LEADING OFF

The No. 23 Texas A&M Aggies head to Nashville for their first SEC road trip of the season. The Aggies and Vanderbilt Commodores rekindle what has become a premier interdivisional rivalry in the SEC. Since the Aggies joined the SEC for the 2013 campaign, the squads have met on 12 occasions, including six times in SEC Tournament play. Texas A&M holds a 7-5 edge in the series. The Aggies claimed both regular-season series, including 2014 in Nashville and 2016 in College Station. The 2016 series included Kyle Simonds' no-hitter in a 3-0 victory to clinch the series. Vanderbilt knocked Texas A&M out of the SEC Tournament in 2013 and 2015 and the Aggies returned the favor in 2016.

NINE-HOLE CONTRIBUTIONS

The Aggies are getting plenty of contributions from the No. 9 spot in the order. Nine-hole hitters are batting .372 (29-for-78) with 22 runs, five doubles, one triple, four home runs and 17 RBI. The .451 on-base percentage for the No. 9 spot leads the team, the .372 batting average and .615 slugging percentage rank second. **JORGE GUTIERREZ** is hitting .571 (4-for-7) with three home runs and five RBI and **HUNTER COLEMAN** is batting .545 (6-for-11) with six runs, one double, one triple and two RBI at the bottom of the order. **COLE BEDFORD** is hitting .455 (5-for-11) with three runs and two doubles at the No. 9 spot.

MID-GAME SURGES

The Aggies have been mauling teams in the fifth and sixth innings, outscoring opponents 63-16 during the two frames.

FIFTH INNING - 33-9... .435 on-base percentage, .354 batting average (34-for-96) with 13 walks, three HBP, six doubles, two triples and two home runs.

SIXTH INNING - 30-7... .474 on-base percentage, .400 batting average (40-for-100) with 12 walks, two HBP, seven doubles, four triples, four home runs.

TEXAS A&M/VANDERBILT SERIES NOTABLES

The Texas A&M and Rice have met 12 times previously with the Aggies holding a 7-5 advantage. The two teams first met in the Aggies inaugural season in the SEC with two matchups at the SEC tournament split between the teams.

The two squads faced off five times in 2016. The Aggies took 2-of-3 from the Commodore in Vanderbilt's first trip to College Station. Kyle Simonds no-hit the fifth-ranked Commodores in the Saturday meeting. In Hoover, Vandy took down the Aggies in a 5-6 victory before A&M knocked off the 'Dores 13-3 in seven innings during an elimination game. The teams had similar meetings in the 2015 SEC tournament with the results flipped. **AUSTIN HOMAN** hit 8-for-17 in the five matchups with a double, triple, home run and six RBI. **BRIGHAM HILL** got a start against Vanderbilt on May 6 striking out seven Commodores.

In the Aggies only previous trip to Nashville they took 2-of-3 from the seventh-ranked 'Dores in 2014.

Vanderbilt has been ranked in the top-10 in each of the 12 previous meetings. They last seven matchups in the series have featured both teams ranked in the top-10.

MORE ON VANDERBILT

The Commodores are 14-8 overall with a 1-2 mark in SEC play. Last week, Vanderbilt opened the league slate by dropping two of three at Ole Miss. The Commodores claimed non-conference series victories against San Diego and St. Mary's, but dropped series to UIC and Cal State Northridge.

Vanderbilt is hitting .277 with a .401 on-base percentage and .418 slugging percentage. Julian Infante leads the way with a .376 batting average, 20 runs, seven doubles, three home runs and 19 RBI. Will Toffey is batting .321 with 19 runs, three doubles, one triple, three home runs, 25 RBI and four stolen bases. Jeren Kendall is hitting .297 with 23 runs, three doubles, three triples, five home runs, six RBI and five stolen bases.

The Commodores have always prided themselves on pitching and this season is no different. Vanderbilt's staff has a 3.09 ERA and is holding opponents to a .216 batting average. Friday night starter Kyle Wright stumbled out of the gate with a 0-3 record and 4.33 ERA, but the All-American rebounded last weekend in a no-decision, allowing just one run on six hits and two walks while striking out four in 7.0 innings at Ole Miss. Saturday and Sunday's starters both have sub-2.00 ERAs with Patrick Raby at 3-2 with a 1.71 ERA and Drake Fellows at 3-0 with a 1.72 ERA.

