**QUICK HITTERS**

- ★ Vanderbilt moved to 6-3 on the season and notched its first true road win of the season with an 87-83 victory over Southern Conference favorite Davidson on December 7. Jeffery Taylor scored a career-high 30 points to lead the Commodores.
- ★ John Jenkins scored 22 points, and continues to lead the SEC in scoring with 21.3 points per game and ranks first in the nation in three's made per game with 3.9 per contest.
- ★ The game was Jenkins' 5th 20-point performance of the season, and 26th of his career. He has also scored in double figures in 40 consecutive games.
- ★ Senior center Festus Ezeli returned from a suspension/sprained right knee to notch 15 points, six rebounds, and two blocks - it was his first action of the season.
- ★ Ezeli (154) is three blocks from tying Will Perdue's career blocks record with 157. Ezeli set the single-season block record last season with 87 blocks.
- ★ The game with Indiana State ends the longest break in between games this season - VU had 10 days off for final exams.
- ★ VU is only shooting 66.3% from the free-throw line this season. VU's last season under 70% from the charity stripe was 2005-06 (.697). Vanderbilt has had only six seasons under 70% since 1962-63.
- ★ For the season, Vanderbilt is allowing opponents to shoot 45.0% from the floor, which is currently the 11th-worst defensive percentage in the SEC. Offensively, the Commodores are shooting 45.6% from the floor and 35.7% from three.
- ★ The Dores have amassed three non-conference losses - VU has not lost four non-conference games in a season since the 2006-07 campaign (four losses).
- ★ The Commodores outrebounded the Wildcats, 38-32, on Dec. 7. Vanderbilt is 6-0 on the season when outrebounding their opponent. VU also outrebounded Davidson, 14-12, on the offensive glass.

**MORE ON THE INDIANA STATE SERIES**

★ Saturday's meeting will be the third in the all-time series. Indiana State won 88-77 in Terre Haute on 12/22/84 in the last meeting. This will be the second game at Memorial Gym between the two schools (VU won 72-66 on 12/19/81).

★ Coach Stallings is 10-3 all-time against Indiana State, with all meetings coming while he was the head coach at fellow MVC member Illinois State.

★ Vanderbilt has no players from the state of Indiana.

**MORE ON INDIANA STATE**

The Sycamores are 7-2 on the season and are the reigning Missouri Valley Conference Tournament champions. Dwayne Lathan leads the team in scoring with 11.8 points per game, while Lathan and Jake Odum lead the team on the glass with 5.1 rebounds per contest. Indiana State's two losses came against Minnesota in the Old Spice Classic in Orlando and at Boise State.

**THREE 1,000-POINT SCORERS**

Brad Tinsley scored 16 points against Monmouth and became the 43rd person to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier, and the second VU player this season to accomplish the feat. John Jenkins recently surpassed the 1,000-point mark to become the 42nd player earlier this year against Cleveland State. Jeffery Taylor is the third player in this year's starting lineup who has 1,000 points - he became the 41st player in Vanderbilt history to surpass the 1,000-point barrier last season. Festus Ezeli, who has returned from a sprained knee, has 687 career points.

**THREE ON WOODEN PRESEASON WATCH LIST**

The Commodores' Festus Ezeli, John Jenkins, and Jeffery Taylor are three of 50 players on the preseason Wooden Award Preseason Watch List - Vanderbilt, North Carolina, and Ohio State are the only three teams in the country with three players on the list.

**RECORD AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS**

Vanderbilt has an 85-208 record all-time against ranked opponents, and a 59-69 record against ranked opponents at home. In the Stallings era, Vanderbilt is 31-53 against ranked foes, and 22-18 in games at Memorial Gym. In 2010-11, Vanderbilt was 3-4 against ranked opponents and 3-1 at Memorial Gym. Louisville was the second consecutive ranked team Vanderbilt played - Xavier was the first ranked team VU has faced this season.

