### #17/19 Vanderbilt Faces #2 Kentucky Saturday

The battle for SEC East supremacy is on the line this Saturday afternoon when the #2 Kentucky Wildcats come to Memorial Gym in a nationally televised contest. Tip off is set for 5 p.m. CT, and the game can be seen live on ESPN and ESPN360.com. The radio call can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson courtside with all of the action.

The Wildcats enter the game with a one-game lead over the Commodores in the SEC East standings and have a league record of 10-1. Vanderbilt is now 9-2 in league play after an 82-78 win over Ole Miss Thursday in Oxford, Miss.

Vanderbilt got its fourth road win in league play for the first time since the 2004-05 campaign with the win Thursday night over the Rebels. It was also the Commodores' third consecutive win, and its 14th win in their last 16 games.

Junior center A.J. Ogilvy paced the Commodore effort with a season-high and 2009-10 team best 27 points against the Rebels. The Australian big man was eight-of-10 from the floor and 11-for-13 from the free throw line in the win. He also grabbed eight rebounds. Sophomore Jeffery Taylor scored 19 points on eight-of-11 shooting, and senior Jermaine Beal added 14 points for the Commodores. Taylor is averaging 20.0 points per game in his last three contests, and Beal is pouring in 19.0 points per game in his last seven games.

Free throw shooting once again was at the forefront of the Commodore victory - VU was 26-of-34 from the charity stripe (76.5%) in the win over the Rebels. It was the sixth time in league play that Vanderbilt has attempted at least 30 free throws. Vanderbilt has played 11 SEC games, and has been to the free throw line an SEC-best 346 times, an average of 31.5 times per game. In fact, the Commodores have made 251 in SEC play,

which is more than eight teams in the SEC have attempted in league play.

Vanderbilt and Kentucky will meet for the second time this season and the 176th in the history of the series. Kentucky won the earlier meeting this year, 85-72, in Lexington, and leads the all-time series, 132-43. The Wildcats also lead the series in games played on the Vanderbilt campus, 48-24, although VU has won four consecutive games over Kentucky at Memorial Gym.

Jermaine Beal leads a very balanced Commodore offensive attack with 14.7 points per game. Jeffery Taylor is next at 14.1 points per game, with A.J. Ogilvy (13.9) and John Jenkins (10.3) also averaging double figures.

### Record Against Ranked Foes

The Commodores are 81-200 all-time against ranked opponents and 2-1 this season (two wins over Tennessee, loss to Kentucky). Vanderbilt has a 26-46 record against ranked opponents in the Stallings' Era.

### Vanderbilt At Memorial Gym

The Commodores are 13-0 so far this season at home, and have an 18-game home winning streak dating back to January 25, 2009 (loss to Florida).

### Commodores And The Top 25

Vanderbilt has been ranked six times so far this year in the Top 25 - in the most recent poll, the Commodores came in at number 17 (AP) and 19 (ESPN/USA Today) in both polls.

Prior to making the rankings in mid-November, the Commodores were last ranked during the 2007-08 season when they held a spot in the Top 25 for 16 consecutive weeks (December 3 to March 17).

### 9-2 SEC Start

Is the best for a Vanderbilt team since the 1992-93 season, when VU captured the SEC East title and advanced to the Sweet 16. The 1992-93 team finished the SEC campaign 14-2 that year.

### Commodores Getting To The Line In SEC Play

Vanderbilt has played 11 SEC games, and has been to the free throw line an SEC-best 346 times, an average of 31.5 times per game. In fact, the Commodores have made 251 in SEC play, which is more than seven teams in the SEC have attempted in league play. VU is third in the league in free throw percentage in SEC games only at 72.5% (251-346).

### Jeffery Taylor Wins Player of the Week

Sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor was named SEC Player of the Week for the week of February 8-15 after he averaged 20.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists in wins over No. 12 Tennessee and LSU. Taylor scored a career-high 26 points in Vanderbilt's win over Tennessee. It was the highest single-game point total by a Commodore this season. He was 12-of-12 from the free throw stripe to become just the fourth player in school history to be perfect from the free throw line when attempting 10 or more shots. He also scored 15 points to go with five rebounds in a win over LSU.

## Kentucky

### Scouting Kentucky

Kentucky enters the game as the #2 team in the country and has a 25-1 record overall. The Wildcats are atop the SEC East division with a 10-1 league record. UK won its most recent game, an 81-75 overtime win at Mississippi State on Tuesday night.

Freshman John Wall leads four Kentucky players in double figures with 17.0 points per game. Freshman big man DeMarcus Cousins (16.0), junior forward Patrick Patterson (14.8), and freshman guard Eric Bledsoe (10.7) also average double figures for the Wildcats.

### Vanderbilt's Record Against the SEC

Vanderbilt has a 624-622 all-time record against the schools that currently comprise the SEC.