The Owls have 22 NCAA Championship appearances, all since 1995. The 2003 National Champion, Rice has made seven College World Series appearances.

Rice boasts 34 Major Leaguers in school annals. Lance Berkman is the most prominent alum, playing 15 years while amassing 1,905 hits, 366 home runs, 1,234 RBI and six All-Star Game appearances.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

The Aggies boast two preseason All-Americans, including **BRIGHAM HILL** and **CORBIN MARTIN**. Both players were named to two separate teams. Hill was named a first-teamer by the NCBWA and a third-teamer by Collegiate Baseball. Martin was named a second-teamer by both Baseball America and D1Baseball.com.

TRIPLE YOUR PLEASURE

The Aggies currently rank second in the nation in triples with 15, trailing only UNC Greensboro (16). The current pace (0.71 per game) would give the Aggies 39 triples after the regular-season, well over the school record of 32 set in 1982 and equaled in 1989.

GEORGE JANCA already has four three-baggers on the year, equaling the team-high from last season. Janca ranks third in the nation with his tally. **LOGAN FOSTER** has three triples on the year and **JOEL DAVIS, BLAKE KOPETSKY** and **BRADEN SHEWMAKE** each have two triples apiece.

The Aggies also rank 18th in the nation in doubles (48) with Shewmake ranked 13th in the nation, individually, with 10 two-baggers.

RACKING UP WINS

The Aggies went a combined 99-30 (.767) in 2015 and 2016. The 99 wins over the two seasons was tied with LSU and Miami (Fla.) for third in the nation. Florida's 104 wins was tops in Division I followed by TCU with 100. The SEC boasted four of the top 10 with Vanderbilt's 94 wins coming in seventh to join Florida, Texas A&M and LSU.

NOTES AND NOTABLES

- In his 12th season at the helm of Texas A&M Baseball, head coach Rob Childress enters the week's action with a 473-245-2 record. Last season, he led the Aggies to the postseason to extend their school-record streak to 10 consecutive seasons.
- Texas A&M is one of nine teams to win 300 or more games from 2010-16. The Aggies went 302-146-1 over the span. A&M trailed only Vanderbilt (334), Virginia (331), LSU (326), South Carolina (323), Florida State (322), Louisville (321), Florida (320) and TCU (314) and over the span.
- The Aggies' recent slide has dropped them out of three of the five national polls. A&M is still No. 23 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and 29th in the NCBWA Poll.

Allowed his first run of 2017 21.0 innings into the season... named to the All-Tournament team at the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic with his 7.0 innings of scoreless, three-hit ball against No. 19 Texas Tech... rattled off three consecutive wins against Top 10 opponents to end the 2016 regular-season, allowing two runs, one earned, in 20.0 inning... earned All-America recognition from Baseball America (second team) and the National Baseball Writers Association (third team) last season... tabbed a Preseason All-American by the NCBWA (first team) and Collegiate Baseball (third team) this season... selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 20th round of the MLB Draft last June... world-class squirrel hunter.

SATURDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER: #32 STEPHEN KOLEK

Making his second SEC start... was solid in his first SEC start despite a no-decision, allowing three runs on five hits and one walk while striking out two in 6.1 innings... was dominant in his first appearance of the year, allowing just one run on three hits while striking out three on 57 pitches in 5.0 innings... left with no-decision against Pepperdine despite a strong performance, yielding just one run on five hits and two walks while striking out two in 6.0 innings... held No. 1 TCU to one run over 4.0 innings, but found himself exiting with a high pitch count... left with no-decision in A&M's 3-2 win over Brown, allowing two runs on eight hits and one walk while striking out three in 7.0 innings... appeared in five SEC games in 2016, all out of the bullpen, posting a 1-0 record with a 3.65 ERA and .209 batting average... has one older brother, Tyler, who was the second overall pick of the 2014 MLB Draft, taken by the Miami Marlins with their first-round selection... named the Alaska League's top prospect by Baseball America last summer, pitching in eight games for the Mat-Su Miners, including seven starts, posting a 4-0 record with a 2.34 ERA and 33 strikeouts in 42.1 innings.

