Series History

Until 2020, Georgia had faced Vanderbilt every year going back to 1968. However, the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic forced the Commodores to cancel last season's meeting in Athens. Therefore, Georgia will be heading to Nashville again like they did in 2019 when the Bulldogs posted a 30-6 victory. The last time Georgia played two straight in the series in Nashville came in 1932 and then in 1952. Overall, Georgia leads the series 58-20-2, including 27-12-2 in Nashville.

Dominating Defense

Currently Georgia ranks second in the SEC in Scoring Defense giving up just 7.7 points per game. The defense has allowed just one touchdown this season and it came in the fourth quarter last Saturday versus South Carolina with the Bulldogs leading 40-6.

Georgia had held its first three opponents to a total of 23 points, which matches the 2019 defense through three games. This year, Georgia defeated No. 3 Clemson 10-3 in Charlotte, routed UAB 56-7 in Athens and then beat South Carolina 40-13. It is worth nothing that UAB's touchdown came on a pick-six.

Most recently, South Carolina was limited to 13 points. The Gamecocks' final stop came on 4th-and-goal from the nine. Georgia finished with one interception, three sacks and six TFLs. With 10:55 left in the contest, USC got a 36-yard TD pass from Luke Doty to Josh Vann which marked the first TD allowed by the Bulldog defense this season. In the first half, USC was held to six points on 131 yards (8 rushing, 123 passing) on 28 plays.

The leading tackler was junior **Nolan Smith** with a career-high 8 stops, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble that was recovered by **Quay Walker**. Senior Columbia, S.C., native **Channing Tindall** was next in tackles by matching his career-high with seven stops. Smith and **Jordan Davis** (2 stops, 0.5 sack) were in on a safety, the first since the final play of the 2020 season (*Azeez Ojulari versus Cincinnati in the 24-21 Chick-fil-A Bowl victory*).

During the Bulldogs' win over No. 3 Clemson in Charlotte, N.C., the Tigers finished the night with just three points on 60 plays and 180 yards as Georgia tallied seven sacks. The Tigers previously had a streak of 400 yards of total offense in their past 12 games. In the first half, Georgia held the Tigers to 90 yards (1 rushing, 89 passing) on 30 plays. The Dogs carried a shutout through three quarters. The Tigers longest play of the night was a 44-yard completion in the fourth. The Tigers scored with 9:08 left in the game on a 22-yard field goal to cut Georgia's lead to 10-3. Clemson's three points were the fewest scored in the Dabo Swinney era and the fewest for the program since 2007.

The Bulldogs' leading tackler against Clemson was safety **Lewis Cine** with nine and six different players registered a sack. Junior ILB **Nakobe Dean** led the way with a pair of sacks while Davis collected two tackles for loss and a sack. Davis was named the **Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week** as well as the **SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week**.

2019 Meeting In Nashville: #4 Georgia Drops Vanderbilt 30-6

The Bulldogs opened their campaign with a rare SEC road game and made short work of Vanderbilt 30-6. Georgia rolled up 326 yards rushing, including 149 from current Detroit Lion D'Andre Swift, as QB Jake Fromm finished with 156 yards passing and a touchdown. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the first half and allowed the Commodores only a pair of second quarter field goals. Current Indianapolis Colt Rodrigo Blankenship drilled a trio of field goals, including a 50 yarder, to add additional points for Georgia. Defensively, current Tennessee Titan Monty Rice and current San Diego Charger Mark Webb had seven tackles apiece. It was the first time since 1995 that the Bulldogs opened a season versus an SEC team and marked the first SEC road opener to a season since 1994. A pair of current Bulldogs in **Kearis Jackson** and **John FitzPatrick** made their first career starts.

Did You Know?

Georgia is the only team in the nation with a 3-0 record versus teams with a winning record. The Bulldogs defeated #9/#7 Clemson (2-1) 10-3, UAB (2-1) 56-7 and South Carolina (2-1) 40-13.

Three SEC Eastern Division championships, 52 wins, one SEC title, four bowl victories, and an appearance in one national championship game are more than respectable rewards over a five-year period. That's what Georgia got when it hired former Bulldog player and assistant coach Kirby Smart to head the program in December, 2015.

The 2020 Bulldogs became Smart's fourth straight team to earn a New Year's Six bowl game. With a Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl victory, the 2020 Bulldog senior class tied the record for the most wins by a senior class in school history (44), set by the 2005 and 2019 teams. That was also Smart's fourth straight team to finish the regular season ranked in the top ten of the College Football Playoff rankings.

