### Vanderbilt Meets Intracity Foe Tennessee State Saturday

Vanderbilt and Tennessee State will meet on the hardwood for the seventh time to begin a six-game Memorial Gym homestand for the Commodores on Saturday afternoon at 3 p.m. The action can also be heard live on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson courtside calling all of the action, and vucommodores.com will have a live webcast of the game.

Vanderbilt emerges from an eight-day break after their last game against Western Kentucky, a game the Commodores dropped, 76-69, at the Nashville Arena on December 11, with today's match up with the Tigers. VU has actually dropped two consecutive games, and will be happy to play in front of the home crowd, where the team has a 3-0 record on the 2009-10 campaign. Vanderbilt's last game at home came against DePaul on December 5, a game the Commodores won, 79-68.

Against Western Kentucky, Vanderbilt was led by sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor, who scored 21 points and grabbed nine rebounds, both team highs. The 21-point effort was his second 20+ point game of the season and fifth of his career. Senior Jermaine Beal, who saw his 70-game starting streak come to an end against the Hilltoppers, came off the bench to score 12 points. He also added four assists for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores are led in scoring and rebounding by Taylor, who averages 15.7 points and 6.6 rebounds per game. Beal adds 13.2 points per contest, and junior center A.J. Ogilvy chips in 12.7 points per game. Ogilvy is second on the team in rebounding at 5.6 rebounds per game.

Saturday's game marks the 35th anniversary of the first time the two teams met on the court on December 8, 1973. Roy Skinner's Vanderbilt team outlasted a very talented Tennessee State squad, 67-66, that night. Vanderbilt leads the all-time series, 6-0, with every game taking place at Memorial Gym.

## VU Vs. Tennessee State: A Historical Perspective - By Ryan Schulz

Commodore Nation editor Ryan Schulz wrote this piece about Vanderbilt's game against the Tigers this Saturday. The Commodore Nation is a monthly magazine which features current news and feature stories of Vanderbilt Athletics.

When Vanderbilt takes the court to play Tennessee State on Dec. 19, the circumstances surrounding the game will be much different than they were when the two faced each other for the first time on Dec. 8, 1973

Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace had already become the first African-American scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court for the 1967-68 season, but when Vanderbilt Coach Roy Skinner scheduled Tennessee State to play Vanderbilt at Memorial Gym, race relations were still touchy, especially in the South. At the time, it was an anomaly for an SEC school to play a historically African-American college.

"You can imagine that at that point in our country's history with race relations the way they were, I think it was a courageous thing for Roy Skinner to schedule them because Vanderbilt had everything to lose in that game," said retired Tennessean sports writer Jimmy Davy, who covered the historic game. "You particularly have to give Skinner credit since he scheduled the game. This is the same guy who recruited Perry Wallace, the first African-American player in the SEC."

When the two met, Tennessee State was coming off a season where it finished runner-up at the NCAA Division II Championships and Vanderbilt was en route to winning the SEC title. Although, Tennessee State played in a lower division, many believed Tennessee State, led by legendary Coach Ed Martin, was a better team.

"The main reason I scheduled the game is because I kept hearing that we wouldn't play them because we were scared of them," Skinner said. "It finally got to me and I said, 'the heck with this stuff,' so I went for it."

The game lived up to the hype. It was a see-saw affair that came down to the final seconds with the Commodores holding onto a 67-66 win. The Commodores were led by Jan Van Breda Kolff, while the Tigers were paced by Leonard "Truck" Robinson, who was drafted in the third round of the NBA Draft that year by Washington.

"It had been said many times that TSU could beat Vanderbilt, and as the game progressed, you felt they were right because it was very close," Davy said. "While it was highly competitive, I think people went away knowing they'd seen a really great basketball game under very unusual circumstances for that time."

Skinner, who was inducted into the Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in September, won 278 games as Vanderbilt's coach—the most in school history—but the Tennessee State game was one he'll never forget. It would be the only time he faced Tennessee State, which didn't face the Commodores again until the 1995-96 season.

"There was a lot of pressure on that game," Skinner said. "Not a lot of schools would play Tennessee State at the time. I just remember how close it was, and I felt like if it had been on their court, they would have won. They had an awfully good team."

