Commodores Meet Richmond Spiders In 2nd Round of NCAA Tournament

The number five seeded Vanderbilt Commodores will open NCAA Tournament play at the Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo., against the #12-seed Richmond Spiders in their 12th career NCAA Tournament appearance. The game tips off at approximately 3:10 p.m. CT, and can be heard live on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com, and seen live on TBS and CBSSports.com.

Verne Lundquist and Bill Raftery will have the call for the television broadcast on TBS.

Vanderbilt will be making its 12th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and their fifth since 2004, and have a 9-12 all-time record at the tournament. The Commodores have advanced to the regional semifinals four times since the field expanded to 64+ teams (1988, 1993, 2004, 2007) and advanced to the Elite Eight on one occasion, in 1965, when the field was only 23 teams.

Vanderbilt will be making its first appearance as a number five seed and its first ever appearance in the state of Colorado.

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings owns a 5-6 mark in the NCAA Tournament. He is 4-4 in his fifth appearance at Vanderbilt (2004, 2007, 2008, 2010) and 1-2 in two appearances (1997, 1998) during his six-year tenure as head coach at Illinois State from 1994-1999.

Thursday's appearance will be the Commodores' first in the Southwest Regional, and it will be Vanderbilt's first meeting with the Spiders since November 25, 1978, when VU won at Richmond in the Spider Classic, 70-59.

The Spiders enter the game with a 27-7 record after capturing the Atlantic 10 Tournament title with a 67-54 win over Dayton on Sunday in Atlantic City. Richmond, who finished 13-3 in the Atlantic 10, is paced by two double-figure scorers, Justin Harper, who averages 17.9 points per game, and Kevin Anderson, who adds 16.5 points per contest. Harper is also the Spiders' leading rebounder, pulling down 7.0 rebounds per game.

The Commodores, who finished in the top three in the SEC in scoring, scoring margin, free throw percentage, field goal percentage, three-point field goal percentage, three-point field goal percentage defense, three-pointers made, and assists, are paced by the SEC's leading scorer, sophomore guard John Jenkins, who averages 19.5 points per game. Junior 6'7 swing man Jeffery Taylor pours in 15.1 points per game, redshirt junior big man Festus Ezeli adds 12.8 points and 6.2 rebounds per contest, and junior Brad Tinsley chips in 10.6 points per game. Tinsley leads the SEC in assists in all games with 4.5 per contest.

Vanderbilt and Tournament Teams

The Commodores have played 14 games against nine 2011 NCAA Tournament teams, and have posted a 6-8 record against those teams (vs. West Virginia and North Carolina in Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off, vs. Belmont, at Missouri, vs. Marquette, home-and-home with Georgia, Tennessee, and Kentucky, and three matchups with Florida).

Stallings Notches 6th 20-Win Season

With the win over Auburn on February 19, Kevin Stallings notched his sixth 20-win season in 12 seasons in Nashville. His six 20-win seasons ties Vanderbilt all-time win leader Roy Skinner for the most 20-win campaigns. Here's a look at his six 20-win seasons at Vanderbilt:

Stallings In SEC Play

Now in his 12th season of SEC play at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings has an 93-99 record in SEC play. This year's team went 9-7 in league play, and it marked the fourth time in five years his teams have won nine or more SEC games.

Free Throws

The Commodores finished the regular season as the SEC leader in free throw attempts with 814 (24.7 per game) in all games and 383 (23.9 per game) in the 16 league contests.

Commodores In Top 25

Vanderbilt dropped out of the AP poll in the final week of the poll and moved to 21st in the ESPN/USA Today poll this week.

It is the eighth week in the ESPN/USA Today rankings. Vanderbilt has been in the AP Poll for eight weeks this year.

This year marks the 20th season the Commodores have appeared in the Associated Press poll, and the fourth time in the last five.

Scouting Richmond

Vanderbilt's Record Against the Atlantic 10

Vanderbilt has a 19-13 all-time record against the Atlantic 10, and a 1-2 record against A-10 teams in the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores knocked off George Washington, 77-44, in the first round of the 2007 Tournament, in their last matchup. Temple knocked off VU, 67-59, in the Sweet 16 in 1993, and Xavier defeated Vanderbilt, 80-68, in the first round of the 1997 Tournament.

The Richmond Series

Vanderbilt owns a 2-0 series advantage against the Spiders. The two teams played a home-and-home series in 1977 and 1978, with VU winning the 1977 matchup at Memorial Gym, 101-68, and the 1978 game in Richmond, 70-59.

