### THE MATCHUP

- Set to take on its first ranked opponent of the 2020 season, Vanderbilt will host the 15th-ranked Georgia Bulldogs at Vanderbilt Soccer Complex Sunday on ESPN.
- This will be the 27th all-time meeting between Vanderbilt and Georgia (Vanderbilt leads 13-12-1)
  - First Meeting: 1995 (W, 3-1)
  - Last Meeting: 10.04.19 (W, 1-0)
  - Last Vanderbilt Win: 10.04.19 (1-0)
  - Last Opponent Win: 10.23.15 (3-1)
  - Last Draw: 09.14.13 (0-0)

• In his five-plus seasons, Darren Ambrose owns a 5-1 record against Georgia. Last time Georgia visited West End, Ambrose's team cruised to a 5-0 win.

### LAST TIME OUT

- Myra Konte scored in the 103rd minute of double overtime Sunday evening to give Vanderbilt a 2-1 victory - its fourth in program history over Florida. The goal was just the second of Konte's career with the other goal coming against a fellow Florida team - Miami in 2018.
- Raegan Kelley scored the game-tying goal in the 80th minute to send the game to overtime after Vandy fell behind thanks to a late first-half goal.
- The win is Vanderbilt's second straight in Gainesville. In all, Vanderbilt has four victories over Florida with two of them coming in the last three seasons during visits to the Sunshine State.

### 2020 TO DATE

- In the season opener against Kentucky, a Haley Hopkins brace was the difference in a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the Wildcats. The victory came after Kentucky scored the first two goals of the game in the opening half to lead by a pair after 45 minutes. Four Does -- Leila Azari, Madiya Harriott, Amber Nguyen and Olivia Simmons -- contributed with assists to the three goals in Vanderbilt's win over Kentucky. While Hopkins scored twice, Blue Ellis notched the tying goal. Vanderbilt spent an astounding 41% of the match attacking in Kentucky's defensive zone. Conversely, UK spent only 7% in Vanderbilt's.
- Across Vanderbilt's three losses to Tennessee, Missouri and South Carolina, four of the five opponent goals have come from set pieces with Tennessee scoring on a corner kick, Missouri tallying twice from the direct result of free kicks and South Carolina winning it on the PK.
- Vanderbilt snapped a three-game losing streak - the longest to date under Darren Ambrose - with the double-overtime win at Florida last time out.

### HEAD COACH DARREN AMBROSE

- Now in his sixth season leading Vanderbilt soccer, Darren Ambrose has guided one of the best five-year runs in program history.
  - The Does have amassed a 63-36-10 record and 31-19-7 SEC mark during his tenure. Ten of those wins were over ranked opponents.
  - Vanderbilt has three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, an SEC regular season championship and an East Division championship under his leadership.
  - Ambrose is the first Vanderbilt head coach in 21 years to have three consecutive double-digit win seasons (2017-19).
  - Vanderbilt has been tough to beat in both home openers and SEC openers, winning each of its last four under Ambrose from 2017 to 2020.

### LATE DECISIONS

- All five of Vanderbilt's games thus far in 2020 have been decided in the second half or later and have been one-goal games.
- All three of Vanderbilt's goals against Kentucky in the season opener came after the 53rd minute with the first two separated by just 6:11 of game action.
- Against Florida, Myra Konte's game-winning goal came in the 103rd minute of double overtime.
- Last season, nine of the 14 wins were decided after halftime, and five of those wins were away from West End.

### DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER ME

- Haley Hopkins' two goals against Kentucky came off of four shots on goal.
- Last season, she accounted for 36% (13-of-36) of the Commodores' goals. In her time on West End, she has scored 29 times.
- Six of her goals a season ago were game winners.
- While starting 43 straight games from 2018-20, Hopkins has been held back by injury in 2020 and did not play last time out at Florida.

**NEW FACES**

- Vanderbilt welcomed seven freshmen to West End for 2020: Abi Brighton, Tina Bruni, Kate Devine, Sophia Gorski, Amber Nguyen, Maya Swinton and Alex Wagner.
- Three freshman Dores -- Abi Brighton, Amber Nguyen and Mya Swinton -- all made their debuts against Kentucky in the opener and have seen consistent playing time since.
  - Brighton has started each match thus far for the Dores.
  - Nguyen leads the team with two assists and made her first collegiate start against Missouri on Oct. 3.
  - Swinton has come off the bench for significant minutes in every game to date.
- Sophia Gorski made her debut at Missouri and logged significant minutes off the bench in Vanderbilt's 2-1 victory at Florida.
- Alex Wagner scored her first collegiate goal in Vandy's 2-1 double-overtime loss to South Carolina, tallying the tying goal in the 75th minute.

