### Vanderbilt Travels To Georgia Wednesday

After a successful three-game homestand, the #18/18 Vanderbilt Commodores hit the road to take on SEC East division rival Georgia Wednesday night at 6 p.m. CT in Athens, Ga.

The game will be televised on ESPNU, and the contest can be heard live on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com.

Beginning with its trip to Stegeman Coliseum on Wednesday night, Vanderbilt will play four of its last six games on the road.

### Vanderbilt-Kentucky Tidbits

John Jenkins scored a career-high 32 points to lead the Commodores to an 81-77 victory over #18 Kentucky on Saturday at Memorial Gym. Jenkins made a career-high 11 field goals (11-17) and tied a career-high with six made threes. Three other players, Festus Ezeli (14), Steve Tchiengang (12), and Brad Tinsley (11) also added double-figure points for the Commodores in the win.

- The Commodores moved to 14-1 at home in 2010-11.
- The four point margin of victory is the least against Kentucky since February 25, 2007, when the Commodores won 67-65.
- Vanderbilt has won six of its past eight meetings with Kentucky when playing in Memorial Gym.
- Vanderbilt's 55% (11-for-20) shooting from beyond the arc matched a season-high previously set against South Carolina on February 5.
- The Commodores move to 6-0 when shooting 50% or better from three-point range.

- After making 20 free throws against Kentucky, Vanderbilt is now 11-2 when making 20 or more free throws.
- Jenkins's 32 points marks the first 30-point game since A.J. Ogilvy scored 33 against LSU on March 4, 2009.
- This marked the first time a Commodore has scored 30 or more points against Kentucky since Mike Rhodes scored 34 on January 19, 1980.
- Vanderbilt's 58.3% (7-for-12) shooting from beyond the arc in the first half is the highest three-point efficiency since shooting 71.4% (5-for-7) against Davidson on January 2.
- The seven three-pointers in the first half are the most the Commodores have had against an SEC opponent this season.
- For the third consecutive game, Vanderbilt shot 50% or better from three-point range in the first half.

#### Player Notes

- John Jenkins scored a career-high 32 points, topping his previous best of 27 set against West Virginia and South Carolina.
- Jenkins made a career-high 11 field goals, moving past his previous high of eight set against Appalachian State.
- Jenkins tallied his 14th 20+-point game of the season. He leads the SEC in 20-point games.
- Steve Tchiengang had a career-high 12 points against an SEC opponent, topping his previous high of 10 set against South Carolina on January 8, 2011.
- Rod Odom's seven rebounds were a career-best against an SEC opponent, topping his previous high of six set against Tennessee on January 15, 2011.
- Brad Tinsley has made an assist in every game this season.
- Festus Ezeli was perfect from the free throw line (4-for-4) for the fourth time this season.

## Team Notes

### About Georgia

Georgia enters the game with a 17-7 overall record and a 6-4 mark in SEC play after knocking off South Carolina in Columbia, 60-56, on Saturday.

Trey Thompkins leads all Bulldog players in scoring and rebounding with 16.6 points and 7.6 rebounds per game. Travis Leslie (14.2) and Gerald Robinson (12.9) also averaged double-digits for Georgia.

### The Georgia Series

Vanderbilt will meet for the 133rd time Wednesday night, with Vanderbilt holding an 84-48 advantage in the series.

The last meeting between the two schools came on January 12 in Nashville in a game the Commodores won, 73-66.

Georgia leads the series 32-26 in Athens, and the Commodores enjoy a 6-3 lead at neutral sites. Vanderbilt owns a 52-13 advantage in Nashville.

### Stallings Versus Georgia

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 14-10 in games played against Georgia, and a 3-8 mark against the Bulldogs in Athens.

### Stallings In SEC Play

Entering his 12th season of SEC play at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings has an 90-96 record in SEC play. In 2009-10, Stallings posted his best SEC record as a coach with a 12-4 mark.

### Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Kevin Stallings is 141-47 in non-conference games and an astounding 104-8 in home non-conference games.

