**DOGS-DORES SET TO SQUARE OFF**

The Georgia Bulldogs and the Vanderbilt Commodores – **two of 11 SEC teams ranked in the top-100 of Monday's NCAA RPI** – will face off on Tuesday evening in a 9 p.m. match-up on ESPNU.

**The Bulldogs enter the week at No. 42 in the RPI while playing the nation's No. 17 strength of schedule.** The Commodores are No. 78 in the RPI, with the No. 8 strength of schedule. UGA and VU are two of six SEC teams that currently sport top-20 SOS rankings by the NCAA.

**Georgia dropped to 11-6 overall and 3-2 in the SEC with an overtime loss at RPI No. 3 Florida last Saturday. The Bulldogs led for 35:11 of the game's 45 minutes before falling just short of their third straight SEC road win.**

**Yante Maten currently leads Georgia in scoring (19.6 ppg), rebounding (8.3 rpg) and field goal percentage (.550). He is second in the SEC in scoring and shooting percentage and third in rebounding. Nationally, Maten entered the week ranked No. 49 in ppg, No. 81 in rpg and No. 50 in FG pct.**

**J.J. Frazier is contributing 16.6 ppg (No. 7 in the SEC). His is averaging an SEC-best 2.2 steals (No. 22 nationally) and 4.2 assists, which ranked sixth in the SEC. Frazier also is No. 3 in the SEC and No. 20 nationally in free throw percentage (.899).**

Maten, a junior forward, and Frazier, a senior guard, are one of the nation's most potent inside-outside offensive tandems. **Their combined average of 36.2 ppg ranks No. 6 nationally among guard-forward scoring duos with both players ranked among the nation's top-250 scorers.**

**Frazier has stepped up his scoring in league play and is averaging a team-high 20.2 ppg, while Maten is averaging 19.2 ppg. They rank No. 2 and No. 3 in the SEC, respectively, in stats for conference games only.**

**Vanderbilt is 8-9 overall. The Dores are 2-3 in the SEC, winning their first two league games before dropping their last three.**

**Matthew Fisher-Davis headlines a quartet of double-digit scorers for Vanderbilt at 16.7 ppg.** In addition, Luke Kornet adds 13.2 ppg, Jeff Roberson chips in 10.4 ppg and Riley LaChance contributes 10.1 ppg.

**SERIES HISTORY WITH VANDY**

**The Commodores currently possess a 91-50 lead in the all-time series between Georgia and Vanderbilt; however, Bulldogs own a 34-28 advantage in games played in Athens.**

Last season on Feb. 20 in Nashville, Georgia dropped an 80-67 decision to Vanderbilt.

J.J. Frazier led UGA with 21 points, his eighth 20-point game of the season. Yante Maten added a double-double of 19 points and 10 rebounds, and Derek Ogbeide totaled a what was then a career-high 11 points.

Vanderbilt jumped out to a 10-2 lead just 4:54 into the game, and the Bulldogs spent the rest of the day playing uphill.

Early in the second half, Frazier dropped six quick points cutting Vanderbilt's lead to seven. A pair of Charles Mann free throws cut the margin to four midway through the period, but Vanderbilt responded with a 7-0 run to regain control.

In the most recent meeting in Athens on Jan. 27, 2015, a balanced offensive effort led Georgia in a 70-62 victory. Nemi Djuricic led the Bulldogs with 15 points, followed by Marcus Thornton with 14, Kenny Gaines with 13 and Frazier with 12.

Georgia used hot shooting from 3-point range (7-of-12) to grab a 31-27 halftime advantage. Vanderbilt started the second half strong, connecting on its first four shots from the floor to go up 36-35.

The Bulldogs responded in a big way, busting open a 20-5 run over the next 10 minutes to stake a 55-41 lead with 7:27 remaining.

The Commodores pulled within five points on four separate occasions in the next six minutes but got no closer. Late free throw shooting was key for Georgia. The Bulldogs knocked down 9-of-10 attempts at the line in the final 1:30.

**LAST TIME OUT**

Georgia fell 80-76 to No. 23 Florida in a back-and-forth game that spilled into overtime Saturday at the Exactech Arena in Gainesville.