### Ogilvy Grabs SEC Player of the Week Honor

A.J. Ogilvy won his first SEC Player of the Week award for the week of November 30-December 6 after averaging 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds against Missouri and DePaul, respectively. It was the first player of the week honor for the 6'11 center from Sydney, Australia - he won three SEC Freshman of the Week awards in the 2007-08 season.

### Scouting Tennessee State

Tennessee State enters the game with a 3-8 record, although the Tigers have won two straight with wins over Detroit and, most recently, against Alabama A&M. Josh Sain leads TSU in scoring with 14.6 points per game, and Robert Covington also averages double digits with 10.4 points per contest. Darius Cox leads the Tigers on the boards with 5.6 rebounds per game.

### Vanderbilt's Record Against The OVC

Vanderbilt has a 54-7 record all-time against teams from the Ohio Valley Conference.

### Stallings Versus Tennessee State

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings will face Tennessee State for the fourth time as a head coach. He has a 3-0 all-time record against the Tigers.

### Ogilvy Reaches Milestone Vs. Lipscomb

A.J. Ogilvy tallied three blocks against Lipscomb on November 16, which gave him 100 blocks for his career, making him the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy is only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

### Double-Digit Man

Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 62 out of 72 games in his three-year career at Vanderbilt. He has 19 career 20+-point outings and has had eight double-doubles in his career.

### Ogilvy On Career Lists

Junior A.J. Ogilvy has already made the all-time records list in scoring and blocks after only two years and change of competition. Ogilvy currently has 1,140 points, and he surpassed Mario Moore for 30th place after scoring eight points against Western Kentucky. His total of 113 blocks put him in third place overall for blocks in a career.

### Beal Also Sees Scoring Increase

Jermaine Beal has seen his scoring increase in every year of his career. So far in 2009-10, he is averaging 13.2 points per game. Last season, he pumped in 12.5 points per game, the team's second highest scoring average, and increased his scoring from his sophomore to junior season by nearly five points (4.9). He averaged 3.8 points per game as a freshman and 7.6 points per game as a sophomore.

### Taylor Has Solid Start

Sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor has gotten off to a quick start for the Commodores, averaging 15.7 points per game. He posted back-to-back double doubles (Arizona, Missouri) for the first time since Matt Freije in 2004, when he accomplished the feat against South Carolina (Jan. 28, 2004) Kentucky (Jan. 31, 2004), and most recently scored 21 points vs. Western Kentucky on December 11.

### International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very worldly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezel is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon.

### Walker Returns From Torn ACL And Excels

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and will be a sophomore this year, has started in every game so far this year and is averaging 6.9 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. He scored nine points in the season opener against Lipscomb, had a career-high 14 points at Saint Mary's, and stuffed the stat sheet with six points, 12 rebounds, four assists, three blocks, and two steals in 25 minutes of action against Missouri.

### Commodores Knock Off St. Mary's

Vanderbilt knocked off St. Mary's, 72-70, on November 20 to open a four-game road swing that included the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational. Vanderbilt handed St. Mary's only their third non-conference loss in their last 29 games in McKeon Pavilion, with Jeffery Taylor leading the way for VU with 19 points.

### Vanderbilt Finishes 2-1 At 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational

The Commodores returned home from their trip to Maui with a record of 2-1, with wins coming over host Chaminade and Arizona, and Vanderbilt's lone loss coming against Cincinnati in the first round of the tournament. Senior guard Jermaine Beal led four players in double figures in the three games in Maui, averaging 14.7 points per game. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy averaged 13.0 points,

### Festus For The Rest Of Us

6'11 redshirt sophomore big man Festus Ezeli has started two games this season and has filled in nicely for the Commodores after A.J. Ogilvy missed some practice time in October with a concussion. Ezeli, who made his eighth start of his career against Western Kentucky, played 14 minutes and contributed seven points, four rebounds, and two blocks against the Hilltoppers.

### Commodores Add John Jenkins To The Fold

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year. Jenkins tallied nine points in his collegiate debut against Lipscomb. So far in 2009-10, Jenkins has scored in double figures four times and is averaging 8.3 points per game.

