What's On Tap

Fresh off final exams, Vanderbilt opens May with a three-game road series against in-state rival Tennessee this weekend in Knoxville. The Commodores and Volunteers will open the set on Friday at 6 p.m. CT, followed by a 3 p.m. CT start on Saturday. Sunday's finale is set for a 1 p.m. CT start. Saturday's game will be televised regionally by Fox Sports Net.

Scouting Tennessee

Tennessee is 25-20 overall and 11-10 in Southeastern Conference play after dropping two of three at Mississippi State last weekend. The Volunteers lost a midweek game to Western Carolina, 5-2, on Tuesday and enter this weekend's action having dropped seven of their last 10.

Sophomore catcher Yan Gomes leads the team with a .350 batting average to go with five homers and 33 RBI. He is hitting .389 in SEC play and all five of his homers have come in league action. Freshman centerfielder Kentrail Davis is a candidate for Freshman of the Year honors with a .345 batting average with nine homers and 37 RBI. Senior outfielder Shawn Griffin is the top power source with 11 homers and 34 RBI. As a team, UT is hitting .294 (10th in SEC) with 49 homers and 282 runs scored (6.26 per game).

Sophomore left-hander Nick Hernandez (1-3, 4.82 ERA) will start for the Vols on Friday with freshman left-hander Bryan Morgado (6-2, 3.20 ERA) scheduled to go on Saturday. Sunday's starter is to be determined. Junior right-hander Danny Willtzt (3-1, 2.41 ERA) leads the team with three saves in 18 relief appearances and has 24 strikeouts and 17 walks in 33.2 innings. As a team, UT sports a 4.96 ERA (11th in the SEC) with 344 strikeouts and 178 walks in 395.1 innings.

De La Osa On Verge Of Becoming School's Career Hits Leader

Senior outfielder Dominic de la Osa is five hits away from breaking Karl Nonemaker's school career hits record of 283.

Coming into the season de la Osa was the lone active Commodore in the 200 hit club. Alex Feinberg, Ryan Flaherty, David Macias and Pedro Alvarez have joined him on the exclusive list. De la Osa now has 279 hits in his four-year career, good for third on the all-time list. Feinberg has 244 in his four years and is currently eighth, while Flaherty has 237 in just his third year, good for 10th best in school history. Macias has 229 hits in his career (12th), while Alvarez, who missed 23 games this year, joined the club against Auburn and now has 210 (21st).

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt went 3-2 last week and won its 30th game of the year this week, marking the fifth straight year of reaching that mark. It tied the school record previously set by Larry Schmittou's teams from 1971-75 ... The Commodores opened the week by scoring 19 runs in two midweek games, but ended it by scoring just six runs in the Kentucky series. It was the lowest output in conference play since the Georgia series in Athens in 2003 ... VU's series loss to Kentucky was the team's first home three-game series loss since losing to the Wildcats in 2006 (13 series overall, 9 SEC series) ... VU batted .293 on the week with four homers and 25 runs scored (five per game) ... The pitching staff sported a 4.00 ERA with 46 strikeouts and 24 walks in 45.0 innings ... The pitching improved in the UK series, limiting the top offensive club in the SEC statistically to just a .245 batting average and 11 runs scored (3.00 ERA). They combined to strike out 29 Wildcats with 13 walks ... Dominic de la Osa went 8-for-18 (.444) on the week with a homer, four RBI, two doubles and five runs scored. His two doubles gives him 60 for his career, one short of the school record of 61 set by Sean Luellwitz (1999-2002). He also had eight hits on the week, giving him 279 in his career, four shy of the school record of 283 set by Karl Nonemaker (1999-2002) ... Shea Robin also had a good week with a 5-for-14 (.357) showing with three doubles and two RBI. He is now hitting over .300 on the year at .305 ... Pedro Alvarez had seven hits, four of them doubles, on the week and is hitting .392 in SEC play ... Jordan Wormsley recorded three hits in a start against Belmont with two RBI ... Steven Liddle went 6-for-11 (.545) on the week in four games, including three starts, to boost his batting average to .279 on the year ... Mike Minor returned to form on Friday night, holding the Wildcats to just five hits and one unearned run in six innings with nine strikeouts and two walks ... Russell Brewer recorded a win and notched a save this week in two appearances... Brett Jacobson pitched three scoreless innings in two relief outings, including getting a save against Belmont ... Richie Goodenow made three relief appearances and struck out two and walked four in 2.1 innings while not giving up a run of his own ... The Commodores committed 10 errors on the week, for a .948 fielding percentage. The errors led to six unearned runs on the week. VU made six errors in the UK series, while the Wildcats played error free baseball the entire weekend ... The Commodores have now lost just as many games as last season and one more SEC game than a year ago when they finished 54-13 overall and 22-8 in league play ... Vanderbilt has the week off as players complete their final exams. The team will then take on in-state rival Tennessee in Knoxville over the weekend.

