Vanderbilt Travels To Kentucky Tuesday

The #21/20 Vanderbilt Commodores travel to Lexington, Ky., to take on East Division rival #20/23 Kentucky on Tuesday night in a nationally televised contest on ESPN. The game tips off at 8 p.m. CT, and can also be heard live on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com.

Brad Nessler, Jimmy Dykes, and Shannon Spake will have the call for ESPN. Tuesday's game at Kentucky marks Vanderbilt's last true road contest of the 2010-11 season.

Vanderbilt-LSU Tidbits

Jeffery Taylor scored a team-high 20 points and Lance Goulbourne scored 16 points and grabbed a Stallings-era best 17 rebounds as Vanderbilt knocked off LSU, 90-69, Saturday afternoon in Baton Rouge. John Jenkins (17), Brad Tinsley (16), and Festus Ezeli (15) also added double figures for the Commodores.

- Vanderbilt now leads the all-time series, 58-48, and now trail LSU, 28-21, in games played in Baton Rouge.
- Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings moves to 9-6 all-time against LSU and 4-2 in games played in Baton Rouge.
- Vanderbilt moves to 21-7 overall and 9-5 in SEC play. Vanderbilt is now 5-4 in true road games and 4-3 in road league contests. The Commodores play at Kentucky Tuesday in their final true road game of the season.
- The Commodores have won their last three road games.
- Brad Tinsley's three-pointer at the 16:25 mark in the first half pushed

Vanderbilt's three-point streak to 790 consecutive games with a three.

- Vanderbilt posted its first 90-point true road game since a 91-85 road win at DePaul on December 12, 2007. First 90-point game in the SEC since February 28, 2007 (99-90 overtime win).
- The Commodores shot 54.4% from the floor for the game, their highest percentage from the floor in SEC play and their highest FG percentage since shooting since shooting 60.7% as a team in the season opener against Presbyterian (11/12).
- The Commodores outscored LSU, 49-26, in the second half after trailing at the halftime break, 43-41. VU is now 7-4 when trailing at the half this season.
- VU posted their 19th and 20th halves of the season of shooting 50% or better. The Commodores shot 57.7% in the first half and 51.6% in the second half.
- LSU shot 41.8% from the floor and 25.0% in the second half. The Commodores move to 16-3 on the season when outshooting their opponent.
- Vanderbilt made 10-of-22 threes for the game, compared to 5-22 for LSU. The Commodores are 19-4 when making more threes than their opponent.
- Vanderbilt made 18-of-28 free throws for the game. The Commodores are now 152-223 from the charity stripe in road games (.682). Vanderbilt has made more free throws than their opponents have attempted (145) in nine road games this season.
- LSU outrebounded Vanderbilt by one, 38-37. VU is now 6-5 on the season when outrebounded by their opponent.
- Vanderbilt outscored LSU, 36-30, in points in the paint, 8-0, in fast break points, and 22-16 in bench points. Both teams scored 15 points off of turnovers, and LSU had 14 second-chance points compared to 13 for VU.
- Ties: 4; Lead Changes: 6; Vanderbilt largest lead: 24 (1:26 in 2nd half).

Player Notes

- Jeffery Taylor led the Commodores with 20 points. It was his 21st double-figure scoring game this season and the 67th of his career. It was also his fifth 20-point game of the season and ninth of his career.
- Taylor also added three assists, two rebounds, and two steals.
- John Jenkins (17), Brad Tinsley (16), Lance Goulbourne (16), and Festus Ezeli (15) also added double figures.
- First time Vanderbilt has had five double figure scorers since January 19, 2011 against Ole Miss (Jenkins, Ezeli, Taylor, Goulbourne, Tinsley).
- Also first time VU has had at least four players with 15 or more points since November 22, 2005 against UNC Greensboro (Julian Terrell, Shan Foster, Derrick Byars, DeMarre Carroll).
- Jenkins has scored in double figures in all 27 games he has played in this season.
- Tinsley's 16 points tied his single-season high in an SEC game...he also scored 16 points at Auburn on February 19.
- Tinsley was 7-for-10 from the field. The seven field goals tied a career high.
- Tinsley had five assists for the 13th time this season and the 23rd time of his career. Tinsley leads the SEC in assists in all games.
- Lance Goulbourne's 17 rebounds is a new career-high, and is a new single-game high in the Stallings era.
- Festus Ezeli scored 15 points and had six blocks against LSU. His six blocks put him one behind Will Perdue for the all-time single-season record with 73. Perdue had 74 in 1987-88.
- Ezeli's six blocks is his eighth game this year where he has had four or more blocks. He has had 22 blocks in his last four games (4.5 per game).