POSTSEASON STREAK CONTINUES INTO 2017

Prior to the arrival of head coach **ROB CHILDRESS**, Texas A&M had never appeared in the NCAA Tournament more than four consecutive years. Advancing to the NCAA Fort Worth Super Regional in 2016 extended the Aggies current string to 10 consecutive years, something that had never happened before in the program's 115 year history.

Childress has led the Aggies to the postseason each of the last 10 seasons, topping the previous-high water mark of four-straight trips, a feat that had happened only twice before at Texas A&M. Former head coach Tom Chandler led his squad to the NCAA Regionals each season from 1975 to 1978 and 11 years later the Aggies enjoyed a similar four-year run from 1986-89 under the direction of head coach Mark Johnson.

LOCAL BOYS

BLAKE KOPETSKY, **LONDON MINER** and **KYLE RICHARDSON** continue a long line of local products to play for the Aggies.

Kopetsky was a standout at Rudder High School in Bryan, earning three letters. He was tabbed an All-Texas 4A Third Team outfielder by the Texas SportsWriters Association as a senior in 2012. He played his first two years at Temple Junior College and returned home in the summers to star for the Brazos Valley Bombers.

Miner was a four-year letterwinner at Bryan High School. He logged 21 career prep wins with 305 strikeouts in 258.0 innings. The 305 career strikeouts set the school record. He was a four-time all-district honoree. As a senior he went 8-5 with a 1.72 ERA and 93 strikeouts in 77.0 innings to earn All-Brazos Valley First Team, All-Greater Houston and All-District 18-5A First Team.

Richardson was a two-time all-district pitcher and 2014 All-State Second Team pitcher at College Station High School. He racked up a career record of 25-4 in his first three seasons for the Cougars, not pitching in his senior year. He batted over .300 in three of his four years, including a .459 average in 2015. He tossed three no-hitters and one perfect game as a prep.

Other recent players to hail from Bryan or College Station include Krey Bratsen (2011-14), Luke Anders (2006-09), Nick Anders (2009), Kyle Nicholson (2004-07) and Keith Stein (2005-06).

IRON MEN

Freshman **BRADEN SHEWMAKE** and senior **JOEL DAVIS** are the only two Aggies to start all 22 games on the season. The Aggies have had five other players appear in all 22 games in 2017, including **NICK CHORUBY**, **LOGAN FOSTER**, **AUSTIN HOMAN**, **GEORGE JANCA** and **BLAKE KOPETSKY**.

IT'S BEEN A LONG TIME SINCE...

The Bowling Green massacre in the opening weekend gave the Aggies some feats that had not been accomplished in a long time and even produced some new records.

The 50 runs were the most ever scored by Texas A&M in an opening weekend, topping the 48 scored in 1999 against UT Pan American.

The Aggies strung together 15 or more runs in three consecutive games for the first time since the 1999 NCAA Central Regional at Olsen Field when the Maroon and White toppled in Jackson State (23-3), BYU (25-4) and South Alabama (17-6).

The 50 runs were the most for the Aggies in three-game series since logging 53 against Texas Tech in March 1989.

TURNER BASEBALL

TURNER LARKINS has the distinction of being selected in the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft one spot before Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Manziel. The Milwaukee Brewers selected Larkins out of Arlington Martin High School in the 28th round (836th overall pick). The San Diego Padres picked Manziel with the 837th pick.

HEAD COACH ROB CHILDRRESS

One of the top pitching coaches and recruiters in the country, Rob Childress enters his 12th season as the head coach of the Texas A&M baseball program.

With a steady stream of success, Childress has led A&M to a school-record 10 consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, five NCAA Regional titles, two conference regular-season crowns, four league tournament titles and the 2011 College World Series. He owns a career record of 458-238-2, trailing only Mark Johnson (876) and Tom Chandler (660) in coaching victories at Texas A&M.