The Bulldogs led for the majority of regulation and 35:11 of the game's 45 minutes overall but could not pull off the upset.

J.J. Frazier led Georgia in scoring with 25 points to go along with a team-best five assists and four steals. Juwan Parker chipped in a career-high 17 points and seven rebounds. Yante Maten contributed 15 points but fouled out after playing a season-low 19 minutes.

With just less than five minutes left in regulation, Frazier intercepted a Gator pass and converted it into a breakaway layup to give Georgia a five-point advantage at 64-59. The Gators tied it up at 65-65 moments later.

Jordan Harris made a left-handed hook to push the Bulldogs in front again 67-65 with 1:09 left. Florida's Kasey Hill went to the line with 24 seconds remaining and made one of two, but the Gators grabbed the offensive rebound. In the closing seconds, Hill again drew a foul and made only one free throw, tying the game and sending it into overtime.

Florida took the early advantage in OT with two free throws, but Georgia Frazier responded with a 3-pointer to take the lead at 70-69. The lead would be the last for the Bulldogs as they were unable to gain the upper hand down the stretch.

**A CHALLENGING SEC SLATE**

Georgia's league schedule will no doubt be among the SEC's most challenging. The conference's unbalanced slate has teams facing five schools on a home-and-home basis.

Each member of the Bulldogs' quintet was in the top-100 of the Jan. 15 edition of the NCAA ratings percentage index (more commonly known as the RPI). The includes two teams in the top-5 – No. 3 Florida and No. 7 Kentucky – as well as No. 26 South Carolina, No. 75 Alabama and No. 84 Auburn.

**BULLDOGS AMONG BEST BOARDERS**

Georgia ranks No. 3 in the SEC and No. 36 nationally in rebound margin, out-boarding opponents by an average of +6.1.

Georgia also ranks No. 3 in the league in rebound margin in SEC games at +7.8.

The Bulldogs have won the rebound count in 14 of 17 games...and two of the times they didn't was by a single rebound.

The Bulldogs have been particularly solid cleaning defensive glass. Georgia ranks No. 2 in the SEC in defensive rebound percentage, both overall (.741) and in league games (.762). Three Bulldogs are ranked among the SEC's top-10 defensive rebounders – No. 4 Yante Maten at 5.1, No. 6 Derek Ogbeide at 4.8 and No. 8 Juwan Parker at 4.7.

**DOGS GETTING DEFENSIVE...AGAIN**

A year ago, Georgia was one of – if not *the* – best defensive teams in the SEC. The Bulldogs led the SEC in field goal percentage defense in conference play, holding opponents to .385 shooting from the field.

Georgia is currently No. 2 among league leaders in FG defense in SEC games. The Bulldogs have held their opponents to a .385 clip.

Last season, Georgia was one of only two teams – along with Kentucky – to hold its SEC foes under 40 percent shooting. This season, the Bulldogs again are one two teams – along with South Carolina – doing so.

**DOGS AMONG TOP SCORING DUOS**

J.J. Frazier and Yante Maten are one of the nation's top guard-forward scoring combinations. Entering this week, that Bulldog duo was the sixth-best inside-outside scoring combination in the nation – and the only one from a Power 5 conference – among teams with two scorers in the top-250 nationally as outlined below.

**PARKER BACK, PRODUCTION UP**

Juwan Parker has enjoyed a successful return to action after missing the last season and a half with the Achilles injury.

**Parker has started all but one game – missing the Morehouse to rest his Achilles due to soreness – and is third on the team in scoring (9.4 ppg) and rebounding (6.0 rpg) and second in assists (2.4 apg).**

Those are considerably higher than his career averages entering this year of 4.9 ppg, 3.7 rpg and 0.9 apg.

He also has established new career highs for points (17 vs. Florida), boards (11 vs. G. Washington), assists (five vs. G. Washington) and minutes (40 vs. Florida).

The Final Exams break seemed to be good for Parker.

In his first 58 games at UGA from his freshman year through a Dec. 4 matchup with Marquette, Parker reached double figures in the scoring column just once.

In nine games since the Bulldogs returned to competition after Finals, Parker has produced seven double-digit scoring outputs, including each of Georgia's last six games. He is averaging 12.7 ppg in SEC play.

