### Vanderbilt Closes Exhibition Season Vs. Southern Indiana

After defeating Alabama-Huntsville, 69-53, on November 3 in their first exhibition game, the Commodores take on their final exhibition opponent Monday when the Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles travel to Nashville for an 8 p.m. tip off. The game can also be heard on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College vucmodores.com as a part of the All-Access package.

### Vanderbilt Vs. Alabama-Huntsville

The Commodores defeated the Chargers, 69-53, behind a 19-point effort from sophomore guard John Jenkins, who was 8-for-16 from the field, had four rebounds, and blocked three shots in the win. Junior center Festus Ezeli added 12 points and seven rebounds, and junior forward Jeffery Taylor added 11 points and six rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 31-19 at the half and was up 42-34 with less than 12 minutes to go in regulation when the Commodores went on a 13-0 run to push the lead to 21 at 55-34. Vanderbilt shot 46.8% from the field and held the Chargers to 33.9% from the floor. The Commodores also blocked nine shots, and outrebounded Huntsville, 36-29.

### About Southern Indiana

Southern Indiana finished the 2009-10 season at 24-9 and finished the year ranked ninth in the final NABC/Division II Top 25 poll. The Screaming Eagles lost 74% of its offense to graduation in 2009-10.

In their other exhibition game against a Division I opponent on November 2, USI lost to Illinois, 76-67, in Champaign. Senior guard C.J. Trotter led USI with 19 points.

## TODAY'S PROBABLE STARTERS

### Season Preview - Guards

Gone is Jermaine Beal at the point guard position, who averaged a team-high 14.6 points per game a year ago, and in steps **Brad Tinsley**, a 6'3 junior who has played at both guard positions in his first two years with the Commodores. He has participated in all 64 games and made 55 starts over that period, mostly at the two-guard position. He has a very well-rounded game and is exceptionally talented passing the ball, which should bode well for Vanderbilt playmakers on the wings and in the post. Tinsley can also score, making 100 threes and averaging 9.2 points per game in his career.

6'4 sophomore **John Jenkins** returns to start at the shooting guard position. Jenkins, the 2010 SEC Sixth Man of the Year and a member of the 2010 All-SEC Freshmen team, averaged 11.0 points per game and his 48.3% from three ranks as the third-best single-season three-point percentage in the program's history and the 11th-best single season in SEC history. It is also the third-best career percentage in SEC history with 100 to 199 career three-point attempts. Jenkins and his shooting stroke could become a national phenomenon if he keeps up his current pace.

### Season Preview - Guards (cont.)

New to the fold is 6'1 guard **Kyle Fuller** from Moreno Valley, Calif. Fuller averaged 27.6 points, eight assists, six rebounds, and four steals per game as a point guard at Rancho Verde High School and was the winningest player in Rancho Verde history. He was a four-year captain, a three-year starter, and was named a first team All-C.I.F. Division IAA selection and the MVP of the Inland Valley Conference in 2010. Fuller will be counted on to back up Tinsley at the point guard position.

Other guards on the roster include senior **Chris Meriwether** and sophomore **Jordan Smart**. Both are walk-ons, and both Meriwether and Smart played very limited minutes in 2009-10.

### Season Preview - Forward

Vanderbilt returns a plethora of forwards, in fact every forward on last year's roster returns. Leading the way is junior **Jeffery Taylor**, who is the Commodores' top returning scorer at 13.3 points per game and a preseason All-SEC first team selection. The 6'7 Taylor, from Norrkoping, Sweden, has started in every game in his two-year Vanderbilt career, and scored in double figures in 24 of Vanderbilt's 33 games, including a career-high 26-point effort against Tennessee in Memorial Gym (2/9).

Also returning is starting four man **Andre Walker**, a 6'7 redshirt junior forward. Walker played in 32 games in 2009-10, started 31, and averaged 6.1 points per game. He also averaged 5.4 rebounds and 2.5 assists per contest, and acted as another ball-handler for the Commodores when needed. Walker was back at full strength in 2009-10 after tearing his ACL two games into the 2008-09 campaign.

