ABOUT VANDERBILT

Picked to finish ninth in the Southeastern Conference, the Vanderbilt Commodores split a pair of games to open the 2016-17 season over the weekend. Vanderbilt defeated Kennesaw State at home on Friday, 86-54, before visiting Indiana and falling to the Hoosiers, who are receiving votes in the top-25 polls, 94-61. Vanderbilt is coming off an 18-14 season last

year which saw the Commodores lose eight of nine games to close the regular season before rebounding to win twice in the SEC Tournament, advancing to the quarterfinals.

Rebekah Dahlman leads the Commodores thus far, scoring 11.5 points per game. Dahlman adds a team-best 3.5 assists a contest, while Marqu'es Webb is averaging a double-double early on with 10.0 points per game and 10.5 rebounds a contest. Vanderbilt is shooting at a .419 clip early on, including a .439 percentage (18-for-41) from long range.

HEAD COACH · DENISE DILLON

Villanova '96 · 14th Season · Career Record: 235-176

Denise Dillon is the winningest coach in the Division I history of Drexel women's basketball, and has led the Dragons to seven post-season appearances in eight seasons. She brought the Dragons their first CAA Championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in the 2008-09 season, earning her second conference Coach of the Year honor that year. She followed that with four straight WNIT appearances, and in 2013, led the Dragons to the title with a 46-43 win over Utah on the Dragons' home court.

Last season, the Dragons won 19 games including a 13-5 mark in CAA play as they earned the league's No. 2 seed and automatic bid to the WNIT for a second-consecutive season. Drexel advanced to its fourth CAA championship game. Dillon mentored a First- and Second-Team All-CAA performer, as well as the program's fifth-ever Dean Ehlers Leadership Award winner, Meghan Creighton.

Since coming to University City and taking over as head coach in 2003, Denise has inspired greatness in her players and forged a new standard for success for the program. She became the first coach in Drexel women's basketball history to lead the team with six-consecutive winning seasons when the Dragons won a school-record 28 games on its way to a 28-10 record and the WNIT title in 2012-13. The Dragons finished third in the CAA, reaching their third-ever and second-straight CAA title game before earning a bid to the WNIT. Drexel beat Iona, Harvard, Bowling Green, Auburn, Florida and Utah on its way to the title. Drexel had never defeated an SEC or Pac-12 team until the 2013 WNIT.

The first break-through season for Denise and her Dragons came in 2008-09. Led by a core of veteran senior leaders and a talented junior in Gabriela Marginean, the Dragons played their way to the 2009 regular-season championship, a program record 24 wins and the top seed in the CAA Tournament. There, Drexel did what many thought was impossible: knocking off 17-time defending champion Old Dominion and ending the Lady Monarchs' NCAA-best 50-game conference tournament winning streak. The Dragons went on to defeat James Madison on its home court to bring home the school's first CAA title.

During her tenure Denise has helped guide the careers of 17 All-Conference selections, four Dean Ehlers Leadership Award recipients, the program's first AP All-American, the leading scoring in Philadelphia women's basketball history and the first Drexel women's player to be selected in the WNBA Draft.

Denise came to Drexel in 2001 as an assistant coach in charge of recruiting and player development. She helped the Dragons bring in Catherine Scanlon, a local product from Drexel Hill, who was one of the first Dragons to go on to a pro career following graduation.

In 2003, Director of Athletics Dr. Eric Zillmer tapped her to become interim head coach of the program and by the 2004-05 season she received full appointment as the head coach of Drexel women's basketball.

The Dragons under Denise adopted a team-centered approach on the court, while playing in an offense that often illustrated that the team as a whole is greater than the sum of its parts. The genesis of this approach can be traced back to her playing career at Villanova under the tutelage of coaching legend Harry Perretta. Playing in an offense similar to the one now run by Drexel, Denise went on to a Hall of Fame playing career for Villanova. From 1993-96 she scored 1,355 points and pulled down 677 rebounds. She was an All-Rookie selection, and a three-time All-Big 5 and All-Big East pick. Her playing career earned her enshrinement in the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame in 2004, the Delaware County Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012, and the Villanova Varsity Club Hall of Fame in 2013.