Parker started the first 14 games for the Bulldogs' 2015 NCAA Tournament team before suffering the injury. He played limited minutes in four contests that season but was out all of last year after surgery in the summer of 2015.

**UGA's MOST...SEC...SUCCESS...EVER**

Georgia has been winning within the SEC at the Bulldogs' best rate ever.

Over the past four seasons, UGA has:

- **Posted its most SEC wins over two- (23), three- (33) and four-season (42) spans.**
- **Recorded four straight .500 or better league records – the first time in 84 seasons of SEC play UGA has done so;**
- **Notched three-straight double-figure SEC win totals – another UGA first;**

**GEORGIA MAKING THE GRADE**

In addition to its success on the court, Georgia has been stellar in the classroom under Mark Fox. **All told, 27 Bulldogs have graduated from UGA since Fox arrived in 2009.**

That tally features two current Bulldogs (Houston Kessler and Juwan Parker), 21 more of Fox's players and four former Bulldog—including former NBA players Jarvis Hayes and Damien Wilkins and 2004 SEC Defensive Player of the Year Rashad Wright.

Parker (pictured above with Fox) earned his degree in Management just two and a half years after he arrived in Athens and is pursuing a master's degree in Sport Management.

Georgia's academic improvements and successes under Fox are evident in the two primary tracking systems of the NCAA – the Academic Performance Rate (APR) and Graduation Success Rate (GSR) as outlined below.

Georgia finished 10-8 in SEC action last season. That followed a 11-7 mark when the Bulldogs tied for third in the SEC in 2014-15, a 12-6 record and tied for second in 2013-14 and a 9-9 effort during 2012-13.

## STEGEMAN CONTINUES EVOLVING

Stegeman Coliseum, which was christened in 1963 and will be home of Georgia Basketball for the 54th full season in 2016-17, has undergone sweeping renovations in the past two-plus decades.

The first major upgrade came prior to the 1995 season and transformed the seating configuration to its current bowl-shaped layout. That work came in advance of the Coliseum hosting rhythmic gymnastics and volleyball competition during the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games.

More updates, including a new video board and sound system, were installed in time for the 2006-07 season.

The most dramatic alteration came in 2011, when Stegeman's outer concourses underwent a 21st century face lift that rendered the arena hardly recognizable from its previous look. The project expanded lobby space on both sides by 10,000 feet and gave new, stories-high glass facades. That renovations also featured the addition of considerable graphics highlighting the past and present of Georgia Basketball.

Most recently in 2016, the arena's east end wall was replaced by a massive graphic highlighting the three programs that compete in the Coliseum (pictured above). Following this season, a second phase will include a new center-hung scoreboard, seats throughout the arena, lighting system and ribbon boards. The cost of the upgrades in 2016 and 2017 is expected to be approximately \$7 million.

In addition to the aforementioned, Georgia constructed one of the nation's largest practice facilities adjacent to Stegeman. Opened in 2007, the \$30-million, 120,000-square-foot building has become a model other schools have visited and attempted to emulate.

### DOGS & CATS LEAGUE LEADERS

Georgia and Kentucky are the only two SEC programs to reach the 20-win mark each of the past three seasons.

UGA and UK also are the only league teams to post double-digit SEC win totals during each of the past three campaigns.

In addition, the Bulldogs and the Wildcats are the only teams to advance to the semifinals of the 2014, 2015 and 2016 SEC Tournaments. No other SEC team has reached the semis more than once during that span.

### UGA TOPS SEC GRAD RATE...AGAIN

Georgia received a perfect 100 in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) data released in November. UGA posted the highest GSR possible for a second straight year.

Georgia and Alabama are the only two SEC programs – and among 39 nationally – to post GSRs of 100 each of the past two years.

Georgia's GSR has seen dramatic increases during head coach Mark Fox's tenure, advancing from 36 in 2009-10, to 43 in 2010-11, to 50 in 2011-12, to 63 in 2012-13, to 71 in 2013-14 to 100 in both 2014-15 and 2015-16.

The NCAA introduced the GSR in 2004-05 in response to college and university presidents wanting graduation data that more accurately

reflected the mobility among all college students today. The GSR accounts for the academic outcomes of student-athletes who transfer from one institution to another and is based on a six-year cohort prescribed by the U.S. Department of Education.