Other forwards returning for the Commodores are four-year seniors **Joe Duffy** and **Darshawn McClellan**, and juniors **Lance Goulbourne** and **Steve Tchiengang**. Newcomers **Rod Odom** and **James Siakam** will also be thrown into the forward mix.

McClellan played in 30 games last season and made one start as a junior, and averaged 1.9 points and 1.2 rebounds per contest. McClellan has made 13 starts in his career, and has assumed a leadership role with the team this summer.

Goulbourne is an explosive wing player who will come off of the bench to spell Taylor at the three spot and possibly get minutes at the two and four spots. Goulbourne played in 31 games as a sophomore in 2009-10 and averaged 3.3 points and 2.1 boards per contest.

He also scored 18 points, a career-high, in 26 minutes of action, also a career-best, in a home win over LSU on February 13, 2009.

Tchiengang, who played in every game in 2009-10 and averaged 3.4 points and 2.5 rebounds per game, will see some time at the four and five positions this season for the Commodores. Tchiengang is a very physical presence who can pop out and hit a three to keep defenses honest.

Duffy played limited minutes in 2009-10, and averaged 0.3 points per game in eight games. However, Duffy is a solid presence in the locker room and in the community – last spring he raised nearly \$3,000 for the Nothing But Nets charity, an organization that buys mosquito nets to protect children from malaria in Africa.

Odom, from Central Islip, N.Y., is a 6'9 freshman forward who was a three-year starter in basketball at the Middlesex School in Massachusetts, where he averaged 25.6 points, 14.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists, and 3.1 blocks in his senior season.

Siakam, a 6'7 athletic forward, was a spring signee from Brehm Prep in Carbondale, Ill., where he averaged 18 points, 10 rebounds, and five blocks per game.

### Season Preview - Center

There are officially two centers on the roster to replace the departed A.J. Ogilvy – redshirt junior **Festus Ezeli** and true freshman **Josh Henderson**.

Ezeli will be called upon as the likley starter at the center position for Ogilvy, who departed as the school's 13th all-time leading scorer with 1,469 points. The 6'11 big man played in 32 games, made five starts, and averaged 12.7 minutes per game and averaged 3.8 points, 3.2 rebounds, and 1.3 blocks per game. His 43 blocks is the sixth-best single season total in the history of the program.

Henderson, a 6'11 center from Roanoke, Va., averaged 20 points, 11 rebounds, four blocks, and four steals per game in his senior season at Cave Spring, where his Knights' team won two district titles, two region titles, and two state titles, and captured the Holiday Hoopla tournament in 2010.

### Fisher, Thompson Courtside to Call Action on Vanderbilt Radio Network From IMG College

Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson are back courtside this season, describing the action of every Commodore game to Vanderbilt followers throughout the Southeast.

Fisher, the Voice of the Commodores, will anchor Vanderbilt play-by-play for the 13th consecutive year.

A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-by-play broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a selected number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 10th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 29th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

# Team Notes

## **Commodores Return Nine Scholarship Players From 2009-10**

Vanderbilt returns nine scholarship players from 2009-10 and three walk-ons to the fold for the 2010-11 campaign. The Commodores' roster will sport three seniors (Joe Duffy, Darshawn McClellan, Chris Meriwether), seven juniors (Jeffery Taylor, Brad Tinsley, Andre Walker, Festus Ezeli, Steve Tchiengang, Lance Goulbourne, and Aaron Noll), two sophomores (John Jenkins, Jordan Smart), and four freshmen (Kyle Fuller, Josh Henderson, Rod Odom, James Siakam).

## **2009-10 Postseason Player Accolades**

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 51st Vanderbilt player to make the All-SEC First Team since voting began in the 1948 campaign. The Commodores have had a player on the first team in four out of the last five years, and six in the last nine. Vanderbilt's last first-team selection was Shan Foster in 2008 - Foster also claimed the league's Player of the Year honor.

Jeffery Taylor's selection is his first to the All-SEC second team. He made the All-SEC freshman team in 2009. A.J. Ogilvy's selection to the second team is his third in three years. He was named to the All-Freshman team in 2008, and named to the second team in 2008, 2009, and now 2010.

John Jenkins is the 10th Vanderbilt player to be named to the All-Freshman team, and only the second to claim the league's Sixth Man of the Year award. Scott Hundley was the only other Commodore to be awarded with the honor, when he won it in 2004.