### Vanderbilt Vs. The SEC

Vanderbilt has a 634-629 record against teams that currently comprise the SEC.

### Vanderbilt-Georgia Connections

The Bulldogs' Gerald Robinson is from Nashville, graduated from Martin Luther King High School, and played at Tennessee State before transferring to Georgia.

Robinson played against the Commodores as a freshman in 2007-08 while at Tennessee State, and scored 24 points for the Tigers in a game VU won at Memorial Gym, 83-74, on December 22. Robinson scored 20 points in the Bulldogs' first appearance in Nashville.

### Jenkins Wins SEC POTW For The Second Time This Season

Sophomore John Jenkins claimed his second SEC Player of the Week honor after averaging 26.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists in two Vanderbilt wins over Alabama and Kentucky. Jenkins and Tennessee's Scotty Hopson are the only two players who have won the award twice this season.

Four of Jenkins' teammates - Festus Ezeli, Lance Goulbourne, and Brad Tinsley - have also claimed the honor this year.

### Free Throws

The Commodores lead the SEC in free throw attempts per game in all games (26.0), and in SEC games only (25.9).

On the road in six games thus far, Vanderbilt has made more free throws than their opponents have attempted. In the six games, VU is 104-153 (.680), while opponents are 70-104 (.673).

### Commodores In Top 25

Vanderbilt is number 18 in both polls this week after wins over Alabama and Kentucky. It is also the highest ranking of the season for the Commodores.

It is the sixth week Vanderbilt has been ranked this season in the AP poll, and the fourth week in the ESPN/USA Today rankings.

This year marks the 20th season the Commodores have appeared in the Associated Press poll, and the fourth time in the last five.

### Stay In The Game Fes!

When center Festus Ezeli has fouled out, the team is 1-3, with a win over Ole Miss and losses at Florida, at South Carolina, and against West Virginia on a neutral floor.

### When Jeffery Taylor Scores 15 Or More...

The Commodores are 13-1, with their only loss coming at Missouri (Taylor had 18 points).

### Taylor And Threes

Jeffery Taylor is 8-of-11 from three in the last three games, and has made 33-84 from beyond-the-arc this season (.393). In his previous two seasons, Taylor was only 10-51 from beyond the arc (19.6).

Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson are back courtside this season, describing the action of every Commodore game to Vanderbilt followers throughout the Southeast.

Fisher, the Voice of the Commodores, will anchor Vanderbilt play-by-play for the 13th consecutive year.

A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-by-play broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a selected number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 10th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 29th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

### Home Sweet Home

In 15 home games this year, the Commodores are 14-1, average 82.6 points per game, and shoot 49.1% from the floor. Vanderbilt also makes 8.9 threes per game, shoots 43.6% from beyond-the-arc, and outrebounds opponents by a margin of +6.6. VU also shoots 78.1% from the charity stripe at Memorial Gym.

In true road games, Vanderbilt is 2-4 on the season and sees their percentages drop from the floor - 42.6% from the field and 31.2% from three. The Commodores get outrebounded by a margin of 3.7 on the road, and only convert 68.0% of their free throws.

### Commodores Vs. Ranked Teams

Vanderbilt is now 4-2 against ranked teams in 2010-11 after their recent win over #18 Kentucky on Saturday at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt is 3-0 in games played against ranked foes at Memorial Gym. In the Stallings' era, Vanderbilt is 30-48 against teams ranked in the Associated Press poll and 21-17 in games played at Memorial Gym.

# SEC Preseason Poll

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fifth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 52 points in the poll to finish behind Florida (110), Kentucky (95), Georgia (72), and Tennessee (71). South Carolina was chosen sixth (20).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 118 votes, 34 votes better than Ole Miss (84).

Florida received eight votes from the league's media to win the SEC Championship.

## VU Wins Finishes Non-Conference

### Unbeaten At Home

With the win over St. Mary's on January 22, the Commodores finished a perfect 10-0 at home in non-conference play, and pushed its non-conference home win streak to 21 (last loss vs. UIC on 12/8/08).

VU has posted a 709-189 (.790) all-time record at the 59-year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference.