Stallings Versus Richmond

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has never faced Richmond.

Richmond-Vanderbilt Common Opponents

Vanderbilt and Richmond have not played a common opponent this season.

Overcoming The Injury Bug

The Commodores have fought the injury bug all season long, making Vanderbilt shuffle its starting lineup throughout the year. Andre Walker, who started the first eight games of the year, developed mononucleosis and then severely sprained his right ankle, and has been limited in minutes since the end of 2010. John Jenkins suffered a left toe injury against Florida in the regular season finale, and missed the opening round of the SEC Tournament against LSU.

Vanderbilt has used five different starting lineups this season.

Danero Thomas hit a 15-footer as the buzzer sounded and 13th-seeded Murray State stunned No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 on Thursday in an NCAA tournament opener in the West Regional.

Jermaine Beal made two free throws with 12.7 seconds left to give Vandy the lead. B.J. Jenkins missed a rushed 3-pointer on the other end, but the ball went out of bounds off a Vanderbilt player with 4.2 seconds left to give Murray State the final shot.

When it went down, Murray State's players sprinted to the other end of the floor and fell into a celebratory pile beneath the basket. Vandy star A.J. Ogilvy slumped to the floor in defeat, while his teammates crouched near their bench in utter disbelief.

Vandy knew it could happen. The Commodores have been in this tough position before.

Vanderbilt used a 7-0 burst to build a 60-56 lead with 3:46 left this time, getting five straight points from John Jenkins. Isaiah Canaan and B.J. Jenkins then hit consecutive 3s for Murray State to regain the lead.

Vandy's Festus Ezeli missed a pair of free throws off the front of the rim with 2:28 remaining -- and the misses proved costly.

No Vanderbilt player reached double digits until Beal had 10 points with 17:21 left. He didn't score again until making the late free throws, finishing with 12. John Jenkins scored 13 and Ogilvy had 12 points and six rebounds.

SEC Preseason Poll

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fifth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 52 points in the poll to finish behind Florida (110), Kentucky (95), Georgia (72), and Tennessee (71). South Carolina was chosen sixth (20).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 118 votes, 34 votes better than Ole Miss (84).

Florida received eight votes from the league's media to win the SEC Championship.

Vanderbilt All-SEC Selections

Sophomore guard John Jenkins became the 52nd Vanderbilt player to make the All-SEC First Team since voting began in the 1948 campaign. The Commodores have had a player on the first team in five out of the last six years, and seven in the last 10. Vanderbilt's last first-team selection was Jermaine Beal in 2010.

Jeffery Taylor's selection is his second to the All-SEC second team, and also his second on the All-SEC Defensive Team. He also made the All-SEC freshman team in 2009. Festus Ezeli's selection to the All-SEC second team is his first all-league selection.

All-NABC Selections

Sophomore guard John Jenkins was named to the NABC All-District 21 first team, and Jeffery Taylor was named to the second team.

Jeffery Taylor Coming On

Junior Jeffery Taylor averaged 21.7 points per game in the three SEC Tournament game and had his third double-double of the season against LSU with a 21-points, 12-rebound performance in the first round in Atlanta last Thursday.

The Commodores are 17-3 in games in which he scores 15 points or more, with their only losses coming at Missouri (Taylor had 18 points) and vs. Florida at Memorial Gym (Taylor scored 15 points), and against the Gators in the SEC Tournament (21 points).

Festus Ezeli One Of Nation's Most Improved Players

6'11 redshirt junior center Festus Ezeli has seen his scoring and rebounding averages jump from 3.8 and 2.9, respectively, per game in 2009-10 to 12.8 points and 6.2 rebounds per game in 2010-11.

Ezeli has five double-doubles this year, 23 double-digit scoring games, and is the new Vanderbilt single-season blocks leader with 86 blocks this year.

Stay In The Game Fes!

When center Festus Ezeli has fouled out, the team is 1-4, with a win over Ole Miss and losses against Tennessee, at Florida, at South Carolina, and against West Virginia on a neutral floor.

Home Sweet Home

In 17 home games this year, the Commodores finished 14-3, averaged 80.3 points per game, and shot 49.1% from the floor. Vanderbilt also made 8.4 threes per game, shoots 41.9% from beyond-the-arc, and outrebounded opponents by a margin of +4.7. VU also shot 77.4% from the charity stripe at Memorial Gym.