### Stallings Versus Kentucky

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has an 8-14 record against Kentucky and a 6-4 record against the Wildcats at Memorial Gym. VU has won four straight against Kentucky on its home floor.

### VU Block Party

For the year, VU has 140 blocks, which is a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened last year in 2008-09.

### VU's Remaining Schedule

The Commodores have five games remaining on their SEC schedule, with three games scheduled at home - Kentucky (2/20), Georgia (2/25), South Carolina (3/6) and two on the road - at Arkansas (2/27), and at Florida (3/2).

### Road Success

Vanderbilt is 4-2 so far on the road in SEC play - the four wins ties a Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season. The Commodores won four games on the road in the 2005-06 campaign, and won three road league games in 1999-00 and 2006-07. The 3-0 start on the road in league play was the best for a Vanderbilt team since 1964-65.

## FIRST MEETING WITH KENTUCKY

LeBron James turned out to be a better good-luck charm than the president for No. 1 Kentucky. With the NBA superstar -- a good friend of coach John Calipari's -- watching from the front row, the Wildcats bounced back from an upset loss to South Carolina with an 85-72 victory over No. 21 Vanderbilt.

DeMarcus Cousins posted his 12th double-double -- the most every by a Kentucky freshman -- with 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead a balanced attack as the Wildcats (20-1, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) served notice to the Commodores (16-4, 5-1) that they remain the team to beat in the SEC.

Cousins almost single-handedly gave Kentucky an early double-digit lead -- he converted four three-point plays in the game's first eight minutes -- and did his best to stay composed despite Vanderbilt's best efforts to rattle him.

When the Commodores tried to throw two or more bodies at Cousins, he would spin toward the baseline for an easy basket or kick it outside to an open teammate for a jumper -- the latest fact in his quickly developing game.

And there were good looks aplenty for the Wildcats, who made 12 of 23 3-point attempts and dominated the boards, outrebounding Vanderbilt 41-22, leading to 20 second-chance points.

Darnell Dodson had 16 points in just his second start of the season. Eric Bledsoe had 13 points and seven rebounds while Patrick Patterson chipped in 12 points.

Jermaine Beal led the Commodores with 19 points, but Vanderbilt couldn't pull off its second road upset of the week in a physical, whistle-plagued game that featured 58 fouls and very little flow. A.J. Ogilvy (12), Andre Walker (10), Jeffery Taylor (10), and John Jenkins (10) also added double figures for the Commodores.

## Stallings Gets Fifth 20-Win Season At Vanderbilt

With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one 20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six. Here's a look his five 20-win seasons at Vanderbilt:

## 50% From the Floor...

Vanderbilt has converted 50% or more of its shots from the field in 11 games so far this season, and have a 11-0 record in those games.

## You Never Know What You're Going To Get...

Vanderbilt has had six different leading scorers (Beal, Goulbourne, Jenkins, Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley, ), five different leading rebounders (Goulbourne, McClellan, Ogilvy, Taylor, Walker), five different assist leaders (Beal, Jenkins, Taylor, Tinsley, Walker), and seven different leading shot blockers (Ezeli, Goulbourne, Jenkins, McClellan, Ogilvy, Tinsley, Walker) so far this season. Eight different Commodores have scored in double figures this season.

## Beal Eclipses 1,000-Point Barrier Vs. Auburn

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 40th player in Vanderbilt history to reach the 1,000-point mark after registering 14 points against Auburn. He is the team's second 1,000-point scorer - A.J. Ogilvy became the first sophomore in VU history to go over the 1,000-point mark last season.

## Big Shot Beal

Beal led Vanderbilt with a 25-point effort in a 85-76 win over Tennessee on January 27, the Commodores' first win in Knoxville in four years. Beal scored 10 points in a 23-5 Vanderbilt run late in the second half to give the Commodores a cushion they would use the rest of the way to come away with the win.

## Beal Also Sees Scoring Increase

Jermaine Beal has seen his scoring increase in every year of his career. So far in 2009-10, he is averaging 14.7 points per game. Last season, he pumped in 12.5 points per game, the team's second highest scoring average, and increased his scoring from his sophomore to junior season by nearly five points (4.9). He averaged 3.8 points per game as a freshman and 7.6 points per game as a sophomore.

## Beal On Scoring Tear

The senior point guard is averaging 19.0 points per game in his last seven games, and has scored 20 or more in three of those seven games - 25 at Tennessee, 21 at Georgia, and 20 vs. Tennessee. He has also had only 10 turnovers in 251 minutes of play in those seven games.

Vanderbilt is 10-4 this season when Jermaine Beal scores at least 15 points ... VU is 17-5 overall in Beal's career when he scores at least 15 points.

## Taylor Breaks Out Vs. Tennessee

Jeffery Taylor broke out in a big way against Tennessee, scoring a career-high 26 points in a 90-71 win over the Volunteers at Memorial Gym. Taylor was 7-for-11 from the floor and a perfect 12-for-12 from the free-throw line in the win, and also added seven rebounds.