## 3-Point Streak Continues Through 25th Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 786 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (795) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (669) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

## Vanderbilt Signs Three To NLI's

Vanderbilt head men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signing of 6'5 point guard **Kedren Johnson (Lewisburg, Tenn.)**, 6'8 forward **Shelby Moats (Waconia, Minn.)**, and 6'4 shooting guard **Dai-Jon Parker (Alpharetta, Ga.)** to National Letters of Intent. All three will be eligible to play for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2011-12.

Many have ranked the Commodores' group in their top 25 recruiting classes.

## Henderson, Siakam Redshirting

Two class of 2010 members, center Josh Henderson and forward James Siakam, will redshirt the 2010-11 campaign.

## Commodores Finish Third In San Juan

Vanderbilt saw some good competition at the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off - the Commodores knocked off Nebraska and then-#8 North Carolina, and dropped a tough three-point decision to West Virginia in the tournament semifinals.

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt Commodores insist they learned a very painful lesson about protecting a lead in the Southeastern Conference.

John Jenkins and Festus Ezeli scored 18 points apiece and Vanderbilt beat No. 24 Georgia 73-66 on to snap the Bulldogs' nine-game winning streak and ruin their first game back in the Top 25 since the end of the 2003 season.

The Commodores (12-3, 1-1) bounced back after blowing their SEC opener with an overtime loss at South Carolina last weekend that knocked them out of the rankings. This time, they never trailed while improving to 52-13 against the Bulldogs at home.

Georgia (12-3, 1-1) had its own problems, having to bus in from Athens, Ga., on Tuesday because of a winter storm. The Bulldogs had such trouble even getting a bus they missed practice.

Coach Mark Fox refused to blame the travel problems for the poor play and his Bulldogs' first loss since Nov. 26 against Temple.

The Bulldogs never got closer than three in the second half. Travis Leslie led the Bulldogs with 21 points, Gerald Robinson added 20 and Trey Thompkins had 13.

Jeffery Taylor had 15 points for Vandy. Ezeli had a double-double, also grabbing 10 rebounds.

Vanderbilt couldn't protect a lead at South Carolina and lost 83-75 even though they never trailed in regulation. This time, before a sold-out crowd, the Commodores led 40-32 at halftime and stayed in front throughout.

- The Vanderbilt starters accounted for 68 of the 73 points.
- Vanderbilt had a season-high eight steals, which tied a season-best.
- Festus Ezeli recorded his third-career double-double by scoring 18 points and grabbing eight boards. All three double-doubles have come this season.
- Ezeli matched a career-high in steals with four with the last time coming against Belmont on December 4, 2010.
- Lance Goulbourne's 10 rebounds marked the third time in his career and second-consecutive game he has had double-digit rebounds.

# Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

## HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 709-189 (.790) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 124 of its last 131 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 171-15 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 104-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

SAN JUAN, P.R. - John Jenkins scored 16 points, and Festus Ezeli and Jeffery Taylor each had 15 to lead Vanderbilt to a 72-65 win over No. 8 North Carolina on Sunday night in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament.

The Commodores (3-1) beat a top-10 team for the first time since knocking off No. 1 Tennessee on Feb. 26, 2008.

UNC's Tyler Zeller had 20 points and 10 rebounds for North Carolina, and freshman Harrison Barnes rebounded from a poor performance to score 11.

Outside of Zeller, the Tar Heels had no offensive threat inside or out. He made seven baskets, and no one else made more than four.

That wasn't a problem for the Commodores. Taylor and Ezeli were tough inside, with 16 rebounds and three blocked shots between them. Jenkins did his work from the free-throw line with a 10-for-12 effort that first built the lead, then helped Vanderbilt keep it for the win. The Commodores bounced back after losing in the final seconds to West Virginia on Friday.

The Tar Heels had made a last gasp effort for the win when they got the ball inside to Zeller, who got the basket and the foul. Vanderbilt forward Andre Walker fouled out on the play and Zeller made the free throw to make it 59-57.

