Records: UMass is 0-7 after suffering a 24-0 loss against Bowling Green last Saturday. Vanderbilt is 3-4 after a 17-13 win over Auburn last week.

Rankings: Neither team is ranked in the Associated Press or the USA Today polls.

UMass Coach Charley Molnar: Molnar enters his first season as a head coach after serving 28 years as an assistant - most recently as the offensive coordinator at Notre Dame. Molnar was named UMass' head coach on December 8, 2011 and is the 29th head coach in program history.
Vanderbilt Coach Coach James Franklin: Head coach James Franklin is in his second season at Vanderbilt with a 9-12 overall record. Franklin was a veteran assistant coach at Maryland, Kansas State, and in the NFL with the Green Bay Packers before landing in Nashville. At Maryland, Franklin coached with UMass defensive line coach and as-

MINUTEMEN CLOSE NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE AT VANDERBILT

• UMass heads to Nashville for the first-ever meeting against Vanderbilt as Saturday's game kicks off a four-game series over the next six years against the Commodores. The Minutemen are coming off a tough 24-0 loss to Bowling Green last Saturday at Gillette Stadium, while Vanderbilt defeated SEC rival Auburn 17-13 at home.

• Voice of the Minutemen Josh Maurer, analyst Matt Goldstein and sideline reporter Cody Chrusciel will have the call on the UMass Sports Radio Network. Adam Frenier will host the pregame, halftime and postgame shows. The game can be heard live starting at 6:40 PM (EST) on 105.5 FM WEEI (Springfield), 1440 AM WVEI (Worcester) and 95.9 FM WATD (South Shore). The broadcast is also available online through www.UMassAthletics.com and on smart phones and tablets through the Tuneln app.

• The game will be televised live Fox Sports Net and NESN with Bob Rathbun calling the play-by-play, Tim Couch with color analysis, and Elizabeth Moreau with sideline reports. Along with calling college football games, Rathbun is a 17-year veteran announcer of the Atlanta Hawks. Couch was an All-American quarterback at Kentucky and the No. 1 pick in the 1999 NFL Draft by Cleveland. Moreau covers SEC football for Fox Sports South and is a former volleyball player from Butler.

• While the UMass defense played one of its best games of the year last Saturday against Bowling Green, it was the offense which struggled picking up just six first downs on 118 total yards. On the ground, the Minutemen picked up 85 yards, but through the air only managed 33 yards - the fewest since throwing for 22 yards at Rhode Island in 2007.

• Michael Cox continues to lead the ground game for UMass with 437 yards (3.9 yards per carry) and three touchdowns. Cox scored his third touchdown of the season at Western Michigan showing his athleticism once again with a high-flying flip over the defense.

• At quarterback, Mike Wegzyn has gotten more comfortable in the pocket going 108-of-212 for 1,045 yards and four touchdowns thrown. He also is UMass' second leading rusher with 155 yards and a TD run. Against Vanderbilt, the redshirt freshman should have two big targets back in tightend Rob Blanchflower and wide receiver Alan Williams who missed the last two games.

• Defensively, Perry McIntyre continues to show he's one of the top linebackers in the MAC with his team-leading 77 tackles which ranks among the top five players in the league. Through seven games, the senior has posted double-digit stops on five occasions.

• UMass returns to MAC action next Saturday with a trip to Northern Illinois (3:30 PM kick-off). The game will be the second of a three-game road swing closed out the following week at Akron.

SERIES HISTORY

• UMass and Vanderbilt meet for the first time in program history. The Commodores are the first SEC team in history to play UMass. *The teams will also meet in 2013 (Gillette Stadium), 2014 (Vanderbilt Stadium) and 2018 (Gillette).*

QUICK SLANTS

- 28 true freshmen and redshirt freshmen have played this year including eight who have started (4 true & 4 redshirt).
- Deion Walker has continued to grow into a role as a primary receiver at UMass. The graduate student from Notre Dame leads the team in catches (34) and receiving yards (424). His 162 yards against Ohio is the 4th most for any MAC wideout this season.
- Perry McIntyre has continued to show why he is one of the best linebackers in the MAC this season with his 5th double-digit tackle effort of the season with 12 against Bowling Green. Entering today's game, he ranks 2nd in the MAC with 11.0 tackles per game.
- Vanderbilt head coach James Franklin and UMass assistant head coach/defensive line coach Dave Sollazzo spent eight years coaching together at Maryland (2001-04; 2008-10). Vanderbilt defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop was the defensive backs coach at UMass during the 2006 NCAA National Finalist run with current Baltimore Raven James Ihejigbo among one of his players.

Despite causing three turnovers on the defensive side of the ball, UMass had troubles offensively, falling to Connecticut, 37-0 in the first-ever FBS game in program history. Darren Thellen earned ESPN's Top Play of the Day on Sports Center with an amazing effort to bat a thrown-away pass back inbounds so Tom Brandt could make the interception. Perry McIntyre led the defense with 12 tackles. Mike Wegzyn was 9-of-22 for 56 yds in his

Indiana racked up nearly 600 yards of offense despite losing quarterback Tre Roberson to a broken leg during the game. Roberson amassed 114 yards rushing and was 6-of-13 through the air with two touchdowns on the ground and one passing. Mike Wegzyn scored UMass' only touchdown on a 16-yard scamper after a 56-yard pass to Marken Michel in the first quarter to make it 7-6 Indiana. Darren Thellen led the defense with 11 tackles and an interception.

A 32-yard interception return for a touchdown by Christian Birt and a pair of field goals by Brendon Levensgood highlighted UMass' scoring in a 63-13 loss at No. 17 Michigan on Saturday afternoon. Denard Robinson showed why he was one of the most prolific players in college football with 291 yards passing and 106 yards rushing with four total touchdowns. The game was a homecoming for UMass tailback Michael Cox who rushed for a season-high 76 yards against his former teammates. Cox played four years at Michigan before enrolling in graduate school at UMass.

Despite a career-high 188 yards rushing and two touchdowns from Michael Cox, UMass suffered a 27-16 loss at Miami in the MAC opener for both teams. UMass outgained the Red Hawks on the ground and through the air, but was unable to finish key scoring drives including an interception thrown from the Miami four yard line and a touchdown call back due to penalty.

A 17-point fourth quarter sealed a come-from-behind win for Ohio against UMass in Week 5 as the Bobcats won 37-34 to remain unbeaten on the season. Mike Wegzyn threw for 373 yards and four touchdowns in arguably the best game for the offense this season. Alan Williams had a career-high 127 yards receiving and 3 touchdowns including one in the final 4 minutes of play as the Minutemen tried to make a late rally.

Western Michigan jumped out to a 28-0 lead holding the Minutemen off the scoreboard until just before halftime en route to a 52-14 win at Waldo Stadium. Tyler Van Tubbergen led WMU with 5 touchdowns on 23-of-28 passing, while the Bronco ground game picked up 268 yards rushing.

UMASS SET FOR INAUGURAL FBS SEASON

- The 2012 season represents a new era in UMass football as the Minutemen transition from a storied past at the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision and the Mid-American Conference.
- The 2011 season marked the final year in the FCS (formerly I-AA) for the UMass football program as the Minutemen are now in year two of their transition period to the FBS (I-A). Along with a new conference and division comes a new home field as UMass will begin playing at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Mass. - also home to the NFL's New England Patriots.
- UMass will become eligible for the MAC Championship and will be Bowl-Eligible in 2013.
- UMass joins UConn (Big East) and Boston College (ACC) as the only New England FBS schools.

