80-69

The Commodores moved to 2-0 on the season with an 80-69 win over cross-town opponent Lipscomb on November 15 at Memorial Gym. Senior forward Rod Odom scored 20 points to lead four Vanderbilt players in double figures, and junior James Siakam tallied the first double-double of his career with 18 points and 13 rebounds. Vanderbilt outrebounded the Bisons, 42-26, and shot 53.2% from the floor for the game.

86-80

The score of the season opener against Georgia State, who is picked by many to win the Sun Belt Conference in 2013-14. The Commodores shot 55.6% from the floor in the back-and-forth affair Tuesday night at Memorial Gym, a game in which Vanderbilt trailed with five minutes to play and were tied with the Panthers with two minutes to go. Senior Rod Odom and freshman Damian Jones led the Commodores with 19 points apiece, with sophomore guard Eric McClellan adding 18 points in the winning effort. The deciding statistic may have been the Vanderbilt bench, which outscored their counterparts, 28-3.

ALL-TIME VU WINS

Head Coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 279th career game with Vanderbilt Friday night against Lipscomb, is now the all-time Vanderbilt wins leader, surpassing legendary coach Roy Skinner. Skinner served as the head coach in 1959 and then from 1962-76. Stallings is also the all-time wins leader at Memorial Gym with 189, and has 402 victories as a head coach.

EUROPE

In August, the Commodores ventured to Greece and Italy for a 10-day tour of the two countries, which included two games against a French Division I All-Star team in Greece and two against an Italian Division III squad in Rome. Vanderbilt came away 4-0 on the trip. Freshman Damian Jones, who only played in the two games in Greece because of a school obligation, led the team with 13 points per game. In four games, Eric McClellan averaged 12.3 points per game, Rod Odom 11.5 points per contest, Dai-Jon Parker 10.3 per game, and Josh Henderson 10.0 points per game.

80+ PT

The Commodores' have tallied 80 points in both games this season, and are averaging 83.0 points per game in the team's two games. Vanderbilt scored 80 points once in 2012-13, and surpassed the 75-point barrier only three times last year.

RECAP & NOTES

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings entered the 2013-14 season needing only two wins to become the Commodores' all-time wins leader.

He got there in only two games, but he had to sweat a little.

Vanderbilt defeated Lipscomb 80-69 on Friday night in front of a crowd of 8,416 as Stallings picked up his 279th win at Vanderbilt (2-0). The victory moved him past Roy Skinner, who coached Vanderbilt from 1958-76. Stallings is 279-175 in 14 seasons with the Commodores. In tying the late Skinner's record, Vanderbilt also had to pull away late in Tuesday's opener against Georgia State.

"I wish somehow I could win a lot of games and not break his record because you don't want to break his records," Stallings said. "He's too nice a guy."

Vanderbilt forward James Siakam picked up his first career double-double, and forward Rod Odom matched a career-high with 20 points against the Bisons (1-2).

Lipscomb, a crosstown foe from the Atlantic Sun that hadn't won in Memorial Gym since 1939, gave Vanderbilt trouble for more than 30 minutes before the Commodores pulled away late. J.C. Hampton led Lipscomb with 21 points. Khion Sankey added 15 for the Bisons.

The difference though was Siakam and Odom. Siakam provided energy on several occasions for Vanderbilt, especially in the second half. He had a dunk and three-point play as the Commodores pulled away after the break. The junior added three assists and a block.

"Every time the game got tight and things got close, James came up with a big play," said Odom, who was 8-of-13 from the field. "In a lot of ways, he kept us going, kept us ahead and kept us ahead. He provided energy through is play."

Siakam had never had more than eight points and eight rebounds in a game before Friday, when he topped his career high in the first half alone.

Stallings might not expect 18 points and 13 rebounds out of Siakam every night, but with his energy and length, Stallings said he knew this kind of game was a possibility.

"I want to be that energy guy," said Siakam, who arrived at Vanderbilt from Douala, Cameroon. "I want to be active on defense and block shots."

Vanderbilt needed every bit of it Friday. Lipscomb took a 48-46 lead with 10:56 to go on three 3-pointers from Hampton and later tied the game at 51 with 8:38 remaining before the Commodores' Eric McClellan hit a free throw to give Vanderbilt the lead for good. Vanderbilt scored 20 of the final 32 points in the game, helped by an 11-0 run.

"We answered a lot," first-year Lipscomb coach Casey Alexander said. "They had several times to get away from us, and we had guys make good individual plays to answer and get us in the game."