It wasn't enough. Vanderbilt fattened the lead from the free-throw line and Taylor slid down the baseline for a bank-layup and a 65-58 lead. Lance Goulbourne slammed home a 3-point miss for a seven-point lead with 1:20 left.

### Notes

- The Commodores finished the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off with a 2-1 record after knocking off North Carolina Sunday.
- The series record moves to 6-4 in favor of North Carolina. It was the first meeting between the two schools since 1995.
- Vanderbilt knocked off a top 10 team for the first time since defeating number one Tennessee, 72-69, on Feb. 26, 2008. The Commodores are now 82-101 in games against teams in the AP Top 25 all-time (since 1949) and 7-13 on neutral floors.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins scored 21 points, hitting 5 of 10 from 3-point range, to lead Vanderbilt to an 82-62 win over Western Kentucky.

Jenkins, who has led the Commodores (6-1) in scoring the past six games, hit a 3-pointer on the right wing to give Vanderbilt a 22-10 lead and the Hilltoppers (3-4) never got within single digits again.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points for the Commodores. The 6-foot-11 junior from Nigeria, who stood a good 5 inches taller than anyone in the Western Kentucky starting lineup, hit all seven of his field-goal attempts and blocked three shots.

Juan Pattillo led Western Kentucky with 18 points and Sergio Kerusch and Caden Dickerson each added 12.

Vanderbilt took a 35-17 lead into halftime. The Commodores shot 50 percent from 3-point range (6 of 12), including three consecutive 3s as part of an 11-0 run that pushed their lead to 35-13.

Jenkins had eight points at the break. Odom had six on the strength of two 3-pointers and Ezeli had six.

Western Kentucky committed 16 turnovers in the first half that led to 17 points the other way.

Vanderbilt didn't take great care of the ball in a sloppy first half either, turning it over 12 times. But the Hilltoppers couldn't take advantage, shooting just 8 of 28 (28.6 percent) and making 1 of 9 3 pointers.

### Notes

- Western Kentucky's 17 first-half points were the least Vanderbilt has allowed since heading into the half up 31-17 on Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008.
- The eight field goals made by Western Kentucky are the least Vanderbilt has allowed this season.

NASHVILLE - Festus Ezeli scored a career-high 24 points and added 10 rebounds as Vanderbilt beat cross-town rival Belmont 85-76.

Ezeli scored 17 points in the second half as the Commodores overcame a 35-32 halftime deficit.

Vanderbilt scored the first six points of the second half and never trailed again. The Commodores shot 57 percent (12 of 21) over the final 20 minutes.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points and eight rebounds for the Commodores (7-1). Lance Goulbourne had 15 points, and Brad Tinsley added 14 as Vanderbilt attempted 45 free throws -- the most in the Kevin Stallings era (2000-present). The Commodores made 35 of them.

Belmont was led by Mick Hedgepeth with 16 points. Kerron Johnson added 13, and Jordan Campbell had 12.

The scrappy Bruins (5-2) led by as much as seven in the first half before settling for a three-point lead at the break.

- Kevin Stallings is now 4-0 all-time against Belmont.
- Festus Ezeli's 24 points and 10 rebounds marked the first time a Commodore has recorded a 20-10 game since A.J. Ogilvy had 20 points and 12 rebounds against Alabama on February 5, 2009.

- Vanderbilt's 45 free throw attempts were the most in the Stallings era, breaking the previous high of 40 set against Kentucky on February 17, 2009 and Boston College on December 30, 2000.

- Vanderbilt has trailed at the half three times this season with this game being the first time trailing in Memorial Gym.
- Ezeli had a career-high 24 points, and garnered his second career double-double.

**NASHVILLE** - Jeffery Taylor and Steve Tchiengang had 15 points each and Vanderbilt hit a season-high 13 3-pointers to breeze past Southeastern Louisiana 85-52.

Eight different Commodores made a 3-pointer. Vanderbilt (8-2) shot 50 percent (13 of 26) from long distance, but only a little better from the free-throw line (14 of 24).