UMASS HISTORY THUMBNAIL

- This is the 130th season of UMass football. UMass has an all-time record of 556-533-51 (.513) in 1,140 all-time games. The Minutemen won two of the last six conference championships (2006 and 2007) as members of the Colonial Athletic Association and the Atlantic 10. In 2008, UMass posted its seventh winning season in a row with a 7-5 record. Over its last nine years at the FCS level, UMass made three NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007, UMass went 10-3, going 7-1 in the inaugural season of the CAA.
- UMass was the winningest program in the CAA over a 10-year span from 1998-2008 with an 83-44 record with a 65.7 win percentage.
- The Minutemen have won 22 conference championships - the last two coming in 2007 and 2008. All-time UMass had eight NCAA Tournament appearances winning the 1998 national title and also playing in the championship game in 2006 and 1978.

LOTS OF NEW FOR 2012

- Along with the move to the Mid-American Conference, UMass welcomed new head coach Charley Molnar in December 2011. Molnar assembled a new coaching staff which is made up of a veteran group with coaching experience at the highest collegiate and professional levels.
- On top of having the new coaching staff, UMass will also be changing its offense from a pro-style attack to a spread, no-huddle scheme.
- On the defensive side of the ball, the Minutemen return to their traditional 4-3 look after playing the 2011 season using a 3-4 defense.
- Continuing the 'New Trend' are the Minutemen's new uniforms. UMass is wearing the new Adidas "Tech-Fit" football uniforms and have stepped away from tradition with black helmets. Additionally, the logo used for the helmets is a new design of the UMass word mark to stand out more. UMass debuted new all-black uniforms in the Gillette opener against Indiana (9/8).

UMASS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

- Prior to UMass' transition to an FBS program, the Minutemen played a I-A opponent in 12 of the previous 13 years. In five of the last seven years, UMass played narrow games with FBS teams, losing by 10 points or fewer including the 2010 season's 42-37 loss at Michigan. UMass has played a ranked FBS team in three of the last seven years having playing then-No. 10 Texas Tech in 2008, then-No. 12 Boston College in 2007, and then No. 20 Michigan in 2010.
- Since FCS (Division I-AA) was formed in 1978, UMass posted a record of 8-23 against I-A foes, with the last victory being a 26-10 triumph over Ball State on Sept. 1, 1984, at home at McGuirk Stadium.
- UMass had Michigan on the ropes in Ann Arbor in 2010 leading 17-7 before the Wolverines were able to score two touchdowns in the final 61 seconds prior to halftime. Michigan extended the lead in the third quarter with another pair of touchdowns, but UMass battled back with three scores in the fourth quarter. A missed on-side kick with 2:05 left in the game allowed Michigan to run out the clock for the win. Kyle Havens was 22-of-29 for 222 yards and 2 touchdowns. Jonathan Hernandez rushed for 114 yards and 2 touchdowns, while Julian Talley had seven receptions for 91 yards and a score.

FORMER MINUTEMEN IN THE NFL

- Entering the NFL Regular-Season, UMass figures to be well represented on Sunday afternoons. The most prominent UMass alum is none other than Victor Cruz whose improbable story and highlight reel season in 2011 captured America's attention. Cruz helped the New York Giants to a Super Bowl win while setting a franchise record for receiving yardage in a single-season. Along with the publicity he garnered for his signature 'Salsa Dance' as a touchdown celebration, Cruz also wrote a book during the off-season which became a best-seller.
- Lining up opposite from Cruz in last year's Super Bowl was James Ihedigbo with the New England Patriots. Ihedigbo previously played three years with the New York Jets alongside Vladimir Ducasse and is now with the Baltimore Ravens.
- Ducasse was drafted in the second round of the 2010 NFL Draft and is entering his third season with the Jets.
- Also currently on NFL rosters are Jeremy Cain (Jacksonville Jaguars), Jeromy Miles (Cincinnati Bengals), and Josh Samuda (Miami Dolphins).
- John Griffin (Jets), Chris Koepplein (Patriots), Jeremy Horne (Kansas City Chiefs), Travis Tripucka (St. Louis Rams), Emil Igwenagu (Philadelphia Eagles), and Julian Talley (New York Giants) were all cut from their respective squads during the final week of the preseason. Igwenagu was then signed to the Eagles' practice squad.
- Former Head Coach Mark Whipple is currently the quarterbacks coach in Cleveland after a stint at the University of Miami as offensive coordinator and with the Pittsburgh Steelers where he coached Ben Roethlisberger.
- The previous high mark for UMass products in the pros came in 1968, when UMass had five players combined between the NFL and AFL, prior to the leagues' merger in 1970. That year, tight end Milt Morin played for the Cleveland Browns, quarterback Greg Landry was a first-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions, quarterback John McCormick played for the Denver Broncos and halfback Terry Swanson and lineman Ed Toner suited up for the then-Boston Patriots.

OFFENSIVE LINE A STRONG FOUNDATION

- The UMass offensive line returned nearly complete from a year ago with the exception of four-year starting left guard Josh Samuda, however, Anthony Dima suffered a preseason injury that forced him to miss the UConn and Indiana games. The group is the most veteran of any offensive position giving the Minutemen a strong foundation to build around.
- Stephane Milhim, Nick Speller and Dima started every game last season, while Quinton Sales returns as one of the top centers in program history. John Wallace and Michael Boland made their first career starts at UConn. Jamie Cassleberry made his first career start against Ohio turning in a strong performance at left guard.

WEGZYN GETS THE NOD AT QB

- Kellen Pagel took over as the starting quarterback during the spring, however, he was diagnosed with post-concussion symptoms when preseason camp started. Mike Wegzyn redshirted the 2011 season as a freshman and the big arm from Tennessee earned the starting job in Pagel's absence.
- A.J. Doyle, Charley Molnar's first recruit at UMass, backs up Wegzyn with Ian Shultis behind him on the depth chart.
- The season-opener at UConn was Wegzyn's first career start, with him going 9-of-22 for 56 yards and an interception.
- Against Indiana (9/8) Wegzyn scored the program's first FBS touchdown with a 16-yard scamper. The play was set-up by a 56-yard throw to Marken Michel in the first quarter. He finished the Indiana game going 18-of-26 for 151 yards with another 32 yards rushing.
- Wegzyn's older brother Matt was formerly a tight end at Tennessee.

WEGZYN SHOWING IMPROVEMENT

- Despite being in his first year of action under center, quarterback Mike Wegzyn had thrown just one interception in 77 attempts between the UConn and the Miami (Ohio) game. Since his pick at UConn and his first interception at Miami (Ohio), Wegzyn went 82 passes without turning the ball over.
- Against Miami, Wegzyn set new career-best marks in completions (19), attempts (40) and yards (213).
- Wegzyn continued to show improvement the next week against Ohio with career best marks in nearly every category completing 27-of-51 passes for 373 yards and four touchdowns without an interception. Wegzyn's 373 yards ranks as the 7th most by a MAC quarterback this season.
- In his first four career MAC games, Wegzyn is 67-of-135 for 697 yards with four touchdowns and five interceptions.

BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

- Until the Ohio game, UMass' play calling had been fairly even in terms of run and pass plays. Against the Bobcats, UMass had 51 passes compared to 33 rush attempts. In both the Michigan and Miami games, UMass had 10 more rush attempts than pass attempts. The first two games and the WMU game were much closer with an average of 2 additional run plays versus pass plays.
- The Miami game saw the most rush attempts in a game (50), while the Ohio game saw the most pass attempts (51).

RUN GAME IMPROVING AS COX HITS STRIDE

- The return of right tackle Anthony Dima helped stabilize the UMass offensive line. Dima missed the UConn and Indiana games due to injury but since returning to the line-up at Michigan, UMass has a combined 182 rushing attempts for 653 yards (131 yds per game) compared to 61 attempts for 80 yards (40 yds per game).
- A big story entering the Michigan game was Michael Cox's return to his alma mater after graduating from Ann Arbor in Spring 2012. Against his former teammates, Cox rushed for a season-high 81 yards on 18 carries.
- Cox had a break-out game at Miami (Ohio) with a career-high 188 yards on the ground and two touchdowns. His nine-yard touchdown run which was capped off with an end-over-end front-flip into the end zone was ESPN Sports Center's No. 5 Play of the Day on Sept. 22. Against the Red Hawks, Cox was able to gain 10-or-more yards eight times out of his 30 carries.
- Cox's 188 yards at Miami ranks as the 8th most by a player in the MAC this season.

RUSH BY COMMITTEE

- UMass also graduated 1,000-yard rusher Jonathan Hernandez, but return several running backs who could fill the void. Fifth-year Michigan transfer Michael Cox leads a talented stable of running backs which includes sophomore Jordan Broadnax, redshirt senior Chris Burns (a transfer from Pittsburgh prior to the 2011 season), redshirt junior Jamar Smith and freshman Stacey Bedell.
- Smith missed much of the 2011 season due to an injury forcing Broadnax to play as a true freshman. Burns played special teams in 2011, but did not record an offensive carry.

1,000 YARD STANDARD

- UMass has produced a 1,000 yard rusher in 19 of the last 33 seasons. Despite not having a 1,000-yard rusher in 2009 and 2010, Jonathan Hernandez hit the mark last season. In 2010, UMass almost had a pair of 1,000 yard running backs in Hernandez and John Griffin.
- UMass had 1,000-yard rushers in seven straight seasons from 2002-08 thanks in part to Steve Baylark who did so all four of his years with the program. Marcel Ship is the only other player in program history to hit the 1,000-yard mark four consecutive seasons. Shipp also holds the program record with 2,542 yards during the 1998 I-AA National Championship Season.
- UMass All-American and ESPN commentator Rene Ingoglia was the last running back besides Baylark and Shipp to have back-to-back 1,000 yard seasons.

WALKER, COX LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

- Former Notre Dame wide receiver Deion Walker and former Michigan tailback Mike Cox each joined UMass over the summer as fifth-year transfers. The duo both received their undergraduate degrees in the spring and are now enrolled in grad school at UMass.
- Walker played in 7 career games for the Irish. Cox played in 12 career games for the Wolverines.
- Walker was rated as the seventh-best wide receiver in the country by SuperPrep and the 11th-best wide receiver in the nation by Scout.com coming out of high school. Cox was a four-star prospect from Avon Old Farms in Connecticut.
- Prior to college both players were standouts in other sports as well as the prep level. Walker was a standout basketball player and triple-jumper winning state championships in both. Cox grew up playing hockey as a center and right wing for the Boston Jr. Bruins before focusing on football.

WALKER GROWING INTO PRIMARY ROLE

- Fifth-year senior Deion Walker has started to assert himself on offense in the last four games after posting just one catch for 24 yards against Indiana and not playing in the game at UConn. Walker has 33 catches for 400 yards in the last five games after being inserted into the starting line-up.
- Walker has five of UMass' 15 20+ yard pass plays this season including three against Ohio.
- His 162 receiving yards against Ohio ranks as the 4th most for a wideout in the MAC this season.
- Walker now leads UMass in receiving yards (424) and catches with 34. His 12.5 yard per catch average and 70.7 yards per game average each lead the team.

BLANCHFLOWER A TALENTED TIGHT END

- Coming into the season, Rob Blanchflower was one of the top returning offensive skill position players at tight end. He was one of two players (Tajae Sharpe) to have a catch in every game this season until an injury forced him to miss the Western Michigan game.
- Against Ohio, Blanchflower set a new career-high with 80 receiving yards and tied his career-best with five catches.
- In the Miami and Ohio games, Blanchflower had a combined 10 catches for 130 yards.
- Blanchflower ranks third on the team in terms of catches (17) and yards (186) despite missing the last two games due to injury.

WILLIAMS GAINING ROLE IN OFFENSE

- Alan Williams has been a versatile player his entire career at UMass. Originally joining the Minutemen as a cornerback, Williams moved primarily to running back during the 2011 season. This year, he transitioned to wide receiver in the new spread offense.
- After making just two catches for five yards, the slot receiver posted 10 catches for 73 yards in the Michigan and Miami games.
- Williams had a break-out game against Ohio with 7 catches for 127 yards and a career-high three touchdowns - the most touchdowns by a wide receiver since Jeremy Horne did so against Bryant on Oct. 25, 2008.
- Williams missed the Western Michigan and Bowling Green games due to a coach's decision.

BROADNAX AN ALL-AROUND YARDAGE LEADER

- As UMass' primary kick returner and a back-up tailback, Jordan Broadnax is the Minutemen's leader in all-purpose yards through seven games this season.
- Broadnax was UMass' top returning rusher returning from the 2011 season when he gained 117 yards on 35 carries through seven games played.
- In 2012, Broadnax is averaging 115.9 yards per game. The sophomore has a 22.9 yard average per kick return including a long of 61 yards at Miami.

MICHEL LOOKS TO BE A PLAY MAKER

- One of the top pure athletes on offense, Marken Michel's speed will definitely be an asset to the revamped wide receiving corps. Michel played in all 11 games in 2011 - primarily on special teams - posting 3 catches for 31 yards and a touchdown. During the offseason, Charley Molnar consistently praised Michel as one of the program's top wide receivers entering the season.
- Michel had his best career game against Indiana with five catches for 68 yards. His 56-yard reception to set-up Mike Wegzyn's rushing touchdown marked the longest of his career.
- Michel was the Minutemen's top receiver with 8 catches for 82 yards (10.2 avg.) prior to missing the Michigan, Miami, and Ohio games due to injury.
- Michel returned to the starting line-up at Western Michigan with 3 catches for 31 yards.

OFFENSE SHOWING IMPROVEMENT

- In the four games following the UConn loss, the Minutemen showed continued improvement on the offensive side of the ball.
- At Michigan, UMass' three drives over 40 yards which resulted in two field goals made and one missed.
- At Miami, UMass put together six drives over 40 yards which culminated in two touchdowns, a field goal and one missed field goal. UMass also had a 61-yard drive to the Miami four-yard line which ended in an interception for a touchdown. Four of the six drives went for 50+ yards for an average of just over 4 minutes each.
- Against Ohio, UMass against put together six drives of 40+ yards with all resulting in points - four of those drives were for 70+ yards.
- In the Indiana and UConn games, UMass had two total drives for 40+ yards highlighted by a 75-yard touchdown drive against the Hoosiers.