- Sophomore Jordan Smart tallied the first made three-pointer of his career.

About Kentucky

Kentucky enters the game with a 20-8 overall record and an 8-6 mark in SEC play after knocking off East division leader Florida on Saturday in Lexington, 76-68.

Brandon Knight leads four Wildcat players in double figures with 17.7 points per game. Terrence Jones adds 17.3 points per game, Doron Lamb chips in 13.4, and Darius Miller averages 10.9 points per game. Jones leads the team on the glass with 9.1 rebounds per game.

The Kentucky Series

Tuesday's game with Kentucky will be the 178th all-time meeting, with Kentucky leading the series, 133-44.

The Wildcats have a 49-25 series lead in games played in Nashville, and a 79-19 series advantage in games played in Lexington. The two teams are tied at four in neutral site games.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 29th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

Free Throws

The Commodores lead the SEC in free throw attempts per game in all games (25.5), and in SEC games only (24.9).

Vanderbilt has made more free throws in SEC play (264) than four teams have attempted.

Commodores In Top 25

Vanderbilt are number 21 in the AP poll and 20 in the ESPN/USA Today poll this week.

It is the eighth week Vanderbilt has been ranked this season in the AP poll, and the sixth week in the ESPN/USA Today rankings.

This year marks the 20th season the Commodores have appeared in the Associated Press poll, and the fourth time in the last five.

SEC Preseason Poll

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fifth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 52 points in the poll to finish behind Florida (110), Kentucky (95), Georgia (72), and Tennessee (71). South Carolina was chosen sixth (20).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 118 votes, 34 votes better than Ole Miss (84).

Florida received eight votes from the league's media to win the SEC Championship.

When center Festus Ezeli has fouled out, the team is 1-4, with a win over Ole Miss and losses against Tennessee, at Florida, at South Carolina, and against West Virginia on a neutral floor.

When Jeffery Taylor Scores 15 Or More...

The Commodores are 15-1, with their only loss coming at Missouri (Taylor had 18 points).

Home Sweet Home

In 16 home games this year, the Commodores are 14-2, average 80.6 points per game, and shoot 48.6% from the floor. Vanderbilt also makes 8.5 threes per game, shoots 42.4% from beyond-the-arc, and outrebounds opponents by a margin of +5.8. VU also shoots 77.9% from the charity stripe at Memorial Gym.

In true road games, Vanderbilt is 5-4 on the season and post these percentages - 43.1% from the field and 35.9% from three. The Commodores are outrebounding their opponents by +0.1, and convert 68.2% of their free throws.

Commodores Vs. Ranked Teams

Vanderbilt is now 4-2 against ranked teams in 2010-11 after win over #18 Kentucky on February 12 at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt is 3-0 in games played against ranked foes at Memorial Gym this season. In the Stallings' era, Vanderbilt is 30-48 against teams ranked in the Associated Press poll and 21-17 in games played at Memorial Gym.

3-Point Streak Continues Through 25th Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 790 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (800) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (672) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Vanderbilt Signs Three To NLI's

Vanderbilt head men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signing of 6'5 point guard **Kedren Johnson (Lewisburg, Tenn.)**, 6'8 forward **Shelby Moats (Waconia, Minn.)**, and 6'4 shooting guard **Dai-Jon Parker (Alpharetta, Ga.)** to National Letters of Intent. All three will be eligible to play for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2011-12.

Many have ranked the Commodores' group in their top 25 recruiting classes.

