LAST TIME

Vanderbilt fell to 9-8 on the season and 1-4 in SEC play after a 63-52 loss to Ole Miss Wednesday night at Memorial Gym. Vanderbilt shot 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the floor, and just 15 percent (3-of-20) from three-point land. Fifteen-percent is the worst the Commodores have shot from outside the arc this season, it is only the second time the 'Dores have shot lower than 20 percent. Rod Odom scored a game high 18 points on 7-of-14 shooting, and 3-of-9 from beyond the three-point line. Odom has scored in double-figures 13 times this season. Damian Jones finished with 14 points in 33 minutes of play. Jones also pulled down 10 boards for his second career double-double. James Siakam had his second double-digit rebounding game of the season, finishing with 10. He also added on seven points and three blocks. Kyle Fuller pulled down a career high nine rebounds.

The Commodores have seven scholarship players and nine overall on the roster after Josh Henderson was lost for the season with a left knee injury Dec. 5 against Marshall and Eric McClellan was dismissed from the team on January 10.

ALL-TIME VU WINS

Head Coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 279th career game with Vanderbilt against Lipscomb on November 15, is now the all-time Vanderbilt wins leader, surpassing legendary coach Roy Skinner. Stallings now has 286 wins at Vanderbilt, is the wins leader at Memorial Gym with 194, and has 409 victories as a head coach.

ODOM

Rod Odom is quietly establishing himself as one of the nation's top shooters, averaging 14.5 points and 5.6 rebounds per game, while shooting 44.7% from three and 72.3% from the free-throw line. Odom is 2nd in the SEC in 3-point percentage (.457) and in 3's made (3.0/game), and has scored in double figures in 13 games this season. He has also made three or more threes in a game on 10 occasions in 2013-14, and tallied his first career double-double at Alabama with 20 points and 10 rebounds. He also had a career-best 24 points vs. Missouri, and leads SEC in conference games only in 3's/game (3.8).

FULLER

Senior point guard Kyle Fuller is having a solid senior season, averaging 10.6 points per game in all games and 13.0 points per game in league play. Fuller is ranked second in the SEC in assists with 4.1 assists per game and 8th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4). He also added his first career double-double with a 17-point, 10-assist game vs. Kentucky.

RECAP & NOTES

NASHVILLE - Marshall Henderson struggled with Vanderbilt's sticky defense trying to keep the Mississippi guard under control. As usual, he hit the biggest shots of the night helping the Rebels pull out another key win.

Henderson hit back-to-back 3-pointers in an 11-point spurt where Mississippi took control of a 63-52 win over Vanderbilt after blowing a 13-point lead in the second half.

The Rebels (13-5, 4-1 Southeastern Conference) now have won three straight overall and leave Memorial Gym with back-to-back wins in a place where they had won in only six of their first 55 visits.

Vanderbilt (9-8, 1-4) just couldn't overcome the Rebels' 44-40 edge on the boards for a 15-8 edge in second-chance points, and Ole Miss turned the Commodores' 17 turnovers into 16 points.

Rod Odom scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Damian Jones had 14 and 10 rebounds. Point guard Kyle Fuller had nearly as many turnovers (four) as he had points (five), and Parker finished with two more turnovers than points (two).

The Rebels took a 29-20 lead into halftime and went up 33-20 in the opening minutes of the second half. But after a first half when Vanderbilt shot 29.2 percent, the Commodores hit nine of their first 17 in the second half. When James Siakam scored underneath with 6:10 left, that gave Vanderbilt its first lead since 3-0 at 46-45.

But then the Commodores went cold as Jones missed a pair of free throws.

Aaron Jones hit a jumper putting the Rebels ahead to stay with 5:48 to go the first of 11 straight points.

Henderson fed a pass to Perez for a layup. Then Odom lost the ball on the sideline leading to a scramble that ended with Henderson hitting a 3-pointer. Henderson then hit a second consecutive 3, pushing the lead to 55-46 with 3:57 left, and celebrated with a big fist pump in front of the Vanderbilt student section that had been booing him all night long when he touched the ball.

