<b>SEC</b>	The Commodores are the reigning SEC Tournament champions after defeating number-one ranked Kentucky in the SEC Championship in 2012. It was Vanderbilt's first tournament title since 1951.
<b>3</b>	Vanderbilt has been to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, the first time that has been accomplished in the history of the program.
<b>7</b>	The Commodores' seven 20-win seasons in the last nine years is only third in SEC to Florida, who has had nine, and Kentucky, who has had eight. Other school totals: Miss. St. (6), Tennessee (5), Ole Miss (4), South Carolina (4), LSU (3), Alabama (3), Arkansas (3), Auburn (1), Georgia (1).
<b>25</b>	Vanderbilt's 25 wins in 2011-12 was the most since the 2007-08 season and the second-most win total since the 1992-93 season.
<b>6</b>	The Commodore' top six scorers must be replaced from a year ago, and 88% of its total scoring output.
<b>NBA</b>	Vanderbilt had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft, the first time that has happened in program history. Junior guard John Jenkins was drafted 23rd by the Atlanta Hawks, senior Festus Ezeli was drafted 30th by the Golden State Warriors, and senior forward Jeffery Taylor was drafted 31st by the Charlotte Bobcats.
<b>3.1</b>	Vanderbilt's leading returning scoring total from an individual player. Kedren Johnson averaged 3.1 points per game in 36 contests last season. Johnson scored 25 points, and had six assists and rebounds in his first collegiate start vs. Nicholls State. The sophomore from Lewisburg, Tenn., set 10 new career highs in season opener.
<b>833</b>	Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 833 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

RECAP AND NOTES

Vanderbilt rolled to an 80-65 win over Nicholls State on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Gym in the Commodores 2012-13 season-opener.

Vanderbilt has now won six-straight season-openers, dating back to the 2006-07 season.

Behind a career day from Kedren Johnson, the Commodores took complete control of the game at the start of the second half. Johnson set new career-highs in points (25), rebounds (6) and assists (6). The Lewisburg, Tenn., native was an efficient 8-of-14 from the field, including 3-of-7 from three-point range.

The Commodores came out of the locker room after the half with a quick 6-0 run to extend their lead to 11 (34-23). From there, Vanderbilt continued its hot shooting as the Commodores would score 21 points in the first four and a half minutes of the second half.

Kevin Bright and Kyle Fuller each scored 15 points for the Commodores, while Bright led the team with eight rebounds in his collegiate debut. Fuller's 15 points were a new career-high, while he tied for the team-lead in assists with six, which also set a new career-high.

The Commodores shot 49 percent from the field for the game, including 66 percent from the field in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 72 percent (8-of-11) from beyond the arc in the second half and 46 percent (12-of-26) for the game.

Fred Hunter led Nicholls State with 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Sam McBeath and T.J. Carpenter added 15 and 11 points, respectively.

Starting Lineups

The Commodores started juniors Rod Odom and Kyle Fuller, sophomores Kedren Johnson and Shelby Moats, and freshman Kevin Bright. It was Odom's 11th career start, Fuller's second, and the first for Johnson, Moats, and Bright.

**HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 61ST SEASON**

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 61st season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.