## Taylor's Free Throws Vs. Tennessee

Taylor finished 12-of-12 from the free-throw line to become just the fourth Vanderbilt player to make all of his attempts when attempting at least 10 free throws. Commodore great Matt Freije owns the school record by making 18-of-18 against Indiana on Nov. 23, 2003. Earlier this season, Taylor set the Memorial Gym record for the highest field-goal percentage in a game.

## Ogilvy Grabs SEC Player of the Week Honor

A.J. Ogilvy won his first SEC Player of the Week award for the week of November 30-December 6 after averaging 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds against Missouri and DePaul, respectively. It was the first player of the week honor for the 6'11 center from Sydney, Australia - he won three SEC Freshman of the Week awards in the 2007-08 season.

## Ogilvy Reaches Milestone Vs. Lipscomb

A.J. Ogilvy tallied three blocks against Lipscomb on November 16, which gave him 100 blocks for his career, making him the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy is only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

## Ogilvy On Career Lists

Junior A.J. Ogilvy has already made the all-time records list in scoring and blocks after only two years and change of competition. Ogilvy currently has 1,373 points, which places him in 15th place all-time. His total of 137 blocks puts him in second place overall for blocks in a career.

## Ogilvy And The 20-Point Barrier

Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in 22 games in his three-year Vanderbilt career, and the Commodores are 21-1 in those games. Also, when he attempts 10 or more free throws, VU is 18-2 in his three-year career.

## Ogilvy Notches Season High At Ole Miss

Ogilvy scored 27 points at Ole Miss, which set a new high for him in 2009-10 and a team-best for an individual this season. Ogilvy was 8-for-10 from the floor and 11-for-13 from the charity stripe against the Rebels on February 18.

## A.J. And The Charity Stripe

## Goulbourne Notches Career Highs Vs. LSU

Sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne scored a career-high 18 points and also grabbed a career-best nine rebounds in Vanderbilt's 77-69 win over LSU Saturday. Goulbourne also played a career-high 26 minutes with starter Andre Walker and top reserve John Jenkins missing the game because of injury and illness.

## Walker Returns From Torn ACL And Excels

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and is a sophomore this year, has started in all but one game so far this year and is averaging 5.9 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. Walker has four games this season with at least five assists, and has either tied for the team lead or led the team in assists eight times this year.

## Walker Misses LSU Game With Shoulder Injury

Walker did not play in the Commodores' 77-69 win over LSU because of a sore shoulder. He returned to the starting lineup against Ole Miss.

## Hinkle Transfers

6'6 redshirt sophomore Charles Hinkle is no longer with the team after deciding to transfer after the fall semester. Hinkle, from Los Alamitos, Calif., averaged 1.4 points and 0.5 rebounds in 10 games in the 2009-10 season, and 1.8 points and 0.8 rebounds in his two-year Vanderbilt career. Hinkle sat out the 2007-08 season as a redshirt.

## Festus For The Rest Of Us

6'11 redshirt sophomore big man Festus Ezeli has started five games this season and has filled in nicely for the Commodores when spelling A.J. Ogilvy.

Against Southern Miss on January 2, Ezeli came off of the bench and added eight points, four rebounds, and three blocks for Vanderbilt, and against MTSU on January 4, he scored a season-high 10 points to go along with three blocks. Against Mississippi State and the Bulldogs' Jarvis Varnado, he scored five points and had a career-high seven rebounds.

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year. So far in 2009-10, Jenkins has scored in double figures 15 times and is averaging 10.3 points per game.

Jenkins has scored in double figures in 11 out of his last 14 games. ## 3-Point Streak Enters 22nd Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 754 consecutive games after the 2008-09 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (763, 2/18) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (642, 2/15) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

## Stallings Now In Second Place On All-Time VU Wins List

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 300th career game as a head coach last season, got his 200th win as Vanderbilt coach against Middle Tennessee State on January 4. He is in sole possession of second place on the all-time Vanderbilt wins list after surpassing Bob Polk's mark of 197 wins against Manhattan.

Now in his 17th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 209 in his 11-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings trails only Roy Skinner (278, 1962-76) on the all-time coaching wins list.

Most recently against LSU, Stallings garnered his 150th career win at Memorial Gym.

## Vanderbilt Signs Three In Early Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that guard Kyle Fuller, center Josh Henderson, and forward Rod Odom have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2010.

Fuller, a 6'1 point guard from Moreno Valley, Calif., averaged nearly 20 points and nine assists per game in 2009 as a junior to lead his Rancho Verde High School team to a 24-6 record and trip to the sectional quarterfinals. This summer, he averaged almost 25 points and 10 assists per contest for his Inland Empire 17 and Under AAU Squad. Fuller will be the Commodores' third player from California on the roster, joining Festus Ezeli and Darshawn McClellan.