Smart's 2019 Bulldogs became the first team in school history to win 11 or more games for a third straight season. The senior class posted a four-year record of 44-12, matching the school record of 44 wins for a senior class. Georgia defeated three Top 15 teams in the final CFP ranking — Notre Dame, Florida, and Auburn — and finished

as the fourth-ranked team in the final polls. The season was capped by a dominant win over Baylor in the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

When Georgia looked for a head coach after the 2015 season, the arrows pointed to Kirby Smart, longtime Alabama defensive coordinator and former UGA player and assistant. The 2017 Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year has not disappointed.

In his first year leading the Bulldogs, Georgia extended its school record to 20 consecutive bowl appearances and had wins over No. 8 Auburn and No. 22 UNC.

In 2017, Smart directed UGA to a 13-2 record, an SEC title, a win at The Rose Bowl Game during the CFP semifinal and a spot in the National Championship. He was named the Maxwell Football Club's George Munger National Coach of the Year. Before 2017, the Bulldogs last SEC title was 2005.

The 2018 and 2019 Bulldogs advanced to the SEC title game, secured an invite to the Sugar Bowl and combined for a 23-5 record.

He has also made an immediate impact in recruiting, posting the nation's No. 1 class in 2018, the second-ranked class in 2019 and the third-ranked class in 2017 and 2020.

In addition to coaching, Smart oversees the Kirby Smart Family Foundation, which is focused on being champions in the community by supporting and giving back to needy children and families. In September of 2020, Smart and his wife Mary Beth pledged \$1 million to support social justice and student-athletes impacted by COVID-19.

*Since 2017, Georgia is 22-2 in SEC East contests. Went 6-0 in the division in 2017-18 for the first time since the SEC split into divisions in 1992.
 *Advanced to 2017-19 SECCGs, making Georgia the first from the East to win at least three straight since 1996.
 *2017 Georgia Munger National Coach of the Year finalist, leading UGA to a 13-2 record, a Rose Bowl Game victory and an appearance the CFP National Championship Game.
 *The Bulldogs' No. 2 AP ranking in 2017 was the team's top AP ranking since week three of the 2008 season when Georgia was No. 2.
 *Eight fourth-quarter comebacks, including wins over #8 AU ('16), #22 UNC in Atlanta ('16), @ #24 Notre Dame ('17), vs. #2 Oklahoma in 2018 Rose Bowl Game. vs. #8 Cincinnati in 2021 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Looking For More Explosive Plays

* Georgia returns eight starters on offense for a team that averaged 32.3 points/game. Through three games in 2021, the Bulldogs are averaging 35.3 points/game.

* The Bulldogs return their top five running backs, headlined by **Zamir White**. Georgia's top three receivers are also back in **Kearis Jackson**, **George Pickens** (*currently injured*) and **Jermaine Burton**. Pickens is coming back from a knee injury that happened in the spring.

* Georgia has had at least five touchdown passes that have covered at least 38 yards. Most recently, JT Daniels had a 38 yarder to freshman **AD Mitchell** and a 43 yarder to Burton against South Carolina. On the year, Burton has eight catches for 173 yards to be the Bulldogs' second-leading receiver.

* On the second play of the game versus UAB, Burton caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from **Stetson Bennett**. Also, Bennett had two more TD bombs in that game, a 61 yarder to redshirt freshman WR **Arian Smith** and an 89 yarder to freshman TE **Brock Bowers**. Smith missed the South Carolina game with an injury.

* The 2020 season was the first under offensive coordinator **Todd Monken**, who placed a premium on explosive plays, which are at least a 12-yard rush or a 16-yard completion.

Daniels 6-0 As A Starter

* **JT Daniels**, an Irvine, Calif., native who was recovering from a torn ACL at Southern Cal in 2019, served as Georgia's starting quarterback from game 7 of the Bulldogs' 2020 campaign through the 2021 opener. He did not play against UAB due to an injury as senior **Stetson Bennett** got the start in a 56-7 win. Daniels returned to the starting lineup against South Carolina and led the Bulldogs to a victory after going 23-for-31 for 303 yards, a touchdown and one pick.

* Georgia ranks fifth nationally on third down conversions (22-for-38, 57.8 percent) and a large reason of that is because of the play of Daniels. This year on third downs, he is 14-for-16 for 99 yards and one TD, one INT and one sack. Ten of the completions have resulted in a first down.

