The Matchup

- Opening play in the NCAA Tournament, No. 10 Vanderbilt will meet No. 9 Penn State Saturday afternoon at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, North Carolina.
- Vanderbilt and Penn State have never met on the soccer field prior to Saturday's game. The winner of Saturday's game will meet the winner of top-seeded Florida State and Milwaukee.

NCAA Tournament Info

- Earning a seed in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, 16-seed Vanderbilt enters the 2021 tournament looking for its first-ever trip past the second round.
- The 2020 SEC Tournament champion, this marks Vanderbilt's 11th NCAA Tournament in program history and the fourth in a row. With a fourth consecutive trip, it marks the second-longest streak in program history and is one short of the record five from 1994-98.
- The Commodores hold a 6-7-3 record in the NCAA Tournament and are 2-2-1 in five games under Darren Ambrose. Of note, Vanderbilt is 2-0-1 in its NCAA Tournament openers under Ambrose with the lone draw a scoreless affair at Clemson in 2019 with the Tigers winning 5-4 on PKs.
- Vanderbilt is one of three SEC teams to make the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four seasons. The other two teams are Arkansas and Texas A&M.
- Additionally, Vanderbilt is one of 17 programs in the nation to make each of the last four NCAA Tournaments. The other 16 teams are: Florida State, North Carolina, UCLA, Penn State, Duke, Southern California, West Virginia, Virginia, Georgetown, TCU, South Florida, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Santa Clara, Clemson and Rutgers.

A Vanderbilt Win Would...

- ...be its 10th victory of the season, giving the Commodores four consecutive seasons of 10-plus wins.
- ...snap a brief two-match winless streak.
- ...be Vanderbilt's seventh NCAA Tournament victory.
- ...give Vanderbilt its first trip to the Sweet 16 in program history.
- ...give Vanderbilt its fifth win of 2020-21 over a nationally-ranked opponent.
- ...extend Vanderbilt's run of results against Top 10 teams to four in a row.

Last Time Out

- On the road for the regular-season finale, Vanderbilt drew with No. 7 Duke in Durham with neither side able to find the winner.
- In double overtime, Kate Devine made two stops in the closing two minutes that saved the game for the Commodores. The match marked Devine's collegiate debut. She came off the bench at halftime in a pre-planned split of the two halves with starter Sarah Fuller.

Ranked Does

- Vanderbilt is ranked No. 10 in the latest Top Drawer Soccer poll. It also checks in at No. 16 in the nation in the United Soccer Coaches poll.
- Vanderbilt was as high as No. 4 in the Top Drawer poll and No. 6 in the United Soccer Coaches poll before its loss to No. 17 Memphis.
- Previously, Vanderbilt's highest ranking in program history was No. 7 during the 2018 season in both polls.

Head Coach Darren Ambrose

- In his sixth season leading Vanderbilt soccer, Darren Ambrose has guided one of the best runs in program history.
- The Does have amassed a 70-38-11 record and 33-20-7 SEC mark during his tenure. Fourteen of those wins are over ranked opponents, meaning Ambrose has guided the program to 14 of its 22 wins over ranked teams.
- To date, Vanderbilt has four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, an SEC regular season championship (2018), a tournament championship (2020) and an SEC East Division championship (2019) under his leadership.
- Ambrose is the first Vanderbilt head coach in 21 years to have three consecutive double-digit win seasons (2017-19) and will make it four years in a row with one more win during the spring season.

Coming Alive

- After scoring 11 goals in eight regular-season games in 2020, Vanderbilt came alive in the SEC Tournament with a tournament-record 14 goals in four games while allowing just four.
- Seven players tallied goals in the tournament with Raegan Kelley leading the way with three. Haley Hopkins, Maddie Elwell and Abi Brighton also added two apiece with Kimya Raietparvar nailing two penalty kicks.
- Along the way, Vanderbilt took down three nationally-ranked teams and each of the top three seeds in No. 13 Tennessee (No. 2 seed), No. 8 Texas A&M (No. 3 seed) and No. 6 Arkansas (No. 1 seed).

Senior Leadership

- Prior to the 2020 regular-season finale, Vanderbilt honored 10 seniors in Haley Hopkins, Olivia Simmons, Kayla Eason, Maddie Elwell, Myra Konte, Leila Azari, Blue Ellis, Sarah Fuller, Madiya Harriott and Rebecca Rossett.
- This four-year class owns a 52-21-6 record, which is good for a .705 winning percentage. The percentage thus far marks the best winning percentage by a four-year class in program history, topping the previous bests of .665 in 1997 and .663 just last year in 2019.
- Overall, this marks the eighth four-year class to win at least 50 games with the program. The 2019 senior class was also the first group to reach the 50-win mark since six classes in a row did from 1995 to 2000.
- Of note, Hopkins, Elwell, Konte, Azari and Harriott are on track to return to the program for another season in the fall of 2021.

Some of the Nation's Best

- With Top Drawer Soccer announcing its midseason top players in the nation, four Commodores made the lists.
- Abi Brighton has been named one of the best freshmen in the country at No. 12 and Amber Nguyen checked in at No. 76 on the list.
- Haley Hopkins and Ella Shamburger were named to the organization's Top 100 in the country. Hopkins is No. 38 and Shamburger checked in at No. 84.