Fuller chose the Commodores over California, UCLA, and Marquette.

Henderson, a 6'11 center, comes to Vanderbilt from Roanoke, Va., where he plays at Cave Spring High School. He averaged 17.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior with the Knights. Henderson, who has maintained a 3.5 GPA in high school, chose the Commodores over Davidson, Virginia, and Wake Forest.

6'8 forward Rod Odom, from Bellport, N.Y., closes out the early signing class for the Commodores. Odom, ranked the 77th best prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, is a long, athletic forward who averaged 16.5 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks at Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., as a junior. Odom chose Vanderbilt over Arizona, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and West Virginia.

## Taylor and FG%

Earlier this season against Tennessee State on December 19, he was 10-for-11 (90.9%) from the floor in a 20-point effort on December 19, which set a new individual single-game FG% record at Memorial Gym. The previous record was 90.0 (minimum 10 attempts) by Vanderbilt's Brett Burrow on Feb.16, 1985 against Tennessee.

## Commodores Knock Off St. Mary's

Vanderbilt knocked off St. Mary's, 72-70, on November 20 to open a four-game road swing that included the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational. Vanderbilt handed St. Mary's only their third non-conference loss in their last 29 games in McKeon Pavilion, with Jeffery Taylor leading the way for VU with 19 points.

## Vanderbilt Finishes 2-1 At 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational

The Commodores returned home from their trip to Maui with a record of 2-1, with wins coming over host Chaminade and Arizona, and Vanderbilt's lone loss coming against Cincinnati in the first round of the tournament. Senior guard Jermaine Beal led four players in double figures in the three games in Maui, averaging 14.7 points per game. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy averaged 13.0 points, sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor added 11.0 points, and true freshman guard John Jenkins chpped in 10.7 points per contest.

## Team Shoots Well Vs. Tennessee State

The Commodores converted on 67.9% of its shots from the floor (36-53), which set a new record for single-game field goal percentage in the Stallings era. The previous best came on March 13, 2008, against Auburn at the SEC Tournament in the Georgia Dome, when the Commodores connected on 67.3% (33-49) of their shots from the field.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 27 points and made all eight free throws attempts in the final 4 minutes to lead No. 17 Vanderbilt to an 82-78 victory over Mississippi.

The Commodores (20-5, 9-2 Southeastern Conference) did it their way, grinding down the Rebels (17-8, 5-6) late with a relentless inside game that led to 34 free throw attempts -- three above their average in league play. Vanderbilt hit 19 of 22 free throws over the final 6:07 for its third straight win and 14th in 16 games.

It was the fourth loss in five games for Ole Miss, which is fading from the NCAA picture after reaching as high as No. 14 in the Top 25 before falling out two weeks ago.

Ogilvy was 8 of 10 from the field and 11 of 13 from the free throw line, while Jeffery Taylor added 19 points. Jermaine Beal hit 9 of 10 free throws to finish with 14 points.

Chris Warren led Mississippi with 23 points, but like many of the Rebels he spent much of the second half in foul trouble and was never a consistent threat.

Ole Miss opened the game with a flurry, scoring 16 points in the first 3:52 to take its biggest lead, 16-5. The Rebels were 5 of 6 from the field and 4 of 4 from 3-point range in that span. After that, though, they went cold, missing 18 of their next 22 shots and scoring just 12 more points in the half.

The Commodores hit 6 of 6 free throws during an 18-8 run in which the Rebels missed 4 of 5 attempts from the line. Murphy Holloway missed the first shot of a 1-and-1 -- his third failure to convert the bonus -- and Reginald Buckner missed two attempts as Vanderbilt made its move.

That gave the Commodores a 65-60 lead and though the Rebels kept it close, Ogilvy and Beal hit Vanderbilt's final eight free throws for the win.

- The win pushed Vanderbilt's record to 5-0 against SEC West competition. The Commodores play at Arkansas on February 27 in their last SEC-West regular season game of the year.
- Vanderbilt shot 47.3 percent (26-55) from the floor compared to 48.4 percent (30-62) by Ole Miss ... Vanderbilt was outshot for the first time since a loss at Georgia on February 6. VU has only been outshot in three games in SEC play this season (at Ole Miss, at Georgia, at Alabama).
- Vanderbilt has outshot its opponents in all but six games this season ... In those six games, Vanderbilt lost four times ... The only games it won when being outshot was at Alabama and at Ole Miss ... The only game it lost when it outshot its opponent was at Kentucky.
- Vanderbilt shot 30.8 percent (4-of-13) from three compared to 44.4 percent by Ole Miss (8-of-18).
- VU is now 19-3 when shooting at least 40 percent from the field.
- Vanderbilt is 16-1 when it's scored 70 or more points and 13-0 in games when it scores at least 80 points.
- Vanderbilt committed 14 turnovers compared to 11 by Ole Miss ... VU is now 9-1 this season when it commits more turnovers than its opponent ... VU has won its last five games when it has had more miscues than its opponent (Tennessee 2x, Mississippi State, LSU, at Ole Miss).
- Vanderbilt shot 58.3% in the second half (14-24). In SEC play, the Commodores are shooting 51.9% from the field (152-293)
- Vanderbilt is now 19-0 this season when leading with five minutes to go in the game.
- The Commodores blocked only two shots in the game against Ole Miss. This year's team, which has already set a new team record for blocks in a season, has only had one game with fewer blocks - the Illinois game on December 8, when VU had only one.
- VU outrebounded Ole Miss, 36-35. The Commodores moved to 12-0 on the season when outrebounding its opponent.
- Vanderbilt had 15 assists against 14 turnovers, the 10th time that the Commodores have had more assists than turnovers. VU is 9-1 in those games, with their only loss coming at Illinois.
- Vanderbilt outscored Ole Miss, 40-38 in the paint, 13-11 on second chance points, and 8-6 on fast break points.