Henderson's back-to-back 3-pointers were the highlight of the night for the senior guard who came in as the SEC's best 3-point shooter and was named the league's player of the week on Monday. He forced overtime here last season from about 30 feet out had trouble connecting Wednesday night. Henderson also missed a shot just after he crossed mid-court that bounced off the rim before the halftime buzzer.

Notes:

- ★ Vanderbilt shot 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the floor, and just 15 percent (3-of-20) from three-point land.
- ★ Fifteen-percent is the worst the Commodores have shot from outside the arc this season, it is only the second time the 'Dores have shot lower than 20 percent.
- ★ Rod Odom scored a game high 18 points on 7-of-14 shooting, and 3-of-9 from beyond the three-point line. Odom has scored in double-figures 13 times this season.
- ★ Damian Jones finished with 14 points in 33 minutes of play. Jones also pulled down 10 boards for his second career double-double.
- ★ James Siakam had his second double-digit rebounding game of the season, finishing with 10. He also added on seven points and three blocks.
- ★ Kyle Fuller pulled down a career high nine rebounds.
- ★ The Commodores held Marshall Henderson and Jarvis Summers, the Rebels' two leading scorers, to a combined 11 points under their season average.

MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 62ND SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 62nd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 882 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

BALL CARE, REBOUNDING

The turnover and rebounding columns are ones that the Commodores have struggled with this season in losses. In Vanderbilt's nine wins, the Commodores have committed only an average of 12.7 turnovers per game and have posted a +2.4 rebounding margin. In losses, VU is committing 15.9 turnovers per game and has a -3.7 rebounding margin. Opponents are also outscoring Vanderbilt, 105-57, in second chance points in the losses, while Vanderbilt has outscored their opponents, 100-95, in second-chance points in their wins.

In August, the Commodores ventured to Greece and Italy for a 10-day tour of the two countries, which included two games against a French Division I All-Star team in Greece and two against an Italian Division III squad in Rome. Vanderbilt came away 4-0 on the trip. Freshman Damian Jones, who only played in the two games in Greece because of a school obligation, led the team with 13 points per game.

NLI'S

Vanderbilt head basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signings of Wade Baldwin IV (6'2 guard, Metuchen, N.J.), Matthew Fisher-Davis (6'5 guard, Charlotte, N.J.), and Riley LaChance (6'2 guard, Brookfield, Wisc.) to National Letters of Intent in November. The three, all ranked in the top 100 by national scouting services, comprise a class that is ranked number 24 in the country by ESPN and number 26 by Rivals.com.

STAFF ADDITIONS

Head coach Kevin Stallings added assistant coach Yanni Hufnagel to his staff over the summer after the departure of longtime assistant Brad Frederick, who took a position at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina. Hufnagel was an assistant at Harvard for four seasons prior to his arrival in Nashville. Coach Stallings also added former Vanderbilt standout Julian Terrell as his Director of Video Operations after an eight-year professional career. Terrell starred for Stallings' Commodores from 2003-06 and helped lead Vanderbilt to the Sweet 16 in 2004.

PARADISE JAM

The Commodores finished the 2013 ezyBonds USVI Paradise Jam with a 2-1 record, with wins over Morgan State and Loyola Marymount and a loss to Providence. Senior guard Kyle Fuller was the team's leading scorer at the tournament, averaging 14.0 points per game, including a 20-point performance against Loyola Marymount and 16 vs. Morgan State, both team highs.

- This is the 112th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 11 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2013-14 season being the 80th year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools (6,738).
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first African-American scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 43 career 1,000-point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2,011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft - John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick - the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61-year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC championship since 1951.
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 10 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had seven 20+-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to 64+ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated \$1 million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt got an impressive debut performance from some new faces Tuesday night to help head coach Kevin Stallings tie the school's all-time wins record.

Freshman Damian Jones had 19 points and seven rebounds, while transfer Eric McClellan scored 18 to help the Commodores pull away from Georgia State for an 86-80 season-opening victory.