### FRAZIER, MATEN TOP MILLENNIUM MARK

This season, J.J. Frazier and Yante Maten have become the 47th and 48th Bulldogs to reach 1,000 career points.

Frazier reached the milestone with a 3-pointer at the 17:57 mark of the first half against UNC Asheville on Nov. 14. Maten joined him with a free throw with 9:41 remaining against South Carolina on Jan. 4.

Frazier has since upped his career tally to 1,270 points, pushing him to No. 21 on the Bulldogs' career scoring leaders ledger. He is just four points shy of joining the top-20. Charles Claxton, father of UGA signee Nicolas Claxton, is the current No. 20.

Maten now has 1,055 points. Last week, Maten ascended all the way from No. 47 to No. 39 on UGA's career scoring leaders ledger. He is within 24 points of climbing all the way to No. 35.

Bulldogs have reached the millennium mark at a relatively steady clip of late.

**DURHAM, WILKINS JOIN CBB HOF**

While Kansas – in Kansas City – is obviously the star attraction of the CBE Hall of Fame Classic, Georgia shined brightest at the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies on Friday (Nov. 18). That’s when former Georgia coach Hugh Durham and player Dominique Wilkins comprised one-quarter of the Hall’s Class of 2016 inductees.

Appropriately, Durham and Wilkins, who together led the Bulldogs to numerous significant firsts, together were Georgia’s first inductees into the Collegiate Hall of Fame. And a large contingent approaching 100 friends and family of Georgia Basketball trekked to Kansas City for the ceremonies.

“It has only happened once, I think, Coach (Dale) Brown and Shaquille (O’Neal) at LSU,” Durham said. “Dominique and I have remained close through the years. He is the foundation of Georgia Basketball. We can take credit for bringing him in, but he is the face of Georgia Basketball. There’s a lot of pride to go in together.”

Durham arrived in Athens in 1978 and was charged with turning around a program that hadn’t finished .500 in more than a decade. Georgia was 14-14 and 14-13 in Durham’s first two seasons before Wilkins arrived as a McDonald’s All-American and the most celebrated recruit in school history.

Wilkins was tabbed 1981 SEC Player of the Year as a freshman while leading Georgia to a 19-12 finish and an NIT appearance, the Bulldogs’ first-ever postseason bid. Wilkins was named All-American a second-straight time in 1982, the same season he helped lead Georgia to the NIT semifinals.

Wilkins departed after that season and was the No. 3 overall pick in the 1982 NBA Draft before enjoying an illustrious career that included being a nine-time All-Star and seven-time All-NBA pick.

Durham remained in Athens for 17 seasons and is Georgia’s winningest hoops coach ever with 297 victories. He led the Bulldogs to the 1983 NCAA Final Four in their first NCAA Tournament appearance. All told, Georgia reached postseason competition 11 times under Durham.

Durham established a national name as head coach at Florida State from 1967-78 before coming to UGA. He led the Seminoles to 230 wins an NCAA runner-up finish in 1972 when they lost to UCLA, 81-76, in the national championship game. After Georgia, he won 106 more games at Jacksonville.

“When you’re a coach, you stand here and think about the reason you’re here,” Durham said.

“If you didn’t win games, you wouldn’t be here. If you didn’t have good players, you wouldn’t win games. If you didn’t have good assistants, you didn’t have good players. If you didn’t have an administration that wanted you to do well, then you wouldn’t have good assistants. That’s the long way of saying there are so many people you represent when you’re standing up here.”

Wilkins was dubbed the “Human Highlight Film” while in Athens, a nickname that has followed him from being Georgia’s career scoring leader when he departed college to 26,668 points and an amazing 24.8 career scoring average in the NBA.

“It’s mind blowing,” Wilkins said. “It’s a special moment in my life to go in with Coach (Durham) because he is like a father to me. You talk about being chosen from 350 D1 schools and to be chosen as one of the greatest. I can’t even tell you how that feels. It’s special because it’s the highest collegiate award you can get.”

The Hall of Fame’s Class of 2016 also includes players Mark Aguirre (DePaul), Bob Boozer (Kansas State), Doug Collins (Illinois State), Lionel Simmons (La Salle) and Jamaal Wilkes (UCLA) and coach Mike Montgomery (Montana, Stanford and Cal).