**WINNING IN BUNCHES**

- In all, the Dores have defeated 16 ranked opponents with 10 of those coming since Ambrose took over ahead of the 2015 season.
- This 2020 senior class has led the Commodores to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1994-98 seasons.
  - Vanderbilt has a mark of 45-19-5 over the last three-plus campaigns since the start of the 2017 season with a 22-10-3 mark in SEC play.

**DORES IN THE POLL**

- In the first release of the United Soccer Coaches poll on Sept. 22, Vanderbilt checked in at No. 10.
- A week later after falling in overtime to Tennessee, Vanderbilt checked in at No. 13.
- A season ago, Vanderbilt reached as high as No. 9 in the poll.

**LOOKING BACK**

- Last season, the Commodores won their third SEC East championship, and first since 1997 (the SEC recognized divisional championships from 1995-2012 and reinstated divisional play a season ago).
- Vanderbilt went 4-1-1 against the division in 2019 with the lone loss coming in a 1-0 heartbreaker to Florida and a scoreless draw on the road against No. 7 South Carolina.
- Nine of the 14 wins were decided after half or later, and five of those were away from West End.
- Eight midfielders accounted for half of Vanderbilt's goals (18-of-36). Each of these midfielders -- Madi Allen, Leila Azari, Mairin Boyle, Peyton Cutshall, Blue Ellis, Maddie Elwell, Raegan Kelley and Alex Kerr -- returned for the 2020 season.
- Of the 36 goals scored last season, there were 37 total assists.
  - Maddie Elwell's 10 assists in 2019 tied for second in the SEC, only three shy of the conference's leader.

**HURRY HOME**

- The Commodores have won 35 matches at the Vanderbilt Soccer Complex since Darren Ambrose took over ahead of 2015, including 17 straight from 2017-18.
  - The 10-0-1 home mark in 2018 was the best home record since 1990's unblemished 9-0 record.
  - The Commodores have beat four ranked foes over the past five years at home and own a 4-4-1 record against ranked teams at home under Ambrose.
  - Vanderbilt has not conceded more than 2 goals in a match on West End since 2017.

**OUR STATE**

- In their last 12 against Tennessee schools (Chattanooga, Lipscomb, Tennessee and Tennessee Tech), the Dores are 9-2-1.

**GOOD LUCK...**

- In the past five seasons from 2015 to 2019, Vanderbilt notched 39 shutouts with 21 of those coming since 2018-19.
  - The 39 shutouts were the highest in a five-year stretch since 45 from 2005-09.
  - Vanderbilt recorded 11 shutouts in 2019.
    - The 11 clean sheets were the most in a single season since 2005 (15).

**GOING THE DISTANCE**

- Four Dores -- Maddie Elwell, Haley Hopkins, Raegan Kelley and Ella Shamburger -- played in and started every match in 2019.
  - Shamburger has started in 45 straight dating to 2018 and played the entire match 17 times last season.
- Thus far this year, five Dores - Leila Azari, Raegyn Kelley, Abi Brighton, Ella Shamburger and Kimya Raietparvar - have started every game for Vandy.

**WHERE I COME FROM**

- Two Commodores hail from Tennessee.
  - Blue Ellis, a senior midfielder, is from Collierville. She netted the game-winner against the Vols in 2017 off a set piece.
  - Freshman goalkeeper, Kate Devine, is from nearby Brentwood.
- Of the 30-athlete roster, Florida is the most represented with five coming from the Sunshine State.
- Other states represented include: California (4), Georgia (4), Texas (3), Nevada (2), Pennsylvania (2), New Jersey (1), North Carolina (1), Ohio (1), South Carolina (1) and Virginia (1).
- Additionally, two hail from Canadian provinces.

**THE DANCE**

- Vanderbilt is one of seven SEC schools to make it to the NCAA Tournament at least three times in the past five years.

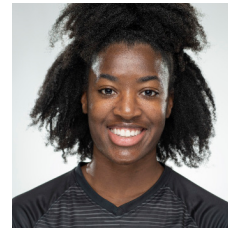
