Vanderbilt Opens SEC Play At South Carolina

The Vanderbilt Commodores open their 77th season of SEC competition when they travel to South Carolina to take on the Gamecocks at 4 p.m. CT in Columbia. The game can be heard on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com.

The game will be televised by ESPN2, with Brad Nessler and Jimmy Dykes handling the play-by-play and color duties.

Vanderbilt-Davidson Tidbits

Junior forward Jeffery Taylor entered the Vanderbilt 1,000-point club with 22 points in an 80-52 win over Davidson Sunday at Memorial Gym. The Commodores held the Wildcats to 29.3% from the floor in the win, and never trailed in the game. Junior guard Brad Tinsley tallied the second double-double of his career with 14 points and 10 rebounds, Steve Tchiengang also scored 14 points, and Festus Ezeli added 12 points in the win.

- Vanderbilt is now 3-1 all-time against Davidson, including a 3-0 mark in Nashville.

- Four players scored in double figures for the Commodores: Jeffery Taylor led the team with 22 points, Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each scored 14 and Festus Ezeli added 12 points.

- Lance Goulbourne made a three-point basket at the 18:57 mark of the first half, which extended Vanderbilt's consecutive games streak with a three-pointer to 775 games.

- Vanderbilt was 6-for-14 from beyond the arc, while Davidson was 5-for-27. VU has made more threes than all but one of their 2010-11 opponents (Belmont).

Player notes:

- With 22 points Sunday, Jeffery Taylor became the 41st player in Vanderbilt history to score 1,000 points. He now has 1,004 career points. He made a season-high 9-for-10 from the free throw line.
- Lance Goulbourne had a career-high three blocks.
- Kyle Fuller had a career-high five assists and tied a career-high with six points.
- Brad Tinsley tied a career-high with 10 rebounds (last happened against Presbyterian, 11/12/10). He had his second double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 rebounds.
- Jordan Smart played a career-high 16 minutes and tied a career-high with two rebounds.

Team Notes

About South Carolina

South Carolina is 9-4 on the season after defeating South Carolina State on Tuesday night, 91-56.

Freshman guard Bruce Ellington leads the Gamecocks with 14.2 points per game - he also paces the team in assists with 3.9 per game. Ellington is the only South Carolina player averaging double figures, but five players average at least 8.6 points per game.

The South Carolina Series

Vanderbilt will meet South Carolina for the 27th time on Saturday afternoon, with the career series tied at 23-23.

The last meeting between the two schools came last year at Memorial Gym on March 6, in a 77-73 South Carolina win.

South Carolina leads the series in Columbia with an 11-10 advantage. The Commodores lead 12-10 at Memorial Gym, and the Gamecocks lead 2-1 at neutral sites.

Stallings Versus South Carolina

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 10-12 all-time against South Carolina, and 6-5 in games played at Columbia.

Stallings SEC Play

Entering his 12th season of SEC play at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings has an 84-92 record in SEC play. In 2009-10, Stallings posted his best SEC record as a coach with a 12-4 mark.

Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Kevin Stallings is 140-47 in non-conference games and an astounding 103-8 in home non-conference games.

Vanderbilt Vs. The SEC

Vanderbilt has a 628-625 record against teams that currently comprise the SEC.

Commodores Hampered By Injuries

Vanderbilt was hoping to return to full strength when Lance Goulbourne returned from a two-game NCAA suspension against Davidson, but instead, were down two men due to injuries sustained in practice in the two days leading up to the game.

John Jenkins, VU's leading scorer, missed the game after suffering a concussion on Saturday, and Andre Walker, who returned for one game (Marquette) after missing four with mononucleosis, suffered a sprained ankle in the Commodores' Friday practice.

Vanderbilt in Top 25

The Commodores entered the 2010-11 AP Top 25 for the first time last week at #24, and crept up two spots to #22 this week. VU also entered the ESPN/USA Today poll this week at #24.

VU Wins 700 At Memorial Gym

The Commodores got their 700th win at Memorial Gym with the win over Belmont on December 4. VU has posted a 703-188 (.789) all-time record at the 59-year old facility. Memorial Gym is the oldest basketball building in use in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt has won 20 consecutive non-conference games at Memorial, with its last loss coming against UIC on December 3, 2008.