The 2016 Aggies earned their first-ever SEC Tournament with a 12-5 victory over No. 1 Florida in the championship game. Texas A&M finished the season with a 49-16 record, including a four-week stretch in which the Maroon and White won 10 of 14 against squads ranked in the Top 10. The magical campaign included Kyle Simonds' complete-game no-hitter against Vanderbilt, a top 10 squad.

The 2015 squad started the season with an SEC-record 24-game win streak en route to a 50-14 campaign, the highest victory tally for the Aggies since 1999. A&M finished third in the SEC with an 18-10 league ledger and won their seventh NCAA Regional title. The Aggies came up one run shy of the College World Series, dropping game three of a Super Regional against TCU, 5-4, in 16 innings.

In 2014, Childress guided the Aggies through their second season in the SEC, securing a spot in the SEC Tournament for the second consecutive year and earning a bid to a school-record eighth consecutive NCAA Championship.

In Texas A&M's first run through the SEC in 2013, Childress led A&M to the final six of the SEC Tournament and a seventh straight NCAA Championship. The Gilmer, Texas, native's expertise as a pitching coach is evident and has made an immediate impact. A&M's pitching staff ranked first or second in the rugged Big 12 in earned run average in each of his seven seasons in the league, including a Big 12-best 2.92 team ERA in 2012.

In 2011, Childress captured co-Big 12 Coach of the Year honors as he led the Aggies to another milestone campaign as he guided the squad back to college baseball's promised land of Omaha, Nebraska, and the College World Series. The trip to Omaha was the fifth in program history and capped off another successful run in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2011 team also claimed the 23rd conference championship in program history as it brought home both the Big 12 regular season and tournament titles before emerging victorious in both the College Station Regional and Tallahassee Super Regional.

A trio of Aggies (Tyler Naquin, Ross Stripling and Michael Wacha) garnered All-America honors in 2011 as Naquin was also named Big 12 Player of the Year while both Stripling and Wacha excelled on the mound under Childress' tutelage. Stripling blossomed during his third year in the A&M program as he led the nation in wins by turning in a 14-2 campaign with a 2.29 ERA.

Named the Big 12's Coach of the Year by his peers in 2008, he guided the Aggies to 46 wins, their first regular-season title in nine years and the first back-to-back NCAA regional championships in school history. Along the way A&M set a new school and Big 12 record by winning 16 straight conference games.

After just one season at the helm, Childress orchestrated the biggest turnaround in NCAA Division I baseball. His 2007 team finished 48-19, winning 23 more games than in 2006, in addition to claiming the NCAA College Station Regional championship, a berth in the Super Regionals and the school's first Big 12 title since 1999.

Childress was named the 19th head baseball coach in school history on June 21, 2005, after spending the previous eight seasons at Nebraska—the first five as an assistant under current Arkansas Head Coach Dave Van Horn and the last three as an assistant to Mike Anderson. In those eight seasons, the Huskers made the NCAA Tournament five times, advanced to the Super Regionals four times and made three appearances in the College World Series (2001, 2002 and 2005).

Childress was a collegiate assistant coach for 14 seasons, including 10 years at the Division I level. He spent seven seasons at Nebraska after serving with Van Horn at Northwestern State from 1995 to 1997.

CAM BLAKE - father, Cody Blake, lettered on the 1989-90 Texas A&M Men's Basketball squad.

NICK CHORUBY - father, Shawn Choruby, was an outfielder for the Aggies in 1984-85.

MASON COLE - father, Curt Cole, was a three-year letterwinner as a tight end at Texas Tech. He was selected by the Denver Gold in the 1984 USFL Territorial Draft and spent time on the Green Bay Packers' roster.

HUNTER COLEMAN - father, David Coleman, is the head coach at Midland College. He served two stints as an assistant coach at Texas A&M, including as a volunteer assistant in the mid-1990s and as a full-time assistant on Mark Johnson's staff from 1998-2005. He earned his master's degree in education administration from Texas A&M in 1995.

TOMMY GILLMAN - brother, C.J. Gillman, played two seasons at the University of Dayton, logging a career .342 batting average with 90 runs, 10 home runs and 104 RBI in 120 games. Gillman played against the Aggies at the 2012 College Station Regional, scoring the Flyers' only run in A&M's 4-1 victory. A two-time All-Atlantic 10 selection, C.J. went on to play two years professionally with the Windy City ThunderBolts of the Frontier League. He's currently an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy.

