What's On Tap

No. 1 Vanderbilt returns home for a brief four game homestand starting with a three game series against Alabama this weekend at Hawkins Field. The first contest is scheduled to start at 7 p.m. on Friday with a 3 p.m. start on Saturday and a 1 p.m. start on Sunday.

Scouting Alabama

Alabama is 19-12 overall and 4-5 in the SEC after dropping two of three against LSU in Tuscaloosa over the weekend. The Crimson Tide got back on the winning track on Wednesday with a 2-1 win over UAB in Hoover, Ala.

All-American senior outfielder Emeel Salem leads the team with a .375 batting average to go along with five homers, 23 RBI and 20 stolen bases in 25 attempts. Outfielder Kent Matthes is the top power source with seven homers and 32 RBI on the year. Alabama has a .306 batting average as a team with 31 homers and 204 runs scored in 31 innings (6.6 runs per game).

Sophomore lefthander Miers Quigley (4-0, 2.63 ERA) will get the start for the Crimson Tide on Friday, with senior righthander Bernard Robert (4-2, 2.93 ERA) scheduled for Saturday and senior southpaw Brandon Belcher (1-1, 3.52) set for Sunday.

Sophomore righthander Tommy Hunter, a member of the 2006 USA Baseball National Team, is the squad's closer with four saves to go along with a 2-3 record and 2.94 ERA. As a team, Alabama sports a 3.49 ERA with 261 strikeouts and 82 walks in 283.2 innings.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt (27-4, 5-4 SEC) is 4-1 in its last five games ... VU hit .338 on the week, including a season high 22 hit attack against Middle Tennessee on Wednesday, with one homer, 13 doubles and 32 runs scored in four games ... The pitching staff came through with a 3.32 ERA and recorded 38 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 innings ... The Commodores have now won seven of the last 10 against the Gamecocks and have taken the regular season series the last three years ... The 4-3 win in 12 innings was the longest game for VU this season. The Commodores are 3-1 in extra innings ... With 10 strikeouts on Friday, David Price moved past Jeremy Sowers (327) into second place on the school's career strikeout list with 336. It was the fifth time in the last six games he has recorded double digit strikeouts. He has 89 strikeouts in 59.1 innings pitched this season ... Casey Weathers threw a career high 4.1 innings of two-hit scoreless relief in Friday's win. He struck out seven and walked two as he closed out the extra inning win to move to 4-1 ... Mike Minor gave up a run in the first inning of his first SEC start and then threw six scoreless inning in picking up the win on Saturday. He gave up five hits in seven innings with a career high nine strikeouts and two walks and is now 4-0 on the year with a 2.15 ERA and has 46 strikeouts and seven walks in 37.2 innings pitched ... Shea Robin was 5-for-14 (.357) on the week. He currently leads the team with a .351 batting average in SEC play (nine games) ... David Macias was 5-for-10 (.500) against South Carolina and has bumped his overall average over .300 to .336 ... Alex Feinberg was 7-for-15 (.467) with a double and three RBI last week ... Pedro Alvarez has hit safely in the last seven games and went 6-for-14 (.429) with two doubles, a homer and eight RBI in four games last week ... Cameron Betourne threw two scoreless innings against South Carolina on Sunday and has not been scored upon in three outings this year ... Ty Davis threw two scoreless innings of relief on Saturday and Josh Zeid had a scoreless inning of work against MTSU on Sunday ... Vanderbilt has come from behind in 16 of its 26 wins on the year ... The Commodores have 99 two-out RBI (210 total) ... Eight offensive starters are hitting over .300 on the year, Brad French the starting first baseman is hitting .280 ... Dominic de la Osa sat out last Sunday's game with a hamstring injury, but is expected to play this weekend. He came through with a pinch hit RBI double in the ninth against Austin Peay on Wednesday ... The Commodores have lost the last four times to the Crimson Tide dating back to the 2005 campaign.

Commodores Regain No. 1 National Ranking

With the series win over South Carolina last weekend, Vanderbilt regained its spot as the No. 1 team in the country in four of the five major polls.