* Bennett enjoyed a career a record-setting performance torching the Blazers for a school record tying five touchdown passes (*all in the first half*). He finished the day 10-for-12 for 288 yards with his scoring strikes covering 9, 12, 61, 73 and 89 yards. Bennett was named the **SEC Offensive Player of the Week** as well as to the **Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8** list following his performance.

* Daniels threw for 1,231 yards and 10 TDs during the final four games of 2020, capped by a 24-21 comeback over undefeated No. 8 Cincinnati in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Daniels made 12 starts at USC (2018-19).

* A former walk-on who returned to Georgia on scholarship as a junior college transfer in 2019, Bennett threw for 1,179 yards last year as a junior with eight TDs and six INTs in eight games including five starts.

* **Carson Beck** is a redshirt freshman from Jacksonville, Fla., who saw his first action late against Missouri last year. Beck saw his first extended playing time against UAB this year, finishing 4-for-10 for 88 yards with one touchdown (12-yd strike to **Justin Robinson**) and one INT.

Sharing The Load At RB

* Seniors **Zamir White** and **James Cook** along with sophomore **Kendall Milton** and junior **Kenny McIntosh** share the load.

* During the win over No. 3 Clemson, White headlined the group with 74 yards on 13 carries, including a total of 32 yards on Georgia's final drive of the game when they ran out the last 4:49 of the game.

* Milton was the leading rusher in the win over the Gamecocks with 10 carries for 66 yards as the Bulldogs tallied 184 yards on 31 carries (5.9 avg.). This performance included a 23-yard scoring scamper by Cook, who also caught a 4-yard touchdown pass.

A Look At The Offensive Line

* There is plenty of competition for playing time on the offensive line for second-year Offensive Line coach **Matt Luke**.

* Senior **Jamaree Salyer** (LT), redshirt freshman **Tate Ratledge** (LG), redshirt freshman **Sedrick Van Pran** (C), fifth-year senior **Justin Shaffer** (RG) and redshirt sophomore **Warren McClendon** (RT) were the starters versus Clemson.

* McClendon was a 2020 Freshman All-American after starting the last nine games in 2021. Salyer and Shaffer have each started 14 career games.

* Van Pran emerged as an option at C after Ericson sustained an injury during preseason camp. After Van Pran got the start at C in the season opener, Ericson had to replace Ratledge at LG in the first quarter after Ratledge went down with a right foot injury and did not return. Ericson has started the last two games at RG.

Evolving Receivers Corps

* The Bulldogs have a variety of weapons at receiver with new targets emerging and existing receivers returning from injuries.

* **Kearis Jackson**, **Dominick Blaylock** and **George Pickens** are working their way back to getting 100 percent from injuries. They are the most experienced receivers on Georgia's roster.

* In the meantime, sophomores **Jermaine Burton** and **Marcus Rosemy-Jacksaint** and redshirt freshmen **Arian Smith** and **Justin Robinson** will be in the mix while true freshman **AD Mitchell** and redshirt freshman **Ladd McConkey**.

* Burton caught his second touchdown passes in as many games against South Carolina and Mitchell posted career highs of four catches for 77 yards and a score versus the Gamecocks.

* All players mentioned above played versus the Tigers in the opener as Georgia had 11 different players catch passes in the victory. Against UAB and South Carolina, nine different Bulldogs finished with at least one reception.

Impressive Start For Bowers

* Freshman TE **Brock Bowers** has a team-best 14 catches for 203 yards and two touchdowns and has started all three games.

* He made his career debut by starting against #3 Clemson. He led the Bulldogs with six catches for 43 yards in the victory. His first touchdown catch of his career was an 89 yarder from **Stetson Bennett** versus UAB. This was the ninth-longest passing TD in school history. Versus the Gamecocks a week later, Bowers was the leading receiver with five catches for 53 yards.

* Bowers became just the eighth true freshman to start a season opener in the **Kirby Smart** era. Bowers saw increased reps during fall camp when junior **John FitzPatrick** and sophomore **Darnell Washington** missed time with injuries.

Creating Havoc Again In 2021

* Defensive coordinator **Dan Lanning** is now in his fourth year and the Bulldogs feature one of the top defenses in the country.

* Georgia is tied for fourth nationally with 13 sacks.