### Individual Notes

- With the win, Head Coach Kevin Stallings is now 209-133 at Vanderbilt ... He is second in school history in career wins and trails only Roy Skinner (278 wins) ... With the team's win against Manhattan on Dec. 30, Stallings moved into second place among all-time wins leaders at Vanderbilt, surpassing Bob Polk's 197 wins...Saturday's win against LSU was Stallings' 150th career victory at Memorial Gym.
- With the win over Ole Miss, Stallings' notched his 5th 20-win season in 11 years at Vanderbilt. It is the 9th of his career (four at Illinois State)
- Junior center A.J. Ogilvy scored a season-high and 2009-10 team best 27 points against Ole Miss. It was his first 20-point performance since scoring 22 points at South Carolina on January 16 and his fifth of the season.
- The 27-point performance was his 22nd career 20-point game - Vanderbilt is 21-1 in those 22 games.
- Ogilvy was 11-for-13 from the free throw line against Ole Miss...it was the 20th game in his career that he has attempted 10 or more free throws. Vanderbilt is 18-2 in those 20 games.
- Ogilvy now has 1,373 career points, which places him 15th all-time on the all-time scoring list. Bobby Thym (1954-57) is 14th on the list with 1,403 career points.
- Jermaine Beal scored 14 points and now has 1,140 in his career, which ranks 31st in school history ... Beal trails Babe Taylor (1,144) points for 30th in school history ... Against Auburn on Jan. 23 Beal became the 40th player in school history to reach 1,000 points in his career ... Beal reached double figures in scoring for the 22nd time this season and 57th time in his career ... Beal has now reached double figures in 13 straight games ...
- Beal had his streak of three or more made threes in a game halted at six against Ole Miss. However, he has hat at least one three-pointer in 18 straight games.
- In Vanderbilt's last seven games Beal is averaging 19.0 points ... Over the same span of games Beal has just 10 turnovers.
- Beal finished the game with two assists and ranks seventh in school history with 390 career assists ... Drew Maddux (1994-98) is sixth in school history with 394 assists.
- Jeffery Taylor scored 19 points in the win over Ole Miss. Taylor has scored in double figures in 20 games this season and 42 times in his two-year career.
- Taylor is averaging 20.0 points per game in his last three contests.
- Taylor also had four assists against the Rebels.
- Brad Tinsley had seven assists against Ole Miss...he now leads the team with 80 assists.

# 2009-10 PRESEASON NOTES

## Returning for the Commodores...

The Commodores return 14 letterwinners from a year ago, including all five starters for a team that finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play in 2008-09. Vanderbilt missed the postseason for the first time for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal is back after leading the SEC for the second consecutive season in assist-to-turnover ratio, while also increasing his scoring average to 12.5 points per game as a junior, a 4.9 point-per-game increase from his sophomore season. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, is one of the program's hardest workers and will lead the Commodores as the only senior on the squad.

The other four starters returning for Vanderbilt include junior center A.J. Ogilvy (15.4 points, 7.1 rebounds per game), sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor (12.5 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard Brad Tinsley (11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds), and a combination of Steve Tchiengang (3.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Darshawn McClellan (2.1 points, 3.0 rebounds) at the power forward position.

Other returning letterwinners include redshirt sophomore wing Charles Hinkle, redshirt sophomore center Festus Ezeli, sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne, redshirt sophomore forward Andre Walker, junior forward Joe Duffy, and walkons Chris Meriwether and Aaron Noll.

6'6 guard Jordan Smart returns after redshirting a year ago, and the only newcomer to the fold, freshman guard John Jenkins, also joins the team.

Walk-on junior guard Elliott Cole will miss the entire season due to a shoulder injury.