BEGINNING TO MOVE THE CHAINS

- In the Miami game, UMass picked up 26 first downs and had more first downs than its opponent for the first time this season. The Minutemen repeated that against Ohio with 28 first downs - four more than the Bobcats.
- After amassing just three first downs against UConn, the Minutemen had 14 against Indiana and 15 at Michigan.
- UMass was also strong on third down conversions against Miami going 11-for-19 as well as against Ohio where the Minutemen were 10-for-19.
- The extra possessions against the Red Hawks and Bobcats showed in the total number of plays and the extension of scoring drives. UMass had a season-high 90 plays (50 rush, 40 pass) for 471 yards at Miami. That was 20 more plays than the previous high set against Indiana and Michigan. Against Ohio, UMass had 84 total plays for a season-best 511 yards and a 6.1 yard average per play.

BIG PLAYS EXTENDING THE FIELD

- Part of UMass' ability to extend drives and pick up third down conversions has been an uptick in big plays. UMass has 19 offensive plays over 20 yards for the season with nine of them coming against Ohio.
- The Minutemen had 20 'first down' plays going for 10 or more yards against the Red Hawks which is the most of the season. UMass had 19 such plays against Ohio.
- Of UMass' 20 'first down' plays at Miami, eight came courtesy of Michael Cox who had 10+ rushing yards on those occasions.

LONGER DRIVES RESULTING IN MORE POINTS

- UMass has put together 13 drives this season of 50+ yards including a season-high long drive of 84 yards capped 50-yard touchdown pass from Mike Wegzyn to Alan Williams against Ohio. All but 14 of UMass' offensive points have come from those drives with seven touchdowns and four field goals. The two 50+ drives that didn't yield points resulted in a missed field goal and an interception in the red zone. At Western Michigan, UMass scored a pair of touchdowns with drives under 35 yards set-up by an interception and a punt return.
- Time of possession has also moved more into UMass' favor in three of the last five games with the Minutemen holding a +8:22 advantage over Michigan, a narrow 8 second deficit at Miami, and a 20 second advantage over Ohio. In the first two games of the season, UConn and Indiana held the ball for an average of 9 minutes longer than UMass.

15 MINUTEMEN MAKE DEBUT ON OFFENSE

- In the season-opener at UConn, 13 Minutemen made their collegiate debut on the offensive side of the ball. Both Mike Wegzyn and A.J. Doyle saw their first career action at quarterback, while Michael Boland, John Wallace, Michael Cox and Tajae Sharpe also made their first career starts for UMass.
- Jaime Cassleberry played in his first collegiate game against Ohio, while Matt Sparks played at Michigan.

VETERAN DEFENSE LEADS THE CHARGE

- Despite losing All-American linebacker Tyler Holmes to graduation, the UMass defense returns nearly all of its major contributors in 2012. Fifth-year senior Darren Thellen is the leader of the corps from his free safety position after having a break-out year in 2011. Thellen broke school records for interception return yardage (172) after picking off five passes during the year.
- Joining Thellen in the secondary is an experienced group led by Antoine Tharpe, Christian Birt, and Ed Saint-Vil who all have started games during their careers.

MCINTYRE ANCHORS THE DEFENSE

- Perry McIntyre anchored the linebackers alongside Holmes last season and finished the year on a tear with 52 tackles over the last four games. He finished the 2011 season with 116 total tackles just two shy of Holmes.
- McIntyre leads the defense with 77 total tackles this season highlighted by 14 against Ohio for his third game in double-figures. After posting 12 tackles against Bowling Green, McIntyre now has 4 straight double-digit tackle games and 10-or-more in five of seven games this year.
- In 39 career games, he has 299 total tackles (124 solo), 20 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks.
- Averaging 11.0 tackles per game, McIntyre ranks 2nd in the MAC while his 77 tackles are the third most in the league.

DEFENSIVE LINE STOUT UP FRONT

- Three of UMass' starting defensive linemen return with Chaz Thompson, Brandon Potvin and Kevin Byrne manning the trenches. Notre Dame fifth-year transfer Hafis Williams has made an impact as a starting tackle, while Stanley Andre moved from outside linebacker to defensive end.
- Hafis Williams leads all defensive linemen with 30 tackles this season, while Stanley Andre is second with 27.

WILLIAMS BOLSTERS INTERIOR LINE

- Joining fellow Notre Dame transfer Deion Walker is Hafis Williams who also received his undergraduate degree in the spring and is enrolled in graduate school at UMass. The defensive tackle played in 24 games for the Irish with 19 career tackles.
- Coming out of Elizabeth High School in 2007, Williams was rated the 9th-best player in New Jersey and the 35th-best defensive tackle in the nation.

THELLEN A CAREER LEADER

- From his free safety spot, Darren Thellen is one of the key figures of the UMass defense. The fifth-year senior has played in 40 career games with 35 starts entering the Vanderbilt game.
- Thellen had a career-high and team-best five interceptions in 2011 for a school record 172 return yards. His 128 return yards against Central Connecticut State (10/8/11) stands as the single-game record in UMass history.
- Run support is also one of Thellen's strong suits as he has 204 total tackles at UMass including a career-high 14 set against James Madison (11/19/11) and 11 against Indiana (9/8/12) - 9 of which were solo stops.
- Thellen earned national attention following the UConn game (8/30) as he batted a thrown-away ball back in bounds to Tom Brandt for an interception in the first half. The play was ESPN Sports Center's No. 1 Play of the Day.

ANDRE MAKES MOVE TO END

- A linebacker for his entire career, Stanley Andre makes the move to defensive end for the 2012 season. Depth at the position prompted the defensive coaching staff to make the move with Andre's combination of size, strength and speed making him a good candidate against the run and on the edge.
- In his previous two seasons, the Dorchester, Mass., native played in 12 games with 11 tackles - primarily on special teams.

BRANDT'S A LINEBACKING DUO

- If No. 37 and No. 47 look strikingly similar, there's good reason for it. Tim (47) and Tom (37) are twin brothers from Natick, Mass. At 6-foot-2, the pair are separated by a mere three pounds. Tim played in all 11 games last season with 33 tackles, a forced fumble and 3.5 TFL's. Tom played in 9 games with 9 tackles and one TFL. For his career, Tom has played in 23 games overall. Tom ranks fourth on the team this season in total tackles with 33 including 20 solo.
- Tom Brandt posted his first career interception in the season-opener at UConn (8/30) as part of a highlight play where Darren Thellen batted a thrown-away ball back inbounds during the first half. The play was ESPN Sports Center's No. 1 Play of the Day.
- Tom also had a career-high 8 tackles against Michigan.

MESSIAH MAKES BIG DEBUT

- True freshman Kassin Messiah made a big splash with his collegiate debut at Miami (Ohio) with 10 tackles including a nine-yard sack in the second play of the game for his first collegiate tackle.
- Messiah followed up that performance with a 12 tackle effort the following week against Ohio.
- In just four games, Messiah moved up to 3rd on the team in total tackles with 44.
- With an 11.0 tackle per game average, Messiah is tied for 2nd overall in the MAC alongside UMass linebacker Perry McIntyre. He is the only freshmen listed in the league's top 50 defensive players.

ROOKIES EARN MINUTES IN SECONDARY

- Several key freshmen and redshirt freshmen have made an impact on the defensive secondary after injuries to Christian Birt and Ed Saint-Vil forced a bit of shuffling in the line-up. True freshmen Khary Bailey-Smith and Joe Colton have each stood out in the secondary spots. Bailey-Smith has 17 tackles and an interception on the season, while Colton earned his first career start at strong safety in front of his hometown fans against Indiana at Gillette turning in six tackles including four solo and one TFL.
- Both have played in every game this season with Colton earning starts against Indiana and Ohio.