Noting 2020-21

- In the season opener against Kentucky, a Haley Hopkins brace was the difference in a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the Wildcats. The victory came after Kentucky scored the first two goals of the game in the opening half to lead by a pair after 45 minutes.
- Across Vanderbilt's five losses to Tennessee, Missouri, South Carolina, Ole Miss and Memphis, five of the 11 opponent goals came from set pieces with Tennessee scoring on a corner kick, Missouri tallying twice from the direct result of free kicks, South Carolina winning it on the PK and Ole Miss scoring the winner on a free kick. Three of those five losses came in overtime (South Carolina, Ole Miss and Memphis).
- Vanderbilt snapped a three-game losing streak - the longest to date under Darren Ambrose - with the double-overtime win at Florida. It marked the fourth win over UF in program history. Since the streak, Vanderbilt has lost just twice in 11 games and is 8-2-1.
- Vanderbilt's tournament title saw the Commodores win four games in eight days.
- Along the way, Vandy defeated three ranked foes, marking the first time in program history Vanderbilt has beat ranked teams in three consecutive games.

Late Decisions

- Ten of Vanderbilt's 11 regular season games this season have been decided in the second half or later and were one-goal games.
- The lone regular season game in the fall that wasn't decided in the second half or a one-goal game came when Vanderbilt scored the game-winner in the 16th minute and beat LSU 2-0, marking Vanderbilt's first first-half goal of the season. Coincidentally, Vanderbilt scored in every first half after that during the fall season, making it six games to start the season without a first-half goal before six consecutive games with a first-half goal to close.
- Since, Vanderbilt has not scored in the first half in three spring games.
- All three of Vanderbilt's goals against Kentucky in the season opener came after the 53rd minute with the first two separated by just 6:11 of game action.
- Against Florida, Myra Konte's game-winning goal came in the 103rd minute of double overtime.
- Against No. 15 Georgia, Haley Hopkins scored the game-winning goal in the 88th minute.
- In 2019, nine of the 14 wins were decided after halftime.

New Faces

- While Vanderbilt welcomed seven freshmen ahead of 2020, it now welcomed a transfer and a freshman ahead of 2021.
- Alea Hyatt joined the program in January from USC. She is eligible for the spring season and the fall 2021 season. Hyatt started her career at North Carolina. A California native, Hyatt transferred closer to home to USC before coming to Vandy.
- Vida Raietparvar also joined the program in January as an early enrollee. She is not eligible to compete until fall 2021.

Winning In Bunches

- In all, the Does have defeated 22 ranked opponents with 14 of those coming since Ambrose took over ahead of the 2015 season.
- This 2020-21 senior class has led the Commodores to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1994-98 seasons.
- Vanderbilt has a mark of 52-21-6 since the start of the 2017 season with a 24-11-3 mark in SEC play.

Hurry Home

- The Commodores have won 37 matches at Vanderbilt Soccer Complex since Darren Ambrose took over ahead of 2015, including 17 straight from 2017-18.
- Prior to No. 17 on Memphis on March 28, Vanderbilt went 28 games from 2017 to 2021 without conceding more than two goals in a match at home - a streak of 28 games.
- The 10-0-1 home mark in 2018 was the best home record since 1990's unblemished 9-0 record.
- The Commodores have three wins, a draw and two losses at home against ranked team in its last six outings. During the run, four of the six games have gone to extra time.
- In all, Vandy is 6-5-1 against ranked foes visiting West End under Ambrose.

- Additionally, three hail from Canadian provinces.

The Dance

- Vanderbilt is one of three SEC teams to make the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four seasons. The other two teams are Arkansas and Texas A&M.
- Additionally, Vanderbilt is one of 17 programs in the nation to make each of the last four NCAA Tournaments. The other 16 teams are: Florida State, North Carolina, UCLA, Penn State, Duke, Southern California, West Virginia, Virginia, Georgetown, TCU, South Florida, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Santa Clara, Clemson and Rutgers.

NWSL in Town

- Vanderbilt hosted Racing Louisville FC at Vanderbilt Soccer Complex on March 7, marking the first exhibition for Vanderbilt against a pro team.
- Head coach Darren Ambrose on the game: "Not only can you come to Vanderbilt, get a world-class education and earn a spring board into the next chapter of your life with an influential network of people around you, but maybe being a professional soccer player is now a career you can aspire to as well here. Realistically, this can become a pathway to the pros, if you've got it in you and you've got that desire, we believe our program is one that can develop and elevate you. It has the national profile, we're seeing consistent success and you're going to get exposure to that next level. We want to show that our program is moving in that direction and becoming one of those programs that's regularly placing athletes into professional careers. The additional bonus is the Vanderbilt degree you earned will also be in your back pocket when you eventually need it."

Next Level

- In January, Myra Konte became the first Commodore ever taken in an NWSL Draft by going 30th overall to the North Carolina Courage.
- Konte's selection marks the first Commodore taken in a draft since 2000 when Asta Helgadottir was selected by the Carolina Courage in the inaugural WUSA Draft after returning to her native Iceland for one season prior to being selected.
- Konte currently plans to return to Vanderbilt for the fall 2021 season before joining the organization that is now co-owned by Naomi Osaka, the defending U.S. Open and Australian Open tennis champion.

Our Trailblazer

- Sarah Fuller made history as the first female to play in a Power Five football game on Nov. 28 when she kicked off for the Vanderbilt football team at Missouri.
- With Vanderbilt's special teams unit battling COVID-19 and contact tracing, Fuller stepped in to help the team and became the first female to participate in a game at the Power Five level just six days after winning the SEC soccer title.
- Two weeks later in Vanderbilt's rivalry game against Tennessee, Fuller became the first woman to score in a Power Five game by going 2-for-2 on extra points.
- Since the end of football season, Fuller was part of President Joe Biden's inauguration event on national television. During the event, the trailblazer introduced a fellow trailblazer in the first female to hold the office of Vice President of the United States, Kamala Harris.

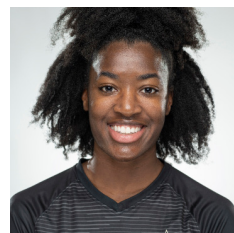
