Vanderbilt Earns #4 Seed, Will Take On Murray State Thursday

The Vanderbilt Commodores, the number four seed in the West Region, will face off against #13 seed Murray State at the HP Pavilion in San Jose, Calif. The game will tip off at 1:30 p.m. CT, and can be seen live on CBS and CBSSports.com. The radio call can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson courtside with all of the action.

Vanderbilt, who is making its third trip in four years to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in school history, will be a four seed at the tournament for the second time in the history of the school. The Commodores were also a four seed in their last tournament appearance in 2008, and last reached the tournament in three out of four years in 1988, 1989, and 1991.

Thursday's matchup with Murray State will mark the third game Vanderbilt has played an NCAA Tournament game in the state of California. The Commodores are 2-0 in the state after advancing to the Sweet 16 out of Sacramento in 2007 after defeating George Washington in the first round, 77-44, and Washington State, 78-74 in double overtime, in the second round. Vanderbilt lost to Georgetown, 66-65, in the East Regional Semifinal that year.

The Commodores have a 5-5 all-time record in the first round of the NCAA Tournament since the field expanded to at least 64 teams in 1985, and have won their first round games in 1965, 1988, 2004, and 2007. Vanderbilt lost its last first-round game on March 21, 2008, to Siena, 83-62, in Tampa.

This will be the 11th overall appearance for Vanderbilt in the tournament, with the Commodores sporting an all-time record of 9-11. This will mark head coach Kevin Stallings' fourth appearance in the Big Dance as the Vanderbilt mentor - he has a 4-3 overall record in the tournament with Vanderbilt. Including his six-year tenure at Illinois State, he has an overall record of 5-5 in five NCAA Tournament berths.

Thursday's appearance in the West Region marks the third time Vanderbilt has appeared in the West Region. Vanderbilt also played in the Phoenix Region in 2004, and advanced to the Sweet 16 that season after two wins in Orlando. Vanderbilt played in the West Region in 1991 (0-1) and 1993 (2-1). The West Regional semifinals and finals will be held in Salt Lake City, Utah, on March 25 and 27. Vanderbilt is 2-0 in tournament games in Salt Lake City -the Commodores defeated Boise State, 92-72, and Illinois, 85-68, in 1993 to advance to the Sweet 16.

Murray State, who finished 30-4, won the Ohio Valley Conference regular season and tournament titles in 2009-10. The Racers have five players that average double figures - Ivan Aska (10.6), B.J. Jenkins (10.5), Danero Thomas (10.4), Tony Easley (10.4), and Isaiah Canaan (10.3).

Vanderbilt is 3-1 all time against the Racers, with the last meeting coming in a 74-57 win December 19, 1988, and 54-7 all-time against teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. Prior to the 1988 meeting with the Racers, Vanderbilt had not faced Murray State since the 1945-46 campaign.

The winner of the Vanderbilt-Murray State contest would take on the winner of the #5 Butler-#12 UTEP matchup on Saturday.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal leads four Vanderbilt players in double figures with 14.7 points per game. Beal is the only player left from Vanderbilt's last Sweet 16 appearance in 2007. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy and sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor each average 13.4 points per game, and freshman John Jenkins adds 10.9 points per game. Each one of the four players made an All-SEC team - Beal on the first team, Ogilvy on the second team, Taylor was selected to the second team and the all-defensive team, and Jenkins was named to the all-freshman team and was named the league's Sixth Man of the Year.

12-4 SEC Mark

Is Vanderbilt's most confence wins since the 1992-93 season when the Commodores won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record. The 12 wins is a new league high under head coach Kevin Stallings, who has been at the helm of the Commodore program since 1999-00.

Road Success

Vanderbilt finished SEC play with a 6-2 road record - the six wins is a new Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season, and ties for the most since divisional play began in the SEC in the 1991-92 season. The 1992-93 team also had six road wins in league play.

Season Sweeps

The Commodores had a regular season sweep of Florida, the first since 2000-01, and Tennessee, the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The last time Vanderbilt was unbeaten against Tennessee and Florida in the same season - 1966.

Vanderbilt At Memorial Gym

The Commodores finished the season 14-2 in home games at Memorial Gym, the sixth time in the Stallings' era that Vanderbilt has finished with 14 or more wins at home.

Murray State

Scouting Murray State

Murray State enters the game with a 30-4 overall record, and is the Ohio Valley Conference tournament and regular season champions.

The Racers are a very balanced team, with five players averaging double figures. Ivan Aska (10.6), B.J. Jenkins (10.5), Danero Thomas (10.4), Tony Easley (10.4) and Isaiah Canaan (10.3) each average double figures, with Easley leading the team on the glass with 5.8 rebounds per game.

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has never faced Murray State.

Murray State-Vanderbilt Common Opponents

Vanderbilt and Murray State have played two common opponents - Western Kentucky and Tennessee State. Both the Commodores and Racers lost their matchup with Western Kentucky, and both teams knocked off Tennessee State. Murray State defeated Tennessee State twice in the 2009-10 season.

VU Block Party

For the year, VU has 167 blocks, which is a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened last year in 2008-09.

Vanderbilt Tidbits

- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with 23 wins, which ties for third most in school history with the 1965 and 1974 teams ... Only the 1993 and 2008 teams had more regular season victories (25).
- Saturday's meeting against Mississippi State marked Vanderbilt's 10th appearance in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament ... Since the SEC split into divisions in 1992, Vanderbilt has reached semifinals three times ... Vanderbilt has made just one previous appearance in the finals, winning the 1951 SEC Tournament.
- The Commodores are 1-9 all-time in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament.
- Vanderbilt has made 599 free throws in 2009-10, which is the second most in school history and most since making 742 during the 1989-90 season ... VU surpassed its total of 594 from the 1971-72 season.