"I'm pretty sure of what we have. Now it's a matter of us getting to be as good as we can be," said Stallings, who tied Roy Skinner (1961-76) with most victories as Vanderbilt head coach (278).

Odom, the team's top returning scorer, hit two 3s early to close it to 12-10 after four different GSU shooters hit 3-pointers the first 4:07 for a 12-7 lead.

Jones, a 6-foot-10 center from Baton Rouge, La., gave the Commodores a boost off the bench early with five straight points including a dunk to launch a 10-2 run for a 20-16 lead.

In a game that saw 16 lead changes and 10 ties, Jones hit a big jumper and Dai-Jon Parker sank his third 3-pointer to push Vanderbilt ahead 78-73 with 1:06 left.

Jones' jumper that gave Vanderbilt the lead for good was about a 17-footer after most of his baskets came inside, including alley-oops and other dunks.

Stallings, who liked his team's resolve to pull out the victory, said the freshman has a lot to learn but could go up and catch almost anything thrown his way.

VU senior Kyle Fuller hit a pair of free throws with 45.1 seconds left for the largest lead in the game (80-74) since 8:09 remaining.

Odom had back-to-back 3s for Vanderbilt down the stretch and sank a pair of free throws with 9.8 seconds for an 84-80 lead. McClellan, a transfer from Tulsa, added two fouls shots for the final points.

GSU transfer Ryan Harrow, who started 24 games last season for Kentucky, had a game-high 27 points for the Panthers (1-1). He lost to the Commodores in the Southeastern Conference tournament in his last game with the Wildcats.

Sophomore R.J. Hunter scored 21 points including three 3-pointers for Georgia State.

Devonta White's two free throws cut it to 82-80 with 10 seconds remaining for the Panthers, picked as a preseason Sun Belt favorite by several outlets.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings entered the 2013-14 season needing only two wins to become the Commodores' all-time wins leader.

He got there in only two games, but he had to sweat a little. Vanderbilt defeated Lipscomb 80-69 in front of a crowd of 8,416 as Stallings picked up his 279th win at Vanderbilt (2-0).

Vanderbilt forward James Siakam picked up his first career double-double, and forward Rod Odom matched a career-high with 20 points against the Bisons (1-2).

Lipscomb, a crosstown foe from the Atlantic Sun that hadn't won in Memorial Gym since 1939, gave Vanderbilt trouble for more than 30 minutes before the Commodores pulled away late. J.C. Hampton led Lipscomb with 21 points.

The difference though was Siakam and Odom. Siakam provided energy on several occasions for Vanderbilt, especially in the second half. He had a dunk and three-point play as the Commodores pulled away after the break.

"Every time the game got tight and things got close, James came up with a big play," said Odom, who was 8-of-13 from the field. "In a lot of ways, he kept us going, kept us ahead and kept us ahead. He provided energy through is play."

Siakam had never had more than eight points and eight rebounds in a game before Friday, when he topped his career high in the first half alone.

Stallings might not expect 18 points and 13 rebounds out of Siakam every night, but with his energy and length, Stallings said he knew this kind of game was a possibility.

"I want to be that energy guy," said Siakam, who arrived at Vanderbilt from Douala, Cameroon. "I want to be active on defense and block shots."

INDIANAPOLIS - Kyle Marshall scored 16 of his career-high 26 points in the final seven minutes Tuesday night, leading Butler past Vanderbilt 85-77 in overtime.

Kellen Dunham added 16 points for the Bulldogs, who won for the 22nd time in 25 games at Hinkle Fieldhouse -- though few have been this challenging.

Butler led 61-47 with 7:43 left in regulation and appeared bound for an easy win. But the Commodores (2-1) went on a 15-2 run to trim the deficit to one and took the lead when Eric McClellan completed a three-point play with 53.8 seconds to go.

Marshall gave Butler the lead with a layup, and then after McClellan tied it with a free throw, he missed the second free throw and was called for a travel. Dunham missed a running 3-pointer at the buzzer.