Henderson, Siakam Redshirting

Two class of 2010 members, center Josh Henderson and forward James Siakam, will redshirt the 2010-11 campaign.

Commodores Finish Third In San Juan

Vanderbilt saw some good competition at the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off - the Commodores knocked off Nebraska and then-#8 North Carolina, and dropped a tough three-point decision to West Virginia in the tournament semifinals.

Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Kevin Stallings is 141-47 in non-conference games and an astounding 104-8 in home non-conference games.

VU Wins Finishes Non-Conference Unbeaten At Home

With the win over St. Mary's on January 22, the Commodores finished a perfect 10-0 at home in non-conference play, and pushed its non-conference home win streak to 21 (last loss vs. UIC on 12/8/08).

VU has posted a 709-189 (.790) all-time record at the 59-year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins' mother texted him before Vanderbilt's game Saturday and told him to score 25 points or more.

The sophomore guard followed the order.

Jenkins scored a career-high 32 points, hitting six 3-pointers, to lift No. 23 Vanderbilt to an 81-77 victory over No. 18 Kentucky despite his sprained right shoulder aching so bad he needed heat at halftime and a big bag of ice afterward. He also made sure to talk to his mother first.

With the win, the Commodores (18-6, 6-4) swept a three-game homestand that will keep them tied for second in the Southeastern Conference's Eastern Division. They came into Saturday tied with Kentucky, Georgia and Tennessee, two losses behind Florida.

Kentucky (17-7, 5-5) dropped to 1-5 on the road in the SEC this season and to the bottom of the East.

Jenkins had Vanderbilt's first 30-point game against the Wildcats since Mike Rhodes had 34 on Jan. 19, 1980, in a loss, and the Commodores' first 30-point game since A.J. Ogilvy had 33 at LSU on March 4, 2009.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points, Steve Tchiengang scored all 12 of his in the first half off and Brad Tinsley had 11 for the Commodores.

Terrence Jones led Kentucky with 25 points, Knight had 20 and Liggins 10. Darius Miller played only 18 minutes before leaving with a groin injury.

- Vanderbilt has won five out of the last six meetings with the Wildcats at Memorial Gym.
- Vanderbilt's 55% (11-for-20) shooting from beyond the arc matched a season-high previously set against South Carolina on February 5.
- The Commodores move to 6-0 when shooting 50% or better from three-point range.

- Stallings is the **first Vanderbilt coach to lead two Commodore squads to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16** since the field expanded to as many as 64 teams in 1985.
- Stallings has **six 20-win seasons at Vanderbilt, which ties Roy Skinner for the most as a Commodore coach**.
- **All 29 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree or are working towards it**.
- **One of only three Vanderbilt coaches with 150 or more wins**.
- Led 2007-08 team to a **perfect 19-0 record at home, the most single-season home wins in the history of the program**.

Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 709-190 (.790) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 124 of its last 131 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 171-15 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 104-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

SAN JUAN, P.R. - John Jenkins scored 16 points, and Festus Ezeli and Jeffery Taylor each had 15 to lead Vanderbilt to a 72-65 win over No. 8 North Carolina on Sunday night in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament.

The Commodores (3-1) beat a top-10 team for the first time since knocking off No. 1 Tennessee on Feb. 26, 2008.

UNC's Tyler Zeller had 20 points and 10 rebounds for North Carolina, and freshman Harrison Barnes rebounded from a poor performance to score 11.

Outside of Zeller, the Tar Heels had no offensive threat inside or out. He made seven baskets, and no one else made more than four.

That wasn't a problem for the Commodores. Taylor and Ezeli were tough inside, with 16 rebounds and three blocked shots between them. Jenkins did his work from the free-throw line with a 10-for-12 effort that first built the lead, then helped Vanderbilt keep it for the win. The Commodores bounced back after losing in the final seconds to West Virginia on Friday.

The Tar Heels had made a last gasp effort for the win when they got the ball inside to Zeller, who got the basket and the foul. Vanderbilt forward Andre Walker fouled out on the play and Zeller made the free throw to make it 59-57.