* The Georgia defense has allowed just one touchdown this year. The Bulldogs' first two opponents did not score until the fourth quarter. UAB's only touchdown came on a pick-six. Clemson managed only a field goal. All 13 of South Carolina's points came after three turnovers, including two field goals and a fourth quarter touchdown.

* Head coach **Kirby Smart** stresses the importance of making havoc plays and how those plays give the defense momentum. Turnovers (interceptions, forced fumbles), deflections, tackles for loss, including sacks, are examples of havoc plays.

Secondary Finding Their Way

* While some may refer to Georgia as "RBU", one could make a case for "DBU" with the recent Bulldogs now in the NFL including four who were drafted last season (Eric Stokes, 1st Round, Green Bay; Tyson Campbell, 2nd Round, Jacksonville; Richard LeCounte, 5th round, Cleveland; Mark Webb, 7th round, L.A. Chargers).

* The Bulldogs' secondary tallied its second and third picks of the year in the win over UAB. Junior **Lewis Cine** and freshman **Kelee Ringo** each had an interception versus the Blazers after senior **Christopher Smith** scored the game's only touchdown with a 74-yard INT return for a TD against #3 Clemson.

* To help offset these losses, Georgia landed a pair talented players via the transfer portal in All-ACC first teamer **Derion Kendrick** (Clemson) and All-America **Tykee Smith** (West Virginia). However, Smith went down with a foot injury in camp and has yet to play.

* Kendrick has his first career pick for the Bulldogs (fourth of his career after snagging three for Clemson) during the win over South Carolina. The Bulldogs are second in the SEC with five picks.

* Smith scored the only touchdown in the win over No. 3 Clemson on a 74-yard interception return (the first pick of his career). He earned **SEC Defensive Player of the Week** honors following his performance. Cine had a team-high nine tackles and two pass breakups while Brini tallied four stops and Speed had a pair of tackles.

* Seniors **Latavious Brini** and **Ameer Speed** are manning the cornerback spots for the Bulldogs during their final seasons.

Making An Impact Up Front

* Preseason All-American **Jordan Davis** joins fifth-year **Devonte Wyatt** as the veterans in the center of the defensive line. The pair combined for six tackles, including two tackles for loss and a sack, and a pass breakup against No. 3 Clemson. Davis was named the **Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week** as well as the **SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week** after his effort against the Tigers.

* The duo is joined by junior **Travon Walker**, sophomore **Jalen Carter**, junior **Tramel Walthour** and sophomore **Nazir Stackhouse** who comprise the rotation of the Bulldog front. Walker had four tackles

and a sack in the 2021 opener while Carter chipped in with two stops, including a sack.

* Clemson was held to two yards rushing as Georgia's defense tallied seven sacks.

* Davis shared a sack with teammate **Nolan Smith** that led to a South Carolina safety as Davis and Wyatt combined for four stops and two TFLs in the win over the Gamecocks.

Bulldog Backers

* Junior ILB **Nakobe Dean** shares the team lead in tackles (17) with junior S **Lewis Cine**. Dean was a semifinalist for the 2020 Butkus Award. He is joined by senior **Channing Tindall** and junior **Quay Walker** in the middle.

* Tindall was the leading tackler in the rout of UAB as he had seven tackles and a sack. He followed that up with another seven stops against South Carolina.

* Dean set the tone early against No. 3 Clemson as he finished with a pair of sacks and five tackles on the night.

* Senior **Adam Anderson** and junior **Nolan Smith** are filling the spot vacated by NFL second round pick Azeem Ojulari. Through the first three games of 2021, Anderson has 12 tackles and three sacks while Smith has a dozen stops and 2.5 sacks.

* Smith exploded for a career-high eight tackles against the Gamecocks in a performance that included 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble.

One Of Country's Top Punting Units Returns

* Senior punter and 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist **Jake Camarda** was the **SEC Special Teams Player of the Year** last season. He posted an SEC best 46.6 average that ranked fourth in the country and was named a FWAA Second-Team All-American. Camarda is a preseason All-American at his position in 2021.

* Camarda had five punts for a net average of 43.4 and dropped four inside the 20-yard line with a long of 51 during the season-opening win over No. 3 Clemson. He was included on the **Ray Guy Award's "Ray's 8"** for his performance versus the Tigers.

* This year, Camarda is averaging 47.4 yards/punt placing seven inside in the 20 and five have been 50+. Georgia leads the SEC in net punting at 45.7. Camarda is averaging 45.6 yards/punt, which is on pace for a school record. Drew Butler, the 2009 Ray Guy Award winner, owns the Bulldog record with a 45.4 mark.