But Marshall dominated overtime as the Bulldogs pulled away. McClellan finished with a career-high 29 points. The Commodores fell to 0-5 all-time against Butler on one of the strangest nights in recent memory at Hinkle Fieldhouse.

The teams combined for 54 fouls and traded scoring flurries all night. Dunham was held scoreless for nearly 9 1/2 minutes before going on a 3-point binge and then fading from view over the closing stretch.

The oddest play of the night might have been when Butler's Kameron Woods came up with a loose ball on the defensive end and the 6-foot-9 forward dribbled coast to coast and went in for a one-handed dunk that appeared to get batted out of the basket as it was going through the net -- ruled a miss.

But nothing was stranger than the Commodores comeback. They trailed by 14 three different times in the second half and spent most of the night in foul trouble, yet somehow dug deep to shut down Butler's outside scorers over the final seven minutes of regulation.

Meanwhile, the Commodores continually drove to the basket, scoring, drawing fouls -- or both -- leading to the 15-2 run. Vandy finally took its first lead, 69-68, in nearly 23 minutes when McClellan converted the late three-point play.

Marshall answered with a layup to give Butler a 70-69 lead, and after Woods was called for a foul with 11.1 seconds left, McClellan grabbed the rebound off the missed free throw and was called for traveling. That gave Dunham a chance to win it with a running 3-pointer, which fell short.

In overtime, it was all Marshall, who gave Butler the lead for good on a short jumper in the lane with 4:26 left. Marshall scored nine of Butler's 16 points.

ST. THOMAS, USVI - Tyler Harris scored 15 points, including a key 3-pointer during a late 18-0 run, as Providence won 67-60 in a thrilling come-from-behind victory over Vanderbilt in the Paradise Jam.

Providence trailed 56-40 with 10:42 left, but caught fire and Vanderbilt crashed and burned. The Friars held Vanderbilt scoreless for nearly 9 minutes, ending on Rod Odom's 3-pointer to give Vanderbilt a 59-57 lead with 2:55 left.

Providence scored the next eight points to build its biggest lead of the game at 65-59. The Friars hadn't led since 9-7 early in the game.

Bryce Cotton added 14 for Providence (5-0) and LaDontae Henton had 12.

Odom led Vanderbilt (2-2) with 17 points, Eric McClellan added 13 and Josh Henderson tied a career-high with 13 points. Henderson scored a combined 11 points in Vanderbilt's first three games, 6, 1, and 4 respectively.

The Friars will play the winner of the Morgan State-La Salle matchup.

Throughout most of the second half, Providence couldn't get the stops when it needed to. The Friars didn't score more than five consecutive points in the second half until the 6:34 mark.

But Providence rallied back, going on an 18-0 run, with 3-pointers by Harris, Kris Dunn and a three-point play by Carson Desrosiers.

Damian Jones missed two crucial free throws with 3:53 left that would have given Vanderbilt its first points in nearly 7 minutes.

Providence trailed for a majority of the first half too. The Friars were held to without a field goal for over 4 minutes, but LaDontae Henton's 3-pointer pulled the Friars to 19-18 with 7:43 left.

Vanderbilt led 31-22 with 1:41 remaining but did not make a field goal in the final 2 minutes and Providence scored the next four to trail 31-26 at halftime.

Providence was held to 34.5 percent shooting, including 2 of 15 3-pointers, in the first half.

Kevin Stallings commented at halftime about Vanderbilt's defense in the first half, saying "...defensively, that's the best 20 minutes of basketball we've played this season."

Vanderbilt out-rebounded the Friars 23-15 in the opening half and made 42 percent of its shots, mostly coming in the paint.

ST. THOMAS, USVI - Kyle Fuller made four free throws in the final minute and finished with 16 points as Vanderbilt held off Morgan State 75-66 in the Paradise Jam.

Damian Jones scored 13 points for Vanderbilt (3-2) and Eric McClellan added 12 -- all coming from behind the 3-point line. Rod Odom and Luke Kornet added 11 apiece. Vanderbilt grabbed 16 offensive rebounds and shot 45.2 percent for the game.