NCAA Tournament First Round

Tampa, Fla. (St. Pete Times Forum)

Kenny Hasbrouck scored 30 points and Tay Fisher added 19 on 6-for-6 shooting from 3-point range, and 13th-seeded Siena stunned No. 4 Vanderbilt 83-62 Friday night in the first round of the Midwest Regional. "Actually, we wanted to be the first upset of the day," Hasbrouck said.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 18 points for Vanderbilt (26-8), which got 13 from SEC player of the year Shan Foster -- who became the 22nd player in SEC history to eclipse 2,000 points -- and 10 from Ross Neltner. The Commodores came into the tournament more than a little miffed that they were widely picked to be a first-round upset victim and insisted they wouldn't look past Siena.

The Commodores got two straight baskets from Keegan Bell and drew within 50-43 with 13:20 to play, but never got any closer the rest of the way. Vanderbilt never got its perimeter game going, shooting 4-for-20 from 3-point range, and didn't exploit its size advantage inside.

The Commodores peeled off five straight points to get their crowd into it; Hasbrouck silenced them with a three-point play. Neltner and Foster scored consecutive baskets; Hasbrouck answered with a 3-pointer, steal and dunk in a 13-second span. When Vanderbilt drew within nine on a pair of free throws by Ogilvy with 40 seconds left in the half, Siena answered yet again.

Naturally, it was Fisher. Siena's only senior hit his fourth 3 of the half -- on as many attempts -- with six seconds left, and the Saints marched into intermission with a 46-34 lead.

The number 13 ranking in the AP poll was Vanderbilt's best since January 7, 2008, when the Commodores also came in at the 13 spot in the Associated Press poll.

Commodores Getting To The Line In SEC Play

In 16 SEC games, Vanderbilt went to the free throw line a SEC-best 471 times, an average of 29.4 times per game. In fact, the Commodores made 355 in SEC play, which is more than **nine** teams in the SEC attempted in league play. VU is first in the league in free throw percentage in all games (72.6, 599-825) and in SEC games only at 75.4% (355-471).

Senior Jermaine Beal led the SEC in free throw percentage in league games with an 87.5% clip (63-72).

You Never Know What You're Going To Get...

Vanderbilt has had six different leading scorers (Beal, Goulbourne, Jenkins, Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley,), five different leading rebounders (Goulbourne, McClellan, Ogilvy, Taylor, Walker), five different assist leaders (Beal, Jenkins, Taylor, Tinsley, Walker), and seven different leading shot blockers (Ezeli, Goulbourne, Jenkins, McClellan, Ogilvy, Tinsley, Walker) so far this season. Nine different Commodores have scored in double figures this season.

Record Against Ranked Foes

The Commodores are 81-201 all-time against ranked opponents and 2-2 this season (two wins over Tennessee, two losses to Kentucky). Vanderbilt has a 26-47 record against ranked opponents in the Stallings' Era.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very worldly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon.

3-Point Streak Enters 22nd Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 761 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (770, 3/14) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (649, 3/14) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Vanderbilt One Of SEC's Top Shooting Teams

In all games, the Commodores are second in the league in field goal shooting (.470), first in three-point field goal percentage (.369), and first in free throw percentage (.726). In SEC games only, Vanderbilt finished first in scoring (78.0), second in field goal percentage (.461), second in three-point field goal percentage (.365), and first in free throw percentage (.754).

Vanderbilt Against Tournament Teams

The Commodores defeated four NCAA Tournament teams in 2009-10 - St. Mary's, Missouri, Florida, and Tennessee, and posted a 6-2 record against teams in the tournament (two losses to Kentucky).

Commodores Knock Off St. Mary's

Vanderbilt knocked off St. Mary's, 72-70, on November 20 to open a four-game road swing that included the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational. Vanderbilt handed St. Mary's only their third non-conference loss in their last 29 games in McKeon Pavilion, with Jeffery Taylor leading the way for VU with 19 points. St. Mary's recently captured the WCC Tournament title with a win over Gonzaga and will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Vanderbilt Finishes 2-1 At 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational

The Commodores returned home from their trip to Maui with a record of 2-1, with wins coming over host Chaminade and Arizona, and Vanderbilt's lone loss coming against Cincinnati in the first round of the tournament. Senior guard Jermaine Beal led four players in double figures in the three games in Maui, averaging 14.7 points per game. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy averaged 13.0 points, sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor added 11.0 points, and true freshman guard John Jenkins chpped in 10.7 points per contest.

Team Sets FG% Record Under Stallings

The Commodores converted on 67.9% of its shots from the floor (36-53) against Tennessee State, which set a new record for single-game field goal percentage in the Stallings era. The previous best came on March 13, 2008, against Auburn at the SEC Tournament in the Georgia Dome, when the Commodores connected on 67.3% (33-49) of their shots from the field.

Vanderbilt's History At The NCAA Tournament

Vanderbilt will be making its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its fourth since 2004, and have a 9-11 all-time record at the tournament. The Commodores have advanced to the regional semifinals four times since the field expanded to 64+ teams (1988, 1993, 2004, 2007) and advanced to the Elite Eight on one occasion, in 1965, when the field was only 23 teams.

The Commodores' last appearance came in the 2008 tournament, when Vanderbilt, a four seed, fell to Siena, a 13 seed, 83-62, in the first round in Tampa, Fla. VU's previous two appearances in the tournament, in 2004 and 2007, resulted in two Sweet 16 runs.

In the 2007 edition of the tournament, Vanderbilt, a #6 seed, knocked off #11 George Washington, 77-44, and #3 Washington State, 78-74, in a double overtime classic, at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. The Commodores were defeated by #2 Georgetown, 66-65, in the East Regional semifinals at Continental Airlines Arena in East Rutherford, N.J.