**LAST TIME OUT - VANDERBILT 87, DAVIDSON 83**

Jeffery Taylor scored a career-high 30 points on a career-best 12 made field goals to lead the Commodores to an 87-83 road win over Davidson on December 7. John Jenkins scored 22 points, and Festus Ezeli played 21 minutes in his season debut and tallied 15 points, six rebounds, and two blocks.

★ Vanderbilt moves to 4-1 all-time against Davidson and 1-1 against the Wildcats at Davidson.

★ The Commodores are now 1-1 in true road games in 2011-12, and have one non-conference road game left this season (at Marquette, 12/29).

★ Vanderbilt is 3-1 this season in black uniforms.

★ The Commodores won the opening tip, the eighth time this season that has happened and is now 6-2 in those games.

★ Davidson shot only 22.7% from three.

★ Vanderbilt shot 48.4% from the floor against the Wildcats, compared to 44.3%. The Dores were 46.7% from three, and 76.9% from the charity stripe.

★ The 76.9% clip from the free-throw line was the team's second-best performance of the season (best, Oregon State, .833 (5-6)).

★ The Commodores outrebounded the Wildcats, 38-32. Vanderbilt is 6-0 on the season when outrebounding their opponent. VU outrebounded Davidson, 14-12, on the offensive glass, and outscored the Wildcats, 14-11, in second-chance points.

★ Vanderbilt scored a season-high 42 points in the paint and also received 24 points from their bench.

★ Vanderbilt's largest lead of the game came at the 7:59 mark in the second half - an 18-point margin.

★ With Jeffery Taylor's three at the 15:17 mark in the first half, VU extended its consecutive game

streak with a three-pointer to 805 games.

- ★ Jeffery Taylor scored a career-high 30 points on 12-17 shooting from the floor. He was also 3-4 from beyond-the-arc. It was Vanderbilt's first 30-point individual performance since John Jenkins scored 32 points in a win over Kentucky on Feb. 12, 2011.
- ★ Taylor's 12 made field goals were also a career high.
- ★ Festus Ezeli returned from a sprained right knee to see his first action of the season. The 6'11 big man scored 15 points in 21 minutes, and also grabbed six boards.
- ★ Ezeli's seven made free throws tied for the team's second most by an individual this season. Brad Tinsley made eight free throws against Monmouth.
- ★ John Jenkins scored 22 points, his fifth 20+-point game of the season and 26th of his career.
- ★ Jenkins has also scored in double figures in 40 consecutive games.

**JENKINS LEADS SEC IN SCORING, NATION IN 3'S MADE**

Junior guard John Jenkins leads the SEC in scoring with 21.3 points per game, and also paces the league in three's made per game at 3.9 per game. He also leads the country in three's made per game.

**NEXT UP FOR COMMODORES**

Vanderbilt returns to Memorial Gym for the first time since November 28 for three games in five days, beginning with Indiana State on December 17. The Commodores play Longwood on December 19 and Lafayette on December 21.

**LOOKING FOR THREE CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS**

The Commodores have appeared in two consecutive NCAA Tournaments, and are seeking a third consecutive berth for the first time in the program's history.

**'DORES RPI STRONG, AS IS STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE**

In the latest RPI Ratings on RealTimeRPI.com, Vanderbilt is ranked seventh and the 'Dores Strength of Schedule is ranked third in the country.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE**

- ★ The 2011-12 slate of games may be one of the most difficult the Commodores have ever faced and one that could see the Commodores take on as many as 13 teams that participated in post-season play a year ago.
- ★ The home schedule includes the season opener against Pac-12 member Oregon (November 11) and a matchup with perennial NCAA tournament stalwart and Atlantic 10 member Xavier on November 28. VU travelled to Louisville, also ranked in the preseason top 10, as part of the Big East/SEC Invitational on December 2nd, and will also host the ESPN Gameday franchise for the first time from Memorial Gym on February 11 against Kentucky.
- ★ Other NCAA Tournament teams on this year's non-conference schedule - Bucknell (Nov. 19), Indiana State (Dec. 17), and Marquette (Dec. 29).