Justin Black scored 18 for Morgan State (0-6) and Ian Chiles added 15 and nine rebounds. Black's layup with 15:08 left pulled Morgan State within single digits at 45-37. Chiles' dunk moved Morgan State closer at 71-66.

But Fuller sealed the game for Vanderbilt, making all four of his free throw attempts with just seconds left.

Vanderbilt will face Loyola Marymount in the fourth-place game on Monday. The Commodores led by as many as 17 in the second half. But Morgan State kept clawing away at its deficit.

The Bears shot just 32.1 percent in the first half, but turned it around in the second, making 14 of 29.

Kornet, a freshman, scored all 11 of his points in the second half for Vanderbilt. Ahead 57-50 with 7:49 left, Kornet threw down a dunk and his 3-pointer less than 2 minutes later extended Vanderbilt's lead to 62-53.

Morgan State did not score in the final minute after missing both 3-point attempts.

The first half was much of the same. The Commodores built an early 14-11 lead, behind seven points by Fuller. He finished with 10 points in the half as Vanderbilt led 37-23 at the break. They outscored Morgan State 26-12 in the paint.

ST. THOMAS, USVI - Kyle Fuller scored 19 points, all but five coming in the second half, as Vanderbilt beat Loyola Marymount 77-68 to secure fourth place in the Paradise Jam on Monday.

Fuller's basket with 1:44 left pushed Vanderbilt's lead to 66-62. He made all four of his free throws on Vanderbilt's next two possessions to make it 70-62 with 48 seconds remaining.

"Kyle Fuller well in this tournament," Vanderbilt's coach Kevin Stallings said. "That bodes well for us going forward."

Eric McClellan made three of his four free throws in the final 30 seconds and Rod Odom made two more with 3 seconds remaining to end it.

McClellan added 17 points for the Commodores (4-2) and James Siakam scored all 11 of his points in the second half. Vanderbilt made 25 of its 52 shots and nailed 75 percent of its 32 free throws.

"We didn't make many 3's and the good news is we scored 77 points, with only three 3-point baskets. And we like to shoot the three. We depend on the 3 and it was good to see us go to the foul line so much," Stallings said.

McClellan had nine of Vanderbilt's first 21 points and the Commodores were up 34-30 at the break.

Vanderbilt opened the second half on a 7-2 run, capped by a Fuller 3-pointer.

The lead was cut to one-point (50-49) after LMU's Chase Flint hit a 3-pointer, followed by a steal and dunk by Marin Mornar.

Ireland's bucket at 8:45 gave LMU its first lead of the second half at 55-53. LMU later led 60-57, but Vanderbilt went on a 7-0 run, highlighted by Fuller's 3-pointer.

"We showed out most resolve when they took the lead," Stallings said. "Our defense got better. Our offense got better. We were 17 of 21 from the foul line in the second half."

Ireland finished with 20 points, his third-straight 20-plus point game for Loyola Marymount (5-2), while Ben Dickinson and Gabe Levin chipped in with 10 each.

It was the first ever meeting between the two programs.

AUSTIN - Isaiah Taylor had 14 points and eight assists and Texas won its first game against a power conference team this season in a 70-64 victory over Vanderbilt on Monday.

Demarcus Holland and Javan Felix each scored 12 points for Texas (7-1). Felix went 2 of 3 from beyond the arc and Kendal Yancy contributed 11 points and six rebounds.

The Longhorns led by as many as 13 points in the second half and were able to hold off Vanderbilt (4-3), which trimmed the Longhorns lead to one point in the final minute after an Eric McClellan steal and dunk.

Felix sunk a pair of key free throws to make it 65-62 before Holland's three-point play with 12.6 seconds left sealed the win.

Austin native McClellan scored a team-high 22 points for Vanderbilt while Josh Henderson scored 12 points on 5 of 8 shooting and Rod Odom had 11 points.