In true road games this year, Vanderbilt finished 5-5 on the season and posted these percentages - 43.3% from the field and 35.0% from three. The Commodores were outrebounded by their opponents by +0.3, and converted 68.3% of their free throws.

3-Point Streak Continues Through 25th Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trex In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 795 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (804) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (674) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Commodores Finish Third In San Juan

Vanderbilt saw some good competition at the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off - the Commodores knocked off Nebraska and then-#8 North Carolina, and dropped a tough three-point decision to West Virginia in the tournament semifinals.

Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Kevin Stallings is 141-47 in non-conference games and an astounding 104-8 in home non-conference games.

VU Wins Finishes Non-Conference Unbeaten At Home

With the win over St. Mary's on January 22, the Commodores finished a perfect 10-0 at home in non-conference play, and pushed its non-conference home win streak to 21 (last loss vs. UIC on 12/8/08). VU has posted a 709-189 (.790) all-time record at the 59-year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference.

Vanderbilt Signs Three To NLI's

Vanderbilt head men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signing of 6'5 point guard **Kedren Johnson (Lewisburg, Tenn.)**, 6'8 forward **Shelby Moats (Waconia, Minn.)**, and 6'4 shooting guard **Dai-Jon Parker (Alpharetta, Ga.)** to National Letters of Intent. All three will be eligible to play for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2011-12.

Many have ranked the Commodores' group in their top 25 recruiting classes.

Henderson, Siakam Redshirting

Two class of 2010 members, center Josh Henderson and forward James Siakam, will redshirt the 2010-11 campaign.

Vanderbilt's History At The NCAA Tournament

Vanderbilt will be making its 12th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and their fourth since 2004, and have a 9-12 all-time record at the tournament. The Commodores have advanced to the regional semifinals four times since the field expanded to 64+ teams (1988, 1993, 2004, 2007) and advanced to the Elite Eight on one occasion, in 1965, when the field was only 23 teams.

Vanderbilt will be making its first appearance as a number five seed and its first ever appearance in the state of Colorado.

The Commodores' last appearance came in the 2010 tournament, when Vanderbilt, a four seed, fell to Murray State, a 13 seed, 66-65, in the first round in San Jose, Calif. The Racers' Danero Thomas hit a shot as time expired to give Murray State a win in one of the most exciting games of the tournament.

In the 2007 edition of the tournament, Vanderbilt, a #6 seed, knocked off #11 George Washington, 77-44, and #3 Washington State, 78-74, in a double overtime classic, at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. The Commodores were defeated by #2 Georgetown, 66-65, in the East Regional semifinals at Continental Airlines Arena in East Rutherford, N.J.

In 2004, VU advanced to the Sweet 16 as a number six seed in the Phoenix regional, defeating No. 11 seed Western Michigan (71-58) and No. 3 seed N.C. State (75-73) in Orlando, Fla. The Commodores then lost to eventual national champion, No. 1 seed Connecticut, 73-53, in Phoenix, Ariz.

- Vanderbilt has a -1.0 scoring margin in the five games and has a 2-3 record (at Kentucky, Florida, LSU, Mississippi State, Florida). The last three games were at the SEC Tournament in Atlanta.
- The Commodores are 77-101 from the charity stripe (.762), compared to 64-80 (.800) for its opponents.
- Vanderbilt is outshooting their opponents, 44.8% to 44.3%.
- Vanderbilt is shooting 26.2% (77-101) from three, and are allowing their opponents 41.5% from three.
- Opponents are outrebounding Vanderbilt by a 3.2 margin.
- Jenkins is shooting .917 (11-12) from the free-throw line; Lance Goulbourne is shooting .786 (11-14), and Jeffery Taylor .739 (17-23).

MORE TIDBITS

- Vanderbilt finished its non-conference season at 12-2, with the losses coming to West Virginia, who made a three with eight seconds remaining in regulation to get the win, and to Missouri, which came on the road in overtime.
- VU finished 10-0 in non-conference games at Memorial Gym and have won 21 consecutive non-conference games on their home floor.
- Commodores finished the season 14-3 at home, the seventh season under Stallings' tenure in which VU has won 14 or more home games.
- Vanderbilt finished 9-7 in conference play, the fourth time in five years VU has had 9 or more SEC wins.
- VU has had 24 halves of 50% or better shooting this season, and six in which the Commodores have held their opponents to below 30% shooting.
- This is the first time Vanderbilt has been a number five seed.

Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 709-191 (.788) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 124 of its last 131 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 171-15 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 104-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

SAN JUAN, P.R. - John Jenkins scored 16 points, and Festus Ezeli and Jeffery Taylor each had 15 to lead Vanderbilt to a 72-65 win over No. 8 North Carolina on Sunday night in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament.

The Commodores (3-1) beat a top-10 team for the first time since knocking off No. 1 Tennessee on Feb. 26, 2008.

UNC's Tyler Zeller had 20 points and 10 rebounds for North Carolina, and freshman Harrison Barnes rebounded from a poor performance to score 11.

Outside of Zeller, the Tar Heels had no offensive threat inside or out. He made seven baskets, and no one else made more than four.

That wasn't a problem for the Commodores. Taylor and Ezeli were tough inside, with 16 rebounds and three blocked shots between them. Jenkins did his work from the free-throw line with a 10-for-12 effort that first built the lead, then helped Vanderbilt keep it for the win. The Commodores bounced back after losing in the final seconds to West Virginia on Friday.

The Tar Heels had made a last gasp effort for the win when they got the ball inside to Zeller, who got the basket and the foul. Vanderbilt forward Andre Walker fouled out on the play and Zeller made the free throw to make it 59-57.

It wasn't enough.

Vanderbilt fattened the lead from the free-throw line and Taylor slid down the baseline for a bank-layup and a 65-58 lead. Lance Goulbourne slammed home a 3-point miss for a seven-point lead with 1:20 left.

Notes

- The Commodores finished the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off with a 2-1 record after knocking off North Carolina Sunday.
- The series record moves to 6-4 in favor of North Carolina. It was the first meeting between the two schools since 1995.
- Vanderbilt knocked off a top 10 team for the first time since defeating number one Tennessee, 72-69, on Feb. 26, 2008. The Commodores are now 82-101 in games against teams in the AP Top 25 all-time (since 1949) and 7-13 on neutral floors.

Ezeli had 11 points and 13 rebounds, and the Commodores (4-1) played the second half without the services of preseason All-SEC pick Jeffery Taylor.

Taylor took a blow to his left eye with about 5 minutes to play in the first half on an intentional foul by Tigers guard Rupert Rose.

The 6-foot-7 junior forward was on the floor for a couple of minutes and didn't return because of blurry vision.

The outcome was still in doubt at the half as Vanderbilt shot 33 percent and led just 40-38.

Grambling (1-5) hung around in large part because of Justin Patton, who had 15 points in the first half and finished with 20.

Brad Tinsley added 14 points and Steve Tchien-gang had a career-high 12.

Vanderbilt took a 35-17 lead into halftime. The Commodores shot 50 percent from 3-point range (6 of 12), including three consecutive 3s as part of an 11-0 run that pushed their lead to 35-13.

Jenkins had eight points at the break. Odom had six on the strength of two 3-pointers and Ezeli had six.

Western Kentucky committed 16 turnovers in the first half that led to 17 points the other way.

Vanderbilt didn't take great care of the ball in a sloppy first half either, turning it over 12 times. But the Hilltoppers couldn't take advantage, shooting just 8 of 28 (28.6 percent) and making 1 of 9 3 pointers.

MURFREESBORO - Jeffery Taylor led four Vanderbilt players in double figures with 18 points as the Commodores beat rival Middle Tennessee 72-53.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

The Commodores built a 14-point lead at the half and the Blue Raiders (4-8) never got closer than eight in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 36 free throws, 26 in the second half, to just 14 for Middle Tennessee.

Jason Jones led Middle with 15 points. The Blue Raiders have lost four in a row.

Vanderbilt had its largest lead of the first half, 41-27, at the half when Brad Tinsley went coast to coast with an inbounds pass after a free throw by Middle's Kerry Hammonds. Tinsley's layup came a second before the buzzer.

The Blue Raiders had cut the lead to six at 30-24 with 1:53 to go when Jenkins took over. He scored nine of his 11 first-half points in a 60-second span beginning at 1:38 when he grabbed an offensive rebound along the left baseline and hit a stepback 3-pointer.

Jenkins followed with a steal near halfcourt, drove the right side, made the layup and converted the three-point play after getting fouled by Middle's Kyle Hunt. Forty-nine seconds later Jenkins' long 3-pointer up top made it 39-26.

NASHVILLE - Over the past six games Vanderbilt (No. 24 AP) has gotten used to playing without its roster intact. It's a good thing, too, because it may be a while before coach Kevin Stallings can utilize his full complement of players.