It wasn't enough. Vanderbilt fattened the lead from the free-throw line and Taylor slid down the baseline for a bank-layup and a 65-58 lead. Lance Goulbourne slammed home a 3-point miss for a seven-point lead with 1:20 left.

Notes

- The Commodores finished the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off with a 2-1 record after knocking off North Carolina Sunday.
- The series record moves to 6-4 in favor of North Carolina. It was the first meeting between the two schools since 1995.
- Vanderbilt knocked off a top 10 team for the first time since defeating number one Tennessee, 72-69, on Feb. 26, 2008. The Commodores are now 82-101 in games against teams in the AP Top 25 all-time (since 1949) and 7-13 on neutral floors.

NASHVILLE - Festus Ezeli posted his first career double-double and John Jenkins scored 22 points as Vanderbilt defeated Grambling State 92-59.

Ezeli had 11 points and 13 rebounds, and the Commodores (4-1) played the second half without the services of preseason All-SEC pick Jeffery Taylor.

Taylor took a blow to his left eye with about 5 minutes to play in the first half on an intentional foul by Tigers guard Rupert Rose.

The 6-foot-7 junior forward was on the floor for a couple of minutes and didn't return because of blurry vision.

The outcome was still in doubt at the half as Vanderbilt shot 33 percent and led just 40-38.

Grambling (1-5) hung around in large part because of Justin Patton, who had 15 points in the first half and finished with 20.

Brad Tinsley added 14 points and Steve Tchien-gang had a career-high 12.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins scored 21 points, hitting 5 of 10 from 3-point range, to lead Vanderbilt to an 82-62 win over Western Kentucky.

Jenkins, who has led the Commodores (6-1) in scoring the past six games, hit a 3-pointer on the right wing to give Vanderbilt a 22-10 lead and the Hilltoppers (3-4) never got within single digits again.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points for the Commodores. The 6-foot-11 junior from Nigeria, who stood a good 5 inches taller than anyone in the Western Kentucky starting lineup, hit all seven of his field-goal attempts and blocked three shots.

Juan Pattillo led Western Kentucky with 18 points and Sergio Kerusch and Caden Dickerson each added 12.

Vanderbilt took a 35-17 lead into halftime. The Commodores shot 50 percent from 3-point range (6 of 12), including three consecutive 3s as part of an 11-0 run that pushed their lead to 35-13.

Jenkins had eight points at the break. Odom had six on the strength of two 3-pointers and Ezeli had six.

Western Kentucky committed 16 turnovers in the first half that led to 17 points the other way.

Vanderbilt didn't take great care of the ball in a sloppy first half either, turning it over 12 times. But the Hilltoppers couldn't take advantage, shooting just 8 of 28 (28.6 percent) and making 1 of 9 3 pointers.

NASHVILLE - Festus Ezeli scored a career-high 24 points and added 10 rebounds as Vanderbilt beat cross-town rival Belmont 85-76.

Ezeli scored 17 points in the second half as the Commodores overcame a 35-32 halftime deficit.

Vanderbilt scored the first six points of the second half and never trailed again. The Commodores shot 57 percent (12 of 21) over the final 20 minutes.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points and eight rebounds for the Commodores (7-1). Lance Goulbourne had 15 points, and Brad Tinsley added 14 as Vanderbilt attempted 45 free throws -- the most in the Kevin Stallings era (2000-present). The Commodores made 35 of them.

Belmont was led by Mick Hedgepeth with 16 points. Kerron Johnson added 13, and Jordan Campbell had 12.

The scrappy Bruins (5-2) led by as much as seven in the first half before settling for a three-point lead at the break.

NASHVILLE - Jeffery Taylor and Steve Tchiengang had 15 points each and Vanderbilt hit a season-high 13 3-pointers to breeze past Southeastern Louisiana 85-52.

Eight different Commodores made a 3-pointer. Vanderbilt (8-2) shot 50 percent (13 of 26) from long distance, but only a little better from the free-throw line (14 of 24).

It was a career high for Tchiengang, who at 6 feet 9 stepped out and hit two 3-pointers. Lance Goulbourne had 13 points, and John Jenkins added 12 on a team-high four 3-pointers.