Texas needed second-half comebacks in four of its previous six wins this year but started the game on an 8-2 run and never looked back. The Longhorns led for the final 39 minutes of the game, using a 16-3 run to take a 31-25 halftime lead.

Vanderbilt trimmed Texas' lead to three points when Henderson knocked down a jumper to make it 57-54 with 2:30 left to play.

Then, Taylor helped the Longhorns take control of the game down the stretch. He completed a three-point play and hit a floater following a steal by Holland all in less than 30 seconds to give Texas a 62-54 lead with 1:47 to go.

The Longhorns initially struggled from the free throw line, making just 10 of 16 attempts before knocking down five straight in the final 24 seconds.

Texas, whose victory Monday came in the first-ever Big 12-SEC challenge, has now won 46 consecutive home games against unranked non-conference opponents. The Longhorns have also won seven of their first eight games for the first time in three years.

Dai-Jon Parker sank a 3-pointer just inside the final minute to give the Commodores (5-3) a 69-65 lead over the hard-charging Thundering Herd (4-4). Shawn Smith sank his final two free throws and Marshall had a chance to tie it on a drive into the paint before James Siakam stole the ball.

"We changed and had a small lineup, not knowing they also changed and had a small lineup," VU Coach Kevin Stallings said. "James (Siakam) came off and defended on a ball screen. He tends to give guards trouble because he has a seven-foot wingspan. Obviously their coach thought he got fouled."

"James made a very good defensive play. I'm proud of him for that nine seconds - at that point anything can happen."

Siakam and freshman center Damian Jones scored 15 points apiece, and Rod Odom added 11 points including two 3-pointers.

Vanderbilt junior center Josh Henderson, however, suffered a knee injury at 11:15 of the first half right after back-to-back blocks by his teammates on a Herd fast break. Initial indications are a torn ACL and MCL, with an MRI scheduled to confirm the damage.

"It's tough because he was playing well," Stallings said. "He really improved in the offseason and had three really good games in a row. I'm disappointed for him."

Jones, starting his fifth straight game, played a career-high 28 minutes and was a force inside. Marshall Coach Tom Herrion said the freshman from Baton Rouge, La., had the chance to be "something special" and played like he had even more points and rebounds than Jones actually did.

Jones' 3-point play a half-second before intermission handed Vanderbilt the largest lead of the first half at 35-26. He powered in a basket after halftime, then slammed in a dunk on a loose ball for a 41-30 advantage.

TUSCALOOSA - Alabama's seven losses this season have been by 10 points or fewer. After a 68-63 win against Vanderbilt, The Crimson Tide have now won two close games in a row.

After beating Robert Morris in its last non-conference game 64-56, Alabama held on to defeat Vanderbilt in the opening SEC game for both teams.

Trevor Releford scored 16 points and had six assists for Alabama (7-7, 1-0). Shannon Hale and Obasohan had 15 points each, and Levi Randolph added 11 points.

Vanderbilt's (8-5, 0-1) Rod Odom had a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Damian Jones had 16 points and Kyle Fuller added 12 points for the Commodores.

With Alabama ahead 52-36 with 12:11 to go, the Commodores went on to a 22-9 run to slice the lead to 61-58 with 3:20 left, but Obasohan buried a three-point shot to extend the lead to 66-60 with 1:27 remaining. The Crimson Tide pushed the lead back up to 68-60 with 25 seconds to go in the game.

It was a pretty evenly played first half, with the score tied 20 at the 6:58 mark before the Crimson Tide went on a 12-2 run to take a 32-22 lead on an alley-oop dunk by Rodney Cooper with 1:19 left in the half. Releford scored eight points to spark the rally. Alabama maintained a 36-26 advantage, matching its largest lead of the first half, at intermission.

NASHVILLE - John Calipari sees his young Kentucky Wildcats growing up and playing more the way he wants even if youthful mistakes still slip through.

Willie Cauley-Stein scored 15 points, and No. 14 Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 71-62 for the Wildcats' fourth straight victory.