The Commodores had dropped from the top spot for the first time in five weeks after losing two of three at No. 9 Arkansas two weeks ago.

The Commodores at 27-4 are off to the best start in school history and the team's 20-0 start was the best start of any sport at Vanderbilt. It bested the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team.

The No. 1 baseball ranking joins women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to postseason play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Mike Minor Named Rivals.com National Freshman Of The Week

Freshman lefthander Mike Minor was named Rivals.com National Freshman of the Week on Tuesday after his stellar performance in his first career SEC start against then No. 1 ranked South Carolina over the weekend. Minor handcuffed the Gamecocks for seven innings in the Commodores 12-1 series clinching win Saturday afternoon. He gave up a run in the first inning and then threw six scoreless innings in picking up the win on Saturday. The Chapel Hill, Tenn., product gave up five hits in seven innings with a career high nine strikeouts and two walks and is now 4-0 on the year with a 2.15 ERA and has 46 strikeouts and seven walks in 37.2 innings. He has a 1.80 ERA in three SEC games with a save and 14 strikeouts and two walks in 10 innings.

Commodores Rally In Ninth To Upend Austin Peay 4-1

Pinch hitter Dominic de la Osa's game-tying RBI single in the top of the ninth sparked a four-run inning as Vanderbilt rallied to defeat Austin Peay 4-1 Wednesday night at Raymond C. Hand Park.

VU rallied for the 16th time this season to improve to 27-4 overall, while Austin Peay dropped to 16-11.

The Commodores trailed 1-0 heading into the ninth before Governor closer Ben Wilshire hit Alex Feinberg to put the tying run on base. Matt Meingasner popped up a bunt attempt for the first out in the inning before de la Osa, who had sat out most of the last two games to rest a sore hamstring, came through with the tying double down the left field line. Wilshire struck out pinch hitter Kurt Lipton and walked David Macias to set up a game-winning two-run triple by Pedro Alvarez to make it 3-1. Ryan Flaherty added a squeeze bunt RBI single to score Alvarez to cap the four run inning.

David Macias finished with a 4-for-4 night at the plate to lead the Commodores, while Alvarez had two hits and two RBI.

Casey Weathers pitched the final 1.1 innings of scoreless ball with four strikeouts and a walk to move to 5-1 on the year.

Michael Dunn pitched 7.1 innings of six hit scoreless ball in his third appearance for the Governors. He struck out five and walked two and left the game with a 1-0 lead in the eighth. Austin Peay took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the sixth courtesy of a RBI single by Matt Smith. Brett Jacobson threw four innings of shutout baseball before being relieved by Cody Crowell to start the fifth. Jacobson gave up six hits with three strikeouts and a walk in the no-decision. Crowell gave up one run on two hits in two innings of work with three strikeouts and two walks. Ty Davis pitched 1.2 innings of two-hit scoreless relief with a walk and a strikeout.

Shea Robin Named To Johnny Bench Watch List

The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission named junior catcher Shea Robin to the initial Johnny Bench Award Watch List.

Twenty-seven catchers from seventeen conferences were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 7, 2007.

Robin is one of four catchers from the Southeastern Conference to be on the list, joining

Tennessee's J.P. Arencibia, Mississippi State's Edward Easley and LSU's Robert Lara. The Woodlands, Texas, native is hitting .305 on the season with a homer and 14 RBI. He leads the team with a .351 batting average in nine SEC games entering the weekend. The watch list will be narrowed down to ten semi-finalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2007.

Record Watch

Two Vanderbilt records worth watching this season are the school's career strikeout mark and the career homer mark. With 10 against South Carolina last Friday, Price now has 336 in his career. He moved past Jeremy Sowers (327) into second place and trails record holder Mike Willis by 14 strikeouts. With 10 homers this year, Pedro Alvarez is now in 10th place with 32. He needs four homers to move past Greg Smith into ninth place on the all-time list.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up preseason plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by Baseball America and Rivals.com this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. Baseball America listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