## Player Accolades

Then-sophomore center **A.J. Ogilvy** was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches at the end of the 2008-09 campaign and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman **Jeffery Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and **Elliott Cole**, **Joe Duffy**, and **Andre Walker** were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marked the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

## Leaders From 2008-09 Season

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

## Ogilvy Named To Preseason All-SEC 1st Team

League coaches have named A.J. Ogilvy to their preseason All-SEC first team. He was a second-team All-SEC preseason selection by SEC media.

## Ogilvy Reaches 1,000-Point Plateau

With his performance against LSU on March 4th of 2009, Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of

Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000 point barrier. He has 1,041 points in his career. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points).

## Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game in 2008-09, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

## Block Party In 2008-09

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

## Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley did not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings in 2008-09 because they did not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would have placed in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would have tied for fifth at 40.3% (58-144), and Tinsley would have been third at 41.1% (69-168). Evaldus Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 52.1% (38-73).

## Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

## Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

## Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

## Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

# SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish third in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 90 points in the poll to finish behind Kentucky (148), and Tennessee (117). South Carolina was chosen fourth (77), Florida fifth (68) and Georgia was chosen sixth (25).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 144 votes, 24 votes better than Ole Miss (120). Kentucky received 20 out of the 25 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received three votes and Tennessee received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

# MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952

## HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 58TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 58th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008 against Mississippi State.

\* The Commodores have posted a 694-186 (.789) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.

\* VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

\* Vanderbilt has won 115 of its last 122 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 162-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).

\* The Commodores are 95-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

\* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

Clint Steindl's 3-point try at the buzzer went in and out, and the Commodores escaped with a victory.

Vanderbilt opened the second half with a 9-0 run, building a 48-39 lead with 17:30 left. Taylor ignited the burst with a fast-break slam after a Gaels turnover. Moments later he had another slam at the end of a break. Walker made it 44-39, scoring inside on yet another fast break. Samhan finally ended the Gaels' drought with put-back with 16:45 left, but the Commodores went on another run, this time outscoring St. Mary's 9-2 to take a 57-43 lead. St. Mary's, though, quickly got back into the game. The Gaels sliced Vanderbilt's 14-point lead to just one at 59-58. Dellavedova's high-arcing 3-point shot from well beyond the top of the key made it 59-53. Then McConnell scored from long range, and Samhan scored inside. But Vanderbilt went on a 6-2 spurt and held off the Gaels down the stretch. St. Mary's has been tough to beat at home. Taylor didn't this time either, making one of two free-throw attempts with six seconds left to help the Commodores complete a come-from-behind 65-64 victory over Alabama on Wednesday night.

Taylor and Ogilvy each had 13 points and nine rebounds for the Commodores, with Taylor scoring 11 in the second half. Jermaine Beal and John Jenkins scored 11 points apiece. Ogilvy played the final five minutes with four fouls.

Vanderbilt went 20-of-37 from the line and made just half of its 12 attempts in the final 5 minutes. It was just enough as Alabama went the final 3 minutes without a field goal.

Alabama was 10-of-17 from the line. The Tide shot 47 percent while the Commodores hit just 39 percent, but Vanderbilt was 5-of-10 on 3-pointers.

Vanderbilt won its eighth straight and improved to 3-0 in the SEC for the first time since the 1989-90 season. Ogilvy, a 6-foot-11 junior, was too much for the Gamecocks to contain underneath. He made 7 of 8 shots from the floor and 8 of 13 from the foul line as Vanderbilt (14-3, 3-0) won its eighth straight.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting. Devan Downey had a season-high 35 points for South Carolina (11-6, 2-1), the third time this season he's surpassed 30.

John Jenkins' 3-pointer with 38.5 seconds to go pushed the Commodores' lead to 41-33. But Downey drove through three defenders for a layup with 1 second left.

Downey finished with 18 of his team's 35 points in the first half.

Vanderbilt adjusted its defense and took Downey's penetration away for the first 10 minutes after the break, building a 17-point lead after Brad Tinsley's two straight jumpers with 10:02 to go.

South Carolina could not come closer than eight points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's depth also wore down the Gamecocks. Stallings shuttled players in and out, all who produced — each of the nine Commodores who played left with at least four points.

Vanderbilt shot better than 60 percent, many of those field goals coming from close to the basket. The Commodores also controlled the boards, outrebounding South Carolina 39-24.

A.J. Ogilvy bumbled around the basket. Jeffery Taylor struggled to find his shot. Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't mind. He still had Jermaine Beal available to rescue the Commodores.

Beal scored 25 points and Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 21 AP) won its 10th straight game with an 85-76 victory over No. 14 Tennessee. It was Vandy's first win in Knoxville in five tries and its first win over a ranked opponent this season.

Stallings has plenty to feel good about besides Beal's clutch play. Vanderbilt (16-3, 5-0 Southeastern Conference) is off to its best start in the league since 1966 and will head to No. 1 Kentucky with control of the SEC East.

For Tennessee it meant a second straight conference loss after falling at Georgia on Saturday. The Volunteers host Florida on Sunday.