The Lions (5-4) were led by Gary Dixon, who came off the bench to score 16. Antonio Benton added 10 as the Southeastern Louisiana bench outscored its starters 36-16.

The Commodores rolled up a 53-24 halftime lead behind a sizzling shooting performance. They converted 62.5 percent (20 of 32) from the floor. It was the most points they had scored in a first half since Nov. 24, 2007, against Bradley in the Cancun Challenge.

Vanderbilt hit eight 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. Jenkins knocked down three of them, and freshman Rod Odom had a pair.

Jenkins' trey with 47 seconds to go until halftime gave Vanderbilt its largest lead of the half at 53-19. The Commodores shot 53.3 percent (8 of 15) from long range in the opening stanza.

MURFREESBORO - Jeffery Taylor led four Vanderbilt players in double figures with 18 points as the Commodores beat rival Middle Tennessee 72-53.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

The Commodores built a 14-point lead at the half and the Blue Raiders (4-8) never got closer than eight in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 36 free throws, 26 in the second half, to just 14 for Middle Tennessee.

Jason Jones led Middle with 15 points. The Blue Raiders have lost four in a row.

Vanderbilt had its largest lead of the first half, 41-27, at the half when Brad Tinsley went coast to coast with an inbounds pass after a free throw by Middle's Kerry Hammonds. Tinsley's layup came a second before the buzzer.

The Blue Raiders had cut the lead to six at 30-24 with 1:53 to go when Jenkins took over. He scored nine of his 11 first-half points in a 60-second span beginning at 1:38 when he grabbed an offensive rebound along the left baseline and hit a stepback 3-pointer.

Jenkins followed with a steal near halfcourt, drove the right side, made the layup and converted the three-point play after getting fouled by Middle's Kyle Hunt. Forty-nine seconds later Jenkins' long 3-pointer up top made it 39-26.

NASHVILLE - Over the past six games Vanderbilt (No. 24 AP) has gotten used to playing without its roster intact. It's a good thing, too, because it may be a while before coach Kevin Stallings can utilize his full complement of players.

The Commodores (11-2) were without two starters Sunday, including leading scorer John Jenkins. It mattered little, though, as they blasted Davidson 80-52.

Jeffery Taylor scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, while Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each added 14 and Festus Ezeli chipped in 12. Tinsley, a 6-foot-3 guard, was the game's leading rebounder with 10.

Taylor finished 6 of 10 from the field and 9 of 10 from the free throw line. Vanderbilt shot 43.4 percent (23 of 53) and held Davidson to a season-low 29.3 percent (22 of 75).

Jenkins, a sophomore shooting guard who is averaging 17.8 points per game, and Andre Walker, a 6-7 junior forward who averages 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists, both sustained injuries in practice.

Freshman Chris Czerapowicz had 16 points to lead Davidson (7-6). Jake Cohen, the Wildcats' leading scorer at 14.9 points, was held to a season-low two points. He fouled out with 9:06 to play.

Vanderbilt used a 15-0 run to take a 23-6 lead with 11:05 to go in the first half. Tchiengang started the run with a 3-pointer on the right wing, and Tinsley capped it 5 minutes later with a 3-pointer from almost the identical spot.

Notes

- The Commodores led at halftime (52-24) for the eighth time this season. VU is 8-0 on the season when leading at the half.
- The 28 point halftime lead was the second largest of the season for the Commodores. VU led SE Louisiana by 29 at halftime (12/18/10)
- This was the 11th half of 50% or better shooting for the Commodores.
- This was the fifth half the Commodores held their opponents to below 30% shooting.
- With 22 points, Jeffery Taylor became the 41st player in Vanderbilt history to score 1,000 points.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina was up eight and as the final seconds ticked away, Vanderbilt went up for what appeared to be a meaningless layup.

But the Gamecocks' Sam Muldrow leaped up, got his fingertips on the ball, and ended up in his school's record books, getting just the second triple-double in South Carolina's history in an 83-75 win over the No. 22 Commodores in Columbia.

Muldrow owned overtime, getting five points, including a crucial 3, and four blocks in the extra period.