* Camarda is also handling most of the UGA kickoffs this year with 14 touchbacks out of his 16 kickoffs.

Jack-Pod

* For his career, junior PK **Jack Podlesny** is 15-for-20 on field goals and 52-for-52 on PATs. This year, he is 2-for-4 on FGs and 14-for-14 on PATs. Podlesny made his debut in the 2020 season opening win at Arkansas and capped his first year by earning Offensive MVP honors at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. In the 24-21 win over #8 Cincinnati, Podlesny accounted for 10 points, including the game-winning 53-yard FG with three seconds remaining.

* Georgia entered the 2021 season with the NCAA record for Consecutive PATs Made. The streak now stands at 344 and involves six kickers (Marshall Morgan, Patrick Beless, William Ham, David Marvin, Rodrigo Blankenship and Podlesny).

* Georgia's snappers this year include returning starters junior **Payne Walker** and redshirt sophomore **William Mote**. Walker snaps on field goals and PATs while Mote handles the snaps for punts.

Trio Of Preseason All-Americans

* Senior punter **Jake Camarda** (1st Team) along with senior offensive lineman **Jamaree Salyer** (2nd Team) and senior defensive lineman **Jordan Davis** (2nd Team) have been named preseason All-Americans by the AP. Camarda, a Ray Guy Award finalist in 2020, made the AP 3rd team a year ago.

* The Bulldogs also had four players earn 2021 Walter Camp Second Team All-America honors this preseason. Davis, Camarda and junior WR **George Pickens** were included on the squad. Pickens is currently out after tearing his ACL during the spring.

Following a year that saw their 2020 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game canceled due to the ongoing pandemic, the Bulldogs opened with non-conference foe Clemson, who was ranked No. 3 in the AP poll, in Charlotte, N.C. The Bulldogs topped the Tigers 10-3. Georgia faced Clemson for the first time since topping the Tigers 45-21 in Athens in 2014. The Bulldogs now own a 43-18-4 edge in the all-time series with Clemson and have won seven of nine neutral site matchups.

Georgia has a total of four non-conference showdowns scheduled - two to start the season and two to wrap the regular season up. After the opener versus Clemson, the Bulldogs played UAB for only the third time in history and won 56-7.

Led by former Bulldog offensive line coach Sam Pittman, Arkansas will make its first trip to Sanford Stadium since 2010. Georgia leads the all-time record 11-4 with the Razorbacks. The Bulldogs knocked them off in Fayetteville, Ark., 37-10 in the 2020 opener.

The Bulldogs' slate features a single open weekend (Oct. 24) and it is again traditionally placed prior to the game versus Florida in Jacksonville, Fla. While the No. 8 Gators outlasted Georgia 44-28 in 2020, the Bulldogs beat their SEC Eastern Division rivals from 2017-19.

A week after the Bulldogs close out their SEC schedule at Tennessee, they host Charleston Southern for their final home game on Nov. 20. The teams have only squared off against each other once and that resulted in a 55-9 Georgia victory in 2014 in Athens.

The Georgia-Georgia Tech rivalry was played every year from 1925 until 2019 and the series is slated to begin again in 2021. The Bulldogs have won the last three in a row, including a 52-7 victory in Athens during the teams' last matchup in 2019.

Dawgs For Pups Bringing Change To Athens Area

The Bulldog football team initiated the Dawgs For Pups program over the last year to embrace the act of serving the Athens community and beyond and the early results have been overwhelming. The players and staff helped raise more than \$100,000 for wireless cards that area kindergarten through eighth grade students could use for virtual learning; collected nearly 30,000 pounds of food for local food banks; made a donation of more than 400 coats to those who were in need during the winter season; and adopted 100 families to buy Christmas presents for, among other projects. The Dogs' latest activity in the community was a bookbag drive for students in the Athens-Clarke County area prior to the start of the 2021-22 academic year.

Smart Family Commits \$1 Million

Head football coach Kirby Smart and his wife, Mary Beth, donated \$1 million to their alma mater in September 2020 to support the UGA Athletic Association's new social justice program, create scholarships for senior student-athletes whose final seasons were impacted by COVID-19, and contribute to the expansion of the UGA football program.

The Smarts joined then Detroit Lions quarterback and former UGA standout Matthew Stafford and his wife, Kelly, to endow UGA Athletics' new social justice program.