**COMMODORES ON TELEVISION**

Vanderbilt will appear on television 25 times in the regular season, with 17 slated for national broadcasts. Vanderbilt's game with Indiana State game is set for CSS and ESPN3, and the 'Dores' game against Lafayette will air on FSN South and ESPN3.

**AS JEFFERY TAYLOR GOES...**

So do the Commodores. Since 2010-11, Vanderbilt is 21-4 in games in which Taylor scores 15 or more points, and 8-10 in games in which he fails to reach the 15-point barrier.

**TAYLOR IS ACTIVE SEC LEADING SCORER**

Taylor is the active scoring leader in the SEC with 1,465 career points. He leads Florida's Erving Walker by 12 points. Taylor is also the SEC's second-leading active rebounder with 606.

**MEMORIAL GYM IN ITS 60TH SEASON**

- ★ The Commodores are now in their 60th season in the Southeastern Conference's oldest facility for basketball. Vanderbilt has an all-time record of 712-192 in its 60 years of existence.
- ★ In 2010-11, the Commodores finished 14-3, averaged 80.3 points per game, and shot 49.1% from the floor. Vanderbilt also made 8.4 3's per game, shot 41.9% from beyond-the-arc, and out rebounded opponents by a margin of +4.7. VU also shot 77.4% from the FT line at Memorial Gym.
- ★ Vanderbilt has won 127 of its last 136 home games against non-conference opponents.
- ★ Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 174-17 non-conference record at home (.916 win percentage).

**3-POINT STREAK CONTINUES THROUGH 25TH SEASON; VU ONE OF THREE TEAMS TO HIT A TREY IN EVERY GAME SINCE 1986-87 SEASON**

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 805 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (811) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (681) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

**COMMODORES SELL OUT OF SEASON TICKETS FOR FIFTH CONSECUTIVE SEASON**

Vanderbilt's games at Memorial Gym will once again be a hot ticket, with the 10,000+ season tickets allotted gone. The only single-game sales of tickets will be for the games in which Vanderbilt students are on holiday break - Saturday, December 17 vs. Indiana State (4:30 p.m.), Monday, December 19 vs. Longwood (7 p.m.), Wednesday, December 21 vs. Lafayette (7 p.m.), Monday, January 2 vs. Miami (OH) (7 p.m.). Tickets are \$20, and can be purchased on vucommodores.com or by calling 615-322-GOLD.

**NEW ADDITIONS**

The Commodores will welcome guards Dai-Jon Parker (6'4, Baton Rouge, La.) and Kedren Johnson (6'4, Lewisburg, Tenn.), as well as forward Shelby Moats (6'7, Waconia, Minn.) to the fold this season. Despite the return of five returning starters, each will push for playing time. Center Josh Henderson and forward James Siakam, who each redshirted last year, are also eligible for the Commodores.

**PRESEASON QUICK HITTERS**

- ★ Vanderbilt entered the 2011-12 campaign as the number seven team in the nation according to the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.
- ★ It marked the first time since November of 1993 (23rd) that the team had been ranked in the preseason, and it's the highest preseason ranking for a Commodore team since 1965, when VU was ranked fifth.
- ★ The Commodores return five starters from last year's team.
- ★ Junior John Jenkins, the SEC's leading scorer and leader in threes made in 2010-11 was named to the preseason All-SEC first team, along with senior forward Jeffery Taylor. Ezeli was named to the second team.
- ★ First time in the Stallings' era (since 1999) that he has had five returning starters.
- ★ Along with Jenkins, Ezeli, and Taylor, seniors Brad Tinsley (point guard) and Lance Goulbourne (forward) return as starters.
- ★ Tinsley led the SEC in assists in 2010-11 with 4.6 per game, and notched the schools' first-ever triple-double against Presbyterian (11 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists).
- ★ Goulbourne was the team's leading rebounder a season ago, and averaged 7.3 rebounds per game.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK BONANZA IN 2010-11**

Four of Vanderbilt's five starters (Brad Tinsley, John Jenkins, Lance Goulbourne, Festus Ezeli) claimed an SEC Player of the Week award last season.