Freshman Bruce Ellington, in his first league game, got the Gamecocks (10-4, 1-0) to overtime. He scored 12 of the Gamecocks final 15 points in regulation -- burying four 3-pointers in seven minutes, including the final points of the second half that tied it at 72 with 2:09 to go.

He then gave South Carolina its first lead of the game with a layup on the first possession of overtime and his quick pass to Muldrow for an open 3 put South Carolina up 81-75 with 2:18 to go.

Ellington finished with 22 points and has scored at least 20 in five of the first 14 games of his college career.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt (11-3, 0-1) with 27 points after missing the last game with a concussion. Jeffery Taylor added 14 points and Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 14 rebounds for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt jumped to an 11-point lead in the first 14 minutes of the game. But the Commodores could never put the Gamecocks away.

Notes

- Vanderbilt led by seven at the half, 37-30. It was the first time in nine tries this season that the Commodores have lost a game after leading at the half.
- The Commodores outrebounded South Carolina 21-17 in the first half, but were outrebounded, 48-41, in the game.
- Head coach Kevin Stallings is now 6-6 in SEC openers.
- Vanderbilt is now 0-2 in its two overtime games in 2010-11.
- South Carolina made 10-of-27 threes, the most made threes against the Commodores this season.

KNOXVILLE - Tobias Harris hit a layup and a pair of free throws in the final 1:09 as Tennessee erased a 17-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt 67-64.

After Harris' layup with 1:09 left and a timeout, John Jenkins stepped out of bounds with 44 seconds left. Melvin Goins missed two shots for the Vols, and Brad Tinsley fouled Brian Williams with 2.7 seconds left as he grabbed the rebound.

Instead of letting Tennessee take the ball in bounds, Rod Odom fouled Tobias Harris, sending him to the line for one-and-one. Harris hit both shots, and Williams stole the ball as Tinsley threw it in bound and the clock ran out.

It was the second time this season the Commodores watched a solid lead unravel. In an 83-75 overtime loss to South Carolina on Jan. 8, the Dores led by 11 points with 8:42 in the second half when the Gamecocks went on a 20-9 run to close out regulation.

Vanderbilt pushed the first-half margin to 17 points on a free throw by Tinsley with 2:03 before halftime, but Tennessee put together a modest 7-0 run to close the half and cut the halftime margin to 30-20 in favor of the Dores.

The Vols used 48.7 percent shooting after the break to slowly chip away at the Commodores' lead, and a 3-pointer by Cameron Tatum with 3:03 to go gave them their first lead of the second half. Harris finished with 15 points, Tatum had 12 and Skylar McBee had 10.

Jenkins led the Commodores (12-4, 1-2) with 21 points, Jeffery Taylor had 14 and Tinsley 12.

The Commodores (13-4, 2-2) needed this win on their home court after dropping their first two road games in the SEC and falling to the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Mississippi (12-7, 0-4) now is off to its worst league start since dropping its first five SEC games in 2000.

Festus Ezeli had 16 points after going 10 of 12 at the free-throw line for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 15 points, and Lance Goulbourne had 14 and tied the Stallings' era team record with 16 rebounds for Vanderbilt. Dawid Przybyszewski last had 16 rebounds Nov. 19, 2004. Chris Warren and Dundercous Nelson had 17 apiece for Ole Miss, Zach Graham 14 and Terrance Henry 11.

The Commodores outshot Ole Miss all over the court, hitting 8-of-16 from beyond the arc and had a big edge at the foul line (28-of-34 compared to 14-of-16). Vandy also outrebounded Ole Miss 41-25.

Ole Miss led 42-39 at halftime after surviving a cold shooting start when the Rebels hit just three of their first 11 shots, and Warren was just 2-of-8 from the floor in the first half. Vanderbilt led by as much as nine early, but the Rebels finally warmed up.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings challenged Jeffery Taylor to shut down South Carolina freshman Bruce Ellington.

The junior essentially did just that, allowing Ellington only two of his 13 points when it mattered, and Taylor also hit a career-high four 3-pointers in scoring 17 points as No. 24 Vanderbilt routed South Carolina 78-60 on Saturday to snap a two-game skid.