It was a career high for Tchiengang, who at 6 feet 9 stepped out and hit two 3-pointers. Lance Goulbourne had 13 points, and John Jenkins added 12 on a team-high four 3-pointers.

The Lions (5-4) were led by Gary Dixon, who came off the bench to score 16. Antonio Benton added 10 as the Southeastern Louisiana bench outscored its starters 36-16.

The Commodores rolled up a 53-24 halftime lead behind a sizzling shooting performance. They converted 62.5 percent (20 of 32) from the floor. It was the most points they had scored in a first half since Nov. 24, 2007, against Bradley in the Cancun Challenge.

Jenkins' trey with 47 seconds to go until halftime gave Vanderbilt its largest lead of the half at 53-19. The Commodores shot 53.3 percent (8 of 15) from long range in the opening stanza.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

NASHVILLE - Over the past six games Vanderbilt (No. 24 AP) has gotten used to playing without its roster intact. It's a good thing, too, because it may be a while before coach Kevin Stallings can utilize his full complement of players.

The Commodores (11-2) were without two starters Sunday, including leading scorer John Jenkins. It mattered little, though, as they blasted Davidson 80-52.

Jeffery Taylor scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, while Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each added 14 and Festus Ezeli chipped in 12. Tinsley, a 6-foot-3 guard, was the game's leading rebounder with 10.

Taylor finished 6 of 10 from the field and 9 of 10 from the free throw line. Vanderbilt shot 43.4 percent (23 of 53) and held Davidson to a season-low 29.3 percent (22 of 75).

Jenkins, a sophomore shooting guard who is averaging 17.8 points per game, and Andre Walker, a 6-7 junior forward who averages 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists, both sustained injuries in practice.

Freshman Chris Czerapowicz had 16 points to lead Davidson (7-6). Jake Cohen, the Wildcats' leading scorer at 14.9 points, was held to a season-low two points. He fouled out with 9:06 to play.

Vanderbilt used a 15-0 run to take a 23-6 lead with 11:05 to go in the first half. Tchiengang started the run with a 3-pointer on the right wing, and Tinsley capped it 5 minutes later with a 3-pointer from almost the identical spot.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina was up eight and as the final seconds ticked away, Vanderbilt went up for what appeared to be a meaningless layup.

But the Gamecocks' Sam Muldrow leaped up, got his fingertips on the ball, and ended up in his school's record books, getting just the second triple-double in South Carolina's history in an 83-75 win over the No. 22 Commodores in Columbia.

Muldrow owned overtime, getting five points, including a crucial 3, and four blocks in the extra period. Freshman Bruce Ellington, in his first league game, got the Gamecocks (10-4, 1-0) to overtime. He scored 12 of the Gamecocks final 15 points in regulation -- burying four 3-pointers in seven minutes, including the final points of the second half that tied it at 72 with 2:09 to go.

He then gave South Carolina its first lead of the game with a layup on the first possession of overtime and his quick pass to Muldrow for an open 3 put South Carolina up 81-75 with 2:18 to go.

Ellington finished with 22 points and has scored at least 20 in five of the first 14 games of his college career. John Jenkins led Vanderbilt (11-3, 0-1) with 27 points after missing the last game with a concussion. Jeffery Taylor added 14 points and Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 14 rebounds for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt jumped to an 11-point lead in the first 14 minutes of the game. But the Commodores could never put the Gamecocks away.

### Notes

- Vanderbilt led by seven at the half, 37-30. It was the first time in nine tries this season that the Commodores have lost a game after leading at the half.
- The Commodores outrebounded South Carolina 21-17 in the first half, but were outrebounded, 48-41, in the game.

KNOXVILLE - Tobias Harris hit a layup and a pair of free throws in the final 1:09 as Tennessee erased a 17-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt 67-64.

After Harris' layup with 1:09 left and a timeout, John Jenkins stepped out of bounds with 44 seconds left. Melvin Goins missed two shots for the Vols, and Brad Tinsley fouled Brian Williams with 2.7 seconds left as he grabbed the rebound.