COLTON PLAYS BIG VS. OHIO

- Playing just 10 minutes away from his hometown of Norwood, Joe Colton had a career game against Ohio in Gillette Stadium. The freshman safety recorded 12 tackles including a team-high 7 solo stops in his second start of the season.

HILLIARD IMPRESSIVE IN OPENER

- Greg Hilliard received high praise in the preseason from the coaching staff and showed why in the season opener at UConn. The sophomore outside linebacker had five tackles including two TFL's and had a forced fumble and recovery in the Red Zone to prevent a UConn score.

THARPE'S ISLAND

- The top returning corner back for 2012 is Antoine Tharpe who has 22 starts in 25 career games. Tharpe started all nine games last season missing two due to injury. The speedy cover corner had a career-high seven pass break-ups for the year including three against Holy Cross in the season-opener.
- In the 2012 season opener against UConn (8/30), Tharpe hauled in his first career interception and had five tackles including one TFL.
- Tharpe has missed the last two games due to injury.

GETTING A PUSH UP FRONT

- UMass had a season-high 8 tackles for loss at Miami including a season-best three sacks. Along with Kassin Messiah's sack during Miami's opening drive, Kevin Byrne had one solo sack, while Stanley Andre and Chaz Thompson teamed up for a sack as well.
- All told, UMass has seven sacks this year and 35 tackles for loss.

DEFENSE FORCING TURNOVERS

- UMass has forced a turnover in six of seven games this season with 7 interceptions and one fumble recovery. The Minutemen had more take-aways than UConn and Indiana, however, gave the ball away more against Michigan, Miami, Ohio, Western Michigan, and Bowling Green.
- With seven interceptions this season, UMass is tied for 45th in the NCAA.
- At UConn, the Minutemen had two interceptions and one fumble recovery.
- Against Michigan, UMass had an interception returned for a 32-yard touchdown by Christian Birt but threw an interception and gave up a fumble recovery on a muffed punt reception.
- At Miami, UMass threw a season-high three interceptions after throwing just one in the previous three games. The defense did pick off a pass in the game to push the turnovers forced streak to four games.
- Ohio marked the first time in 2012 that UMass was unable to force a turnover in a game.
- Of the seven interceptions made this season, only Darren Thellen has multiple picks (Indiana, Western Michigan). The other five have come from Tom Brandt (UConn), Antoine Tharpe (UConn), Christian Birt (Michigan), Mike Lee (Miami), and Khary Bailey-Smith (Bowling Green).

MOLNAR QUOTES FROM WEEKLY MAC MEDIA TELECONFERENCE

On the performance of the team in its most recent contest, a 24-0 loss to Bowling Green:
Our defense really performed very well. In the first half it was 7-0 ball game and even in second half we did a great job of holding Bowling Green out of the endzone for quite a while. Offensively, we just couldn't get anything going and it took the wind out of the defense's sails when they would have a great series, come off the field and the offense just couldn't create any momentum for our football team. I think that really hurt us.

On the play of the defense specifically against Bowling Green:

"That is by far the best we have performed, especially against the run, this year. Our team just seemed to be coming together defensive on the afternoon and I was pleased with the way they played, the enthusiasm they had and their pursuit of the ball. I think the biggest thing was that we eliminated so many of the mental errors that plague young football teams or teams that are starting off with a new coaching staff. It seemed like we were able to move over that hump, so hopefully we can maintain that as we move forward."

On the opportunity to play Vanderbilt on the road this coming weekend:

"Any time you go out-of-conference you are carrying the banner for the MAC and we know we will have a lot of eyes on us with just the fact that we are playing an SEC team that beat Auburn last week is enough to get everybody excited. I know our guys are ready to play football, even after the game [against Bowling Green] I could tell our guys were disappointed but not discouraged. The morale was good - no one likes to lose and we certainly didn't taking losing easy but I think our guys will come back, practice hard and be ready to play."

On the status of freshman TE Derek Beck:

"He is out today [Monday] and is going to go through some further examinations through the next 24 hours and then we will get the lay of the land with him but hopefully he will only be out until midweek. I don't know if that will be the case or not."

On measuring the status of the program 2/3rds of the way through the season:

"I am looking at every game as an opportunity to win. Every game is a teaching moment to teach our guys how to do everything right during the course of the week - how to use their time effectively at practice and off the field. Whenever you play in a bigger venue with a louder crowd that is against you, what you are really doing is preparing your team for the big games you will play as you venture forward. Playing at Vanderbilt is a different kind of pressure, but never-the-less it's an intense setting that will help our guys as they go forward and as we start playing bigger and more meaningful games in the Mid-American Conference where we are competing for an Eastern Division Championship."

SPECIAL TEAMS KEY

- Jeff Strait was key in the season-opener at UConn with a career-high nine punts for 378 yards (42.0 average).
- Colter Johnson took over the punting duties against Indiana turning in a 44.1 yard average including 3 over 50 yards. At Michigan, he had six punts for a 38.5 yard average including a 53 yard kick. With good hang time, three of his six punts were fair caught.
- Miami saw the punt coverage team do its least amount of work for the season as UMass punted just once in the game.
- The Bowling Green game saw Johnson's best performance of the year with 10 kicks for 478 yards (47.8 yard avg) highlighted by a season-long 66 yard drive.
- Through seven games, Johnson ranks 3rd in punting average (43.3 yards).
- Brendon Levengood has handled the kick-off duties for the second straight season. At Michigan he also handled duties as place kicker where he was 2-for-3 including a long of 32 yards. His only miss was on a 45 yard kick in the fourth quarter which had plenty of distance, but was just wide left.
- Blake Lucas handled field goals against Ohio going 2-for-2 with a long of 30 yards, while Levengood handled kick-offs and extra point attempts.

ROOKIE DUO LEADERS ON COVERAGE

- Freshmen John Robinson and Joe Colton are tied for the team lead in special teams' tackles this season with five each. The pair has 10 of UMass' 36 tackles on kick and punt coverage. Robinson has 3 tackles on kick-offs and 2 tackles on punt coverage, while Colton has 4 of his 5 stops on punt coverage.
- Tom Brandt is third on the team with four tackles - all coming on kick-off coverage.

KICK RETURN AMONG BEST IN MAC

- With a 22.2 yard average on kick returns, UMass ranks 5th among all MAC teams. UMass has 32 kickoff returns for 711 yards - all but one by Jordan Broadnax. The 711 yards is the most in the MAC, while Broadnax's 61 yard return at Miami is the league's 5th-longest return of the season.

FRESHMEN MAKING AN IMPACT

- In 2012, UMass has played a total of 28 true or redshirt freshmen. Of those, 21 are true freshmen including starters Michael Boland (OL), Joe Colton (FS), and Tajae Sharpe (WR). All told, UMass has started eight true or redshirt freshmen this season.

MICHIGAN CROWD A NEW RECORD

- The crowd of 110,708 fans at the Michigan established a new program record as the largest attendance to witness a UMass sporting event. The previous mark was 110,187 also set at Michigan back in 2010.
- The Michigan attendance also became the third most to see a MAC game. In 2005, 110,971 fans at the Big House saw Michigan face Northern Illinois for the league record. In the MAC top 10 for single-game road attendance, Michigan is the opponent for every one.

