TEAM NOTES

ABOUT VANDERBILT

- The Commodores are 15-12 (5-9 SEC) in their 16th season under head coach **Kevin Stallings**. They are No. 116 in the RPI.
- Since its overtime loss at home to Tennessee on Feb. 11, Vanderbilt has gone 2-1, with wins over Alabama and Missouri.
- Sophomore big man **Damian Jones** was a pre-season first-team All-SEC pick by the league's head coaches, and he leads the Dores in scoring (14.9 ppg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg).
- Starting guard **Riley LaChance** is the SEC's top-scoring freshman, averaging 12.6 ppg.
- Vanderbilt freshman forward Jeff Roberson has missed the last two games with concussion-like symptoms. He is one of three VU players currently dealing with concussion-type injuries.
- Stallings is Vandy's all-time winningest coach and also ranks seventh on the SEC's all-time coaching wins list.
- Tennessee owns a 70-17 all-time home record against Vanderbilt, including wins in each of the last four meetings on Rocky Top.
- Tennessee's 115 wins over the Commodores are the most by the Vols over any opponent, and only Kentucky (218 games) has been an opponent of the Vols more times than Vanderbilt (186).

FAST BREAK

Tennessee is one of only 13 programs in the nation to make at least four NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances in the last eight seasons.

LAST MEETING WITH VANDERBILT

- Tennessee came back from down five points with 15 seconds left in regulation to send the game to overtime and capture a 76-73 road win at Vanderbilt Feb. 11.
- **Robert Hubbs'** driving layup as regulation time expired sent the game to overtime. In the extra session **Josh Richardson** scored five of the Vols' nine points to secure the win in the Vols' first OT game under head coach Donnie Tyndall.
- Richardson scored a game-high 27 points on 10-of-18 from the floor. He also added seven rebounds and four assists.
- Junior **Armani Moore** scored 13 points Junior **Derek Reese** also regained the scoring touch as he tallied a career-high tying 12 points, making 5-of-6 shots. **Kevin Punter** had 10 points.
- The Commodores were led by **Damian Jones**, who scored 16 points and grabbed nine rebounds. **James Siakam** (14 points) and **Jeff Roberson** (12) also scored in double-figures.
- A pair of Richardson jumpers and a clutch 3-pointer by Punter put the Vols in position to send the game into the extra session.
- Tyndall donned the trademark Tennessee orange blazer, made famous by legendary UT coach **Ray Mears**, for the first time.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST VANDERBILT

- **Dyron Nix** (17 points, 18 rebounds) and **Doug Roth** (10 points, 10 rebounds) recorded double-doubles and Tennessee beat Vanderbilt 79-69 in overtime in Stokely Athletics Center Feb. 4, 1987, in Knoxville.
- **Dick Johnston** made six free throws in double-overtime to lift UT to a 77-72 win over the Dores in Nashville on Feb. 2, 1970. **Jimmy England** led the charge with 27 points, and **Bobby Croft** had an 18-16 double-double.
- **Danny Schultz** holds UT’s single-game scoring record against Vanderbilt, as he dropped 35 points on the Dores on Feb. 15, 1964, in Nashville.
- Tennessee All-Century Team member **Paul “Lefty” Walther** (1948-49) never lost to Vanderbilt during his career as a Vol. The Covington, Ky., native helped lead Tennessee to a 4-0 record over the Dores, beating Vandy by an average of 9.8 points.

TYNDALL IN REMATCH GAMES

- During **Donnie Tyndall's** career as a Division I head coach, his teams are 41-26 (.612) when facing an opponent for the second time in a season.
- Since the 2009-10 season, his teams are 27-10 (.730) the second time they face a foe.
- When the second matchup comes at home, Tyndall's teams are 24-8 overall and 19-2 since 2008-09.
- At Tennessee, Tyndall is 0-2 in rematch games.

VANDY'S LAST TRIP TO KNOXVILLE WAS HISTORIC

- In Vanderbilt's last trip to Thompson-Boling Arena, Tennessee pummeled the Commodores, 76-38, with a record-setting defensive effort March 1, 2014.
- Vanderbilt's 38 points were the fewest scored by an opponent in arena history. The previous low was 40, set by MTSU in 2007 and ETSU in 1996.
- The Tennessee win by 38 points is the largest margin of victory in 186 all-time meetings with Vanderbilt, dating to 1922. The previous largest margin was 35, in a 56-21 UT win on Feb. 22, 1947.
- In holding Vanderbilt to just 38 points, it was the fewest points scored by the Commodores in the series since that game in 1947, when they had 21.