In 2004, VU advanced to the Sweet 16 as a number six seed in the Phoenix Regional, defeating No. 11 seed Western Michigan (71-58) and No. 3 seed N.C. State (75-73) in Orlando, Fla. The Commodores then lost to eventual national champion, No. 1 seed Connecticut, 73-53, in Phoenix, Ariz.

Highlights From Big Dance

1965 – Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite Eight before losing to No. 1 ranked Michigan, 87-85. The Vanderbilt-Michigan game featured consensus All-Americans Clyde Lee of Vanderbilt and Cazzie Russell of Michigan.

- Lee scored 28 points (second highest NCAA single-game total by Commodore behind Billy McCaffrey 29-point effort (March 20, 1993, 85-68 victory over Illinois). Lee played the entire second half with four personal fouls.

- Lee also grabbed 20 rebounds (all-time NCAA single-game high by Commodore) in the loss vs. Michigan.

- Lee's 24-point, 15-rebound effort led Vanderbilt OT win over DePaul, 83-78, to advance to the Michigan game.

- Lee was named All-South Region Most Outstanding Player while Vanderbilt guard Keith Thomas also earned All-Region honors.

1974 - Vanderbilt hits 21 of 22 free throws in loss vs. Marquette (61-69, March 16) - tied for sixth best single-game performance in NCAA tournament.

- Vanderbilt's Jeff Fosnes was named All-South Region Team.

1988 - Led by All-SEC center Will Perdue, Vanderbilt advanced to the Sweet 16 behind the shooting touch of junior guard Barry Goheen. Seeded No. 7, Vanderbilt defeated No. 10 Utah State in the first round to meet No. 2 seeded Pittsburgh. With the Commodores trailing by three in the closing seconds, Goheen launched a 25-footer at the buzzer to send the game into overtime. Goheen helped clinch the victory with four free throws and an assist in overtime.

- National Player of the Year Danny Manning scored 38 points to lead eventual national champion Kansas over the Commodores.

1993 - While advancing to the second Sweet 16, Commodore guard Ronnie McMahan puts on a three-point shooting exhibition, hitting 13 of 19 (68.4 percent). It ranks as the eighth best performance ever in NCAA tournament history.

- As a team, the Commodores hit 47.1 percent of their 3-point attempts (32-68), tied as fifth best team effort in NCAA tournament history.

- Guard Billy McCaffrey puts on a show for the Commodores in 85-68 victory over No. 6 seeded Illinois. McCaffrey sets Commodore single-game NCAA mark with 29 points in the victory.

- In a 67-59 loss to Temple (Sweet 16), Vanderbilt made its only free throw attempt.

2004 - In one of its most memorable NCAA Tournament games in recent history, Vanderbilt overcame an 11-point deficit with 3:45 remaining as Commodore all-time leading scorer Matt Freije poured 31 points, including 11 in the final 3:28 to help Vanderbilt rally for a 75-73 second-round win over N.C. State. Mario Moore hit Corey Smith with a backdoor pass that Smith converted for a conventional three-point play with 23 seconds remaining to help seal the victory.

2007 - Vanderbilt dropped a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to #2 seed Georgetown in the East Regional semifinals on March 23 behind a controversial, acrobatic layup by Hoya star Jeff Green with 2.5 seconds remaining in regulation. The Commodores knocked off #11 George Washington, 77-44, in the first round, and defeated Washington State, 78-74, in double overtime at ARCO Arena in what many considered the best game of the 2007 tournament. Derrick Byars made five three-pointers in the second half to lead Vanderbilt to victory.

2008 - The Commodores, a four seed, were upset by 13-seed Siena, 83-62, in the first round of the tournament in Tampa, Fla. Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer Shan Foster was limited to only 13 points in the loss. It was Vanderbilt's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament as a #4 seed.

Vanderbilt All-SEC Selections

Stallings Claims Second Coach Of The Year Honor

Vanderbilt head coach won his second SEC Coach of the Year award in 2010 in a vote by SEC Coaches. He was also awarded with the honor in 2007 by the league's coaches. Stallings was also named the District 21 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

Stallings Gets Fifth 20-Win Season At Vanderbilt

With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one 20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six. Here's a look at his five 20-win seasons at Vanderbilt:

Stallings Now In Second Place On All-Time VU Wins List

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 300th career game as a head coach last season, got his 200th win as Vanderbilt coach against Middle Tennessee State on January 4. He is in sole possession of second place on the all-time Vanderbilt wins list after surpassing Bob Polk's mark of 197 wins against Manhattan.

Now in his 17th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 212 in his 11-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings trails only Roy Skinner (278, 1962-76) on the all-time coaching wins list.

Stallings' Success

In 31 seasons as a player and coach, his teams have made 25 tournament appearances, including 16 NCAA berths and three Final Fours.

Senior Players Graduating Under Stallings

All 26 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree or are working towards it.

Beal Named To All-SEC First Team

Senior Jermaine Beal was a unanimous selection to the All-SEC First Team by the league's coaches on March 9. Beal, who leads the Commodores with 14.7 points per game, made his first all-league team in his four-year career with Vanderbilt.

Beal In Elite Company

Senior guard Jermaine Beal is only the third player in Vanderbilt history to have at least 1,000 points, 400 assists, and 125 steals. Kevin Anglin (1990-93) and Frank Seckar (1993-96) are the only other Vanderbilt players to accomplish the feat.

Beal Winningest Player For Vanderbilt

Beal has been at the helm of the Commodores for the last four seasons, a span that has included 91 wins so far. The 90 wins is the most in a four-year stretch in Vanderbilt basketball history.