Aaron Harrison added 14 points and Andrew Harrison 10 and Kentucky (12-3, 2-0) started off a two-game road swing through the Southeastern Conference with a win. Julius Randle had 10 of his 11 rebounds in the first half.

That left senior Rod Odom as Vandy's leading scorer averaging 13.8 points a game, and he spent 10 minutes of the first half on the bench because of foul trouble. He finished with five points.

Freshman Damian Jones had a game-high 18 points and 11 rebounds for Vanderbilt (8-6, 0-2). Kyle Fuller had 17 points and 10 assists, and Dai-Jon Parker added 17.

Vanderbilt outshot Kentucky 50 percent (25 of 50) to 42.6 percent (26 of 61).

But the Wildcats used their size for a 41-28 rebounding edge, and their much deeper bench outscored the two scholarship players on Vanderbilt's bench 19-3.

The Wildcats took advantage of Vanderbilt's woes by painting the inside of Memorial Gym blue with fans making themselves right at home chanting "Go Big Blue" early and often.

Kentucky took the lead for good at 8-6 on a jumper by Aaron Harrison, the first of nine straight points as the Wildcats took advantage of a nearly 6-minute scoring drought by Vanderbilt to go up 15-6. Calipari anticipated Vanderbilt trying to grind his Wildcats down, so he had them open the game trying to match that pace.

The Wildcats led 30-22 at halftime but didn't take control until Andrew Harrison hit back-to-back 3-pointers, the second midway through the second half pushing the Wildcats' lead back to double digits. Alex Poythress added his first bucket on a layup giving Kentucky its biggest lead at 53-39 with 9:26 left.

Cauley-Stein said he thought the Wildcats played a good game.

A technical called on Poythress for delay after a dunk with 5:37 left helped Vanderbilt score five quick points including a 3-pointer by Parker to pull within 60-52 with 5:20 left.

NASHVILLE - Rod Odom scored a career-high 24 points, hitting six 3-pointers, and the short-handed Vanderbilt Commodores beat Missouri 78-75 in the Tigers' first visit to Memorial Gym as a member of the Southeastern Conference.

Vanderbilt (9-6, 1-2) snapped a two-game skid by avoiding foul trouble and hitting a season-high 12 3-pointers. The Commodores are down to seven scholarship players after leading scorer Eric McClellan first was suspended from the university, then kicked off the team for good last week. They lost their first two games without McClellan.

Missouri (13-3, 1-2) now has lost two of three. The Tigers were looking for their third road win this season trying to work their way back into the Top 25.

Kyle Fuller added 22 points for Vanderbilt. Dai-Jon Parker had 11, and Damian Jones added 10.

Jabari Brown scored 22 points for Missouri, while Jordan Clarkson had 18 and Ross 11.

The Tigers opened the second half by scoring the first eight points in taking their first lead since the opening bucket on a layup by Williams at 40-39. The teams swapped the lead back and forth before Fuller finished off a fast-break with a layup for Vanderbilt putting the Commodores back ahead 45-44 with 13:30 to go. That started a 10-2 spurt featuring a pair of 3s from Odom, the second giving Vandy a 53-46 lead with 10:52 remaining.

Missouri pulled within 60-57 on a jumper by Brown with 4:17 left. First Fuller hit a 3-pointer, then Odom added his sixth 3 to push the lead to 66-59 with 2:00 left. The Tigers couldn't get closer than the final score on a 3-pointer by Clarkson with 2 seconds left as Vanderbilt went 6 of 7 at the free throw line in the final 40 seconds with Fuller hitting all six of attempts at the line to seal the win.

These are two of the SEC's best shooting teams and the league's best defending against the 3-pointer with Vanderbilt (27.8 percent) just ahead of Missouri (28.6 percent). The Commodores shredded Missouri's defense as they knocked down 3 after 3 and finished 12 of 32 (37.5 percent) -- both season-highs allowed by the Tigers. That more than made up for Missouri outrebounding Vanderbilt 45-35 and the Tigers' 36-16 scoring edge in the paint.