Off the court, Denise's commitment to helping student-athletes grow as players and as people has been one of the program's greatest success stories. Andrea Peterson ('09), Gabriela Marginean ('10), Hollie Mershon ('13) and Meghan Creighton ('16) earned the CAA's prestigious Dean Ehlers Leadership Award, the most winners under any single head coach in conference history. Nicole Hester ('09) was the recipient of the John Randolph Inspiration Award and the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association's Most Courageous Award in 2009.

LAST TIME OUT

Bailey Greenberg scored 10 points in the first half and Sarah Curran netted 13 consecutive points as part of a 15-0 run as the Dragons took control against Delaware State in an eventual 69-44 win at the Daskalakis Athletic Center. Drexel improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 2010-11 season, which saw them open the year with five consecutive victories. The Dragons saw 10 different players score on Sunday against Delaware State, and seven players contribute at least four points.

ALL-CONFERENCE DRAGONS

Sarah Curran, who has now been named a First Team All-CAA performer in back-to-back years, was also recognized as a Preseason All-Conference selection this year. Curran is already the second Dragon ever (along with Gabriela Marginean) to earn multiple First Team All-CAA nods and can join Marginean as the only three-time honorees at the end of this season. Senior Jessica Pellechio joins Curran on the Preseason All-CAA list as an honorable mention selection.

SPLASH CITY

Drexel hit 264 three-pointers last year, most in CAA history. The Dragons opened this season where they left off, hitting 11 against Penn State on Friday including a program-record eight from Jessica Pellechio. They added nine on Sunday against Delaware State and are 20-for-57 (.351) overall from long range. Pellechio leads the team with 10 this year, while active career leader Meghan Creighton (177 since 2012-13) netted her first two of the year on Sunday.

IN GOOD HANDS

Senior point guard Meghan Creighton finished last season with 184 assists and just 57 turnovers, giving her a 3.23 assist-to-turnover ratio. That left her fifth in the nation in that category, percentage points back of national leader Caroline Coyer (Villanova) at 3.40. She has picked up right where she left off, dishing out 11 assists against two turnovers over the first two games. Creighton's 5.6 assists per game last season also was highly-ranking nationally, coming in at 28th in the country.

EARLY RETURNS

Drexel freshman Bailey Greenberg has more than held her own so far, starting both games and averaging 10.5 points per game. She scored 11 against Penn State and 10 against Delaware State to become the first Drexel freshman to reach double figures in her first two games since Gabriela Marginean (2006). Marginean would go on to become the all-time leading scorer in Philadelphia Division I women's basketball history.

CURRAN EVENTS

Sarah Curran was named a First Team All-CAA performer the last two seasons. She was the first Dragon since Marginean to earn two-career First Team recognitions. She now has 1,151 career points, 15th all-time in Drexel women's basketball history. Curran has reached double figures in both games this year after starting last season with seven-consecutive double-digit outputs.

ACCEPTING CHARITY

Since the beginning of the 2014-15 season, Drexel is a combined 609-for-773, a .788 percentage that ranks tops in the nation over that time span. Drexel was second in the nation behind Washington in 2014-15 (.778) and third behind Connecticut and Columbia in 2015-16 (.786). This year has gotten off to a particularly fast start, with the Dragons going 22-for-22 from the line against Penn State. They extended that streak to 27 consecutive made free throws before their first miss against Delaware State, and are now 32-for-35 (.914) from the line through two games this season.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Three seniors are expected to be mainstays in the starting lineup - Meghan Creighton, Sarah Curran and Jessica Pellechio. Friday was the first time Drexel has started three seniors on opening day since 2012-13, when Nicki Jones, Hollie Mershon and Taylor Wootton all started.

STARTING YOUNG

At the same time that the Dragons are starting three seniors, they also saw a freshman start on opening day for the third time in the last five years. Bailey Greenberg, a graduate of nearby Archbishop Wood, netted 11 points and pulled down five rebounds in her first collegiate game. She joins Meghan Creighton (2012) and Sarah Curran (2013) as freshman to start the season opener for the Dragons over the last five seasons, meaning that 60 percent of Drexel's current lineup has been a starter ever since their first collegiate game.