### 3-Point Streak Enters 22nd Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 738 consecutive games after the 2008-09 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (746, 12/17) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (631, 12/17) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

### Commodores And The Top 25

Vanderbilt has been ranked twice so far this year in the Top 25 - with both times coming at the #24 slot in the polls. The Commodores moved into the 24th slot in the ESPN/USA Today poll for the week of December 7-14 after registering two wins over Missouri and DePaul. VU was also in the poll earlier this year at #24 in both polls before their appearance in the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational, but quickly moved out after going 2-1 at the Lahaina Civic Center. Prior to making the rankings in mid-November, the Commodores were last ranked during the 2007-08 season when they held a spot in the Top 25 for 16 consecutive weeks (December 3 to March 17).

### Stallings Approaches Second Place On All-Time VU Wins List

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 300th career game as a head coach last season, is now only two wins shy of tying Bob Polk's mark of 197 wins, which is second all-time on the VU coaching list. Stallings has 195 career Vanderbilt wins.

Now in his 17th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 195 in his 11-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings trails only Roy Skinner (278; 159, 1962-76) and Bob Polk (197; 1948-58, 1960-61) on the all-time coaching wins list.

### Vanderbilt Signs Three In Early Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that guard Kyle Fuller, center Josh Henderson, and forward Rod Odom have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2010.

Fuller, a 6'1 point guard from Moreno Valley, Calif., averaged nearly 20 points and nine assists per game in 2009 as a junior to lead his Rancho Verde High School team to a 24-6 record and trip to the sectional quarterfinals. This summer, he averaged almost 25 points and 10

assists per contest for his Inland Empire 17 and Under AAU Squad. Fuller will be the Commodores' fourth player from California on the roster, joining Festus Ezeli, Charles Hinkle, and Darshawn McClellan.

Fuller chose the Commodores over California, UCLA, and Marquette.

Henderson, a 6'11 center, comes to Vanderbilt from Roanoke, Va., where he plays at Cave Spring High School. He averaged 17.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior with the Knights. Henderson, who has maintained a 3.5 GPA in high school, chose the Commodores over Davidson, Virginia, and Wake Forest.

6'8 forward Rod Odom, from Bellport, N.Y., closes out the early signing class for the Commodores. Odom, ranked the 77th best prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, is a long, athletic forward who averaged 16.5 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks at Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., as a junior. Odom chose Vanderbilt over Arizona, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and West Virginia.

# 2009-10 PRESEASON NOTES

## Returning for the Commodores...

The Commodores return 14 letterwinners from a year ago, including all five starters for a team that finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play in 2008-09. Vanderbilt missed the postseason for the first time for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal is back after leading the SEC for the second consecutive season in assist-to-turnover ratio, while also increasing his scoring average to 12.5 points per game as a junior, a 4.9 point-per-game increase from his sophomore season. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, is one of the program's hardest workers and will lead the Commodores as the only senior on the squad.

The other four starters returning for Vanderbilt include junior center A.J. Ogilvy (15.4 points, 7.1 rebounds per game), sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor (12.5 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard Brad Tinsley (11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds), and a combination of Steve Tchiengang (3.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Darshawn McClellan (2.1 points, 3.0 rebounds) at the power forward position.

Other returning letterwinners include redshirt sophomore wing Charles Hinkle, redshirt sophomore center Festus Ezeli, sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne, redshirt sophomore forward Andre Walker, junior forward Joe Duffy, and walkons Chris Meriwether and Aaron Noll.

6'6 guard Jordan Smart returns after redshirting a year ago, and the only newcomer to the fold, freshman guard John Jenkins, also joins the team.

Walk-on junior guard Elliott Cole will miss the entire season due to a shoulder injury.

## Player Accolades

Then-sophomore center **A.J. Ogilvy** was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches at the end of the 2008-09 campaign and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman **Jeffery Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and **Elliott Cole**, **Joe Duffy**, and **Andre Walker** were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marked the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

## Leaders From 2008-09 Season

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

## Ogilvy Named To Preseason All-SEC 1st Team

League coaches have named A.J. Ogilvy to their preseason All-SEC first team. He was a second-team All-SEC preseason selection by SEC media.

## Ogilvy Reaches 1,000-Point Plateau

With his performance against LSU on March 4th of 2009, Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of

Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000 point barrier. He has 1,041 points in his career. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points).

## Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game in 2008-09, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

## Block Party In 2008-09

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

## Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley did not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings in 2008-09 because they did not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would have placed in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would have tied for fifth at 40.3% (58-144), and Tinsley would have been third at 41.1% (69-168). Evaldus Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 52.1% (38-73).

## Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

## Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

## Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

## Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

# SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish third in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 90 points in the poll to finish behind Kentucky (148), and Tennessee (117). South Carolina was chosen fourth (77), Florida fifth (68) and Georgia was chosen sixth (25).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 144 votes, 24 votes better than Ole Miss (120). Kentucky received 20 out of the 25 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received three votes and Tennessee received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Jeffery Taylor scored a season-high 21 points to go along with his nine rebounds but it wasn't enough to top Western Kentucky as the Hilltoppers knocked off the No. 24 Commodores, 76-69 at the Nashville Arena. With the loss, Vanderbilt falls to 6-3 on the year while Western Kentucky improves to 5-3.

The Commodores held a slim 38-37 lead at the halftime break but were outscored 39-31 in the second half.

Vanderbilt had just two players score in double figures on Friday led by Taylor with 21 while Beal chipped in 12 points.

The Hilltoppers outrebounded the Commodores 40-31 in the game, including 23-10 in the second half.

## Notes Vs. Western Kentucky

### Starting Lineups

Vanderbilt started freshman John Jenkins and sophomores Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley at guard ... sophomore Andre Walker started at forward and redshirt sophomore Festus Ezeli at center. It was the first time this season that Vanderbilt used this starting lineup. It marked the third different starting lineup combination this season.

Taylor made his 40th consecutive start and has started every game of his career ... Tinsley made the 37th start of his career and 20th in a row, starting every game since Jan. 31, 2009 at Auburn ... The start by Walker was the 10th of his career ... Before this season, his only start was against MTSU on Nov. 24, 2009 when he suffered a season-ending knee injury ... Ezeli start was the second of the year and eighth of his career, his previous start this season came in the season opener against Lipscomb on Nov. 16 ... With Beal not starting tonight, it snapped his 70-straight games of starting ... Tonight's game marked just the fourth time in Ogilvy's career (72 career games) that he did not start.

### Postgame Notes

Vanderbilt falls to 6-3 on the season, while Western Kentucky improved to 5-3.

The 2009-10 season is the 110th in Vanderbilt's history.

Today's meeting was the 24th all-time between Western Kentucky and Vanderbilt ... Vanderbilt now leads the all-time series 13-11. VU is now 1-1 in games played at Nashville Arena ... In the other meeting at Nashville Arena, Vanderbilt won 80-75 on Dec. 2, 2001 ... The 2001 meeting was also the last time the two teams had met prior to tonight.

With the loss, Vanderbilt is now 51-15 against teams from the Sun Belt ... Vanderbilt Head Coach Kevin Stallings is now 3-1 all-time against Western Kentucky.

With Brad Tinsley three-pointer with 18:08 remaining in the first half, Vanderbilt extended its consecutive games streak with at least one three-pointer made to 738 ... VU is one of only three schools (UNLV and Princeton) that have made at least one three-pointer in every game played since the three-point line was established for the 1986-87 season ... Only UNLV (744) has a longer streak than Vanderbilt.

Vanderbilt had 28 bench points compared to 15 for Western Kentucky

Vanderbilt outscored WKU 37-36 in points in the paint

There were eight lead changes in the game (5 in the first half, 3 in the second).

Vanderbilt lost for the first time this season after leading at the half.

Vanderbilt finished the game 26-for-56 (46.4%) while WKU was 28-of-57 (49.1%)

Vanderbilt is now 4-3 this year when being outrebounded by its opponent.

### First Half Notes - Vanderbilt 39, Western Kentucky 38

Western Kentucky connected on six of their first seven shots to take a 14-9 lead at the first media timeout (15:35 in the first half).

Festus Ezeli scored Vanderbilt's first four points of the game.

Vanderbilt had six different players score in the games first six and half a minutes. (Beal, Ezeli, Tinsley, Walker, Taylor and McClellan all scored during that time).

After not starting the game A.J. Ogilvy checked into the game for the first time with 12:40 left in the first half.

Trailing 21-15 at 12:40 mark, Vanderbilt went on a 14-7 run over the next 6:37 to take a 29-28 lead with 6:03 remaining in the first half. The one-point lead was Vanderbilt's first lead of the half. Jeffery Taylor scored eight points during the run. The run was also sparked by a pair of Ezeli blocked shots that led to fast break points.