LEE MAY GONZALEZ - cousin, Michael Gonzalez, is an 11-year MLB veteran, including stints as a relief pitcher with the Pittsburgh Pirates (2003-06), Atlanta Braves (2007-09), Baltimore Orioles (2010-11), Texas Rangers (2011), Washington Nationals (2012) and Milwaukee Brewers (2013). Has appeared in 509 games, all in relief, with a 17-24 record, 56 saves, 3.14 ERA and 511 strikeouts in 444.1 innings. Best season to date came in 2006 with the Pirates, going 3-4 with a career-high 24 saves, a 2.17 ERA and 64 strikeouts in 54.0 innings.

LEE MAY GONZALEZ - uncle, Eric Gonzalez, played for the Aggies in 1992-93 and is currently the head coach at Laredo Community College. As a junior in 1992, Eric batted .287 with 31 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, one home run, 26 RBI and 14 stolen bases in 55 games.

GEORGE JANCA - brother, Sam Janca, pitched for Texas Tech in 2007 and 2008. Ended his collegiate career at Angelo State.

STEPHEN KOLEK - brother, Tyler Kolek, was the second overall pick of the 2014 MLB Draft, taken by the Miami Marlins with their first-round selection.

JASON RUFFCORN - father, Scott Ruffcorn, was a three-year letterwinner at Baylor, logging a career record of 20-7 with a 3.23 ERA and 184 strikeouts in 222.2 IP from 1989-91. He pitched five seasons in the Major Leagues, including one year with the Philadelphia Phillies and four years with the Chicago White Sox.

BAIN SCHOENVOGEL - uncle, Chad Schoenvogel, played baseball at Blinn College and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the second round of the MLB Draft.

CASON SHERROD - grandfather, Horace "Bud" Sherrod, played football at the University of Tennessee and was Most Valuable Player of the 1951 Cotton Bowl Classic as a defensive end, helping lead UT to a 20-14 win over the Texas Longhorns. He spent one season in the NFL, playing for the New York Giants in 1952. He is a member of the University of Tennessee Athletic Hall of Fame.

BRADEN SHEWMAKE - father, Shane Shewmake, has been head coach at UT Dallas since the 2002 season, earning American Southwest Conference East Coach of the Year recognition in 2004 and 2012.

SEC ALL-TIME LEADER IN WINS

The Aggies own the most wins of any SEC program with 2,628 victories, which ranks 12th nationally. Texas A&M is currently one of just 24 NCAA Division I programs to reach the 2,500-win plateau, entering play with a 2,629-1,467-42 mark. On May 1, 2016, the Aggies became the first SEC team to reach the 2,600-win mark with a 6-2 win at Arkansas. Texas A&M's all-time winning percentage of .641 also leads the SEC and ranks 16th among NCAA Division I schools.

Among the everyday starters, **BRADEN SHEWMAKE** leads the way with a .436 batting average (17-for-39) with four walks, six doubles, one home run and 25 RBI and **JOEL DAVIS** is hitting .400 (12-for-30) with seven walks, three HBP, two doubles, one triple and 18 RBI.

CASHING IN... RUNNERS ON THIRD LESS THAN TWO OUTS

The Aggies have been proficient at scoring runs with a runner at third and less than two outs, knocking in runs on 55-of-81 opportunities (.679)... **WALKER PENNINGTON** has converted on 7-of-8 (.875) and **AUSTIN HOMAN** has converted on 11-of-13 (.846)... Other notables in the situation include **BRADEN SHEWMAKE** at 8-of-10 (.800). Texas A&M's opponents are converting with a runner at third and less than two outs on 29-of-55 (.527).

SUMMER LOVIN'

Baseball America tabbed two Aggies as top prospects in their respective summer leagues.