POINTS-OFF-TURNOVERS DOWN

- In its two losses last week, Tennessee averaged just 6.0 points off turnovers.
- Entering that week, the Vols were averaging 17.5 points off turnovers (through 12 SEC games).
- Saturday in Oxford, Tennessee forced the Rebels into committing only six turnovers. That marked a season-low for a UT opponent.

If Puerto Rico qualifies for the 2016 Olympics, Vols junior **Derek Reese** may be boarding a flight to Rio. Reese, whose grandparents, Anselmo and Irma Montañez, were born in Puerto Rico, is active in that country's national program. He played for Puerto Rico's Men's National "B" Team at the 2013 FIBA Stankovic Continental Champions Cup in China.

Michiganders Abound at Tennessee

Each of Tennessee's "big three" athletic programs prominently feature a Michigan native on the coaching staff. **Donnie Tyndall** is a native of Grand Rapids. Head football coach **Butch Jones** hails from Saugatuck. And longtime assistant women's basketball coach **Dean Lockwood** is from Bay City.

“(Armani) Moore looks like the village blacksmith, or a strong safety who wandered onto the wrong playing field. In the NBA combine, they make potential draft picks lift 185 pounds. Anywhere around 15 repetitions is an impressive number. Moore has hoisted 185 17 times, high among his teammates.”

UT LOOKS TO AVOID FOUR-GAME SKID

- Tennessee hopes to snap its current three-game skid Thursday vs. in-state rival Vanderbilt.
- During the last six seasons, first-year Vols head coach **Donnie Tyndall** has never lost four consecutive games, and he has suffered through only three losing streaks of three games. All three of those skids were snapped after three games.
- The last time a Tyndall-coached team lost four straight was February 2009, when Morehead State lost four consecutive games—all on the road—to Eastern Kentucky, Kent State, Murray State and UT-Martin in an 11-day span.
- Tyndall has coached 207 games since that four-game losing streak.

VOLS SUCCESSFUL ON STATE CIRCUIT

- Since the start of the 2005-06 season, the Vols have beaten every in-state Division I team. Those schools include Austin Peay (1-1), Belmont (3-0), Chattanooga (4-0), ETSU (5-0), Lipscomb (1-0), Memphis (4-5), Middle Tennessee (5-1), Tennessee Tech (3-0), Tennessee State (2-0), UT Martin (2-0) and Vanderbilt (13-6).
- During that span, UT is 43-13 (.768) against in-state Division I teams.

HEARTBREAK AT THE BUZZER

- In three of Tennessee’s eight SEC losses, the Vols have had shots to either tie or take the lead at the final buzzer of regulation.
- Saturday at Ole Miss, senior **Josh Richardson** had two shots, both with UT facing a two-point deficit, in the final eight seconds. He missed a potential go-ahead 3-pointer with eight second on the clock. Then, after an offensive rebound, timeout, and subsequent inbounds play, Richardson shot a contested two-point field goal that rimmed out as time expired. That final shot would have forced overtime.
- At Georgia Feb. 7, Richardson had a 3-point shot from the top of the arc that could have tied the game. But that shot drew iron, and time expired in the scramble for the rebound.
- At Arkansas Jan. 27, coach **Donnie Tyndall** drew up a beautiful play that resulted in **Robert Hubbs III** having an open look at a potentially game-tying 3-pointer from the corner. That shot, released with five seconds on the clock, bounced gently on the rim multiple times before caroming back into play.

VOLS PICKED 13th IN SEC

- Tennessee was predicted to finish 13th in the 2015 SEC race by an SEC and national media voting panel.
- At 6-8, the Vols are currently in a three-way tie for seventh place in the standings.

VOLS RANK 33rd IN NATION IN STEALS

- In all games, the Vols rank second in the SEC in steals (7.8 spg, 33rd nationally). But UT leads the league in steals during SEC play (7.6 spg).
- Three of the top five SEC steals leaders during conference play are Vols: 3. **Kevin Punter** (1.9 spg), 4. **Armani Moore** (1.8), 5. **Josh Richardson** (1.7).

TYNDALL’S TEAMS HAVE TYPICALLY BEEN TOUGH AT HOME

- Over the last three seasons (dating to start of 2012-13), **Donnie Tyndall’s** teams are 36-5 in regular-season home games (27-1 at Southern Miss; 9-5 at Tennessee).
- This season has been an anomaly of sorts, as Tyndall’s squad has lost more than twice as many home games this year (5) as they did the previous two years combined (2).
- Tyndall’s teams have won 21 consecutive regular-season home games against non-conference opponents, dating to a 57-56 loss to South Dakota Dec. 10, 2011, at Morehead State.