BATON ROUGE, La. - Johnny O'Bryant scored 22 points and grabbed 12 rebounds as LSU defeated Vanderbilt 81-58.

O'Bryant had struggled in the past four games -- three of which were Tigers losses. O'Bryant averaged ten points and six rebounds in those four games. In LSU's overtime defeat at Ole Miss last Wednesday, O'Bryant had only six points and five rebounds.

Going against a Commodores team with just seven scholarship players available, O'Bryant was 5-of-10 from the field and 11-of-14 at the foul line. The 22 points were his most since the season-opener at Massachusetts when he scored 25 points. The 12 rebounds were O'Bryant's second most of the season.

Jordan Mickey had 13 points for the Tigers (11-5, 2-2). Jarell Martin and Andre Stringer scored 11 and 10 points, respectively. Rod Odom led Vanderbilt (9-7, 1-3) with 20 points. Damian Jones had 16 points, while Dai-Jon Parker finished with 10.

O'Bryant was dominant in the opening half for LSU with 13 points and 10 rebounds. He even made his first 3-pointer of the season in the first 20 minutes.

The Tigers took control of the game with a 10-0 run during the middle of the opening half. O'Bryant started the outburst with two foul shots which tied the score at 11-11 with 12:22 remaining before halftime. A basket by Martin on the next possession gave LSU the lead for good.

Mickey made one of two free throws and Tim Quarterman connected on a 3-pointer. A basket by Stringer put the Tigers in front 19-11 with 9:17 remaining in the half.

Vanderbilt came no closer than five points during the rest of the first half. A pair of foul shots by both O'Bryant and Quarterman in the last 90 seconds gave LSU a 35-25 lead at the break.

The Tigers didn't allow the Commodores to cut into their comfortable halftime advantage. Back-to-back field goals by O'Bryant and Malik Morgan put LSU on top 45-32 with 16:16 remaining in the game. Vanderbilt came no closer than nine points the rest of the way.

NASHVILLE - Marshall Henderson struggled with Vanderbilt's sticky defense trying to keep the Mississippi guard under control. As usual, he hit the biggest shots of the night helping the Rebels pull out another key win.

Henderson hit back-to-back 3-pointers in an 11-point spurt where Mississippi took control of a 63-52 win over Vanderbilt after blowing a 13-point lead in the second half.

The Rebels (13-5, 4-1 Southeastern Conference) now have won three straight overall and leave Memorial Gym with back-to-back wins in a place where they had won in only six of their first 55 visits.

Vanderbilt (9-8, 1-4) just couldn't overcome the Rebels' 44-40 edge on the boards for a 15-8 edge in second-chance points, and Ole Miss turned the Commodores' 17 turnovers into 16 points.

Rod Odom scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Damian Jones had 14 and 10 rebounds. Point guard Kyle Fuller had nearly as many turnovers (four) as he had points (five), and Parker finished with two more turnovers than points (two).

The Rebels took a 29-20 lead into halftime and went up 33-20 in the opening minutes of the second half. But after a first half when Vanderbilt shot 29.2 percent, the Commodores hit nine of their first 17 in the second half. When James Siakam scored underneath with 6:10 left, that gave Vanderbilt its first lead since 3-0 at 46-45.

But then the Commodores went cold as Jones missed a pair of free throws.

Aaron Jones hit a jumper putting the Rebels ahead to stay with 5:48 to go the first of 11 straight points.

Henderson fed a pass to Perez for a layup. Then Odom lost the ball on the sideline leading to a scramble that ended with Henderson hitting a 3-pointer. Henderson then hit a second consecutive 3, pushing the lead to 55-46 with 3:57 left, and celebrated with a big fist pump in front of the Vanderbilt student section that had been booing him all night long when he touched the ball.

Henderson's back-to-back 3-pointers were the highlight of the night for the senior guard who came in as the SEC's best 3-point shooter and was named the league's player of the week on Monday. He forced overtime here last season from about 30 feet out had trouble connecting Wednesday night. Henderson also missed a shot just after he crossed mid-court that bounced off the rim before the halftime buzzer.