Instead of letting Tennessee take the ball in bounds, Rod Odom fouled Tobias Harris, sending him to the line for one-and-one. Harris hit both shots, and Williams stole the ball as Tinsley threw it in bound and the clock ran out.

It was the second time this season the Commodores watched a solid lead unravel. In an 83-75 overtime loss to South Carolina on Jan. 8, the Dores led by 11 points with 8:42 in the second half when the Gamecocks went on a 20-9 run to close out regulation.

Vanderbilt pushed the first-half margin to 17 points on a free throw by Tinsley with 2:03 before halftime, but Tennessee put together a modest 7-0 run to close the half and cut the halftime margin to 30-20 in favor of the Dores.

The Vols used 48.7 percent shooting after the break to slowly chip away at the Commodores' lead, and a 3-pointer by Cameron Tatum with 3:03 to go gave them their first lead of the second half. Harris finished with 15 points, Tatum had 12 and Skylar McBee had 10.

Jenkins led the Commodores (12-4, 1-2) with 21 points, Jeffery Taylor had 14 and Tinsley 12.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins led five Commodores in double figures with 20 points, and Vanderbilt beat Mississippi 84-74 to send the Rebels to their worst start in Southeastern Conference play since 2000.

The Commodores (13-4, 2-2) needed this win on their home court after dropping their first two road games in the SEC and falling to the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Mississippi (12-7, 0-4) now is off to its worst league start since dropping its first five SEC games in 2000.

Festus Ezeli had 16 points after going 10 of 12 at the free-throw line for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 15 points, and Lance Goulbourne had 14 and tied the Stallings' era team record with 16 rebounds for Vanderbilt. Dawid Przybyszewski last had 16 rebounds Nov. 19, 2004. **STARKVILLE** - Jeffrey Taylor scored 25 points and John Jenkins added 21 as No. 19 Vanderbilt rallied for an 81-74 victory over Mississippi State.

The Commodores (15-4, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) won at Humphrey Coliseum for the first time since 1993, breaking a streak of eight straight losses in Starkville. Vanderbilt trailed by as many as nine points, but used a 12-0 run late in the second half to recover for its third straight victory.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points for Vanderbilt while Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 77-74 with 20 seconds remaining when Taylor stole the ball in the press and dunked for the clinching basket. The 6-foot-7 junior was 9 of 18 from the field and had five rebounds, three steals and two assists.

Jenkins made 9 of 9 free throws, including seven during Vanderbilt's crucial 12-0 run that turned a 66-59 deficit into a 71-66 lead.

Ravarn Johnson scored 19 points and Dee Bost added 18 for the Bulldogs (10-9, 2-3), who shot 26 of 58 (44.8 percent) from the field. Mississippi State struggled from 3-point range, making just 8 of 29 (27.6 percent).

Renardo Sidney, MSU's best post player, battled foul trouble for most of the game. The 6-10, 275-pound sophomore finished with six points and five rebounds in just 13 minutes.

- Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings got the first win of his career in Starkville. His overall record at the Humphrey Coliseum is now 1-5, and against the Bulldogs overall, he is now 7-8. Stallings has now won in every SEC venue.
  - The win was Vanderbilt's first SEC road victory of the season, and its second of 2010-11. The Commodores are now 2-3 on the road (win vs. MTSU, losses at Missouri, South Carolina, Tennessee).

**NASHVILLE** - Rotnei Clarke scored a season-high 36 points and Michael Sanchez had a career-best 20 as Arkansas upset No. 19 Vanderbilt 89-78, handing the Commodores' first home loss this season.

Vanderbilt (15-5, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) had won its first 11 at Memorial Gym, and the Commodores had a sold-out crowd cheering them on.

Arkansas (14-6, 4-3) hadn't had much success here, winning on only three of its previous 10 trips. The Razorbacks also had lost to the first two ranked teams they played this season. That didn't matter Saturday as they shot a season-high 57.4 percent.

They also outrebounded (30-22) and outdefended Vanderbilt. The Commodores only bettered Arkansas at the free throw line (25 of 26), which wasn't nearly enough.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt with 24 points. Festus Ezeli had 18 points, Jeff Taylor 13 and freshman Rod Odom had a season-high 12.