J-RICH AN OFFENSIVE CATALYST

- Vols senior **Josh Richardson** plays a direct role in 39.4 percent of Tennessee’s total team scoring.
- The team leader in both scoring and assists, Richardson has scored 408 points, and his 93 assists have led to 240 points.
- Translated to percentages, Richardson scores 24.8 percent of UT’s points, and assists on 14.6 percent more points.
- When examining Tennessee’s 3-point baskets this season, Richardson has made or assisted on 55.0 percent of them (83 of 151).

NOBODY DOES MOORE

- Junior "human multi-tool" **Armani Moore** is one of the SEC's most versatile players, and he is thriving under first-year UT head coach **Donnie Tyndall**.
- Moore has started every game, has four double-doubles and leads the Vols in rebounding (6.9 rpg, seventh in the SEC), offensive rebounding (2.9 orpg) and blocks (1.3 bpg).
- Moore has set career-highs in every statistical category already this season.
- His plus/minus rating (per 40 minutes) is the best on the team: +5.58

MOORE CRASHING OFFENSIVE GLASS

- In SEC play, 6-5 junior **Armani Moore** ranks fourth in the league with 3.3 offensive rebounds per game.

REESE STEPPING UP IN SEC PLAY

- Junior forward **Derek Reese** has stepped up in a big way recently in the Vols' frontcourt.
- In SEC play, the Orlando, Fla., native is averaging 6.5 points and 6.1 rebounds.
- Reese is averaging 27.6 minutes in league games. He has started six of those games and come off the bench in eight others.
- Reese has stepped up his rebounding game against SEC foes. During non-conference play, he averaged 3.0 rebounds per game. In the first 14 conference games, Reese's average has more than doubled to 6.1 rpg (16th in the SEC).

HUBBS ON A HOT STREAK

- Tennessee sophomore **Robert Hubbs III** played in the Vols' first 12 non-conference games last season before being shut down due to a shoulder injury.
- This is Hubbs' first time experiencing SEC play, and he is averaging 8.1 points and 4.1 rebounds in league games.
- He missed a potential game-winning 3-pointer at the final buzzer at Arkansas (1/27/15) but bounced back to drive the length of the court and lay in the game-tying basket to force overtime at Vanderbilt two weeks later (2/11/15).

BAULKMAN RIDING FT STREAK

- Junior guard **Devon Baukman** doesn't get to the free-throw line with regularity (just 1.3 attempts per game), but since Jan. 17—a period spanning 11 games—he is 10-for-10 at the stripe.
- Overall this season, Baukman is shooting .833 from the foul line (25-of-33).

HALFTIME LEAD BODES WELL

- During his nine-year career as a Division I head coach, **Donnie Tyndall's** teams are 144-21 (.873) when leading at halftime.
- Tennessee is 10-1 this season when leading at halftime.

TENNESSEE HAS TWO TOP-20 WINS

- The Vols have beaten a pair of teams that were ranked in the top 20 of the Associated Press poll at tipoff. Tennessee upset 15th-ranked Butler 67-55 on Dec. 14, and the Vols beat 19th-ranked Arkansas 74-69 Tuesday.