Ellington scored 22 points in helping South Carolina rally from a 14-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt on Jan. 8 to open Southeastern Conference play, and Stallings told Taylor two days ago that this would be his most important defensive game for the Commodores this season.

John Jenkins scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Festus Ezeli added 17, and Brad Tinsley had 11 points and nine assists.

South Carolina (13-8, 4-4) has lost three of four, and this one ties the Gamecocks with Vanderbilt at the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Ramon Galloway led South Carolina with 16 points before fouling out. Malik Cooke scored 12 and Sam Muldrow had 11.

Vanderbilt outshot the Gamecocks all over the court but dominated from beyond the arc. The Commodores hit 11 of 20 from 3-point range, their most 3s against an SEC opponent this season and just two shy of the 13 they hit in beating Southeastern Louisiana in December.

- Vanderbilt wore their gold uniforms for the first time this season.
 - The Commodores wore the opening tip and are now 15-3 when doing so.
 - VU went 2-2 from the free throw line in the first half, tying a season-low for free throws attempted in a half. The Commodores went 1-2 in games against Presbyterian and Western Kentucky.

NASHVILLE - Brad Tinsley sunk his off-balance jumper despite getting fouled and hit the free throw to help seal the victory for Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) in an 81-77 win over Alabama at Memorial Gym.

JaMychal Green thought he got fouled, too, seconds later only to see officials rule the Alabama forward stepped out of bounds trying to drive the baseline and tie up the game.

With Tinsley's three-point play with 17 seconds left, Vanderbilt beat Southeastern Conference-leading Alabama 81-77 on Thursday night. Alabama coach Anthony Grant said he'd have to check the replay, which he didn't have the benefit of seeing after the game.

Now Vanderbilt (17-6, 5-4) has won the first two games of a three-game homestand with No. 18 Kentucky visiting Saturday to remain knotted with three others for second in the SEC's Eastern Division. Tinsley's shot came off a screen, and he hit the shot even as Trevor Releford hit his arm.

Jenkins finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 19 before fouling out with 90 seconds left, Tinsley had 15 and Ezeli had 11. Taylor said it was great to watch his teammates close out a tight game, but difficult to watch from the bench helpless.

Green finished with 23 points for Alabama, including shooting 10 of 11 at the line. Tony Mitchell scored 22 points, and Releford had 11 before fouling out late.

The Tide came in with the nation's third-string defense and best in the SEC, holding opponents to 57.1 points per game. Vanderbilt is the SEC's best scoring offense, and the Commodores matched what Alabama had been allowing with less than 12 minutes left.

- With the win, Vanderbilt improved to 13-1 at home this year. The Commodores' 81-point performance Thursday marked their 10th time this year that they have scored at least 80 points at home (10-0).

ATHENS - John Jenkins scored all of his 21 points in the second half and No. 18 Vandy rallied from a second-half deficit of 14 points to beat the Bulldogs 64-56.

Jenkins, the leading scorer in the Southeastern Conference, was scoreless before making a 3-pointer with 13:15 remaining when Georgia led 40-26. It was the first of five 3-pointers for the sophomore.

It was an important road victory for a Vanderbilt team best known for its home success. The Commodores (19-6, 7-4 SEC) are only 3-5 away from Nashville, including 2-3 in conference games.

The Bulldogs' last field goal came on a 3 by Travis Leslie for a 53-40 lead with 9:49 to go.

Led by Jenkins, Vanderbilt closed the game with a 24-3 run as Georgia managed only three free throws.

The Commodores moved past Georgia (17-8, 6-5) for second place in the SEC East. Gerald Robinson led the Bulldogs with 15 points.

Jenkins has scored in double figures in all 25 games this season, including 15 games with 20 or more points. He leads the SEC with his averages of 19.8 points overall and 22.3 in SEC games.

After ending his scoring drought, Jenkins had three more 3-pointers in a 12-0 run, capped by another 3 from Brad Tinsley, to cut Georgia's lead to 53-52.