Underclassmen Hurlers Coming Together

Vanderbilt came into the season with just two upperclassmen pitchers with significant experience in junior right-handers Nick Christiani and Brett Jacobson. The Commodores have had to rely on youth on the mound and the group under pitching coach Derek Johnson has started to solidify down the stretch.

Sophomore ace Mike Minor has recorded 18 strikeouts and just four walks in 13 innings in his last two starts. Redshirt freshman right-hander Russell Brewer is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in his last four outings with two saves. He has eight strikeouts and a walk in six innings in that span. Redshirt southpaw Richie Goodenow has not given up a run in his last eight appearances as a specialist and has five strikeouts in 4.1 innings in his last six outings. True freshman Chase Reid is second on the team in appearances with 16 and sports a 3-0 record and 2.57 ERA. Two other freshmen, Taylor Hill and Mark Lamm (redshirt) have performed well in midweek action. Hill is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA in his last two starts, while Lamm has 20 strikeouts and 10 walks in 19.2 innings on the year.

Christiani Coming On Strong

Junior right-hander Nick Christiani has come on strong in the month of April after being left off the 25-man roster against Arkansas (March 29-30). Since that time the New Jersey native has gone 4-1 with a 2.64 ERA and has 26 strikeouts in 30.2 innings. Christiani moved back into the weekend rotation against Mississippi State on April 13 and responded by giving up just two runs on three hits in seven innings of work with 10 strikeouts. He then picked up the win with five innings of five hit ball against Auburn on April 20. Christiani threw his first career nine-inning

complete game against Kentucky on April 27, giving up three runs, two earned, on six hits with five strikeouts and two walks. The feat was done, despite sitting for nearly two hours due to a rain delay. He is now 5-2 on the year with a team best 3.64 ERA and has 48 strikeouts and 19 walks in 54.1 innings.

Alvarez and de la Osa Approaching School Homer Record

Pedro Alvarez and Dominic de la Osa are within reach of the school's career home-run record. Alvarez missed 23 games and has hit three homers since his return at the start of April to up his career total to 43. That ties him with Glenn Davis for third on the school's all-time list. De la Osa has six homers on the year that ties him with Cam Hazen for fifth most in school history. Alvarez needs six more round-trippers and de la Osa needs seven to tie Scotti Madison's mark of 49 set from 1977-80.

De la Osa broke Boomer Whipple's mark of 809 career at-bats against Ole Miss and now has 863 going into the Tennessee series. De la Osa also has 60 career doubles, just one off the school mark of 61 set by Sean Luellwitz from 1999-2002.

Commodores Picked To Finish First in SEC (East) By Coaches

Vanderbilt is predicted to repeat as the 2008 Southeastern Conference baseball champions, as voted by the league's 12 baseball coaches in the 17th annual preseason SEC poll.

The Commodores, ranked as high as No. 3 nationally in the preseason polls, seek to capture their fifth SEC Championship, having also won titles in 1973, 1974, 1980 and 2007. Vanderbilt returns eight position starters and four pitchers from their 2007 squad which also won the SEC Tournament and earned the National No. 1 Seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Since 1996, the SEC has named a regular season champion as well as a tournament champion. Prior to 1996, the tournament champion was considered the SEC Champion.



HEAD COACH TIM CORBIN



In five seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has turned Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball. In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13 of 15 weeks during the regular season.

The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the Southeastern Conference, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever, and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the

series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game.

The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year by College Baseball Insider and regional coach of the year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association.

The Commodores hosted their first ever NCAA regional as the No. 1 National Seed and arrived as a power in college baseball.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

His overall record of 198-108 (.647) is third best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

In 2006 he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alumni playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 20 VU players have been drafted over the last three years including eight in 2007.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set then school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) – all of which were bettered in 2004. The team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.