The Commodores (11-2) were without two starters Sunday, including leading scorer John Jenkins. It mattered little, though, as they blasted Davidson 80-52.

Jeffery Taylor scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, while Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each added 14 and Festus Ezeli chipped in 12. Tinsley, a 6-foot-3 guard, was the game's leading rebounder with 10.

Taylor finished 6 of 10 from the field and 9 of 10 from the free throw line. Vanderbilt shot 43.4 percent (23 of 53) and held Davidson to a season-low 29.3 percent (22 of 75).

Jenkins, a sophomore shooting guard who is averaging 17.8 points per game, and Andre Walker, a 6-7 junior forward who averages 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists, both sustained injuries in practice.

Freshman Chris Czerapowicz had 16 points to lead Davidson (7-6). Jake Cohen, the Wildcats' leading scorer at 14.9 points, was held to a season-low two points. He fouled out with 9:06 to play.

Vanderbilt used a 15-0 run to take a 23-6 lead with 11:05 to go in the first half. Tchiengang started the run with a 3-pointer on the right wing, and Tinsley capped it 5 minutes later with a 3-pointer from almost the identical spot.

- The Commodores led at halftime (52-24) for the eighth time this season. VU is 8-0 on the season when leading at the half.
- The 28 point halftime lead was the second largest of the season for the Commodores. VU led SE Louisiana by 29 at halftime (12/18/10)

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina was up eight and as the final seconds ticked away, Vanderbilt went up for what appeared to be a meaningless layup.

But the Gamecocks' Sam Muldrow leaped up, got his fingertips on the ball, and ended up in his school's record books, getting just the second triple-double in South Carolina's history in an 83-75 win over the No. 22 Commodores in Columbia.

Muldrow owned overtime, getting five points, including a crucial 3, and four blocks in the extra period.

Freshman Bruce Ellington, in his first league game, got the Gamecocks (10-4, 1-0) to overtime. He scored 12 of the Gamecocks final 15 points in regulation

-- burying four 3-pointers in seven minutes, including the final points of the second half that tied it at 72 with 2:09 to go.

He then gave South Carolina its first lead of the game with a layup on the first possession of overtime and his quick pass to Muldrow for an open 3 put South Carolina up 81-75 with 2:18 to go.

Ellington finished with 22 points and has scored at least 20 in five of the first 14 games of his college career.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt (11-3, 0-1) with 27 points after missing the last game with a concussion. Jeffery Taylor added 14 points and Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 14 rebounds for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt jumped to an 11-point lead in the first 14 minutes of the game. But the Commodores could never put the Gamecocks away.

KNOXVILLE - Tobias Harris hit a layup and a pair of free throws in the final 1:09 as Tennessee erased a 17-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt 67-64.

After Harris' layup with 1:09 left and a timeout, John Jenkins stepped out of bounds with 44 seconds left. Melvin Goins missed two shots for the Vols, and Brad Tinsley fouled Brian Williams with 2.7 seconds left as he grabbed the rebound.

Instead of letting Tennessee take the ball in bounds, Rod Odom fouled Tobias Harris, sending him to the line for one-and-one. Harris hit both shots, and Williams stole the ball as Tinsley threw it in bound and the clock ran out.

It was the second time this season the Commodores watched a solid lead unravel. In an 83-75 overtime loss to South Carolina on Jan. 8, the Dores led by 11 points with 8:42 in the second half when the Gamecocks went on a 20-9 run to close out regulation.

Vanderbilt pushed the first-half margin to 17 points on a free throw by Tinsley with 2:03 before halftime, but Tennessee put together a modest 7-0 run to close the half and cut the halftime margin to 30-20 in favor of the Dores.

The Vols used 48.7 percent shooting after the break to slowly chip away at the Commodores' lead, and a 3-pointer by Cameron Tatum with 3:03 to go gave them their first lead of the second half. Harris finished with 15 points, Tatum had 12 and Skylar McBee had 10.

Jenkins led the Commodores (12-4, 1-2) with 21 points, Jeffery Taylor had 14 and Tinsley 12.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins led five Commodores in double figures with 20 points, and Vanderbilt beat Mississippi 84-74 to send the Rebels to their worst start in Southeastern Conference play since 2000.

The Commodores (13-4, 2-2) needed this win on their home court after dropping their first two road games in the SEC and falling to the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Mississippi (12-7, 0-4) now is off to its worst league start since dropping its first five SEC games in 2000.