The teams traded the lead until a 3-pointer by Brad Tinsley with 8:42 left put Vanderbilt up 59-56, a lead it did not relinquish.

Beal hit a layup and two 3s in less than a minute to give Vanderbilt control with a 74-60 cushion with 4:58 remaining.

J.P. Prince led Tennessee (15-4, 3-2) with 22 points, and Wayne Chism grabbed 16 rebounds. Scotty Hopson scored 14, while Maze added 12.

Vanderbilt shot 50.9 percent from the floor, the 11th time this season the Commodores have hit more than half their shots.

But it wasn't until the second half that they found their touch. Ogilvy finished with 12 after scoring two points in the first half. John Jenkins, Taylor and Tinsley each added 10 points.

LeBron James turned out to be a better good-luck charm than the president for No. 1 Kentucky. With the NBA superstar -- a good friend of coach John Calipari's -- watching from the front row, the Wildcats bounced back from an upset loss to South Carolina with an 85-72 victory over No. 21 Vanderbilt.

DeMarcus Cousins posted his 12th double-double -- the most every by a Kentucky freshman -- with 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead a balanced attack as the Wildcats (20-1, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) served notice to the Commodores (16-4, 5-1) that they remain the team to beat in the SEC.

Cousins almost single-handedly gave Kentucky an early double-digit lead -- he converted four three-point plays in the game's first eight minutes -- and did his best to stay composed despite Vanderbilt's best efforts to rattle him.

When the Commodores tried to throw two or more bodies at Cousins, he would spin toward the baseline for an easy basket or kick it outside to an open teammate for a jumper -- the latest facet in his quickly developing game.

And there were good looks aplenty for the Wildcats, who made 12 of 23 3-point attempts and dominated the boards, outrebounding Vanderbilt 41-22, leading to 20 second-chance points.

Darnell Dodson had 16 points in just his second start of the season. Eric Bledsoe had 13 points and seven rebounds while Patrick Patterson chipped in 12 points.

Jermaine Beal led the Commodores with 19 points, but Vanderbilt couldn't pull off its second road upset of the week in a physical, whistle-plagued game that featured 58 fouls and very little flow. A.J. Ogilvy (12), Andre Walker (10), Jeffery Taylor (10), and John Jenkins (10) also added double figures for the Commodores.

The Vanderbilt Commodores are really comfortable playing at home in Memorial Gym. Against Mississippi State on Wednesday night, they almost got too cozy.

Jermaine Beal scored 17 points, and No. 18 Vanderbilt held off the Bulldogs 75-72, the Commodores' 11th win in 12 games.

Vanderbilt (17-4, 6-1 Southeastern Conference) bounced back after losing their first league game last weekend at then-No. 1 Kentucky. The Commodores had been on the road for four of the first six games in SEC play, and they looked very happy to be back home before a sold-out crowd where they hadn't lost this season.

But this hasn't been an easy series for the Commodores with Mississippi State having won seven of the past 10.

The Bulldogs (16-6, 4-3) almost did it again, fighting back from a 14-point deficit to get within 73-72 with 28.6 seconds left on a 3-pointer by Dee Bost. Vanderbilt's John Jenkins made two free throws with 6.8 seconds remaining, then Bost missed a 3 before Romero Osby of the Bulldogs missed two free throws with 1 second left.

A.J. Ogilvy added 16 points for Vanderbilt, while Jenkins had 12 and Brad Tinsley 11. The Commodores are 6-1 in SEC play for the first time since 1992-93.

Jarvis Varnado had 12 points, 14 rebounds and nine blocks - seven in the second half - for the Bulldogs. Kodi Augustus had 15 points, Barry Stewart 13 and Bost 12. Varnado and Stewart set the school record by playing in their 127th game.

The Bulldogs, pressured into constant turnovers most of the first 25 minutes, settled down and rallied to beat No. 18 Vanderbilt 72-58.

Georgia (10-11, 2-6) appeared bound for its fourth straight Southeastern Conference loss when it trailed early in the second half. But the Bulldogs recovered to shoot 53.2 percent for the game and end a three-game losing streak.

Georgia won for the first time since beating then-No. 8 Tennessee on Jan. 23. Trey Thompkins also had 17 points as the Bulldogs gave Vanderbilt (17-5, 6-2) its second loss in its last 13 games.

Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt with 21 points. Tinsley added 18, but the Commodores found too little scoring support for the two guards.

Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy had six points, ending a streak of scoring in double figures in 12 straight games. He led the Commodores with nine rebounds.

Beal and Tinsley made 9 of 13 shots from the field in the first half, but their teammates were 1 for 18. Vanderbilt made only 20 of 61 shots overall and matched its season low for points.

Georgia turned the ball over 13 times in the first half and trailed 36-28 early in the second half before rallying behind Travis Leslie, who scored 13 of his 17 points after the break.