Beal Eclipses 1,000-Point Barrier Vs. Auburn

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 40th player in Vanderbilt history to reach the 1,000-point mark after registering 14 points against Auburn. He is the team's second 1,000-point scorer - A.J. Ogilvy became the first sophomore in VU history to go over the 1,000-point mark last season.

Big Shot Beal

Beal led Vanderbilt with a 25-point effort in a 85-76 win over Tennessee on January 27, the Commodores' first win in Knoxville in four years. Beal scored 10 points in a 23-5 Vanderbilt run late in the second half to give the Commodores a cushion they would use the rest of the way to come away with the win.

Beal Goes For Career-High 28 Points Vs. Georgia

The senior point guard scored a career-high 28 points in a 96-94 overtime win over Georgia on Feb. 25, his fourth 20+ point performance of the season and the eighth of his career. He also dished out seven assists against zero turnovers in 38 minutes of action against the Bulldogs.

Beal Also Sees Scoring Increase

Jermaine Beal has seen his scoring increase in every year of his career. So far in 2009-10, he is averaging 14.7 points per game and leads the team in scoring. Last season, he pumped in 12.5 points per game, the team's second highest scoring average, and increased his scoring from his sophomore to junior season by nearly five points (4.9). He averaged 3.8 points per game as a freshman and 7.6 points per game as a sophomore.

Ogilvy Notches Season High At Ole Miss

Ogilvy scored 27 points at Ole Miss, which set a new high for him in 2009-10 and a then team-best for an individual this season. Ogilvy was 8-for-10 from the floor and 11-for-13 from the charity stripe against the Rebels on February 18.

Ogilvy Grabs SEC Player of the Week Honor

A.J. Ogilvy won his first SEC Player of the Week award for the week of November 30-December 6 after averaging 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds against Missouri and DePaul, respectively. It was the first player of the week honor for the 6'11 center from Sydney, Australia - he won three SEC Freshman of the Week awards in the 2007-08 season.

Ogilvy Reaches Milestone Vs. Lipscomb

A.J. Ogilvy tallied three blocks against Lipscomb on November 16, which gave him 100 blocks for his career, making him the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy is only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

Ogilvy Garners First Double-Double Of The Season Vs. Georgia

Ogilvy had 17 points and 10 rebounds in the Commodores win over Georgia on February 25, his first of the season and 10th of his career.

Ogilvy And The 20-Point Barrier

Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in 22 games in his three-year Vanderbilt career, and the Commodores are 21-1 in those games. Also, when he attempts 10 or more free throws, VU is 19-2 in his three-year career.

Taylor Makes Second-Team All-SEC, All-SEC Defensive Team

The sophomore was named to the All-SEC second team and the All-Defensive team by the league's coaches in 2009-10.

Taylor Breaks Out Vs. Tennessee

Jeffery Taylor broke out in a big way against Tennessee, scoring a career-high 26 points in a 90-71 win over the Volunteers at Memorial Gym on February 9. Taylor was 7-for-11 from the floor and a perfect 12-for-12 from the free-throw line in the win, and also added seven rebounds.

Taylor's Free Throws Vs. Tennessee

Taylor finished 12-of-12 from the free-throw line to become just the fourth Vanderbilt player to make all of his attempts when attempting at least 10 free throws. Commodore great Matt Freije owns the school record by making 18-of-18 against Indiana on Nov. 23, 2003. Earlier this season, Taylor set the Memorial Gym record for the highest field-goal percentage in a game.

Jeffery Taylor Wins Player of the Week

Sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor was named SEC Player of the Week for the week of February 8-15 after he averaged 20.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists in wins over No. 12 Tennessee and LSU. Taylor scored a career-high 26 points in Vanderbilt's win over Tennessee. It was the highest single-game point total by a Commodore this season. He was 12-of-12 from the free throw stripe to become just the fourth player in school history to be perfect from the free throw line when attempting 10 or more shots. He also scored 15 points to go with five rebounds in a win over LSU.

Jeffery Taylor And Double Digits

Taylor tallied 13 points against South Carolina, the 24th time he has scored in double figures this season and the 45th of his career. He has started every game of his two-year Vanderbilt career.

Taylor and FG%

Earlier this season against Tennessee State on December 19, he was 10-for-11 (90.9%) from the floor in a 20-point effort, which set a new individual single-game FG% record at Memorial Gym. The previous record was 90.0 (minimum 10 attempts) by Vanderbilt's Brett Burrow on Feb. 16, 1985 against Tennessee.

Walker Returns From Torn ACL And Excels

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and is a sophomore this year, has started in all but one game so far this year and is averaging 6.1 points and 5.5 rebounds per game. Walker has five games this season with at least five assists, and has either tied for the team lead or led the team in assists eight times this year.

Walker Gets Career High Vs. Georgia

Walker scored a career-high 17 points in a career-best 38 minutes in an overtime, 96-94, win over Georgia on February 25. Walker was a perfect 6-for-6 from the charity stripe, grabbed six rebounds, had three assists, and three blocks in the win over the Bulldogs. In the SEC quarterfinals against the Bulldogs, the sophomore forward had six points, 10 rebounds, four assists, three blocks, and two steals.

Walker And Double Figures

Walker has scored in double figures in four games this season.

Commodores Add John Jenkins To The Fold

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year. So far in 2009-10, Jenkins has scored in double figures 18 times and is averaging 10.9 points per game.

Jenkins Named To All-SEC Freshman team and SEC's Sixth Man of the Year

The freshman was named to the All-SEC freshman team and was only the second Commodore player to be named as the league's Sixth Man of the Year. Scott Hundley was also awarded with the honor in 2004.

Jenkins Scores Career-High 25 Points Against Georgia In SEC Tournament

Jenkins was 7-of-10 from the floor, 5-of-8 from three, and 6-of-6 from the free throw line in a 25-point effort against Georgia in the SEC Quarterfinals on March 12. It was a career-high for the freshman.