**COMMODORES LED SEC IN SEVERAL CATEGORIES IN 2010-11**

Vanderbilt led the SEC in scoring in all games (75.9) and SEC games only (73.8 ppg). In all games, the Commodores finished statistically in the top three in scoring margin (3rd, +8.2), free throw percentage (2nd, .743), field goal percentage (3rd, .458), 3-point field goal percentage (2nd, .371), 3-point field goal percentage defense (2nd, .313), assists (3rd, 13.4), defensive rebounds (2nd, 26.0), and threes made (2nd, 7.7).

In SEC games only, Vanderbilt also led the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (30.5). VU finished in the top three in SEC games only in free throw percentage (2nd, .752), field goal percentage (3rd, .381), and threes made (3rd, 7.5).

**VANDERBILT AND NATIONAL RANKINGS**

The Commodores ended the 2010-11 season ranked 29th in the nation in scoring offense (75.9), 35th in scoring margin (+8.2), 27th in 3FG% defense (31.3%), 37th in free throw percentage (74.3), and 38th in blocks per game (4.8). Individually, John Jenkins ranked ninth in three-point field goals per game (3.1), 25th in three-point field goal percentage (40.8), and 30th in scoring (19.5 ppg). Festus Ezeli finished 18th in blocks per game (2.6), and Brad Tinsley ended the year 27th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.46).

A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-by-play broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a select number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 11th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 30th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

## COMMODORES LOSE TWO PLAYERS FROM LAST YEAR'S TEAM

Vanderbilt's Andre Walker and Darshawn McClellan, who each received their Vanderbilt degree in May of 2011, each transferred to another school for their fifth year of eligibility. Walker transferred to Xavier, whom the Commodores played on November 28 at Memorial Gym, and McClellan will use his final year of eligibility at Louisiana-Lafayette.

## GETTING TO THE LINE

For the second consecutive season (2009-10, 2010-11), Vanderbilt topped the league in free throws made and attempted in all games and in the 16 conference games. Vanderbilt attempted 837 free throws on the season, for an average of 24.6 attempts per game, and made 622 (18.3 per game). In league play, the Commodores attempted 383 free throws (23.9) and connected on 288 of those attempts (18.0).

Individually in 2010-11, Festus Ezeli was second in the league in free throw attempts with 216, with Jeffery Taylor finishing eighth in the conference with 167, and John Jenkins ninth with 161.

In 2011-12, the Commodores have made 130 free throws (196 attempts), compared to 119 makes by opponents (178 attempts).

## MORE FREE THROW NUMBERS

One more reason that the Commodores missed center Festus Ezeli - of the returning players in college basketball, Ezeli is the seventh-leading player in the country in terms of getting fouled. Ezeli was 140-216 from the charity stripe last season (64.8%).

**MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952**

**HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 60TH SEASON**

Storyed Memorial Gymnasium is in its 60th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 712-193 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 127 of its last 136 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 174-17 non-conference record at home (.911 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 107-10 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

Oregon fell to 0-4 when opening against a ranked opponent. But the Ducks didn't go down easily as Tony Woods had 12 points and Brett Kingma and E.J. Singler added 10 each.

Vanderbilt led by 20 with 13:36 to go, but Oregon came back with 14 straight points. The Ducks got as close as 62-57 on a jumper by Kingma with 5:09 left.

The Ducks finished with 20 turnovers, which Vandy turned into 24 points.

NASHVILLE - D'Aundray Brown had 18 points, eight rebounds and seven steals as Cleveland State upset No. 7 Vanderbilt 71-58 in a regional game of the Legends Classic.

Brown missed all of last season after tearing a tendon in his finger early, and the sophomore guard helped hold Vandy forward Jeffery Taylor to just nine points and forced the senior into six turnovers.