3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 775 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (784) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (662) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Vanderbilt Signs Three To NLI's

Vanderbilt head men's basketball coach Kevin Stallings announced the signing of 6'5 point guard **Kedren Johnson (Lewisburg, Tenn.)**, 6'8 forward **Shelby Moats (Waconia, Minn.)**, and 6'4 shooting guard **Dai-Jon Parker (Alpharetta, Ga.)** to National Letters of Intent. All three will be eligible to play for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2011-12.

Many have ranked the Commodores' group in their top 25 recruiting classes. ESPN has the group ranked #23 in the nation.

A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-by-play broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a selected number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics.

Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 10th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 29th year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.

- Stallings is only the **second coach in Vanderbilt history to register five 20-win seasons** (Roy Skinner - six).
- **All 29 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree or are working towards it.**
- **One of only three Vanderbilt coaches with 150 or more wins.**
- Led 2007-08 team to a **perfect 19-0 record at home**, the most single-season home wins in the history of the program.

Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 703-188 (.788) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 123 of its last 130 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 170-15 non-conference record at home (.916 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 103-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

SAN JUAN, P.R. - John Jenkins scored 16 points, and Festus Ezeli and Jeffery Taylor each had 15 to lead Vanderbilt to a 72-65 win over No. 8 North Carolina on Sunday night in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament.

The Commodores (3-1) beat a top-10 team for the first time since knocking off No. 1 Tennessee on Feb. 26, 2008.

UNC's Tyler Zeller had 20 points and 10 rebounds for North Carolina, and freshman Harrison Barnes rebounded from a poor performance to score 11.

Outside of Zeller, the Tar Heels had no offensive threat inside or out. He made seven baskets, and no one else made more than four.

That wasn't a problem for the Commodores. Taylor and Ezeli were tough inside, with 16 rebounds and three blocked shots between them. Jenkins did his work from the free-throw line with a 10-for-12 effort that first built the lead, then helped Vanderbilt keep it for the win. The Commodores bounced back after losing in the final seconds to West Virginia on Friday.

The Tar Heels had made a last gasp effort for the win when they got the ball inside to Zeller, who got the basket and the foul. Vanderbilt forward Andre Walker fouled out on the play and Zeller made the free throw to make it 59-57.

It wasn't enough.

Vanderbilt fattened the lead from the free-throw line and Taylor slid down the baseline for a bank-layup and a 65-58 lead. Lance Goulbourne slammed home a 3-point miss for a seven-point lead with 1:20 left.

Notes

- The Commodores finished the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off with a 2-1 record after knocking off North Carolina Sunday.
- The series record moves to 6-4 in favor of North Carolina. It was the first meeting between the two schools since 1995.
- Vanderbilt knocked off a top 10 team for the first time since defeating number one Tennessee, 72-69, on Feb. 26, 2008. The Commodores are now 82-101 in games against teams in the AP Top 25 all-time (since 1949) and 7-13 on neutral floors.

Ezeli had 11 points and 13 rebounds, and the Commodores (4-1) played the second half without the services of preseason All-SEC pick Jeffery Taylor.

Taylor took a blow to his left eye with about 5 minutes to play in the first half on an intentional foul by Tigers guard Rupert Rose.

The 6-foot-7 junior forward was on the floor for a couple of minutes and didn't return because of blurry vision.

The outcome was still in doubt at the half as Vanderbilt shot 33 percent and led just 40-38.

Grambling (1-5) hung around in large part because of Justin Patton, who had 15 points in the first half and finished with 20.

Brad Tinsley added 14 points and Steve Tchien-gang had a career-high 12.

Vanderbilt took a 35-17 lead into halftime. The Commodores shot 50 percent from 3-point range (6 of 12), including three consecutive 3s as part of an 11-0 run that pushed their lead to 35-13.

Jenkins had eight points at the break. Odom had six on the strength of two 3-pointers and Ezeli had six.

Western Kentucky committed 16 turnovers in the first half that led to 17 points the other way.

Vanderbilt didn't take great care of the ball in a sloppy first half either, turning it over 12 times. But the Hilltoppers couldn't take advantage, shooting just 8 of 28 (28.6 percent) and making 1 of 9 3 pointers.