Festus Ezeli had 16 points after going 10 of 12 at the free-throw line for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 15 points, and Lance Goulbourne had 14 and tied the Stallings' era team record with 16 rebounds for Vanderbilt. Dawid Przybyszewski last had 16 rebounds Nov. 19, 2004. Brad Tinsley added 14 points.

Chris Warren and Dundercous Nelson had 17 apiece for Ole Miss, Zach Graham 14 and Terrance Henry 11.

The Commodores outshot Ole Miss all over the court, hitting 8-of-16 from beyond the arc and had a big edge at the foul line (28-of-34 compared to 14-of-16). Vandy also outrebounded Ole Miss 41-25.

Ole Miss led 42-39 at halftime after surviving a cold shooting start when the Rebels hit just three of their first 11 shots, and Warren was just 2-of-8 from the floor in the first half. Vanderbilt led by as much as nine early, but the Rebels finally warmed up.

STARKVILLE - Jeffrey Taylor scored 25 points and John Jenkins added 21 as No. 19 Vanderbilt rallied for an 81-74 victory over Mississippi State.

The Commodores (15-4, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) won at Humphrey Coliseum for the first time since 1993, breaking a streak of eight straight losses in Starkville. Vanderbilt trailed by as many as nine points, but used a 12-0 run late in the second half to recover for its third straight victory.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points for Vanderbilt while Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 77-74 with 20 seconds remaining when Taylor stole the ball in the press and dunked for the clinching basket. The 6-foot-7 junior was 9 of 18 from the field and had five rebounds, three steals and two assists.

Jenkins made 9 of 9 free throws, including seven during Vanderbilt's crucial 12-0 run that turned a 66-59 deficit into a 71-66 lead.

Ravarn Johnson scored 19 points and Dee Bost added 18 for the Bulldogs (10-9, 2-3), who shot 26 of 58 (44.8 percent) from the field. Mississippi State struggled from 3-point range, making just 8 of 29 (27.6 percent).

Renardo Sidney, MSU's best post player, battled foul trouble for most of the game. The 6-10, 275-pound sophomore finished with six points and five rebounds in just 13 minutes.

- Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings got the first win of his career in Starkville. His overall record at the Humphrey Coliseum is now 1-5, and against the Bulldogs overall, he is now 7-8. Stallings has now won in every SEC venue.

NASHVILLE - Rotnei Clarke scored a season-high 36 points and Michael Sanchez had a career-best 20 as Arkansas upset No. 19 Vanderbilt 89-78, handing the Commodores' first home loss this season.

Vanderbilt (15-5, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) had won its first 11 at Memorial Gym, and the Commodores had a sold-out crowd cheering them on.

Arkansas (14-6, 4-3) hadn't had much success here, winning on only three of its previous 10 trips. The Razorbacks also had lost to the first two ranked teams they played this season. That didn't matter Saturday as they shot a season-high 57.4 percent.

They also outrebounded (30-22) and outdefended Vanderbilt. The Commodores only bettered Arkansas at the free throw line (25 of 26), which wasn't nearly enough.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt with 24 points. Festus Ezeli had 18 points, Jeff Taylor 13 and freshman Rod Odom had a season-high 12.

Sanchez missed all but four games last season with plantar fasciitis and sat out the first 11 games due to a stress fracture in his foot. That may be why the Commodores simply weren't ready for him. Sanchez wound up scoring more points than he had managed in the previous eight games combined (17), using his speed to dominate the Commodores in the paint.

The Razorbacks blew open a game that was tight in the opening minutes with five ties and seven lead changes, before Mardracus Wade's free throw put them up for good at 15-14 with 13:28 left. They built the margin to as many as 11, led 43-36 at halftime and pushed the lead to as much as 16 in the second half.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings challenged Jeffery Taylor to shut down South Carolina freshman Bruce Ellington.

The junior essentially did just that, allowing Ellington only two of his 13 points when it mattered, and Taylor also hit a career-high four 3-pointers in scoring 17 points as No. 24 Vanderbilt routed South Carolina 78-60 on Saturday to snap a two-game skid.

Ellington scored 22 points in helping South Carolina rally from a 14-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt on Jan. 8 to open Southeastern Conference play, and Stallings told Taylor two days ago that this would be his most important defensive game for the Commodores this season.

John Jenkins scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Festus Ezeli added 17, and Brad Tinsley had 11 points and nine assists.