CARROLL CONNECTION

Seniors Meghan Creighton and Sarah Curran are starting their final season together on the court. They played together for three years at Archbishop Carroll High School in Radnor, Pa., and have been on the Dragons together for the past four seasons. Together, along with 2016 Drexel graduate Rachel Pearson, they won the PIAA Class AAAA state championship in 2012. The Carroll pipeline to Drexel has a rich history, with Pearson the latest graduate including 2009 CAA champions Andrea Peterson and Brooke Cornish and 2013 WNIT MVP Hollie Mershon. Current Drexel athletic trainer Kerri DiPietro is also a Carroll grad.

WOOD WOMEN

There have been at least two Archbishop Carroll graduates on the Dragons since the 2012-13 season, but this year Drexel will also feature a duo from another Philadelphia-area high school, as Archbishop Wood graduates Aubree Brown and Bailey Greenberg team up to play for Drexel. Brown won a state title at Wood as a freshman in 2011-12, the year before Greenberg came to the school. In 2013-14, the pair teamed up to lead Wood back to the state championship game. After Brown's departure, it was Greenberg's turn to win a championship as Wood captured the state title last spring. Both players were First Team All-Philadelphia Catholic League and All-State selections individually.

MILESTONE WATCH

- Senior forward Sarah Curran needs 69 points to match Maureen Michaels (1,220 from 1997-2000) for 14th all-time on the Drexel scoring charts.
- Curran needs six three-pointers to reach 100 in her career.
- Senior guard Meghan Creighton needs two assists to reach 450 career assists. She is currently second all-time at Drexel with 448 career helpers.
- Creighton needs 23 three-pointers to become the fifth Dragon ever with 200 career threes.
- Senior guard Jessica Pellechio needs 122 points to reach 1,000 in her career, including 550 points scored as a freshman and sophomore at VCU.

DEAN EHLERS UNIVERSITY

Then-junior guard Meghan Creighton was named the CAA's Dean Ehlers Award recipient last season, an award given to the top student athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship in conjunction with her academic and athletic achievement." Creighton was the fifth Dragon to win the award, two more than any other present or former CAA program can boast. She joined Michelle Maslowski, Andrea Peterson, Gabriela Marginean and former teammate Hollie Mershon as Drexel's winners. Creighton could become the first-ever two-time winner of the award on the women's side if she earns the distinction again this season.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The 2016-17 Drexel women's basketball team will feature three international student athletes, with freshman Ana Ferariu (Romania) joining sophomores Tereza Kracikova (Czech Republic) and Eline Maesschalck (Belgium). The Dragons have had at least one international player on the roster every season since Denise Dillon became the head coach, with Amy Mallon heading up recruiting in that area.

MEGHAN CREIGHTON ASSISTING OTHERS

Throughout the 2016-17 season, senior point guard Meghan Creighton, the CAA's Dean Ehlers Award winner last season, will be playing with a purpose beyond wins and losses through her Assisting Others campaign. For every assist she dishes out this season, Meghan has collected pledges and will be generating donations to EvanFest and Ryan's Case for Smiles, two charities near and dear to her heart.

COMEBACK KIDS

Six times during the CAA regular season last year, the Dragons found themselves trailing by double digits. Four of those times, Drexel came back to win. Drexel trailed by double digits at Northeastern (Jan. 25), at UNCW (Feb. 5), at Elon (Feb. 21) and vs. William & Mary (Feb. 28) and came back to win. In three of the four - at UNCW, at Elon, vs. William & Mary - the Dragons overcame the double-digit deficit to lead by 10 or more during the game. Overall, Drexel was 17-3 when leading by 10+ at some point during the game, and 4-9 when trailing by 10+.

WELCOME TO OUR HOUSE

Drexel will play five non-conference home games in 2016-17, the most since the 2010-11 season when Drexel went 12-2 at home including a perfect 5-0 mark in the non-conference. That year, with Villanova and Seton Hall both visiting the Daskalakis Athletic Center, was also the last time that two power-five conference schools made trips to the DAC during regular season play. This season, both Penn State from the Big Ten (Drexel win, 83-60 on Nov. 11) and Syracuse out of the ACC (Nov. 21) make visits the DAC. This year will be the first time ever that Drexel's non-conference schedule has featured home games with multiple power-conference opponents with more than one league represented.