**Eight have topped 1,000 points under Mark Fox.** The others are Charles Mann, Trey Thompkins, Kenny Gaines, Nemi Djuricic, Travis Leslie and Kentavious Caldwell-Pope.

**MATEN CONSISTENT PERFORMER**

Yante Maten, the only SEC player on the watch list for the Karl Malone Award as the nation’s top power forward, has been a model of consistency since the start of last season.

**In 51 games during his sophomore and junior years, Maten has 46 double-digit scoring outputs (with 16 20-point and four 30-point games), grabbed double-figure rebounds 16 times and posted 15 double-doubles.**

**32+34=SOLID PRODUCTION AT THE “5”**  
Georgia’s tandem No. 32 Mike Edwards and No. 34 Derek Ogbeide is giving the Bulldogs very solid production on the low block.

To date, the classmates are contributing a double-double at 11.2 points and 10.9 rebounds per game for the Bulldogs.

Edwards and Ogbeide are combining to log 38.9 minutes per game, primarily manning the '5' spot together.

Ogbeide is averaging 7.2 ppg and 6.8 rpg in 20.8 mpg. Edwards is at 4.0 ppg, 4.1 rpg and 18.1 mpg.

### FRAZIER GRABS UGA CAREER FT MARK J.J. Frazier became UGA's career record holder for free throw percentage at Georgia Tech on Dec. 20.

The senior from Glennville, Ga., opened the season at No. 2 among UGA's career leaders in free throw efficiency at 81.1728 percent. That trailed only Jerry Epling's effort of 82.1561 percent (221-of-269) from 1968-70.

**Frazier has now connected on 71-of-79 (88.9 percent) at the stripe this season, which ranks No. 3 in the SEC and No. 20 nationally. That has raised his career percentage to 82.8784 (334-of-403).**

### HARRIS STARTS, CONTRIBUTIONS UP

Jordan Harris moved into the Bulldogs' starting five against UL Lafayette on Dec. 14. **Harris became the 10th Bulldog to start as a freshman during the last seven seasons.**

He joined five current teammates on that list – senior Houston Kessler; juniors Yante Maten and Juwan Parker; and sophomores Mike Edwards and Derek Ogbeide.

Harris' playing time has seen a considerable jump over the past seven outings. **He averaged 11.6 mpg in the first 10 outings but is seeing 24.9 mpg in the last seven games.**

During that span, Harris also has posted career highs for points (12 at Auburn), rebounds (five vs. South Carolina), assists (five at Tech), blocks (two at Ole Miss), steals (three at Ole Miss) and minutes (36 at Florida).

### TURTLE FOR 3...ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY

**Fifteen of William "Turtle" Jackson's 20 field goals this season have been 3-pointers. In fact, Jackson's first 11 made shots from the field came from behind the arc.**

Jackson's 3-point heavy tally is not surprising. Last season, 10 of his 13 field goals were 3-pointers and his shooting percentage was better from beyond (33.3 percent) than overall (28.3 percent).

**For his career, 25 of Jackson's 33 FGs have come from farther than 20-feet, 9-inches from the basket.**

### EARLIEST SEC OPENER IN A WHILE

The SEC opener at Auburn on Dec. 29 marked the first time Georgia played a December league game since the Bulldogs opened defense of their 1990 SEC Championship against Vanderbilt on Dec. 11, 1990.

### HISTORIC WIN OVER JACKETS

Georgia's 60-43 win over Georgia Tech on Dec. 20 equaled the Bulldogs' most decisive road win over Tech since a 55-38 decision on Dec. 6, 1980. **To find a larger margin of victory, you have to go back to a 69-13 win on 1/19/09...that being 1909.**

### DOGS EARN 500TH "W" AT STEGEMAN

Georgia's Dec. 17 win over Charleston Southern represented the Bulldogs' 500th all-time victory at Stegeman Coliseum.

Originally named the "Georgia Coliseum," the venue was christened on Feb. 22, 1964, when a standing-room-only crowd of 13,200 witnessed the Bulldogs defeat Georgia Tech, 81-68. The first game in the Coliseum actually was the undercard to that contest, an 86-75 win by UGA's freshman team over its counterparts from Tech.