Cleveland State has four seniors back from a team that won the Horizon League last season. The Vikings hadn't played since an exhibition Wednesday night and looked very fresh, while Vanderbilt (1-1) appeared sloppy and slow after opening Friday night with a late tipoff against Oregon.

Cleveland State scored first on a 3-pointer by Trevon Harmon within the first minute and never trailed. The Vikings forced Vanderbilt into 21 turnovers - 15 of them steals. Harmon finished with 11 points and Jeremy Montgomery added 10.

John Jenkins, the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer with 19.5 points last season, had 17 for Vanderbilt. Lance Goulbourne added 11.

With the early tipoff, Cleveland State came into a Memorial Gym barely half full, and the Vikings jumped to a 16-point lead and were up 37-24 at halftime. They outshot Vanderbilt, hitting 50 percent (27 of 54) compared to 35.3 percent (18 of 51) and scored 22 points off the Commodores' turnovers.

The Commodores (2-1) bounced back after losing to Cleveland State to drop from No. 7. John Jenkins, the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer last season, hurt his right ankle in the loss when he stepped on a player's foot in the first half, while senior center Festus Ezeli is out with a sprained knee until at least December.

Brad Tinsley, Lance Goulbourne and Kedren Johnson each added 12 points. Rod Odom had 10.

Josh Henderson, a redshirt freshman helping fill in with Ezeli out, hit a short jumper that put Vandy ahead to stay with 2:46 left. Jenkins, who missed the Commodores' last game with a sprained right ankle, had 20 points in the first half of a game that was close until Vanderbilt (3-1) took the lead for good with a spurt that started with 2:16 to play.

The Commodores will play Oregon State for the championship on Monday night at the Izod Center.

Jeffery Taylor added 17 points for Vanderbilt and Lance Goulbourne had 15, including 10 in the opening 7 minutes of the second half.

C.J. Leslie, who missed the first three games of the season while sitting out a suspension for accepting \$410 worth of impermissible benefits, had 20 points for the Wolfpack (2-1), but the sophomore forward missed the last 6 minutes of the game because of leg cramps.

Richard Howell had 16 points and nine rebounds for the Wolfpack.

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - There was plenty of talk about Brad Tinsley's 15-foot jumper with 4.5 seconds left that gave No. 18 Vanderbilt a 64-62 victory over Oregon State in the championship game of the TicketCity Legends Classic at Izod Center.

There was even more about the defensive effort of the Commodores' Jeffery Taylor against Oregon State's Jared Cunningham, who had 35 and 37 points, respectively, in his previous two games.

Cunningham finished with nine points on 3-for-9 shooting.

John Jenkins, Vanderbilt's top scorer at 23 points per game and the tournament MVP, finished with 14 points for the Commodores (4-1), who led by eight with 10:10 to play. Taylor added 13 points and Tinsley had nine.

Devon Collier had 19 points for the Beavers (4-1), while Ahmad Starks added 16.

Vanderbilt, especially Taylor, did an outstanding defensive job on Cunningham, who had two points in the second half. The junior guard scored 35 points against Hofstra and 37 in a semifinal win over Texas, but he just couldn't get open looks against Vanderbilt.

That included the game's final play, when Cunningham drove to the basket as time ran out but Taylor stayed with him and the ball didn't even hit the rim. The Oregon State bench was yelling for a foul, but replays showed it was a clean play by Taylor.

"I feel like we really got outworked, out-toughed, outplayed and we won because we have superior talent and superior players, size, strength and athleticism, skill," Stallings said. "But we lost the fight portion of the game tonight, and that's disappointing."

The game pitted Stallings against his former assistant King Rice in his first season as Monmouth's head coach. Stallings said it looks like the Hawks are buying into Rice's message of how he wants them to play.

"I'm happy for him," Stallings said. "He's been having a hard time getting his team to play hard as hard as he wants them to."