Jenkins Impresses

Jenkins has scored in double figures in 14 out of his last 20 games. Earlier this year against Southern Miss on January 2, Jenkins tied a Memorial Gym record for three-point field goal percentage, making 6-of-6 from beyond the arc in route to a 20-point effort against the Golden Eagles. Jenkins tied Barry Booker, Kevin Anglin and Dawid Przybyszewski for the gym record. All four of the players that hold the record went 6-of-6 from beyond the arc.

Jenkins Wins Three SEC Freshman Of The Week Honors

Jenkins won three SEC Freshman of the Week honors this season. He averaged 13.5 points, 1.5 rebounds, and 1.5 assists in Vanderbilt's two wins Feb. 22-March 1. He was honored for his performances against Middle Tennessee State and Florida, January 4-11, when he averaged 13.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in two Commodore wins, and also for his performances against Manhattan and Southern Miss December 27-January 4, when he averaged 17.5 points, 3.5 rebounds.

Jenkins Sets Freshman Three-Point Made Record

Jenkins has now made 70 three-pointers in his freshman season, which sets a new Commodore record. Vanderbilt all-time leading scorer Shan Foster (2005) and current team member Brad Tinsley (2009) held the record prior to Jenkins, making 69 in their freshman seasons.

Vanderbilt Signs Three In Early Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that guard Kyle Fuller, center Josh Henderson, and forward Rod Odom have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2010.

Fuller, a 6'1 point guard from Moreno Valley, Calif., averaged nearly 20 points and nine assists per game in 2009 as a junior to lead his Rancho Verde High School team to a 24-6 record and trip to the sectional quarterfinals. This summer, he averaged almost 25 points and 10 assists per contest for his Inland Empire 17 and Under AAU Squad. Fuller will be the Commodores' third player from California on the roster, joining Festus Ezeli and Darshawn McClellan.

Fuller chose the Commodores over California, UCLA, and Marquette.

Henderson, a 6'11 center, comes to Vanderbilt from Roanoke, Va., where he plays at Cave Spring High School. He averaged 17.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior with the Knights. Henderson, who has maintained a 3.5 GPA in high school, chose the Commodores over Davidson, Virginia, and Wake Forest.

6'8 forward Rod Odom, from Bellport, N.Y., closes out the early signing class for the Commodores. Odom, ranked the 77th best prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, is a long, athletic forward who averaged 16.5 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks at Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., as a junior. Odom chose Vanderbilt over Arizona, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and West Virginia.

Barry Stewart and Dee Bost each scored 14 points to lead Mississippi State to a 62-52 win over Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) in the SEC semifinals at Bridgestone Arena.

Phil Turner and Jarvis Varnado also added 11 for the Bulldogs, who won four straight games in the 2009 tournament for their first title in seven years. They received a first-round bye this time after sharing the SEC West Division crown with Mississippi, a team they beat twice this season.

Jermaine Beal scored 11 for Vanderbilt (24-8), which was hoping to reach the SEC tournament championship game for only the second time. The Commodores made the final and won in 1951 and have lost two other times in the semifinals since the league split into divisions in 1992.

With a 33-29 lead just after halftime, Mississippi State went on an 11-0 run. Kodi Augustus blocked a shot by Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor, and Bost made a fast-break layup to give the Bulldogs a 44-29 lead with 17:13 left.

Ogilvy had only two free throws, and Jenkins scored seven points after having a career-high 25 in the Commodores' quarterfinal win over Georgia. Beal was four points below his average.

Vanderbilt started to show signs of life when a three-point play by Taylor and a 3 by Brad Tinsley launched a 10-0 run. After a pair of free throws by Varnado, Tinsley sank another 3 to cut Mississippi State's lead to 51-48 with 5:37 left. The Bulldogs clamped down on defense and answered with a 9-1 run to seal the win.

2009-10 PRESEASON NOTES

Returning for the Commodores...

The Commodores return 14 letterwinners from a year ago, including all five starters for a team that finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play in 2008-09. Vanderbilt missed the postseason for the first time for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal is back after leading the SEC for the second consecutive season in assist-to-turnover ratio, while also increasing his scoring average to 12.5 points per game as a junior, a 4.9 point-per-game increase from his sophomore season. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, is one of the program's hardest workers and will lead the Commodores as the only senior on the squad.

The other four starters returning for Vanderbilt include junior center A.J. Ogilvy (15.4 points, 7.1 rebounds per game), sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor (12.5 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard Brad Tinsley (11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds), and a combination of Steve Tchiengang (3.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Darshawn McClellan (2.1 points, 3.0 rebounds) at the power forward position.

Other returning letterwinners include redshirt sophomore wing Charles Hinkle, redshirt sophomore center Festus Ezeli, sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne, redshirt sophomore forward Andre Walker, junior forward Joe Duffy, and walkons Chris Meriwether and Aaron Noll.

6'6 guard Jordan Smart returns after redshirting a year ago, and the only newcomer to the fold, freshman guard John Jenkins, also joins the team.

Walk-on junior guard Elliott Cole will miss the entire season due to a shoulder injury.

Player Accolades

Then-sophomore center **A.J. Ogilvy** was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches at the end of the 2008-09 campaign and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman **Jeffery Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and **Elliott Cole**, **Joe Duffy**, and **Andre Walker** were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marked the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

Leaders From 2008-09 Season

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Ogilvy Named To Preseason All-SEC 1st Team

League coaches have named A.J. Ogilvy to their preseason All-SEC first team. He was a second-team All-SEC preseason selection by SEC media.

Ogilvy Reaches 1,000-Point Plateau

With his performance against LSU on March 4th of 2009, Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of

Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000 point barrier. He has 1,041 points in his career. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points).

Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game in 2008-09, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

Block Party In 2008-09

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley did not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings in 2008-09 because they did not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would have placed in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would have tied for fifth at 40.3% (58-144), and Tinsley would have been third at 41.1% (69-168). Evaldus Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 52.1% (38-73).

Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish third in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 90 points in the poll to finish behind Kentucky (148), and Tennessee (117). South Carolina was chosen fourth (77), Florida fifth (68) and Georgia was chosen sixth (25).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 144 votes, 24 votes better than Ole Miss (120). Kentucky received 20 out of the 25 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received three votes and Tennessee received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 58TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 58th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

* The Commodores have posted a 695-188 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.

* VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

* Vanderbilt has won 115 of its last 122 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 162-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).

* The Commodores are 95-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

Andre Walker had 14 points for the Commodores (2-0). Omar Samhan scored 25 points and grabbed 18 rebounds for St. Mary's (2-1), and freshman guard Matthew Dellavedova had 19 points. St. Mary's cut Vanderbilt's lead to 71-70 with 9.3 seconds left when Ben Allen grabbed a loose ball and scored from the key. After Vanderbilt inbounded the ball, Mickey McConnell quickly fouled Vanderbilt's Brad Tinsley. He made one of two free throws, making it 72-70. Clint Steindl's 3-point try at the buzzer went in and out, and the Commodores escaped with a victory. Vanderbilt opened the second half with a 9-0 run, building a 48-39 lead with 17:30 left. Taylor ignited the burst with a fast-break slam after a Gaels turnover. Moments later he had another slam at the end of a break. Walker made it 44-39, scoring inside on yet another fast break. Samhan finally ended the Gaels' drought with put-back with 16:45 left, but the Commodores went on another run, this time outscoring St. Mary's 9-2 to take a 57-43 lead. St. Mary's, though, quickly got back into the game. The Gaels sliced Vanderbilt's 14-point lead to just one at 59-58. A.J. Ogilvy and Jermaine Beal combined to score 46 points, including 28 in the second half to propel the Commodores to a 95-87 win over Florida in the Southeastern Conference opener.

VU had four players finish in double figures, led by Ogilvy's 24. Beal chipped in a season-high 22 points while Jeffery Taylor and John Jenkins added 14 and 13 points, respectively. Andre Walker posted an excellent all-around effort with eight points, 10 rebounds, and career-high seven assists.

With the win, Vanderbilt improves to 12-3 overall and 1-0 in the SEC. The loss drops Florida to 11-4 and 0-1 in league play.

The 95 points scored against Florida marks the highest point total against the Gators since the 'Dores recorded a 105-85 win over the Gators in Nashville during the 1979-80 season.

Vanderbilt got the Gators into foul trouble and outscored them 20-8 off turnovers.

Kenny Boynton had a career-high 28 points for Florida. Erving Walker also had a career-best 22. Alex Tyus added 12, and Dan Werner 11. Vernon Macklin and Chris Murphy each fouled out with more than six minutes remaining.

When Jeffery Taylor stepped to the free throw line with the game tied, Vanderbilt teammate A.J. Ogilvy wasn't worried.

And when the first foul shot didn't fall? No sweat. "He never misses two in a row," Ogilvy said.

Taylor didn't this time either, making one of two free-throw attempts with six seconds left to help the Commodores complete a come-from-behind 65-64 victory over Alabama on Wednesday night.

The Crimson Tide's Anthony Brock then missed a shot in traffic and JaMychal Green couldn't control the ball for a follow-up attempt as the final seconds ticked off with the Commodores (13-3, 2-0 SEC) claiming their seventh consecutive win.

Taylor and Ogilvy each had 13 points and nine rebounds for the Commodores, with Taylor scoring 11 in the second half. Jermaine Beal and John Jenkins scored 11 points apiece. Ogilvy played the final five minutes with four fouls.

Vanderbilt went 20-of-37 from the line and made just half of its 12 attempts in the final 5 minutes. It was just enough as Alabama went the final 3 minutes without a field goal.

Alabama was 10-of-17 from the line. The Tide shot 47 percent while the Commodores hit just 39 percent, but Vanderbilt was 5-of-10 on 3-pointers.

Vanderbilt won its eighth straight and improved to 3-0 in the SEC for the first time since the 1989-90 season. Ogilvy, a 6-foot-11 junior, was too much for the Gamecocks to contain underneath. He made 7 of 8 shots from the floor and 8 of 13 from the foul line as Vanderbilt (14-3, 3-0) won its eighth straight.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting. Devan Downey had a season-high 35 points for South Carolina (11-6, 2-1), the third time this season he's surpassed 30.

John Jenkins' 3-pointer with 38.5 seconds to go pushed the Commodores' lead to 41-33. But Downey drove through three defenders for a layup with 1 second left.

Downey finished with 18 of his team's 35 points in the first half.

Vanderbilt adjusted its defense and took Downey's penetration away for the first 10 minutes after the break, building a 17-point lead after Brad Tinsley's two straight jumpers with 10:02 to go.

South Carolina could not come closer than eight points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's depth also wore down the Gamecocks. Stallings shuttled players in and out, all who produced — each of the nine Commodores who played left with at least four points.

Vanderbilt shot better than 60 percent, many of those field goals coming from close to the basket. The Commodores also controlled the boards, outrebounding South Carolina 39-24.

A.J. Ogilvy bumbled around the basket. Jeffery Taylor struggled to find his shot. Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't mind. He still had Jermaine Beal available to rescue the Commodores.

Beal scored 25 points and Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 21 AP) won its 10th straight game with an 85-76 victory over No. 14 Tennessee. It was Vandy's first win in Knoxville in five tries and its first win over a ranked opponent this season.