The Bulldogs went on to finish 3-1 at the Coliseum during the 1963-64 season, posting additional wins over Vanderbilt and Florida State (with a young assistant coach named Hugh Durham on the Seminoles' bench).

Georgia is in its 54th full home campaign in the arena. The "Georgia Coliseum" was renamed "Stegeman Coliseum" on March 2, 1996. The namesake is Herman J. Stegeman, who coached basketball, baseball, football and track & field and also served as AD at UGA during his tenure from 1919-39.

### MATEN JOINS TOP-10 UGA SWATTERS

**Yante Maten joined Georgia's top-10 career leaders for blocked shots against Marquette on Dec. 4.** The junior from Pontiac, Mich., has since ascended to the No. 6 spot and is currently six swats shy of No. 5 Donte' Williams.

### "KPG LIGHT" LIGHTS IT UP

**Kenny Paul Geno registered a career-best 15 points versus Morehouse on Nov. 30, doing so by making the most field goals (5) and 3-pointers (4) of his career.**

**Geno was easing back into action after a bout with a stomach ailment. He lost approximately 16 pounds surrounding the CBE Hall of Fame Classic during Thanksgiving week.**

Against George Washington on Nov. 21, Geno registered his first DNP in 46 games – since a broken wrist forced him to miss 11 outings in 2014-15. He played one minute versus Kansas the following night and eight against Gardner-Webb on Nov. 25 before a season-high 22 MP versus the Maroon Tigers.

### FROSH DOUBLE UP VS. MOREHOUSE

**Freshmen Tyree Crump and Jordan Harris notched their first double-digit scoring games against Morehouse on Nov. 30 with 16 and 11 points, respectively.**

More impressive was the efficiency in which they reached those marks.

### BULLDOGS SIGN TWO

**Nicolas Claxton and Rayshaun Hammonds have signed letters-of-intent with the University of Georgia, head coach Mark Fox announced on Monday, November 14.**

Both players inked papers during the NCAA's week-long early signing period. Claxton signed in ceremonies on Nov. 14, while Hammonds did so on the previous Thursday, Nov. 10.

Claxton is a 6-10, forward from Legacy Charter School in Greenville, S.C., and the son of former Bulldog Charles Claxton. Nicolas averaged 12.9 points and 7.1 rebounds last season, as well as blocking 3.0 shots per game. He has helped Charter compile a 49-14 record over the past two seasons.

Claxton represented the U.S. Virgin Islands during the 2015 Centrobasket U17 Championships in San Juan, Puerto Rico. He averaged 11.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 4.8 blocks per game in five outings, leading the Virgin Islands to a runner-up finish in the tournament. Claxton posted single-game highs of 20 points and 15 rebounds against Mexico in the semifinals, as well as 10 blocks in a group stage matchup with Bahamas.

"Nic is a terrific shooter and passer for a player with his length," Fox said. "He really is going to be a good inside-outside scoring threat. I know he is excited about playing at his parents' alma mater."

Hammonds, a 6-8, forward from Norcross, Ga., was named first-team All-State for Class 6A by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution as a junior after averaging 16.7 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.0 blocks, 1.7 assists and 1.2 steals per game for the Blue Devils. As a sophomore, Hammonds averaged 14.1 points, 7.8 boards and 1.9 blocks at Norcross.

Over the past two seasons, Hammonds has helped Norcross post a combined 53-8 record and a pair of state tournament appearances. The Blue Devils finished 26-4 last season, losing to eventual state champion Westlake in the Sweet 16. Norcross was 27-7 in the 2014-15 season and lost to Peppelbrook in the state quarterfinals.

"Rayshaun has terrific versatility and can score the ball in a variety of ways," Fox said. "He's coming from a great program, and we are excited he is a Dawg."

Both of Claxton's parents, Charles and Nicole, attended UGA. Charles was a four-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs from 1992-95 and was an All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC performer. Among Georgia's career statistical leaders, Claxton is currently No. 20 in points (1,274), No. 5 in rebounds (840), No. 4 in field goal percentage (.542) and No. 2 in blocked shots (247). He was drafted by Phoenix in the second round of the NBA Draft and eventually played with Boston during the 1995-96 season.