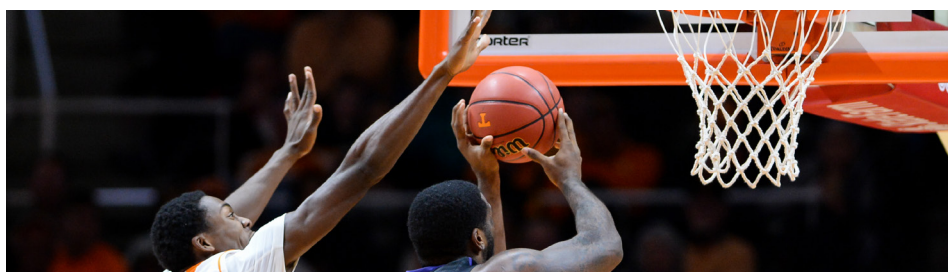

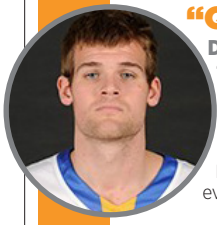

THE BIRTH OF TYNDALL'S ZONE

- In 2007, with a young **Kenneth Faried** on his roster at Morehead State, **Donnie Tyndall** was racking his brain for a way to keep Faried close to the basket on defense. The future NBA All-Star was such a force in the paint in the OVC that opponents went to great lengths to lure him out of the paint.
- One common tactic saw opposing teams simply take their center and use him to set ball-screens out front, effectively sacrificing their own big man to try and neutralize Faried.
- Said Tyndall: “What teams we’re doing to Kenneth Faried was the biggest impetus for me moving to the matchup zone. He was constantly getting dragged out 25 feet from the rim, hedging ball screens, and good coaches were telling their five men to do that, to drag him out there and try to wear him down or get him to pick up a cheap foul.”
- “So protecting Kenneth was the main reason for going in that direction initially, but it’s just continued to evolve over the years as we’ve changed things and tweaked different things inside the scheme. We’ve changed some rules about how we’ve guarded certain actions after seeing some things we didn’t respond well to.”

“The general principles aren’t difficult to learn, because it’s just like man. Where it’s different is that your help is all based on zone principles with rules and scripts for every kind of situation.”

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- UT has forced more turnovers than it has committed in 15 of its 26 games this season.
- UT’s +2.0 turnover margin (all games) ranks third in the SEC.
- The Vols force opponents into 14.3 turnovers per game while committing 12.4.

STEALS PREVALENT IN TYNDALL'S SYSTEM

- The aggressive, matchup-zone defensive system employed by coach **Donnie Tyndall** led to both of his Southern Miss teams ranking among the Division I leaders in steals each of the past two seasons.
- In 2012-13, Southern Miss ranked fifth nationally with an average of 9.6 steals per game. In 2013-14, Tyndall’s Conference USA championship team ranked 17th nationally with 8.2 steals per game.
- In all games this season, Tennessee averages 7.8 steals per game, which ranks 33rd nationally.
- Junior guard **Kevin Punter** has nabbed at least four steals four different times, and he had a season-high six steals at Georgia (2/7/15).

TAKING CHARGE

- Junior forward **Armani Moore** owns the team lead for charges drawn this season with five.
- Moore is Tennessee’s active leader in charges drawn, with 13 in his career.
- As a team, UT has taken 22 charges this season.

RICHARDSON KNOWN FOR DEFENSE

- Given the emphasis that coach **Donnie Tyndall** places on defense, it’s fitting that Tennessee’s best player and team co-captain, senior **Josh Richardson**, has built a reputation as an elite defender.
- Richardson made the 2014 SEC All-Defensive Team as a junior.
- Richardson is five blocks shy of breaking into UT’s all-time top-10 list for career blocks. He needs 90 to tie for 10th, and he currently has 85.
- He has a pair of three-block games this season, and in UT’s win over 15th-ranked Butler (12/14/14), he logged a career-high six steals (one shy of the school record).
- Richardson leads the SEC with 2.0 steals per game this season (all games).
- Richardson also has eight games this season in which he’s nabbed at least three steals (UT is 5-3 in those contests).



10:04 SCORELESS!

During Tennessee’s 64-57 victory over Santa Clara in the opening round of the 2014 Orlando Classic at ESPN’s Wide World of Sports, the Volunteers held the Broncos scoreless for a span 10:04.

The drought spanned the final 27 seconds of the first half and the first 9:37 of the second half. During that stretch, Santa Clara went 0-for-8 from the floor and committed three turnovers.



FAST BREAK

In the semifinals of the Orlando Classic, Tennessee forced 11th-ranked Kansas to make 11 second-half turnovers (16 total).

QUICK DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Tennessee has drawn 22 total charges this season.
- UT also has forced eight shot-clock violations and one 10-second call.
- The Vols forced Georgia into committing 20 turnovers in Athens (2/7/15).
- Senior **Josh Richardson** had a career-high six steals in UT’s upset win over 15th-ranked Butler (12/14/14).
- The Vols held Kansas State without a field goal for a span of 11:27 during the first half of UT’s win over the Wildcats (12/6/14).
- UT also forced 22 turnovers against K-State while logging 12 steals and nine blocks. **Armani Moore** had five of those blocks, marking a career-high.
- Tennessee forced 15th-ranked VCU to commit 18 turnovers when the teams met to open the season at The Veterans Classic at the U.S. Naval Academy (11/14/14).
- SEC All-Defensive Team member **Josh Richardson** blocked three shots in the opener vs. VCU.
- Three Vols logged multiple steals in UT’s home-opening win over Texas Southern (11/20/14).
- In limiting Mercer to 15 first-half points (11/22/14), the Vols had their best defensive half since leading Presbyterian, 43-13, on Dec. 18, 2012. UT held the Bears to .182 shooting as a team in the first half; Mercer did not make a field goal for the final 9:48 of the half.