NASHVILLE - Jeffery Taylor and Steve Tchiengang had 15 points each and Vanderbilt hit a season-high 13 3-pointers to breeze past Southeastern Louisiana 85-52.

Eight different Commodores made a 3-pointer. Vanderbilt (8-2) shot 50 percent (13 of 26) from long distance, but only a little better from the free-throw line (14 of 24).

It was a career high for Tchiengang, who at 6 feet 9 stepped out and hit two 3-pointers. Lance Goulbourne had 13 points, and John Jenkins added 12 on a team-high four 3-pointers.

The Lions (5-4) were led by Gary Dixon, who came off the bench to score 16. Antonio Benton added 10 as the Southeastern Louisiana bench outscored its starters 36-16.

The Commodores rolled up a 53-24 halftime lead behind a sizzling shooting performance. They converted 62.5 percent (20 of 32) from the floor. It was the most points they had scored in a first half since Nov. 24, 2007, against Bradley in the Cancun Challenge.

Vanderbilt hit eight 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. Jenkins knocked down three of them, and freshman Rod Odom had a pair.

Jenkins' trey with 47 seconds to go until halftime gave Vanderbilt its largest lead of the half at 53-19. The Commodores shot 53.3 percent (8 of 15) from long range in the opening stanza.

MURFREESBORO - Jeffery Taylor led four Vanderbilt players in double figures with 18 points as the Commodores beat rival Middle Tennessee 72-53.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

The Commodores built a 14-point lead at the half and the Blue Raiders (4-8) never got closer than eight in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 36 free throws, 26 in the second half, to just 14 for Middle Tennessee.

Jason Jones led Middle with 15 points. The Blue Raiders have lost four in a row.

Vanderbilt had its largest lead of the first half, 41-27, at the half when Brad Tinsley went coast to coast with an inbounds pass after a free throw by Middle's Kerry Hammonds. Tinsley's layup came a second before the buzzer.

The Blue Raiders had cut the lead to six at 30-24 with 1:53 to go when Jenkins took over. He scored nine of his 11 first-half points in a 60-second span beginning at 1:38 when he grabbed an offensive rebound along the left baseline and hit a stepback 3-pointer.

Jenkins followed with a steal near halfcourt, drove the right side, made the layup and converted the three-point play after getting fouled by Middle's Kyle Hunt. Forty-nine seconds later Jenkins' long 3-pointer up top made it 39-26.

Notes

- The Commodores improved to 1-1 in true road contests. Tuesday night's game was Vanderbilt's last non-conference road trip of the 2010-11 season. VU next ventures on the road in their SEC opener against South Carolina on January 8 and the sixth game of 2010-11.

NASHVILLE - Over the past six games Vanderbilt (No. 24 AP) has gotten used to playing without its roster intact. It's a good thing, too, because it may be a while before coach Kevin Stallings can utilize his full complement of players.

The Commodores (11-2) were without two starters Sunday, including leading scorer John Jenkins. It mattered little, though, as they blasted Davidson 80-52.

Jeffery Taylor scored 22 points for Vanderbilt, while Brad Tinsley and Steve Tchiengang each added 14 and Festus Ezeli chipped in 12. Tinsley, a 6-foot-3 guard, was the game's leading rebounder with 10.

Taylor finished 6 of 10 from the field and 9 of 10 from the free throw line. Vanderbilt shot 43.4 percent (23 of 53) and held Davidson to a season-low 29.3 percent (22 of 75).

Jenkins, a sophomore shooting guard who is averaging 17.8 points per game, and Andre Walker, a 6-7 junior forward who averages 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists, both sustained injuries in practice.

Freshman Chris Czerapowicz had 16 points to lead Davidson (7-6). Jake Cohen, the Wildcats' leading scorer at 14.9 points, was held to a season-low two points. He fouled out with 9:06 to play.

Vanderbilt used a 15-0 run to take a 23-6 lead with 11:05 to go in the first half. Tchiengang started the run with a 3-pointer on the right wing, and Tinsley capped it 5 minutes later with a 3-pointer from almost the identical spot.