Crump was 4-of-4 from the field, including 2-of-2 from 3-point range, and 6-of-6 at the line. Harris hit 4-of-5 field goals, including a pair of 3s, and made 1-of-2 shots at the line.

All told, 15-of-17 (88.2 percent) shots from the freshmen found the bottom of the net.

### FOX GARNERS CAREER VICTORY 250

**Mark Fox notched his 250th win in 13 seasons as a head coach with the Bulldogs' Nov. 14 victory over UNC Asheville.**

Fox was 123-43 in five seasons at Nevada. He was 127-104 in his eighth campaign in Athens when he reached the milestone.

All told, Fox has produced nine 20-win teams and advanced to the postseason nine times – including four occasions at Georgia – during his head coaching career.

### FRAZIER, MATEN ON POY WATCH LIST

J.J. Frazier and Yante Maten were on the Lute Olson Award Preseason Watch List. The award is presented to the nation's top D-I player who has played at least two seasons.

**Georgia was the only SEC team and one of only nine nationally to have two players on the list along with Cincinnati, Indiana, Kansas, North Carolina, Oregon, Villanova, Wisconsin and Xavier.**

There were five SEC reps on the 50-player ledger, which also featured Kentucky's Isaiah Briscoe, Texas A&M's Tyler Davis and Arkansas' Moses Kingsley.

### A POTENT INSIDE-OUTSIDE COMBO

Yante Maten and J.J. Frazier were one of college basketball's most explosive inside-outside combinations last season.

Frazier and Maten averaged 16.9 and 16.5 points, respectively, last season. That made Frazier the leading returning scorer in the SEC this season...and Maten the league's third-leading returning point producer.

**Their combined 33.4 ppg average made them the fifth-best returning forward-guard scoring combo in Division I for 2016-17, as listed below.**

### BULLDOGS TRAVEL TO SPAIN

The Bulldogs got an early start on preparations for the 2016-17 campaign with a tour of Spain in August.

Georgia won a trio of exhibition outings by an average of 26.0 ppg, with associate head coach Philip Pearson and assistants Jonas Hayes and Yasir Rosemond served as head coaches for one game each.

Pearson led UGA in the first matchup, a 65-48 victory over the Madrid All-Stars. Yante Maten paced Georgia with 19 points, while Derek Ogbeide notched a double-double of 10 points and 10 boards.

Under Rosemond, the Bulldogs raced to a 118-70 win over the Valencia All-Stars. Mike Edwards led the way with 20 points. J.J. Frazier added 18 points, and freshman Jordan Harris chipped in 17.

Georgia wrapped up the trip by beating the Barcelona All-Stars 96-72 under Hayes. Maten again led UGA in scoring with 23 points, while Tyree Crump contributed 20 points and four assists. Ogbeide collected his second double-double in Spain.

### A HOMEGROWN ROSTER

**Nine of the 15 players on Georgia's 2016-17 roster are Peach State prep products.**

That list includes eight of the 14 active players on the Bulldogs' roster – seniors J.J. Frazier (Faith Baptist Christian Academy), Houston Kessler (Landmark Christian School) and Brandon Young (Marist School); sophomores William "Turtle" Jackson (Athens Christian School), Connor O'Neill (Blessed Trinity Catholic High) and Derek Ogbeide (Pebblebrook High); and freshmen Tyree Crump (Bainbridge High) and Jordan Harris (Seminole County High).

In addition, Christian Harrison, a walk-on transfer from Troy who is sitting out this season, played at Woodward Academy.

### MATEN UP FOR MAILMAN AWARD

**Yante Maten was named to the watch list for the Karl Malone Award, which is given to the nation's top power forward by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.**

**Maten was only SEC Player named to the Watch List.**

The award is named after Karl Malone, who led Louisiana Tech to the 1985 NCAA Sweet 16 and went on to become a two-time NBA MVP and 11-time first-team All-NBA performer for the Utah Jazz.

Malone scored 36,374 points in the NBA, second to Kareem Abdul-Jabbar when he was enshrined in the Naismith Hall in 2010, and won Olympic Gold medals in 1992 and 1996.
