLY REPORT

Vanderbilt dropped its first two games of the season to a pair of teams from Ohio.

The Commodores lost to Miami-Ohio 1-0 in its home opener on Friday, surrendering a goal in the 80th minute despite outshooting the Redhawks 22-8.

On Sunday in their first road game of the season at Cincinnati, they had just three shots and allowed the game-winning goal in the 67th minute.

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

The Commodores head to the Evergreen State for a pair of road games. Vanderbilt plays at Gonzaga on Friday night and caps off three straight road games against Seattle University on Sunday afternoon.

Gonzaga is coming off a 9-9-1 season and finished tied for fifth in the West Coast Conference with a 4-4-1 mark. The Bulldogs return five starters and 15 letterwinners. Gonzaga started off the season with a 1-1 tie against Nevada on Friday, scoring on an own goal by Nevada. The Commodores are 0-2 all-time against the Bulldogs, with the last meeting in 2012.

Seattle went 15-4-3 in 2014 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to South Carolina in penalty kicks. The Redhawks captured a share of the Western Athletic Conference regular-season championship and won the league tournament crown.

Seattle dropped its season opener to Washington State 3-1, but defeated Oregon in double overtime 1-0 on Sunday. The Redhawks are led by Natasha Howe, who scored 10 goals last year. Vanderbilt and Seattle have never met.

AMBROSE ERA BEGINS

Darren Ambrose begins his first year at Vanderbilt as the sixth head coach in program history. He spent the last 15 years as head coach at Penn, where he was the winningest coach in program history with 148 wins. He also guided the Quakers to three NCAA Tournaments, three Ivy League championships, while never having a losing season.

The 44-year-old from England has been a coach for the last 20 years, serving on staffs as Florida State, Connecticut and Rhodes College. He is no stranger to Tennessee as he received his master's degree from Memphis, starting his coaching career at Rhodes College and was active in youth soccer in Memphis, leading the Memphis FC '81 girls team to a state title and the Dana Cup championship in Denmark in 1998.

DOUBLE THREAT

Simone Charley enters the second half of what has so far been a superb two-sport college career.

The 5-foot-8 forward from Hoover, Ala., leads active VU players with 14 career goals, including a team-high nine last year.

She accounted for seven of the team's nine goals in league play and scored six goals in her last six games. She was named First Team All-SEC and All-South Region Second Team last year.

She showed glimpses of continuing her excellence with two goals in the team's exhibition game against Alabama last week.

Charley also is a standout on the track as a three-time All-American. After finishing ninth in the triple jump as a freshman at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, she outdid herself as a sophomore. She placed fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and then reached the podium at the NCAA Outdoor Championships with a third-place finish in June. In the process, she leapt 44-3.25, breaking her own school record.

TASTING THE WORLD CUP

The Commodores were represented at the Women's World Cup in June in Canada.

Redshirt junior Lina Granados made the 23-player roster for Colombia and traveled with the team during its four games. Colombia advanced out of pool play for the first time and fell to the United States, the

eventual champ.

Granados hails from Ashburn, Va., but has dual citizenship as she was born in Bogota, Colombia. She has played for the Colombia Football Federation since she was 15, and has played in international tournaments three times. She helped the Colombia U-20 team win gold at the 2013 Bolivian Games in Peru.



OGUNSAMI BACK IN NET

Christiana Ogunsami returns in goal after a promising freshman campaign.

The 5-foot-11 keeper from Cherry Hill, N.J., started all 19 games in 2014. She made 113 saves last year to lead the SEC and record the second-most stops in a single season in program history. She also tied the school record with 15 saves against No. 10 Texas A&M on Oct. 10. It was the most saves by a Vanderbilt keeper since Christy Barringer made 15 stops on Oct. 17, 1992.

Ogunsami spent the summer trying to fine-tune her game by working at The Keeper Institute in New Jersey with former U.S. Women's National Team goalie Jillian Loyden.

MORRISH BEGINS NURSING SCHOOL

Senior goalkeeper Shannon Morrish will be juggling not only soccer and her final year of undergraduate studies this fall but also nursing school.

Morrish, a native of Bradenton, Fla., entered Vanderbilt University's School of Nursing this week. She is pursuing a master's degree in adult/gerontology acute care. She'll be a registered nurse after the first year and complete the requirements to be certified as a nurse practitioner by May 2017.

ANDERSON RETURNS HOME

This weekend's road trip to Washington will serve as a homecoming for Claire Anderson.

The junior defender hails from Seattle and played at Lakeside School and was named a three-time All-Metro Mountain League selection by the Seattle Times. She has played in 33 games at Vanderbilt, starting 25.



SEC PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH

Five Vanderbilt players were selected as preseason players to watch.

Junior forward Simone Charley (nine goals, three assists), redshirt sophomore midfielder Lydia Simmons (three assists), sophomore defender Cristina De Zeeuw (one assist), senior midfielder Erin Myers (one goal) and sophomore forward/midfielder Sasha Gray (one goal, one assist) were all chosen.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Vanderbilt dominated possession and the stat sheet, but the Commodores fell short in their season opener and coach Darren Ambrose's debut.

Miami-Ohio scored in the 80th minute to hand Vanderbilt a 1-0 loss on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. The Commodores outshot the Redhawks 22-8, with 13 shots on goal, but none found the back of the net.

Haley Walter scored the lone goal in with 10 minutes left in the game on an assist from Courtney Evans. Walter nudged a shot off the feet of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, who tried to cut down Walter's angle, and the ball bounced up into the goal.

It was a tough loss for Vanderbilt (0-1) and Ambrose, who was coaching his first game as Commodores head coach after spending the previous 15 years at Penn. VU outshot Miami 16-4 in the first half and a couple of solid looks that were snuffed out.

Simone Charley, who led the team with 12 shots and seven on goal, nearly put the Commodores in front in the 19th minute. On a breakaway, Charley aimed a shot toward the right corner. But Miami goalkeeper Vic Maniaci got enough of her mitt on the ball that it deflected off the near post. It was one of Maniaci's 11 saves.

Twice Vanderbilt had empty nets in the first half, but Miami defenders knocked the ball away. Off a corner kick, Charley headed the ball toward the goal. Vanderbilt defender got a foot on it and steered it toward the net but Redhawks defender was right there on the goal line to keep the shot from going in. Lina Granados also had a chance as she beat Maniaci to her left just inside the five yard-mark, but the ball was cleared by a defender at the goal line.

Senior Taylor Elliott had the team's best look in the first half. She settled the ball after heading it and tried to slip a shot past Cincinnati goalkeeper Sam Pavlika but a defender was there at the line to knock it away. Later in the half, redshirt sophomore Lydia Simmons fired in a free kick from 25 yards out that Pavlika had to jump and swat away. Vanderbilt's lone shot attempt in the second half by Simone Charley's was immediately blocked.