CHARLEY MOLNAR RADIO SHOW

- The Bud Light UMass Football Coach's Show With Charley Molnar airs live on Thursday night's from the Hangar Pub & Grill on University Drive in Amherst. Each Thursday night, Coach Molnar joins Voice of the Minutemen Josh Maurer along with player guests to give insight into the program and take a look at the week's upcoming opponent. The show airs on 105.5 FM WVEI in Springfield and 1440 AM WVEI in Worcester from 7-8 PM.

- One of Charley Molnar's core tenants as a football coach is to engage his players with the community through service projects. In his time at UMass, Molnar, his staff and members of the team have volunteered and helped at events throughout Western Mass.
- Over the summer, members of the football team volunteered at the Boys & Girls Club each week in Holyoke, Mass. The players served as mentors at the Club and engaged the children in activities.
- Players also helped with Habitat For Humanity, were representatives at the Special Olympics torch lighting ceremony, visited local schools and helped work the Relay For Life.

CARTER DONATES BONE MARROW

- One of the most notable and selfless acts came from redshirt junior Ryan Carter during the offseason. Carter found out he was a match for a bone marrow transplant after being tested during the Minutemen's Bone Marrow Registration Drive last fall.
- Carter underwent surgery in February at Mass General Hospital in Boston. His bone marrow was transplanted to a five-year old boy who he has never met.

THEY'RE IN THE GAME

One of the highlights of the transition to the FBS level for UMass fans was the inclusion of the Minutemen in EA Sports' NCAA Football '13 which hit stores this past summer. Several years ago, EA Sports phased out the inclusion of FCS teams leaving UMass off the small screen. Fans would create and share customized rosters, however, and create teams based on UMass' attributes to get around the Minutemen's previous exclusion from the game.

SCHOLARSHIP VIDEO GOES VIRAL

• While UMass head coach Charley Molnar is best known for his creativity in drawing up offensive schemes, it may have been his presentation of a pair of scholarships during preseason camp which is drawing the most national attention currently. In a video posted during the bye week, Molnar surprises Dan Maynes and Rob O'Connor with full scholarships during a team meeting. The catch to the video is that he has a pair of Amherst Police officers 'serve' the papers during a team meeting. Since being posted to the internet, the video has over 77,000 views and has been picked up by CNN, Good Morning America, USA Today, The Today Show, ESPN, CBS Sports Network, and more. Fans have tweeted and shared the video via Facebook calling it one of the feel good stories of the year.

STADIUM UPGRADES AT MCGUIRK

• As part of the transition plan to the FBS, McGuirk Stadium in Amherst will be receiving several upgrades over the next two years. With groundbreaking anticipated in February, the two main projects include a new Field House for the program which will house offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, a theatre, athletic training facilities, video facilities and strength & conditioning facilities. This will mark the first time in the modern era that all support services for the program will be housed in one complex. Additionally, a new press box will be built. McGuirk Stadium was opened in 1965 and seats 17,000 fans. The newest renovations to the stadium include a FieldTurf surface which was installed in 2006 and permanent lighting in 2008.

VETERAN COACHING STAFF

• Charley Molnar has assembled a veteran coaching staff with experience at the highest levels of football. The staff is comprised of coaches who have spent years at Bowl Championship Series (BCS) schools as well as time in the National Football League and the United Football League. The experienced staff has found success at every level of the college game and in the professional ranks as the Minutemen begin a new era of football in Amherst.

• "I think the staff we have assembled has the knowledge, experience, and teaching tools to make us a successful program in all phases of the game," said Molnar. "This is a highly motivated group of professionals who know how to gain success not just in football, but in daily life. Their experiences as coaches and players will serve as the foundation for what we want to build here - championship caliber football played by championship caliber young men."

AD CAMPAIGN IN FULL BLITZ

• One of the challenges in playing at Gillette Stadium is attracting a new fan base to fill the sizable facility. UMass enlisted the Gold Group advertising firm to assist in the promotion of the program and the move to the new venue. Along with radio and television exposure, billboards in both Eastern and Western Mass were acquired and a number of MBTA buses sport UMass Football advertising in Boston. Both traditional and grass roots efforts are in the works for the balance of the season to reach over 100,000 UMass alumni in the Boston/Eastern Massachusetts area.

MAC PRESEASON POLL

First Year at UMass

First Year as Head Coach

As the UMass football team prepares to embark on its biggest transition in program history, Charley Molnar will draw upon 28 years of experience to lead

the Minutemen into the Football Bowl Subdivision and the Mid-American Conference. Molnar was officially named the 29th head coach of the UMass football program on Thursday, December 8, 2011 at the new home of the Minutemen - Gillette Stadium.

A veteran offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Molnar developed prolific offensive attacks at Notre Dame, Cincinnati, and Central Michigan. In his time at those schools, the Morristown, N.J., native helped them to a 59-20 record and seven straight bowl games including Cincinnati's historic 2009 season where the Bearcats won the Big East Conference Championship, played Florida in the Sugar Bowl and finished 3rd in the BCS rankings.

"I am extremely pleased that Charley will lead the University of Massachusetts into this new era as our head football coach," said Director of Athletics John McCutcheon. "His background, energy, commitment to student-athletes and desire to be part of a growing program clearly makes him the right man for this endeavor."

Molnar joins the Minutemen after two seasons with Notre Dame as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. In his time with the Fighting Irish, the Morristown, N.J., native helped the program to an 8-4 record in 2011 and an appearance in the Champs Sports Bowl along with an 8-5 record in 2010 and an appearance in the Sun Bowl.

"This is an opportunity I worked for my whole career and there is no limit to my excitement that guiding the UMass football program brings me," said Molnar. "I have a vision for this program into the future and we are going to do nothing but great things at the University of Massachusetts."

"UMass Amherst has a proud, 130-year tradition in college football, and the hiring of Charley Molnar represents the true start of a new era. Charley is a proven and respected leader. He will ensure that our student-athletes excel both on and off the field as the Minutemen begin play at the FBS level of competition," said former UMass Chancellor Robert C. Holub.

"Coach Molnar has a track record of winning and has the history of being associated with programs that won, that have shaped the lives of student-athletes, and that were first-class making their universities, their students, faculty, friends and alumni proud," said University President Robert L. Caret.

The 2012 season will be Molnar's 29th overall including 11 seasons as an offensive coordinator and 17 seasons coaching quarterbacks.

Prior to his time at Notre Dame, Molnar was an integral piece of Cincinnati's rise capped by a Big East Championship, Sugar Bowl Appearance and top-five final ranking in the BCS standings in 2009.

Molnar also has extensive experience with the Mid-American Conference after working at Central Michigan, Western Michigan, Kent State, and Eastern Michigan.

For the six seasons prior to joining UMass, Molnar worked alongside current Notre Dame head coach Brian Kelly.

"Charley was a part of my offensive staff the last six years and a key figure in the success we had at Central Michigan, Cincinnati and Notre Dame. Charley's familiarity with the Mid-American Conference and strong recruiting connections on the East Coast will truly benefit him at UMass," said Kelly.

For the second straight year, Molnar helped the Irish earn a bowl game bid in 2011 thanks in part to the play of quarterback Tommy Rees. Rees threw for over 2,700 yards that season with 19 touchdowns, averaging 225.7 yards per game. As a unit, the Irish averaged 424.1 yards per game on offense thanks in part to Rees and 1,000-yard rusher Cierre Wood. Alongside Wood, Jonas Gray netted nearly 800 yards rushing and 12 touchdowns on the ground.