South Carolina (13-8, 4-4) has lost three of four, and this one ties the Gamecocks with Vanderbilt at the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Ramon Galloway led South Carolina with 16 points before fouling out. Malik Cooke scored 12 and Sam Muldrow had 11.

Vanderbilt outshot the Gamecocks all over the court but dominated from beyond the arc. The Commodores hit 11 of 20 from 3-point range, their most 3s against an SEC opponent this season and just two shy of the 13 they hit in beating Southeastern Louisiana in December.

Notes

- Vanderbilt wore their gold uniforms for the first time this season.
- The Commodores wore the opening tip and are now 15-3 when doing so.
- VU went 2-2 from the free throw line in the first half, tying a season-low for free throws attempted in a half. The Commodores went 1-2 in games against Presbyterian and Western Kentucky.

NASHVILLE - Brad Tinsley sunk his off-balance jumper despite getting fouled and hit the free throw to help seal the victory for Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) in an 81-77 win over Alabama at Memorial Gym.

JaMychal Green thought he got fouled, too, seconds later only to see officials rule the Alabama forward stepped out of bounds trying to drive the baseline and tie up the game.

With Tinsley's three-point play with 17 seconds left, Vanderbilt beat Southeastern Conference-leading Alabama 81-77 on Thursday night. Alabama coach Anthony Grant said he'd have to check the replay, which he didn't have the benefit of seeing after the game.

Now Vanderbilt (17-6, 5-4) has won the first two games of a three-game homestand with No. 18 Kentucky visiting Saturday to remain knotted with three others for second in the SEC's Eastern Division. Tinsley's shot came off a screen, and he hit the shot even as Trevor Releford hit his arm.

Jenkins finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 19 before fouling out with 90 seconds left, Tinsley had 15 and Ezeli had 11. Taylor said it was great to watch his teammates close out a tight game, but difficult to watch from the bench helpless.

Green finished with 23 points for Alabama, including shooting 10 of 11 at the line. Tony Mitchell scored 22 points, and Releford had 11 before fouling out late.

The Tide came in with the nation's third-string defense and best in the SEC, holding opponents to 57.1 points per game. Vanderbilt is the SEC's best scoring offense, and the Commodores matched what Alabama had been allowing with less than 12 minutes left.

Notes

- With the win, Vanderbilt improved to 13-1 at home this year. The Commodores' 81-point performance Thursday marked their 10th time this year that they have scored at least 80 points at home (10-0).
- Vanderbilt improved to 13-1 on the year when Jeffery Taylor scores at least 15 points. Their only loss came at Missouri when Taylor had 18 points.

ATHENS - John Jenkins scored all of his 21 points in the second half and No. 18 Vandy rallied from a second-half deficit of 14 points to beat the Bulldogs 64-56.

Jenkins, the leading scorer in the Southeastern Conference, was scoreless before making a 3-pointer with 13:15 remaining when Georgia led 40-26. It was the first of five 3-pointers for the sophomore.

It was an important road victory for a Vanderbilt team best known for its home success. The Commodores (19-6, 7-4 SEC) are only 3-5 away from Nashville, including 2-3 in conference games.

The Bulldogs' last field goal came on a 3 by Travis Leslie for a 53-40 lead with 9:49 to go.

Led by Jenkins, Vanderbilt closed the game with a 24-3 run as Georgia managed only three free throws.

The Commodores moved past Georgia (17-8, 6-5) for second place in the SEC East. Gerald Robinson led the Bulldogs with 15 points.

Jenkins has scored in double figures in all 25 games this season, including 15 games with 20 or more points. He leads the SEC with his averages of 19.8 points overall and 22.3 in SEC games.

After ending his scoring drought, Jenkins had three more 3-pointers in a 12-0 run, capped by another 3 from Brad Tinsley, to cut Georgia's lead to 53-52.

Jenkins' fifth 3-pointer tied the game at 55, and he scored again to give Vanderbilt a 57-55 lead with 2:50 remaining. It was the Commodores' first lead since the opening minutes of the game.

AUBURN - Once John Jenkins and No. 18 Vanderbilt got going, Auburn couldn't keep up.

Jenkins scored 22 points and the streaking Commodores used a dominant four-minute stretch in the second half to turn a tie game into a 77-60 rout over the Tigers.

The Commodores (20-6, 8-4 SEC) went on a 23-4 run after Auburn (9-17, 2-10) managed to tie it six minutes into the second half. Their fifth straight victory gave Vandy its sixth 20-win season during coach Kevin Stallings' 12 years in charge.