Notes on UT's Youth & Inexperience

The Vols have 10 healthy scholarship players (including former walk-on Galen Campbell, who was just placed on scholarship Jan. 9)

True freshmen have combined to make 23 starts for this Tennessee team.

Five of Tennessee's top eight contributors (in terms of minutes per game) have one season of Division I experience or less.

There are 200 available minutes to be played in a 40-minute game. Tennessee has seen true freshmen account for an average of 38.7 minutes per game.

Entering SEC play, **Josh Richardson** was the only player on UT's roster who had ever scored 10 or more points in an SEC game.

Tennessee has a program-record eight newcomers on its roster this season.

UT's four returning lettermen tied Missouri and Texas A&M for fewest among SEC teams.

Tennessee's 10 healthy scholarship players include three true freshmen and two junior-college transfers.

MINIMIZING "BAD LOSSES"

- In terms of RPI, the "worst" loss on UT's resume is a loss to Mississippi State (No. 192).
- RPI of the other teams that have beaten the Vols: Kentucky = 1; Kansas = 2; VCU = 12; Arkansas = 20; Ole Miss = 32; Texas A&M = 346; Georgia = 37; NC State = 52; LSU = 54; Alabama = 79; Marquette = 143.
- So in total, 10 of UT's 12 losses have come vs. top-80 RPI teams.

McGHEE OUT WITH FOOT INJURY

- UT's already thin frontcourt was dealt a major blow Dec. 17 at NC State, when freshman **Jabari McGhee** (4.4 ppg, 3.8 rpg) suffered a right foot injury. He had surgery Dec. 19 and will redshirt; he appeared in only eight games.
- McGhee led the Vols in field-goal percentage (.700), and was the team's second-leading offensive rebounder (2.3 oprg) while playing 13.9 minutes per game.

FRESHMEN PLAYING BIG ROLE

- True freshmen **Willie Carmichael III** (15.9 mpg), **Detrick Mostella** (12.7 mpg) and **Tariq Owens** (7.2 mpg) all are playing significant roles for the Vols.
- Tennessee has started multiple true freshmen in four games this season.
- True freshmen are combining to average 38.7 minutes per game and have combined to make 23 starts.
- Last season, Tennessee freshmen accounted for only 11 starts all year, and the Vols never started multiple freshmen in a single game.

VOLS SIGN PHILLIPS, SCHOFIELD

- **Donnie Tyndall** announced Nov. 12 that **Shembari Phillips** and **Admiral Schofield** have signed NLI's to attend UT and join the Vols as freshmen next year.
- The 6-4, 185-pound Phillips is currently a senior at Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga.
- Phillips attended Tucker High School last season, where he averaged 18 points, six rebounds, four assists and two blocks.
- Schofield, a 6-6, 220-pound combo forward, attends Zion-Benton Township High School in Zion, Ill.
- As a junior last season, Schofield earned honorable mention All-State honors from the *Champaign-Urbana News Gazette* after averaging 16 points, eight rebounds and two assists.

"I couldn't always get to the rim. So I had no choice but to just pull up. I started really working on that, the 12- to 15-footers. That's when I started the one-dribble pull-up, stop on a dime, things like that."

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vols' 2014-15 roster features 14 players (11 scholarship student-athletes) representing eight states.
- There are four Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, three from Georgia, and a pair of players from Florida. Alabama, Kentucky, Maryland, New York and Oklahoma also are represented.
- Tennessee has three seniors, five juniors, one sophomore and five freshmen.
- Eight Vols stand 6-5 or shorter, and six players are 6-6 or taller.

FAST BREAK

Tennessee has produced 45 all-time NBA Draft picks, including eight first-rounders. Two Vols were selected in the 2014 NBA Draft, as **Jarnell Stokes** was picked 35th, and **Jordan McRae** was taken 58th.

TENNESSEE PART OF 2016 MAUI FIELD

- Tennessee will join Chaminade (host school), UConn, Georgetown, North Carolina, Oklahoma State, Oregon and Wisconsin in the 2016 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational field.
- It will be UT’s third all-time appearance at the Maui Invitational. The Vols also played in the event in 2004 (fourth place) and 2011 (seventh place).