Highlighting the 2011 season for the Irish were wins over Michigan State, Pittsburgh, Purdue, and Air Force.

In 2010, his first year with the Irish, Molnar helped install a new offensive system and developed both Dayne Crist and Rees as first-time starting quarterbacks. Crist started the first nine games and passed for 2,033 yards with 15 touchdowns before injuring a knee in the first quarter of the ninth game. Rees played the rest of the ninth game after Crist was injured and completed 33 of 54 passes for 334 yards with four touchdowns. He started the final four games and led the Irish to wins over No. 15 Utah, Army, at USC and Miami (Fla.) in the Hyundai Sun Bowl.

Under Molnar's tutelage, Rees set Notre Dame freshman records in touchdown passes (12) and completion percentage (61.0). He also ranked in the top five among freshman Irish quarterbacks in completions (third, 100), yards (second, 1,106) and passing efficiency (second, 132.70).

From 2006-09, Molnar coached alongside current Irish head football coach Brian Kelly at Cincinnati and Central Michigan and helped develop record-breaking quarterbacks and wide receivers. With the Bearcats, Molnar was passing game coordinator and coached the wide receivers from 2007-09. He oversaw the two most prolific passing seasons in Cincinnati history and mentored a pair of record-setting receivers.

Wideouts Mardy Gilyard and Dominick Goodman flourished with Molnar as their coach. Goodman played for Molnar from 2007-08 and initially set Cincinnati career records with 2,512 receiving yards and 22 receiving touchdowns. Goodman also tied the previous school record with 204 career catches.

Gilyard received Molnar's tutelage from 2007-09 and broke Goodman's career records by recording 3,053 receiving yards and 25 TD catches. Fittingly, Gilyard also finished his Bearcat career with 204 receptions, tying the school record.

In 2009, Molnar's passing attack averaged 308.77 yards per game to rank eighth in the nation and the 4,014 passing yards set the Cincinnati single-season record. The Bearcats ranked fourth in the country in passing efficiency (161.21), thanks, in part, to a school record 39 TD passes. Cincinnati's high-octane offense averaged 447.5 total yards per game (11th in the nation) and tallied the fifth-most points in the Football Bowl Subdivision at 38.6 per game.

With Molnar's guidance, Gilyard became just the second Cincinnati player ever to be named an All-American by the American Football Coaches Association. He caught a school-record 87 passes for 1,191 yards with 11 TDs and ranked in the top 20 nationally in receptions and receiving yards per game. Gilyard was named first-team all-BIG EAST for the second year in a row and became the Bearcats' first player with multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons.

Armon Binns developed into a solid complementary receiver opposite Gilyard in 2009. Entering the season, Binns had registered two career receptions for 19 yards and zero TDs, but Binns became a second-team all-BIG EAST performer under Molnar after totaling 61 receptions for 888 yards and 11 TDs.

Gilyard and Goodman both experienced career seasons in 2008 as Gilyard set the Cincinnati record with 1,276 receiving yards and Goodman totaled 1,028 yards receiving. The duo became the first Bearcats players to eclipse 1,000 receiving yards together in the same season since 1968 when Jim O'Brien and Tom Rossley accomplished the feat.

Gilyard caught 81 passes and 11 TDs in his breakthrough season and ranked eighth in the nation in total receiving yards, en route to being named first-team all-BIG EAST. Goodman recorded 84 receptions (a school record, at the time) and seven TDs.

In 2007, Molnar's aerial attack proved a harbinger of things to come for Bearcats fans as Cincinnati passed for 3,720 yards and 36 TDs - both school records, at the time. The Bearcats ranked eighth in the country in passing efficiency (149.38) and averaged 286.2 passing yards per game to rank 20th nationally. Marcus Bennett was selected second-team all-BIG EAST after tallying a school-record 13 TD receptions.

Prior to Cincinnati, Molnar joined Kelly's Central Michigan staff in 2006 when he helped the Chippewas win 10 games for the first time since 1979. Central Michigan won its Mid-American Conference division, the MAC championship and was victorious in the Motor City Bowl. The Chippewas' offense ranked first in the MAC in scoring and second in passing.

Molnar coached the quarterbacks and wide receivers at Central Michigan and developed the most prolific freshman quarterback and wide receiver duo in the nation in 2006. Dan LeFevour was named MAC

Freshman of the Year and was selected first-team all-MAC after he led the conference in passing TDs, passing yards, passing efficiency, completion percentage, total completions and total yards. Under Molnar's tutelage, LeFevour completed 247 of 388 pass attempts for 3,031 yards with 26 TDs. He also rushed 132 times for 521 yards and seven TDs and ranked 13th nationally in total offense (253.7 yards per game). LeFevour set school records for passing yards and TD passes, and his 3,552 total yards also were a Central Michigan record. He finished his rookie campaign ranked 19th nationally in passing efficiency.

On the receiving end of many LeFevour passes was freshman wide receiver Bryan Anderson who snagged a school-record 73 passes for 877 yards and five TDs. Anderson also was named first-team all-MAC and was selected a first-team freshman All-American.

Molnar completed a rare coaching feat at the conclusion of the 2006 season. Not only was he on the sidelines for 15 contests, including the 2006 MAC Championship Game, 2006 Motor City Bowl and 2007 International Bowl, but he coached the MVP in all three postseason games.

Molnar directed another record-setting quarterback during his only season at Indiana State in 2005. As the associate head coach and offensive coordinator of the Sycamores, Molnar's offense broke six school passing records (including passing yards, completion percentage and TD passes) and two of his players combined to break 11 single-season or single-game school marks. Quarterback Blayne Baggett completed 284 of 473 passes for 2,741 yards, all school records. Baggett's 284 completions also were a Gateway Conference single-season record. Wide receiver Sam Logan was the primary beneficiary, as his 77 receptions were a Sycamore record and his 849 receiving yards ranked second in school history. Logan was honored

after the season as a first-team all-Gateway Conference performer.

Molnar coached quarterbacks from 2003-04 at Western Michigan and was forced to develop multiple signal-callers each season. In 2004, Molnar helped three quarterbacks combine to pass for 2,913 yards (264.8 yards per game) with 23 passing TDs. He also had to prepare three Bronco quarterbacks in 2003 as he guided them to the eighth-ranked passing attack in the nation with 3,701 passing yards (308.4 yards per game) and 31 TDs. Chad Munson passed for 2,123 yards with 18 TD passes in 2003, while Jon Drach completed 67.0 percent of his passes for 1,499 yards and 13 TDs.

A one-year stop at Eastern Michigan in 2002 as quarterbacks coach followed a one-year stint as wide receivers coach at Eastern Illinois in 2001.

From 1990-2000, Molnar spent time as offensive coordinator as well as working with quarterbacks and wide receivers at two universities. He worked for seven seasons from 1994-2000 at Kent State after he worked in the same position at Illinois State from 1990-93.