Jenkins' fifth 3-pointer tied the game at 55, and he scored again to give Vanderbilt a 57-55 lead with 2:50 remaining. It was the Commodores' first lead since the opening minutes of the game.

Notes

- The 32.3% was a season-low, and it was only the fifth time this season Vanderbilt has shot below 40% from the field. VU is now 2-3 in those games.
- The 32.3% was the lowest in a victory in the Stallings era.
- The Commodores outrebounded Georgia, 49-32, including 23-9 on the offensive glass. Vanderbilt outscored the Bulldogs, 18-4, in second chance points.
- Festus Ezeli posted his fourth double-double of the year and his career with 10 points and 12 rebounds. He also added a career-high seven blocks.

AUBURN - Once John Jenkins and No. 18 Vanderbilt got going, Auburn couldn't keep up.

Jenkins scored 22 points and the streaking Commodores used a dominant four-minute stretch in the second half to turn a tie game into a 77-60 rout over the Tigers.

The Commodores (20-6, 8-4 SEC) went on a 23-4 run after Auburn (9-17, 2-10) managed to tie it six minutes into the second half. Their fifth straight victory gave Vandy its sixth 20-win season during coach Kevin Stallings' 12 years in charge.

This one might have been a little tougher than expected -- for a while, at least.

Then Jenkins and the Commodores got over it. He hit 5 of 11 3-pointers and scored 16 in the second half. Jeffery Taylor had 20 points and 10 rebounds for the Commodores while Brad Tinsley scored 16. Ezeli Festus only had six points but also blocked five shots.

Earnest Ross led Auburn with 19 points and Kenny Gabriel added 13. They were a combined 10-of-18 shooting while the rest of the team made just 12 of 32 attempts.

Ross also had 10 rebounds and five assists but committed six turnovers.

The Tigers tried the game 42-42 on back-to-back 3-pointers by Gabriel and Ross six minutes into the second half, but Vanderbilt quickly erased any hopes of an upset over the next four minutes.

The Commodores scored the next 14 points to start a 20-2 run.

Notes

- The Commodores notched their 20th win of the season, the sixth time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has surpassed the 20-win barrier and the 18th time in the history of Vanderbilt basketball.
- A sixth 20-win season for Stallings ties him with all-time Vanderbilt win leader, Roy Skinner, for 20-win campaigns.
- Vanderbilt has won five consecutive games, dating back to the Commodores' 78-60 win over South Carolina on February 5. The five game streak marks a season-best -- Vanderbilt won five consecutive games between November 21 and December 4.

BATON ROUGE - Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor gave his sizable rooting gallery every reason to be heard.

With more than two dozen relatives traveling from Texas and Louisiana to see him play, Taylor scored 20 points and the 18th-ranked Commodores outscored LSU 49-26 in the second half for a comfortable 90-69 victory.

John Jenkins overcame a slow start to finish with 17 points for Vanderbilt (21-7, 9-5 Southeastern Conference), which bounced back from its first loss in six games last Tuesday against state rival Tennessee.

Vanderbilt, which shot 54.4 percent (31 of 57), trailed 43-41 at halftime but surged into the lead for good early in the second half with a 14-0 run during which Taylor dunked twice and hit two free throws.

Vandy then held the Tigers to 25 percent shooting (8 of 32) in the second half.

Storm Warren had a career-high 24 points and Ralston Turner added 18 for LSU (11-18, 3-11), which has lost 11 of 12 games.

Andre Stringer scored 10 points for the Tigers, who on Wednesday had snapped a 10-game losing streak with a victory at Mississippi State.

A strong first half put LSU in position to make it two straight wins, but the Tigers wound up looking overmatched by the Commodores, who had five players in double figures, including Lance Goulbourne and Brad Tinsley with 16 each and Festus Ezeli with 15.

- Vanderbilt posted its first 90-point true road game since a 91-85 road win at DePaul on December 12, 2007. First 90-point game in the SEC since February 28, 2007 (99-90 overtime win).

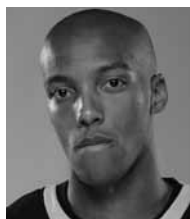