## **Stallings Wins SEC Coach of the Year in 2010**

Vanderbilt head coach won his second SEC Coach of the Year award in 2010 in a vote by SEC Coaches. He was also awarded with the honor in 2007 by the league's coaches. Stallings was also named the District 21 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

## **Quick 2009-10 Recap**

- Vanderbilt made its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its fourth since 2004. The Commodores lost a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to Murray State in San Jose, Calif.
- With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, 2010, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one

20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six.

- The Commodores went 12-4 in SEC play in 2009-10, the most conference wins since the 1992-93 season when the Commodores won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record. The 12 wins is a new league high under head coach Kevin Stallings.

- Vanderbilt finished SEC play with a 6-2 road record - the six wins is a new Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season, and ties for the most since divisional play began in the SEC in the 1991-92 season. The 1992-93 team also had six road wins in league play.

- The Commodores had a regular season sweep of Florida, the first since 2000-01, and Tennessee, the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The last time Vanderbilt was unbeaten against Tennessee and Florida in the same season - 1966.

- The Commodores finished the season 14-2 in home games at Memorial Gym, the sixth time in the Stallings' era that Vanderbilt has finished with 14 or more wins at home.

- For the year, VU had 167 blocks, a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened in 2008-09.

- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with 23 wins, which tied for third most in school history with the 1965 and 1974 teams ... Only the 1993 and 2008 teams had more regular season victories (25).

- Vanderbilt made 616 free throws in 2009-10, which is the second most in school history and most since making 742 during the 1989-90 season ... VU surpassed its total of 594 from the 1971-72 season.

- Vanderbilt was ranked in the Top 25 10 times in 2009-10 and for eight straight weeks. The number 13 ranking in the AP poll was Vanderbilt's best since January 7, 2008, when the Commodores also came in at the 13 spot in the Associated Press poll.

## **Getting to the Line**

In 16 SEC games, Vanderbilt went to the free throw line an SEC-best 471 times, an average of 29.4 times per game. In fact, the Commodores made 355 in SEC play, which is more than nine teams in the SEC attempted in league play. VU was first in the league in free throw percentage in all games (72.1, 616-854) and in SEC games only at 75.4% (355-471).

## **Beal and Ogilvy Depart**

Two Vanderbilt All-SEC players from 2009-10, Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy, have departed the Commodore roster for the 2010-11 campaign. Beal, who graduated in May, and Ogilvy, who left school early to pursue professional basketball opportunities, combined to score 36.4% of the team's points a year ago. Both also left as 1,000-point scorers.

## **International Flavor**

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. , Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon.

## **3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season**

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 762 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (770) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (649) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

## **Commodores Add Four Freshmen In 2010-11**

The Commodores have added four freshmen to the roster in 2010-11. Freshman point guard Kyle Fuller (6'1, 180), center Josh Henderson (6'11, 220), forward Rod Odom (6'9, 207), and James Siakam (6'7, 210) have joined the Vanderbilt roster.

## **Vanderbilt And National Rankings**

The Commodores ended the season ranked 26th in the nation in blocks (5.2 bpg), 29th in scoring offense (76.9), and 34th in field goal percentage (47.0).

## **McClellan Redshirting**

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings announced after the Alabama Huntsville game that senior forward Darshawn McClellan will redshirt the 2010-11 season. He is on track to graduate in May with a degree in Human and Organizational Development and will have one year of eligibility remaining.

# Individual Notes

## #44 Jeffery Taylor

- Junior forward Jeffery Taylor, a preseason All-SEC selection by the media and the league's coaches, put on 25 pounds of muscle this offseason and is ready for a breakout season in 2010-11. Taylor has scored in double-digits in 45 career games, and has started every game of his Vanderbilt career.
- Averaged 13.3 points, 5.2 rebounds, 1.7 assists, and 1.1 steals per game and started in every contest for the Commodores as a sophomore...Scored in double figures in 24 of Vanderbilt's 33 games, including a career-high 26-point effort against Tennessee in Memorial Gym (2/9).

# Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

## HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 695-188 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 115 of its last 122 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 162-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 95-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.