Sanchez missed all but four games last season with plantar fasciitis and sat out the first 11 games due to a stress fracture in his foot. That may be why the Commodores simply weren't ready for him. Sanchez wound up scoring more points than he had managed in the previous eight games combined (17), using his speed to dominate the Commodores in the paint.

The Razorbacks blew open a game that was tight in the opening minutes with five ties and seven lead changes, before Mardracus Wade's free throw put them up for good at 15-14 with 13:28 left. They built the margin to as many as 11, led 43-36 at halftime and pushed the lead to as much as 16 in the second half.

- Vanderbilt lost at home for the first time this season and the first time losing in Memorial since falling to South Carolina 77-73 on March 6, 2010.
  - The Commodores allowed a season-high 89 points, the most points an opponent has scored against Vanderbilt since Georgia put up 94 in an overtime game in Memorial Gym on February 25, 2010.
  - The 11-point margin of defeat is the largest since falling 72-58 at Georgia on February 6, 2010 and the largest at home since dropping to Florida 94-69 on January 20, 2009.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings challenged Jeffery Taylor to shut down South Carolina freshman Bruce Ellington.

The junior essentially did just that, allowing Ellington only two of his 13 points when it mattered, and Taylor also hit a career-high four 3-pointers in scoring 17 points as No. 24 Vanderbilt routed South Carolina 78-60 on Saturday to snap a two-game skid.

Ellington scored 22 points in helping South Carolina rally from a 14-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt on Jan. 8 to open Southeastern Conference play, and Stallings told Taylor two days ago that this would be his most important defensive game for the Commodores this season.

John Jenkins scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Festus Ezeli added 17, and Brad Tinsley had 11 points and nine assists.

South Carolina (13-8, 4-4) has lost three of four, and this one ties the Gamecocks with Vanderbilt at the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Ramon Galloway led South Carolina with 16 points before fouling out. Malik Cooke scored 12 and Sam Muldrow had 11.

Vanderbilt outshot the Gamecocks all over the court but dominated from beyond the arc. The Commodores hit 11 of 20 from 3-point range, their most 3s against an SEC opponent this season and just two shy of the 13 they hit in beating Southeastern Louisiana in December.

NASHVILLE - Brad Tinsley sunk his off-balance jumper despite getting fouled and hit the free throw to help seal the victory for Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) in an 81-77 win over Alabama at Memorial Gym.

JaMychal Green thought he got fouled, too, seconds later only to see officials rule the Alabama forward stepped out of bounds trying to drive the baseline and tie up the game.

With Tinsley's three-point play with 17 seconds left, Vanderbilt beat Southeastern Conference-leading Alabama 81-77 on Thursday night. Alabama coach Anthony Grant said he'd have to check the replay, which he didn't have the benefit of seeing after the game.

Now Vanderbilt (17-6, 5-4) has won the first two games of a three-game homestand with No. 18 Kentucky visiting Saturday to remain knotted with three others for second in the SEC's Eastern Division. Tinsley's shot came off a screen, and he hit the shot even as Trevor Releford hit his arm.

Jenkins finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 19 before fouling out with 90 seconds left, Tinsley had 15 and Ezeli had 11. Taylor said it was great to watch his teammates close out a tight game, but difficult to watch from the bench helpless.

Green finished with 23 points for Alabama, including shooting 10 of 11 at the line. Tony Mitchell scored 22 points, and Releford had 11 before fouling out late.

The Tide came in with the nation's third-stingiest defense and best in the SEC, holding opponents to 57.1 points per game. Vanderbilt is the SEC's best scoring offense, and the Commodores matched what Alabama had been allowing with less than 12 minutes left.

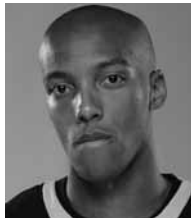

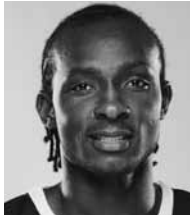