The Commodores already are without starting center Festus Ezeli due to a sprained knee, and Steve Tchiengang sat with concussion-like symptoms after being hit in the face Monday night against Oregon State in winning the TicketCity Legends Classic in New Jersey.

The Commodores (5-1) didn't need him on a hot-shooting night where they trailed only off the opening bucket. Josh Henderson and Dai-Jon Parker had a career-high 10 points each.

This easily was the toughest game yet for the Hawks (0-6). Jesse Steele scored 25 points, Ed Waite had 15 before fouling out, and Austin Tillotson 11.

They sure know how to take over a game at the right time.

Holloway scored 10 of his 24 points in overtime after Lyons tied it up in the final seconds of regulation, and No. 11 Xavier rallied from 10 down to beat 20th-ranked Vanderbilt 82-70.

Xavier trailed by as much as 10. The Musketeers scored the final four points of regulation, including Lyons' short jumper with 6.5 seconds left to force overtime. Wells hit two free throws, and Holloway knocked down two 3-pointers to cap a 12-0 run ending with 2:27 remaining in overtime that put Xavier up 74-66.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt with 20 points. Lance Goulbourne and Jeffery Taylor had 18 apiece. The Commodores went cold after Jenkins' 3 with 3:56 left put Vandy up 66-62. They didn't score again until Jenkins' jumper with 2:17 left in overtime, but coach Kevin Stallings was more disappointed in his Commodores turning the ball over 18 times.

"Turnovers are generally careless or selfish," Stallings said. "Neither of those has anything to do with the other team."

**LOUISVILLE** - John Jenkins twice gave Vanderbilt leads late. The 20th-ranked Commodores found a way to lose them both.

Jenkins scored 27 points, but Peyton Siva drove through the middle of Vanderbilt's defense for a layup with 1.4 seconds left to rally No. 6 Louisville over the Commodores 62-60 in overtime.

Jenkins finished 9 of 15 from the field and 5 of 11 from 3-point range as the Commodores (5-3) took a nine-point lead midway through the second half and a five-point lead in overtime. They couldn't hold on to either.

Jenkins' jumper gave the Commodores a 43-34 lead, but Jeffery Taylor made a steal and missed a layup that would've pushed it to double digits.

Louisville answered with a 13-4 run that ended with Chane Behan's steal and slam that tied it with 2:28 left. With the game tied again in the closing seconds, Siva wound the clock down near halfcourt, then drove into the lane around Taylor and found Behan down low.

Behan took the ball to the floor once to slice across the lane, but missed the shot off the backboard and rim and slumped down in frustration at failing to hit the winner.

Jenkins scored the first five points of overtime, but Louisville rallied again.

Behan answered with a three-point play. After the two teams traded a pair of free throws, Kyle Kuric, who finished with 15 points, hit a 3-pointer that gave Louisville a 58-57 lead.

Brad Tinsley tied it with a free throw before Kuric hit a jumper that set up the final sequence when Jenkins hit two free throws and Siva easily passed Lance Goulbourne down the lane, hitting a finger-roll layup with 1.4 seconds left.

**Notes**

- ★ The loss was Vanderbilt's second consecutive overtime defeat after falling to Xavier earlier in the week in overtime, 82-70, and the fifth straight overtime loss dating back to the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign.
- ★ John Jenkins led the Commodores with 27 points, his fourth 20-point game of the season and 24th of his career.

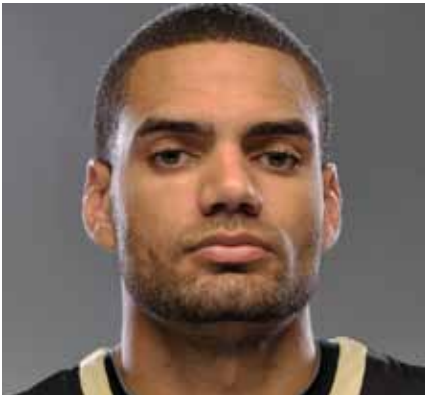