MITCHELL KILKENNY - Northwoods League

Kilkenny worked out of the bullpen for Texas A&M this spring but impressed when he did get opportunities, posting a 1.67 ERA and 29 strikeouts in 27 innings. He started five games for Madison and showed the best combination of stuff and projectability of any pitcher in the league. Listed at 6-foot-4, 202 pounds, Kilkenny has a lean, athletic frame and his motion is loose and easy. He stays upright throughout, throws from a high three-quarters arm slot and works quickly. Kilkenny works with a four-pitch arsenal and throws them all for strikes—he had just three walks in 32 innings this summer. He works 90-94 mph with his fastball, throws a changeup and curveball in the 77-80 mph range and a cutter from 87-91 mph. The latter pitch might be his best—it has excellent depth and deception, especially when it's thrown down in the zone, and hitters were often helpless against it during the summer." - *Baseball America*

STEPHEN KOLEK - Northwoods League

"A year after Corbin Martin was named the circuit's best prospect, another Aggie landed atop the list as the physical righthander Kolek flashed the type of movement and velocity on his fastball that made some think he could be a first-round pick in due time. The younger brother of 2014 No. 2 overall pick Tyler Kolek, Stephen pitched in just 12 games for the Aggies as a freshman but impressed anyway, striking out 21 in 30 innings and posting a 3.30 ERA. He was even better for the Miners this summer, striking out 32 in just 37 innings and finishing with a 2.45 ERA. Already 6-foot-3 and 210 pounds, Kolek used a cutter, two-seam fastball and sinker, all of which sat 89-92 mph this summer, to overpower opposing hitters. Other pitchers on the circuit might have thrown harder, but few boasted more movement on their pitches than Kolek. The hard sinker is his best pitch currently and if he is able to add strength and velocity down the road as Miners' coach Ben Taylor expects he will, the pitch will be downright lethal. He pitches off his variety of fastballs but his secondary stuff isn't below-average either. The changeup has good sink in its own right and has a chance to be an average pitch down the road while the curveball needs refinement but did show good depth at times. Despite his size and how hard he throws Kolek doesn't put a lot of effort into his delivery and his motion is very clean. This allowed him to throw all of his pitches for strikes in any count and keep hitters guessing. Kolek's command came and went this summer but that was at least partially attributed to the movement on his pitches." - *Baseball America*

CHORUBY'S SENIORITY

Senior **NICK CHORUBY** enters the week as the most senior of veterans on the squad. Heading into the game game against Rice, Choruby has played in 148 games, including 71 starts.

Choruby is the lone Aggie with over 100 career games under his belt.

YOUNG GUNS

Six Texas A&M freshmen combined to hit 99-for-276 (.359) with 68 runs, 21 doubles, seven triples, 10 home runs and 65 RBI in the first 22 games of the season. The six freshmen combine on a .441 on-base percentage.

BRADEN SHEWMAKE, who earned SEC Freshman of the Week recognition for his performance the opening weekend, is hitting .406 (39-for-96) with 22 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, three home runs and 28 RBI, including four ribbies in his debut. He batted 5-for-5 with one double, one home run, two runs and three RBI in the series finale against Pepperdine. Shewmake ranks second in the nation in hits (39), ninth in total bases (62), 11th in RBI (28) and 16th in doubles (10).

JORGE GUTIERREZ reached base in 21 of his 43 plate appearances (.488 on-base percentage), going 10-for-32 (.313) with nine walks, two HBP, one triple, three home runs, nine runs and eight RBI.

CAM BLAKE is 5-for-18 (.278) with six walks, three runs and five RBI.

HUNTER COLEMAN is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with seven runs, three doubles, one triple and seven RBI.

LOGAN FOSTER is batting 31-for-87 (.356) with 26 runs, eight doubles, three triples, four home runs and 15 RBI. He earned SEC Freshman of the Week after his All-Tournament Team performance at the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic, where he hit .412 (7-for-17) with six runs, three doubles, one triple and one home run. Foster ranks 13th in the nation in runs (26), 19th in total bases (57).

TOMMY GILLMAN has come off the bench in seven games, hitting 2-for-5 with one walk, one run and two RBI.

UP NEXT

The Aggies continue with their seven-game road trip as they travel to San Marcos on Tuesday for a midweek clash against the Texas State Bobcats.