At one point in the first half, Vanderbilt went through a 1-for-7 drought from the field with four turnovers as Lipscomb took a five-point lead midway through the half. Siakam delivered a spark in the final 12.9 seconds by converting a three-point play for a 33-30 halftime lead.

The momentum continued into the second half as Vanderbilt went on a 9-0 run before Hampton's flurry of 3-pointers. Lipscomb was 10-of-28 from beyond the arc for the game and scored 20 points off 11 Vanderbilt turnovers.

"We didn't get it done tonight, not the way I wanted," Stallings said. "We got it done with the final score, but we weren't playing for the final score. We were playing to get better, and I'm not sure we did."

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 62ND SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 62nd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt got an impressive debut performance from some new faces Tuesday night to help head coach Kevin Stallings tie the school's all-time wins record.

Freshman Damian Jones had 19 points and seven rebounds, while transfer Eric McClellan scored 18 to help the Commodores pull away from Georgia State for an 86-80 season-opening victory. Rod Odom, one of two VU seniors, also scored 19 points including five 3-pointers.

"I'm pretty sure of what we have. Now it's a matter of us getting to be as good as we can be," said Stallings, who tied Roy Skinner (1961-76) with most victories as Vanderbilt head coach (278).

Odom, the team's top returning scorer, hit two 3s early to close it to 12-10 after four different GSU shooters hit 3-pointers the first 4:07 for a 12-7 lead.

Jones, a 6-foot-10 center from Baton Rouge, La., gave the Commodores a boost off the bench early with five straight points including a dunk to launch a 10-2 run for a 20-16 lead.

In a game that saw 16 lead changes and 10 ties, Jones hit a big jumper and Dai-Jon Parker sank his third 3-pointer to push Vanderbilt ahead 78-73 with 1:06 left.

Jones' jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good was about a 17-footer after most of his baskets came inside, including alley-oops and other dunks.

Stallings, who liked his team's resolve to pull out the victory, said the freshman has a lot to learn but could go up and catch almost anything thrown his way.

VU senior Kyle Fuller hit a pair of free throws with 45.1 seconds left for the largest lead in the game (80-74) since 8:09 remaining.

Odom had back-to-back 3s for Vanderbilt down the stretch and sank a pair of free throws with 9.8 seconds for an 84-80 lead. McClellan, a transfer from Tulsa, added two fouls shots for the final points.

GSU transfer Ryan Harrow, who started 24 games last season for Kentucky, had a game-high 27 points for the Panthers (1-1). He lost to the Commodores in the Southeastern Conference tournament in his last game with the Wildcats.

Sophomore R.J. Hunter scored 21 points including three 3-pointers for Georgia State.

Devonta White's two free throws cut it to 82-80 with 10 seconds remaining for the Panthers, picked as a preseason Sun Belt favorite by several outlets.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings entered the 2013-14 season needing only two wins to become the Commodores' all-time wins leader.

He got there in only two games, but he had to sweat a little.

Vanderbilt defeated Lipscomb 80-69 in front of a crowd of 8,416 as Stallings picked up his 279th win at Vanderbilt (2-0). The victory moved him past Roy Skinner, who coached Vanderbilt from 1958-76. Stallings is 279-175 in 14 seasons with the Commodores. In tying the late Skinner's record, Vanderbilt also had to pull away late in Tuesday's opener against Georgia State.

"I wish somehow I could win a lot of games and not break his record because you don't want to break his records," Stallings said. "He's too nice a guy."

Vanderbilt forward James Siakam picked up his first career double-double, and forward Rod Odom matched a career-high with 20 points against the Bisons (1-2).

Lipscomb, a crosstown foe from the Atlantic Sun that hadn't won in Memorial Gym since 1939, gave Vanderbilt trouble for more than 30 minutes before the Commodores pulled away late. J.C. Hampton led Lipscomb with 21 points. Khion Sankey added 15 for the Bisons.

The difference though was Siakam and Odom.

Siakam provided energy on several occasions for Vanderbilt, especially in the second half. He had a dunk and three-point play as the Commodores pulled away after the break. The junior added three assists and a block.

"Every time the game got tight and things got close, James came up with a big play," said Odom, who was 8-of-13 from the field. "In a lot of ways, he kept us going, kept us ahead and kept us ahead. He provided energy through is play."

Siakam had never had more than eight points and eight rebounds in a game before Friday, when he topped his career high in the first half alone.

Stallings might not expect 18 points and 13 rebounds out of Siakam every night, but with his energy and length, Stallings said he knew this kind of game was a possibility.

"I want to be that energy guy," said Siakam, who arrived at Vanderbilt from Douala, Cameroon. "I want to be active on defense and block shots."