Stallings has plenty to feel good about besides Beal's clutch play. Vanderbilt (16-3, 5-0 Southeastern Conference) is off to its best start in the league since 1966 and will head to No. 1 Kentucky with control of the SEC East.

J.P. Prince led Tennessee (15-4, 3-2) with 22 points, and Wayne Chism grabbed 16 rebounds. Scotty Hopson scored 14, while Maze added 12.

Vanderbilt shot 50.9 percent from the floor, the 11th time this season the Commodores have hit more than half their shots.

But it wasn't until the second half that they found their touch. Ogilvy finished with 12 after scoring two points in the first half. John Jenkins, Taylor and Tinsley each added 10 points.

DeMarcus Cousins posted his 12th double-double -- the most every by a Kentucky freshman -- with 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead a balanced attack as the Wildcats (20-1, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) served notice to the Commodores (16-4, 5-1) that they remain the team to beat in the SEC.

Cousins almost single-handedly gave Kentucky an early double-digit lead -- he converted four three-point plays in the game's first eight minutes -- and did his best to stay composed despite Vanderbilt's best efforts to rattle him.

When the Commodores tried to throw two or more bodies at Cousins, he would spin toward the baseline for an easy basket or kick it outside to an open teammate for a jumper -- the latest facet in his quickly developing game.

And there were good looks aplenty for the Wildcats, who made 12 of 23 3-point attempts and dominated the boards, outrebounding Vanderbilt 41-22, leading to 20 second-chance points.

Darnell Dodson had 16 points in just his second start of the season. Eric Bledsoe had 13 points and seven rebounds while Patrick Patterson chipped in 12 points.

Jermaine Beal led the Commodores with 19 points, but Vanderbilt couldn't pull off its second road upset of the week in a physical, whistle-plagued game that featured 58 fouls and very little flow. A.J. Ogilvy (12), Andre Walker (10), Jeffery Taylor (10), and John Jenkins (10) also added double figures for the Commodores.

The Vanderbilt Commodores are really comfortable playing at home in Memorial Gym. Against Mississippi State on Wednesday night, they almost got too cozy.

Jermaine Beal scored 17 points, and No. 18 Vanderbilt held off the Bulldogs 75-72, the Commodores' 11th win in 12 games.

Vanderbilt (17-4, 6-1 Southeastern Conference) bounced back after losing their first league game last weekend at then-No. 1 Kentucky. The Commodores had been on the road for four of the first six games in SEC play, and they looked very happy to be back home before a sold-out crowd where they hadn't lost this season.

But this hasn't been an easy series for the Commodores with Mississippi State having won seven of the past 10.

The Bulldogs (16-6, 4-3) almost did it again, fighting back from a 14-point deficit to get within 73-72 with 28.6 seconds left on a 3-pointer by Dee Bost. Vanderbilt's John Jenkins made two free throws with 6.8 seconds remaining, then Bost missed a 3 before Romero Osby of the Bulldogs missed two free throws with 1 second left.

A.J. Ogilvy added 16 points for Vanderbilt, while Jenkins had 12 and Brad Tinsley 11. The Commodores are 6-1 in SEC play for the first time since 1992-93.

Jarvis Varnado had 12 points, 14 rebounds and nine blocks - seven in the second half - for the Bulldogs. Kodi Augustus had 15 points, Barry Stewart 13 and Bost 12. Varnado and Stewart set the school record by playing in their 127th game.

The Bulldogs, pressured into constant turnovers most of the first 25 minutes, settled down and rallied to beat No. 18 Vanderbilt 72-58.

Georgia (10-11, 2-6) appeared bound for its fourth straight Southeastern Conference loss when it trailed early in the second half. But the Bulldogs recovered to shoot 53.2 percent for the game and end a three-game losing streak.

Georgia won for the first time since beating then-No. 8 Tennessee on Jan. 23. Trey Thompkins also had 17 points as the Bulldogs gave Vanderbilt (17-5, 6-2) its second loss in its last 13 games.

Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt with 21 points. Tinsley added 18, but the Commodores found too little scoring support for the two guards.

Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy had six points, ending a streak of scoring in double figures in 12 straight games. He led the Commodores with nine rebounds.

Beal and Tinsley made 9 of 13 shots from the field in the first half, but their teammates were 1 for 18. Vanderbilt made only 20 of 61 shots overall and matched its season low for points.

Georgia turned the ball over 13 times in the first half and trailed 36-28 early in the second half before rallying behind Travis Leslie, who scored 13 of his 17 points after the break.

The more composed Georgia offense abused Vanderbilt's man defense to make 14 of 21 shots in the second half while committing only eight turnovers.

Georgia's defense prevented Vanderbilt from its first 4-1 start in SEC road games since the 1966-67 season.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't know when Jeffery Taylor would break out. He just felt it would be soon.

The sophomore guard's timing couldn't have been better. Taylor scored 16 of his career-high 26 points in the first half, and Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 22 AP) never trailed in routing No. 12 Tennessee 90-71, grabbing sole possession of second place in the Southeastern Conference's Eastern Division, one loss behind Kentucky (No. 2 ESPN/USA Today, No. 3 AP).

The Commodores (18-5, 7-2) swept the season series against their in-state rival for the first time since 2004-05 -- the season before coach Bruce Pearl took over Tennessee. They did it with the best shooting performance at the free-throw line in Stallings' 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, connecting on 37 of 43.

Jermaine Beal scored 20 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 11 for Vanderbilt, which didn't miss reserve John Jenkins. The freshman, who had been averaging 10.4 points, was hospitalized with the flu Monday and was so ill he needed five bags of fluid intravenously.

Taylor hadn't scored more than 10 points in a game since Jan. 23 against Auburn. He couldn't miss against Tennessee as the sophomore was 4 of 5 from the field and perfect on all eight free throws in the first half.