Dogs Up To No. 2

Georgia checked in at No. 5 in the AP pre-season Top 25 poll as well as the Coaches poll and surged to No. 2 in the AP/Coaches polls after beating No. 3 Clemson. This marked the fourth consecutive season that the Bulldogs began in the top five. Georgia opened up with a 10-3 win over the Tigers in the Duke's Mayo Classic in Charlotte and then topped UAB 56-7 and SC 40-13 at home. The Tigers were picked No. 3 in the AP and No. 2 in the Coaches poll. The first College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking will be released in November. Georgia will refer to the AP and Coaches poll rankings until the CFP's weekly rankings.

No. 2 Georgia 40, South Carolina 13

Sept. 19, 2021 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs opened Southeastern Conference play with a dominating 40-13 win over the South Carolina Gamecocks before a sell-out crowd of 92,746 fans at Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium and an ESPN nationally-televised audience Saturday afternoon.

Returning from injury, quarterback JT Daniels connected on a 21-yard pass to tight end Brock Bowers on the first play from scrimmage before tailback James Cook scampered for a 23-yard touchdown. On the following drive, South Carolina used a 61-yard completion to get on the board with an ensuing 37-yard field goal. Georgia responded quickly as Daniels hit wide receiver Jermaine Burton for a 43-yard touchdown. Near the end of the first quarter, the Gamecocks would strike again with another field goal, set up by an interception thrown by reserve quarterback Stetson Bennett.

In the second quarter, Georgia extended its drive with a pair of third-and-long conversions, leading to a 38-yard touchdown pass from Daniels to wideout Adonai Mitchell, the first of the freshman's career. As the clock neared halftime, the Bulldogs took control of the game with a critical sequence showcasing all three phases of the game. Punter Jake Camarda's 42 yard punt was downed at the 1-yard line, leading to nose tackle Jordan Davis sacking Gamecock quarterback Luke Doty in the end zone for a safety. Following the resulting free kick, the Bulldogs quickly moved into field goal position with kicker Jack Podlesny booting a 36-yarder as the first half clock expired.

Following an interception by cornerback Derion Kendrick on the first drive of the second half, tailback Zamir White extended the lead with a 15-yard touchdown run. On the ensuing drive, Doty fumbled on a strip-sack recovered by linebacker Quay Walker, leading to a 4-yard touchdown pass from Daniels to Cook. In the fourth quarter, the Georgia defense allowed its first touchdown of the season as Doty connected with wide receiver Josh Vann on a 36-yard score. The Gamecocks looked to add one more touchdown in the closing minutes, but the Bulldogs' defense stopped them on fourth-and-goal from the 9-yard line to preserve the 27-point win.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I thought the guys played really hard. So many guys played a big role in this game, seemed like the wealth was spread around defensively and offensively. I thought JT played with a high level of confidence, believed in what our guys could do, and got the ball to our playmakers ... Jake (Camarda) made a huge play, and then, the defense made a huge play. Then we were able to save our timeouts, and it was really big to get those pass plays to set up the field goal. I just thought that was a really good sequence to steal five points."



JT Daniels returned from injury to lead the Georgia passing attack, finishing 23-for-31 for 303 yards and three touchdowns.

Worth Noting...

- Before the game, the UGA Athletic Association honored five pioneers — Richard Appleby, Horace King, Larry West, Clarence Pope and Chuck Kinnebrew — who 50 years ago became the Bulldogs' first Black scholarship football players, enrolling in 1971. There is now a permanent monument in Reed Plaza that commemorates the trailblazers and their Bulldog careers.
- With a safety, the Bulldogs have 21 scores (17 TDs, 4 Safeties) by either the defense or special teams in the Kirby Smart era. The Bulldogs improved to 18-1 under Smart when they have a non-offensive score. In the first half, following a turnover where South Carolina took over at the Georgia 12, the defense held the Gamecocks to three yards and a 26-yard field goal.
- With the 40-13 win, Georgia now has a 53-19-2 edge in the series history including 20-10 since South Carolina joined the SEC. The Bulldogs are 5-1 against South Carolina under Kirby Smart.
- Georgia's opponents have scored only 23 points in three games, which matches the total through three in 2019.
- With five made PATs, junior placekicker Jack Podlesny extended Georgia's NCAA-record streak to 344 consecutive makes, dating back to the 2014 season. During the streak, six different Bulldog kickers have successfully converted on their attempts.