“THE MANIMAL” IS A TYNDALL PUPIL

- **Kenneth Faried**, one of the NBA’s biggest young stars, was recruited and coached by **Donnie Tyndall** at Morehead State.
- This past summer, Faried—known as “The Manimal”—led the U.S. National Team to gold at the FIBA World Cup.
- The Denver Nuggets signed Faried to a five-year, \$60 million contract extension in October.
- Faried’s impressive development under Tyndall shined most during the 2010-11 campaign, as he won his second consecutive OVC Player of the Year award, earned consensus All-American status and broke **Tim Duncan’s** career NCAA rebounding record before being selected 22nd overall by Denver in the 2011 NBA Draft.

TYNDALL WANTS VOLS TO OVERACHIEVE

- First-year head coach **Donnie Tyndall** has preached a mantra of “overachieving” to his 2014-15 squad.
- Tyndall: “(I want our fans to) help us be the most overachieving team in college basketball. That’s our goal. And I don’t want to say that to undersell our talent level or our players, but we need to overachieve this year to have a good year, and our fans need to help us do that.”

VOLS WERE DOWN TO NINE MEN, AND HERE’S HOW IT HAPPENED

- Tennessee entered SEC play with just nine healthy scholarship players after starting the season with 12.
- Sophomore big man **Dominic Woodson** transferred out at the semester break after appearing in four games.
- Freshman forward **Jabari McGhee** fractured a bone in his foot Dec. 17 at NC State (out 6-8 weeks).
- On Jan. 5, it was announced that graduate transfer point guard **Ian Chiles’** season was over due to a nagging right shoulder injury that required surgery.
- On Jan. 9, head coach **Donnie Tyndall** surprised the team by placing **Galen Campbell**, a fourth-year walk-on guard from Knoxville, on scholarship for the 2015 spring semester. That brought UT’s total number of healthy scholarship players back up to 10.

Hoops a Priority on Rocky Top

The University of Tennessee has invested more than \$40 million into its basketball facilities since the end of the 2006-07 campaign.

Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility and began the first phase of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena.

The \$19 million first phase of renovations included the addition of 32 luxury suites that are located in the existing north balcony, a loge area just below the luxury suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.

The Vols' state-of-the-art basketball practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, houses two full-size gymnasiums, one for each of the men's and women's basketball teams, as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.

The athletic department renovated the men's and women's basketball offices at the arena during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for the basketball programs.

New to Thompson-Boling Arena last year was the 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.

And in March of 2014, TBA became the third college arena to install an LED lighting system (joining Arizona State and Notre Dame).

- In his two seasons at Southern Miss, first-year UT head coach **Donnie Tyndall's** teams turned in year-end RPis of No. 27 in 2013 and No. 29 in 2014.

- Tennessee withstood a furious charge by the Razorbacks in the final minutes to hold on for the win. The Vols made 11-of-14 from the foul line in the final 1:08 to seal the victory.
- For Arkansas, the loss snapped a seven-game win streak.
- Tennessee's pressuring defense flustered Arkansas's fast-paced offense most of the night. Arkansas was held to 69 points, 14.9 less than their season average of 83.9.
- The Vols forced the Razorbacks into a season-high 18 turnovers and converted those into 27 points. Tennessee controlled the paint as well, with a 40-32 advantage.
- Josh Richardson led the Vols with a season-high 24 points, while Robert Hubbs III scored a career-high 16 points. Armani Moore netted 14 points and had four steals.
- The Vols were in control for nearly the entire game and never trailed for the final 38 minutes of action despite the late Hog charge.
- Up by a pair at halftime, the Vols opened up a 10-point advantage early in the second half, punctuated by a Richardson breakaway slam as UT took a 43-33 lead with 16 minutes left in the game.
- Detrick Mostella's back-to-back 3-pointers midway through the second half pushed Tennessee's lead to 15 at 53-38. The Vols held Arkansas without a point for 4:37 midway through the second half while building a 16-point lead.

- Junior guard Kevin Punter led the Vols with 14 points, while senior guard Josh Richardson tallied 10.
- Kentucky was led by Devin Booker, who netted 18 points, despite shooting 5-of-16 from the floor and 2-of-9 from 3-point range. Andrew Harrison added 14 points for the Wildcats.
- Tennessee's defense played havoc with Kentucky all night. The Wildcats shot just 41.5 percent from the floor, including 37.5 percent in the second half. Kentucky made 5-of-22 3-pointers, 1-of-9 in the second half.