The more composed Georgia offense abused Vanderbilt's man defense to make 14 of 21 shots in the second half while committing only eight turnovers.

Georgia's defense prevented Vanderbilt from its first 4-1 start in SEC road games since the 1966-67 season.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't know when Jeffery Taylor would break out. He just felt it would be soon.

The sophomore guard's timing couldn't have been better. Taylor scored 16 of his career-high 26 points in the first half, and Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 22 AP) never trailed in routing No. 12 Tennessee 90-71, grabbing sole possession of second place in the Southeastern Conference's Eastern Division, one loss behind Kentucky (No. 2 ESPN/USA Today, No. 3 AP).

The Commodores (18-5, 7-2) swept the season series against their in-state rival for the first time since 2004-05 -- the season before coach Bruce Pearl took over Tennessee. They did it with the best shooting performance at the free-throw line in Stallings' 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, connecting on 37 of 43.

Jermaine Beal scored 20 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 11 for Vanderbilt, which didn't miss reserve John Jenkins. The freshman, who had been averaging 10.4 points, was hospitalized with the flu Monday and was so ill he needed five bags of fluid intravenously.

Taylor hadn't scored more than 10 points in a game since Jan. 23 against Auburn. He couldn't miss against Tennessee as the sophomore was 4 of 5 from the field and perfect on all eight free throws in the first half.

J.P. Prince led Tennessee with 19 points, Wayne Chism had 16, Melvin Goins 11 and Scotty Hopson 10.

The Commodores scored the first six points and led 44-27 at halftime. They hit eight of their first 11 shots as Tennessee missed 14 of its first 17 and eventually led by as many as 27 points twice.

Missing two players and playing for the first time since beating its in-state rival, Vanderbilt was in position for a letdown.

Lance Goulbourne wouldn't let that happen. The reserve forward scored a career-high 18 points -- 11 in the second half -- to lead the Commodores (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 22 AP) to a 77-69 victory over LSU.

Vanderbilt (19-5, 7-2 Southeastern Conference) was without starting forward Andre Walker (shoulder) and reserve guard John Jenkins, who missed his second straight game due to the stomach flu.

Goulbourne, who averages just 13 minutes a game, shouldered most of the load Saturday, playing 26 minutes. He was big on the glass with nine rebounds and clutch at the free throw line, where he was 7 of 9.

LSU (9-16, 0-11), which has lost 13 straight regular-season conference games dating to last season, erased an eight-point deficit in the second half. The Tigers tied it at 59-59 with more than 4 minutes left on a dunk by Garrett Green.

Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy responded on the other end with a basket and drew a foul. He missed the free throw but Goulbourne was there for the putback that gave the Commodores a 63-59 lead.

After LSU's Tasmin Mitchell scored inside, Ogilvy hit two more free throws and Jermaine Beal tacked on a three-point play for a 68-61 lead with 2:06 left.

Beal scored 17 points, Jeffery Taylor added 15 and Ogilvy had 12 for Vanderbilt.

Mitchell scored 18 of his 20 points in the second half, Bo Spencer added 18, Storm Warren had 12 and Dennis Harris scored 10 for LSU, which hasn't won a league game in the regular season since Feb. 28, 2009, at Kentucky.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 27 points and made all eight free throws attempts in the final 4 minutes to lead No. 17 Vanderbilt to an 82-78 victory over Mississippi.

The Commodores (20-5, 9-2 Southeastern Conference) did it their way, grinding down the Rebels (17-8, 5-6) late with a relentless inside game that led to 34 free throw attempts -- three above their average in league play. Vanderbilt hit 19 of 22 free throws over the final 6:07 for its third straight win and 14th in 16 games.

It was the fourth loss in five games for Ole Miss, which is fading from the NCAA picture after reaching as high as No. 14 in the Top 25 before falling out two weeks ago.

Ogilvy was 8 of 10 from the field and 11 of 13 from the free throw line, while Jeffery Taylor added 19 points. Jermaine Beal hit 9 of 10 free throws to finish with 14 points.

Chris Warren led Mississippi with 23 points, but like many of the Rebels he spent much of the second half in foul trouble and was never a consistent threat.

Ole Miss opened the game with a flurry, scoring 16 points in the first 3:52 to take its biggest lead, 16-5. The Rebels were 5 of 6 from the field and 4 of 4 from 3-point range in that span. After that, though, they went cold, missing 18 of their next 22 shots and scoring just 12 more points in the half.

The Commodores hit 6 of 6 free throws during an 18-8 run in which the Rebels missed 4 of 5 attempts from the line. Murphy Holloway missed the first shot of a 1-and-1 -- his third failure to convert the bonus -- and Reginald Buckner missed two attempts as Vanderbilt made its move.

That gave the Commodores a 65-60 lead and though the Rebels kept it close, Ogilvy and Beal hit Vanderbilt's final eight free throws for the win.