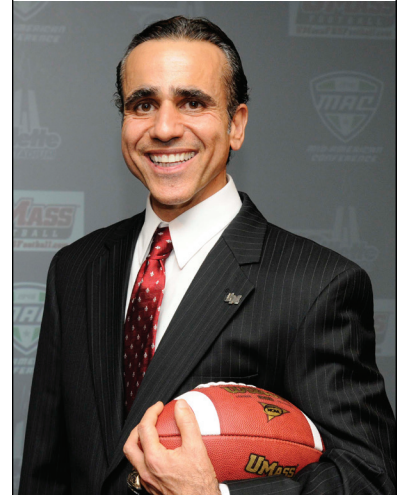
Prior to Illinois State, Molnar called the offensive plays and coached quarterbacks at Western Carolina in 1989. He made his first foray into major college football as a graduate assistant in 1987-88 at Virginia. With the Cavaliers, he assisted the quarterbacks coach.

Molnar's first coaching job came at his alma mater, Lock Haven University. From 1984-86 he worked with the wide receivers, tight ends, running backs and kickers.

A 1984 graduate of Lock Haven, Molnar earned his bachelor's degree in political science. He was born July 23, 1961, and he and his wife, Meg, have eight children: Charley III, Gillian, Tate, Bryce, Mitch, Gemma, Gianna and Dominic.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - Despite forcing three turnovers on defense, the UMass football team was unable to capitalize, falling 37-0 on Thursday night at Connecticut in the Minutemen's FBS era debut. Antoine Tharpe and Tom Brandt each had interceptions, while Greg Hilliard had a fumble recovery. The game was the first meeting between the two former Yankee Conference/Atlantic 10 rivals since the 1999 season - the last for UConn before moving to the FBS ranks.

The Minutemen fall to 0-1 on the season, while the Huskies start the season with a 1-0 record. UMass will host its first-ever FBS home game on Saturday, Sept. 8 as Indiana visits Gillette Stadium.

UConn's Chandler Whitmer threw for 219 yards going 15-for-25, while Lyle McCombs ran for 82 yards and a touchdown. Dwayne Gratz had a key interception return for a touchdown prior to halftime, while Taylor Mack blocked a UMass punt that was recovered for a touchdown in late in the third quarter.

Jeremy Davis paced the Huskies' receiving corps with five catches for 79 yards. UConn finished the night with 372 total yards to UMass' 59.

In his collegiate debut for the Minutemen, Mike Wegzyn was 9-for-22 for 56 yards, freshman A.J. Doyle also saw action, entering the game with 8:24 remaining. Redshirt junior Rob Blanchflower made two catches for 17 yards, while freshman Tajae Sharpe had one catch for 15 yards. Chris Burns carried the ball 11 times for a total of 17 yards.

Mike Wegzyn scored UMass' first-ever FBS touchdown on a 16-yard scamper in the first quarter against Indiana. The play was set-up by a 56-yard pass from Wegzyn to Marken Michel to start the drive.

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. - Indiana put together consecutive 75-yard scoring drives in the second quarter to pull away from UMass en route to a 45-6 win in the Minutemen's inaugural FBS home game at Gillette Stadium.

The UMass offense showed improvement from last week's setback at UConn, totaling 264 yards of offense. Quarterbacks Mike Wegzyn and A.J. Doyle combined to throw for 186 yards on 21-of-34 passing. Wegzyn finished with 151 yards on 18-of-26.

The defense recorded an interception for the second-consecutive game when Derren Thellen picked-off Tre Roberson midway through the first quarter. Thellen finished with a game-high 11 stops. Perry McIntyre added nine tackles and Tom Brandt led a group of players with six each.

Indiana finished with 606 total yards and 321 on the ground. Roberson rushed for a game-high 105 yards on four carries and threw for 98 yards on 6-of-11 with a touchdown before leaving the game in the second quarter with a left leg injury.

Indiana got on the board on its second possession when Roberson scored on a 50-yard draw play up the middle.

UMass responded with a 3-play, 75-yard drive that was highlighted by Wegzyn's 56-yard pass to Marken Michel and put the Minutemen in the IU red zone. Two plays later Wegzyn rushed for 16 yards out for his first career touchdown.

The Hoosiers answered with score on their next two possessions. A Roberson 39-yard run followed by a 5-yard pass to Shane Wynn.

UMass got a shot of momentum when Thellen intercepted Roberson but the drive stalled at the Hoosier 24 when the Minutemen's first fourth-down attempt of the year came up inches short.

Mitch Ewald capped off a 12-play, 75-yard drive with a 19-yard field goal to extend the IU advantage to 24-6 with 12:36 in the second quarter. The play came after Roberson was hit hard on a rush that saw him leave the game in an ambulance with a left leg injury.

With 8:13 to play in the opening half, IU's Stephen Houston gave the visitors a 31-6 lead on a 2-yard TD rush. The Hoosiers added seven more on Isaiah Roundtree's 2-yard scamper with 2:15 left as they claimed a 38-6 halftime lead.

Alan Williams tallied a career performance against Ohio, providing a single-game personal-best 127 receiving yards and three touchdown receptions on seven total catches, including a 50-yard completion from QB Mike Wegzyn.

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. - Mike Wegzyn threw four touchdowns and completed 27 passes for 373 yards as UMass nearly upset league-leader Ohio, falling 37-34 at Gillette Stadium Saturday.

UMass (0-5, 0-2 Mid-American Conference) outgained its opponent for the second-consecutive week, amassing 511 yards of total offense on 84 plays. Wegzyn completed passes to six different receivers, including three touchdown strikes to Alan Williams and another to Deion Walker.

Walker hauled in a game-high 11 catches for 162 yards, while Williams finished with seven for 127 yards. With receivers Walker (162) and Williams (127) over 100 yards against the Bobcats it marked UMass' first game of two players amassing 100 or more receiving yards since Oct. 23, 2010 at Gillette Stadium in the Colonial Clash (Anthony Nelson [190] and Julian Talley [111]) vs. New Hampshire. Michael Cox rushed for 80 yards on 22 carries to lead the Minuteman ground game.

Ohio (5-0, 1-0) got 269 yards and two touchdowns on the ground from Beau Blankenship, including the eventual game-winner on a 40-yard rush with just over six minutes to play that put the Bobcats ahead 37-27. Tyler Tettleton, who started for Ohio after missing the last game with an injury, went 15-for-27 with two touchdowns and 229 yards.

UMass was able to hold Ohio twice in the final few minutes and score to cut the deficit to three before stalling near midfield in the final minute.

KALAMAZOO, Mich. - A set of rushing touchdowns from Michael Cox and Jordan Broadnax highlighted a 52-14 UMass football defeat at Western Michigan's Waldo Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Western Michigan recorded the first four scores of the contest to secure a 28-0 lead heading to the end of the second quarter. However, the Minutemen gained some momentum going into half-time when Deion Walker appeared to score on a 15-yard touchdown reception, however, the play was reviewed and his knee was called down at the half-yard line. Two plays later, Mike Cox scored on a sweep to the right as he once again dove over the top of two Bronco defenders for the score.

Western Michigan quarterback Tyler Van Tubbergen put the contest out of reach during the third quarter, using two passing scores and a rushing touchdown to extend the Western Michigan advantage to 49-7 entering the fourth stanza. Van Tubbergen found Scriven from three years out to push the lead to 35-7 with 11:57 left in the quarter. Van Tubbergen added an 18-yard toss to Jaime Wilson on the following drive at the 9:22 mark before diving in from 1-yard out with 38 seconds left in the third to go up 49-7.

After WMU kicker Andrew Haldeman notched a 30-yard field goal with 8:33 left in the fourth, Broadnax secured his first collegiate touchdown. On second-and-five, Broadnax took the handoff from 10 yards out and fought his way into the endzone to reach the final score, 52-14.