This one might have been a little tougher than expected -- for a while, at least.

Then Jenkins and the Commodores got over it. He hit 5 of 11 3-pointers and scored 16 in the second half. Jeffery Taylor had 20 points and 10 rebounds for the Commodores while Brad Tinsley scored 16. Ezeli Festus only had six points but also blocked five shots.

Earnest Ross led Auburn with 19 points and Kenny Gabriel added 13. They were a combined 10-of-18 shooting while the rest of the team made just 12 of 32 attempts.

Ross also had 10 rebounds and five assists but committed six turnovers.

The Tigers tried to get the game 42-42 on back-to-back 3-pointers by Gabriel and Ross six minutes into the second half, but Vanderbilt quickly erased any hopes of an upset over the next four minutes.

The Commodores scored the next 14 points to start a 20-2 run.

BATON ROUGE - Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor gave his sizable rooting gallery every reason to be heard.

With more than two dozen relatives traveling from Texas and Louisiana to see him play, Taylor scored 20 points and the 18th-ranked Commodores outscored LSU 49-26 in the second half for a comfortable 90-69 victory.

John Jenkins overcame a slow start to finish with 17 points for Vanderbilt (21-7, 9-5 Southeastern Conference), which bounced back from its first loss in six games last Tuesday against state rival Tennessee.

Vanderbilt, which shot 54.4 percent (31 of 57), trailed 43-41 at halftime but surged into the lead for good early in the second half with a 14-0 run during which Taylor dunked twice and hit two free throws.

Vandy then held the Tigers to 25 percent shooting (8 of 32) in the second half.

Storm Warren had a career-high 24 points and Ralston Turner added 18 for LSU (11-18, 3-11), which has lost 11 of 12 games.

Andre Stringer scored 10 points for the Tigers, who on Wednesday had snapped a 10-game losing streak with a victory at Mississippi State.

A strong first half put LSU in position to make it two straight wins, but the Tigers wound up looking overmatched by the Commodores, who had five players in double figures, including Lance Goulbourne and Brad Tinsley with 16 each and Festus Ezeli with 15.

Notes

- Vanderbilt posted its first 90-point true road game since a 91-85 road win at DePaul on December 12, 2007. First 90-point game in the SEC since February 28, 2007 (99-90 overtime win).
- The Commodores shot 54.4% from the floor for the game, their highest percentage from the floor in SEC play and their highest FG percentage since shooting since shooting 60.7% as a team in the season opener against Presbyterian (11/12).
- First time VU has had at least four players with 15 or more points since November 22, 2005 against UNC Greensboro (Julian Terrell, Shan Foster, Derrick Byars, DeMarre Carroll).

LEXINGTON - Kentucky hadn't lost a game at Rupp Arena in two years. There was no way the Wildcats were going to let Vanderbilt ruin senior center Josh Harrellson's going away party.

An exhausted Harrellson flustered Vanderbilt's Festus Ezeli into mishandling a lob pass in the final second, allowing the 20th-ranked Wildcats to beat the 21st-ranked Commodores 68-66.

The Wildcats showed plenty of grit in the final 1:36 with freshmen Brandon Knight and Terrence Jones combining to make 7 of 8 free throws as Kentucky won its 34th straight home game, the third-longest streak in school history.

Knight finished with 17 points and Jones added 15 points and nine rebounds for Kentucky, which avenged a loss at Vanderbilt on Feb. 12 by slowing down star John Jenkins.

Jenkins torched the Wildcats for 32 points in the first meeting but was held to 16 this time.

Ezeli led the Commodores (21-8, 9-6) with 22 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks but also turned it over three times.

Still, Vanderbilt was able to do something most of the previous 33 visitors failed to do when walking into Rupp, it made the Wildcats work for it.

Notes

- Vanderbilt shot 44.8% for the game, compared to 42.4% for Kentucky. The Commodores moved to 16-4 when they outshoot their opponents in 2010-11.
- The Commodores were 2-for-11 from three, the fewest threes Vanderbilt has made this season. Previous low was three made threes against Tennessee on February 22. The 18.2 percentage from three is the team's lowest of the year.
- VU outrebounded Kentucky, 36-34. The Commodores move to 13-2 when outrebounding their opponent.

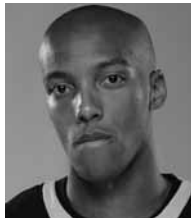