J.P. Perfect led Tennessee with 19 points, Wayne Chism had 16, Melvin Goins 11 and Scotty Hopson 10.

The Commodores scored the first six points and led 44-27 at halftime. They hit eight of their first 11 shots as Tennessee missed 14 of its first 17 and eventually led by as many as 27 points twice.

Missing two players and playing for the first time since beating its in-state rival, Vanderbilt was in position for a letdown.

Lance Goulbourne wouldn't let that happen. The reserve forward scored a career-high 18 points -- 11 in the second half -- to lead the Commodores (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 22 AP) to a 77-69 victory over LSU.

Vanderbilt (19-5, 7-2 Southeastern Conference) was without starting forward Andre Walker (shoulder) and reserve guard John Jenkins, who missed his second straight game due to the stomach flu.

Goulbourne, who averages just 13 minutes a game, shouldered most of the load Saturday, playing 26 minutes. He was big on the glass with nine rebounds and clutch at the free throw line, where he was 7 of 9.

LSU (9-16, 0-11), which has lost 13 straight regular-season conference games dating to last season, erased an eight-point deficit in the second half. The Tigers tied it at 59-59 with more than 4 minutes left on a dunk by Garrett Green.

Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy responded on the other end with a basket and drew a foul. He missed the free throw but Goulbourne was there for the putback that gave the Commodores a 63-59 lead.

After LSU's Tasmin Mitchell scored inside, Ogilvy hit two more free throws and Jermaine Beal tacked on a three-point play for a 68-61 lead with 2:06 left.

Beal scored 17 points, Jeffery Taylor added 15 and Ogilvy had 12 for Vanderbilt.

Mitchell scored 18 of his 20 points in the second half, Bo Spencer added 18, Storm Warren had 12 and Dennis Harris scored 10 for LSU, which hasn't won a league game in the regular season since Feb. 28, 2009, at Kentucky.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 27 points and made all eight free throws attempts in the final 4 minutes to lead No. 17 Vanderbilt to an 82-78 victory over Mississippi.

The Commodores (20-5, 9-2 Southeastern Conference) did it their way, grinding down the Rebels (17-8, 5-6) late with a relentless inside game that led to 34 free throw attempts -- three above their average in league play. Vanderbilt hit 19 of 22 free throws over the final 6:07 for its third straight win and 14th in 16 games.

It was the fourth loss in five games for Ole Miss, which is fading from the NCAA picture after reaching as high as No. 14 in the Top 25 before falling out two weeks ago.

Ogilvy was 8 of 10 from the field and 11 of 13 from the free throw line, while Jeffery Taylor added 19 points. Jermaine Beal hit 9 of 10 free throws to finish with 14 points.

Chris Warren led Mississippi with 23 points, but like many of the Rebels he spent much of the second half in foul trouble and was never a consistent threat.

Ole Miss opened the game with a flurry, scoring 16 points in the first 3:52 to take its biggest lead, 16-5. The Rebels were 5 of 6 from the field and 4 of 4 from 3-point range in that span. After that, though, they went cold, missing 18 of their next 22 shots and scoring just 12 more points in the half.

The Commodores hit 6 of 6 free throws during an 18-8 run in which the Rebels missed 4 of 5 attempts from the line. Murphy Holloway missed the first shot of a 1-and-1 -- his third failure to convert the bonus -- and Reginald Buckner missed two attempts as Vanderbilt made its move.

That gave the Commodores a 65-60 lead and though the Rebels kept it close, Ogilvy and Beal hit Vanderbilt's final eight free throws for the win.

John Wall sank a pair of free throws with 20 seconds left and had a big blocked shot to send No. 2 Kentucky to a 58-56 win over No. 17 Vanderbilt.

Kentucky (26-1, 11-1 SEC), which beat Vanderbilt 85-72 on Jan. 30, grabbed a two-game lead over Vanderbilt in the SEC East and dealt the Commodores (20-6, 9-3) their first home loss this season. It was the first time the Wildcats swept the regular season series since 2005.

Wall's free throws gave the Wildcats a 57-53 lead, but John Jenkins answered with a 3-pointer to pull Vanderbilt within a point.

Kentucky's Eric Bledsoe missed a pair of free throws, but Wall responded by blocking a 3-pointer by Jenkins on the other end and grabbing the ball.

He made one of two free throws for a two-point lead with 2.5 seconds to play, and the Commodores had one more chance.

A.J. Ogilvy caught a long in-bounds pass by Darshawn McClellan, but his runner in the lane bounced off the rim at the buzzer.

Cousins led Kentucky with 19 points and Patrick Patterson chipped in 13.

Taylor scored 17 points for Vanderbilt, which was a woe-of 2 for 20 from 3-point range.

Vanderbilt, the SEC's most prolific free-throw shooting team, used free throws to keep up with the Wildcats, and a pair by Taylor with 6:08 to go gave the Commodores a 49-45 lead, their largest of the game.

It didn't last long. Thanks to some free throws by Cousins, a layup by Bledsoe and a 3-pointer by Patterson, Kentucky scored the next eight points to grab a 53-49 lead with 2:57 left.

Georgia looked ready to make it three after beating the Commodores in Athens 72-58 on Feb. 6 and losing on the final possession 96-94 in overtime a couple miles away from the Bridgestone Arena on Feb. 25.

These teams looked ready to go to overtime for a second straight game in this series as they swapped the lead back and forth in the opening minutes. Beal's jumper put Vanderbilt ahead 10-9 with 15:16 left, and the Commodores never trailed again.

But, Georgia was brimming with confidence -- if not energy -- after thumping Arkansas about 24 hours ago and just missing a chance to sweep the season series from Vanderbilt with that overtime loss.