With Vanderbilt holding a slim 29-28 lead, Western Kentucky retook the lead a minute later when AJ Slaughter made a free throw with 4:59 left in the half.

With the game tied at 30-30 at the 4:38 mark in the opening half, Western Kentucky went on a 5-0 run to take a five-point (35-30 lead) with 3:19 remaining. The Commodores responded with a 6-0 run of their own over the next four minutes to take a 36-35 lead with 48 seconds remaining in the half. Ogilvy and Tinsley had three points a piece during the run.

There were five lead changes in the first half.

Vanderbilt was 13-of-29 (45%) from the floor in the first half while Western Kentucky was 15-of-30 (50%) in the opening half. WKU connected on seven of their first 10 shots in the half.

VU outrebounded WKU 21-17 in the first half

VU was 40 percent (4-for-10) from downtown in the first half while Western Kentucky was 2-for-8 (25%).

VU's Jeffery Taylor led the team with 12 points and five rebounds at the half. Taylor connected on 5-of-7 shots in the opening stanza.

Brad Tinsley had nine points, including 2-for-4 from 3PT in the half

Eight Vanderbilt players scored in the first half.

### Second Half Notes

With VU holding a slim 38-37 lead at the half, Western Kentucky retook the lead at the 19:12 mark in the second half with a two-point basket by Jermy Evans. 11 seconds later VU retook the lead (40-39) when Taylor connected on a field goal with 19:01 left in the half.

After two lead changes in the first minute of the second half and the game tied at 42-42 WKU went on a 8-3 to take a 48-43 lead with 15:55 left in the game.

With Western Kentucky leading 54-48 with 12:51 to play, Vanderbilt went on a 7-2 run to get within one point (56-55 in favor of WKU) with 10:21 to play.

With WKU holding a 56-55 lead, they went on 4-0 run to take a 60-55 lead over the Commodores with 9:10 remaining in the game.

By the 15:33 mark of the second half there had already been five lead changes in the half.

With WKU leading 70-63 with 56 seconds remaining in the game, Jermaine Beal scored the last six points of the game for the Commodores as he finished with 11 second half points and 12 for the game.

### Individual Notes

Head Coach Kevin Stallings now has 195 career wins and 131 losses at Vanderbilt, trailing Bob Polk's 197 wins, which ranks second in school history ... Roy Skinner's 278 wins is more than any coach in Vanderbilt history.

Jeffery Taylor finished with a season-high 21 points, reaching double figures in scoring for the 30th time in his career ... Taylor's 21 points marked the most points he has scored in a game since he scored a career-high 23 at South Carolina (1/28/09) last year. Taylor has scored in double figures in all but one game this season.

Jeffery Taylor finished the game with a career-high nine made field goals. Taylor's previous career high was eight made field goals, which he did four times last season with that last coming against DePaul on (12/5/09)

A.J. Ogilvy scored 8 points off the bench and now has 1,140 for his career, which ranks 30th in school history ... Ogilvy passed Mario Moore for 30th all-time (1,137 points) during the second half of tonight's game. He now trails Babe Taylor (1,144 points) by only four points for 29th all-time ... A.J. Ogilvy has scored in double figures in 62 of 70 career games.

Ogilvy finished with one block and now has 113 in his career, which is third in school history ... Ogilvy trails Julian Terrell (116 blocks) for second place in career blocks ... During the season-opener against Lipscomb, Ogilvy became the second VU player to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career ... Will Perdue (1,281 points and 157 blocks) is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat ... Ogilvy also became just the fourth player in VU history with 100 or more blocks in his career.

Jermaine Beal scored 12 points, reaching double figures for the eighth time this season and 43rd time in his career.

Beal finished the game with a team high four assists and is ninth in school history with 341 career assists ... Al McKinney ranks eighth in school history with 351 career assists.

# MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1982

## HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 58TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 58th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008 against Mississippi State.

\* The Commodores have posted a 684-186 (.786) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium. \* VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

\* Vanderbilt has won 110 of its last 117 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 157-15 non-conference record at home (.912 win percentage).

\* The Commodores are 90-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

\* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.
